Po zakonih države Ohio smejo taki klubi prodajati pijačo samo svojim dobro stoječim članom. Slovenski narodni domovi imajo po večini take vrste permite.

Vandenberg zahteva, da zavezniki pregledajo volitve na Poljskem

Washington. — Senator Vandenberg je naglašal v senatni zbornici, da bi se morali Anglija in Rusija pridružiti Zed. državi, da bi takoj natančno pregledali zadnje volitve na Poljskem. Vandenberg je podprl izjavo državnega oddelka, da je poljska vlada prelomila svojo svečano obljubo, da bo vodila svobodne volitve. Mesto tega je pa vladni blok izvajal ene najbolj terorističnih in nepoštenih volitev.

Vandenberg je opomnil Velike Tri: Rusijo, Anglijo in Zed. državo, da so na konferenci v Jalti in Potsdamu svečano obljubili, da bodo imeli Poljaki svobodne volitve, pri katerih si bo narod svobodno izbral vlado.

Vandenberg je rekel, da zaenkrat nima nobenega drugega nasveta glede tega, kot da se Amerika, Anglija in Rusija, ki so podpisale obljubo poljskemu narodu o svobodnih volitvah, medsebojno posvetujejo, kaj da je zdaj njih dolžnost.

AMERIŠKI VOJAKI SO OROPALI POSLANIŠTVO

Tokio. — Šest ameriških vojakov je priznalo, da so vdrl v urad siamskega poslaštva, kjer so prisilili uradnike z orožjem, da so jim odprli blagajno. Iz nje so vzeli 245.000 jenov, kar je v ameriški valuti \$16.800. 48 ur zatem so imele oblasti vse roparje v roki. Pri njih so dobili še skoraj ves denar.

Med storilci je bil tudi Pvt. Steve Broda, 1888 E. 26. St., Cleveland, O. Broda je služil v Nemčiji, kjer je bil obsojen na 30 let ječe, ker je pretepel nekega častnika. Potem mu je bila pa kazen odpuščena, ko se je ponudil, da bo služil naprej. Poslan je bil na Japonsko lanskega septembra. Doma v Clevelandu ima ženo in dva otroka.

UNRRA bo pomagala nekaterim državam na račun drugih

Washington. — Uradniki UNRRA delajo zdaj na ameriškem načrtu glede nadaljnje pomoči Avstriji in drugim deželam. Katere so prej namenili poslati lokomotive in poljsko orožje, bodo raje poslali kar živež. Dalje so odobrili načrt za pomoč Grčiji, Poljaki in Italiji, ki bodo dobile pomoč na račun Češke, Kitajske in Jugoslavije. Mesto zadnjim, bo poslala UNRRA pomoč prvim omenjenim. Ameriški uradniki so rekli, da bodo porabili \$50.000.000 ali več za nakup živil, kar naj bi se vzelo iz skupne blagajne UNRRA.

Anglija je dala Burmi svobodo

London. — Anglija je obvestila Burmo, da postane lahko popolnoma neodvisna, ali pa ostane z Anglijo kot dominijon. V aprilu bo izvoljena skupščina, ki bo spisala ustavo. Burma leži vzhodno od Indije in šteje 17.000.000 prebivalstva.

Država New York za odprte delavnice

Albany, N. Y. — V državni legislaturi je vložen predlog, da se postavno prepove zaprte delavnice. Postava bi govorila, da delavec ne bi bil prisiljen biti član unije, če bi hotel dobiti delo.

Anglija je pripravljena vzeti 500.000 beguncev, 80.000 Židov

Jugoslavija dolži Zed. države, da so kršile pogodbo

Ameriški delegat je takoj dokazal, da to ne odgovarja resnici

London. — Pred deputiji ministrov, ki delajo temelje za mirovne pogodbe z Avstrijo in Nemčijo, je nastopil jugoslovanski delegat dr. Mladen Iveković, ki je v ostrih besedah napadel Zed. državo, češ, da so prelomile sporazum v Jalti. Dr. Iveković je trdil, da so Veliki Trije na Jalti določili, da dobi 18 zaveznikov (brez Sovjetske Unije) \$10.000.000 vojne odškodnine od Nemčije in da je dobila Jugoslavija dozdej komaj 4 desetinke enega odstotka od tega.

Ameriški ambasador Murphy se je podal nato v debato z dr. Ivekovićem in ga primoral priznati, da ni bila taka vsota nikoli odobrena na konferenci v Jalti.

Potem je dr. Iveković napadel Anglijo in Ameriko češ, da skupaj zakrli nemški kapital, ki se nahaja v inozemstvu. Dalje je napadel ameriško zasedbeno oblast v Avstriji, ki se je odpovedala nemškemu imetju v svoji coni.

Dr. Iveković je pri svojih napadih na zaveznike pazno gledal na to, da je letel napad samo na zapadne zaveznike in ni niti enkrat omenil Sovjetske Rusije. Ker je istočasno na moskovskem radiju in časopisu ostrva vonja proti ameriški in angleški politiki na Nemškem, se napad dr. Ivekovića prav lahko tolaži. Ker je rečeno, da bo danes obiskal ameriški delegat dr. Murphy ruskega delegata Fedorja Guseva, je umevno, da bo zahteval pojasnila glede teh neupravičenih napadov.

V diplomatskih krogih si te napade tolažijo s tem, da hoče Sovjetska Unija omečiti zapadne zaveznike pred konferenco v Moskvi. Toda očitno je, da je dosegla ravno nasprotno.

VELIKI NALIVI SO BILI VČERAJ PO DRŽAVI OHIO

Skoro iz vseh delov države Ohio poročajo o hudih nalivih včeraj. Najhujše je bilo v južnih delih države. V Springfieldu je divjal pravecvi vihar, ki je napravil škodo čez \$100.000 na raznih tovarnah. Huda sapa je podirala dimnike in odnašala strehe.

V Euclidu pri Clevelandu so hudi nalivi onemogočili kanalom dovolj hitro odvesti vodo. Potok Euclid je prestopil bregove in voda se je razlila čez ceste in prišla tudi v kleti. Najhujše je bilo na Nauman Ave. med 200. in 222. cesto. Z višje ležečih krajev je drla voda in poplavlila Euclid cesto. Voda je stala 2 čevlja visoko, da ni mogla naprej ulična železnica, niti avtni promet.

O veliki škodi poročajo tudi iz Tracy Ave., kjer voda ni mogla sproti po podzemskih kanalih. To so bili najhujši nalivi od leta 1929. Dež je lil neprestano 18 ur.

Vlada in delavske unije se strinjajo s tem, da se tako opomore pomanjkanju delovne moči v Angliji. Zdej dela v Angliji še 355.224 nemških vojnih ujetnikov, ki bodo šli pa kmalu domov.

POSEBNA KOMISIJA BO PREGLEDALA BEGUNCE PO ITALIJI

London. — Ministrstvo za delo in delavske unije so se sporazumeli v tem, da se dovoli naseliti v Angliji 500.000 beguncev. Dozdej so se temu upirale delavske unije, toda zdaj so pristale na to pod pogojem, da bodo novi naseljenci podvrženi unijskim odredbam in standardom in drugič, da se predvsem dopusti v deželo take, ki bi najbolj nadomestili pomanjkanje delavcev, kot v premogovni industriji, v livarnah, v predalnicah in na polju.

Delavske unije, ki so se dozdej absolutno upirale vsaki imigraciji njihovih delavcev, so seprevidele, da je nova imigracija edina rešitev za ekonomsko težkočo deželo, ki ji tako akutno primanjkuje delovnih moči.

Vlada je šele zadnji teden prišla na dan z zahtevu, da se imortira delovno silo od zunaj, ki je zdaj na razpolago po raznih begunskih taboriščih po Evropi.

Delavske unije so pristale na to, da se privede v deželo do 500.000 beguncev, od katerih sme biti do 80.000 Židov.

Vojni minister je poročal pri

seji vladnega kabineta, da se nahaja zdaj v Angliji še vedno 355.224 nemških vojnih ujetnikov, ki so največ zaposleni na delu po kmetijah. Toda ti bodo tekom prihodnjih 12 mesecev poslani domov in tedaj bo v deželi veliko pomanjkanje delovne moči, če ne bodo te ujetnike nadomestili drugi.

V vladi je bilo slišati kritiko, ker se dozdej še ni zaposlilo pri civilnih delih 142.000 Poljakov, ki so služili v Italiji in ki jih je potem Anglija sprejela. Od teh jih je še vedno, je rekel vojni minister, kakih 58.000 v uniformi in so zaposleni v svojih lastnih taboriščih, ali pa delajo v raznih vojnih oddelkih.

V Italijo bo odšla posebna angleška komisija pod poveljstvom brigadirja Fitzroya Mucleana, ki bo pregledala vse begunce v taboriščih, ki so pod angleško upravo. Tem se bo vse natanko povedalo o razmerah, ki jih čakajo doma, ako se vrnejo v domovino. V teh taboriščih so večinoma Jugoslovani, ki se ne strinjajo z sedanjim režimom v Jugoslaviji.

Nižja zbornica v Georgiji je sprejela predlog proti zamorcem

Atlanta, Ga. — Poslanska zbornica je z 133 proti 62 glasovom sprejela predlog, da naj bodo primarne volitve brez državne kontrole in da se dovoli demokratski stranki v Georgiji, da zabrani zamorcem voliti v primarnih volitvah. Demokratom ta predlog dovoli, da smejo imeti samo "bele člane."

Predlog je vložil poslanec Roy Harris, desna roka guvernerja Talmadgeja. Ko so nasprotniki predloga vpili, da je to navadna diktatura, je izjavil poslanec Bennett: "Raje pustim, da mi diktatura, je izjavil poslanec zamorskih glasov." Predlog je bil poslan v senat za nadaljnjo akcijo.

Ako bo postal predlog postava, potem zamorci v Georgiji ne bodo mogli voliti v primarnih volitvah, kjer se nominira kandidata za jesenske volitve.

SVILE ZDEJ JE SKORO NIČE NE KUPUJE

Washington. — Zdej skoro ni nobenega kupca za svilo. Največjo zalogo jo ima vlada. Vlada jo ponuja po \$5.50 funta. Še pred nekaj meseci je bila \$22 funta. Vzrok temu je, ker ženske ne kupujejo več dragih svilenih nogavic, ker imajo rajši one iz nyloga.

Včeraj se je po Washingtonu raznesla vest, da bo OPA ukazala zvišati najemnino za 10%. Toda proti večeru je prišla iz Bele hiše beseda, da je predsednik Truman ukazal, naj to določi kongres.

Bančni odsek bo zaslial ob strani, za in proti. Tobey je rekel, da ameriški narod ne bo puščal, da bi se hišnim posestnikom godila krivica s prenizko najemnino, toda morajo dokazati, da je res prenizka.

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Boj za človekovo osebnost

II.

V našem času se torej v resnici bje boj za človekovo osebnost.

In ta boj se bje v mislih glavah, bje se na papirju, bje se po radiu, bje se v načrtih, bje se pri zelenih mizah diplomatov bje se v krvi in smodniku. Druga svetovna vojna ni nič drugega kot eno izmed strašnih dejanj tega boja. A dovolj očitno je, da ta boj še ni končan! Nič ne more reči, kdaj in kako se bo bila odločilna bitka. Morda bo zmota podlegla brez novega prelivanja krvi in brez novih ruševin. Morda pa ima priti prej še strašnejša založna človeštva, preden bo boj za dostojanstvo človekove osebnosti končan in bo resnica zmogla. Kdo ve? A črni oblaki na obzorju ne izključujejo najhujšega.

In kdo se bori v tem boju na strani resnice?

Prva, duhovna, sila, ki se je postavila v obrambo človekovih naravnih pravic, je Cerkev. Katoliška Cerkev, četudi jo nasprotniki napadajo in slikajo kot najhujšo zatiralno človekovih pravic, je tsita duhovna sila, ki je neustrašeno brunila resnico v vseh časih. Zato brani danes tudi resnico o človekovem dostojanstvu in o človekovi pravici do osebne lastnine. Po nauku ki ga je Cerkev prejela od Boga, je vsak poedini človek nekaj velikega pred Bogom in pred ljudmi. Vsak človek je božji otrok, ustvarjen po božji podobi, ima neumrjočo dušo, ki je več vredna kot ves svet, je visoko vzvišen nad vsemi drugimi stvarmi na svetu. Zato ima tudi osebne pravice, ki mu jih nihče ne more vzeti. Je res, da je po krščanskem nauku podvržen božjim in naravnim zakonom. A to mu ne krati njegovega osebnega dostojanstva, ampak mu ga ravno jamči. Kajti po krščanskem nauku je tudi tisti, ki vlada državo, podvržen božjemu zakonu in mora spoštovati osebne pravice posameznih državljanov.

Zvesta svojemu poslanstvu je Cerkev tekom stoletij vedno branila človekove naravne pravice. Kolikor je mogla, je skušala odpraviti zablodo suženjstva in branila osebno svobodo posameznih ljudi. Seveda ni vedno dosegla svojega namena, ker ni imela na razpolago sile. Tako se je Cerkev postavila v bran tudi proti modernim zablodam. Leon XIII. n. pr. je obsodil pred vsem svetom brezobzirno izkoriščanje delavskih množic. In njegov klic so ponavljali za njim njegovi nasledniki. Papeži naših dni so dvignili svoj glas tudi proti nacizmu in odločno naglasili človekove pravice in enakopravnost vseh ljudi in rodov na zemlji.

Seveda je zato tudi zmota naših dni dvignila proti Cerkv glasen vrišč in udarila po njej, kjer je le mogla. A to Cerkev ne bo zadržalo pri obrambi človekovih naravnih pravic. Cerkev ravno s tem, da podleže sili, zmaga. Ali ne smemo imenovati obsodbo nadškofa Stepicina veličastno zmago?

Druga sila, ki se bori za človekovo osebnost, je demokracija. Seveda prava demokracija, to se pravi vrsta vseh dobro mislečih ljudi ali tudi držav, ki razumejo, v čem obstoji resnična demokracija in jo hočejo z vsemi silami ohraniti in pospeševati. Zato boj za človekovo osebnost lahko imenujemo tudi boj za resnično demokracijo.

In v tem taboru demokracije ima skoraj gotovo prvo mesto ravno Amerika. Kajti ameriška demokracija se sme imenovati najboljša ureditev države, kar jih moremo v našem času najti po svetu. Ne trdimo, da je to najpopolnejša oblika demokracije, ki si jo je sploh mogoče misliti. To ali ono bi se tudi v Ameriki dalo izboljšati. Je res, da je v Ameriki doma kapitalizem, kar ji nasprotniki tisočkrat očitajo. A je tudi doma demokracija. Je res, da v Ameriki ne svetijo samo sonce, a je tudi res, da je v Ameriki mnogo manj senec kot kje drugod.

Dokaz za to trditev je tudi dejstvo, da so danes oči vseh zatiranih narodov uprte v Ameriko. Amerika pomeni zanje zadnje upanje na rešitev izpod jarma. Ni pretirana trditve, ki se bere tu pa tam, da je Amerika danes na tem, da prevzame vodstvo mednarodnega življenja. Zato je tudi pred vsemi drugimi narodi poklicana, da prevzame vodstvo tudi v boju za človekovo osebnost. Kakor smo bili priča zadnja leta, je Amerika doprinesla odločen delež pri tem boju, ko je šlo za to, da svet zajame poplavo nacizma. Brez Amerike si je težko misliti, kako bi se to zgodilo. In poslanstvo Amerike za obrambo najosnovnejših človekovih pravic brez dvoma še ni končano.

A drugo vprašanje je, ali se vsi Amerikanci zavedajo dovolj, kaj svet pričakuje od njih. Najbrž ne vsi. Je pač tako na svetu, da se človek še dobrega naveliča. Zato se morda precej Amerikancev ne zaveda dovolj, kaj pomeni zanje, da smejo govoriti in pisati, kar hočejo in v kakršnem jeziku hočejo, da smejo verovati, kar hočejo, da jih nihče ne goni na volišča z bajonetom na puški, da jim nihče ne predpisuje, katerega kandidata naj volijo, da gredo zvečer mirno spat (če so posteni) in se jim ni bati, da jih bo sredi noči zbudila in povabila s seboj GESTAPO, NKWD, OZNA ali kakorkoli se že te "kulturne ustanove" v službi modernega ti-

ranstva imenujejo. Človek bi mislil, da je tako. Kajti le tako si je mogoče razložiti, da se navdušujejo za inozemske diktature, ki on njih danes morajo vedeti, da so diktature.

Edino pameten zaključek je torej: Če hočemo dobro Ameriki in svetu, sebi in drugim, bodimo dobri katoliki, bodimo dobri demokrati, in borimo se za to, da bodo v javnem življenju kolikor mogoče zavladala krščanska načela ki so tudi načela edine prave demokracije. Le tako bomo doprinesli svoj pošten delež v tem boju, ki ga mora bojevati človek našega časa, če hoče, da bo sebi in svojim potomcem ohranil eno najbolj osnovnih dobrin, ki jih ima človek na tem svetu — svojo osebnost. Kajti brez te se človek ne more več imenovati človek.

Zanimivo poročilo

Iz Londona došlo poročilo omenja sledeči prizor v angleškem parlamentu:

Ko je bila otvorena seja v angleškem parlamentu 21. januarja je dospel na sejo tudi bivši angleški premijer Winston Churchill. Vsedel se je v prvo klopo pred omlajem ministrov, ravno pred mizo ministrskega predsednika Attleeya. Zamisljeno je zrl na Attleeya, najbrže se je sam pri sebi čudil, kako je Attlee, mož srednje postave, uspel zbrati okrog sebe večino volitev v Angliji, da je porazil konservativce. Tiho je poslušal poročilo, ki ga je dal zbornici Attlee. Vprašal za pojasnila in nekaj o dnevnem redu, nakar je vstal in odšel iz dvorane. Tedaj, piše poročevalec, se je videlo, da na odločni osebi medvojnega, ministrskega predsednika Churchilla dovršuje svoje delo njegova starost. Postaral se je. In na to pripominja poročevalec, ko sem zrl na odhajajočega postarane angleškega državnika, se mi je zdelo, da gledam na simbol angleškega konservatizma, ki prav enako odhaja iz pozorišča, kakor je odhajal Churchill s te seje. Churchill in doba konservativna odhajata, kakor staro leto z odra, pred novim letom. To je podobno sedanjega političnega življenja v Angliji. Nova doba prihaja tudi v Anglijo.

Cleveland, Ohio

Friday, January 31, 1947

Augusta, Me. — During the recent hunting season, 32,000 deer were shot in Maine. This is a record for all the seasons in Maine.

Cleveland, O. — Bob Feller, famous Indian pitcher, signed a contract with the Indians for \$80,000 or thereabouts, as he wouldn't divulge the exact figure. He received \$70,000 last year and admitted that he was getting a substantial raise for this year.

Washington. — The highest court in the land decided that solidier rookies, who as a matter of fact, did not go to any camp nor put on the uniform, cannot claim furlough pay or any other rights of war veterans.

Washington. — Representative Fred Hartley, Republican from New Jersey, filed a resolution to forbid all portal-to-portal pay suits, which increased to almost \$5 billion. He calls it "legalized robbery." The majority of the Republican leaders have approved this resolution.

Dolores, 9, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Joe Gilvar, 9600 Cardwell Ave., underwent an emergency appendectomy, which was performed in the nick of time to save her life.

A card from Daytona Beach, Fla., notifies us that John Drenik, Joseph Demshar and Frank Ryce arrived there safely.

At the Union elections at Cleveland Graphite Bronze last week, the Mechanics Educational Society of America (ME SA) won over CIO. The first received 1,753 votes and the second 1,295. Against all unions there were 153 votes.

Columbus, O. — Governor Herbert ordered investigation of 34 liquor permits granted private clubs the last days before handing over the department to the new administration. In 11 days 279 permits were granted.

Chicago. — The forecast is less turkeys this Thanksgiving Day, because the price of feed is too high. Last year there were 41,000,000 turkeys on the market, but this year there may be only 34,000,000. At the same time, refrigerators have now in storage 130,000,000 pounds of turkey meat.

Belgrade. — An American citizen, Ivan Pintar of Chicago, was sentenced to death for treason. Tito's government accused him of promising to make connections between the Croatian crusaders, who are against the regime, and the American Army.

Cleveland's cold spell last week was indirectly the cause for the closing of many plants, including the Aluminum Co., Apex Electric, Republic Steel, American Steel & Wire. Lack of gas for heating private homes forced the East Ohio Gas Co. to divert gas from factories.

Washington. — The Committee for investigating un-American activities has organized to investigate Communist activities in the film industry, in labor unions, the army and schools.

Washington. — Dairy

experts report that milk production has fallen. Wisconsin, the largest producer of milk, shows a decrease for the first time in 5 years. The demand for cows is lower, too. Wisconsin shipped out 90,000 cows the previous year. This was 35,000 more than in 1945.

New York. — The Chinese settlement, old and young people, celebrated their New Year last week. According to the Chinese calendar the year is 4635.

Tallahassee, Florida. — The Duke and Duchess of Windsor went hunting for wild turkey, pigeons and quail.

Washington. — The Veterans Administration reports that there were 86,108 patients in army hospitals. Of these, 37,360 are from the Second World War. More than half of them are mentally ill.

The well known Jim Nousek Sr., of 5705 Bon-Ave., will be a patient at St. Vincent's Hospital for some time. We wish him a speedy recovery.

Detroit. — General Motors announced an increase in prices of all its models except the Chevrolet. The increase will be from \$17 to \$193. General Motors builds Cadillac, Buick, Oldsmobile, Pontiac and Chevrolet cars.

Creston, O. — Producers of sausage and smoked meats, the Gerstenlagers Bros., were fined \$20,000 by OPA for selling their products above ceiling price last year from January to July.

New York. — The N. Y. Central Railroad laid off 7,000 employees from all departments to lower expenses.

Washington. — The American government has refused to give up to Russia her citizen Alexis, who was an attaché with the Russian Embassy in Mexico, and who is in U. S. at the present time.

Cleveland dairies, effective Jan. 24, cut milk prices 2 cents a quart. Home delivered milk is now 18 cents a quart and the store price is 17 cents. Telling-Belle Vernon Co., announced the cuts first.

Beckley, W. Va. — Erskine Richmond, school principal, was laid off because he worked in the coal mine during his spare hours. Now he works all day long in the coal mine, and he says that he is earning twice as much as in school.

London. — Geo. Alexandrov, accused U. S. and England of starting with a full offensive against Hitler only when it was clear that Russia herself could defeat the German army. George Alexandrov is head of Soviet propaganda. "Nuff said!"

Washington. — Parnell Thomas, chairman of the Committee for investigating un-American activities, declared that both men, the one who first conceived the idea of a suit for "portal-to-portal" pay, and the one who started the first suit, have long records of Communist activities.

Rome. — The Vatican sent a bill to the Allies for \$755,550 for damages inflicted by Allied bombs on Gandolfo castle near Rome. The American commission is investigating the damage.

Copenhagen. — A crash of the Royal Dutch Airlines transport killed 16 passengers and six crewmen. Among the dead were the American soprano Grace Moore and Sweden's Prince Gustaf Adolf. The plane was taking off for Stockholm.

Miami Beach, Fla. — Scarface Al Capone, 48, Chicago gangster of the prohibition era died Jan. 25 in his private villa, which was heavily guarded.

Washington. — After being sworn in as Secretary of State, General Marshall declared he is not interested in any political office, meaning that he will not be a candidate for president in 1948.

Pittsburgh, Pa. — The contract between CIO and United Steel Corp. has been extended to April 30, although the present contract expires Feb. 15, to gain additional time to work out a satisfactory agreement.

Athens. — The Greek government announced that Yugoslavia called home her military attaché and told Greece to recall hers from Belgrade. Government circles report that Tito's government also advised U. S. to recall her military attaché from Belgrade.

Needless to say that a happy reunion and talk followed.

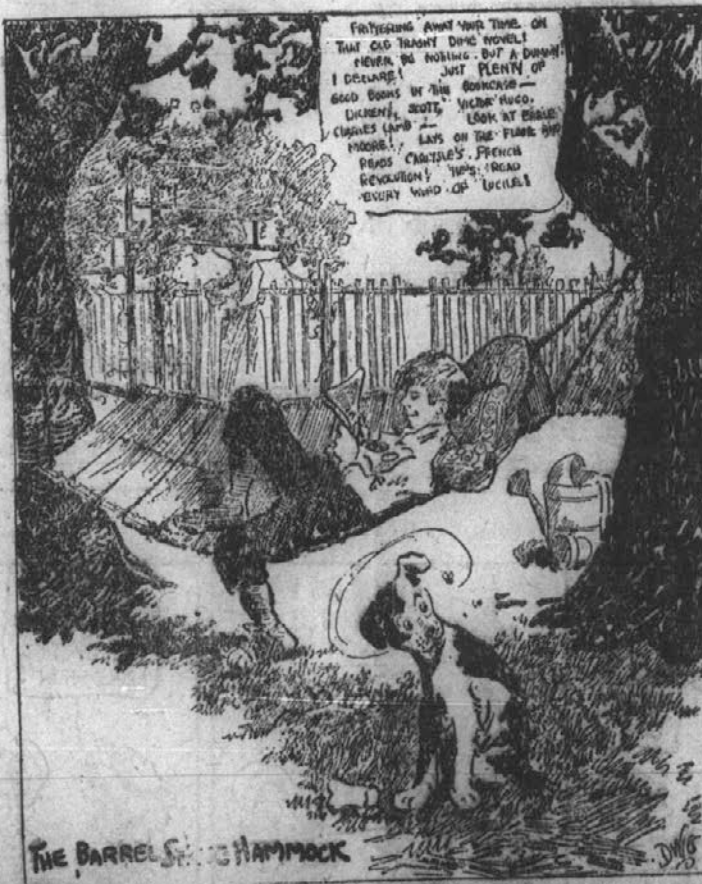
