## Fantje na Vasi impressive at 25<sup>th</sup> Anniversary concert

I recall 25 years ago when the future Fantje na Vasi was nothing more than a group of friendly young lads standing on a corner (or in a club-room) - singing. A brilliant idea was conceived. They decided to form themselves into a choral group. Being young, they had a lot of moxie, guts, energy, charm, but no experience singing as a professional team. That did not stop the 20 or so lads from renting the Slovenian National Home on St. Clair, putting announcements of a concert in this paper, and going on stage and singing their hearts out. The result wasn't bad because the individual talent was there. It was done much to the approval of their parents and friends who urged them to continue. But their voices and blending needed improvement.

It took the dogged efforts of John Sršen to whip the fellows into a singing unit. These young men who grew up in the St. Vitus and St. Mary's area were all childhood chums. It was a natural fit that they should continue their friendship in a meaningful way. They rehearsed each week to put on an annual concert. When a member of one of the fellow's family died they were at the funeral home to sing beautiful Slovenian farewell songs. They sang at each other's weddings, and did select performances throughout the United States and Slovenia.

With the passing of each year, it became obvious their dedication was sincere. Their harmony began to blend as one voice. John Sršen inserted more difficult songs into their repertoire. Mostly they sang in Slovenian, but other languages were added, such as Latin, and German. They added one or two numbers in English. For example, last Saturday, Oct. 5, at their 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary concert they sang, "And so it goes," a beautiful Irish melody. And "My Girl," was a rousing success for a bunch of white guys.

There was a full house at the Slovenian National Home last Saturday to help the group celebrate their Silver Anniversary. Fantje na Vasi demonstrated their dedication to music by singing several complex songs to which the audience gave their hearty approval and appreciation by giving several standing ovations.

The program itself was very pleasing with an informal opening as the 18 fellows sang a few numbers without tuxedo jacket in front of the stage, to the accompaniment of Slavko Teskač on accordion, Pavle Jurkovič on bass guitar, and guitarist Miha Dolinar. The men then went on the stage dressed in their formal attire to present the rest of their concert.

Before the half, the audience was treated to the wonderful dancing of 84 very young Kres Dancers' Children's Group who put on an

enjoyable presentation. The teachers and dancers are to be congratulated for putting on a very entertaining performance for which the audience went wild with approval.

The Fantje na Vasi -- (young lads from the village) have certainly matured to where we can now call them young men from the village. Their singing has also evolved into a crescendo of melodious harmony. Every person who attended that special concert of 20 songs agreed it was a thrilling and satisfying occasion. The 900 guests came expecting to hear a good concert, instead they were witness to the debut of a magnanimous model of perfection.

I asked director John Sršen how he could get 18 different personalities to forego their natural individuality and sing so harmoniously. He said simply, "They are all very dedicated and committed."

There were tears in his eyes at the end of the concert as he realized the efforts of their 25 years of rehearsals and camaraderie has blossomed into a beautiful work of art. They say Slovenians love to sing; the proof was in the performance Saturday.

Those of us who have seen the Fantje na Vasi concerts for the last 25 years have been witnesses to a transcendent of a loyal group of friends with untrained voices into a cohesive blend (Continued on page 6)

## Celebrating Bishop Edward Pevec's Remarkable Service

A Mass to celebrate the 20<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Auxiliary Bishop A. Edward Pevec's Episcopal ordination and his retirement from office will take place at 7 p.m. on Monday, October 14 at the Cathedral of St. John the Evangelist in downtown Cleveland.

A reception will follow at The Forum, One Cleveland Center, one block north of the cathedral.

The Mass and reception is open to all.

Bishop Pevec, 77, retired in August after serving the diocese for 20 years as bishop and 52 years overall as a priest.

After his ordination in 1950, Bishop Pevec as a young priest was assigned as assistant pastor at St. Mary Church, Elyria. Two years later he was named assistant pastor of St. Lawrence Church in Cleveland.

Bishop Pevec soon entered the academic world, joining the faculty of Borromeo Seminary in September, 1953. He remained at the seminary for much of the next 26 years becoming the high school's vice rector in 1971.

But parish life called once again when he became pastor of his home parish, St. Vitus

Church in Cleveland's St. Clair neighborhood in 1975. He returned to Borromeo in 1979, this time as rector of the college seminary. It was a position he held until Pope John Paul II appointed him bishop and vicar of the eastern region of the diocese in 1982.

When Bishop Anthony M. Pilla told him that Pope John Paul II had chosen him as the diocese's new auxiliary bishop, the *Universe Bulletin* reported that he was "overwhelmed and surprised... maybe not necessarily in that order."

Bishop Pevec said he was reluctant to accept the position initially, but concurred after Bishop Anthony M. Pilla explained the importance of being called to serve the church. "The reluctance just disappeared because I thought this is what the Lord wants me to do," Bishop Pevec said at the time of his appointment.

He held the position for a little more than 20 years, working largely with the parishes and ministries in eastern Cuyahoga, Lake and Geauga counties.

Bishop Pevec's retirement began on Sept. 1<sup>st</sup>.

home fried potatoes, strudel and coffee.



unit's up-coming maneuvers to Grenwohr once again, but this time they will have to go alone, without me. The supply officer kept bugging me that week, saying, "Won't you re-enlist?" Sorry, I said, but home is calling me, although I will miss Grafenwohr. (I'll miss Grafenwohr like I will miss eating fried liver and onions.) I really hated to see the trucks pull off in a convoy through the main gate for I would never be seeing them again. I'll miss some ding-bat knocking on my door at 1 a.m. asking me to open the supply room for clean linen. No, he did not wet the bed, but it was water soaked, because boys will be boys and some ding-bat filled up a condom with water and punched needless holes on top and when the soldier got back from town, it was lights out and he had to undress and get into the bed in the dark. Well, all hell breaks loose when you sit on a condom full of water with needless holes on top. Yep, you get a "wet bottom" in no time.

The commander knew what was going on, but the more he said he would punish the soldiers who played such tactics, the more they did it, for who in their right mind would admit they did it.

Another stunt they pulled

quite often would be to short change the top sheet. While the soldier was out of the room, the guys would remake his bunk neatly, all sides tucked in like he had left it, but the top cover sheet, they would fold half back so when he crawled into the sack, his feet would just go down half way. The language you would hear from him would carry all the way from the top floor to the basement. I guess they had to do something to break up the monotony.

Well, the convoy left and there were very few troops staying behind consisting of those who were rotating back to the states. They had to keep some men on post as guards for after all we did not want anyone stealing the entire post while the soldiers were away on maneuvers. They also had to leave back a cook to prepare meals for those who were staying behind.

The place looked like a deserted city. It really looked lonely and perhaps then the feeling really kicked in and I was not all that excited about having to leave for the states.

Odd dam, what am I saying? Well, they say that the mind is the first thing to go. We had about 10 days before we were scheduled to board trucks and the train for the one way trip to Bremer-

haven, port of embarkation.

Fortunately, Frank Sartore was there with me and we would be going back to the states together for our discharge dates were only two days apart. I told Frank that I had a bad voyage coming over on the ship and I spent more time in the head (that is what they call the men's room aboard ship). It was the head for my head was in the toilet bowl most of the time - or the other end. Frank started with his "bull crap" that he had an old Italian remedy for seasickness. I said, forget about your Italian remedy for I am familiar with your French Italian words for spaghetti dinner. He said, okay, don't fret, I'll talk to some of the medics who are still on post. Lucky for me he knew the right party for he got some pills that I took just before they put the ship in first gear and everything that went into my tummie stayed there.

I am going to cut this column for now because I am coming close to the end of my visit to the Fatherland. May the Good Lord bless and watch over all of you, and God, please watch out for me for I am not a good swimmer and never did care for sharks, dead or alive.

# Life in the Refugee Camps

**Wednesday, Feb. 27, 1946**

I went to the damaged warplanes in the woods and brought back some wire and aluminum pipes.

**Thursday, Feb. 28, 1946**

This evening some of the refugees performed the comedy "At the White Pony." My sister Mici helped people remember their lines. Attendance was good and people were happy with the performance.

**Saturday, March 2, 1946**

Tonight I went to a repeat performance of the "White Pony." The acting was excellent, especially Dr. Erman.

**Sunday, March 3, 1946**

At 7 a.m., I went to Mass, then driving class from 10 - 12, then took a walk with Cilka from 3 - 5 p.m., and another dance from 8 - midnight. Even I was tired from dancing. But the absence of some members of our group (the ones who returned to Slovenia last week) kept our spirits down.

**Monday, March 4, 1946**

I wove a basket from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. I think it turned out well.

We have electricity now without interruption, and without any problems.

**Tuesday, March 5, 1946,**

Mardi Gras

A new English class started at 5 p.m. The teacher, Miss Russon, speaks English only and moves on very quickly. From 8 - 10 p.m., I went to driver training. The others in our room had a dance until midnight. There was also a dance in the camp hall with people wearing masks.

Our room got extra food for supper because it was our turn to get what was left over in the kettle. The food that is left in the kettle after everyone gets their rations goes to a different barracks each day. Our turn for this extra food comes up every other Tuesday.

**Wednesday, March 6,  
1946, Ash Wednesday**

Someone set up a puppet man made of straw next to a barracks that has mostly women, and set it on fire. Everyone in the camp came to watch. Whoever set up the fire was teasing the women about not being married.

**Thursday, March 7, 1946**

Mire returned from another one of his trips. UNRRA is saying they will no longer give him food ration cards since he leaves without permission.

**Friday, March 8, 1946**

I was at driver's training

all evening. The engineer spoke 4 times, and the electrician 3 times. We have to learn everything about how automobiles work.

**Saturday, March 9, 1946**

Mire got his first postcard from his wife Manica (Cilka's sister) back home in Ziri. She writes that she is fine, but bored. There is not a single word for Cilka. I think Cilka's family is angry with her, that she is traveling with me without being married. We should have gotten married in Vetrinje, our first camp. But I always wanted us to be married by my priest brother Stanko, in the presence of my parents, and my other brothers and sisters. Are we waiting in vain for the time when that will be possible?

**Sunday, March 10, 1946**

I went to Mass at 7 and 9 a.m., then to driver's training from 10 - 12, then for a walk with Cilka and Mici to the soccer field outside town. This afternoon, the camp had a farewell ceremony for departing UNRRA director Cluyver.

Cilka got a card from her sister Manica with news from Ziri. Her cousins Franc and Joze Gantar were each sentenced to 10 years in prison for not cooperating with the Partisans during the war. Franc was my boss when I was assistant manager.

ager for the shoemakers' cooperative in Kranj during the war. I said the two of us would probably be hung from the nearest lamppost if the Partisans win the war; he said we would probably get 10 years in prison. He guessed that one exactly right.

Later, I learned that Franc Gantar had actually helped the Partisans, even while we were making shoes under German occupation. One day during the war, he was very worried about a certain wagon-load of wood. The horse-drawn wagon was stopped by Partisans, who took 800 kilos of leather which Franc had hidden under the wood. I believe he had arranged with the Partisans for them to get that leather. I heard that he also gave the Partisans 7% of whatever profit we made from selling shoes to the Germans. That kind of assistance probably kept him from being executed after the war, but it wasn't enough to keep him out of prison. After he got out of prison, he worked his way up until he became one of the managers of the Alpina shoemaking factory, which was formed out of the many small shoemakers' cooperatives which we had in Ziri.

# World War II – the Home Front

There were other ways to stretch meat ration stamps, not all of them pleasant. One time a friend of Grandpa's gave him some squirrels, dressed and ready to cook. Mom prepared them using a rabbit recipe for '*hasen pfeffer*', a sweet-sour taste similar to '*sauerbraten*' that required a long marinade. It was edible, and surprisingly did not have any gamy taste, but we had no encores. Wild rabbits were often prepared this way, but domestic rabbit didn't need clever disguises. We had experience with rabbits, since we'd been raising them since the early 1930's and through the war years. They were kept in our old shed, and then in the garage when the shed was demolished. They were easy to raise, and we liked rabbit.

I would help Grandpa when we killed and dressed a rabbit. He delivered the fatal blow, and then it was my job to hold it by the hind legs as he knifed and pulled the skin away; almost like taking a sweater off over your head, inside out.

One of the rabbits had been specially fed by my dad but was never eaten. It loved clover, and became nice and plump on the baskets of the stuff that he gathered in the corner vacant lots. When that rabbit became dinner, everyone expected a particularly succulent meat, but at first bite we made sour faces of disgust and quickly rid ourselves of the mouthful. The meat tasted like clover, and although rabbits may like it, take it from me, you will not! "Waste not; want not" went out the door that day, along with the rabbit.

We had a hurriedly prepared meal of pork sausage to go with the potatoes and lettuce. From then on, our rabbits were given the varied diet of vegetable scraps they

had eaten before. If there was any such thing as 'rabbit chow' or 'pellets,' we didn't know of it. Besides, if we had to buy food to feed the rabbits, they were no longer a bargain.

In summer, their normal feed was scraps of garden and kitchen greens. Year-round, it was my job to supplement their diet by scouting the local stores for discarded carrot tops, cabbage, lettuce or celery – most anything that was trimmed or peeled off to make the vegetables more attractive. Every store had a basket filled with trimmings, and if you promised to come and get it on a regular schedule, they were glad to get rid of it.

That about covers the small inconveniences of wartime food rationing. There were other commodities that were either rationed or very difficult to find. There were constant reminders to save our money and help the war effort by spending it on "War Bonds," but there wasn't very much surplus cash in our neighborhood. A new tire was hard to get, and required turning in the worn

tire and filling out forms. This was not a problem at our house, but it did make 'recapping' a good business. All metals were to be conserved and recycled, as were paper, glass and rags. New shoes and leather goods were scarce. The O.P.A. (Office of Price Administration) was established to hold down prices, and froze them as of a given time period. We talked about these things at home, but they were 'small potatoes' compared to news from the 'front.' The progress of the war was our biggest worry and the main topic of conversation. We all had family or friends in the war, and they were our main concern.

A sketchy look at best, but this is what it was like in

our family on the 'Home front' during the war. We were very lucky. Although both my dad and grandpa had to register for the draft, uncle Mike was the only one likely to be drafted. He was at the maximum age limit, and was called up and went for a physical. He failed his exam because of a 'spot' on his lung. He lucked out both ways – he didn't get drafted, and he didn't develop TB (tuberculosis), which was still a 'killer' disease at the time.

We sent CARE packages to our relatives in Slovenia, but only God knows if they reached the people to whom they were addressed. Things were bad there, worse than we knew. Both of Dad's parents died during the war, but we don't know how or exactly when. Other relatives were also killed in the war, but we know very little about them. Mom corresponded with some of our elderly relatives until they died, but their information was vague. We were one of the lucky Collinwood families that remained intact through World War II.

# Pumpkin Cake

- One yellow cake mix
- $\frac{1}{2}$  cup melted margarine
- one egg
- 1 -- 29 oz. pumpkin mix
- 2 --  $\frac{3}{4}$  cup brown sugar
- 3 -- 3 eggs
- 1 -- t. vanilla
- $\frac{1}{2}$  t. cinnamon
- 4 –  $\frac{2}{3}$  cup milk
- $\frac{1}{4}$  cup sugar
- $\frac{1}{4}$  cup butter
- 1 cup chopped nuts



Reserve one cup cake mix for topping. Combine rest of mix,  $\frac{1}{2}$  cup melted margarine, and one egg. Press into bottom of ungreased 9 x 13 pan. Add and mix pumpkin, brown sugar, 3 eggs, milk, cinnamon, and sugar, and vanilla. Pour into pan. Mix reserved cake mix, sugar, margarine, and nuts, and sprinkle over cake. Bake 350 degrees one hour until knife comes out clean.

- 1 cup solid pack pumpkin
- Peanut butter, raisins, nuts or candy for decoration



Preheat oven to 350°. Combine flour, oats, baking soda, cinnamon and salt. Cream butter, gradually add sugar, beating until light and fluffy. Add egg and vanilla; mix well. Alternate additions of dry ingredients and pumpkin, mixing well after each addition. For each cookie, drop  $\frac{1}{4}$  cup dough onto lightly greased cookie sheet; spread into pumpkin shape, using a thin metal spatula. Add a bit more dough for stem. Bake 20-25 minutes until cookies are firm and lightly browned. Remove from cookie sheets; cool on racks. Decorate using icing or peanut butter to affix raisins, nuts or candies. – Makes 20 cookies. X

# Impossible Pumpkin Pie

- $\frac{1}{4}$  cup sugar
- 1 can (2 cups) pumpkin
- $\frac{1}{2}$  cup biscuit baking mix
- 2  $\frac{1}{2}$  tsp. pumpkin pie spices or cinnamon, nutmeg, or ginger
- 1 tbsp. butter or margarine

Heat oven to 350°F. Lightly grease 9 or 10" pie plate. Beat all ingredients smooth. Pour into pie plate. Bake 50 - 55 minutes, until golden brown and knife inserted in center comes out clean. Can be refrigerated.

When cool and just before serving, top with Cool Whip or Whipped Cream. X

## The Unsung Heroes:

The Slovenians have a heritage of taking care of their loved ones. Dating back to the early part of the 20<sup>th</sup> century, it was a hallmark of our neighborhood to witness how many young and middle aged men and women stayed home to take care of their aged parents or even grandparents.

Sometime ago, probably in the late forties, Fr. Louis Baznik gave a mother's day sermon on our love for the dear mothers who sacrificed daily in bringing up their children, particularly those with large families, which was quite common around St. Lawrence. In his sermon, he made a special note of appreciation to the many unsung heroes who gave a good part of their young adult life to stay back and take care of their aging and feeble parents. This heroic effort is mostly unseen and under-appreciated by the respective families or even the person who is being cared for.

It is readily observable that the elderly are not always the most patient, and frequently disagreeable, demanding, and sometimes just plain ornery. When illness strikes, the care giver becomes a cook, a bread win-

ner, a nurse, and a patient listener of oft repeated tales of the past. This was a particular tedious chore before the tube (TV) became the "baby sitter." Hearing was sometimes a problem and yelling seemed uncharitable. This era was also pre- "depends," with the control of odors a usual priority. Open wounds needed bandage changing on a daily basis. These chores were not for the meek.

On our E. 81<sup>st</sup> street, we could go from house to house recalling all of the families who had children taking care of Ma and/or Pa. In many households, grandmothers still were able to take care of themselves, but they had their grandchildren over for visits and mini-vacations on a regular basis. Of course, the life expectancy was not as long as it is today. As a youngster, I thought that 70 was ancient. Now I have second thoughts.

Other heroes that go unnoticed are the *Janitors*, like John Keglovich, who often gave us ruffians a bad time, but kept the boilers stoked, the lights burning and the buildings in rather sound repair. Later, Charlie Mlakar and a host of volunteers kept the buildings in solid condition.

Then there was the Altar and Rosary Society that maintained a clean church, with shiny brass candle holders, white altar linens

and well buffed floors. The choir is a chore of love for the Church and sacred music. Their often tedious rehearsals are rewarded only in the knowledge that they have blended into correct polyphonic harmony at those important celebrations. Compliments are not requested, but appreciated. The entire system of volunteers is often under-appreciated except for the leaders who are trying to execute a strenuous task. Some individuals prefer to be unnoticed, but are always around when needed. These rare people are the true heroes.

Sick calls are those events that we never anticipate but it is taken for granted that the priests are always on duty just waiting for those messages that someone is near death and needs the blessings of the Church at the waning hours of life. These acts are unnoticed until an exception occurs when no priests are readily available. We were always blessed at St. Lawrence to have exceptionally devoted priests who came to assist in our needs.

Backers of sports teams, events, programs and bulletins are unnoticed and taken for granted. Their advertisements on the backs of one's uniform or in a booklet subsidized most of the endeavors of organizations around St. Lawrence.

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# How Did We Survive?

Looking back, it is hard to believe that we have lived as long as we have. As children we would ride in cars with no seat belts or air bags.

Riding in the back of a pickup truck on a warm day was always a special treat.

Our baby cribs were painted with bright colored lead based paint. We often chewed on the crib, ingesting the paint.

We had no childproof lids on medicine bottles, doors, or cabinets, and when we rode our bikes we had no helmets.

We drank water from the garden hose, not from a bottle.

We would spend hours building our go-carts out of scrap and then ride down the hill, only to find out we forgot the brakes. After running into the bushes a few times we learned how to solve the problem.

We would leave home in the morning and play all day, as long as we were back by the time the streetlights came on. No one was able to reach us all day.

We played dodge ball and sometimes the ball would really hurt. We ate cupcakes, bread and butter, and drank soda pop, but we were never overweight because we were always outside playing.

Little League had tryouts and not everyone made the team. Those who didn't had to learn to deal with disappointment. Teams didn't have 7 or 8 coaches; we didn't need them or want them.

Some students weren't as smart or mature as others so they failed a grade and were held back. This was not a problem. Today they pass everyone, even those who cannot read, write or add. -- Or the parents sue.

Our generation produced some of the greatest risk-takers and problem solvers. We had the freedom, failure, success and responsibility, and we learned how to deal with it.

We didn't have polls and talk shows to tell us how to live and what to do.

It was a great life; we loved it.

If you would be remembered; do one thing superbly well.

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## West Nile Virus Information & Prevention

1) West Nile virus is an emerging disease that was first seen in the United States in 1999. This year the virus has caused human disease in 20 states and the District of Columbia and has been isolated from animals or mosquitoes in all states east of the Rockies.

2) Most people infected have no symptoms or experience a mild illness causing fever, headache, body aches and often a skin rash and swollen lymph glands. More serious infections cause encephalitis (inflammation of the brain) or meningitis with rapid onset of high fever, neck stiffness, stupor, disorientation, tremors, muscle weakness, convulsions, paralysis, coma, and rarely, death.

Persons over 50 have the highest risk of severe disease. Young children and those with suppressed immune systems are also more susceptible. West Nile virus cannot be spread directly from person to person or animal to person.

3) The disease is caused by the bite of an infected mosquito. Since mosquitoes breed in standing water, the primary method to reduce mosquito populations is to remove standing water around homes and buildings. Check for any item or area that can hold water, including planters, flowerpots, clogged gutters, discarded tires, wheelbarrows, etc. Remove the items, drill holes in them, or turn them over to prevent water accumulation. Change water in wading pools and bird baths every 3-4 days.

4) Personal protective measures include: stay indoors at dawn and dusk; avoid areas with weeds, tall grass or bushes. Wear long sleeved shirts and long pants when outdoors. Spray clothing with repellents containing permethrin. Install or repair window and door screens, and apply insect repellent containing deet to exposed skin. The most effective insect repellent for adults contains 35% deet. Higher concentrations afford

no additional protection. Repellents used on children (aged 2-12) should not contain more than 10 percent deet. Repellents may irritate the eyes and mouth, so avoid applying repellent to the hands of children. Electromagnetic and ultrasonic devices and vitamin B are not effective in preventing mosquito bites. Mosquitoes in the United States also transmit other diseases such as Easter Equine Encephalitis, St. Louis Encephalitis, and Dengue Fever.

5) Birds are the primary host of West Nile Virus. Dead birds can be an indication that West Nile Virus is present in your area. If you find a dead bird, contact your local health department on what action to take.

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

## Slovenian Singers in World Choir

Back in February audition calls went out to all over the world for young singers to join the World Youth Choir for their 2002 tour. In Slovenia, four young people answered that call, Nadja Platner, a recent music graduate from Ig, Uroš Petrič, a student of music from Vrhnik, Matevz Kajdž from Ljubljana, and Rebeka Hren from Logatec, both the later studying music. Rebekah was already in the choir from the year. Singers are accepted for two year tours. The four also found another young Slovenian student who was living in Italy and came with the Italian group.

In August, the World Youth Choir finally met, trained and had eight concerts, four in Chicago, 1 in Kalamazoo, Michigan where they also recorded a CD, one concert in Madison, WI and two in Minneapolis, MN. (Nadja had the fun of meeting Bobby McFerrin at the

### Protimanjšinska gonja na Koroškem

Na njem je bilo slišati, poroča novinarka Dela Ivan Lukanc, tako napadalne govore proti manjšinskim pravicam, manjšini in tudi ustavnemu sodišču kot leta ne. Zborovanja v nabito polni dvorani (več kot 800 udeležencev) so se udeležili tudi koroški deželniki glavar Jörg Haider in zastopniki vseh treh v koroškem deželnem zboru zastopanih strank.

Predsednik brambovcov in nekdanji svobodnoški deželnozborski poslanec Fritz Schre-

tter v svojem govoru ni samo zanikal, da je slovenščina drugi deželni jezik na avstrijskem Koroškem, trdil je tudi, da slovenska manjšina nima nobene pravice za dvojezične napise, kot jo je v svoji razsodbi jasno dočil avstrijsko ustavno sodišče. Manjšini je podtkal, da je hotela s pomočjo "politično motiviranega vrhovnega sodišča na Koroškem ustvariti sklenjen dvojezični teritorij".

Haider je pa trdil, da je slovenska manjšina na Koroškem deležna "odličnega in pozitivnega ravnanja, kot ga ne najdeš nikjer v Evropi".





## Slovenian Singers in World Choir

Back in February audition calls went out to all over the world for young singers to join the World Youth Choir for their 2002 tour. In Slovenia, four young people answered that call, Nadja Platner, a recent music graduate from Ig, Uroš Petrič, a student of music from Vrhnik, Matevz Kajdiz from Ljubljana, and Rebeka Hren from Logatec, both the later studying music. Rebekah was already in the choir from the year. Singers are accepted for two year tours. The four also found another young Slovenian student who was living in Italy and came with the Italian group.

In August, the World Youth Choir finally met, trained and had eight concerts, four in Chicago, 1 in Kalamazoo, Michigan where they also recorded a CD, one concert in Madison, WI and two in Minneapolis, MN. (Nadja had the fun of meeting Bobby McFerrin at the

world youth choir symposium on choral music in Minneapolis and took a picture with him.) The two concerts in Minneapolis were the best because they were held before full audiences in large churches; and furthermore, the last concert was attended by conductors and musicians with sensitive ears and high expectations. Receiving praise from them was especially exciting and rewarding for the young singers.

They spent two weeks preliminary to the concerts, studying the repertoire in Chicago and were housed at the University of Illinois. During the tour they traveled by special buses and spent some nights with host families. All together there were about 100 singers.

## Crime Watch

Protecting Senior Parents

(NAPS)—Each year, illegal telemarketing and mail fraud schemes rob consumers—often senior citizens—of their hard-earned life savings. The U.S. Postal Inspection Service (USPS) urges people to discuss this issue with loved ones, particularly their parents, to help make sure that fraud doesn't hit home.



People should regularly speak with their parents to help protect them against fraud.

Many of the schemes that target seniors are sweepstakes, where the "winner" must pay a small processing fee in order to claim his/her "prize." However, an increasingly common occurrence is the charity solicitation call, where people are asked to pledge money to help some seemingly worthy cause.

To help protect your family, make sure they all know the following steps to take:

- Protect your financial information. Don't ever give out credit card numbers or bank account numbers over the phone unless you initiated the phone call.

- Don't be pressured into sending money in advance. If it's a legitimate contest, you don't need to pay anything to receive your prize. In addition, if you don't remember entering a sweepstakes, it's probably best to be suspicious of a notice claiming you won.

- Get all information in writing before you agree to a purchase.

Nortel Networks Corporation plans to lay off an additional 7,000 workers by years end.

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

## Pastirjev glas

*Bil je Jezusov in Marijin, čutil je s Cerkvio, rad je imel domovino, ni bil nergač, ni se smilil sam sebi, bil pa je tudi odločen, dostojanstven, odpuščajoč in odprt človek.*

Pred stotimi leti se je 28. septembra v Kovorju rodil dr. Jožef Pogačnik, duhovnik, pesnik, urednik, glavni sodelavec nadškofa Antona Vovka in za njim 31. ljubljanski škof ter prvi slovenski metropolit.

Ko gledamo v bogato duhovno zakladnico njegove misli, ne moremo iti mimo velikega četrtka leta 1977, ko je pri krizmeni maši spregovoril tudi o dogajanju med drugo svetovno vojno, ki ga akademik Janko Kos pravilno označuje – slovenska katastrofa. Nadškofove misli niso bile izsiljene kot razne izjave po vojni, ampak so sad molitvenega razmisleka osebnosti, zaznamovane z evangeljskim etosom:

*"V imenu vseh tistih slovenskih katoličanov, ki poslušajo glas svojega pastirja, izjavljam, da odpuščamo vse, kar nas je po človeški krivdi hudega zadelo. Vse, kar se je v imenu krščanske vere zgodilo, obsojamo – kakor smo obsojali med vojno in je obsojalo tedanje cerkveno vodstvo – in v imenu krivcev prosimo odpuščanja. Pa ni dovolj, da pravimo: Odpustimo, pozabili pa ne bomo nikoli. Prosim vse verne Slovence, naj nikar preveč ne obujajo žalostnih spominov na pretekle hude dni"* (Družina 39/1977).

Izjava je širša in to zahtevo in prošnjo pastirja še globlje utemeljuje. Gotovo je, da mora ostati zgodovinski spomin, da se kaj takega ne bi več zgodilo, toda evangeljska zahteva po odpuščanju je jasna. Nadškofov župnik v Trnovem, kjer je Pogačnik pet let kaplanoval, Fran Saleški Finžgar, je 6. avgusta 1944 obhajal zlato mašo. Ob tej priložnosti sta s sosedom, prijateljem arhitektom Jožetom Plečnikom oblikovala spominsko podobico s pretresljivim Križanim in z njegovimi besedami na križu: OČE, ODPUSTI! Toda že čez nekaj časa je prišel odgovor iz enega segmentov katoliškega tabora s pozivom: OČE, UDARI!

Če skušamo še tako razumeti nagibe, poti in stiske, ki so določale posamezne medvojne usode, moramo reči, da je samo OČE, ODPUSTI res Kristusov, evangeljski, božji, medtem ko je OČE, UDARI poganski, barbarski in protievangeljski.

Pri bistvu problema smo! Gre za vprašanje vere v Jezusa Kristusa in njegov večni evangelij. Ta govori o Bogu kot Očetu, ki vodi človeško zgodovino, ki pošilja

sonce in dež tako nad pravične kot krivične, o sodbi, ki pritiče Bogu in bo šele razodela misli mnogih src; o ljubezni do sovražnikov in o neprestani pripravljenosti odpuščati.

Ta evangelijski nauk mora v srcu res vernega človeka zavzemati prvo in temeljno mesto in oblikovati njegovo mišljenje in delovanje na celotnem družbenem, kulturnem, političnem, gospodarskem, družinskem in vsakem drugem področju.

Ko se ozremo še na vso prelito kri, naj bo nedolžnih ali krivih, potem se moramo zamisliti nad svojo odgovornostjo, če nas ta kri ne očisti in dovolj ne posvari. Kdor ne zna premagati preteklosti z odpuščanjem ali s prošnjo po njem in ne sprejeti skrivde tudi svojega tabora, svojih bližnjih, ta tudi ne more v polnosti ustvarjati sedanjosti in prihodnosti.

Na prihodnost bomo to jesen vplivali tudi s svojim glasom na volitvah. Vsakokratne volitve bi morale biti praznik neposredne demokracije. Toda namesto da bi se na njih odločali premišljeno, odgovorno, trenzo in sproščeno, se ob njih velikokrat sprostijo politične strasti, ki preraščajo v sovraštvo, delitve ljudi, obsojanje in obrekovanje – pa še bi lahko naštevali.

Kako se bomo obnašali kristjani? Glas pastirja – tudi iz groba – je predvsem zgled, ki naj ga poslušamo in posnemamo: *bodimo Jezusovi in Marijini, čutimo s Cerkvio, imejmo radi domovino, ne nergajmo in se ne smilimo samim sebi, bodimo pa tudi odločni, dostojanstveni, odpuščajoči in odprti ljudje!*

150 let lazaristov na Slovenskem

## Misijonska družba za pomoč ubogim

Danes v slovenski provinci 54 lazaristov, med njimi tudi dva škofa  
Vzgoja in vodenje misijonov

Ljubljana - Pomoč ubogim je bilo vodilo sv. Vincencija Pavelskega, ko je leta 1625 v Parizu ustavil misijonsko družbo. Njeni duhovniki in bratje so se naselili v nekdanjem avguštinskem samostanu sv. Lazarja in so jih začeli imenovati lazaristi.

Pred poldrugim stoletjem jih je na Slovensko povabil škof Anton Martin Slomšek - 26. septembra 1852 so začeli delati v cerkvi sv. Jožefa v Celju. Štiriinpetdeset lazaristov je danes članov slovenske province, ukvarjajo pa se predvsem z vzgojo in z vodenjem misijonov.

Enako kot pred 150 leti se je 26. septembra letos iz opatijske cerkve do vrha Jožefovega hriba nad Celjem vila procesi-

ja. Tako so lazaristi simbolično počastili obletnico, ko so predstavniki njihove družbe prvič stonili na slovenska tla.

"Človeku je treba pomagati in k njemu pohititi, kot bi gorelo, je bilo eno od načel Vincencija Pavelskega. Čutil se je nagovorjenega, da za revne nekaj stori, a je vedel, da sam ne bo mogel, zato je začel ljudi povezovati v dobrodelne organizacije s krščanskim navdihom," je razložil lazarist Anton Lavrič.

V prvi polovici sedemnajstega stoletja je Francijo upehala tridesetletna vojna, zaradi katere je bilo veliko siromaštva, mnogo ljudi je ostalo brez domov. "Duhovniki so živeli v mestih, na podeželju jih skoraj ni bilo. Duhovno so bili ljudje zelo zanemarjeni. Duhovniki, zlasti tisti na vasi, so bili slabo izobraženi, za njihovo eksistenco ni bilo poskrbljeno, zato so se ukvarjali z vsem močim.

Vincencij je čutil, da je treba ljudi poučiti in okrepliti v veri, zato je začel organizirati ljudske misijone - to pomeni, da so skupine njegovih duhovnikov obiskovale različne župnije in tam s srečanjem, na katerih so obravnavali verske teme, poskrbeli za duhovno ob-

novo. Taki misijoni so še vedno ena glavnih nalog naše družbe," je povedal Lavrič.

Na ta dan smo imeli parado, po njej pa kosilo z dodatki: vsak vojak je dobil košček na ražnu pečene jagnjetine, en luk, žlico kuhane, oslajene pšenice in pol kozarca vina.

Najboljša je bila pšenica; jagnjetina je bila še krvava, vino mi pa ni dišalo, ker sem vedel, da so se ga že prejšnji dan napili fantje v skladišču, potem pa dopolnili sod z vodo in tobakom. Eden je bil zvečer tako pijan, da se je sukal na tleh, kakor muha, ki jo položeš na hrbet.

## OTROŠKI IZRAZI IN PSOVKE

Na dve stvari se nisem mogel privaditi pri vojakih: na čudno oslavljanje predpostavljenih: podnaredniče, poručnike, pukovnike itd. Vse to se mi je zdele otroško in ponizjujoče. Drugo so bile pa surove psovke, za katere slovenski jezik nima izraza. Rabili so jih vsi od redova do najvišjega čina. Vsak ti je lahko kar iz navade psoval vse sorodnike in vse svetnike.

Nekoč sem vprašal Steva Stevanovića (najjačeg u puku), če ga ni nič sram kar naprej rabiti te besede. "E, pa to je naša navika," je odgovoril. "Ako idem čiči, ne smem, da mu psujem majku, žen-

ku, tetku ili sestrico, onda mu psujem sliku svetog Ilje."

Ker Slovenci nimamo izraza za to besedo, sem mislil, da jo imajo samo Srbi in Hrvati, pa sem kmalu spoznal, da jo rabijo tudi Arnavuti, Madžari, Nemci in drugi – vsak v svojem jeziku. Da, tudi Angleži in Amerikanci, samo veliko bolj poredko. Prvič sem slišal to angleško besedo, ko je prišel pome neki "Skač" (Škot) s tovornjakom, da me je peljal čez Muro v bivšo orožno tovarno "Göring Werke", pa je kar naprej ponavljal neko neznano besedo.

Doma sem jo iskal zastonj po slovarju. Sklenil sem, da bom vprašal našo učiteljico, kaj ta beseda pomeni, pa sem na srečo vprašal prej nekega drugega.

(Göring Werke so Rusi popolnoma izpraznili; iz nje so odpeljali 3000 vagonov strojev. Ena hidraulična stiskalnica je bila tako velika, da so morali podpreti stavbe, da so jo dobili ven.)

Njegova knjiga, v kateri analizira vprašanja, ki zadevajo slovensko narodno pomiritev in podaja svoj pogled nanjo, je bila povod za okroglo mizo, ki jo je 3. oktobra zvečer v Cankarjevem domu organizirala Revija 2000. Z njo naj bi, kot je dejal glavni in odgovorni urednik Revije 2000 Peter Kovačič Peršin, spodbudili nove pogledi na slovensko razdvojenost.

Toda direktor programov Radia Slovenije Andrej Rot in zgodovinar Jože Dežman sta bila do Pribčevega pisanja precej kritična. Prvi je opozoril, da skuša avtor oblikovati neko nestransko stališče do narodove pomiritev, hkrati pa njegovi argumenti večinoma temeljijo na časopisnih člankih, zaradi česar je, kot je dejal, "knjigo prebiral z velikansko muko, saj bi jo bilo treba temeljito prečistiti". # POBOJI DRUŽIN LETA 1942

## I. del

Leta 1942 so partizani pobili vsaj 27 slovenskih družin. Zato, da bo jasneje bistvo komunizma in partizanštine ter vzroki za protirevolucijo (vaške straže, domobranci, tudi "črna roka"), naj na kratko te primere naštejemo.

◇

16. decembra 1941 so partizani v domači hiši na Verdu vpričo treh mladoljetnih otrok ubili očeta Pavleta Veharja ter njegovo ženo Marijo. Otroci, stari pet, šest in devet let, so ostali sirote.

30. januarja 1942 so partizani umorili Antona Repovža mlajšega iz Metlike. 15. maja (ali 15. 9.?) istega leta so ubili še njegovega očeta Antona Repovža.

5. februarja 1942 so komunisti umorili v Ljubljani tri člane družine Urbanc, mater Frančisko, sina Ivana in hčerko Ivanka.

16. marca 1942 so partizani v Iga vasi v Loški dolini ubili Franca Zigmunda in njegovo hčerko Alojzijo.

1. aprila 1942 so partizani na Svinjskem pri Šentrupertu vpričo otrok in moža ustrelili Frančisko Peček, mater sedemnajstih otrok; iz osemnajstih je bil v šestem mesecu nosečnosti.

6. aprila 1942 so partizani na Ševnici pri Mirni na Dolenjskem postrelili očeta Franca Kolenca, njegovo ženo in štiriletno hčerko. 17-letni sin Alojz je ranjen zbežal in so ga ubili kasneje.

Grob na mirenškem pokopališču je bil po vojni uničen in tudi njihove hiše na Ševnici ni več.

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## Spominska slovesnost v Teharjah

10. aprila 1942 so partizani na Lavrici ugrabili zakonca Stanislava in Katarino Trontelj, ju odvedli na Mačkovec in ubili.

15. aprila 1942 so partizani na Mirni postrelili 45-letnega očeta Alojza Uhernika, 35-letno ženo Amalijo ter 15-letno hči Amalijo. Prvi poskus poboja so partizani naredili že v začetku aprila, vendar se jim ni "posrečil".

Tudi njihov grob na mirenškem pokopališču je zravnан z zemljo. Da bi bilo še huje, so iz povsem nerazumljivih razlogov, te žrtve, katerih pogoje je takrat izredno odmeval, izpustili tudi na spomeniku zamolčanih žrtv, ki so ga vgradili leta 1994 na zid cerkve na mirenškem pokopališču.

17. aprila 1942 so partizani v bajtici vrh klanca v Zabočevem pri Borovnici vpričo šestih otrok (od dveh do trinajst let) ubili očeta Jožeta Mihelčiča (42 let) in mater Ivano (45 let), ki je bila noseča.

17. aprila 1942 so komunisti v Ljubljani ubili tri člane družine Čuk. Doma v Kosezah, Podutiski 51, vpričo drugih otrok, so ustrelili očeta Lenarta (r. 1900), mater Evgenijo (r. 1904 kot Koštrin) ter dveletno hčerko Vando (r. 16. 5. 1940).

18. aprila 1942 je "Leteca udarna patrulja", ki jo je vodil Stane Semič-Daki, ponoči vdrla v Rupnikovo hišo v Lanišču pri Škofljici. Umorili so mater Rozo Rupnik in njeni 21-letno hčerko Marijo.

V noči na 22. april 1942 so partizani vdrli v Jakopinovo hišo v Ponovi vasi pri Grosupljem in pobili vso družino: 44-letnega očeta Jožeta, 39-letno ženo Marjeto, 18-letnega sina Jožeta, 17-letno hči Ano, 11-letnega sina Venclja in 6-letnega sina Štefana. Njihov grob na pokopališču v Št. Juriju je bil po vojni zravnан z zemljo, danes pa čezenj vodi pot.

27. aprila 1942 so partizani v Stranski vasi pri Dobrovi ugrabili tri sestre Skopec. Naslednji dan so jih v taborišču na

Kluču pobili: 22-letno Marijo, 19-letno Ivanko ter 18-letno Francko.

6. maja 1942 so partizani z doma na Bištrici pri Mokronogu odpeljali Zavodnikovo družino. V Blatnem klancu so umorili 60-letnega očeta Antonia, 64-letno ženo Terezijo ter 31-letno hči Jožefo, sinu Antonu je uspele pobegniti.

11. maja 1942 so na Pokojušču nad Borovnico ubili Rafaela Hvalo in njegovo ženo Jožefo; zapustila sta dva otroka.

13. maja 1942 so partizani v Šentvidu pri Stični umorili štiri ljudi. Zvezcer so vpričo žene v njegovi hiši ustrelili Franca Hrena, mizarja in uglednega vaškega odbornika. Sinova, 18-letnega Franceta in 16-letnega Stanka, so odgnali in ju neznano kje ubili. Isto noč so odgnali v smrt še ne dvajset let staro Marijo Urbančič. Maja so od doma odpeljali tudi Janeza Zupančiča iz Šentvida. Njegov 13-letni sin Jernej ga je šel iskat, vendar so ubili tudi njega.

17. maja 1942 so partizani ugrabili Franca Jakoša st., Franca Jakoša ml. (očeta in sina) in Milka Cankarja iz Dobrunj ter Franceta Jakoša in Ivana Palčiča iz Bizovika. Odvedli so jih proti Polici in jih 18. 5. v Krčmarjevem gozdu pri Bliski vasi umorili.

V noči s soboto na (binkoštno) nedeljo, 23. maja 1942, so prišli partizani k sosedom Lichtenbergove družine ob Ljubljanici v Bevkah, h Kaminovim, kamor so Lichtenbergovi hodili spat zaradi groženj. Vpričo ostalih otrok so jih streljali v daljših časovnih presledkih ter se pri tem zahtevali. Najprej so ustrelili hči Ido, nato 22-letno hči Petronilo, 47-letno mater Jožefo, nazadnje pa še 57-letnega očeta Karla. Mama in Ida sta umrli še isto noč, oče in Petronila pa v bolnišnici. Pokopali so neznano kje na Žalah.

25. maja 1942 so partizani umorili tri člane Černetove družine iz Gozda-Reke pri Prežganju: očeta Franca (r.

Teharje (*Delo fax*, 7. okt. 2002) – Več kot dva tisoč ljudi se je v nedeljo, 6. oktobra, zbralo na Teharjah pri Celju na letos že enajsti slovesnosti v spomin na žrtve pobojev, ki so se neposredno po drugi svetovni vojnepred 57 leti dogajali v takratnem teharskem taborišču. Slovesnost se je začela z mašo, ki jo je vodil mariborski pomožni škof in generalni vikar dr. Anton Stres, po maši pa je zbrane nagovoril še tajnik društva Nova slovenska zaveza Stane Štrbenk. Popoldne se je spominska slovesnost nadaljevala na Hrastniškem hribu, kjer so na mestu, kjer je bilo nekdaj morišče, s katoliškim in pravoslavnim obredom blagoslovili ploščo v spomin na vse žrtve teharskega taborišča.

Dr. Anton Stres je na spominski slovesnosti na Teharjah, ki jo je sam imenoval tudi spravna slovesnost, državo Slovenijo opomnil, da še vedno ni izpolnila svoje temeljne naloge in postala vrhovna varuhinja varnosti vseh državljanov pred nasiljem, da torej še vedno ne zagotavlja vsem državljanom pravico do pravice. "V državi Sloveniji na to izpolnitev tukaj in drugod pobiti med drugo svetovno vojno in po njej že predolgo čakajo," je dejal dr. Stres in dodal, da za rajne pač ni odločilno, ali bodo državni zbor in politične stranke zmogli minimum poštenja in odgovornosti ter omogočili izglasovanje zakona, iz katerega bo jasno razvidno, da se je pomojenim zgodila nezaslišna krivica. In da so tisti, ki so jo zagrešili, morilci. Oni so svojo pravico pač že našli v božji solidarnosti.

"Za našo državo pa je to še vedno odprto in odločilno vprašanje. V odgovoru nanj je videti moralno podobo naše državne oblasti. Ko se torej vsako leto zberemo tukaj, je to tudi preroško dejanje. Tu smo namreč zato, da tistim, ki nam trenutno vladajo, znowa povemo, da svoje dolžnosti še nismo izpolnili," je na slovesnosti v Teharjah še dejal dr. Anton Stres.

Kritičen do državne in tudi celjske oblasti je bil v svojem nagovoru zbranim ob pomniku na Teharjah tudi tajnik društva Nova slovenska zaveza Stane Štrbenk. Slovensko državo kot naslednico oblasti, ki je zaregla povojne poboje, je obtožil, da še vedno ni priznala zločinov, se opravičila prizadetim in vrnila pobitim časti in dobrega imena.

Konec maja 1942, na binkoštno soboto, so v Zadobju pri Lučinah partizani ustrelili Ivano Bizovičar, mater štirih otrok. Še isti dan so ustrelili tudi sina Franca.

3. junija 1942 so partizani v Velikih Brusnicah pri Novem mestu ubili očeta Franca Medleta, ženo Marijo ter hčerko Marijo.

V začetku junija 1942 so partizani v Boričevem pri Novem mestu ugrabili Antona Mišjaka, očeta enajstih otrok. Skupaj z njim so nekam v topliške gozdove odgnali tudi sina

Alojza. Njunega groba niso našli. Že 24. maja so z Vrha pri Ljubnu odpeljali Antona Škedlja, očeta štirih otrok ter njegovega delavca Franca Jakšeta. Njunega groba niso odkrili. 3. 6. so umorili Alojza Hrovata s Petan, očeta desetih otrok. 12. 6. so odgnali in umorili brata Martina in Janeza Pirca iz Podljubnega. Junija so iz Gornje Lakovnice odgnali in ubili Alojza Šušteršiča, očeta sedmih otrok.

V začetku julija so odvedli in ubili Ignacija Ravbarja iz Podljubnega, očeta dvanajstih otrok.

V dobrem mesecu in pol so torej v okolici Šmihela pri Novem mestu partizani ubili pet očetov, ki so za seboj pustili 43 otrok.

13. junija 1942 ponoči so partizani vdrli v Mravljeto hišo na Brezovici

sledečih manevrov, je odslužil svoj rok eden od dveh ordonanc na komandi mesta. Po starem običaju bi ga morali zamenjati najboljša četa v polku (ki je bila tisto leto naša) s svojim najboljšim vojakom.

Ker so bili že vsi "punorokovci" razdeljeni po delavnicah in v pisarno, ostali pa poslani v šole za kaplarje, je ostal na razpolago za Komando mesta samo najslabši, najbolj ošamarani vojak, ki sem ga mogel videti samo v ogledalu.

Tako so mi povedali, da se komandant mesta piše tudi Pavlović (Dragutin), da pa ni podnarednik, ampak polkovnik, ki je bil kmalu nato povišan v brigadnega generala. Pa tudi to, da je zelo strog in da še noben ordonans ni končal svoje službe brez zapora. Saj tega sem si dolgo želel.

Komanda mesta je bila nastanjena v intendanturi, kjer so bile barake za skladišča in pekarijo, lopa za topove in enonadstropna hiša za komando mesta ter intendanturo. Spodaj je imel svojo pisarno intendant, kapetan prve klase, ki je šel vsako soboto popoldne domov v Petrinje po bližnjici peš – po želežniški progi, zgoraj pa naša pisarna, posebna soba za telefon in spalnica za ordonansa.

Vsa intendantura je bila ograjena z do 2 metra visokim zidom in je ležala ob Kolpi poleg mesta. Tam sem bil večkrat na straži, zato sem kraj že nekoliko poznal. Komandant je imel v svoji pisarni obešeno veliko ogledalo tako, da je v njem vsak čas lahko videl stražarja na oglu pročelja. Od tu je marsikoga spravil v zapor.

Moj prvi stik z njim je bil po telefonu; na prvi dan službe, je pozvani: "Halo! Tu komanda mesta," sem odgovoril. "Pukovnik Pavlović, a ko govoril?" "Gospodin pukovnič, ja sam vaš novi ordonans redov XY." "A gde je Franc?" "Otišao je na stanicu, da vas sače ka." "Nema ga ovde." "Stičiće skoro." "O, baš je došao."

Prvi razgovor je bil kar dostojen. Franc G. iz

Prekmurja mi je povedal, da ga je spremil na njegovo stanovanje v mestu, pod večer je pa prišel v pisarno pregledat pošto, pa kmalu odšel domov. Ves čas sem sedel na stolu v hodniku in čakal, da bi mi dal z zvoncem na mizi znak, da me potrebuje, pa ni bilo nič. Ko je odhajal, sem mu šel odklenit vrata v pritičju. Ni videti slab človek.

Nekaj dni pozneje je nadziral čete po vežbališčih v okolici in se okrog poldne vrnil v pisarno. Konja je moral zelo gojniti, ker so bile njegove gamaše znotraj čisto bele od konjskih pen.

V pisarni je sedel za pisalno mizo in se tako obrnil, da sem mu lahko obrisal pene z gamaš. Tudi to pot je kmalu odšel.

Ko se je vrnil z njegova stanovanja Franc, ki je bil njegov osebni (jaz pa pisarniški) sluga, je povedal, da je prilomastil po stopnicah, psujoč mente, mojega očeta in mater, vrh stopnic pa odpel gamaše, ki so bile spet čisto bele, in jih zabrisal po celi dolžini hodnika. Naslednji dan sem pričakoval nevihte in zapora, pa ni bilo nič.

Nekaj tednov pozneje, ko se je vrnil po daljšem nadziranju polkov blizu in daleč, je prebiral pošto pozno v noč.

Ker sem bil navajen iti v posteljo točno ob devetih, sem postal ob tistem

času zaspan, sedeč na stolu v hodniku in čaka joč na znak z zvončkom. Bil sem vedno bolj truden, pa sem šel v svojo sobo in sedel na posteljo, misleč: "Če me bo poklical, bom že slišal." Sam nisem vedel, kdaj sem zaspal.

Okrog polnoči me je zbudil ropot. Tekel sem po stopnicah, da bi odklenil vrata, a ta so bila na stežaj odprtta. Le kako je vedel, kje je ključ?

Pogledal sem za njim; bil je že pri stranskih vratih v obzidju, ki sicer niso nikoli rabila, zaklenjena z žabico. Ne vem, s kakšno silo je odtrgal ključavnico in jo zalučal po dvorišču in odvihral v noč. Šel sem nazaj v svojo sobo in pospravil vse svoje stvari v kovček, pripravljen za odhod.

Drugi dan je prišel v pisarno in ni niti z besedico omenil nočnih neprilik. Menda se je zavedal, da ima vojak pravico po deveti uri spati.

Kadar je bil moj general doma v pisarni, mu je vselej prinesel pekovski mojster (spet Slovenc), ki je delal v pekarni niti 100 metrov proč od nas, polovico ali vsaj četrtinko hleba kruha. Komandant ga je pokusil le včasih, vselej pa pustil ostalo.

Ta kruh je bil izredno dober, na pol bel, pšeničen. Z mojstrom sva se zmenila, da mi bo dala hleba, kadar bom šel

domov (seveda se bom moral enkrat odreči hlebu), da ga bom nesel domov pokazat očetu, kako dober kruh jemo v jugoslovanski vojski. Vedel sem, da bi drugače ne verjel, da smo jedli v Jugoslaviji boljši kruh kot v stari Avstroogrski. Res je bil začuden in ga je pohvalil.

## DOMOV

Ko sva bila s starejšim bratom hkrati na naboru in oba potrjena, so nama povedali, da imam jaz kot tretji član družine, pravico do skrajšanega roka. (Prvi je bil oče, ki je služil 7 let in pol.)

Rekli so, da lahko greva oba hkrati v vojsko, ko bo starejši brat odslužil pol leta, pa naj jaz naredim prošnjo za skrajšan rok.

Jaz se za to nisem brigal, oče, ki je v enem letu zgubil 4 od 8 poomočnikov, je pa naredil prošnjo, a so mu odgovorili, da mora starejši brat odslužiti vseh 18 mesecev, šele potem imam jaz pravico na skrajšan rok. Sedej morem samo izbirati med odsluženjem celega roka ali s čakanjem, da bo brat odslužil celega, pa bi potem prosil na skrajšanje, torej bi moral dve leti čakati doma. Oče je sprejel to možnost in jaz sem moral domov.

Na mesto Franca je prišel iz druge čete Srb, ki je bil nepismen in len, da se mu ni ljubilo niti vsako jutro iti en km daleč v kasarno po čorbo, jaz sem pa tudi raje

šel na trg kupit pol litra mleka ali malo grozinja, včasih pa košček surovega masla ali ovčjega sira, zavitega v zelnato vaho. Kako je ta človek vršil svojo službo, bi rad vedel.

V kasarni, kamor sem se šel poslovit, me je srečal arnautski priatelj Murat Ramadana Babun, trgovec z lesom v Skopju. Obžaloval je, da moram domov. "Ko bi bila midva na komandi mesta, bi živila, kao bogova," je rekел.

Cetnega komandirja Ivo Severovića, ki je bil med tem povisan v kapetana prve klase, sem našel v sobi bataljonskega dežurnika, ker je ta dan opravljal njegovo službo. "Idi i pozdravi moje Slovence," je rekel.

O njem sem slišal oziroma bral še enkrat: Prvo leto v taborišču, sem našel po naključju kos beograjske Politike in v njej kratko vest: "Major Ivo Severović je bil pred ljudskim sodiščem spoznan za krivega izdajstva in obsojen na smrt z ustrelitvijo. Obsodba je bila izvršena takoj."

O podnarednikih sem pa bral v Ameriški Domovini kratek članek spomina nekega PAK-a, ki je prišel služit svoj rok v podčastniško šolo v Sarajevu, ki se je ravno takrat selila iz Gorazda. Vso oblast je takrat predstavljal neki podnarednik, ki je hotel takoj v začetku vteptiti v glave rekrutov rešpekt pred njegovo vsemogoč-

pri Ljubljani ter ustrelili očeta Antona, sinova Franca in Vinka, najstarejšega sina Antona pa so odgnali v svoje taborišče na Ključ in ga tam ubili. Dan kasneje, 14. junija 1942, so partizani na domu v Ljubljani ugrabili horjulskoga župana Janeza Bastiča in njegovo ženo Marjano in ju ponoči manj kot kilometr od doma umorili; za seboj sta pustila sedem otrok. Takrat bi zagotovo ubili vsaj sina Toneta, vendar se je uspešno skril. Pet sinov je bilo ubitih kasneje.

15. junija 1942 so partizani ugrabili brate Alojza, Franca in Stanka Grčarja iz Jesenic pri Šentrupertu. Mučili so jih v Žalovčah pri Trebelnem, nato pa ubili. Vsi trije so imeli družine in so bili očetje.

17. junija 1942 so partizani v Kostanjevici ob Krki umorili štiri ljudi. Od doa so odgnali Jožeta Novaka. Bil je očim Franca in njegove sestre Alojzije Hodnik, ki so ju skupaj z Alojzijino 14-letno hčerko Štefanijo prav tako odgnali od doma. Vse štiri so umorili pri Mihovici.

Neznanega dne leta 1942 so na domu ugrabili in ju odgnali zakonca Josipa in Marijo Trost z Dolše pri Kostanjevici. Znano je, da so Trosta strahovito mučili, vendar njenega groba niso našli.

18. junija 1942 so partizani pod Roženberkom nad Mirensko dolino poleg Šentrupertškega župnika Franca Nahtigala ter kaplana Franca Cvara ubili tudi 62-letnega Alojza Jakoša, očeta dvanajstih otrok iz Roženberka.

20. junija 1942 je partizan prišel v trgovino zakoncev Skubic v Šmarju-Sap. Ustrelil je moža Jožeta in ženo Marijo; zapustila sta dva otroka.

Neke junajske noči so partizani na domu ugrabili zakonca Janeza in Pavlo Dežman z Lavrice ter njenega 17-letnega sina Ivana in jih domnevno ubili pred Krimsko jamo.

23. junija 1942 so partizani na Suhorju umorili kmetico Ivano Lojk, mater že v maju umorjenega Ivana Lojka iz Dol. Junija 1942 so partizani ubili Marijo Za-

gorc ter njeno hčerko Vido iz Šentjerneja (ubili so ju nekje nad Mihovim). Junija so partizani ubili in vrgli v brezno Štefana Stigliča s Cerovca v Beli krajini, oskrbnika gradu Krupa, njegovo ženo Marijo in služkinjo gradu Mici Inkret.

1. julija 1942 so partizani v Cerknici ugrabili tri ljudi ter jih umorili in vrgli v Kirmsko jamo. Med njimi sta bili sestri Francka Drenik in Ivanica Mihevc.

1. julija 1942 so partizani umorili zakonca Suhadolnik iz Podpeči pod Krimo. Franca in Albino so vrgli v neko brezno. Domačini so ju skupaj s še enim truplom, čez dva meseca potegnili ven in 6. 9. pokopali v Preserju.

2. julija 1942 so partizani umorili zakonca Jožeta in Ano Pečnik iz Dvorske vasi pri Velikih Laščah.

3. julija 1942 so partizani ugrabili Jožeta Lončariča, kmeta iz Rosalnic, in ga umorili na Brezovi, Rebri. 27. julija so prišli na Lončaričeve nivo blizu Rosalnic, kjer so umorili njegovo vdovo Marijo Lončarič in 15-letno hčer Anico. Druga

hčerka Terezija se je morilcu iztrgala in uspešna zbežati.

6. julija 1942 so partizani ubili Matijo Šimenca (očeta štirih otrok) ter njegovega sina Franca iz Podloga pri Dragatušu.

Julija 1942 so partizani v Goričah ustrelili Janeza Šveglja (r. 1880), na Golniku pa zakonca Jožeta in Marijo Škerjanc. Nemci so zato v obeh krajih 11. julija ustrelili po pet talcev.

12. julija 1942 so partizani ugrabili, mučili in umorili Franca Brulca s Hrušice, župana občine Šmihel-Stopiče. Skupaj z njim so umorili tudi 16-letnega sina Jožeta. Brulčevi hišo so povsem izropali. Bil je oče devetih otrok.

Takrat so partizani umorili tudi brata Antona in Alojza Vidmarja iz Šentjošta pri Stopičah ter Franca Turka (r. 1903) z Zajčjega Vrha, očeta šestih otrok (najstarejši 12 let, najmlajši pol leta).

12. julija 1942 so partizani pri Borovnici pobili 6 ljudi. Bilo je v nedeljo, 12. julija, proti večeru, ko so v zaselku Dražica pri Borovnici streljali iz grmovja na pred hišo sedeče člane družine Vičič. Smrtno so zadeli 45-letnega očeta Emila in 15-letno hčer Ivko. Čez nekaj ur, pozno zvečer, so prišli nedaleč stran, ob Belem potoku pri Borovnici, v hišo Lončarjevih. V kuhinji so ubili 47-letnega očeta Franca, 42-letno mater Frančisko, 21-letnega sina Franceta in 18-letno hčer Marijo.

20. julija 1942 so partizani na Dolenjih Otavah pri Cerknici ugrabili Terezijo Knap in 16-letno hčerko Pavlo ter ju umorili (Kirmska jama?).

20. julija 1942 so partizani pri Šentjerneju ubili tri ženske člane družine Liseč (prebivale so na Dobravci kot begunke iz Rake): Terezijo, mater petih otrok ter hčerki 18-letno Nežo in 20-letno Marijo.

23. julija 1942 so partizani ugrabili, nato mučili in umorili Franca Furlana in sina Marijana iz Dolenjega Kronovega, čez tri dni pa še mater Marijo.

K vsemu temu nimam reči nič drugega, kot AMEN.

### ZAKLJUČEK

Jugoslavija je veljala pred drugo svetovno vojno za vojaško najmočnejšo državo na Balkanu. Začetek in nagel konec vojne je dokazal, da kupi orožja ne pomenijo veliko, če je vojak lačen, pogosto opsovan in tepen;

takemu vojaku so predpostavljeni največji sovražniki.

Leta 1940 je R. Friedman, ki sem ga imel za najpoštenejšega trgovskega potnika med Judi, še verjel v moč jugoslovenske armade. "Ta res nima bogatih zalog, toda za tri dni je vsega dovolj. Pred tem bomo pa jedli italijanske makarone in streljali z italijanskim oružjem."

Po zaključku orožnih vaj v Zagrebu, je bil drugačnega mnenja: "Res smo imeli tri dni vsega dovolj – dokler so trajale naše zaloge od doma. Potem smo pa šli po hrano h kotlu in ga sredi dvorišča obrnili, ker hrana ni bila niti za prašiča."
