Največ mrtvih v treh mesecih v Vietnamu!

Ameriške izgube v mrtvih so dosegle s 430 pretekli teden 35,265, rdeče pa s 5686 pretekli teden skupno 58,509.

SAIGON, J. Viet. — V preteklem tednu je po uradnih podatkih padlo v bojih 430 Amerikanov, 2185 pa je bilo ranjenih. To je več kot kdajkoli v zadnjih treh mesecih vse od začetka zimsko-pomladanske rdeče ofenzive.

Rdeči so imeli po ameriških podatkih pretekli teden 5686 mrtvih, s čimer so njihove izgube v mrtvih tekom vojne presegle pol milijona. Kljub hudim izgubam je radio Hanoi prenašal včeraj poziv Ho Či Minha rdečim, naj se bore, dokler ne bodo nasproti "popolnoma premagani" in se bodo Amerikanci umaknili.

Južnovenamske vladne čete so imele pretekli teden v bojih 527 mrtvih in 1634 ranjenih. Te številke kažejo, kako domače vojaške sile nosijo vedno težji del vojskovjanca.

Poveljnik 101. ameriške divizije letalske pehoty gen. M. Zais je dejal, da je bila njegova naloga "uničiti sovražnika in njegove naprave v dolini A Shaw" in on je to storil in bo delal tako tudi v bodoče, dokler bo imel tak ukaz. V obrambu napada in osvojitve "Hamburger Hill" oddstrani sen. E. M. Kennedyja so se oglašili tudi drugi vojaki in nevojaki. Gen. M. Zais je posebej ugotovil: Pripovedka je, da ne bo storil sovražnik nič proti nam, če ne bomo mi storili nič proti njemu. Če bomo mi sedeli pri miru, nas bo pobil!

Biafranske sile tišče proti Port Harcourtu

MONTREAL, Que. — Po uradnih podatkih je bilo v preteklem letu na kanadskih univerzah le 14 odstotkov kanadskih profesorjev, ostalo pa tujci. Kanadske univerze so lani najele 1,013 profesorjev iz Združenih držav, 545 iz Velike Britanije, 722 iz raznih drugih držav in le 362 iz Kanade.

Domačini, ki so bežali pred zveznimi četami, ko so te lanskosko jesen zasedle Owerri, se vračajo na svoje domove in jih obnavljajo. Biafranske čete so povestih pripadnikov dobrodelenih organizacij, ki pomagajo prebivalstvu Biafre, prodre že takodaleč, da so le še bile 9 milj letališča Port Harcourta.

Razak je prevzel v Maleziji odgovornost

V Maleziji, kjer je prišlo zaradi zadnjih volitev v zvezni parlament do budih nemirov, se duhovi pomirja-

KUALA LUMPUR, Mal. — Predsednik vlade Abdul Razak je že koncem prejšnjega tedna prevzel odgovornost za obnovo miru in reda, ta teden pa je k temu dobil še naloge gospodarske obnove. Predsednik vlade Abdul Rahman ga je namreč imenoval v novi vladi za poslov vodčega finančnega ministra. Nova vlada, v kateri so zastopniki vseh ras, bo sodelovala z Narodnim odborom, ki je po ukinitvi ustave prevzel odgovornost za vodstvo dežele.

Razak je bil imenovan za direktorja omenjenega odbora s širokimi civilnimi in vojaškimi pooblastili, ki naj bi mu omogočili obnovo reda in zakonitosti. Boji med Malajci in Kitajci so v enem tednu zahtevali 158 človeških življenj in seveda tudi precejno gospodarsko škodo.

Oblasti trdijo, da se je položaj že precej umiril, toda po zanesljivih podatkih policija še vedno prijema v predelih mesta, kjer je napetost velika in možnost za nove spopade najbolj pereča, sumljive ljudi in znane skrajne ter hujšačke. V teh delih mesta je bila od 13. maja pa do srede tega tedna stalno policijska ura in oblasti in vojaštvo so dovažale prebivalstvo, ki ni smelo iz domov, hrano in druge nujne potrebščine. Policijska ura je ostala v veljavni le še v predelu mesta Kampong Bahru in v sosednjih kitajskih naseljih, kjer napetost ni še prav nič popustila.

Med Malajci, ki predstavljajo nekaj manj kot polovico vsega prebivalstva dežele, pa imajo v deželi na enodnevni protestni deželi glavno politično moč, in štaj. med Kitajci, ki jih je nekaj manj, pa imajo v rokah skoraj vse gospodarstvo, vlada staro sovraščvo, ki dobiva vedno novega ognja.



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Slovenska kapela v Narodnem svetišču se bliža uresničenju

Načrt za slovensko spominsko kapelo v Narodnem svetišču Brezmadežnega spočetja v Washingtonu, D.C., je dokončan in sprejet. Priznati je treba, da sta uprava Svetišča in arhitekt storila vse, kar je v sedanjih razmerah mogoče, in upoštevala slovenske predloge v toliki meri, da bo slovenska kapela v resnici urejena in zgrajena tako, da bo pravi izraz slovenske vernosti in kulture doma in v svetu.

Osrednji motiv in glavni poudarek kapele je seveda slika Marije Pomagaj z Brezij. Slika je oljnata kopija originala na Brezjah, isti mer in v približno enakem okvirju. Podoba visi na steni nad oltarjem, v katerega rob je vklešan napis: Our Lady of Brezje — Pray for us. Pod napisom je v sredini oltarja vklesan slovenski grb — polmesec s tremi zvezdami. Mal, a vendar učinkovit poudarek baroka — viška slovenske cerkvene umetnosti — je izražen in valoviti, zlatih pramenih, ki izvirajo iz slike v slogu starodavnih baročnih monštranc in so vklesani v marmorno steno.

Stene kapele so iz rožnatega marmorja, ki ne daje samo primernega barvnega ozadja barviti sliki Marije Pomagaj, pač pa tudi s svojo barvo vzbuja vtis topotnosti in domačnosti. Prostor pred oltarjem je v obliki osmerokotnika. Obiskovalec, ki stoji v njegovi sredini, lahko istočasno zre oltar in vse štiri marmornate relieve — po dva na vsaki strani — kakor tudi obe steni z zlatimi, vklesanimi napisi. Relievi iz belega marmorja, visoki približno en meter in široki tri četrte, prikazujejo krst slovenskega kneza Gorazda — s čemer je obenem tudi poudarjena 1200-letnica pokristjanjenja Slovencev — in škofa Barago, kako s kromom širi isto vero med Indijance, škofa Slomška, učitelja slovenske mladine, ter simbolično skupino slovenskih izseljencev v Ameriki.

Ves marmor, kakor tudi po modelih slovenskega akademskoga kiparja Franceta Goršeta izklesani reliefi, pridejo iz Italije. Slika Marije Pomagaj je tudi delo slovenskega umetnika. Strop kapele, barvan v sovpadajoči barvi marmornih sten, je obrobljen z borduro stiliziranih rdečih nageljev v slovenskem narodnem motivu. Bolj slovenska kapela si je v danih razmerah težko predstavljati. Slovenska kapela pa se bo razlikovala od drugih manjših kapel v Narodnem svetišču tudi po tem, da bo enota zase. Ne bo povezana, kot druge, s stranskimi izhodi v sosednjem kapele, pač pa bi imela en sam, lastni vhod.

Upači je, da bo kapela skončana do konca maja prihodnjega leta. Vendar je trenutno že težko določiti točen datum, kajti delo je v prvih početkih in vsaka nepredvidljiva težava ali zakasnitev zaradi dobave ali okvare gradiva lahko povzroči nevšečne zamude. Do jeseni bodo dela že toliko nepredovala, da bo določitev končnega datuma posvetitve veliko manj tveganja.

Poldružno delo za slovensko spominsko kapelo je polno zaviranja vrednih uspehov. Darovi, ki jih je Narodni odbor v Clevelandu doslej prejel in jih še prejema od rojakov križem Amerike, dokazujejo globoko narodno in versko zavednost ameriških Slovencev. Rojaki in rojakinja, ki vneto zbirajo denar, sodelovanje slovenskih organizacij in njihovega tiska, vse to dokazuje globoko vdanost zamskih slovenskih spominskih kapel in zato ves vloženi trud ni bil zmanj: **slovenska kapela je postala stvarnost.**

Zbirka seveda še ni zaključena in se še nadaljuje. Prepričani pa smo, da bodo naši verni in zavedni rojaki kmalu prispevali še preostalo tretjino zneska za naš narodni spomenik, čigar osrednji simbol je že pred več kot pol stoletja ganil Cankarja, da je zapisal:

"Ozrle so bodo nate usmiljene oči Matere božje z Brezja in potolažen boš..."

Prav tole sem izrazil pred kratkim Švedu Sornsenu, ki smo v avtomobilski prodajalni o tem govorili.

On pa: "Počasi, počasi! Sitnosti šele nastajajo. To še niso niti prvi oblaki pred viharjem. Se spominjate, ko sem vam že parat pravil, kaj razni politični opazovalci po Evropi pričakujajo in napovedujejo? Že pred tremiti leti mi je doma na Švedskem omenjal mnenja nekaterih vodilnih mednarodnih politikarjev moj daljni sorodnik, ki je na važnem političnem položaju: Že tedaj je on omenil, da leta 1968, 1969 in 1970 bodo najbolj kritična. Nza se nategniti za kaka leta dalj, a sitnostim se svet ne bo izognil.

Za nekaj trenutkov smo vti utihnil. On pa zopet spregovori: "Vsek narod ima tako družbo, kakršno si jo vzgoji. To na vseh poljih naše življenja. Nihče ni izvzet. Odgovornosti se ne more umikati nihče. Imamo šole, iz katerih prihaja mladina, bodoča inteligence — bodoči gospodarji, bodoči voditelji, bodoči vsega "tega in onega" — kakšni so? Pred temi vprašanji bi bilo na mestu vprašanje: Čigavi so? Kdo jih je vzgojil?"

Ali jih nismo mi sami vzgojili z našimi vzgojitelji? Ali smo se kaj zanimali, kako naši vzgojitelji vršijo svoje dolžnosti? Kako so jih učili in vzgajali? Popraskajmo se po glavi in vprašajmo se enkrat, trikrat, desetkrat, čiga gava krivda je?

Potem pa sodimo, čigava krivda je?"

Tako je nam odgovoril. Nekaj časa smo se spogledavali — pravega odgovora, ki naj bi druge obtežil in obožil, pa nihče ni imel.

On pa:

"Vidite, naše šole nam dajojo sadove semena, ki smo ga sejali — največ v nezavednosti misleč, da bo vse prav, posledice pa jasno govore, da ni vedno vse prav, če se javnost ne zanima kaj kdo v njihovem imenu seje med mladino in jo vzgaja, ki bo jutri jemala v roke vodstvo o zmorejo. Posojilnice so pred kratkim dvignile obresti na posojila na 7½%. Zraven so še dolčeni drugi stroški za cenitive, razne druge provizije, ki pri višji posojilih takoj gredo v stotake. Vse zgleda, kakor razna poročila stavbiških podjetij omenjajo ter tudi poročila posojilnic, da se bo začelo tudi omejevanje posojil. To radi tege, da v slučaju kakih gospodarskih kriz bodo posojila bolj kri-

ta.

Javnost in vsak posameznik bi se moral več zanimati za razne zadeve, posebno še za šolstvo, kaj se v njem uči, kakšen duh prevladuje in naših šolah in če kaj v redu in na mestu, da se odpre usta in pove, če se kaže ne dopade. Ne pa molčati in se čuditi šele takrat, ko posledice radi lastne brezbržnosti začno nasčipati.

Father Leopold Mihelich Becomes Pastor in Denver, Colo.

HERO PRIEST RECALLS TERROR IN NAZI OCCUPIED SLOVENIA

By MRS. JOAN BIRSA

Denver, Colo. — Impressive ceremonies held on April 17, 1969: The Rev. Leopold Mihelich was formally installed as pastor of Holy Rosary Church in Denver, Colorado. With all pupils from Holy Rosary School taking part, the Rev. James Rasby, Dean and Pastor at the Cathedral, officiated at the installation.

Father Mihelich came to Denver June 1, 1955 from the Diocese of La Crosse, Wisconsin to assist the Rev. Msgr. John Judnic. He came to the USA on June 8, 1950 at the invitation of Bishop John P. Treacy of La Crosse, and became assistant at Marathon, Wisconsin to Msgr. Venceslaus Multerer.

Father Mihelich was born on October 3, 1906, a son of Martin and Antonia Mihelich. He made his grade school studies at St. George in Slovenske gorice and his high school, college and theology studies in Maribor, Slovenia.

ORDAINED July 10, 1932, he was appointed assistant pastor in Slovenska Bistrica, to Father Ivan Solinc, while continuing to study and take examination at the University of Ljubljana for certification as a high school and college professor. After completion of his studies for his master's degree, Father Mihelich was appointed a teacher at Slovenska Bistrica High School.

In August, 1941, Father Mihelich went to Belgrade, the Yugoslav capital, to assume a profes-

TAKES FIRM STAND

Hell began for Father Mihelich in April 1941, when the Nazi armies marched into Slovenska Bistrica. The Pastor, Ivan Solinc of the parish church had escaped the invaders by only one day, and the assistant, Father Jacob Vraber, was assigned to duty in the Yugoslav Army. So, although Father Mihelich was a teacher, the pastoral duties fell upon him. Every day Nazis took valuables from the rectory and church; they confiscated all parish funds and his personal money. In their desire to promote Germanism, they ordered him to preach in German to his people. Because the people did not understand German, he refused, and as a result was thrown into a concentration camp in Maribor. Ninety percent of the priests of his diocese were consigned to the camp. The priests were brutally beaten, poorly fed, and assigned hard labor.

WHEN THE NAZI THREAT ended, Father Mihelich returned to Slovenska Bistrica and his old school and parish, only to find that the communists had taken over where the Nazis left off. They were tightening their hold on the country.

While taking a religious census of the area, Father Mihelich noticed that the Reds were keeping him under close surveillance. He managed to evade his "shadows", often by buying a railroad ticket farther than his destination, and then jumping off the train as he neared his goal.

sorship in a college there. Meanwhile, he assisted other priests in the area in administering to the needs of 100,000 refugees of Nazism. Many times, he narrowly escaped death from bombing and ambushes.

Shortly afterward, the chief of police, a former student of Father Mihelich, warned the priest that he had sat in on a four-hour long interrogation regarding him, and that his only chance for survival lay in flight from the country. At that time, priests were being shot for "treason."

Realizing that he would no longer remain free to administer to his people, Father Mihelich left Slovenia in May, 1946. For the next four months he stayed in various DP camps in Austria, tending to the spiritual need of other refugees.

By then, communist interference in church work was becoming more and more intense. OZNA — secret police carefully noted sermons, and bishops were forced to send their pastoral letters secretly, by priest-messenger.

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FATHER MIHELICH was one of the bishop's messengers. One Saturday night he had four copies of a pastoral to deliver, and time was running short. He boldly flagged down a communist officer on a motorcycle and demanded a ride to the four churches, saying that he had an important message to deliver. The Red had no idea what the message was, and gave the priest his ride.

In September, 1946, he left for France, stopping in Hyeres (Var), where he acted as chaplain at "La Maison du repos" property of Saint Sulpice in Paris. Four years later, as noted previously, he came to the United States of America.

IN HIS NEARLY 14 years at Holy Rosary, Father Mihelich has worked hard to promote Slovenian culture in Denver. He has conducted classes in Slovenian and Croatian languages, and has helped promote the cause for beatification of Bishop Anton Martin Slomšek by establishing an annual Slovenian-Croatian Day, at which there have been talks and cultural performances in Slovenia.

THE SMALLER new unit was achieved by redesigning the magnet and most of the structural parts of the present receiver unit used in the TRIMLINE. When Western Electric's anticipated 10 million unit per year production rate is reached, the new design will result in an annual savings of some 85 tons of molybdenum, 49 tons of cobalt, 43 tons of nickel and 30 tons of copper.

An assembly method devised especially for the new receiver will allow acoustical output to be measured via computer during adjustment of the unit, thereby assuring both a precise product and few rejections.

The new receiver will be used in the electronic phone of the future, which requires a smaller and lighter unit than is currently available.

Denny doesn't lose any sleep over any of them.


"I lost a couple of more challenges," he casually says when the home runs are more frequent.

ALL'S FAIR IN LOVE AND PLAYOFFS

What an outrage... a travesty of justice! The Boston Celtics finish fourth, yet win it all. Regular-season performance in the National Basketball Association means nothing. That's how critics view the NBA playoff system. The Celtics' detractors, however, are far less numerous than their admirers. The same applies to the playoff blueprint that enabled the Celtics to atomize for their rather mediocre showing during the 82-game NBA schedule. Playoff attendance figures are a potent rebuttal to the cry for "justice."

Impartial observers in search of equity could find flaws in the NBA's playoff format. On the other hand, many of the snipers are guilty of overstatement and misstatement when they claim regular-season results mean nothing beyond the fight for the fourth and last playoff berth in each of the seven-club divisions. The Baltimore Bullets and Los Angeles Lakers were rewarded with more than playoff berths for winning NBA division titles. Each club received \$20,000 for finishing first. The Bullets collected another \$5,000 for compiling the highest won-lost percentage in the NBA.

NEIGHBORS: NOW! GETS \$150,000 IN TWO GRANTS

The Greater Cleveland Neighborhood Centers Association's Neighbors: NOW! capital fund campaign for \$1.56 million is receiving \$150,000 in two grants from The Cleveland Foundation.

One is a direct grant of \$100,000 from the V. Eugene S. and Blanche R. Helle Memorial Fund. The other is a \$50,000 "challenge" grant from the A. E. Convers Memorial Fund and is contingent upon participation of businesses, merchants and residents in neighborhoods where centers are operated by the Greater Cleveland Neighborhood Centers Association (GCNCA). Funds obtained from these sources will be matched on a dollar-for-dollar basis through the grant to a maximum of \$50,000.

In announcing the grants, Seth Taft, General Chairman of the Neighbors: NOW! campaign, said,

"We are both pleased and encouraged by this splendid support from The Cleveland Foundation. We recognize, however, that the challenge grant will present some serious problems. The neighborhoods where GCNCA maintains centers are far from affluent. If they were, there would likely be little need for the services rendered by these agencies. Raising a total of \$50,000 in such areas is a formidable task that will require plenty of hard work and ingenuity." A special campaign division is being formed to concentrate on this effort.

Many of GCNCA's seventeen participating agencies are planning special neighborhood events to raise a part of the challenge grant goal.

On May 10, eleven different East End neighborhood house groups, including three golden age and

five street clubs, are combining their efforts for a bake sale at Kroger's on Buckeye Road. Merrick House is planning a similar effort.

The rear West Side has scheduled a neighborhood fair which will have a Neighbors: NOW! booth and Mt. Pleasant is undertaking several projects — among them a fashion and talent show sponsored by the Head Start Mothers.

Funds sought through the Neighbors: NOW! campaign will generate an additional \$1,783,000 in matching grants from government sources. The money will be used to build new neighborhood multi-service centers in Glenville, Hough, Mt. Pleasant and the Near West Side with Alta House, League Park and Hiram House Camp receiving lesser amounts for modernization and expansion.
