Organizacija brezposelnih v Wisconsinu za odločitev

ROOSEVELT HOČE ODPRAVITI DIREKTNE PODPORE

Madison, Wis., 18. jun.—Dve delegatki, ki so se udeležili kongresa za brezposelnost in socialno zavarovanje, je navdušeno odobrilo predlog glede odločitve o relativnih delavskih in stroških. Poziv, naj se delavci pripravijo na stavke, da izvajajo unijake mezde pri relativnih projektih, je izdal Harold Hartley iz Milwaukeeja, glavni svetovni brezposelnih delavcev v Wisconsinu.

Organizacija brezposelnih je morala tukaj v nedeljo in ponedeljek in po zaključitvi so delegatke odločile pred predložitvijo zahtev. Po dolgem obnavljanju je guverner La Follette obvestil delegatke, da je pripravljen sprejeti njih komiteje. Člani komiteja, kateremu predseduje Hartley, so bili le nekaj časa v guvernerjevem uradu, nakar so obvestili delegatke, da je La Follette odklonil predložene zahteve.

Reprezentante organiziranih brezposelnih delavcev so se na kongresu zborovali izrekli proti La Folletteovemu relativnemu programu, ki določa \$209,000,000 za gradnjo relativnih projektov, ki so bolj pomembni, ker bi stroške nosili delavci, farmarji in mali posestniki. Zahtevali so, da država naloži dodatne davke na visoke dohodke in denar, ki bi ga dobila iz tega vira, zaradi za financiranje relativnih projektov. Guvernerju so predložili tudi več načrtov socialne zakonodaje in naznanili, da bodo pritišli na državno legislaturo, da bi zakonili.

V čakalnici pred guvernerjevim uradom je prišlo do manjših demonstracij, ko so bili delegatke informirani, da je guverner zaprosil in zaradi tega ne more sprejeti njihovega komiteja. Slisali so se vziki: "Strahota!" "Ali se guverner boji delavcev?" Ker delegatke niso hoteli oditi iz guvernerjeve palače, se je La Follette udal in znanil, da bo sprejel njih komiteje.

Washington, D. C., 18. jun.—Predsednik Roosevelt je večerjal s direktorji državnih relativnih administracij, da morajo na prihodnje leto, da najdejo zaslužek brezposelnih, ki so sedaj na relativni listi federalne vlade, v prihodnjih letih. To morajo ugotoviti, čeprav bi to pomenilo ugotoviti federalnih relativnih delavskih stroškov, ki so kongres določil nad milijarde dolarjev.

Roosevelt je informiral direktorje, da hoče nadomestiti "določila" z uposlavitvijo brezposelnih pri relativnih delih in ta dela z uposlavitvijo relativnih v privatnih industrijah. Izrekel je napoved, da se bo država vrnila v normalne razmere v prihodnjih par mesecih in da je že na poti definiranja programa. On bo gledal, da ne bodo stroški za posameznike delavce, ki so upošleni pri federalnih relativnih projektih, znatno več kot \$1200 in v tej vsoti mora biti vključen tudi material. "Naj namen je odprava relativnih stroškov," je dejal Roosevelt. "Te stroške uničujejo tisto, kar imamo, da je najboljše v naših državljanih. Hočemo, da imajo ljudstvo, da ne spada v krivice, da ne prejema relativnih stroškov. Najti jim moramo zaslužek, čeprav bo ta zaslužek v prihodnjih manjši kot v svetovnih industrijah."

Predsednik je dal rekel, da se bo obdržal in da bo takoj začel gradnjo relativnih projektov.

Dovolil je, da se zniža pristopnina za vse nove člane na \$1 (za mladinski oddelki ni pristopnine), in da jednota plača tudi stroške zdravniške preiskave za vse, ki bodo pridobljeni v teku prihodnjih šest mesecev (tega leta bodisi v redni članski ali mladinski oddelki).

HBZ izstopila iz federacije

Poneverjen denar JBF bo povrnjen

Milwaukee, Wis.—Na eni zadnjih sej konvencije Hrvatske bratske zajednice je bila daljša razprava o Jugoslovanski bratski federaciji, v kateri je bila zajednica vključena. Sprejet je bil predlog s 112 glasovi proti 66, da HBZ izstopi iz federacije, pri kateri nima "nobenih koristi".

Nato je bila razprava, če je zajednica odgovorna za vsoto okrog \$260, lastnina federacije, katero je zaplaval bivši gl. tajnik Vinko Solić, ki je bil tudi tajnik JBF. Nekateri delegatke, med temi tudi gl. predsednik Butković, so argumentirali, da zajednica ni odgovorna za ta denar, ker mu ga je zaupala federacija, ne pa HBZ; drugi delegatke so pa pobijali to stališče in dokazovali, da je HBZ moralno odgovorna. To stališče je končno prevladalo in predlog, da HBZ povrne federaciji omenjeno vsoto, je bil sprejet s 105 glasovi proti 41.

Mooney končno izvojeval priziv

Californijsko najvišje sodišče se je podalo

San Francisco, Calif.—Vrhovno državno sodišče je 17. junija uslišalo zahtevo Toma Mooneyja za proceduro "habeas corpus", na podlagi katere bo to sodišče pregledalo vse podatke Mooneyjeve obravnave. Mooney je bil pozvan, da pride pred to sodišče s svojimi odvetniki dne 27. junija, ko bo določen datum prizivnega procesa.

Isto sodišče je leta 1918 zavrglo Mooneyjev priziv z motivacijo, da Mooney nima nobene podlage za pretres procesa nižjega sodišča.

Mooney naveda v svojem apelu, da je bil pokriven na temelju krive priče. "Posledice neizvajanja sekcije 7a," pravi odsek za delo, "so se iztekle v širokem in globokem razočaranju s strani delavstva, ki upravičeno smatra, da je došlo lepe besede, toda je bilo izdano po vladi radi neizvedenja njenih obljub."

"Delavci, ki so se skušali organizirati v domnevanju, da jih v tem protektira sekcija 7a, so se v številnih slučajih znašli predmet diskriminacije s strani delodajalca in vsi njihovi apeli na vlado so bili zaman. Ako se tej situaciji ne napravi konec, bo postala večja nevarnost za industrijski mir kakor si je mogoče predstavljati."

NAČRT ZA NOV DELAVSKI ODBOR V KONGRESU

Odešek za delo ga priporoča v sprejetje

POLJEDELCI IZKLJUČENI

Washington. — (FP) — Nižja zbornica kongresa je te dni dobila iz odeska za delo tako zvani Conneryjev načrt za industrijske odnose ali za ustanovitev novega vladnega delavkega odbora. Odešek ga je v nekaterih točkah več ali manj sprejmenil radi odloka vrhovnega sodišča v slučaju NRA.

Ta osnutek je dvojček Wagnerjevega predloga, katerega je senat že sprejel. Glavna razlika med njima je v tem, da bi bil po Wagnerjevem načrtu nov delavski odbor samostojen tribunal, po Conneryjevem bi pa postal del delavkega departmanta.

Tudi kongresnik Marcantonio iz New Yorka in član odeska za delo je v svojem manjšinskem priporočilu za to, da je novi delavski odbor samostojna agencija. Z večino svojih kolegov v odesku za delo se tudi ne strinja, ker so v načrtu izključeni vsi poljedelski delavci iz jurisdikcije delavkega odbora. On argumentira, naj imajo tudi poljedelski delavci iste privilegije ali pravice kakor industrijski, ker organizacija potrebuje prav tako kakor slednji, izkoriščani so pa še bolj.

Odešek za delo pravi v svojem priporočilu, da pomeni ta načrt le razstignitev železniškega zakona na druge industrije. V jedru res ni nobene razlike, niti ne v namenu. Načrt gre za to, da se delavstvu zagaruje pravica do organizacije in preprečijo stavke. Slednje naj bi se doseglo z apeli po instancah. Stavka ta predlog ne propoveduje kakor jih ne železniški zakon, toda jih otežkuje.

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Ta Conneryjev predlog bo v nižji zbornici naletel na večjo opozicijo kakor je pa Wagnerjev v senatu. Proti njemu deluje mogočna lobija raznih podjetniških organizacij.

Governer podprl stavkarje v Omahi

Odklonil je pogoje uprave cestne železnice

Omaha, Neb., 18. jun. — Guverner R. L. Cochran je sinoči odklonil predlog uprave Omaha & Council Bluffs Street Railway Co., da se stavka cestnih železničarjev, ki je izzvala resne izgube v zadnjih dneh, poravnava s pridržki.

Kompanija je naznanila, da je pripravljena na pogajanja glede zvišanja mezde in krajšega delovnika, ne mara pa priznati zaprte delavnice, starostnih pravic stavkarjev niti ne bo ponovno upoštevala 68 od 268 stavkarjev.

Cochran, ki je razglasil obsešno stanje v Omahi, je odločno zavrnil kompanijo in izjavil, da se mora pokoriti njegovemu odloku, ki je, da se mora pogajati s stavkarji o vseh zahtevah, katere so ji predložili. Temu ultimatu je sledila daljša konferenca, toda oba, guverner in družba, še vedno vztrajata vsak na svojem stališču.

Ko je guverner uvidel, da se kompanija ne bo podala, je ustavil obrat cestne železnice. S tem jo hoče prisiliti na pogajanja z reprezentanti stavkarjev. V nedeljskem ultimatu je guverner zahteval, da sporni stranki imenujeta svoje reprezentante v posebni odbor, ki naj bi poravnal konflikt do 10. dopoldne v ponedeljek. Stavkarji so to storili, ne pa kompanija, ki je kot odgovor guvernerju sklicala sejo direktorije.

Medtem pa stavkarji, ki so se sestali z guvernerjem ob določnem času, čakajo na nadaljnjo akcijo kompanije brez komentarja. Dosele niso podali še nobene izjave glede stališča, ki ga je zavzela družba v tem sporu. Konferenca z guvernerjem se je udležil tudi Ernest Bowerman, tajnik tukajšnje centralne delavske unije.

Toledo, O., 18. jun. — Stiri dnevna stavka proti Toledo Edison Co., ki je ogražala vse industrijske aktivnosti v severnozahodnem delu države, je bila večeraj končana. Javnopravni delavci so z glasovanjem odločili, da se vsa sporna vprašanja predloži arbitraži in sklenili, da se danes vrnejo na delo. Vse stavkovne straže, ki so piketirale podjetje, so bile odpoklicane že večeraj popoldne.

Reorganizirana mehiška vlada

Calles izgublja vpliv

Mexico City, 18. jun. — Predsednik Lazaro Cardenas je reorganiziral mehiško vlado. Le eden član prejšnje vlade je ostal, drugače so vsi novi ljudje. Vsi prejšnji člani kabineta, ki so bili naklonjeni Callesu, so bili odslovljeni. Konflikt s Callesom se je torej zaključil s popolno zmago Cardenas in vse kaže, da bo Callesov politični vpliv zdaj izgubil v Mehiki in Calles sam morda odide v tujino.

Predsednik Cardenas je večeraj izjavil, da program vlade ostane kot je bil. Vlada bo nadaljevala socialno politiko v prid delavskim slojem. Večeraj je Cardenas pozdravil delegate mednarodne meščanske organizacije Rotariancev, ki tu zborujejo. Rekel je, da je mehiška republika ponosna na svoje socialne in ekonomске reforme, ki so v inozemstvu predmet plitve kritike; te reforme so namenjene socialnemu napredku mehiškega ljudstva, ki je bilo stoletja zatirano.

Klerikali v glavnem mestu Mehike so izkoristili prisotnost 3000 Rotariancev in so v nedeljo uprizorili smešne demonstracije proti vladi. Policija jih ni motila.

VELIKA DELAVSKA ZMAGA V MINNEAPOLISU

Farmer - laboriti dobili župana in večino v mestnem svetu

OPEN S A P A R J I PORAZENI NA CELI ČRTI

Minneapolis, Minn. — Organizirano delavstvo je pretekli teden dobilo kontrolo nad mestno vlado kot rezultat najbolj vroče volilne borbe v viharni politični zgodovini tega mesta.

Thomas E. Latimer, kandidat za župana, je bil izvoljen z večino 21,000 glasov in poleg tega so laboriti dobili tri nove sedeže v mestni vladi, štirje njihovi aldermani pa so bili ponovno izvoljeni. V mestnem svetu imajo laboriti sedaj 14 sedežev, opozicija pa 12.

Minneapolis je imel že dvakrat prej delavskega župana, toda izvajati ni mogel svojega programa, ker je reakcija kontrolirala mestni svet. Pozneje so imeli laboriti večino v mestnem svetu, ki pa ni bila dovolj močna, da ni ovrgla sklepe konservativnega župana, ki je bil takrat na krmilu.

Sedanja mestna vlada bo lahko izvajala svoj program, za katerega je šla v boj v volilni kampanji. Vsi delavski kandidati so šli v boj z geslom, da je treba zlomiti Zvezo državljanov, močno organizacijo anti-unijakih delodajalcev, ki je kontrolirala mestno vlado.

Latimer je objubil, da bo prvi njegov oficijelni čin odsloviitev policijskega načelnika M. Johnnesa, ki je z oboroženo silo prisilil na pomoč openšparjem, ki so skušali razbiti stavko voznikov tovornih avtov v zadnjem poletju.

V krvavih policijskih navalih na stavkarje je bilo nad sto oseb ranjenih in v eni sami bitki sta bila dva ubita in 50 ranjenih. Vsi razen dveh so bili ustreljeni v hrbet, ko so se umikali pred policijo. Situacija je postala tako resna, da je moral guverner Olson poslati milicijske v Minneapolis, da so protektirali stavkarje pred policijskimi napadi.

Novi župan je po poklicu odvetnik in že dolgo časa aktiven v delavskem gibanju. Bil je član Zapadne rudarske zveze in vodilna sila v stavki, ki je l. 1909 izbruhnila v arebrnih in avinčenih rudnikih v okolišu Coeur d'Alene, Idaho. Zaeno z drugimi rudarji je bil vržen v ječo, v kateri je več stavkarjev umrlo.

Ustanovitev cenene klinike

Philadelphia. — Dr. C. Dudley Saul, glavni zdravnik dveh tukajšnjih bolnišnic ter znan zagovornik socializirane medicine, je skupaj z nekaterimi drugimi zdravniki ustanovil cenečno kliniko. Proti malemu mesečnemu assessmentu nudi nova institucija popolno zdravniško oskrbo v slučaju bolezni in bolnišnico do treh mesecev na leto. Prva organizacija, ki je zavarovala svoje člane pri tej instituciji, je časniškarska unija iz Camdena in Philadelphiae.

Unijsko gibanje med ženskami

Organizirati so se začele žene unionistov; konvencija v St. Louisu

St. Louis. — (FP) — Čeprav je ameriško strokovno gibanje staro že nad sto let, je organizirana delavka v njem razmeroma mlad prišlec. Vzrok temu je seveda, ker je bil strokovni unionizem dolga desetletja — skoraj sto let — le za izurjene delavce. Navadni tovarniški delavci, moški ali ženske, niso dosti znali za strokovno organizacijo — zanje sploh ni bilo prostora v njej, če niso bili kvalificirani. Njim je pot v organizacijo odprl šele industrijski unionizem, ki vsaj v Ameriki še ni popolnoma utrjen. Izjema so le nekatere industrije, v glavnem oblačilne.

In čeprav se je pojavila žena — in otroci — v industrijah že ob zibelni strojne produkcije, je ostala brez vsake organizacije do tega stoletja. Imela je proti sebi tudi konservativne in "militantne" unioniste, ki so jo do današnjega časa smatrali za "začasn pojav" v tovarnah. Celo glavni oblikovalec ameriškega unionizma pokojni Samuel Gompers je gledal cinčno na delavke in bil je dolga leta proti vsaki protekciji s strani zakona. Z omejeno delavsko zakonodajo se je sprijaznil šele v zadnjih svojih letih.

Žensko strokovno gibanje je torej povsem nov pojav v industrijski Ameriki. Staro je komaj dva do tri desetletja. Večji korak je napravilo v povojni dobi, predvsem v zadnjih letih, ko so nekatere "moške" unije pričele gojiti ženske pomožne (Women's Auxiliaries) organizacije, sestoeče iz soproj in hčera. Te organizacije so najbolj razširjene med železničarki, oziroma njih soprojami. Obstoje pa tudi v drugih organiziranih industrijah. (V oblačilnih industrijah in v tekstilnih teh organizacij ne potrebujejo, ker so delavke močan faktor v unijah.)

Pred tremi leti je bila ustanovljena federacija teh ženskih strokovnih "auxiliary" organizacij, ki bi imela prihodnji teden svojo tretjo konvencijo v St. Louisu. Objema že dve splošni organizaciji, štiri centralne unije in 74 neodvisnih ženskih skupin.

Ta federacija delavskih žena si je nadela nalogo, da širi unionizem med ženstvom, predvsem med ženami in hčerami organiziranih delavcev ter se aktivno udeleževati njih bojev. Razvoj tega gibanja je sigurno velikega pomena za ameriško delavstvo, ker pomenja organiziranje vse družine in ne le njenega skrbnika.

Naj že greste na gore, na morskobal ali deželo, ugotovite, da hotel, taborišče ali vodna hiša, kjer se ustavite, imajo zdravstveno in sanitarno odpravo smeti in odpadke, da se tam rabi sveže mleko, ki je bilo pastirizirano, da ni muh v kuhinji in jedilnici, da okna pravilno zamrežena in da ljudje, oprejeni v kuhinji in jedilnici, so snažni v oseh oblačili. Ako pišete na State Board of Health dobite bržkone potrebne informacije. Vedo, ma so taki kraji zdravstveno varni, ali bi je ugotoviti to.

Ako nameravate izlet v avtomobilu, morate biti dvakrat toliko previdni. Ako se ustavite za jed ali pijačo pri kaki stojnici ob cesti, rite se, da je snažna in sanitarna. Navarazam vam to pove. Oglejte si prostor. V katerih primitivnih jedilnicah so kozarci krožniki le površno osnaženi brez vzroka. Jed je izpostavljen prahu in muham. Bodite previdni le onih prostorov, kjer je vse staro, kjer ravna jo jedli na snazen način in kjer ni preveč prahu in muh.

Zapomnite si tudi to, da ne smete piti iz studenec ali potokov ob cesti, koder se zite ali hodite, razun ako je označeno za stvene oblasti, da je varno piti. Gorski potni so vedno čisti kot se dozdevajo.

Čiščenje krvi

Vsi čaji, ki jih ljudstvo pozna in pije ali v pomladnem času, so bolj ali manj odvajajo. Vsekakor so pa ljudske čajne mešanice priročne za zdrave, še bolj pa za bolne ljudi. Zmešati je treba: mačeve, brezovo listje, njeve jagode, rman (achillea), sladki koren, sladke korenine, krhljikovo skorjo, žilčtrobentice, peteršilj in fižolove stroke. Pri nemo lahko tudi še druga znana zelišča. To zmešamo in kuhamo po dve žlici v poltrietr litra vode in pustimo stati dobre ure. Zjutraj in zvečer popijemo po eno sklico tega čaja. Če nam je okus pretrpek, ko pridenemo nekoliko pomarančnega soka sladkorja.

Zdravilna moč jajca

V kuhinji nam rabi jajce za pripravo mnogih jedi. S pridom ga pa uporabljamo di kot zdravilo:

1. če se nam zatakne v grlu ribja koža, moramo požreti sirovo jajce, da jo splavi s bojem;

2. kadar se opečemo, položimo na opekline sto tenko belo kožico, ki je v jajcu med lupin in beljakom;

3. kadar smo hripavi, stepemo beljak s korjem in počasi srebano po več žlicah snega. Najbolje je, če ponovimo to vsake tri dni.

Po boleznih oslabele ljudi naj ubijejo jajce v kozarec vina in to izpijejo. To da moč napravi dober tek. Na splošno je priporljivo, da slabotni ljudje večkrat pijejo vino s sirovim jajcem.

Dead Hands Rule the Living

Whether the United States Supreme Court has the power to veto laws of Congress is still in dispute, although it is clear that no clear grant of such power can be cited. However, it is a tragedy that society should be hampered by the dead hand of the past. The men who framed the Constitution had no comprehension of the world in which the modern generation lives and were they to emerge from their tombs they would be as much surprised as Caesar would be if he walked the streets of Paris today.

The Constitution was framed for a society that was almost wholly agricultural. Our civilization is industrial with its great power of production and distribution owned by giant trusts and mergers. The candle and pin torch have been replaced by the electric light, the pack-horse and wagon by the railway; the town crier by the daily newspaper, the telegraph, wireless and radio; home and shop production by vast industrial plants equipped with machinery; local markets by the world market.

An industrial revolution has occurred since the First Congress met in 1789, and yet the mind of an old agricultural age speaks through the Constitution to the mind of this age of industry and invention. It is an absurdity piled upon the absurdity of starvation in the midst of plenty.

Converting the Devil

A Memorial Day speaker said capitalism will be Christianized and all will be well.

Capitalism will be Christianized when the devil is. If the devil were converted he would no longer be a devil. When capitalism is Christianized, it will no longer be capitalism. In other words, capitalism cannot be Christianized. But capitalism can be replaced by a social order in which the spirit of Christianity, the spirit of brotherhood, will prevail.

Capitalism is anti-Christian, anti-brotherly, by nature. It sets men against one another. It sets classes against one another.

The NIRA codes, while they existed, certainly did not Christianize capitalism. Neither will anything else that leaves the basic principle of capitalism intact Christianize the social order.

That basic principle is the private ownership of collective property and its use for private profit.

What the people must use together they must own together.

Nothing short of this will be a brotherly social order. But this will be Socialism—not Christianized capitalism.—Milwaukee Leader

This Thing Called Fraternalism

(A True Narrative)

The true meaning of fraternalism is often misunderstood and certainly many times misapplied. In relating stories of fraternal deeds and actions, oftentimes, the truly great fraternal (brotherly affection) tales are never told. Sincere people need no constant sermons on fraternalism. They perform their kindly acts with certainty and positiveness irrespective of what is said and done by others.

No doubt, in the vast scope and field of our Society many notable fraternal acts take place. It seems to me that we should know more about them. If not all, at least some of them should be brought before the spotlight. All such noble cases will be of far reaching value and the spotlight illumination will disclose some intimate and interesting incidents and some tempestuous discomfitures.

Finding herself in a rundown and weakened condition due to overwork, one of our sisters was advised to go to a better climate for her health. Ordinarily, a rest is welcomed by most all of us, but when we find ourselves in trying circumstances, and without funds, such an order brings on only added grief. Especially is that so, as was the case, where no work was available for either of the male members of the family; this sister being practically the whole support and upkeep of the family.

Well, the order came and so the young lady approached the secretary of her lodge who immediately communicated with the lodge brethren in the state to which she was destined. At the same time her father, though without employment, went back to his employer (a railroad) in search of transportation.

In short order our sister was on her way. And, incidentally, what has been said thus far, is not near as important as what follows.

As the train in which our patient was riding rolled across the dusty plains and prairies westward, across one state and then the next, an acquaintance with a totally strange woman, a Mrs. Smith, was made. Fortunately, they both had the same destination. This woman was already up in the years, but all the years only made her lovelier and kinder. She was, indeed, assuring, offering our friend in quest of health, every assistance possible. "If the place to which you are going isn't entirely satisfactory, just come over to my home," she said. Well, with some reluctance, our sister soon was obliged to accept this invitation, although it was previously arranged that she would go to our people. Upon arrival, she relates, she was

greeted cordially enough. However, she sensed a fear of superimposition. At least outward signs offered every such indication.

The contrast in the manner in which she was received by these strange people, not at all connected with any fraternal society, and that of our fellow fraternalists, seemed to be very noticeable. One looked upon the whole thing as a liability. The other, as an opportunity to be of service for a needy cause. Mrs. Smith and her family were very nice to our sister. They have done everything possible to make her stay pleasant and profitable at remarkably reasonable terms. When the doctor permitted, she was taken into the mountains to see the lustrous beauty of nature.

The human element that enters into such cases can further be reiterated. Over four hundred letters, cards and packages were received by our sister during her nearly four months' stay in the west. Cards and letters signed, "A Pioneer"; gifts, scrap books, candy, etc., from a number of our fine Pioneer sisters, some of whom have never met our sick friend. All that was true fraternalism, which served its purpose better than any words can express and brightened a weary soul. That's the kind of stuff that silently speaks LOUDER THAN ANY VOICE OVER THE MICROPHONE and gladdens the hearts of the humble givers and arouses a pride in the organization. Yes, Pioneers, these humble hearts who render silent service and who crave no credit for their deeds do fraternalism an honor.

We do have people in the Pioneers who do things to bring the prestige and pride and honor to every other Pioneer heart. However, not to speak so much of what we do, BUT TO BE EQUAL TO THE OCCASION WHEN IT ARISES, in that lies the glory of fraternalism.

I can appreciate such a stand as that.
