Mož ameriške državljanke

Vprašanje: Ako se ženska, ki je ameriška državljanka, poroči z inozemcem v inozemstvu, ali njen inozemski soprog pravico priti v Združene države brez oziroma na kvoto?

Odgovor: Ker ste ameriški državljani po očetovi naturalizaciji, smete zaprositi za spričevalo derivativnega državljanstva, to pa le tedaj, ko ste dosegli starost 21 let.

Za prošnje za "Certificate of derivative citizenship" služi tiskovina Form 2400. Pristojbina znaša \$5. Drugače pa moreno dokazati svoje državljanstvo, ki se je poročil kasneje, uživa le prednost v kvoti. Ameriški konzuli brez izjemne zahtevajo od vseh prisilcev, da vstopljeno v Združene države brez oziroma na kvoto?

Odgovor: On pridobi tako pravico le tedaj, ako se je poročila izvršila pred dne 1. julija 1932. Inozemski soprog ameriške državljanke, ki se je poročil kasneje, uživa le prednost v kvoti. Ameriški konzuli brez izjemne zahtevajo od vseh prisilcev, da vstopljeno v Združene države brez oziroma na kvoto?

Odgovor: Podaljšanje dovoljenja

Vprašanje: Pripuščen sem bil v Združene države za dobo šest mesecov, rad bi pa dalje ostal. Kako naj dobim dovoljenje?

Odgovor: Poslati morate prošnjo za podaljšanje roka začasnega bivanja na priseljeniško oblast v onem pristanišču, kamor ste prišli. Ako je inozemski potni list še vedno veljavien in se razlogi za podaljšanje zdijo upravičeni, se vam bržko dovolji, da ostanete dalje za gotovo dobro. Prošnjo morate podpisati pred notarjem in poslati oblasti v doličnem pristanišču nekrej do 30 dni in ne kasneje do 15 dni pred dnevnem, ko poteka rok, do katerega vam je bilo dovoljeno, da ostanete tukaj.

And incidentally the SNPJ members of Michigan are also set on rallying to this affair and bustin' things wide open, for they have been in their shell for these many years, for working conditions have been anything but good for such a long time. But since things are picking up, they are a little more optimistic. So get out your old green bonnet and umbrella and hike it into Detroit for Labor Day.

We have many beautiful and interesting sights to show you, and you ought to have plenty of time doing it THREE WHOLE DAYS.

Detroit is the largest Automobile City in the world and contains many other industries. We have here the largest plant in the world, the Ford Motor Co. in River Rouge. Other plants include Chrysler, General Motors, Briggs, Murray's, Caddillac, Lincoln, Packard, etc. The beautiful parks and boulevards are the pride of Detroiters. One of the most popular parks is Belle Isle, and many interesting sights can be seen here.

Then we also have the Detroit-Windsor Tunnel and the Ambassador Bridge, Briggs Stadium, Fords Rotunda, Greenfield Village, State Fair Grounds, Fort Wayne, Detroit Zoo and many others, too numerous to mention.

As for Detroit itself, our readers will be interested to know that Detroit is not built in block formation, but rather on a Half-Wheel basis, with the Hub being the City Hall or Downtown Detroit. From this point spokes are formed by the following streets:

Help to Organize Juvenile Circles— Glaring Inconsistencies

A report, somewhat belated, from Luzerne, Pa., informs us that the first SNPJ Juvenile Circle in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania has been organized there. The ice has been broken, therefore, and other Circles in Pennsy will follow. The Luzerne Circle has 36 members, and Sister Mary Bizjak has been selected as its administrator.

Another heartening news item came from Milwaukee, Wis., where an SNPJ Juvenile Circle has been organized under the sponsorship of the Milwaukee SNPJ Federation. There are one hundred members in this Circle.

And so it goes. It is our expectation that news about Juvenile Circles will be forthcoming regularly.

At the summer session of the Supreme Board two weeks ago, a long discussion was held on Juvenile Circles—proof that the Board considered the topic of Circles an important one. A by-laws to govern SNPJ Juvenile Circles were approved, and the financial angle was considered. The recommendation of some of the Supreme Board members that the Circle members should be given some form of insignia, badges, or caps, was referred to the Supreme Executive Committee.

A motion was passed to give the Juvenile Circles a special and appropriate name. The name by which they are to be called will be selected by the juveniles themselves through a contest in the Mladinski List. The Supreme Executive Committee decided that a special prize of five dollars will be awarded to the boy or girl of the SNPJ Juvenile department who suggests the best name for the SNPJ Juvenile Circles. This contest will be conducted during the month of October; the announcement will be published in the October issue of the Mladinski List.

Lodge officers, as well as parents, are urged to take action and cooperate in organizing new Circles. Now that the form, business, and other work of these Circles has taken shape, they should grow rapidly in every town where a capable leader for such an enterprise is available.
