VSE KAŽE, DA BOMO V AMERIKI ŠE ZIBALI

Washington. — Teta štoklja je v Ameriki vedno bolj pridina. Otroški oddelek delavskega departmanta namreč javlja, da se je število rojstev v 10 letih, to je od 1933 do 1943 pomnožilo za 30 odstotkov.

V istem času se je zmanjšalo število smrti med otroci skoraj za eno tretjino in število smrti porodnic se je skrčilo skoraj za polovico.

Mussolini je imel v načrtu poraziti Roosevelta

Nuernberg. — Pri obravnavi proti nacijskim zločincem so bili predčitani stenografski zapisi razgovorov med Hitlerjem in grofom Cianom, leta 1939, ki je bil italijanski zunanji minister. Ciano je predložil Hitlerju Mussoliniju načrt, naj se ne začne vojne pred letom 1940, ko je tajništvo SNPJ. Stara je bila predsednik Roosevelt kandidiral za 3. termin. Mussolini je rekel, da Roosevelt ne bo izvoljen, če ne bo vojne. Mussolini je tudi trdil, da se bodo demokracije bori, če bodo postisnjene v kot.

Zapiski pa kažejo, da je Hitler vse to zavrgel, češ, da se bo do zapadne demokracije bale iti v splošno vojno. Hitler je povedal Cianu v obraz, da bo Nemčija napadla Poljsko v jeseni 1939.

Hiter je imel v načrtu napasti Poljsko že 25. avgusta 1939. Toda je napad odložil za en teden ter dal svojim diplomatom čas, da podkujojo ali drugače pregorovijo Anglijo, da ne bo šla Poljakom na pomoč. Ko ni imel uspeha, je udaril na Poljsko 1. septembra. Na 3. septembru pa Anglia in Francija izjavili dati vso podporo Poljski.

Pomanjkanje stanovanj bo še bolj občutno

Washington. — Če pravimo že danes, da je največje pomanjkanje stanovanj v zgodovini Amerike, ni to še nič v primeru, kar bo prihodnje leto. Vrnilo se bo domov milijone vojakov, 1,500,000 porok pričakujejo in najmanj 2,750,000 rojstev drugo leto. Stavbeniki pa pravijo, da se ne bo moglo zgraditi več kot kakih 475,000 stanovanjskih hiš.

Iz listin je tudi razvidno, da je vpad nemške vojne sile v Jugoslavijo in Grčijo 6. aprila 1941 zadržal invazijo v Rusijo za polne 4 tedne. Vojaki strokovnjaki misijo, da so bili ti širje tedni odločilni za končno rusko zmago.

Glavnem namen tega zvišanja je, ker časopisnega papirja pričinjuje, kar se bo čutilo še nekaj let in višja cena bo preprečila nepotrebno rabo istega.

Bivši komunistični agent vlada Jugoslavijo

(Konec)

Mihajlovič in Tito sta si bila kmalu v laseh. Tito je obdolžil Mihajloviča kolaboracije z nacija; o tem nisem pa nikoli dobil kakega dokaza.

Z agresivno podporo od Sovjetske Rusije je Tito uspeval. Njegovi sopotniki so razstavljali vsa sovjetska znamenja. Njegovi vojaki so pozdravljali s stisnjeno pestjo (to je bilo odpravljeno v decembri 1943, ko je dospela angleška misija); povsod so bili komisarji za "politično vzgojo"; zastava je bila rdeča zvezda; naslov je med seboj "drug"; povsod so se pojavili letaki s sliko Tita in Stalina. Kot iz tal je zrasla strahovita OZNA, tajna policijska organizacija, po vzorcu ruske NKVD in OGPU.

Angleži so videli pisavo na steni z obleščenimi rdečimi črkami. Vedeli pa so, da se morajo izogniti vsakemu sporu z zaveznico Rusijo. V septembru 1943 so premestili svojo podporo od Mihajloviča na Tita. Amerika se je nagnila k partizanom devet mesecev pozneje. Kmalu ni bilo več zaščitnih uniform, partizani so dobili lepo bojno opravo, ki je nosila znatnejši našiv "Philadelphia, Pa." Prišla je dobra hrana, angleško in ameriško orožje z municijo je dospelo na fronto. Partizani so zadeli terno!

Predudarni Jugoslovani starejše generacije so opazovali Tita z vso previdnostjo. Toda mladina je hitela pod njegovo zastavo in tudi ženstvo. Okroglo 25% njegove armade je bilo žensk. Krepka kmetska dekleta so se borila, jedla in spala z moškimi po gozdovih.

Okruglo tri četrtine Titovih pristašev je pod 25 leti starosti. Nek poveljnik brigade, ki sem ga srečal, je bil star 19 let. Večina generalov je bila pod 30 leti. Za prav mlade je pa Tito ustvaril organizacijo po vzorcu sovjetskih mladinskih skupin ali po vzorcu nemških Hitlerjugend; kakor hitro postanejo mladenci, so zreli za redno vojsko. Ta mladina je, ki napravlja vso stvar kričeče histerično. Dan za dnem se jih pita z junaškimi frazami, kot: "Svoboda!" in "Svoboda izpod fašističnega jarma!" Mladina se odzivlja s klici: "Ti-to-Ti-to-Ti-to!" Mladina ne misli zase, ampak slepo verjame, da se bori za "demokracijo," ker ji maršal tako zapoveduje.

Titova Narodna osvobodilna fronta se je zavezala, da bo postavila platformo siedečih glavnih štirih točk, katerih vsako posebej hočemo obdelati:

1. Ustvaritev narodne enakopravne federativne Jugoslavije, v kateri bodo imele vse narodnosti svoje narodne pravice.

V Jugoslovanski vladi je Tito ministrski predsednik, vojni minister in vrhovni poveljnik vojske. 21 njegovih ministrov je Titovih pristašev; štirje so pa molčavi nasprotvnik.

Jugoslavija je bila razdeljena v šest avtonomnih držav, ki so podložne njegovi vladji. V petih so glavni ministri mladi komunisti; v šesti, Srbiji, je pa Titova najtrdrovratnejša opozicija. Srbi, ki tvorijo 51 odstotkov vse Jugoslavije, trdijo, da se ni niti eden njih predvojnih voditeljev pridružil Narodni osvobodilni fronti. Dolže Tita, da jih je dal pomoriti na tisoče, zapreti pa na deset tisoč. Povedo tudi njih imena. Tožijo, da so poteptane njih ustavne pravice. Srbi so Titov najbolj resen problem.

Tito ima eno tretjino Jugoslavije solidno za seboj. Toda to je dinamična, oborožena manjšina, ki ima v rokah moč in ki se lahko drži naprej.

2. Prave demokratične pravice in svoboda.

Komisarji in tajna policija je povsod. Ljudje, ki jih vidijo v nezaželeni družbi, so takoj aretirani. Kritika Tita ali Sovjetske Rusije se kaznuje s smrtno. Sodišča so bila organizirana po sovjetskem vzorcu. Samo v Belgradu so privlekli pred sodišče nad 5,000 oseb.

Samo "politično simpatično" ameriško vojaško osobje je dobilo dovoljenje stopiti v Jugoslavijo. Preiskava glede tega je včasih trajala en mesec. Enkrat v Jugoslaviji je bilo Amerikancem prepovedano pod kaznijo takojšnjega izbacovanja občevati s civilisti. Prepovedano jim je bilo iti tri milije od svojih baz brez posebnega dovoljenja ali partizanskega vodje "za varstvo." Amerikancem ni dovoljeno videti dosti partizanske demokracije.

Od začetka do konca je Osvobodilna fronta prav tako "demokratična," kot je Sovjetska Rusija.

3. Nedotakljivost zasebne lastnine.

Titovci so se bahali, da se ne polaste ničesar na dejeli. Poudarjajo, da jim je dana vsaka stvar "prostovoljno." Za partizanske sopotnike je to pravilno. Za druge (dve tretjini prebivalstva) pa ni. Videl sem, kako so se polastili domov, tovaren, trgovin in osebne lastnine. Kdor ni z Osvobodilno fronto, mu ne ostane ničesar.

Na isti način se razdeljuje živež. Ako si partizan je; ako nisi, umiraš od glada. Ko sem bil jaz tam, so jugoslovanski civilisti cepali po cestah od glada, toda Tito ni puštil ameriških ladij z relifom, ki so bile vsidrane v Italijini in na katerih je živež gnil. On je zahteval popolno kontrolo rezdelitve potrebščin, kar mu je bilo takrat odrečeno.

4. Nobene revolucionarne, ekonomiske ali socialne spremembe.

V novembra 1944 sem bil priča v Dubrovniku prvi

"svobodnih" volitev v Jugoslaviji. Obdržavane so bile v gledišču, napolnjenem z volivci. Toda vse prisotne so partizani poprej sami odbrali; pri vratih je pa stala straža, ki ni pustila notri nobenega nepovabljenega. Volitve so se vršile z dvigom rok. Tajna policija je vse opazovala s praktičnimi očmi; vsi Titovi pristaši so bili izvoljeni soglasno, to se razume.

To je "svoboda" z revolucionarnimi spremembami.

Ekonomika in socialna zgradba se stopnjena sovjetizira. Na direkten Titov poziv se glorija Sovjetske Rusije tlači v ljudi zjutraj, opoldne in zvečer. Vse, kar je rusko, je najboljše. Z lastnimi očmi sem slišal komisarja, ki je zbral skupino beguncov ob dalmatinskom obrežju, jim pokazal 300 ameriških B-17 v zraku ter z ponosom izjavil: "To so ruski!"

Jugoslavija bo morda gnezdo za bodočo vojno ali mir. Proti zapadu leži dolgo obrežje s pristanišči, ki so dovolj velika za svetovno mornarico; proti vzhodu pa leži Sovjetska Rusija, obdana od suhe zemlje. Na sredi sedi Tito — bivši komunistični agent. . .

Beseda od svojcev iz domovine

Dobro poznani Steve F. Pirnat, ki vodi svojo trgovino in urad na 7403 St. Clair Ave., je pred kratkim prejel pismo iz Ljubljane, katerega piše njegova sestra Marjeta Pirnat, za njegovo ženo Frančiško Pirnat, iz Velikih Poljan pri Ribnici, ter mu poroča, koliko so trpeli v zadnji vojni, pomankanja in lakote, ter posebno žalostno novočico, da so mu italijanski sadisti ustrelili dva starejša sina in tretjega mlajšega pa odpreli v internacijski.

V letu 1942, ko so pohlepni po tuji zemlji, italijanske horde okupirale del Jugoslavije, so dali dnevni ukaz, da se mora ves okupiran narod osebno zglašati v Ribnici za krušne kartete (Ration Book).

Ubogo ljudstvo se je ukazu v splošnem odzvalo, iz razloga ker brez krušnih kart, ni mogel nikdo nič kupiti za svoj revni živiljenki obstanek, pri Cerkvi pa jih je italijanski oholi okupator obkolil in vse može in mlađeniče pobral ter odgnal v Kočevje, tam pa nekaj mož in mlađeničev izbral in v vasi Velike Poljane štiri, dva moja sinova in dva soseda, ter jih tam množenstvo brez zaslisanja ustrelili. Moja sinova Štefan in Matija Pirnat, (priči oženjen in zapušča dva neprekobljeni otroki — šest in štiri leta) vse druge može in mlađeniče pa odgnali v italijansko ujetništvo, med katerimi je bil moj mlajši sin France, in bil tam v ujetništvu do razsula italijanske pohlepnosti, po razsulu pa je bil poročilo pisano, se za mladega Cirila nič ne ve, je živ ali mrtev in mogoče, da je izginil v nemških krematorijih.

Ker bo gotovo zanimalo naše rojake iz okolice Videm-Krško, na Dolenjskem, pri meji Štajerske in moli dve sestri imata svoje može iz tamožnje okolice, prva iz vasi Straža pri Kršku, druga pa iz vasi Libelj pri Leskovcu, se glasi poročilo, da v Ljubljani dva meseca, na 14. nov. 1944, so ga pa nemčurji z drugimi ujetniki vred odgnali neznano kam, in do casa, ko je bilo to poročilo pisano, se za mladega Cirila nič ne ve, je živ ali mrtev in mogoče, da je izginil v nemških krematorijih.

Prizadeti smo pri tem pa tudi drugi, ker smo imeli v Mikličevi kleti spravljeno oblike. Mislimi smo, da bo varno, ker je klet obokana (velbana), pa ravno na to hišo je padla bomba in v eni minutu je bilo vse v plamenih. Prav nič ni bilo mogoče rešiti. Dve kravi smo imeli privezani na vrtu in sta bili tudi ubiti od bombe. Cleveland, Ohio

Saturday, December 8, 1945

The Rodger Construction Co., which is building six houses on E. 61 St., needs more bricklayers as well as ordinary laborers to speed up the job.

John Modic has taken over Mountain Inn at 4228 St. Clair Ave. He used to operate a cafe at 4034 E. 123 St.

The Ford Motor Co., proposed to CIO auto workers that in their new contract, a clause should provide a payment of \$5 from the CIO Union for every worker who goes out on an unauthorized strike. The union has not given an answer.

An interesting collection at the University in Austin, Texas, gathered by Leigh Hunt in the 19th century, is the hair of the most famous men, such as Napoleon, Geo. Washington and others.

Approximately 650,000 CIO steelworkers took a strike vote throughout U.S. last week, with 82 per cent in favor of a strike. In Cleveland, 12,184 cast their vote for the strike, against 2,737. In Ohio, the vote was 61,787 for, and 12,983 against.

The OPA in Washington announces that the price of vinegar will increase from 4 to 20 cents a gallon, beginning Dec. 4. (Well, then we won't drink it!)

Up to Nov. 6, the losses in the Army and Navy amounted to 1,068,415 men, — of these, 27,524 were killed, 651,737 wounded, 26,744 missing and 115,410 captured.

Jack and Heintz, Inc., will pay \$3,500,000 in Christmas bonuses to all workers on the company payroll June 1, 1945, at which time there were 8,000 workers, while today there are 1,400 left.

Dave Reed flew down with his damaged bomber near Coos Bay, Ore. The plane was caught in a tree, 150 feet high. He was imprisoned up there 36 hours before found by woodsmen. Except that he was cold, the pilot felt no ill consequences.

When England could not get rid of rats in Hong Kong, in spite of all its efforts, she offered a reward for each rat killed. But this was soon discontinued, when the Chinese, seeing a good income, began to raise them instead.

A storm, which on Friday of last week, hit northeastern states with rain, sleet and snow, caused the death of 32 persons. The storm extended as far west as Buffalo, N.Y., with 8 inches of snow. Winds reached 70 miles an hour in Boston and western New York had 28 inches of snow.

About 1,500,000 more tons of sugar are expected for next year according to an investigation of the food situation made by the Congressional Committee.

Undisputed champions of the west, with nine victories in 10 starts and a perfect record in their own section, Cleveland's Rams are ready for whatever the East may have to offer.

Taking command half a dozen minutes after the opening kick-off, the Rams bounced the Boston Yanks, 20 to 7, in the last game of the regular National League schedule before 18,470 fans Sunday at League Park.

Philadelphia, Dec. 1.—Army's star-spangled array struck swiftly for three touchdowns in the opening period and defeated Navy, 32 to 13, as scheduled today, but not without being given a genuine dog-fight by the

Middies in the final grueling 45 minutes of their annual football struggle.

A crowd of 102,000 in Municipal Stadium, including President Truman, saw the Tars recover from the opening shocks of the Cadets' offensive, and not only avert what had threatened to become a shambles, but play the vaunted West Pointers on virtually even terms for the greater part of the contest.

HOCKEY

Spectacular goal tending by John Kiszkran, 21-year-old rookie net minder, subbing for injured Harvey Teno, brought the badly crippled Cleveland Barons to a 4-to-2 victory over Providence Reds before a roaring packed house of 11,302 fans Saturday night at the Arena.

In his sixth appearance for the Barons this season, Kiszkran knocked down 47 shots, 34 of them before he was scored on in the final period. It was his first victory in a Cleveland uniform.

Though the mangled Barons are

they have an undefeated streak of

seven straight at the Arena—five wins

and two ties—and have lost only once,

in their opener to Hershey on Oct. 16 on their home ice.
