Na igrišču se je zbral tudi okoli 250 okoličanov in sosedov.

Ko je bila uradna slovesnost otvorite končana, je množica pritisnila proti stojnicu z okrečili. Dva odrasla sta se pri tem sprla in stepla, policaj, ki je bil navzoč, ju je hotel pomiriti. Rev. James Cook je svojim mladim sodelavec, ki so prišli v župnišče pri njegovi cerkvi Dobrega pastirja, dejal: Sedaj veste, komu je to podobno... Vi niste bili napadeni kot posamezniki, bili ste žrtve geta. Kljub briški preskušnji so fantje izjavili, da bodo ostali do konca programa.

Castrovci streljali na poslanstvo ZDA v Londonu?

LONDON, Vel. Brit. — Scotland Yard je začela stikati zatojno špansko revolucionarno skupino, ki naj bi bila baje odgovorna za streljanje na vrata ameriškega poslanstva tu preteklo nedeljo. Na poslanstvo so streljali s strojnico iz avtomobila, v katerem so bili trije moški. Izginili so, predno jih je mogla policija ustanoviti.

Letaki, ki so jih natrosili, in pismo, ki ga je prejel Reuter v ponedeljek, kaže, da so napad organizirali pristaši Castra na Kubi. Sami sebe so napadalci označili za First May Group of Revolutionary Solidarity Movement. Cilj napada naj bi bila "ustavitev zločinskih umorov ameriške armade".

Ali se je treba bati kitajskega posega v Severni Vietnam?

C L E V E L A N D, O. — To vprašanje je zopet postalno po reče vsaj za naše generale in politike. Predsednik Johnson je namreč dovolil našemu vojnemu letalstvu, da bombardira strateške točke v Severnem Vietnamu prav ob kitajski meji. Naše vojno letalstvo je to pravico že izrabilo in bombardiralo želesnico, ki vodi iz Hanoia na Kitajsko, prav ob vietnamsko-kitajski meji. Pravi čudež bi bil, da ne bi pri tem ameriška letala prišla tudi na kitajsko stran in celo tam odvrgla svoje bombe. Pri današnji hitrosti vojnega letal mora človek to pričakovati prav vsak trenutek. Dejansko se je to že parkrat zgodilo, tako trdi Amerika; Kitajska pa pravi, da so ameriška letala bila na kitajskem nebu še več kot stotkrat. Kdo ima prav?

Da so takri vdori naših vojnih letal na kitajsko stran za komunistični režim prava izvajanja, tega ne bi mogel nihče tajiti. Vprašanje pa je, kako bodo kitajski komunisti na to reagirali. Pri tem uidejo vse misli takoj na korejsko vojno. Tudi takrat so Kitajci misili, da morajo videti v našem vojskovjanju ob reki Yalu nevarnost za njihovo

varnost, in se vmešali v korejsko vojno. Posledice kitajskega vmešavanja čutimo še danes ne samo v razdeljeni Koreji, ampak tudi v politični napetosti v vzhodni Aziji. Zato je tem važnejše vprašanje, ali se kai takega lahko ponovi tudi v Severnem Vietnamu.

Kot zmeraj, govori nekaj razlogov za tako možnost, nekaj pa proti. Razlogov, ki govorijo proti, je trenutno več. Predvsem ne silijo ameriške čete niti v Severni Vietnamu, kaj sele na Kitajsko. V Severnem Vietnamu nima dalje Amerika nobenih utrijevnih postojank in tudi ne misli nanje. Naša administracija je dalje netočnotek izjavila, da nima ničesar iskati v Severnem Vietnamu in da ne misli tja poslati svojih oboroženih sil. Če bi jih hotela, bi bila to že davno storila.

Vpoštovati je tudi treba, da je pri vdoru kitajskih čet v Korejo igral veliko vlogo tudi Stalinov nasvet, kajti Moskva in Peiping sta igrala takrat na istem političnem klavirju. Danes sta obe rdeči velesili sprti skupaj skoraj do dna, pri čemur je Moskva veliko bolj zainteresirana na svetov-

Ravnov v tem je pa tudi nevarnost, ki je ob korejski vojni ni bilo.

AMERIKA IN SOVJETIJA SE DOGOVORILI O MEJI ATOMSKE OBOROŽITVE

Včeraj sta predložili razorozitveni konferenci v Ženevi v Švici načrt mednarodne pogodbe, ki prepoveduje atomskim silam predajo atomskega orožja in znanja o njegovi izdelavi nematomske silam. Upajo, da bo dogovor očoren in podpisani nekje v začetku prihodnjega leta, četudi je težavno vprašanje nadziranja njegovega izvajanja še odprt.

ZENEVA, Šv. — Po petih letih razgovorov je končno prišlo med Združenimi državami in Sovjetsko zvezo do sporazuma o predlogu za mednarodno pogodbo, ki naj prepreči širjenje atomskega vodikovega orožja na države, ki tega še nima. Včeraj sta predstavniki ZDA W. Foster in predstavnik ZSSR A. Roščin izročila razorozitveni konferenci enaka predloga za tako pogodbo v obravnavo. Predlog prepoveduje atomskim silam predajo atomskega orožja in znanja o njegovi izdelavi državam, ki takega orožja še nimajo. Tako naj bi bilo to omejeno na Ameriko, Sovjetijo, Veliko Britanijo, Francijo in rdečo Kitajsko. Zadnji dve se razgovorov v Ženevi ne udeležujeta, vendar pričakujejo, da bo Francija v doglednem času pogodbo podpisala, Kitajska pa se jo verjetno vsaj držala.

V predlogu pogodbe je ostal člen 3., ki govorji o nadziranju izvajanja pogodbe, kadar bi bila podpisana, brez besedila, ker se predlagateljci nista mogli o tem sporazumeti. Sovjetska zveza hoče, da prevzame nadziranje Mednarodna agencija za atomske reaktorce na Dunaju, v kateri je zastopana tudi Sovjetska zveza, med tem ko se zahodnoevropske države temu upirajo, če da bi dobila Sovjetska zveza na ta način možnost vohunjenja o tehniki atomskih reaktorjev v teh državah. Zato so te države, predvsem Zahodna Nemčija na stališču, da naj njihove atomske reaktorce nadzira EURATOM. Atomska agencija Evropske gospodarske skupnosti. Taka rešitev seveda ni všeč Sovjetiji, ki trdi, da bi se to reklo, do države zavodljiva. Ameriški zastopnik Foster je kljub temu izrazil upanje, da bo dosežen sporazum med vsemi prizadetimi in da bo pogodba nekje v začetku prihodnjega leta podpisana.

Zadnje vesti

COLUMBUS, O. — Predstavniški dom je izglasoval včeraj povisjanje prodajnega davka od 3 na 4% v zakonskem predlogu, ki naj prinese državi Ohio 300 milijonov dolarjev za javno šolstvo. Predlog je sedaj pred konferenco Doma in Senata.

SAIGON, J. Viet. — Ameriške letalske sile so izgubile včeraj nad Severnim Vietnamom letalo Thunderchief, ko so bombardirala vojaške cilje na področju Hanoi-Hajfong in na področju ob kitajski meji.

KAIRO, Egipt. — Predsednik vlade Sudana Mahgoub je objavil včeraj tu, da sta Savdija in Egipt sprejela njegov predlog za končanje državljske vojne v Jemenu, ki se drži v glavnem dogovora iz Jidda. V Jemenu pojde na mesto egiptovskih čet sudanske, alžirske in tunizijske. Pod njihovim varstvom bo nato izvedeno ljudsko glasovanje, ki naj odloči o bodoči ureditvi Jemena.

HONG KONG. — S kitajsko strani je prišlo včeraj do ponovni vpad preko 17 milij dolge meje na področje Hong Konga. Britanske kolonialne čete, ki jih sestavljajo nepalski Gurke, so napadale vselej pognele s solzivnimi in dimnimi bombami nazaj preko meje.

LONDON, Vel. Brit. — Vse kaže, da v poslanstvu rdeče Kitajske tu sežigajo dokumente, kar je običajno priprava za prekinitev diplomatskih odnosov. Ali bo to tega prišlo ali ne, zavisi od Peipinga. V Londonu trdijo, da bodo klub vsemu pustili svoje zastavstvo v Peipingu.

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Bruno v lastnem očesu

V Svobodni Sloveniji, ki izhaja v Buenos Airesu v Argentini, je njen sodelavec iz Gorice objavil članek, ki ostavlja trd boj milijona in pol keltskih Bretoncev v Franciji za obrambo njihovega jezika. Članek je lep primer sestopisemskega svarila o tem, kako radi vidimo iver v očesu svojega brata, bruna v svojem lastnem pa ne!

Zadnji podvigi francoskega predsednika gen. De Gaulle na obisku v Kanadi so vzbudili po vsem svetu veliko pozornost in so gotovo precej omajali njegov osebni ugled v mednarodnih krogih. Poleg tega so tudi vrgli temno senco na Francijo samo, saj je francoska vlada popolnoma potrdila generalove teze in s tem jasno pokazala svojo "jezikovno" imperialistično težnjo po frankofonski veličini!

Prav zadnje dni pa so se pojavili za Francoe neprjeti odmevi generalovega zadržanja in to v Franciji sami. De Gaulle je zahteval "svobodo" za francosko govoreče Kanadčane, ni pa pomislil, da ima Francija sama tudi nekaj odstotkov resnično jezikovno nesvobodnega prebivalstva. Med temi so prav keltski Bretonci na severozahodnih državah in ti so ob tej priliki zahtevali zase to, kar je francoski predsednik zahteval za že svobodne kanadske Francoze. Francija je bila vedno znana kot izrazito centralistično urejena država, zato sploh uradno ni priznala obstoja nefrancosko govorečih skupin, in je v tem še mnogo slabša od drugih držav z narodnimi manjšinami.

Lansko poletje se je vršil v Gorici kongres Evropske zveze narodnih manjšin, četudi le neuradno, ker ga je rimska vlada prepovedala. Zbralo se je pa vseeno veliko število delegatov z vseh strani zahodne in severne Evrope. Tako sem imel priliko seznaniti se tudi z nekaterimi delegati bretonskih skupnosti v Franciji, ki so mi marsikaj zanimivego povedali o položaju te keltske skupin.

Dandanes živi v Bretoniji približno 1,400,000 Bretoncev, ki še govore keltski jezik, od skupno nekaj nad tri milijone prebivalcev te dežele. Od francoske revolucije sem bretonski jezik sploh ni užival nikakega uradnega priznanja. Šele leta 1870 je nekaj izobražencev zahtevalo poučevanje bretonskega jezika (med njimi tudi Charles De Gaulle, stric sedanjega predsednika). V začetku tega stoletja je nezadovoljstvo vedno bolj naraščalo in vrstile so se peticije pariških vlad za priznanje osnovnih pravic Bretoncev. Poznejši predsednik republike Doumergue je zavrnil zahtevo po poučevanju bretonščine, češ da bi to podpiralo separatistične težnje v Bretoniji. Leta 1911 pa je nastala bretonsko nacionalistična stranka. Vladni predstavniki so bili do bretonskih zahtev vedno bolj nerazpoloženi. L. 1952 je prosvetni minister javno izjavil, da mora zaradi francoske enotnosti bretonski jezik izginuti!

Medtem so med bretonskimi rodoljubi ter izobraženci nastale razne kulturnopolitične organizacije za obrambo narodnih in jezikovnih pravic. Po dolgotrajnih prizadevanjih in z nezanimanjem francoske vlade so šele po zadnjem vojnem letu 1951 v francoskem parlamentu odobrili zakon, po katerem so dovolili vstop v državne šole raznim deželnim jezikom, med njimi bretonskemu in baskovskemu. Seveda pa so bile tudi pri tem velikanske omejitve. Dovolili so le minimalno število ur pouka, ni bilo na razpolago sredstev za učbenike, pouk bretonskega jezika sam pa je bil postavljen čisto na zadnje mesto. Še pred nekaj leti so ministrske oblasti skušale še bolj omejiti poučevanje bretonskega jezika kljub zakonskim predpisom. Pouk bretonskega jezika se je vršil v različni, a vedno skrčeni meri na osnovni in srednji šoli. Jasno, da je bil pouk vedno le neobvezen. Kar se tiče visokih šol, ima univerza v Rennesu stolico za keltščino, in še ta je edina v Franciji.

Seveda je le malo število šol, ki je res uvedlo pouk bretonščine. Tudi na katoliških šolah ni bila usoda malega jezika bolj cveča. Stalno pa so uradne oblasti indirektno pritiskale na starše, češ da bretonski jezik ni važen, da nima nikake praktične veljave itd., in s tem so odtujili prizadeve od pouka materinskega jezika.

Bretonci sami govore zato o kulturnem genocidu. Bretonski jezik nima vstopa v upravno življenje, na sodišča (razen tolmača v skrajnih sili) in še duhovščina se vedno bolj oddaljuje od njegove uporabe. Milijon ljudi bretonskega jezika lahko sliši v materinščini samo polurno tedensko radijsko oddajo folklorne vsebine... Iz vsega je torej jasno razvidno, da je izginotje manjšinskih jezikov, ki jih še govore na francoskem ozemlju, eden izmed temeljnih ciljev francoske oblasti. Kot v 19. stoletju, še dandanes francoske množice izvajajo jezikovni imperializem nasprotni posameznim deželnim kulturam.

Te in podobne izjave so prihajale iz ust bretonskih predstavnikov. Francija, ki je dala Evropi in svetu veliko šte-

vilo odličnih duhov in učiteljev svobodoljubja ter enakosti in bratstva, ne zna svojim podanikom zagotoviti osnovnih kulturnih pravic. Ali naj bo taka "Evropa domovin", kot si jo zamišla stari francoski general?

Papež Hadrijan je to tudi potrdil.

Naša župnija — Marijinega Vnebovzetja v Collinwoodu — pa je še ostala slovenska. Ali se zavedamo prednosti in odlike, ki nam je s tem podeljena? Naš novi gospod župnik Rev. Viktor Tomc se trudi, da bi obdržal slovenski značaj župnije. Vsi slovenski verniki mu moramo biti za to hvaležni in mu pomagati pri njegovih prizadevanjih.

Trenutno se g. župnik trudi, da bi uvelodil ljudske petje pri sv. maši ob osmih. Narocil je večje število molitvenikov "NAŠA DARITEV". Molitvenik je ponatis sv. maše iz Rimskega misala. Knjižica je vezana in tanka, tako da jo lahko shranimo v žep ali pa v ročno torbico. Ponatis so oskrbeli Slovenci v Trstu. To je že peta izdaja tega molitvenika, kar pomeni, da se Slovenci tega molitvenika lepo poslužujejo.

Molitvenik "Naša daritev" ima poleg sv. maše tudi izbor pesmi za ljudske petje. Pesmi so označene s številkami v rdeči barvi, da jih je lahko najti.

Po novi liturgični konstituciji nas hoči sv. Cerkev približati prvimi časom krščanstva, ko je srečna prihajala — k lomljenju kruga — k sv. maši — in s himnami in slavospevi častila Boga kot verska skupnost, ne kot skupek posameznikov.

Po vseh župnih so že takoj prvo adventno nedeljo leta 1964, ko smo začeli izvajati navodila nove liturgične konstitucije, začeli tudi z ljudske petjem. To ni bil zanje noben problem. Naša župnija skoraj po treh letih tega še nismo dosegli.

Kdo vlada na Kitajskem?

LONDON, Ang. — To se sprašujejo diplomati, ki skušajo slediti dogodkom na Kitajskem. Vse polno znakov govorji namreč, da oblast Maove struje hitro propada. Ministrski predsednik Ču-En-laj se trudi, da bi pomiril sprte tovariše, pa se mu le redkokdaj posreči. To je znamenje, da število Maovih nasprotnikov raste in da ti postajajo zmeraj bolj samozavestni. Nekateri med diplomati celo misljijo, da Maova skupina ni več sposobna, da bi branila tuja poslanstva v Peipingu.

Bili so časi, ko so tovarisi iz Maove okolice naravnost organizirali napade na diplomatska zastopstva in posamezne diplome, za kar so navadno rabili rdečo gardo. Peipinska mladina se je na te napade tako navadila, da misli, da sedaj lahko opravlja to delo kar sama. Zato se je kitajska zunanjša politika razdelila na dva dela: deloma jo vodijo kitajski diplomatje v zunanjem ministrstvu, deloma pa rdeča garda na peipinskih učilicah. Garda je postala pri svojem poslu zelo goreča, jemlje zmeraj več poslaništva na tarčo, se ne zadovoljuje le z ruskim, angleškim, jugoslovanskim itd.; že sedaj napadla tudi ceylonsko

in kenijsko, kakor hitro je nameč zvedela, da Ceylon in Kenija ne mislita zmeraj tako, kot to želi Maov režim.

Indija bi rabila \$1-3 bilijone pomoči

Naša dežela je dala po I. 1951 Indiji vsega skupaj \$7.7 bilijonov v obliki posojil in daril, največ v deželnih pridelkih. Letos bo Indija potrebovala nekaj manj hrane, ker je bilo kar dosti dežja in pričakujejo izredno dobro letino. Ta pri vsem tem ne bo tako velika, da bi mogla prerediti prebivalstvo. Uvoz pšenice bo še zmeraj potreben.

Zakon o pokojninhah prišel pred senat

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Predstavnški dom je že izglasoval zakon o novih pokojninhah z besedilom, ki ga je predlagal kongresnik Mills. Besedilo pa ne odgovarja željam federalne administracije. Sedaj ga je dobil v roke senatni finančni odbor.

Tam bo administracija poskusila omiliti besedilo, v boju je počnala federalnega tajnika za zdravstveno in socijalno politiko Gardnerja ter njegovega pomočnika Cohen. Zagovarjala sta potrebo, da naj povišanje pokojnine znaša 15%. Želite tudi, da senat ne pristane na razne omejitve v podpiranju revjev, ki jih je sklenil predstavnški dom. Ni pa upanja, da se bo senat oziral na želje administracije, bo verjetno pristal na Domovo besedilo vsaj v važnejših točkah.

LONDON, Vel. Brit. — Strokovni krogri tu trdijo, da je egyptovski diktator Naser pognal v oboroženih sil ali pa zaprl okoli tisoč oficirjev, med njimi celo vrsto višjih, ki naj bi bili odgovorni za poraz v vojni izraelom. Podpredsednik maršal Abdul Hakim Amer, ki je bil tudi namestnik glavnega poveljnika Naserja, je bil v večino svojih ožjih sodelavec "upokojjen", nekateri od njih pa so se znašli kar v ječi.

Zaprta naj bi bila med drugimi poveljničko letalstvo gen. Sidki Mahmud in obrambni minister Shams Badran.

Tolikšna čistka oficirjev bo Naserju še bolj otežila obnovno oboroženih sil, ker je več tisoč egyptovskih oficirjev še v izraelskem vojnem ujetništvu.

Maov pomočnik ukazal rdečim gardistom, naj se drže svojih učilnic

HONG KONG. — Minister za javno varnost Husieh Fu-chih, eden od ožjih sodelavcev v veliki proletarski kulturni revoluciji, je na zborovanju rdeče Garde v Peipingu preteklo sredo pozval mlaude rdeče gardiste, naj ostanejo v svojih učilnicah in končajo "notranji boj". Vsebinsko ministrovega govora sta objavila peipinski radio in "Ljudski dnevnik" glavno glasilo Kitajske Komunistične partije.

Hsieh je pozval rdeče gardiste, naj ostanejo v svojih šolah in svoj napor usmerijo v kritiko Maovih nasprotnikov in nasprotnikov njegovega nauka, ki se zbirajo okoli Liu-Shao-chija. Sedaj ni več potreben, da rdeči gardisti hodijo na "dolge pohode izmenjavat svojo revolucionarno skušnjo", kot je bilo to pred enim letom.



Toffee Ice Cream Roll

3/4 cup sifted flour	1 quart vanilla ice cream,
2 tablespoons instant coffee	softened
1/4 teaspoon baking powder	1 cup chopped Heath
4 eggs, separated	chocolate-covered
1 teaspoon vanilla	English toffee bars
3/4 cup granulated sugar	1/2 pint (1 cup) whipping
	cream, whipped

Sift together flour, coffee, baking powder and salt. Beat egg yolks and vanilla until lemon colored. Add 1/4 cup sugar gradually and beat until very thick. Beat egg whites until they hold soft peaks. Add remaining 1/2 cup sugar gradually and continue beating until stiff and glossy. Fold yolk mixture into egg whites. Fold in dry ingredients. Spread batter evenly over greased and waxed paper-lined jelly roll pan (15x10x1-inch). Bake in 375°F. oven until done, about 12 minutes. Turn cake out onto clean flannel dish towel sprinkled with confectioners' sugar. Gently peel off waxed paper at once and trim off the lengthwise crusts. Roll cake jelly-roll fashion in towel; cool on rack. Unroll cake; spread with ice cream and sprinkle with 2/3 cup chopped toffee bars. Roll up tightly, wrap in foil and store in freezer until serving time. To serve, slice and top with a dollop of whipped cream and a sprinkling of remaining chopped toffee bars for each slice. Yield: 8 to 10 servings.

PAL Campaign Launched

A fund drive to raise \$200,000 to maintain and expand neighborhood youth centers operated by PAL (Police Athletic League) was launched recently by Raymond E. Channock, corporate fund chairman of PAL.

"To be effective," said Channock, who is president of The National Acme Company, "law and order require enforcement, respect, understanding, and support. Business and industry need a community atmosphere in which these factors are brought together for maximum realization of our city's real growth potential.

"In recent months we've seen matters going from bad to worse as far as respect for law and order are concerned. Civil disorders typified by the Hough riots of last year, and several incidents so far this year probably can be avoided if the business leaders of the community make a determined effort to face the problem realistically. Each of us must expend every effort and play whatever part is necessary to avert further acts of disobedience.

"Neighborhood youth centers operated by PAL have for several years been one of the most effective means of combating juvenile delinquency and securing better understanding between youth and law enforcement agencies. Recently, several of these centers have had to be closed because a substantial federal grant was terminated.

"Orly by launching a \$200,000 campaign to secure funds for the operation and expansion of such centers can we hope to stem the tide against a rising wave of juvenile delinquency and restore respect for law and order in Cleveland."

Refresher Courses For Retired Nurses

Because a similar program was such a success last spring, St. Vincent Charity Hospital will hold another three-week refresher course for nurses, Sept. 18 thru Oct. 6.

The program is another effort on the part of the Hospital to bring "retired" nurses back to the hospital patients' bedside.

Last spring's program attracted 33 nurses of which several have returned to work either on a full-time or part-time basis in Greater Cleveland Hospitals.

Sister M. Maurice, the Hospital's Acting Director of Nursing Service, said, "all hospitals in the Greater Cleveland area are in need of additional nurses and we are trying to do our part to bring out of retirement those who have given up nursing to either raise a family or for some other reason."

She explained that again, applicants for the upcoming refresher course would not be required to sign any agreement to work at the conclusion of the course or any other stipulation.

Primarily an evening program, it will be held three days a week from 6:30 p.m. to 9:30 p.m. at the Hospital. In addition, clinical experience will be conducted several times a week for eight additional hours so that the nurse may choose two sessions per week which are convenient for her.

The classroom instruction, which will be given by members of the Hospital's Nursing Service Department and faculty members of the School of Nursing, will center on new nursing trends, medications and treatments, plus a review of nursing fundamentals.

Record 55,000,000 Audience Say Telecast of All-Star Game

The largest television audience ever to view a baseball game outside the World Series — a record 55,000,000 persons — watched the All-Star Game on July 11.

Commissioner William Eckert said the midsummer attraction, nationally televised from Anaheim, drew an estimated 49.9 percent of the TV audience throughout the nation. Essentially, this means that the game was viewed on 23,800,000 of the total sets in use at the time.

The National League won the 15-inning game, 2-1.

According to NBC, which recently signed a \$50,000,000 three-year contract for exclusive rights to coverage of the World Series, All-Star Game and the Game of the Week, the 1967 All-Star contest had a 25.6 Nielsen rating. This figure amounts to one-fourth of the total number of TV sets in the country.

Banks Now Second Only To Anson in Cub Hits

Chicago, Ill. — The ageless Ernie Banks has passed another milestone in his fabulous career. On August 11 he singled against the Phillies for hit No. 2,194 to break a tie with Stan Hack and put him second on the all-time Cub list for most hits.

The only one ahead of him is Cap Anson, who played before the turn of the century. He had 3,081 hits.


Umps to Say If Weather Is Okay to Start Games

U. of Minn., Yugoslavia Set Exchange Program

Minneapolis, Minn. — A cooperative research program has been established by the University of Minnesota Center for Immigration Studies and the Center of Studies of the History of Slovene Emigration in Ljubljana, Yugoslavia.

The program will facilitate an exchange of information between the University and the Yugoslavian center, which is sponsored by the Slovene Academy of Sciences and Arts.

Each research center will provide visiting scholars full encouragement and full access to all materials which are open to research by its own students. Professor Timothy Smith is the rector of the re-

sult of conferences, held over a three-year period, between Professor Smith and Professor Fran Zwitser, Director of the Center of Studies in Slovenia. Smith is professor of history and education and a member of the Minnesota Center.

Professor Smith, who is conducting a three-year study of emigration, education and social change among migrating villagers from Central Europe, plans to do research in Ljubljana in the winter of 1968. Rudolph Susel, a research associate with the Minnesota Center, is studying in Ljubljana this summer.

The program also involves the cooperation of the National University Library in Ljubljana. Mrs. Mary Molek, curator of Immigrant Archives at the University of Minnesota, and Dr. Jaroslav Dolan, director of the library in Yugoslavia, have set up a program for the exchange of publications related to Slovanes in America and microfilm copies of newspapers.

The Minnesota Center has similar cooperative arrangements with other educational institutions and libraries in Yugoslavia and in Hungary.

The official opening of the Fair will be at 7:30 p.m., Thursday, Sept. 7, and booths will remain open until 9:30 p.m. The hours for Friday, Sept. 8, will be from 10 a.m. to 9:30 p.m., and on Saturday, Sept. 9, from 10:00 a.m. to 6 p.m.

Radio station WXEN will be broadcasting live from the Fair.



ALL AROUND WINNER

Considering that electricity is one of the prime movers of modern civilization, it is indeed fortunate that electric service comes so near to being totally dependable. The investor-owned companies may have their faults and problems. Among the latter is competition from government-owned or subsidized power suppliers, not to mention other sources of energy. But, failure and the consequent disruption of a vital service is no more acceptable to a utility than defeat is to the Marines.

Just how great a stake the country has in a strong and growing electric industry, not only from the standpoint of unfailing reliability of service, but also from the standpoint of overall economic impact, is revealed by a series of advertisements of one of the larger investor-owned, taxpaying companies. In one of these advertisements, the company reported that its tax bill for 1966 was \$42.2 million and pointed out that this would build 136 new schools or 42 miles of the interstate highway system. This company, in addition to paying federal income, state income and state property taxes, makes payments to 154 counties, 444 cities and 180 school and fire districts.

The local investor-owned utility is one of a community's largest taxpaying companies — a fact that those who criticize the industry are careful never to mention. But, it may explain why the public has expressed a preference for the taxpaying, investor-owned systems over tax-financed, politically-managed, public systems. And, when it comes to service, the taxpaying electric industry is a winner — something everyone likes.



Dessert Cheese Ring
(Makes 8 servings)

1 cup cold water	1 (8-oz.) package Eagle Brand
3 tablespoons (3 envelopes) unflavored gelatine	Neufchâtel cheese
1 cup orange juice	1 (3-oz.) package Napoleon
1 cup (8-oz. container) Borden's large or small curd creamed cottage cheese	Brand Roquefort cheese
	1 cup (1/2 pint) heavy cream, whipped

In the top of a double boiler combine water and gelatine; let stand 5 minutes. Place over boiling water. Cook until gelatine is dissolved; stir constantly. Stir in orange juice; cool thoroughly. In large electric mixer bowl combine cottage cheese, Neufchâtel and Roquefort cheeses; beat until smooth. Gradually add gelatine mixture. Beat on low speed until mixture is smooth and evenly blended. Set bowl into ice water. Stir mixture until slightly thickened. Fold in whipped cream. Turn into a lightly oiled 1-1/2-quart ring mold. Chill about 3 hours, or until firm. Unmold onto serving plate. Fill center with orange and grapefruit sections or assorted fruits of your choice.

LAW ENFORCEMENT AND CRIMINAL JUSTICE ACT. Responding to the overwhelming sentiment of the Nation, the House has passed and sent to the Senate H.R. 5037, the Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice Act of 1967. Aimed at the scandalous rise in major crimes throughout the country, the legislation seeks to increase the effectiveness and coordination of law enforcement at all levels of Government. During Floor debate two Republican amendments were adopted which strengthened the Administration bill. The first provided an additional \$25 million specifically earmarked to meet the need of local police officials for training in riot prevention and control, as well as to provide communication between the States relating to persons traveling with the intention of inciting riots. Second, one of the major considerations was whether to give the greatest voice in the use and control of funds provided by the Act to the Attorney General or to the Governors of the States. As passed by the House, the decision favored the State Governors. There was concern lest a national police force would be established if we left the authority in the hands of the Attorney General. In addition, the States and local communities should train and equip their own police forces. I voted for these amendments and for the bill on final passage. The acceptance of these amendments by a resounding vote (256-147) and the size of the vote on final passage (377-23) suggests wide support from all parts of the country for efforts to arrest the spread of crime and violence.

Color Telecasts Of Ohio State Fair

Ohio Bell has announced plans to sponsor three half-hour color telecasts statewide of the 1967 Ohio State Fair which runs Aug. 24 through Sept. 4.

It is the hope that bringing the Fair to the people via television will again expose the Fair to Ohioans and help make this the biggest and most successful ever.

Television was given major credit by Governor James A. Rhodes for last year's record breaking attendance, which topped the million and a half mark.

One In a Series
Living With Your Heart

More than 20,000,000 Americans are afflicted by heart and blood vessel diseases. These same diseases are responsible for 54 of every 100 deaths in the United States and constitute the major medical challenge of our time.

Since hypertension and atherosclerosis cause about 90% of heart and circulatory disorders, you may be interested in understanding precisely what these terms mean. A good comparison is the plumbing system in your home.

Take, for example, a water pipe in your basement. If the pipe has been in use for a number of years, lime and rust may have accumulated in its bore, narrowing and roughening the normally smooth surface until the flow of water is reduced to a thin stream. One day a chunk of this crusty deposit may block the flow entirely.

Something similar frequently happens to arteries in the human body. The deposit is usually made up of fatty substances, one of them cholesterol. It forms inside the lining of the channel through which the blood flows, narrowing the passageway and diminishing the supply of blood to the tissues the artery supplies. Medically, this condition is called atherosclerosis, or in lay terms, "Hardening of the Arteries".

What happens when the arteries are thickened and narrowed? The blood, as it passes through the roughened channel, has an increased tendency to clot. When a blood clot forms in a narrowed artery, it may block the channel and so block the blood supply. If the clot closes off the coronary artery — the artery that feeds life-giving blood to the heart itself — a "Heart Attack" or coronary occlusion may occur.

That part of the heart tissue deprived of its blood supply quickly dies. If the artery that is closed off is a supply line to a portion of the brain, one of the several forms of "stroke" may occur.

To visualize hypertension, let's go back to the water pipe in the basement, extending it to the front of the house and joining it to a garden hose. When the nozzle of the hose is screwed down to throw the stream farther across the lawn, the narrowing or constricting of the nozzle walls causes the pressure to be increased inside the hose. Many authorities believe the blood pressure in arteries rises for a similar reason, for one of the earliest phenomena in hypertension is a widespread constriction or narrowing of the arterioles, the tiny blood vessels of the blood-distribution network.

When these small vessels are constricted, the channels become smaller and the pressure behind them must increase if the blood is to get through.

And what is the effect of high blood pressure? To force a normal amount of blood into blood vessels that have become constricted, the heart must work harder. Being a muscle, it grows progressively larger and, finally, with years of this extra effort, reaches the point at which it can no longer perform efficiently. Additionally, the effects of hypertension can be found in many parts of the body. Prolonged, severe high blood pressure often involves the kidneys and the brain, for example, as well as the heart.

State law also provides that no person "shall write, print, or publish an account of a lottery or scheme of chance, by whatever name, style, or title... or the price of a ticket, or showing where a ticket may be or has been obtained, or giving publicity to such lottery or scheme of chance."

Penalty for conviction is a fine of not more than \$500, or up to six months in jail, or both. Violators can be prosecuted in each county where such publication is circulated.

While heart attacks and strokes can be fatal, most frequently they are not. Most patients usually recover to lead useful and productive lives. Some physicians have found drugs which retard blood clotting, to be helpful in treating the complications of "Heart Attack". Furthermore, medical science has developed other new drugs to reduce high blood pressure, so that its destructive effects on the heart, blood vessels and vital organs can be controlled. But medical science has not yet perfected tests through which to determine when atherosclerosis has started, how far it has advanced or what arteries it is affecting.
