SNPJ spet prekoračila število 50,000 članov

Lep napredek v članstvu v prvi polovici tega leta. Mladinski oddelek je napredoval za 329 članov, oddelek odraslih pa za 558, skupaj 887 članov; v obeh oddelkih je SNPJ dne 30. junija štela 50,491 članov.

Slovenska narodna podpora jednota spet zaznamuje lep napredok v svojem članstvu v prvi polovici leta 1938. V prvih šestih mesecih tega leta je srebrojubilejna mlaadinska kampanja prinesla SNPJ 1188 novih članov. Na drugi strani je iz mlaadinskega oddelka prestopilo veliko število članov v oddelki odraslih—natančno število bo objavljeno v kasnejšem poročilu—nečlanov je umrlo in nekaj odstopilo, a kljub temu je pridobitev novih članov pokrita izguba in preostanek znaša 329 članov v mlaadinskem oddelku.

V tem času je oddelek odraslih brez vsake kampanje napredoval za 558 članov. Skupni napredek članstva SNPJ v prvi polovici leta torej znaša 887 članov.

SLAB ZAČETEK OBRAVNATE V AVTNI UNIJI

Frakcijske napetosti na seji eksekutive

PRETEP V URADU UNIJE

Detroit, 26. jul. — Eksekutiva avtne unije je včeraj pričela z obravnavo proti štirim suspendiranim podpredsednikom. Na zatožni klopi so Ed Hall, Wyndham Mortimer, Richard Frankenstein in Walter Wells — bivši tajnik-blagajnik George Addes je bil nedavno izključen.

Tako prvi dan obravnave se je pokazala velika frakcijska napetost, ki je povzročila tudi majhen spopad med Addesom in Mauricem Silvermanom, Martinom pristašem. Pograbil sta se pred uradom unije, toda tovariši so jih razvajili.

Suspendirani uradniki so prisli v glavni stan in večji družbi svojih pristašev, uradnikov krajinskih unij iz Milwaukeeja, Detroita, Clevelanda, Toledoa, Lansinga in drugih mest. Teh je nad 20. Kot so izjavili, so prišli k obravnavi po nalogu svojih unij.

Na drugi strani je bilo v uradu tudi večje število Martino-vih pristašev, katere je Frankensteen obdolžil, da so — pretepači. Ker je bilo v uradu le preveč ūma in nereda, je eksekutiva zaključila, naj se odstranijo vsi, ki nimajo legitimnega biznisa. Na sledenje Thomasa in Reutherja so se nepoklicani pristaši obeh skupin odstranili.

Eksekutiva je včeraj razpravljala o proceduri obravnave. Suspendirani uradniki zahtevajo javno obravnavo, kakor tudi novo obravnavo za Addesa. Obe skupini očitata druga drugi, da sta v službi ali orodje komunistov. Martin pravi, da se je Frankensteen zvezal s komunisti, Frankensteen pa dolži Martina, da je pod vplivom disidentnih komunistov.

Mestna policija je v navalu na urad unije International Woodworkers Assn. (CIO) razbila pohištvo in zasegla vse rekorde. Predsednika unije Clifford Willetta in več drugih unionistov je policija izgnala iz mesta in zapretila da jim bo trda predla, če se vrnejo.

Louis Goldblatt, direktor CIO v severni Californiji, je zdaj vložil tožbo proti kompaniji pri delavskem odboru. Za izgnane unioniste se je zavzela tudi Unija za ameriške civilne svobodčine. Svet industrijskih unij v San Franciscu je sprejel rezolucijo, v kateri poziva senatni odsak, kateri vodi preiskavo zatiranja civilnih svobodčin, naj pošlje svoje reprezentante v Westwood in druga californijska mesta, kjer so industrijski magnati organizirali "vigilantske" grupe za zatiranje unij Odbora za industrijsko organizacijo.

Preiskava mlekarškega trusta v Chicagu

Chicago. — Čikaški mlekarški trust, katerega dominira kompanija Borden in Bowman, je predmet preiskave federalne vleporete. Po poročilu federalnega poljedelskega departmента ima trust kontrolo nad trgom in odira tako mlekarške farmarje kakor odjemalce. Izdelovalci sladoleda in steklenic, ki tudi odirajo odjemalce, bodo prišli pozneje na vrsto.

Lojalisti v zmago-viti protifenzivi

Spet so natepli Italijane na katalonski fronti

Barcelona, 26. jul. — Armade španske ljudske vlade so včeraj spet presenetile Frankove fašiste in njihove italijanske ter nemške zavezničke z mogreno protifenzivo v Kataloniji. Lojalisti so v treh kolonah prekoračili reko Ebro in prodri skozi fašistično črto do Gandese 14 milij od reke. Istočasno je ljudska vlada vrgla sveže čete v hrib Valencijo in ojačala tamkajšnje čete, ki so zadnje dni valovile sem in tja pod silovitim napadi Frankove armade. V včerajšnjih bojih v Kataloniji in nad Valencijo so najbolj trpeči italijanski "prostovoljci" v fašistični armadi, ki so moralni spet prejemati glavne udarce lojalistične ofenzive.

Valencija, 26. jul. — Fašistično italo je včeraj napadlo z bombami in strojnici angleško ladjo Bellwyr v pristanišču Gandiji južno od Valencije; istočasno je kasneje napadlo neko špansko ladjo. Podrobnosti glede škode še niso znane.

ORGANIZE SNPJ JUVENILE CIRCLES!—POLITICAL MORALITY IN PENNSYLVANIA

During the Silver Jubilee Juvenile campaign of our Society, now entering the eighth month, a great opportunity to spread the SNPJ Juvenile Circle movement offers itself. It was logical that this movement took root already in the early spring of this year, and, as the months progressed, more and more enthusiastic reports about its growth were coming into the SNPJ office.

We have now about a dozen Juvenile Circles organized or in the process of formation throughout the country. The Ohio lodges are so far the most active in this respect.

As has been pointed out, it is proper that juveniles themselves in this or that locality show desire for a Circle before it is realized. The juveniles who are regular and careful readers of the Mladinski List are by this time well acquainted with the idea and purpose of such Circles; there are a number of ways in which they may make their desire for a Circle known to their lodge.

But good intention only is not enough. It is the duty of the responsible leaders of a lodge to respond, to call together the juveniles of their lodge, or several lodges, and to select an administrator who will help to organize a Circle and after that will manage the Circle meetings and its activities.

It is, therefore, the duty of the local lodge leaders to take on and spread the SNPJ Juvenile Circle movement.

Seriously, what do you think of the ethical side of such a political topsy-turvy? How can a " betrayer of labor" in a few months become a "friend of labor"?

Notes on the Cleveland Federation's Activities

CLEVELAND.—Last Sunday's meeting, despite the warmth of the weather, was well attended by a number of representatives who interestingly participated in the discussions of the morning. In the interests of brevity this article will be confined to two topics of discussion—namely, the question of the Federation Farm idea and the organization of Juvenile Circles in the SNPJ.

Most of the members who were in the organization eight or nine years ago when an interested group first began to plan, to organize and to agitate for the purchase of a recreation farm to which members might go and enjoy themselves during their leisure time, remember the enthusiasm shown by many of the senior members and a nucleus of English-Speaking lodge leaders and members. The depression and the bank failures put an effective damper on any immediate fulfillment of the hopes and plans of these self-sacrificing and enthusiastic members. Some of the senior members are gone and a good proportion of the English-Speaking lodge enthusiasts out of the active circles of their respective lodges, pursuing careers or other interests which immediately are more important.

At the present time, because of the fact that a sizeable fund is in the banks available for those who would use it, enough interest has been aroused (primarily among the senior lodge members as yet) in the idea of a Federation Recreation spot to have resulted in the appointment of a committee to investigate likely sites, to plan and to persuade the present leaders of the local lodges to lend their support and enthusiasm to the realization of this long standing idea. It is important! It is important because of the following considerations:

At the meeting, when a report was presented of a meeting of senior and English-Speaking lodge representatives gathered specifically for the purpose of considering the Recreation farm idea, it was evident that the senior members are disappointed in the reaction they received from those upon whom they largely depend to bolster up and arouse further enthusiasm for the plan—the English-Speaking lodges. All, it was reported, that was forthcoming was a lack of any enthusiasm and even a defeatist attitude regarding the possible surmounting of difficulties attendant upon realization of the plan.

It might be well to point out that a project of this kind is vitally important because of these considerations: 1) it will give every member something to work for; 2) it will help our senior members to maintain their interest in some activity outside their routine of work and keep them young mentally in planning and cooperating together; 3) younger members will be aided not only in this way, but will be able to develop their own talents in leadership and in social intercourse. It is a challenging opportunity to grow intellectually and socially.

4) Finally, it is important because of the growing interest in and organization of Juvenile Circles in the SNPJ. It is laboring the obvious to say that it will be an opportunity to help our own younger brothers and sisters, our own children, to enjoy the benefits of a wholesome atmosphere in which to develop.

Finance Committee Proceedings

Meeting of March 19, 1938

The meeting was called to order at 9 a. m. by the Chairman. All members of the Committee were present. Minutes of the previous meeting approved. Brother Vider reported on the following items:

1—A letter from Attorney Philip B. Heller regarding the \$25,000.00 National Life Building (23 South La Salle Street) 6% leasehold bonds.

These bonds are in default and a plan of reorganization is being formulated. Attorney Heller suggested that we wait for further developments, and the Committee so decided.

2—Ashland Industries Manufacturing, \$15,000.00 Bonds were recommended sold by Moody's Investors' Service. The properties cover approximately 25 acres of land and improvements at 74th Street and Ashland Avenue.

3—We received a cash settlement from the Central Texas Telephone Co. foreclosure sale.

4—Loan No. 20-J in the amount of \$350.00 was in default. There are considerable taxes in default also. It was agreed to dispose of the property.

5—A letter from mortgagor of loan 61-J asked for the renewal of his mortgage of \$1700.00. Brother Zupan moved that we renew the loan providing he pays \$100.00 on principal at once and \$100.00 each year of the mortgage. The motion was seconded and carried.

6—A letter from mortgagor of loan 155-J advised that she was not able to play the note of \$500.00 on her mortgage at present. Brother Olip moved that we ask for a \$250.00 payment immediately and for a \$250.00 yearly repayment and that the loan be thus renewed. The motion was seconded and carried.

7—Loan 123-a property was sold on contract.

8—No reply has been received to the letter and terms which were forwarded to the Six Point Realty Co. on their refunding plan.

Brother Vogrich reported on the following matters:

1—Brother Vranichar stopped in the office to speak about his mortgage.

2—\$7000.00 Akron, Ohio, Water Extension Bonds were sold.

3—\$10,000.00 Catahoula Parish, Louisiana, Road District Bonds were sold.

4—\$99,000.00 U. S. Government 1½% bonds due in 1939 were sold and \$99,000.00 U. S. Government 2½% bonds due in 1960 were bought.

5—\$24,000.00 in FHA Mortgages were purchased in Chicago after the last meeting.

6—M. B. Vick and Company reported that Mr. Vick was spending some time in Florida and that they were of the opinion that Glades County Bonds of which we have \$23,000.00 could be sold for about 85. Brother Olip moved to sell these bonds at 85 or better. The motion was seconded and carried by a 6 to 1 vote.

7—Following our promise to sell our Pasadena, California, Bonds of which we have \$20,000.00 at 106.50, these were taken up by the Tax-payers' Committee and the sale was, therefore, consummated.

8—An offer was made to exchange our Cameron County, Texas, Road 5's for Parma, Ohio, but on advise of Moody's Service, the exchange was not agreed upon.

9—A counter proposal was submitted to the Six Point Realty Company

regarding their refunding program. The proposals were read and a discussion held. The matter, however, was held over until the following meeting.

10—Loans 143, 136 and 65-J have been repaid during the past month.

Brother Vider reported that the property on which we had loan No. 78 was taken over by foreclosure.

Brother Petrovich reported that he had brought along plans for a construction loan which would be a sort of a sample home and if it was approved by the FHA could be duplicated and used as a model for other construction loans by the same contractor.

Brother Olip moved that we allow loans up to 80% on new construction providing they were approved by the FHA. The motion was seconded and carried.

Further, that the property at Youngstown, Ohio, was vacant and wanted to know what disposition to make of the property. It was moved, seconded and carried that Brother Petrovich be authorized to rent or sell it as soon as possible.

Brother Vider reported that he will be away on a speaking engagement for a six week period and recommended that Brother Cainkar replace him as Secretary of the Committee during that period. It was agreed that Brother Cainkar take care of this work during Brother Vider's absence.

Brother Lotrich reported that an organization was interested in the Hrvatski Dom but that nothing definite has been done regarding the sale of same.

Further, that an offer of \$9,000.00 was secured for the Cherne property.

Further, that a \$5,000.00 offer for the Kolar property was flatly rejected.

Brother Vogrich reported that about \$65,000.00 was available for investing this month. Accordingly, the Committee was of the unanimous opinion to purchase \$5,000.00 Kansas City 3% bonds, 1972-73 maturity at par.

Brother Zupan moved to place the remaining \$50,000.00 in FHA mortgages in Chicago, selection to be made from the \$100,000.00 worth of these mortgages which were submitted at this meeting. The motion was seconded and carried unanimously.

Brother Petrovich inquired about good industrial and utility bonds and emphasized that Moody's Service was of the opinion that we could purchase

same without any harm to the Society's investment portfolio. Other members of the Committee discussed the advisability of going into this field.

The Committee next went over the standing orders to sell the following bonds: Jonesboro, Arkansas School District; Brevard County, Florida, Special Road and Bridge District, Dade County, Florida, Tamiami Highway, Pasco County Highland Special Road District, bids will be sought on these. Sumter County, Florida, were ordered sold. Robstown, Texas, Certificates have not been disposed of as yet.

It was agreed to hold the Jones County, North Carolina, Bonds.

The meeting was adjourned at 4 p. m.

Take It — or Leave It

Hitting the Nail on the Head

It is only once in a great while that one happens upon an article written as intelligently and frankly as that by Pearl S. Buck in the August issue of Harper's. The article is entitled "America's Medieval Women."

Miss Buck, who has concentrated her energies on writing about China, has now turned her attention to the American woman. During the past few years she has made it a point to know women in business, housewives, artists, and young and old women in city and country.

She has come to the general conclusion that women in America are very badly treated, that they are an unhappy lot, and that men still cling to the old, old tradition that woman's place is in the home.

The American woman, if she is an intelligent, modern American woman, is unhappy because the old, old tradition will not recognize that a woman has a right to be herself, says Miss Buck.

"Educated woman cannot be kept in four walls—even satin-lined, diamond-studded walls—without discovering sooner or later that they are still a prison wall." American woman has been trained physically and intellectually to contribute her share to business, the arts, the sciences, and then tradition slams the door in her face and tells her that "her place is in the home."

Kathe Kollwitz is now living "somewhere" in the slums of Berlin after leaving the German academy, along with others, when Thomas Mann was expelled.

The author does not spare criticism of a great mass of American women, however. She condemns their "impersonalities, their perverseness, their headstrongness, their utter selfishness, their smallness of mind and outlook, their lack of any sense of responsibility toward society, even to be pleasant. And their laziness—look

at the motion-picture houses, the theaters, the lecture halls—crowded all day with women!"

One of the errors, Miss Buck points out, is that all women are judged simply as a woman, and all men are considered simply as one of the men. And one of the most common ways for a man to judge all women is to pass such judgment simply because he knows only one woman—his wife.

"To educate women as we do for our present state of traditionalism is to put new wine into old bottles. A good deal of ferment is going on. Amiable, ignorant, bovine women make much better mothers than neurotic college graduates."

Here are thought-provoking statements. If you count yourself an intelligent woman—or man—you will certainly place this article in the current Harper's magazine on your must list.

A Woman Artist

It is with a sense of satisfaction, then, after reading Miss Buck's estimate of woman's ability, that one finds a hearty appraisal of Kathe Kollwitz, the German artist.

The Chicago Daily News art critic says, "She is the 'grand old woman' of German Expressionism, just past 71—ranking in genius with the best of the men."
