Doba individualizma v vladu in gospodarstvu se več ne vrne

New York. — (FP) — Po petih letih študiranja socioloških in gospodarskih tokov je komisija za socialno raziskovanje v Šolah objavila poročilo, v katerem pravi, da je individualizma v vladu in narodnem gospodarstvu konec. Svet in predvsem Amerika stopa v dobo kolektivizma.

Poročilo je podpisalo 16 članov komisije, štirje mu pa nasploh nato. Komisijo so tvorili profesorji, med njimi Charles A. Beard, predsednik American Historical asociacije in eden najboljših ameriških zgodovinarjev.

V novi kolektivistični družbi bo privatna svojina omejena ali pa sploh prenehala. Nasledila jo bo javna lastnina. Sedanji sistem privatnega lastništva se lahko ohrani za daljšo dobo le, če bo privatna svojina razdeljena med mase, pravi poročilo.

"Nastajajoča doba je doba prehoda. Spremljajo je velike napetosti, ki nastajajo iz novih tokov porajajoče se integrirane ekonomije in radi tradicionalnih praks zatonevajoče dobe individualizma. Te prehodne boljčine se najbolj očitujejo v posmanjkanju sred Bogastva, v prelomiti zaupanja, v široko razpredenem banditstvu, v slabem aranžmu med produkcijo in distribucijo ter v veliki neenakosti bogastva in dohodkov."

Z drugimi besedami: kapitalizem je na smrt bolan in v njim vred vsa človeška družba. Ta bo ozdravela le s prihodom kolektivizma, ki je svojstvo socializma.

Hitlerjevska Nemčija troši milijone za propagando

Veliko nacijsko mrežo je razpredia po vseh državah, v katere pošilja agitatorje in ogromne vsote denarja

Stockholm. — Glasilo švedske delavske vlade "Socialni demokrat" je zadnje čase priobčilo serijo dobro dokumentiranih člankov, v katerih razkriva mrežo velike nacijske propagande hitlerske Nemčije. Članki so povzročili večjo senzacijo tudi po drugih evropskih državah.

Iz priobčenega materiala je razvidno, da je Hitlerjev propagandni minister Goebbels razpredel fašistično mrežo po vseh važnejših državah. Za svojo propagando je nacijska Nemčija potrošila v Avstriji 15 milijonov mark (dve marki in pol sta en dollar), pet milijonov v Cehoslovaki, poldrug milijon na Holandskem, 750,000 mark v Švici.

Po milijona mark je Goebbels poslal svojim zaupnikom na Švedskem, 700,000 mark v Belgiji, pol milijona v baltiške države, pol milijona v Rumunijo, 200,000 na Dansko in Finsko, dva milijona v Južno in Centralno Ameriko in štiri milijone mark v Združene države in Kanado.

Kar so Hitlerjevi emisari doobili direktno od nemških nacija, ali pa nabrali med privrženci, je ta vsota, ki mora biti velika posebno v Ameriki, že posebej. Avtor teh senzacionalnih člankov ne navaja vsote, katero je Hitler potrošil v Angliji in Franciji, omenja pa, da je vsekakor velika.

Za svojo propagando v tujini se nemška vlada poslužuje tudi paroplovnih družb, ki so izredno zvišale število mornarjev, čeprav je biznis veliko slabši. Tlorišča propagande so tudi nemški konzulati, kjer dobre protekcije in skrivališče številni Hitlerjevi agenti.

Fašistična igra je perfektna. Razni mednarodni kapitalisti so Hitlerju prispevali težke milijone, da se je povpel v sedlo. Zdaj pa Hitler skrbi, da se njegov nordizem in predvsem nacizem razširi tudi po drugih kapitalističnih državah ter jih obvaruje pred — marksisti in židi.

Campaign Record for April

In April, the second month of the official jubilee membership campaign commemorating the thirtieth anniversary of the SNPJ, the campaign resulted in securing 371 newly-acquired members, of whom 185 are new adult members and 186 new juvenile members. Numerically, the net campaign result in both departments for April is the same.

Members of these groups are unfortunately fooled when they permit themselves to be propagandized into thinking that Socialism is against their interests. They will be far better off in the new system, and they should advocate it with all their might.

FASCISM AND RELIGION

Intelligent workers who observe the rise of fascism in Europe know that it has a religious content. In Germany a large section of the Protestant faith is fascist while in Italy and Austria the ruling fascism is of the Catholic type. In the latter two countries' fascism has restored the union of Church and State. Not a week passes that press dispatches do not carry some reference to the religious or church aspects of fascism in one or more nations abroad.

This phase of fascism has the possibility of dividing workers in a way that would play into the hands of fascism in general. Whether a ruling class annexes a Protestant or Catholic church, a scientific or atheist cult, for its own purposes should not divert the attention of the working masses into a futile debate over the faith or cult that is so annexed. No matter what religious or other phase fascism takes, it is the ally of the ruling class and the enemy of the working class. Protestant fascism is not the special enemy of the Catholic worker and Catholic fascism is not special enemy of the Protestant worker. Fascism of whatever type is the enemy of the whole working class and to single out the religious aspect of the given type of fascism and to argue against it on that basis is for workers to play into the hands of the enemy.

In this country we have seen Jewish bankers singled out for condemnation,

as though we would be satisfied if all bankers were Americans. There are big corporations in this country whose directors include Catholic, Protestants and Jews and they act as a unit in framing labor policies. They permit no religious differences to interfere with these policies. They act in accord with the interests of their class.

The Catholic capitalist will sanction the breaking of a strike even though he may know that he is reducing the standard of living of workers of his own religious faith.

The same is true of the Protestant exploiter and it is notorious that in the needle trades many of the worst

exploiters of Jewish workers are Jewish owners of needle trades shops and factories.

In this country we have seen Jewish bankers singled out for condemnation, as though we would be satisfied if all bankers were Americans. There are big corporations in this country whose directors include Catholic, Protestants and Jews and they act as a unit in framing labor policies. They permit no religious differences to interfere with these policies. They act in accord with the interests of their class.

The Catholic capitalist will sanction the breaking of a strike even though he may know that he is reducing the standard of living of workers of his own religious faith.

The same is true of the Protestant exploiter and it is notorious that in the needle trades many of the worst

exploiters of Jewish workers are Jewish owners of needle trades shops and factories.

The experience of the working masses in all countries shows that however much piety the exploiters of labor may profess they do not permit their religion to be the main concern in dealing with the workers. Working people should display the same intelligence. No matter what type of fascism rules, it places the workers of all faiths under the boot of the class that lives by the exploitation of labor. For this reason the Protestant worker should be the first to denounce German fascism and the Catholic worker should be the first to denounce Austrian or Italian fascism. For each to denounce the other type would be an exercise in hypocrisy and a desertion of the class ideal that should unite all workers in a common solidarity.

It is important to stress this matter as we have occasionally received material—that is tolerant of Protestant fascism and opposed to the other and tolerant of the other and opposed to Protestant fascism. Whatever mask it wears, fascism means chains for all workers. All workers must oppose it with the economic arguments that apply to all its forms.

Instructions and Explanations for the Campaign

The Supreme Board at its annual meeting held in February laid plans for a jubilee campaign by which to secure new members in both the adult and juvenile departments. The campaign officially opened March 1 and closes December 31, 1934. New members accepted at any time during the dates specified will be entitled to privileges of the campaign, and the proposers and agitators to the awards which are as follows:

Juvenile Department

For each individual new members up to 5, a member will receive 25¢. For 5 members an award of \$2.50 will be given.
" 10 " " " " " 5.00 " " "
" 15 " " " " " 10.00 " " "
" 20 " " " " " 15.00 " " "
" 25 " " " " " 20.00 " " "

It is to be understood that awards will be given only as specified above, both as to number and amount. (This is mentioned to prevent unnecessary correspondence as to how much will be given for, let us say, 8 or 12 members.)

Members of the juvenile department who enter during the campaign will be exempt from payment of two monthly assessments, and the Society will pay the expense of the medical examination up to the sum of 50¢.

Adult Department

The Society will pay \$1.00 for each newly-acquired member between the age of 16 and 35 years. The branches and individuals participating in the campaign—of which the Supreme Office must be notified—will, in addition to the prizes mentioned, receive \$10.00 in cash for 25 or more new members secured.

During this campaign the Society will bear the expense of the medical examination for every new member between the ages specified, up to the amount of \$2.00, and each such member will be exempt from payment of \$1.00 initiation fee for the building fund. This means that every new candidate will pay \$1.00 initiation fee in addition to that into the sick benefit fund as specified in the by-laws.

Passive members who have not exceeded the two-year term of passivity and who become active before June 1, of the current year, will be exempt from payment of 6 months' assessment into the mortuary fund for the period prior to July 1, 1933. This is explained as follows: No assessment into the mortuary fund will be collected for the term of passivity between January 1, 1933, and June 30, 1933. All assessments in arrears in the mortuary fund prior to January 1, 1933, and following July 1, 1933, will be collected. Any member who was passive before July 1, 1933, for a period of over 6 months may increase his age rate instead of paying assessment into the mortuary fund prior to July 1. Any term of passivity after July 1 must be paid for and according to the new increased age rate. In other words, the decision in effect from July 1, 1933, to December 31, 1933, has been extended to June 30, 1934.

The Supreme Board further decided that all members at present insured for \$600 death benefit who desire to transfer to Class "B" or "C" may do so for their previous amount of death benefit; however, this provision was made only for the \$600 class. Members insured in any other class and desiring to transfer can be insured in the new class only for the amount specified in the by-laws.
