The supreme secretary's office, consequently, is at the present time occupied with detailed work in the compilation of the report. Therefore, officers and individual members who did not as yet receive an answer to their recent communications with the supreme office, are requested to please be considerate, for replies to the various communications will be made shortly.

**IRREGULAR TEETH**

**CHICKEN SALAD SANDWICHES**

Chop fine white meat of chicken. Make a dressing of salt, pepper 2 tablespoons salad oil and 1 of strained lemon juice. Stir this thoroughly with the chicken. Let stand in ice box for an hour, then spread upon lightly buttered thin slices of white bread. Spread a slice with the mixture, sprinkle with chopped pecan or walnut meats, then press on a buttered slice of bread.

**FRIED CHICKEN SANDWICHES**

Use whatever is left over from a roast or boiled chicken. Melt in the skillet a tablespoon of butter. Cut the chicken in small pieces, but do not chop or mince. Beat an egg with 1/2 teaspoon of milk. Stir the cold chicken in this and drop by spoonfuls in the butter. Fry to a golden brown and drain. Mix 1 1/2 tablespoons butter with 1/2 teaspoon lemon juice and a little cayenne. Spread 1 slice of white bread with this, and lightly butter second slice, then put some of the fried chicken between. Makes a very substantial sandwich, and uses up all left over chicken.

## NOVEL DERBY FEATURE AT WORLD'S EXPOSITION

An egg-laying derby in which hens from all parts of the United States and from foreign lands will compete for honors will be one of the features of Chicago's 1933 World's Fair—A Century of Progress Exposition.

Champion hens from 28 states of the Union, the Dominion of Canada and four nations abroad have already been entered. This contest, the first ever to be held in connection with a world's fair, is sponsored by the National Poultry Council.

The egg-laying contest will last for six months. The birds will be housed in the exhibit the first week in April. The actual egg counting will begin May 1, or one month before the formal opening of the exposition. It will end Oct. 29, two days prior to the closing of the fair.

One hundred pointed arch houses, each divided into two pens, will accommodate the 200 entries. In addition, 30 houses and pens near the contest buildings will house specimen flocks of unusual varieties of domestic and wild, land and water fowl.

It is planned to hatch out baby chicks from the eggs laid each week as long as they are salable. Thereafter the daily collection of fresh laid eggs will be purchased by Chicago hotels and housewives. The sale of chicks and eggs will help defray the expenses of the contest.
