Benefit dinner for St. Vitus Auditorium

On Sunday, Oct. 20, a benefit dinner, sponsored by local KSKJ lodges Christ the King No. 226 and Sacred Heart of Jesus No. 172 will be held in St. Vitus Auditorium from 11 a.m. until 1:30 p.m. On the menu will be roasted chicken and roast beef, plus side dishes and home-made soup.

Cost is \$10.00 for adults, \$5.00 for children. Tickets are available from the parish rectory (361-1444), or Frank Sega (944-0020). Tickets will also be sold at the door. This is a "matching funds" project with KSKJ whereby the first \$500 raised by each lodge will be matched by the KSKJ organization.

Net proceeds will be used for St. Vitus kitchen and auditorium.

The St. Vitus auditorium was constructed in 1956/57. The area where the auditorium is now located was previously staging ground for summer and fall festivals. But due to the returning World War II veterans, an increase in young families, and an influx of Slovenian émigrés, pushed the issue of whether or not to construct a new parish auditorium/gymnasium to the forefront.

By September 22, 1957 St. Vitus Parish Auditorium was finished and open to the public. The exterior of the

building was composed of manganese gray and sand finished buff brick with the main entrance on Glass Avenue featuring multi-colored concrete panels.

The roof was quite different as it was scalloped. The construction was pre-stressed concrete girders. Two concrete girders, spanning approximately 88 feet, were cast on the job and then raised 23 feet onto the columns as part of the roof.

In addition to the unique roof structure this facility was also built with the thought of providing a modern stage for dramatic productions. A lighting unit, dressing rooms, props were added.

A fully equipped kitchen, social room and storage area were also included.

Updated rest-rooms and new athletic equipment rooms were remodeled in the late 1980s.

The main lobby included imported Italian black marble for the new terrazzo floor.

Within a few years weekly gymnastic classes were being held in the auditorium with its instructor the former Slovenian Olympic gymnast, Janez Varšek.

The new facility featured daily warm lunches.

The gym floor is a regulation junior high school

basketball court with folding bleachers. When remodeling occurred in the late 1980s, half the bleachers were able to be saved and were then installed above on the upper portion of the remodeled storage rooms.

Msgr. Louis B. Baznik's message in September, 1957 to the parishioners and friends was, "We have realized the generous sum of almost a quarter million dollars. The remaining debt will be retired."

The listing of over 1,000 individuals and families indicated support for this project with the average donation being \$100-\$150. The final estimated cost was a bit over \$300,000. (Note: a similar structure built this past September, 1996 for Our Lady of Mt. Carmel (Wickliffe, Ohio) was over \$1 million.

Over 40 years have passed since that first shovel broke ground. If we conservatively calculate that 100 lunches have been prepared over the past 40 years at a minimum of 100 school days, this amounts to 40,000 meals served in the auditorium.

The facility is getting old, and is in need of repair. Please attend the fund-raiser this Sunday.

The "Go Like 60 To Be One of 60" campaign to enroll 60 new subscribers to the American Home has come to a successful conclusion, reaching its goal on Monday.


Heartfelt thanks to everyone who either signed up themselves or gave a gift subscription.

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

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The story of Slovenian genealogy

The following are excerpts from genealogical presentations given during Slovenefest XV by Al Peterlin, founder-president of the Slovenian Genealogy Society.)

What is the Slovenian Genealogy Society? How can they help me? The Slovenian Genealogy Society is a self-help society. Founded in 1986, as a non-profit educational organization, the society depends on the interaction and cooperation of its members. The members collect, preserve, and make available to the public, records documenting the lives of individuals with Slovenian ancestry. The SGS helps its members by making them aware of available information and how to put it to best use.

The Society publishes a quarterly newsletter and actively seeks single page articles from its members outlining successes and failures. Members can submit queries regarding names, history, and techniques. Shared experiences are the lifeblood of the society. Members also submit 3x5 cards for each person and family researched and update them as additional information is uncovered. Many a search has been shortened because another member has already done some of the work! They are repaid by making your information available to other researchers.

Current indexes maintained by the society include the Index to Obituaries of The Forest City News, Forest City, PA 1898-1990 with several thousand entries. The society's Slovenian Ancestry Index of 3x5 cards submitted by members is another great resource, putting you in touch with others who may be researching the same family line.

An increasingly valuable resource is the society's Everyname Index to US Slovene Church Jubilee or Historical Publications.

Member Mary Lou Davidson has compiled Volume I with 25,000 names from 26 church histories. Volume II, with another 25,000 names has just been completed, and work is well along on Volume III. Eventually, these will all be available through the Internet, but for now the society shares these resources with its members through the mail.

However, you may not find your ancestor in the Slovenian Genealogy Society indexes unless you, too, help out. Everyone, member or not, is asked to remember the SGS when "house-cleaning." Send us those church jubilee books and church and/or local histories that are gathering dust in the attic. Send them to the

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
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Holmes Avenue Pensioners News

The largest attendance ever, 184 members, settled right down to business at the September meeting to deal with two matters – the presentation of a slate of officers for 1997-98 and the possibility of amending one of the by-laws.

Nominating committee chairman Frank Ponikvar and his committee (Stan Bohinc, Frank Skoda, Emeric Pausic and Gus Petelinkar) presented a slate featuring the present officers. Nominations from the floor were made but none of the nominees accepted. The membership approved the committee's slate which included for President, John Habat; Vice President Matt Zabukovec; Recording Secretary, Jennie Tuma; Financial Secretary, Louise Fujda; and Corresponding Secretary, Ann Bechert. Formal voting will take place at November meeting.

With respect to the by-laws, President John Habat presented copies of the by-laws to the members and encouraged a group reading, article by article, be done so as to discuss any additional changes that might be considered at that time. Mary Lavrich related how the original by-laws, submitted in 1962, were written in Slovenian and that not until 1980 were they translated into English by herself and Mary Marinko. The present ones had been amended in 1992.

None of the articles were questioned except the one dealing with membership being limited to 300 paying members. A great deal of passionate discussion followed the motion to increase the number to 330. Finally, by a very close margin, the members voted to accept the motion for an increase. According to the by-laws, the membership must approve this motion at the next

meeting and confirm it at the following one.

A motion was made and accepted and then voted on and approved to increase yearly membership dues. The amount of the increase was not discussed at that time.

Having finished the work-side of the afternoon, the group turned its attention to lighter matters. Ed Harbie and Matt Kajfez outlined trips they are offering. Ed's is to W. Va's Wheeling Downs dog races and Oglebey's Christmas Lights, scheduled for Wednesday, Nov. 20th at a cost of \$38.00 per person (meal, refreshments and transportation included).



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Documentary Film on First 90 years Of St. Mary Parish A Delight to All

Several hundred present and former parishioners of St. Mary's Church on Holmes Avenue in Cleveland's Collinwood neighborhood gathered last Friday evening in the parish school auditorium. They came to see the first showing of a video documentary describing the first 90 years of this Slovene American parish.

The documentary, with the title *Many Voices, One Heart*, was produced by Joseph Valencic, who worked closely with videographer Eric Caldwell and St. Mary's pastor Rev. John Kumse. Contributing to the project via interviews, family photographs and films, and financially, were literally hundreds of persons and many organizations. All were listed at the close of the hour-long documentary.

The overriding impression of the documentary was its professionalism and superb photography. Rather than a mere chronology of St. Mary's 90 years, the scenes varied from recent events to earlier ones, with contemporary and generally brief interviews and comments interspersed with photos and some film dating back several to many decades.

Although most of the commentary and interviews were in English, there were many Slovene language passages as well, with accurate English subtitles accompanying the spoken Slovene. Several passages of excellent singing in Slovene by the church choir also marked the documentary.

Rev. Kumse, who commissioned the documentary as part of the parishes ongoing celebration of its 90th anniversary, commented on the parish and its role in the community a number of times during the film. He noted that the parish had always been responsive to the needs of the community it served and that it would continue to do so as long as that community supported it.

Those present at the viewing applauded enthusiastically at the close. Indeed, during the film there were many occasions when ripples of recogni-

tion were heard as those in the audience saw scenes they especially remembered or heard the remarks of some of those who were interviewed.

St. Mary's parish is one, as is St. Vitus, which has experienced the membership of persons from all the generations of Cleveland Slovene Americans, from the earliest to the most recent. This was reflected accurately both in the documentary itself and the audience last Friday.

Rev. Kumse and Joseph Valencic were applauded warmly both after their introductory remarks and after the viewing of the film. Both were deserving of the recognition for this unique and historically valuable project.

Copies of the documentary are on sale at \$29.95 per copy. This is a film that ought to be seen in every Slovene American community. It is both a superb record of one particular parish and a useful guide for those who might be moved to prepare a similar documentary about their parish or community or institution.

Efforts are under way to persuade a local television station to air the video. Hopefully that initiative will succeed. In the interim, however, those in the Slovene American community can secure a print of the film and show it at a meeting of their particular organization. It will be an hour very well spent.

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
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Bill Tofant - All American

I was born in Jugoslavia on May 25, 1912, in Gorizia, Italy. My parents' names were William and Rose. After one year we came to the United States and settled in Cleveland.

On my birth certificates in Gorizia, the parish priest had my name on the certificate as Wilhelmus instead of William or Bill. Our family packed our things and went to Trieste. We said goodbye to friends and relatives and boarded an ocean liner bound for America.

After an uneventful ocean crossing, we landed at the Harbor Immigration Office in New York where we tendered our passports. One immigration officer walked over, scrutinized me from head to foot and remarked, "Hey, kid! You are going to have trouble getting a job if you keep on using the name Wilhelmus." My parents thanked him for the advice, and we walked south on Ninth Street to catch an east bound bus to Cleveland.

Once settled in Cleveland, we took a bus to East 61st Street and St. Clair. We walked to Glass Avenue to check a possible site for a bakery. My father was a baker; he learned the trade in a village in Jugoslavia. We found Glass Avenue to be an ideal spot. Mr. Smole had a barber shop next door. The bakery was across from St. Vitus

Church. The Smole family was very kind and helpful to us.

My parents had all the plans. Later, when I was older, around 15 years old, my job was to make deliveries. This called for a coaster wagon. I recalled a wagon in a window display at Grdina Hardware, located at 6127 St. Clair.

I then looked for my father. He was at Smole's barbershop. I took him to the hardware store and introduced him to John Grdina, his wife, Minnie, and son, Ray. We explained that we came from Slovenia and was interested in the coaster wagon. We inquired about the "rabbi's price."

Then we answered all their questions about conditions in Europe. I must have made an impression on Mrs. Grdina. She asked if I wanted to drive a truck for the hardware company. I told her I would be unable to take the offer because I had a part-time job as a reporter for the *Ameriška Domovina*, a Slovenian language newspaper. But after I finished that work, I could consider the delivery job for Grdina Hardware.

"Not so fast, Wilhelmus," cautioned my mother. Tomorrow morning we will start the educational portion of your young life. We will then waltz over to East Madison Elementary School located at Carl Avenue and Addison Road."

Sure enough, I was awakened bright and early the next day and escorted to school. We found out from the principal that our next stop would be Willson Jr. High School at E. 55th Street, across from Richmond Clothing Factory.

In conversations with other male students, I was made aware of the St. Clair Bathhouse, Gordon Park and Bare Ass Beach presided over by a person with the moniker of "Bill the Mayor." This was part of Lake Erie adjacent to East 55th Street.

But more interesting to me was League Park, the home of the Cleveland Indians, an American League baseball team. League Park was located at East 66th and Lexington Avenue. I was given the directions to get there.

I went to St. Clair Bathhouse and became acquainted with the head man there, "Heinie" Martin Antoncic, who introduced me to fighters who were working out. Their names were Frankie and Eddie

Simms - brothers. They had a sister, Jean, and a close relative, Matt Hoyer, the accordion virtuoso.

Several days passed before I was to get over to League Park. I met the head groundskeeper, van Dellen, and was given a run down as to my duties, which included being on alert for the first appearance of Babe Ruth and the New York Yankees.

I was to go to a pharmacy to pick up a bottle of Eye Lo and have it on hand in the Yankee dugout. It was to be used by the Babe before taking his turn at bat. I was named official batboy. Bill Lobe asked me to catch behind the plate during warm-ups.

I was also nominated to pitch batting practice for any players who wanted to be on the field at 11 a.m. daily. This gave me an opportunity to recruit some of my buddies to snag fly balls in the outfield.

Friends who served as shaggers were John Kovacic, Ed Kovacic, Rudy and Al Koporc, Babe and Ken Hogan, Art Tibyash, Al Milnar, and Chuck Jacobs. I accumulated a couple dozen baseballs, which I sold to a few Class A teams. Incidentally, I played Class A ball for the Rosenblums, Morris Shoes and Kraft Cheese.

(Translator's note: our baggage included two wooden crates which my father had made in the refugee camp. They measured two feet high by two feet wide and three feet long, and were made from boards which my father had obtained from a demolished barracks. Inside we had all our belongings – basically items we had acquired during the past five years in various refugee camps – blankets, clothes, pots and pans my father fashioned out of the aluminum skim of a downed warplane, and a large quantity of lace-work that my mother had made in the refugee camps.)

I was worried I would have to pay customs duties for the lace-work. I talked to a priest about this, and he assured me that everything would go smoothly. When the customs officer came to us, the priest sent a pretty young woman to distract him. The customs inspection went well.

There were some Jews who had larger crates filled with valuable paintings by well-known artists. They had to open everything up for the customs officers.

We were greeted by women in gray uniforms – I think they were the Daughters of the Revolution. They served us coffee and donuts. I wished they had not taken the holes out of the donuts! If I hadn't been so embarrassed, I would have gone back in line many times (maybe I did). Later, we saw a man selling food in many languages – an apple, a piece of bread and I think small cups of coffee – for a dollar. I bought food for all three of us and spent as much as I had earned in three days of hard labor in Austria. At these prices, the few dollars that we received from the National Catholic Welfare Conference for the trip will be gone too soon.

It was already night when they put us on buses and

drove us through Manhattan to the train station. I looked out from the bus and tried so hard to see the tops of the skyscrapers that I developed quite an ache in my neck. I wondered how the driver could distinguish the stop-lights from all the other lights – everything was covered with red, green and blue lights. (We were not used to Christmas lights.)

We had to wait about an hour at the train station. I used this time to look for a loaf of bread for about ten children – ours, Sršen's and Rihtar's. The grownups were hungry, too. But there were no loaves of bread to be found anywhere – just sandwiches, so thin you could see through them and expensive as saffron.

A gentleman walked around us a number of times and looked us over. Finally, he came to me and gave me a couple of dollars, and suggested I buy some candy for the children. I was grateful, but I would have been much happier with a loaf of bread.

Around 11 p.m. we boarded the train. It was a New York Central train, with large, shiny, new aluminum cars. On the inside end of each car was a large mirror made of ground glass. Stenciled on the mirror was a map of the railroad's routes all across America. To us, this train represented the greatness and comfort of America, just as Europe was represented by the old, small wooden cars that brought us from Salzburg to southern Italy.

In spite of our hunger we soon fell asleep and did not see the first part of our new homeland.

December 23, 1949

With other trains roaring past and many red and green lights everywhere, I did not sleep well. Sršen's and Rihtar's children woke before 6; our Johnny at 7:30. From 7 to 8 a.m., the train waited in Buffalo.

There were many factories everywhere. I wondered if they were automobile factories since there were so many cars everywhere. I


wondered about all the wood houses. They seemed so poor, not like our stone or brick houses back home. At home, only beggars lived in wood houses. Cars were everywhere, but no people. I noticed some car cemeteries, too. Snow began to fall, whitening everything.

In the morning, the train passed through Cleveland. I'm not sure why this city interested me so much. Maybe because I had read that this was the second largest Slovenian city in the world? (Or did I sense that we would someday make Cleveland our home?)

As we traveled through Indiana, we gazed in awe at the gigantic fields of corn, still un-harvested. Next to the fields we saw tiny houses here and there. We compared it to Croatia.

Around noon we became hungry, but we didn't have anything to eat. Sršen and I went to the dining car and asked about lunch. All they had was tomato soup and sandwiches. An older black man served us soup and then brought us sandwiches for the kids. Again, everything was so expensive – soup was 50 cents and a sandwich a dollar.

Four gentlemen were sitting in the same dining car. They became very loud during their meal; they were discussing labor issues and not agreeing with each other. When the discussion became especially heated, one of

them said, "Let's stop this and sing *Silent Night*. It's almost Christmas." And they really did sing it – loudly and clearly. This is much better than Europe, I thought.

We reached Chicago at 5 p.m. There they took us to a different train station, where we boarded an old Soo Line train. After many short stops we reached Marshfield, Wisconsin at 4:30 the next morning. During the trip our friend Sršen asked every passenger and the conductor in Croatian, "When will we get to the station marked on our envelope?" (In Yugoslavia, we spoke Slovenian, but Serbo-Croatian was the official language.) After every response, he knew less than he did before, because he

didn't understand what anyone was saying.

In Marshfield, people were waiting for us – Mr. Gosar, Mr. Brezic, Mr. Lamovec, Gosar's brother and others with four autos. Brezic recognized me immediately (from a picture I had sent him) and offered me brandy, but I didn't want any. After an hour's drive, we arrived at Frank Gosar's farm, where the Sršen and Rihtar families got off, while we continued on to our new home. When we passed through the town of Loyal, I particularly noticed the Christmas trees, hanging across the road and covered with lights – it was as if they were celebrating our arrival.

Of the 12 Olympic contestants participating in world finals in shooting, Raymond Débéc took the silver medal in Naféls, Switzerland. Congratulations, Raymond!

This year *Infos* presented a program, "Internet in Slovénia" September 26 and 27 in Cankar Home. There were exhibitions, lectures, demonstrations, and workshops. There is great interest in Slovénia for computers and the Internet. In fact it is greater than in France, Italy, Belgium, Greece, and many other countries of Europe. Two more sessions will be presented by *Infos* this year. That will be November 26 to 30 and December 4 to 12.

A very popular singing group in Slovénia calls itself Čuki. Do you know what a čuk is? Neither did I. It's an owl, a male owl. So now you know!

Hotelier Vinko Lévtik appearing in court in Ljubljana again asserted that he did not shoot a captured partisan. The successful hotel proprietor, today in Italy, insisted his innocence while in court in Gorica. Lévtik was an active Domobranec during the liberation war in Slovénia. His case has been dragging out for years.

Internet in Slovénia featured 40 exhibitors. More than 50 talks were given in various meetings. Télekom of Slovénia held a press conference in Cankar Home. Various examples of netting and on-line techniques were presented. Télekom of Slovénia also introduced a new telephone book on the Internet.

On October 5, 1946 the body of Rev. Izidor Zavadla was discovered in a woods near Gornje Polje. He had been missing since he had disappeared without a trace on September 15 of that year.

The pastor had been promoting the religious magazine, *Bogohub*. Likewise he had openly worked against the spread of Slovénian communism. In memory of his murder, the citizens of Gornje Polje erected a monument to this martyred priest.

At a press conference, officials of Slovenska invésticijska banka in Ljubljana announced issuance of the Diners Club card. The bank is co-operating with Diners Club International of Slovénia.

Bjoén von Sydow, Swedish Minister of Commerce, was on a visit to Slovénia. He was accompanied by a number of manufacturers' representatives. He pointed out that trade between Sweden and Slovénia was increasing.

Dr. Anton Trstnjak, died in Ljubljana at the age of 90. He was a Catholic priest, professor of Philosophy and Psychology in the Theological Faculty of Ljubljana. Since 1983 he was a regular member of SAZU, the Slovénian Academy of Science and Arts. He was author of a number of books, his most recent one (1991) was entitled, *Misli o slovénkém človéku* (Thoughts about the Slovenian Human Being). R.I.P.

Lojzé Péterlé has been re-elected president of SKD, the Slovénian Christian Democrats political party.

As you know, Alénka Vindiš is Miss Slovénia for 1996. In an interview she said that the most important thing is the esthetics of the spirit. Best wishes, Ms. Slovénia!

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


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


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
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Euclid Pensioners Report



Peanut Pumpkins

½ C. chunk style peanut butter	2 T. milk
1/3 C. shortening	1-1/2 C. sifted flour
½ tsp. salt	1 egg
¾ C. sugar	1 tsp. soda

Cream peanut butter and shortening, gradually add sugar, mix well. Beat in egg and milk. Sift flour, soda and salt together, add to creamed mixture.

Shape into balls. Flatten on ungreased cookie sheet. Bake at 375 degrees, 10 to 12 minutes. Cool.

Add enough milk to 1 cup sifted confectioners' sugar to make of spreading consistency. Tint orange with a little red and yellow food coloring. Spread on flat side of 2 cookies. Put together. Make faces with semi-sweet chocolate chips dipped in frosting. Use a peanut for the stem. Makes 18 double cookies.

Attracting Birds

Do you want to attract wild birds to your yard?

Here are some easy guidelines to follow. First of all you have to meet some of the basic needs they are looking for: food, water, shelter from predators, and a place to raise their young.

The four basic feeder designs are the following: a hanging feeder with sunflower seed; a ground or tray type feeder with cracked corn and mixed seed; a suet feeder, and water.

By following these simple steps you can attract more than 100 species of birds to your yard. Never fear that birds will eat only from your feeder and forget how to eat on their own. They are extremely resourceful and will continue eating wild foods from other sources.

However, once you begin a feeding program, never stop in the winter. These are the toughest survival months for a bird. If you are moving or will be away for a length of time, gradually taper off your feeding, giving them time to find other food sources.

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

Pretekli teden v Ljubljani se je nadzornega odbora Nata — Prvo zasedanje Natovega odbora zunaj bruseljskega sedeža zveze

Pretekli četrtek in petek je bilo v Ljubljani zasedanje Politično-vojaškega nadzornega odbora Nata. To je bilo prvo takšno zasedanje, ki je potekalo izven bruseljskega sedeža zveze Nato. Zasedanja so se udeležili predstavniki 16 držav članic ter 27 držav podpisnic Partnerstva za mir in drugih evropskih varnostnih organizacij. Osrednja tema je bila razprava o civilno-vojaških razmerjih in demokratičnem nadzoru nad oboroženimi silami. Slovenija je od raznih Natovih predstavnikov dobila splošno zelo pohvalne ocene. Namestnik generalnega sekretarja Nata Sergio Balanzino je novinarjem povedal, da se možna širitev Nata približuje zaključni fazi in odločitev o tem, katere države bodo v prvem krogu povabljeni v severnoatlantsko zavezništvo, bo sprejeta najbrž pozno poleti prihodnje leto. Med drugim je bil Balanzino vprašan, ali so nerešena vprašanja s Hrvaško problematična za morebitno slovensko vključevanje v Nato, je odgovoril, da ne. To se bi spremenilo le v slučaju, da bi se slovensko-hrvaški odnosi v naslednjem času bistveno poslabšale.

Slovenski zunanji minister Davorin Kramčun je poudaril, da ima Slovenija pri prošnji za zgodnjo vključevanje v Nato, se pravi v prvem krogu, podporo ZDA, pri tem pa citi-

ral dejanje ameriškega kongres pred tedni, ko je le-ta uvrstil Slovenijo v prvo kategorijo držav skupaj s Poljsko, Češko in Madžarsko. Poročila v osrednjih sredstvih obveščanja v ZDA pa Slovenijo še vedno pri tem opuščajo, dalje so se že oglašili nekateri vplivni komentatorji, ki niso naklonjeni razširitvi Nata. Pričakovati je torej precejšnje razpravljanje o tem znotraj (po vsej verjetnosti) ponovno izvoljene Clintonove vlade, prav tako v zveznem kongresu, ko bo ta tema postala še bolj aktualna prihodnje leto.

Trajna nestalnost

Padeč berlinskega zidu je po desetletjih stabilnosti ravno vesila sil, ki je slonela na jedrski grožnji, privedel do novega obdobja neravnovesja in grozčih trajnih vrtincev napetosti in negotovosti.

V spremenjajočem se svetu je dejansko edina os ameriška velesila s še kolebajočim zunanjepolitičnim pristopom. Ob evropski šibkosti in nesoglasjih ostaja le nada, da se lahko ob novem mandatu ameriški predsednik Clinton prodorneje posveti svetovni stabilizaciji. Nova svetovna ureditev zahteva dolgoročni načrt, ki sedaj še ni razviden. Prvo televizijsko predvolilno soočanje med Clintonom in republikanskim tekmečem Doleom kaže, da Clinton ohranja vodstvo v razmerju 52:31. Novi mandat bo omogočil trajnejši pristop v zameno za dosedanje obliže, ki jih je morala svetovna velesila uporabljati za gašenje svetovnih požarov od Balkana do Srednjega vzhoda in odnosov z Rusijo.

Nov izbruh nasilja na Srednjem vzhodu kaže znake popuščanja napetosti. Ostaja pa bistvena razlika med izraelskimi in palestinski pogledi. Palestinci težijo po suverenosti, Izrael noče popustiti nadvlade. Na Dalnjem vzhodu se spreminja stanje afganskega vreliča na mejah z nekdanjo Sovjetsko zvezo, sedaj labilno Skupnostjo neodvisnih držav, Pakistanom, Indijo in Kitajsko. Za zagotovitev reda in stalnosti ob botrovjanju gospodarskih interesov se je Amerika, kot se zdi, odločila da podpre skrajne Talibane. To odpira nov konflikt z Rusijo, saj islam nevarno ogroža kar pet članic Skupnosti neodvisnih držav, od Tadžikistana do Turkmenije, Kirgizije, Kazahstana in Uzbekistana. Varnost teh držav je odvisna od prisotnosti ruske vojske, ki skrbi tudi za zaščito jedrskih oporišč.

Morda so prav spremembe na tej daljni šahovnici svetovale tajniku ruskega sveta za varnost Lebedu popustljivejše stališče med pogovori na Atlantskem zavezništvu v Bruslju. Medtem ko nad Rusijo lebdi Jelcinova bolezen, je novi čar Lebed, ki je še na predvečer grozil z raketami proti širjenju atlantskega zavezništva na vzhod, prisluhnili verjetno zelo prepričljivim argumentom. Opustil je grožnje, a opozoril, da bi bil potreben poprejšnji dogovor z Rusijo. Enostansko širjenje bi negativno vplivalo na rusko javno mnenje in politični okvir. Treba je najti izhod v sodelovanju. Končni vtis prvega Lebedovega potovanja v tujino je potrdil pragmatični pristop nekdanjega generala.




Na Golovcu odkrili novo grobišče

V dolžini treh kilometrov zakopanih več sto trupel
CELJE — Na Golovcu pri Celju so odkrili novo množično grobišče poveljnih žrtev. Ko so v torek (8. okt.) v Zgornji Hudinji v bližini osnovne šole Franje Roša izkopavali zemljo, je upravljalec delovnega stroja naletel na človeške kosti in vojaško opremo. Okoli kosti neznancev je bila ovita telefonska žica. Starejši stanovci se spominjajo, da so op vojni v bližini tega kraja pogosto slišali srbsko govoreče vojake, ki naj bi tu izvajali usmrnitve.

To je v kratkem že drugi odkop na Golovcu; pri prvem so našli kosti najmanj 32 žrtev (dokončno število še ni znano, predvsem zato, ker je teren zalit z vodo), pri novem odkopu pa so naleli na še veliko večje grobišče. Razprostira se v dolžini desetkilometrskega protitankovskega jarka, ki so ga med vojno izkopali okoli Celja. Vanj so po vojni metalni žrtve in jih zakopali precej globoko. Po predvidevanju poznavalcev naj bi bilo grobišče dolgo najmanj tri kilometre, v njem pa naj bi bilo več sto trupel moških, žensk in otrok (verjetno gre za begunce).

Dežurni preiskovalni sodnik okrožnega sodišča v Celju je po obvestilu o najdbi ostankov človeških trupel na območju Golovca v navzočnosti dežurnega okrožnega tožilca včeraj (9. okt.) opravil ogled kraja najdbe. Odredil je kriminalistično obdelavo kraja najdbe, njegovo fizično varovanje, pomoč podjetja Veking iz Celja pri nadaljnjem izkopavanju ter prevoz že izkopanih ostankov človeških trupel na patomorfološki oddelku celjske bolnišnice. Celjski okrožni državni tožilec je včeraj preiskovalnemu sodnemu predlagal nekatera preiskovalna dejanja, ki naj bi jih opravili proti neznamim storilcem kaznivih dejanj genocida in kaznivega dejanja vojnega hudodelstva zoper vojne ujetnike. Ostanki trupel bodo hranili na patomorfološkem oddelku celjske bolnišnice, dejanci tega oddelka pa bodo pomagali pri nadaljnjem izkopavanju.

Včeraj dopoldne si je grobišče skupaj s predsednikom podpredsednikom teharske komisije ogledala tudi predsednik parlamentarne komisije za preiskavo poveljnih pobojev Jože Pučnik. Danes dopoldne si bo kraj ogledala tudi posebna sodnomedicinska komisija pod vodstvom preiskovalnega sodnika. Ta komisija bo odločila, v katero smer bo šla raziskava in kako se bo odpiralo zemljišče.

človek prevzel gospodarski resor. Ker na to Drnovšek ni pris stal, je Združena lista na hitro najačila odhod iz vlade. Ta odhod je ena naših ključnih političnih zaslug. To smo dosegli, ne moremo pa kaj več s petnajstimi poslanci. Sicer so nas strašili z demonstracijami v Mariboru, da je to socialna bomba, ekonomski propad itd.

Dejal sem predsedniku ZD, da sem prepričan, če se postavimo skupaj pred delavce, ko bodo na cesti, se bo njihov prst obrnil proti njim, ker so že desetletja narobe vodili. Tako pa je sedaj v TAMu v Mariboru hudo, a je hkrati olajšanje, ker so se začele stvari reševati. Podjetje TAM se je razdelilo v bolj ali manj zdrave dele. Nekateri imajo dobra načrila, drugi pa bodo šli po socialni poti ali po restrukturiranju. Tako nam je TAM hvaležen, da smo od početka postavili jasno besedo, in povrhu smo dobili v stranko precej članov od tam.

Drugi dosežki

V prvem času smo dosegli, da je prišlo do vrnitve Škofovih zavodov in da je bila tam možna obnovitev gimnazije. Podlaga je v zakonu, ki ga je pripravil naš član šolski minister Vencelj, v katerem je bila uvedena možnost zasebnega šolstva, brez česar zavoda ne bi bilo. Tudi so mnogi naši člani osebno pomagali, da se je gimnazija pričela, kar je bil skoraj čudež, ki ga ni nihče pričakoval, niti v cerkevih krogih. Drži, kar mi je nekdo rekel: Drugače bo takrat, ko bomo naučili drugače misliti učitelje od učiteljev. Taka šola je bistvenega pomena, da se prične drugačna mentaliteta.

Do Radia Ognjišče, ki je drugo najbolj poslušano v Sloveniji, je prišlo po zaslugu Krščanskih demokratov v krovni komisiji za stike med Cerkvijo in državo, ki je priporočila, da se dodeli Ognjišču frekvenca.

Tako imamo dva medija, od katerih eden zelo dobro deluje. V skladu z našim demokratičnim prepričanjem smo prispevali k pluralizaciji slovenskega medijskega prostora.

Tako je v teh občinah sedaj intenzivno življenje, delujejo nove ekipe z novimi župani, nekaj denarja dobijo od države, nekaj si ga sposodijo, nekaj dobijo sami, tako da lahko izvršijo marsikaj, kar prej niso poznavali. Dobro je, če vsi poznaajo osebno župana in on ljudi. Sedaj je že nad 80 zahtev za nove občine, kar je potrdilo o pravilnosti stališča in truda SKD.

Nikoli prej se v Sloveniji ni zgradilo toliko cest in telefonov, kar je nujno za napredok. Naš minister za kmetijstvo je dobil v tujini najboljše ocene za kmetijsko politiko, doma pa veliko kritik. Slovenija je edina država, ki je pokazala večjo kmetijsko proizvodnjo kot drugod po Vzhodni Evropi.

V tem času smo dosegli sporazum z Evropsko zvezo, prišli do Partnerstva za mir, prišli smo po zaslugu demokrščanskega ministra v Cefto, sred-

njevropsko gospodarsko cono proste trgovine, ki nam je zelo koristila v gospodarskih odnosih.

Lahko rečem, da če ne bi skrbeli krščanski demokrati po državni plati z ministrom Šterom, po drugi pa po cerkveni plati s pomočjo laikov, ne bi papežev obisk izpadel tako dobro kot je. Dobil je najboljše ocene po organizacijski, tehnični, varnostni plati, ni bilo nobene nesreče ali problema. 

Slovenska župnija sv. Cirila v New Yorku

— I. del —

Slovenski izseljenci, ki so prihajali v ZDA proti koncu preteklega in v začetku sedanjega stoletja, so se naseljevali v krajih, kjer so dobili delo v rudnikih, gozdovih, železarski industriji in nekateri tudi na kmetijah. Bili so v glavnem nekvalificirani delavci kmečkega porekla. V New Yorku so se v večjem številu ustavili le tisti, ki so bili že doma zaposleni pri izdelovanju slamnikov. To so bili Domžalčani. V newyorški slamnikarski industriji so bili pomembni Judje, tako kot lastniki slamnikarskih podjetij, kot delavci in kot kupci.

V nadaljevanjih bomo objavili tekst dr. Janeza Arneža, ki ga je pripravil za spominsko knjigo ob 80-letnici župnije sv. Cirila v New Yorku. Ur. AD

New York je bil tedaj in je še danes največje ter najvažnejše središče judovstva izven države Izrael. Judje, posebno ortodoxni, so ponavadi bili pokriti. Zato je bil tedaj New York pomemben trg moških pokrovit, tako tudi slamnikov.

Novonaseljeni Slovenci v New Yorku so iskali slovenskega duhovnika, ki bi jim pomagal ustanoviti slovensko župnijo. Imeli so občasno stike s slovenskima duhovnikoma, Rev. Francis Kosmerl, Rev. Alojzij L. Blaznik, a oba sta že imela svoji župniji in se nista mogla posvetiti Slovencem.

Položaj se je izboljšal, ko je marca 1908 prišel v New York frančiškan pater Kazimir Zakrajšek z izrecnim namenom, da se posveti Slovencem. Newyorški nadškof ga je imenoval za kaplana pri nemški cerkvi sv. Nikolaja na drugi cesti, v mestnem delu, kjer je živel večina Slovencev. S tem imenovanjem mu je bil omogočen dohodek za preživljjanje; ob kaplanski službi je imel možnost skrbeti tudi za Slovence v mestu New York in okolici. V cerkvi sv. Nikolaja je imel redno slovensko službo božjo.

V letu prihoda v New York je p. Zakrajšek ustanovil Društvo sv. Rafaela, ki naj bi skrbelo za pomoč novim naseljenecem. Istega leta je ustanovil tudi dekliško Marijino družbo, ki je takoj imela nad sto članic.

Pater Zakrajšek je načrtoval nekak 'slovenski' frančiškanski samostan, v katerem naj bi bili združeni slovenski, slovenski in hrvaški frančiškani za delo med svojimi sorodniki. V začetku decembra (1908) je odpotoval v Evropo, da bi dobil novih frančiškanskih duhovnikov; ustavil se je tudi v Rimu, ker je potreboval redovna dovoljenja za svoje načrtovano delo.

V njegovi odsotnosti ga je nekaj časa nadomeščal koroški duhovnik Jurij M. Trunk. (Rojen 1. sept. 1870 v Bačah na Koroškem, umrl 1973 v San

Franciscu. V ZDA je prišel prvič spomladji 1909, ponovno oktobra istega leta in maja 1911. Amerika je naredila nanj velik vtis. Svoja opazovanja je popisal v nemško pisani knjigi *Quer durch Amerika*. V Ameriki pa je tudi zbiral podatke za svoje obsežno delo o Ameriki in slovenskih naseljencih, ki jo je izdal v Celovcu v samozaložbi 1912 pod naslovom *Amerika in Amerikanci*.)

Kmalu pa je prišel iz Slovenije pater Salezij Vodušek, ki je prevzel mesto kaplana pri sv. Nikolaju, pa se je zaradi bolezni kmalu vrnil v Evropo in tam umrl (1912). Nasledil ga je pater Anzelm Murn, ki je postal kaplan na nemški župniji in vodja slovenskega misijona sv. Cirila pri cerkvi sv. Nikolaja.

Septembra 1912 se je odvedal kaplanski službi in se posvetil delu za organizacijo slovenske župnije v New Yorku. Avgusta 1913 je bil p. Anzelm Murn prestavljen v South Bethlehem, Pa., da bi tam urenil vse priprave za novo slovensko župnijo sv. Jožefa za Prekmurske Slovence.

Spomladji leta 1915 je prišel iz Palestine med newyorške Slovence pater Benigen Snoj. Med odhodom p. Murna in prihodom p. Snoja, se je zvrstilo kar precej duhovnikov, ki so za kratko dobo skrbeli za newyorške Slovence: p. Irenej Petričak, Val. Mihelič, p. Širca, Anton Berk, p. Placid Belavc.

Slovenski frančiškani in drugi svetni duhovniki, ki so delali med Slovenci, so tedaj stanovali v župnišču slovaške župnije sv. Družine v Brooklynu. Župnik te slovaške župnije je bil pater Zakrajšek, ki je bil tudi urednik lista in koledarja Ave Maria. Poleg tega je tam tudi vodil Rafaelovo družbo, organiziral Zvezo katoliških Slovencev in Zvezo slovenskih duhovnikov.

Pater Snoj je pohitel z organiziranjem nove župnije. Zelo pomemben je bil občni zbor slovenske cerkvene občine 9. januarja 1916 v dvorani pod cerkvijo sv. Nikolaja. Udeleženci tega zabora so s svojim podpisom obljudili prispevati \$5,180 za novo cerkev.

Kmalu nato, 14. januarja, je newyorški nadškof kardinal Farley odobril nakup hiše, ki

Izseljenci spet izrinjeni

Za nekaj pojasnil smo prosili Petra Venclja, direktorja Urada za Slovence po svetu pri zunanjem ministrstvu. Dejal je, da je za te zadeve zadolžena republiška volilna komisija, njihov urad le pomaga. Na ministrstvu za notranje zadeve so dobili podatke o tem, koliko je po svetu Slovencev, ki bodo lahko volili. Gre za slovenske državljanje s stalnim bivališčem v drugih državah. Teh je približno 58.000, živijo pa v različnih državah. Urad se zaveda, da je rok za prijavo v volilni imenik in za pošiljanje volilnih kartic prekratek, kar bi se dalo urediti z nekaj dobre volje.

strani je bila pesem »In slednjič vendar« v 13 kiticah, ki jo je sestavil v čitalničnem slogu Rev. Kazimir Zakrajšek. Ena kitica jo ponazarja:

Na tujem bil je tuj dozdaj, v New Yorku rod naš nepoznan.

A danes, glej, kako krepak, kak veren stopil je na plan!

Čeprav je bila večina slovenskih podjetij na Manhattnu, so se Slovenci v vedno večjem številu selili v Brooklyn, kjer so bile na razpolago za nakup družinske hišice in cenejša stanovanja. Kmalu jih je bilo tam več kot na Manhattnu, kjer je cerkev sv. Cirila.

Zato so nekateri želeli tudi v Brooklynu ustanoviti slovensko župnijo. Že 29. maja 1917 je bila formalno ustanovljena Slovenska cerkvena občina v Brooklynu. V verskem oziru je zanje skrbel pater Kazimir Zakrajšek vse do leta 1919, ko je odšel v Chicago. Nadomestil ga je frančiškanski pater Pavel Stanislav Dreš, ki pa je ostal

Kje se je zataknilo? Volilni zakon je bil sprejet pred volitvami leta 1992 in se do zdaj ni v ničemer spremenil. V njem so določeni tudi vsi omenjeni roki. Urad za Slovence po svetu je predlagal, da bi lahko ti volilci zahtevali za vpis v volilni imenik poslati že dva meseca pred volitvami, vendar je zmanjkal časa, tako da je zdaj ostalo vse po starem. O podaljšanju roka so se pogovarjali tudi predstavniki različnih strank, vendar v parlamentu niso nikoli dobili potrebne vsetretjinske večine, da bi dosegli spremembe.

Peter Vencelj je dejal, da razume slabo voljo volilcev v tujini. Te zadeve bi morale biti urejene v parlamentu. Veleposlaništva, ki potrjujejo volilne kartice, je urad prosil za pomoc. Ti naj bi zaprte kuverte prevzeli in jih fizično prenesli s predstavnosti v Slovenijo. Ali bodo to storili, je odvisno od konzularnih predstavnikov. Do zdaj niso pokazali prave volje.

Na zunanjem ministrstvu so Petra Venclja še vprašali, kdo bo plačal te dodatne stroške. Ker ima urad le skromna sredstva, to ni izvedljivo. Urad lahko pomaga z naslovi, telefonskimi pogovori... Vendar zamisel le ni padla na populoma jalova tla, saj je predstavništvo v Münchenu že objavilo datume, kdaj bodo sprejemali kuverte z volilnimi lističi.

Na zadnjih volitvah je volilo približno 6.000 izseljencev. Ce bi se volitev lotili na drugačen način, bi lahko volilo vsaj trikrat toliko ljudi. Urad lahko za zdaj le obvešča predstavništva po svetu, saj se zaveda, da so zdajšnja pravila zelo toga.

Urad je predlagal, da bi v oddaljenih državah nekje skupaj zbirali volilne kuverte, potem pa bi vse skupaj nekdo prinesel v Slovenijo. Urad bi jih pomagal deliti po volilnih okrajih. To je za zdaj le zamisel, saj Urad za Slovence po svetu ne pripravlja volitev - za to je zadolžena republiška volilna komisija, za pomoč izseljencem pri volitvah pa diplomatska predstavništva.



ANKARAN - Prvo vojaško plovilo Slovenske vojske

Pluj srečno in mirno morje, Ankaran!

»Danes je zgodovinsko dan za slovenski narod, Slovensko vojsko, še posebej pa za mornariški odred Slovenske vojske. Napočil je dan, ko bodo naši mornarji lahko končno odpluli na slovensko morje z modernim in našim razmeram prilagojenim plovilom,« je na slovesnosti ob poimenovanju in predaji v uporabo mornariškemu odredu Slovenske vojske plovilo **HVL 21 Ankaran** dejal minister za obrambo Jelko Kacin. Slovesnost ob tem dogodu je potekala 1. avgusta v Izoli.

Temeljni akt, na podlagi katerega je bila sprejeta odločitev o nakupu plovila, je Zakon o temeljnih razvojnih programih do leta 2003. Izbor in nakup plovila je bil skrbno premišljen in načrtovan. Mednarodni razpis je bil poslan številnim ladjedelnicam v osmih državah in tudi Sloveniji. Ponudbe na razpis je poslalo devet ladjedelnic, in sicer za triajst različnih plovil, mnogi pa so zaradi embarga od ponudbe odstopili.

Strokovna komisija, ki je ponudbe ocenjevala, je obiskala štiri ladjedelnice in se na koncu odločila za enega od izraelskih proizvajalcev, čigar ponudba je slovenskim zahteval in željam najbolj ustreza. Ob tem je pomembno tudi to, da je kar šestdeset odstotkov vrednosti plovila pokrito s protidobavami slovenskega gospodarstva. Hkrati z nakupom plovila so potekali tudi drugi podprojekti, ki omogočajo operativno delovanje celega sistema.

Krst »Ankarana«

Začetek slovesnosti ob poimenovanju prve slovenske vojaške ladje po mestu Ankaranu je napovedalo 21 zaporednih strelov iz 105-milimetrskeh havbic 460. topniškega diviziona. Pomolu v izolski marini se je v spremstvu helikopterjev 15. br. VI. bližala prva slovenska vojaška ladja. Nebo nad slovensko obalo in morjem so preletavala letala pilatus PC-9 in Zlini 15. br. VL.

Potem so se ob ladji (poleg častne enote Slovenske vojske) za prvi pregled razvrstili častniki, podčastniki in mornarji mornariškega odreda ter posadka prve slovenske bojne ladje. Tej poveljuje poročnik fregate Andrej Androjna.

Zbrane na slovesnosti je najprej pozdravil župan Izole dr. Mario Gasparini in »Ankaranu« zaželet mirno morje.

Slavnostni govornik je bil minister za obrambo Jelko Kacin. Dejal je, da smo Slovenci sredozemski in pomorski narod, kar je tudi zgodovinsko dejstvo. Ob tem je spomnil na mornariškega častnika Jugoslovanske kraljeve mornarice, poročnika bojne ladje Sergeja Mašera, ki je nedvomno zgled junaštva in neizmerne zavdosti o pripadnosti svojemu narodu.

Sergej Mašera se je po splošni kapitulaciji kraljevine Jugoslavije skupaj z majhno skupino tovarišev uprl vdaji in poskušal izpluti k zaveznikom, kar pa mu, žal, ni uspelo. Zradi ponosa, častniške drže in zavesti o sramoti ob vdaji se je s tovariši odločil, da ladje ne bodo predali sovražniku. Po izkrcanju posadke sta s kolegom Milanom Spasičem ladjo minirala in skupaj z njo potonila.

»Takšno žrtvovanje je redek primer poguma v zgodovini pomorstva. Naj nam bosta domoljubje in neizmeren pogum poročnika Sergeja Mašere v ponos in opomin,« je dejal minister Kacin in nadaljeval:

»Danes je za našo državo in naše mornarje velik in zgodovinski dan. Od danes imamo ne samo vojaško ladjo, ampak vojaško mornarico z večnamenskim bojnim plovilom. Imamo in izobesili smo vojaško pomorsko zastavo, imamo prelepe mornariške uniforme in tudi koračnico slovenske vojaške mornarice. Od danes smo vsi skupaj bolj pomorci, kot smo bili še včeraj. Od danes smo prava sredozemska država in naša vojska je postala danes, čeprav simbolično, pa vendarle tudi pomorska sila.«

Najslovesnejši trenutek je bil krst »Ankarana«. Botra prve slovenske vojaške ladje je bila Vida Mašera Borovljev, sestra Sergeja Mašere, ki je »Ankaranu« zaželeta srečno plutje in mirno morje. Nato pa je, tako kot veleva tradicija, ob boku ladje opravila »šamanjski« krst.

Ob tem je orkester Slovenske vojske zaigral koračnico slovenske vojaške mornarice, ki jo je za to priložnost napisal Jože Privšek.

Po krstu je »Ankaranu« z gosti na krovu zaplul na svojo prvo uradno vožnjo.

Slovesnosti v Izoli so se poleg najodgovornejših ljudi MORS in SV udeležili tudi številni drugi ugledni gostje iz slovenskega političnega in javnega življenja ter številni obiskovalci.

Kakšna je prva slovenska vojaška ladja

Hitra večnamenska ladja tipa super dvora Mk II je bila izdelana v Izraelu in nosi ime Ankraran. Plovilo ni namenjeno samo vojaškim namenom ali za vojno, temveč je vsestransko uporabno tudi v miru, za reševanje iz morja, ekološka posredovanja, pa tudi za pomoč pomorski policiji in drugim subjektom na obali ter seveda usposabljanju pripadnikov Slovenske vojne. V vojni pa bi bile njene temeljne naloge: vzdrževanje ugodnega vojnega režima plovbe v slovenskem ozemeljskem morju.

Ladja je dolga 25 metrov in široka 5,6 metra in lahko doseže hitrost 40 vozlov. Posadka šteje 12 članov. Ladja je polnoma vojaška, »špartansko opremljena«, namenjena patruljiranju in bojevanju. Je tudi zelo živila in težko potopljiva, to omogoča samodejni sistem za varnost pred požarom in vdorom vode.

TINE VELIKONJA in JUSTIN STANOVNIK

Ljubljana — Parlamentarna komisija, ki jo je leta 1990 ustanovil Demosov parlament in jo je vodil Nace Polajnar, je bila vnovič ustanovljena in je resnično zaživelja šele leta 1993, čeprav so bile takrat razmere veliko manj ugodne. Po volitvah v jeseni leta 1992 so namreč leve stranke, ki so izhajale iz Komunistične partije, s pomočjo volilnih prevar (SNS, ZS, DS) doble večino v državnem zboru, s tem pa tudi v omenjeni komisiji. Zasluga, da delo ni zastalo, gre predsedniku komisije dr. Jožetu Pučniku. Že od vsega začetka se je pokazalo, da so pristojnosti in naloge komisije preozke. Demosov parlament hote ali v naivni veri, da bo vse prav, samo če se bo lepo in vladljivo vedel, ni hotel drezati v medvojne dogodke, ni hotel, da se raziščejo nasilna dejanja, storjena v času državljanke vojne, čeprav bi obravnavali zločine na eni kot na drugi strani. Tudi to nalogo bo morala opraviti prihodnja komisija. Do konca bo tudi morala raziskati že začeto delo, ki obravnavata pravno dvomljive procese pa tudi taka dejanja, kot so plenitve premoženja, selitve obmejnih prebivalcev in podobno.

Ko smo spremljali delo komisije, napade nanjo, norčevanje ljudi, ki so bili klicani na zaslišanja, smo imeli občutek, da bo na koncu vse skupaj izzvenelo kot predvolilna burka. Čeprav smo občudovali vztrajnost in resnost njenega predsednika, ki se je v svoji funkciji znašel, kot da je zanj ustvarjena, smo imeli občutek, da je voz sicer speljal, da pa ne bo pripeljal do cilja, saj ga je večina čedalje huje vlekla nazaj.

Zdaj imamo pred seboj tisto, kar si nekateri predstavljajo kot pravico do več resnic, z jasnim sporočilom: do resnice se da prikopati s pomočjo preglastovanja. Na eni strani ugotovitev preiskave, ki jo je podpisalo šest poslancev, ki imajo torej večino in ki zahtevajo, da je poročilo dokončno in naj ga poslanci sprejmejo kot poročilo in predloge komisije, na drugi strani poročilo, ki ga je oblikovala skupina petih članov preiskovalne komisije kot svoje ločeno mnenje.

Kaj je tisto, kar loči obe skupini v komisiji? Soglašajo, da so poboji bili, povedo tudi kje in kako, ni pa soglasja v bistvenem, kar lahko izrečemo z enim vprašanjem: Kdo je to storil? Večinska skupina na neki način soglaša z Mitjem Ribičičem in njegovim znanim stavkom: »V okviru zaključnih bojev smo likvidirali nekaj tisoč najhujših zločincev.« Vseeno pa je ta del komisije ugotovil, da pravno ni moralno odgovornost nosi prejšnja oblast in nenačrtna državno-pravna predhodnica. V predlogu sklepov ni niti z besedo omenjena tista sila, ki je imela vse v rokah in odločala o vsem — Komunistična partija.

Manjšinsko poročilo izrecno poudarja prav to, saj se njegova prva točka v predlogu sklepov glasi: pravno in moralno odgovornost za izvršene povojne poboje nosi vodstvo Komunistične partije, ki je v povojnih letih imelo absolutno oblast v Sloveniji. V naslednji točki zahteva, da moramo zaradi spoštovanja prava in kulture ostanke žrtev primerno pokopati, označiti grobišča in popraviti krivice, kolikor je danes to še mogoče. In končno, sodne oblasti morajo natančno določiti, v katere kategorije zločinov spadajo povojni poboji ujetih vojakov in civilistov na Slovenskem in kazensko pravno ukrepati.

Ta komisija je po našem mnenju med najpomembnejšimi, če ne najpomembnejšo parlamentarna komisija tega zabora. Njena naloga je bila, da na najobčutljivejši točki doseže pripravljenost rešitve za dokončanje državljanke vojne in politično-pravno obliko sprave.

Žal komisija kot celota, ki odseva razmerja sil v državnem zboru, ni bila sposobna opraviti te naloge. Izkazalo se je, da sile komunističnega nasledstva in sile, ki težijo v njihovo ideološko območje, niso sposobne obračunati s svojo preteklostjo.

Sestava parlamentarne komisije deluje proti načelom sodelovanja pravne zavesti, proti najtemeljnijšim pojmom pravičnosti in končno proti načelom, ki zahtevajo urejeno in uravnoteženo dojemljanje sveta in postavljanje njegove politične in moralne ureditve. TRST — Inštitut za slovensko izseljenstvo Slovenske akademije znanosti in umetnosti izdaja dvojezično revijo *Dve domovini - Two Homelands* z razpravami o izseljenstvu. Ureja jo uredniški odbor deseti znanstvenikov, finančno pa jo podpira Ministrstvo za znanost in tehnologijo Republike Slovenije.

Pred kratkim je izšla 6. številka te revije in prinaša devet razprav, tri poročila in osmocen, torej bogato in raznovrstno vsebino z različnih področij slovenskega izseljenstva. Skoraj vse razprave so prebrali kot referate na 2. mednarodnem srečanju raziskovalcev izseljenstva 8. oktobra 1993 na Opčinah nad Trstem.

Prvo razpravo je prispevala Majda Kodrič iz Trsta z naslovom *Zanimanje slovenskih misjonarjev v Severni Ameriki za izseljevanje rojakov, kot se odraža v dopisih v Zgodnjem Danici*. Verski časopis Zgodnjega Danica je izhajal od 1849 do 1902, skoraj ves čas ga je urejal podjetni duhovnik Luka Jeran in časopis si je pridobil velike zasluge tudi za izseljevanje Slovencev v Severno Ameriko.

Leto 1830 je prišel na področje ob Velikih jezerih Fridek Baraga in kmalu pritegnil več drugih misjonarjev. Nekaj časa so vse misijonske postaje v Michiganu, v severnem Wisconsinu in vzhodni Minnesota upravljal slovenski misjonarji. Zgodnjega Danica je redno poročala o misijonskem delu, hvalila pa je tudi ameriško zemljo, ki je primerna za obdelovanje.

Dne 9. maja 1865 je odšlo 51 Gorenjev v Ameriko in so jih naselili na področju reke Mississippi, kjer so ustanovili dve vasi z župnijama: Sv. Anton in Sv. Stefan. V obeh župnijah je še danes ohranjen spomin na Slovence. Misjonarji so redno poročali v Zgodnjem Danici o življenu teh izseljencev, vedno pa so poudarjali, naj se selijo tisti, ki se morajo. Slovenskih izseljencev je bilo pre malo, zato so utonili v ameriškem svetu.

Bela krajina je pokrajina, iz katere se je do druge svetovne vojne izselilo največ ljudi. Od 1880 do 1910 se je izselilo več kot 12.000 ljudi, to je skoraj polovica prebivalstva.

»Bela krajina je živila od Amerike. Amerika je zidala, popravljala, dajala kruh in obliko,« je zapisal Janez Ma terič v svoji knjigi Slovenska vas pod kapitalističnim jarrom, Ljubljana 1957. Tako predstavlja Belo krajino v svoji razpravi Nives Sulič.

Mihail Kuzmič je po spisih v Mladem Prekmurcu sestavil razpravo o izseljevanju iz Prekmurja med prvo in drugo svetovno vojno. Prekmurci so vedno hodili na sezonsko delo in pred prvo vojno jih je bilo 12.000, do leta 1910 pa se je izselilo 5.867 ljudi. Leta 1938 je bilo med izseljenci 60% žensk,

delale so po 18 ur in več, zasluzile pa so po 10 dinarjev.

Zemlje je bilo v Prekmurju vedno premalo, tudi agrarna reforma ni odpravila tega problema. Vladal je tudi običaj, da so starši delili zemljo med otroke, ko so se poročili.

Rozina Švent je opisala begunce po zadnji vojni v Avstriji in Italiji. Vsi so vedeli, da bodo morali oditi po svetu, ko bosta Avstria in Italija podpisali mirovno pogodbo.

Največ jih je odšlo v Argentino, ker je dosegel duhovnik Janez Mladnik pri generalu Peronu dovoljenje, da lahko pride v Argentino 10.000 Slovencev, ne glede na starost in zdravje. Nekaj so jih sprejeli Kanada, ZDA in Avstralija, nekaj malega pa jih je ostalo na Koroškem. Vsi so se v novih domovinah vzivelji v razmere in začeli novo življenje, v Argentini pa so ustvarili novo Slovenijo.

Breda Čebulj Sajko je na podlagi avtobiografske metode predstavila izseljevanje v Avstralijo v šestdesetih letih. Vzroki tedaj niso bili samo politični, ampak različni, in največ so odhajali v Avstralijo. Med opisanimi je tudi pater Valerjan Jenko, ki je dokončal teologijo v ZDA, septembra 1963 pa je odšel v Avstralijo, ker je primanjkovalo slovenskih duhovnikov.

Janja Žitnik je predstavila *Mladostno bojevitost Milene Merlak ob pesničini šestdesetletnici*. Pesnica Milena Merlakova se je rodila 1935 pri Logatcu, dokončala gimnazijo in študirala na ljubljanski univerzi primerjalno književnost in psihologijo, odšla avgusta 1960 z Levom Detelo na Dunaj, kjer sta se poročila in si ustvarila dom, v katerem še danes živita.

Pesmi je pisala že v dijaških letih, v begunstvu je pisala še v nemščini in angleščini. Izdala je štiri samostojne pesniške zbirke in eno skupaj z možem. V pesmih je toliko avantgardizma in hermetike, da so težko

razumljive, če je sploh mogoče ugotoviti, kaj je hotela povedati. Hodila je za možem, ki je iskal nova pota v slovenski poeziji. Najbolj uspela je zbirka *Zimzelene luči* iz leta 1976, v kateri je opela verske praznike, pogosto notranje doživeto in v bogatem pesniškem jeziku.

Žitnikova je ocenila vse zbirke in jih uvrstila na mesta, ki ga zaslužijo.

Peter Klinar je opisal nekaj sodobnih vidikov slovenskih imigracijskih procesov. Od 60-ih letih naprej »je Slovenija posala izrazita imigrantska država, v katero so se vseljevali številni imigranti s področja nekdanje Jugoslavije, tako da se je vse do 1991. leta povečeval delež neslovenskega prebivalstva, ki je v tem letu dosegel že 12,45% vsega prebivalstva.«

Vzporedno pa so se izseljevali tudi Slovenci, med njimi predvsem izobraženci. Ker Slovenci niso imeli narodne države, so prinesli v emigracijo samo slovensko etnično narodno identiteto in zavest ter jo gojili naprej tudi preko emigrantskih etničnih skupnosti.

Slovenija ni takoj izoblikovala svoje vselitvene in izselitvene politike. Če je bila ob nastanku samostojne države zelo odprta do pripadnikov jugoslovenskih narodov, ki so živeli ali se zatekli v Slovenijo, je počasi začela zapirati meje, ni pa znala pritegniti svojih izseljencev iz tujine. Slovenci nimajo nikjer na svetu težav radi svoje narodnosti, povsod se znajo vživeti v razmere in si urediti življenje, zato se težko vračajo v »staro« domovino.

Milena Bevc je analizirala začasne slovenske emigrante in jih razporedila po regijah in izobrazbi. Po ljudskem štetju iz leta 1991 ima Slovenija »začasno« v tujini 2,7% vseh svojih stalnih prebivalcev, t.j. 52.600 oseb. Pretežni del evидентiranih slovenskih izseljencev živi v Nemčiji, precej jih je tudi v Avstriji, Švici in Italiji. Zastopane so vse slovenske krajine, izobrazba je visoka. Avtorica je opremila razpravo s preglednimi grafikonami.

Milan Bufon je prikazal prostorsko mobilnost v območju Goriške zaradi političnih sprememb po prvi in drugi svetovni vojni. V Brdih so navedli, da imajo v gospodinjstvih do 70% izseljenih članov. Najpogosteje se pri tem navajata dve sorodstveni kategoriji: »bratje in sestre« (63% navedb), strici in tete (26% navedb). V nadaljevanju analizira izseljevanje, to je bilo zelo izrazito v Novi Gorici, ki je novo mesto namesto italijanske Gorice.

Breda Čebulj Sajko poroča o tretjem mednarodnem srečanju raziskovalcev izseljenstva v Portorožu maja 1994.

Marina Lukšič-Hacin je bila dva meseca na študijskem pobovanju med Slovenci na Švedskem. Navezala je stike z izseljenicami, njihovimi društvami, z osrednjo Slovensko zvezo, s poslaništvo, poglavitnimi univerzitetnimi središči in povsod iskala vire o Slovencih za

doktorsko disertacijo. To je prvo tako sistematično delo med izseljenci.

Jožko Fornazarči poroča o slovenskih študentih po svetu. Po ustanovitvi slovenske države so ustanovili v Mednarodni pisarni Študentske organizacije Univerze (ŠOU) načrt Slovenski študenti po svetu. Kot prvi cilj so si zastavili nalogu, da navežejo stike s slovenskimi študentovskimi klubovi v Celovcu, Gradcu, na Dunaju, v Zagrebu, Splitu, na Reki in v Trstu. Stiki s temi študenti so že utečeni, težje je s stiki s slovenskimi študenti po svetu, saj imajo za zdaj stike samo s Sydnejem v Avstraliji.

Sledi osem ocen knjig, ki se nanašajo na izseljenstvo in sorodne probleme. Tako je 6. snopič Dveh domovin bogat in odkriva vrsto problemov o slovenskem izseljenstvu. Vse razprave so napisane z velikim strokovnim znanjem in bogato bibliografijo.

Zamenjal ga je pater Kornej Petrič. Z njim se je začelo prav resno prizadevanje za ustanovitev slovenske župnije s svojo cerkvijo. Zbirali so denarna sredstva in nameravali kupiti neko protestantsko cerkev, ki je bila tedaj na prodaj. Vse to delo pa je prenehalo z nenadno smrtjo (8. maja 1925) p. Kornelija Petriča.

Vzrok za propad cele akcije je bilo več. Prvi je bil prav gotovo ta, da niso uspeli dobiti duhovnika, ki bi prevzel skrb za novo župnijo. Župnik nemške teritorialne župnije ni bil naklonjen ideji, da bi znotraj njegovega teritorija nastala neteritorialna narodnostna župnija. Prav tako pa tudi franciškani niso bili navdušeni nad idejo druge slovenske župnije v New Yorku. Vpeljali so pri sv. Cirilu tretjo nedeljsko mašo, ki naj bi bila za Slovence iz Brooklyna. Udeležba pri tej maši je padala in zato so jo že spomladi leta 1927 ukinili. Vedno večji del Slovencev se je navadil hoditi v najbližjo brooklynško cerkev, tako angleško kot tudi nemško.

Licenciat iz filozofije je dosegel leta 1943 in končal leta 1949 z doktoratom iz teologije z dizertacijo »Ljubezen pri Janezu Evangelistu«.

Služboval je v Švici, v nemško govorečem kantonu v škofiji Chur, od leta 1949 do 1976 kot kaplan, profesor in kasnejše ravnatelj semeniča in škofov vikar.

V Ljubljano je bil poklican leta 1977 in postal kanonik in arhidiakon. 23. februarja 1980 je bil imenovan za nadškofa in metropolita, 13. marca je nadškofijo kanonično prevzel in bil posvečen in umeščen 13. aprila 1980.

Po kanonskem pravu je dolžan vsak škof ali župnik s 75. letom podati na svojo službo

ostavko. Nadškof jo je že predložil papežu Janezu Pavlu II. in Slovenija moli in čaka, kdo

ga bo nasledil. Od tam dobivamo tudi mi prošnje, da bi izmolili njemu vrednega naslednika. Nesporo je nadškof dr. Šuštar bil za čase njegovega škofovanja najbolj primerena oseba, ker je med strahotami revolucije v domovini bil v rimskem teološkem študiju in kasneje dolga leta v Švici. V svojem delovanju se je držal verjetno v duhu evanglista Janeza iz sledkov in nauka njegove dizertacije o največjem evangelistu Kristusove ljubezni.

O nadškofu so in bodo pisali še mnogi verjetno obširne članke in knjige. Naša molitev naj ga spremlja in mu utrdi zdravje.

Pred odhodom iz Švice v Slovenijo je nadškof bil zvest sodelavec MZA in vsako leto poslal svoj ček in nekaj znakov za naše misijonarje in pionirke.

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
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
