### Sudanci so podpisali dogovor o pomiritvi

Državljanska vojna v Sudenu, ki je divjala nad 15 let, je bila pretekli ponedeljek končana s podpisom sporazuma med vlado in predstavniki upornih črncev.

ADIS ABEBA, Abes. — Zadnji ponedeljek je bil tu podpisani dogovor o pomiritvi vlade Sudana s črnimi v treh južnih pokrajinih republike, ki so bili v sporu nad 15 let. V državljanski vojni, ki je divjala v Sudenu, je bilo mrtvih več sto tisoč ljudi, največ upornih črncev.

Sporazum med uporniki in med vlado v Kartumu je posredovala Abesinja, tu so se vršili razgovori in tu je prišlo do sporazuma, ki priznava črnim pokrajinam na jugu Sudana obsežno samoupravo. Za sudansko vlado je dogovor podpisal zunanjji minister Mansour Khaled, za črne pa maj. gen. Joseph Lago, vodnik upornikov.

Severni in srednji del Sudana je poseljen z Arabci, ki so po veri muslimani, južne tri pokrajine pa so naseljene s črnimi, ki so ali že pogani ali pa kristjani. Med čremama skupinama obstaja staro nasprotstvo še iz časov, ko so Arabci lovili po črnskih pokrajinah v preteklem stoletju ljudi in jih prodajali v sušnost.

Pod angleško oblastjo se je spor malo unesel, pa je naglo butnil na dan, ko je postal Sudan neodvisna država in je arabska večina hotela gospodovati nad črnimi in jih izkoriscati. Zato je težko reči, ali bo sedanji dogovor obveljal v pomeni dajansko novo dobo v odnosih med čremema deloma prebivalstva Sudana ali pa je le stopnja na poti k razdelitvi Sudana na temelju delitve njegovega prebivalstva.

### Unije previdne

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Vodniki AFL-CIO so zelo previdni v svojih izjavah in nastopih po svojem odhodu iz Plačnega odobra, da ne bi sprožili v Kongresu kakega nastopa za omejitev moći Unij, kot se je v preteklosti že nekajkrat zgodilo. Doslej taki poskusi niso uspeli, ni pa nujno, da bi to veljalo tudi za bodočnost.

Slično kot proti povezavi velikih industrijskih podjetij z zakoni proti trustom in kartonom bi radi nekateri nastopili tudi proti delavskim unijam, ki povezujejo delavce v celih vejah industrije in s tem lahko vrše na vso industrijo velik pritisk, s sličnim zakonom.

### Grčija dobi Phantom letala iz ZDA

ATENE, Gr. — ZDA so prodati Grčiji 36 Phantom jet letala, ki bodo dobavljena v prihodnjih mesecih. Grčija je članica NATO, torej zavezница ZDA, od katerih dobiva ves čas vojaško pomoč.

### Komunistična partija v Bengaliji svobodna

DAKA, Beng. — Komunistična partija je v Pakistanu prepovedana, v Bengaliji pa dovoljena. Kot gobe po dežju so se pojavili njeni uradi in postojanke v raznih delih neodvisne Bengalije, katere voditelj Mujibur Rahman izjavlja, da je za politično svobodo in demokracijo.

Srp in kladivo, znak komunizma, je postal vsakdanji znak, skoraj reden pojav v vseh delih republike. Mujibur Rahman, predsednik vlade in vodnik Avami lige, politične stranke, ki je pri volitvah decembra 1970 dobita skoraj vse zvezne in pokrajinske poslance v tedaj Vzhodnem Pakistanu, je prepričan, da mu komunistična partija ni nevarna.

Sodi, da mu je vsekakor manj nevarna kot javna stranka, kot pa bi mu bila, če bi delala podtalno.

Komunistična stranka zahteva svoje zastopstvo v javnih predstavnosti in organizaciji javne pomoči ter obnove. Prevladuje ujeno prosovjetsko krilo, ujavljava pa se tudi prokitajsko posebno med študenti, pa četudi je Kitajska v času revolucije in vojne uradno podpirala Pakistan. Komunisti trdijo, da izidov volitev decembra 1970 niso več javljivni in da ne odgovarajo položaju. Muhibur sicer te trditve zavrača, pripravlja pa nove volitve, kakor hitro do premašanja sejanja prehranjenega križa in bo nova država premagala vsej glavne prve težave.

### Angela Davis odgovorila

SAN JOSE, Kalif. — Angela Davis, 29 let stara črnka, ki priznava, da je komunistka, je očačila otočnico za "nesmiseln fantastično". Priznala je, da je kupovala orožje, da pa je tega norela imeti zaradi številnih prečenj za svojo lastno varnost. Nikdar ni kupila kakega orožja, a kak zločinski namen.

Otočnica ji očita, da je ona kupila orožje, s katerim so nato ugrabili sodnika in naj bi hoteli za njegovo izpustitev doseči svobojo za G. Jacksona, v katerega naj bi bila Angela Davis zaljubljena.

Otočnka je priznala, da je jubila globoko G. Jacksona, toda šele kasneje. Da bi ga skušala reči iz "strasti", kot trdi otočnica, je "jasen dokaz moškega šovinizma, ki prevladuje v tej družbi", je trdila A. Davis v svojem zagovoru.

### C5A preplačala letalske sile z enim bilijonom

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Skupni gospodarski odbor Kongresa, ki mu načeljuje sen. Proxmire, je objavil poročilo Generalnega računskega urada, organa Kongresa za nadzor finančnega poslovanja zvezne vlade o nabavki letal C5A. Iz poročila je razvidno, da so letalske sile preplačale letala z vsaj enim bilijonom dolarjev.

Pregledniki Splošnega računskega urada so dognali, da vodstvo Letalskih sil ni nič ukrenilo, ko je bilo očitno, da bo cena letal presegla dogovor za vsaj 400 milijonov dolarjev.

Letalske sile so določale Lockhead Aircraft Corporation za izdelavo letala C5A najprej 705 milijonov, nato pa so ji dale na razpolago še nove vsote, da je skupno doplačilo zneslo biljon dolarjev.

### OBSEŽEN NAPAD RDEČIH NAPOVEDANA OFENZIVA?

Severnovenetjanske sile so včeraj in danes obstrejvale s topništrom, minami in rakетami južnovetjanske položaje tik južno od Demilitarizirane cone. Vladne sile so enega od napadenih položajev izpraznile, umaknile pa so dalje proti jugu tudi več tisoč civilistov, ko ravnajo z možnostjo nove, napovedovane rdeče ofenzive.

SAIGON, J. Viet. — Včeraj so helikopterja nad Laosom predele pognali na 9 vojaških potekli ponedeljek, pri čemer je ložajev južno od Demilitarizirane cone. Vladne sile so enega od napadenih položajev izpraznile, umaknile pa so dalje proti jugu tudi več tisoč civilistov, ko ravnajo z možnostjo nove, napovedovane rdeče ofenzive.

Med tem ko so imele ameriške sile pretekli teden 4 mrtve, je ta teden število mrtvih preseglo že 20. Južni Vietnamci so pretekli teden izgubili v bojih 445 vojakov, rdeči pa naj bi imeli 1961 mrtvih.

### Katoliška cerkev izgubila 13,450 duhovnikov v 6 letih

VATIKAN. — Po podatkih "L'Observatore Romano della Domenica" je v letih 1964-1969 opustilo svoj poklic 13,450 katoliških duhovnikov ali povprečno 0.5%. Skupno je imela katoliška cerkev v začetku leta 1970 425,000 duhovnikov. Povprečno jih je skozi navedenih 6 let opustilo svoj poklic okoli 2,240.

Vatikanski list pravi, da je število dosti manjše, kot ga navajajo na splošno. Največ duhovnikov je Cerkev zapustilo leta 1969, 727 v Evropi, 658 v Severni Ameriki in 207 v Latinameriki.

Skupno število krščenih katoličanov je bilo v začetku 1970 633 milijonov in blizu 190,000 farah, katerih ena petina pa je bila brez duhovnika.

### Plin iz ZSSR za ZDA?

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Ameriški strokovnjaki pripravljajo predlog za pogodbo o obsežnih dobavah naravnega plina iz Sovjetske zvezde. Predlog naj bi prišel na dnevnih red razgovorov predsednika Nixon-a z vodnikom ZSSR, ko bo maja v Moskvi.

Skupni dogovor z dobavami in prevozom v zmrzljinem stanju naj bi bil vreden 4 bilijone dolarjev.

The Federation of Slovenian Homes brings together all the Slovenians of Greater Cleveland and ties in the different Homes and people belonging to them, so that it makes one big family.



## MISSION HOSPITAL IN TAIWAN SAVES LIVES OF NEEDY

(From April 1972 Maryknoll magazine)

Perhaps to some it would appear to be an unlikely partnership — a pagan Chinese doctor from Taiwan and a Maryknoll missioner from Cleveland. But their venture, the Ku General Hospital in Yuanli, a town of about 15,000, is doing much to give hope and peace to poor people faced with financial catastrophe as a result of having to undergo major surgery or hospitalization.

I don't know if you have ever seen a grown man cry out of despair," said Father Frank Rebol in telling how he became a partner with Dr. Khu Yao-Chong in building a 50-bed hospital. He has seen that many times and the plight of these poor people gave him the idea of building the hospital, completed about 1½ years ago.

A lot of the poor people in Taiwan do not have anything like medicare or hospitalization insurance, he said. Although they work hard, often seven days a week, their income is

seldom adequate to take care of emergencies.

Also, there is no such thing as being admitted to a public hospital and paying the bill later. "You have to put up at least half of the money before they even talk to you," said Father Rebol. And one has to pay the entire bill when he is released.

The alternatives are to die or to borrow. Actually, parents and other family members do not let a sick person die. They

## VOINOVICH CANCELS REFUND WAIVERS

Cuyahoga County Auditor, George V. Voinovich said that he has ordered the discontinuance of the practice of placing a waiver on the back of refund checks going to individuals who have received a reduction in real estate taxes from the Cuyahoga County Board of Revision.

The waiver reads:

"Endorsement hereof acknowledges that this payment is offered and received in full satisfaction of the Board of Revision complaint No. [redacted] on Permanent Parcel No. [redacted] and that upon acceptance and payment

Voinovich explained that the waiver is misleading since those individuals receiving the reduction without hearings are entitled to an oral hearing if they are dissatisfied with the amount of the reduction.

Voinovich also said that he has revised the letter which accompanies the refund check so that it includes an explanation of what steps the taxpayer can take if he is not satisfied with the reduction granted.

## Congresswoman Green says

## PUBLIC ASSISTANCE FAMILY COULD RECEIVE \$11,513

Congresswoman Edith Green of Oregon asked the Library of Congress to compile the total amount of funds a family could receive if that family took advantage of all public assistance programs available.

On the basis of two hypothetical families — one a mother with four children ranging in age from preschool to the college level and the other a mother with eight children ranging from preschool to college — Mrs. Green was advised that the first family could collect a

total of \$11,513 a year under various programs of federal aid ranging from health care to scholarships. The second family, if all available federal programs were utilized, could have an annual income of over \$21,000.

Commented Mrs. Green, "Now for those people across the country who are saying this is a government that does not have any concern for the poor — I suggest they look at these programs."

make great sacrifices to secure the money needed to get necessary surgery and hospitalization. This means going to loan sharks whose interest rates are sky high.

"For a loan of \$100 you would be paying years and years," said Father Rebol. "You would pay perhaps three to ten times as much as you should." Seeing the plunge into debt for years and years gave Father Rebol the idea of building a hospital that would accept the poor and forcing them to mortify their future.

He joined with young Dr. Khu in building the four-story \$10,000 hospital and took responsibility for paying half the cost. At the time, he was trying to get together a payment by Chinese New Year's, the traditional time of paying off debts. But he was not worried

because he had just been back to the U.S. and people had been generous. He said that several foundations and the Catholic Medical Mission Board were contributing medicines or equipment.

Father Rebol and young Dr. Khu came together through the doctor's family. His father, who died about three years ago, was one of the best Catholics in Yuanli. Dr. Khu gave up a good practice in Taichung to return to his hometown to administer the new hospital.

The missioner's role is that of silent partner. He is not involved in administration or day-to-day decisions on policy. But he and Dr. Khu agree that no one should be turned away because he cannot pay. Of course, those who can pay do so, even if only part of the cost, in order to keep the hospital running, said Father Rebol.

Father Rebol has an office in the hospital and makes daily rounds, but his public role is only that of pastoral counselor.

The first patient admitted to the hospital even though he could not pay was a factory worker with seven children and a mother to support. He could not afford the cost of an operation, so he paid only for the medicine.

Father Rebol and Dr. Khu necessarily have to restrict admission of charity cases to their own locality, an area of some 100,000 people. (There are a few other Catholic hospitals on this island of 14 million people who accept the indigent.)

But at least for these there won't be the worry about selling their property or getting into debt for years and years just because they need hospitalization, concluded Father Rebol.

And in this small way the poor, whom the missioner comes halfway around the world to serve, will experience the healing love of Christ.
