Tekom minulega leta je bilo 429 članov in članic poškodovanih in operiranih. Skupne poškodninske in operacijske podpore se je plačalo \$42,925. Trdi se slučaji v znesku \$300 niso bili plačani, to pa iz razloga, ker so listine dospele v urad že tekom tega leta.

Smislon pravil plača v poškodninski in operacijski sklad vsak član in članica mesečno 13 centov. Ta asesment ne zadoštuje. Da se je zamoglo izplačila izvršiti in podporo izplačati, ne da bi se razpisal poseben asesment, se je do vrednjem glavnega odbora iz sklada izrednih podpor izposošljalo \$4,000.

Da bo to popolnomjasno, želim omeniti to-le: Na Joliet Trust & Savings banki je bil vložen denar neplačanih posmrtnin. Tekom leta je bilo treba izplačati razne smrtninske deleže dediščem, ki so določili legalno starost, ali pa varuhom nedoletnih dedičev. Ker je banka prenehala s poslovanjem, so se ti smrtninski deleže izplačali iz stroškovnega skladu, tako da dedičem ni bilo treba čakati za denar.

Ko smo pa prejeli denar iz omajnjene banke, se je omenjena svota \$10,257.21 zopet vrnila v stroškovni sklad. To sem omenil zato, da ne bi kateri misil, da je bil vsled te transakcije stroškovni sklad kaj oškodovan.
