DRUŠTVENE IN DRUGE SLOVENSKE VESTI

V današnji izdaji Nove Dobe so po številkah društva navedene imena članov Ameriške bratske zveze, ki služijo v vojni sili Zedinjenih držav. Število tam navedenih naših vojakov znaša 426. Seznam pa je že par tednov več, če računamo čas, ki je pretekel od pošiljatve tozadnevnih društvenih poročil na glavni urad in tam uredništvu. V tem času so bili vpoklicani k vojnikom nadaljnji naši člani. Po imenu glavnega tajnika znaša število članov Ameriške bratske zveze, ki so točasno v vojni sili Zedinjenih držav, 700 ali več.

Društvo Ameriške bratske zveze so glasom izkaza, ki je pridobiven na drugem mestu da-najše izdaje Nove Dobe, doseglo investirala nad enajst tisoč dolarjev v obrambne ali vojne fondove Zedinjenih držav.

V Lorainu, Ohio, se bo v nedeljo 22. marca zvečer vršila prizabna predelitev podružnice Jugoslovenskega pomožnega odbora, slovenska sekcijska, katera čisti dobitek je name-njen fondu omenjene pomožne organizacije. Prostor prededitve Slovenski narodni dom.

V bolnišnici v Windberu, Pa., bo operiran za vnetje slepiča Anthony F. Tauzey, član društva 136 ABZ v Kraynu, Pa., bivši delegat omenjenega na 16. redni konvenciji Ameriške bratske zveze. Omedeno društvo tudi poroča, da kupilo vojni bond Zedinjenih držav za sto dolarjev.

Dramsko društvo "Ivan Can-can" v Clevelandu, Ohio, vprizeno nedeljo 22. marca "Bachelor Buddies," veseloigrivo v treh dejanjih, v avditoriju S. N. Doma na St. Clair Ave. Pričetek ob popoldne.

Iz bolnišnice v Pittsburghu se vrnil na svoj dom v Homer Way, Pa., Joseph Kerin, član društva št. 122 ABZ.

Organizacija "American Friends of Yugoslavia" v New Yorku priredila na večer 26. marca velik banket v proslavo zgodovinskega jugoslovanskega leta, s katerim je Jugoslavija stopila v vrsto držav, ki se borijo proti osišču.

Zborovanje American Slavic Congressa, s sedežem v Pittsburghu, Pa., se bo v dneh 25. in 26. aprila vršilo v Detroitu, Mich.

George Oswerk iz Walsenburga, Colo., ki je prve dni januarja prostovoljno odšel k vojaki, je bil kot mehanik pridezen posadki bombnikov. Pri valjanju 5. marca pa je letalo, v katerem je bil Oswerk z dvema tovarišema, treščilo v morje nekaj milij od newjerseyske obale. SPLOŠNI TEDENSKI PREGLED

VOJNA NA PACIFIKU

Australski in ameriški bombarški so pretekli teden besno napadali japonska zbiranja pri New Guineji, velikem otoku severno od Avstralije, in so potopili več kot en ducat sovražnih transportnih ladij. Blizu japonske obale je neka ameriška podmornica potopila štiri japonske trgovske parnike. Pričakuje se, da bodo Japonci v kratkem napadli Avstralijo samo, ki se hiti pripravljati na primeren spremem sovražnika. Poroča se, da so tja že despolna močna ameriška ojačanja.

Britiske in kitajske čete se utrjujejo v gornjem delu Burme, kjer se vsak čas pričakuje japonske ofenzive.

Na filipinskem polotoku Bataanu, katerega še vedno trdno drži general MacArthur s svojo ameriško in filipinsko posadko, zadnje dni ni bilo večjih aktivnosti.

POMORSKA BITKA

Mornariški department je preteklo soboto izdal poročilo, da so zavezniki v trdnevi pomorski bitki z Japonci konci februarja izgubili 13 vojnih ladij na različnih tipov. Japonska mornarica, ki je bila močnejša, jih je baje izgubila osem. Od potopljenih zaveznih ladij sta bili dve ameriški, namreč križarka Houston in rušilka Pope, ostale pa so bile angleške, hollandske in avstralske.

VOJNA V EVROPI

Z ruske fronte se poroča, da so Rusi razvili novo veliko ofenzivo s poldrugim milijonom svežih čet. Cilj te ofenzive je iztrgati Nemcem nekatera močno utrjena mesta in s tem preprečiti ali oslabiti nameravano nemško pomladno ofenzivo. Lokalne uspehe beležijo Rusi na mnogih točkah dolge fronte. Poročajo tudi, da so v enem mesecu samo na centralni fronti pobili skoraj 50,000 Nemcev.

Od norveške obale se poroča o večjih aktivnostih med nemškimi in angleškimi pomorskim in letalskimi silami. Angleški bombniki tudi noč za nočjo napadajo nemške industrijske kraje. UTRDBA CORREGIDOR

Filipinska utrdba Corregidor, ob ustju manilskega zaliva, še vedno odbija japonske napade. Površina te utrjene ameriško-filipinske postojanke znaša kmaj 15 kvadratnih milij, pa je tako dobro opremljena in pravljena, da ji Japonci z vso svojo veliko premočjo dosedajo niso mogli do živega. Japonski letalci so zmetali na ta skalnatih košček sveta nad 1,500 bomb, pa brez posebnega uspeha. Branilci so zbrili na tla 120 japonskih letal. Japonci imajo Manilo, toda manilskega pristana ne morejo rabiti, ker je pod ognjem topov s Corregidorja.

BRAZILIA JEZNA

Največja južnoameriška republika Brazilija je sicer že pred tedni pretrgala diplomatske stike z državami osišča, toda ni nobeni napovedala vojne. Kljub temu nemške podmornice potapljalce brazilske parnike na Atlantiku. To je pretekli teden dalo povod za velike demonstracije v glavnem mestu Rio de Janeiro, kjer so izgradniki napadli in razbili več nemških, italijanskih in japonskih trgovin in drugih podjetij. CENZURA IN KONTROLA

Vojne razmere nam bodo prisile marsikaj, na kar v tej deli nismo navajeni. Med te novosti spada cenzura poročil ali vesti, ki bi mogle koristiti sovražniku, in kontrola cen raznih potrebščin. Tako, na primer bodo cenzurirana pisma ameriškim vojakom na severnem Irskem in v drugih bazah, kjerkoli se nahajajo ameriški vojaki izven kontinentalnih Zedinjenih držav. Cenzurirana bodo od ameriških častnikov, kakor naznanja vojni department.

Cenzura se bo opravljala v bazi, kjer se nahajajo vojaki, in bo veljala tako za prihajajoča, kot za odhajajoča pisma.

Vojni department je tudi razložil, kako treba nasloviti pisma na vojake. Adresa naj vsebuje ime vojaka, njegovo šaržo in vojaško organizacijo, kakor tudi številko pravilnega vojaškega poštnega urada in pisma je treba pošiljati poštarju v New Yorku ali San Franciscu, kakor je pač dopisujeti vojak v svojem pismu naznanil. Poštar bo nadalje poslal pismo omenjemu vojaškemu poštnemu uradu, kjerkoli se nahaja.

Kot navodilo, kako naj se napisati pismo za vojaka, nahajajočega se izven Zdinjenih držav, poštni department daje sledenji primer: "Private. John Doe, Company C, 199th Infantry, 27th Division, Army Post Office 801, care of Postmaster, New York City."

Tudi ime in naslov pošiljatelja naj se napiše na zgornjem levem kotu koverte.

Vojaki v enotah, ki bodo kmalu zapustile domačo bazo, bodo dobili navodila, kdaj naj pišejo svojim dopisovalcem, da rabijo številko vojaškega poštnega urada.

Raba številke vojaškega poštnega urada je, kakor vojni department poudarja, velike važnosti. Dočim se mnogo ne ugovarja proti rabi naslova vojaške enote, dokler je ta doma, postane ta naslov vojaška tajnost, čim se enota preseli drugam. Na takrat je ne sme rabiti naslov vojaške enote, čim se ista nahaja izven Zdinjenih držav.

Vojni department prosi za sodelovanje civilnega prebivalstva v pravilnem adresiranju pisem na vojake in pri tem opozarja na velikansko delo dostavljanja vojaške pošte. Tekom leta 1941 je bilo odpremljenih 45,968,185 komadov vojaške pošte, kar je toliko kot vsa pošta, odpremljena na leto bodisi v Grand Rapidsu, Michigan, San Antonio, Texas, ali Akronu, Ohio.

Po izbruhi vojne se je kolici na vojaške pošte podvojila, tekomo decembra, od tega meseca naprej pa hitro narašča.

Urad upravljanja cen (Office of Price Administration), po svojih začetnih črkah nazvan OPA, je odredil najvišje cene, po katerih se sme prodajati.

Britiški vojaški eksperti so izbrali deset generalov, ki so se izkazali za najboljše v sedanji vojni. Od Američanov je dobil točno general Douglas MacArthur, ki tako uspešno branil Bataan na Filipinih. Dalje sta v tej desetorici ruski maršal Semjon Timošenko in general Gregorij Žukov, ki sta se sijajno izkazala na ruski fronti. Nemška odličnjaka sta maršal Erwin Rommel, poveljnik afriškega kora, in maršal Karl von Rundstedt, ki poveljuje nemškim četam na južni ruski fronti. Dalje so med odličnjaki britiški general Archibald Wavell, ki je zdaj v Indiji; vrhovni poveljnik kitajskih armad general Čiang Kai-shek; japonski general (Dalje na 4. strani)

TROPSKE BOLEZNI

Sedanja svetovna vojna, ki je siloma potegnila tudi Ameriko v svoj vrtinec, se vrši na mnogoštevih frontah, in Amerika, katera namen je držati vojno proč od ameriškega kontinenta, mora pač pošiljati svoje vojsko v razne oddaljene kraje, da se tam ustavi in pobije sovražnika. Na tak način bo morda mogoče, da civilno prebivalstvo Zedinjenih držav ne bo direktno prijedalo po vojnih grozotah.

Kam vse so to svrhu bile že poslane ameriške ekspedicije, v tem, kjer se nahajajo vojaki, in bo veljala tako za prihajajoča, kot za odhajajoča pisma.

Vojni department je tudi razložil, kako treba nasloviti pisma na vojake. Adresa naj vsebuje ime vojaka, njegovo šaržo in vojaško organizacijo, kakor tudi številko pravilnega vojaškega poštnega urada.

Najnevarnejše tropске bolezni so malarija, griža in rumenska mrzlica. Najbolj razširjena in uničujoča je malarija, ki jo širi neke vrste komarji. Oseba, ki je bila enkrat okužena z malarijo, se je težko popolnoma iznebi, kajti bolezen se rada povrča v določenih predložkih. Malarijo se zdravi s kininom in z nekim novovrstnim zdravilom, ki se imenuje statine. Zaščitnega serum proti malariji dosedaj še niso iznale.

Druga nevarna tropска bolezen je griža (dysentery). Griža je dveh vrst. Prvo vrsto povzročajo bacili in je nekoč med torstnimi bolniki zahtevala do 40 odstotkov smrtnih žrtev. Danes se uspešno zdravi z zdravilom sulfaguanidina. Drugo povzročajo enocelični zajedavci in jih dostikat sledijo dolgoletne bolezni prebavili. Tukom ameriške civilne vojne je bilo zaradi griže začasno onesposobljeno več pomorskih in letalskih sil. Angleški vojaki, posebno tisti, ki so namenjeni v trdnevi, dobijo inžekcije ali vbrizganja tega zaščitnega zdravila.

Rumenska mrzlica je bila zadnja leta skoraj popolnoma iztrebljena, iz obližnjih krajev ameriškega kontinenta, vendar je vse skupaj. Dejstvo je, da so Indijci zahtevali več samostojnosti in samovladje že pred desetletji, toda brez uspeha. INDIJA HOČE SVOBODO

Indija zavzema ogromen kos južne Azije, ki moli deloma v Indijski ocean. Prebivalstvo Indije se senci na 352 milijonov, ki govori 222 različnih jezikov. Prebivalstvo Indije je torej jezikovno še bolj mešano kot je prebivalstvo Evrope. Vsekakor se računa, da 97 odstotkov teh jezikov izhaja iz treh glavnih debel: arijsko-indijskega, dravidijskega in tibetoburmanskega. Prebivalstvo pripada po večini večini belemu ali arijskemu plemenu, kolikor ni pomešano z Mongoli, Crnci, Malajci in drugimi.

Patriotism—loyal, strong, and true—to our United States and for everything it stands, is impressively represented by every single member of our American Fraternal Union. This was indicated in an official report released by our supreme secretary, Bro. Anton Zbasnik, who conducted a poll of every lodge in our society covering the number of our young members who are serving in the armed forces of the United States, and also the amounts invested by our individual lodges in United States Defense bonds.

The complete report is printed in this issue of Nova Doba and when you have finished reading it you will realize the immense patriotic quality of everything represented in our society. You will know that "we are doing our share, and if need be, will do more than our share to assure victory for us and defeat of our enemies!" It would be well to keep in mind also that since this report was compiled additional men have been inducted into our armed forces to bring the total from what is 426 in our report, to over 700, and that bonds are still being purchased individually by our lodges and its members.

In a rough resume the report showed that 108 lodges have contributed 426 men to the Armed forces of our country. Lodge No. 2, of Ely, Minnesota has the most men—19 in all—from any one lodge in the army. And more are leaving daily.

To date, our individual lodges have invested \$11,625 in United States Defense Bonds. Lodge No. 200 of Ely, Minn., heads the list of largest individual Defense Bond purchasers with their investment of \$3,900. Lodge No. 1 second with \$1,300 invested. Since the report, more bonds have been purchased. More will be purchased!

Our Supreme Board has already invested \$75,000 in United States Bonds, and has authorized numerous contributions to Red Cross and other war organizations which will contribute to aid our men in the service.

The excellent demonstration of our society in exerting every effort to help our country win the war shows that proves that the changing of our name to American Fraternal Union was more than justified! Our members are not only contributing manpower and investing in government bonds because they are patriotic; but, they are showing that what is in their hearts is the spirit of America itself—to cherish and love it—to protect it from enemies!

Every effort made; every sacrifice that must yet be made by them will be a part of their inner voice which goes out to the Nation's enemies in a challenge that is mighty in scope—a challenge that rings defeat for those who dare to threaten our America.

Illinois Fraternal Congress Meeting

The Annual Meeting of the Illinois Fraternal Congress was held at the Morrison Hotel in Chicago on Saturday, February 21st. The meeting opened shortly after 10 o'clock with the singing of "America" and the Pledge of Allegiance to Our Flag.

After the appointment of committees, roll call of officers, report of the Credential committee and reading of the minutes of the previous annual meeting and meetings of the Board of Directors, greetings to those present were extended by Norton J. Williams, Vice-President of the National Fraternal Congress. He pointed to the many responsibilities which face fraternal societies during the present critical period in America. We all have a very definite part to play in the great battle for freedom and must assume that part willingly, with hope and confidence that despite temporary reverses, ultimate victory will be won.

The Supervisor of the Fraternal Division of the Illinois Insurance Department, E. F. Barnes, addressed the meeting and urged a continuation of the good work and purpose for which fraternal societies were organized—to serve, not profit.

The Secretary reported that 30 Societies had representatives at this meeting, and the Treasurer's report disclosed that the income during the year slightly exceeded the expenditures, leaving a balance on hand of \$2644.84. It was decided to invest the sum of \$1000.00 in U. S. Defense Bonds.

The Nominating Committee recommended the re-election of practically all the present officers and directors, and this report was adopted.

As the next meeting of the National Fraternal Congress is to be held in Chicago during the month of September, the President of the Illinois Congress was instructed to appoint a Reception Committee which also will arrange for entertainment for the delegates who will attend.

It was decided that if another meeting of the Illinois Congress is held in the Fall, it should be held in Springfield, Ill. Also that during the observation of National Fraternal Week regional meetings be held in many cities in order to arouse greater interest and give favorable publicity to the fraternal insurance cause. Three meetings are planned for different districts in Chicago with outstanding programs.

Dr. Preston Bradley spoke at the luncheon on the life, character and virtues of George Washington and the American struggle for freedom.

The afternoon was devoted to the subject of the Fraternal Youth Program. A number of very interesting reports of youth activities among various societies were given. It was noteworthy that out of the six speakers, four were from Slav organizations, and the discussions which followed indicated that actually we were ahead of others in promoting interest among our younger members.

Red Cross Votes to Hold Combined Appeal Yearly

To relieve the increasing burden on men and women in all communities who are asked to contribute to fund raising efforts during war-time, the American Red Cross has decided to postpone its 1942 fall membership Roll Call. Instead the campaign will be held simultaneously with the next war fund appeal early in 1943, Chairman Norman H. Davis has announced.

The Red Cross has been greatly influenced in reaching this decision by the fact that the majority of the highly important Community Chest Campaigns are held in the early fall, Mr. Davis asserted. With Red Cross Roll Calls moved into the late winter or early spring it will ease the problem of the Community Chests.

"In combining our efforts into one appeal a year we shall still emphasize the membership principle of the Red Cross which is so deeply rooted in the voluntary character of the organization," Mr. Davis said. "In view of this decision the Red Cross feels that it is justified in holding, independent of any other fun raising efforts, one campaign a year which includes its Roll Call membership appeal."

Chairman Davis said the current War Fund Campaign was nearing successful conclusion. As of March 7, he revealed 2,547 chapters had reported \$61,172,000. It is expected the \$65,000 objective will be reached during March.



V mesecu "The American Mercury" je S. L. Solon priobčil o jugoslovenskih četnikih sledenči zanimivi članek:

Ko so glavne sile jugoslovenske vojske nehale boriti, so se oddelki, ki so sklenili nadleževi vojno, umaknili v planine. Posrečilo se jim je odpeljati s seboj del svojega lahkega topništva in precejšnje del motornih vozil — motorna kolesa, oklopne avtomobile in celo lahke tanke. Oddelki so se pritajili in uredili svoja poveljstva in preskrbo z živilimi. Del hrane jim je dajalo naklonjeno prebivalstvo, vendar jim je bilo jasno, da bodo večino potrebsčin za bodočo borbo, benzinc, orožje, strelivo in dele za motorna vozila moral s silo ugrabiti nemški vojski. Iz teh majhnih začetkov se je jugoslovenska četniška vojska razvila v najmočnejše uporniško gibanje, ki je kdaj grozilo sovražniku. Beseda četnik prihaja od "četa," imena, ki so ga nadeli majhnim oboroženim oddelkom, ki so v časih turškega gospodstva strašili po planinah. V dotednih s tem jeguljastim in nevarnim sovražnikom se Hitlerju ponuja priložnost pokusiti, kaj ga v bodoče čaka v zasedeni Evropi.

Delovanje četnikov je postajalo bolj in bolj občutno. V prvih mesecih, odkar so se umaknili v gore, so dobili ukaz, naj ne začenjajo borbe s sovražnikom. Odvrniti je bilo treba pazljivost vojske, pustiti jo, da skrči število svojih vojakov po vojašnicah in popusti s previndostjo. V glavnih črtah se je ta načrt posrečil. Nemci so sporili, da je odpor strit. Bilo pa je nekoliko nemških četnikov, ki so se spraševali, kaj se je zgodilo s 150,000 jugoslovenskih vojakov, ki jih niso našli ne med mrtvimi, ne med ranjenimi in ujetimi. Kmalu pa se jim je začelo v glavnih svitati. Majhni četniški oddelki so začeli napadati nemške prevoze in se zalažati z orožjem in potrebščinami. Dolge vrste nemških tovornih avtomobilov so pri svojih potovanjih po zasedenih pokrajinah zadevale na ovire sredstva in prihajale v topniški ogenj jugoslovenske vojske. Naučili so se, kako z ležeznimi drogi in vzdovi ustaviti za več uželezniški promet; potem so večkrat zaporedno razdelili železniško progo med Beogradom in Nišem. Nemško potovanje je z obupom ugotavljalo, da se škoda, čim pomnoži straža, ponavljajo drugod. Jugoslovenski ogleduh, ki jih je mnogo tisoč tudi med prebivalstvom samim, so vedno nahajali v nacističnih stražarskih mrežah najslabše mesto in tja so potem
