Slovenska Cvetna nedelja v Ameriki

Sovjetske rakete in čete prišle v Egipt

Pretekli teden naj bi dospele v Egipt, kot poroča New York Times iz "zanesljivih diplomatskih virov", sovjetske čete in rakete v Egipt.

NEW YORK, N.Y. — Včerajšnji New York Times je prinesel na prvi strani vest, da so po zanesljivih diplomatskih virih iz Kaira dospele pretekli teden v Egipt sovjetske čete in rakete, da pomagajo braniti Naserjevo domovino pred izraelskimi letali. Število sovjetskih čet ceni jo nad 1,500 mož. Njihova naloga bo upravljal rakete SAM-3, ki so posebno izdelane za boj proti nizko letečim letalom, in seveda radarje ter vse drugo, kar je v zvezi z moderno organizirano letalsko obrambo.

Poročila iz Egipta trdijo, da so videli sovjetske vojake, ki so vozili tovornjake z rakетami na puščavski velecesti med Aleksandrijo in Kairom. Promet na tej cesti je bil ponovno zadnji teden za tuje prekinjen. Rakete so postavili okoli Aleksandrije in raznih vojaških oporišč, pa jih postavljajo tudi okoli Kaira in drugih pomembnih središč v dolini Nila, kamor so v preteklih mesecih ponovno priletele izraelska letala.

Vprašanje nastane, kaj bodo storili Sovjeti, če izraelska letala napadejo ta oporišča raketi in pri tem pobijejo ruske posadke, ki jih upravlja. Mar se ne bodo Rusi v takem slučaju odločili za varovanje teh oporišč z lastnimi lovskimi letali in lastnimi piloti? Izraelska poročila so ta teden ponovno trdila, da ruski piloti krmajo egiptskata letala, ki nadzirajo kretanje ameriške šeste flote po vzhodnem Sredozemlju.

ZDA PRIZNAVAJO VLADO KAMBODŽE KOT USTAVNO

Eržavno tajništvo v Washingtonu je včeraj izjavilo, da priznane novega položaja v Kambodži "iz ustavnih razlogov ne obstoji". Odstavitev predsednika Sihanuka nima tako na priznanje ZDA nobenega vpliva, ker je bila izvedena v skladu z ustavo.

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Združene države so včeraj priznale novo stanje v Kambodži, ko so izjavile, da z ozirom na ustavo ne obstoji vprašanje priznavanja vlade. Ta je dejansko ostala na svojem mestu, narodna skupščina in državni svet sta odstavila samo princa Norodom Sihanuka kot predsednika države. Ker se je to zgodilo v okviru ustave in po njenih določilih, vprašanje priznavanja novega stanja pravno ni niti nastopilo. Princ Sihanuk je med tem še vedno v Peipingu, kjer so ga včeraj sprejeli z vsemi častmi kot državnega poglavarja.

V Phnom Penhu je med tem šel novi začasni predsednik Cheng Heng na radio in je ob sodil "velike" napake svojega prednika princa Sihanuka, ki da se ni brigal za dobrobit ljudstva, ampak uganjal nepotizem in korupcijo. Prav tako ga je obdolžil sodelovanja s Severnim Vietnamom in "provizorično revolucionarno vlado Južnega Vietnama", katere oboroženim silam se dobavljal orožje v svojo osebno korist.

Vlada predsednika gen. Lon Nol-a je med tem oklical izredno stanje in za 6 mesecev ukinila vse ustavne pravice državljanov. Lon Nol je Severni Vietnam in Viet Kong označil enostavno za "naše vietnamske sovražnike" in poslal, kot trdijo poročila, večino kambodžanskih oboroženih sil proti meji Južnega Vietnama, kjer se na kambodžanskih tleh zadržuje okoli 40,000 rdečih vojakov, pretežno severnih Vietnamcev.

Razume se, da naše delegacije, ki imajo stike z vietnamskimi komunisti, stalno intervenirajo za podatke.

ZDRAŽENI NARODI, N.Y. — Potem ko sta Vel. Britanija in Amerika vetrili resolucijo afriško-azijskih držav proti Rodeziji v Varnostnem svetu ZN, je bila to po posredovanju Finske omiljena v taki obliki, da so jo vse članice sprejele.

Nova, preteklo sredo odobrena resolucija poziva vse države, naj prekinejo prometne zveze z Rodezijo in se drže bojkota, pusti pa poštne, telefonske, telegrafike in radijske zveze Rodezije z svetom v miru. Prav tako je bil iz resolucije črtan poziv Veliki Britaniji, naj nastopi proti Rodeziji z oboroženo silo. Nova resolucija v bistvu Rodeziji ne bo povzročila nobenih novih težav.

Veliko bralcev ne upa naročiti neodvisnih časopisov, morajo si pomagati na druge načine, da pridejo do njih.

Razgovori v Peipingu ostali še brez uspeha

MOSKVA, ZSSR. — Glavno gledalo Komunistične partije ZSSR "Pravda" je včeraj omenila, da razgovori med Sovjetsko zvezo in Kitajsko v Peipingu ob odstranitvi obmejnih sporov ne potekajo uspešno. Vzrok naj bi bil v kitajskem prepranju, da Sovjetska zveza pripravlja vojno proti Kitajski.

"Pravda" vse vesti o vojaških pripravah proti Kitajski odločno zavora in se zavzema za ohranitev miru vzdolj sovjetsko-kitajske meje.

Pisanje "Pravde" je zanimivo v toliko, ker Rusi svojih vojaških priprav v Srednji Aziji, pa tudi na Daljnem vzhodu pravnične ne skrivajo, kot jih seveda tudi Kitajci ne. Kitajska vztrajajo-





Easter Basket Coffee Cake



Easter is the traditional time to serve coffee cakes that are special. People drop by after church and children are famished, despite chocolate bunnies and jelly beans. For a coffee cake that's delicious and quick to make, try this one combining biscuit mix and cranberry-orange relish.

CRANBERRY BASKET WEAVE COFFEE CAKE
(Makes 1 9-inch round coffee cake)

4 cups biscuit mix	1/4 cup chopped pitted prunes
2 tablespoons granulated sugar	1/4 cup finely chopped nuts
2 eggs	1 cup Ocean Spray cranberry-orange relish from a 14-ounce jar

Combine biscuit mix and sugar. Beat eggs and remove 2 tablespoons for glazing top. Blend remaining egg into cream and add to dry ingredients. Knead on well-floured board until smooth. Press 2/3 of dough into greased 9-inch cake pan and up sides about 1 inch. Combine prunes, nuts, and cranberry-orange relish. Spread over the top of the dough. Roll out remaining dough into 1/2 strips and arrange over filling. Use a long strip around the outer edge of the cake. Brush with reserved beaten egg. Bake at 425° F. for 20 to 25 minutes or until richly browned.

(5) Be sure your water heater is supplying water that is "hot enough." (That means at least 140 degrees.) Many innocent washers are blamed for not washing clean enough when the fault is due to an inefficient water heater or one with too low a thermostat setting.

is pushed all the way in. See if the washer stopped itself because the previous load became unbalanced. If so, press the reset button. Make sure the lid is completely closed; on some washers a safety switch will shut off the power if the lid is even partly open.

(3) Never overload. This prevents clothes from washing properly and also puts a strain on the motor.


PROMOTION - A COMMUNITY BUILDER

Suburban sprawl and the satellite communities it has spawned has struck a hard blow at downtown shopping areas in many cities. Civic leaders, knowing that a town without a center runs the risk of losing its identity, have sought to stem the outflowing tide, often at considerable cost to taxpayers.

But people will never return to downtown shopping areas for purely aesthetic or sentimental reasons, and no one knows this better than downtown merchants. Besides parking lots and other facilities, they know that downtown stores must offer customers a pocketbook incentive. Such is the way of the free market, where consumers have the final say in the evolution of retail distribution.

An interesting example of how downtown merchants can move to revive lagging downtown shopping is seen in Baton Rouge, Louisiana. More than 26 Baton Rouge merchants have formed a nonprofit corporation in a cooperative effort to attract business to downtown stores. A central part of their program after extensive research was to arrange for a group of stores within a four-block area to give trading stamps.

Baton Rouge merchants are demonstrating a fact that a great many people overlook — promotion and advertising are community builders, as well as business builders.

Hot Cheese Soup Hits The Spot

A perfect beginning for a meal or a meal in itself is flavor-some Swiss Cheese Soup. As the name implies, natural Wisconsin Swiss cheese is the mainstay of the thick rich soup, which also takes advantage of both the convenience and flavor of dehydrated onion soup mix.

Serve this delightful concoction while piping hot, advises the Borden Kitchen. If allowed to cool too much, and the cheese becomes stringy, just stir and gently reheat.

Swiss Cheese Soup

(Makes 5 cups)

2 tablespoons margarine OR	2 cups milk
butter	1½ cups (one 6-oz. package)
3 tablespoons all-purpose flour	shredded Borden Natural Wisconsin Swiss Cheese
3 cups boiling water	Parsley
1 (1¼-oz.) package dehydrated onion soup mix	

In medium-size saucepan, melt margarine or butter. Stir in flour; cook over low heat until mixture bubbles and color starts to turn golden. Remove from heat. Pour in boiling water. Sprinkle onion soup mix on top; return to heat and cook for 15 minutes. Add milk and cheese. Heat just until cheese starts to melt. If desired, garnish with parsley. Serve piping hot.

Fire hazards found in some modern fabrics

All fabrics can burn.

This means that the clothes you wear and the furnishings in your home will burn under the proper set of conditions.

The most common source of clothing ignition among adults is CARELESS SMOKING. Following smoking, the cook stove, rubbish fire and heating stove cause the most frequent accidents.

Fabrics vary greatly in their flammability. Of the basic fibers wool is comparatively flame-resistant. It will ignite, but it burns slowly, but very easy to put out.

Glass fibers such as (Fiberglass, PPG Fiber Glass, Dynel) and other man made fibers are fire resistant.

Synthetic fibers such as nylon, polyester, or acrylics are

usually less flammable than the fibers of cotton, linen and rayon. But synthetics can actually melt as they burn and the sticky substance that is formed produces deep, localized burns.

Cotton and Rayon burn readily. They can be treated with chemicals to make them flame-proof, but manufacturers have just recently begun to use this treatment on clothes.

What should be done if someone's clothes catch on fire? Force him to drop or lie down wherever he is. If a rug, or wool blanket is available roll the person into it to smother the fire.

The natural tendency when clothes catch fire is to RUN. But this only makes the fire burn faster and increase the danger of flames and smoke sweeping up toward the face.

Ohio Bell's Earnings Decreased in 1969

Ohio Bell's earnings decreased in 1969 for the second consecutive year, according to the phone company's annual report. Net income was down \$7,005,000 from the previous year and earnings per share dropped to \$1.67. This is compared with earnings of \$1.90 in 1968 and \$2.08 in 1967.

According to President Frederick R. Eckley, the reduced net income is the result of unprecedented inflationary pressures that were most noted in increased wages and in the highest money costs in the company's history.

Operating expenses were \$335,075,000 for 1969, an increase of \$36,244,000 over 1968, or about 12 per cent higher. At the same time total operating revenues were up \$27,995,000 over the previous year to \$500,744,000, a 5.9 per cent rise.
