Direktno iz Washingtona poročila STEPHEN M. YOUNG Congressman-at-Large of Ohio

Treba je razčistiti pojme. V kongresu imamo večkrat ostre debate. Takrat se "izkašljamo," pustimo vse ventile, razčistimo ozračje in končno dosežemo nek sporazum in soglasje. Mislim, da bodo Ujedinjeni Narodi tudi enkrat tako delali. Kar pustimo delegate, da se mučijo in trudijo, kričijo in zmerjajo kakor jim srce poželi. Vse to je potrebno na svetu, da se doseže mir, ki ga vsi ljudje žele. Treba je samo malo prakse, kako se pride do zlate srede in kako se doseže prava misel.

Elektrifikacija. Elektrizacija kmetijskih področij je pač velika stvar, ki jo je izvršila Rooseveltova administracija. Podozelsko prebivalstvo je srečno in zadovoljno, da se ta elektrifikacija sedaj nadaljuje. Dejansko ni nobena stvar tako zelo olajšala bremena kmetijskih ljudi in toliko pospešila sreče in blagostanja kmetov, njihovih žena in otrok kot elektrifikacija podozelskega in njena sedanja razširitev in okrepitev.

V prvih osmih mesecih leta 1948 je bilo zgrajenih 109 milj. novih linij in 368,000 novih družin je dobilo električno razsvetljavo in silo. To je kar veliko. Vendar je treba še mnogo storiti na tem področju. Če vedno imamo en milijon in osemsto-šestdeset farm brez elektrike. To pomeni, da še vedno ena tretjina naših farm nima elektrike.

Sedaj imamo še za 450 milijonov dolarjev prošnje za kredit za elektrifikacijo. Vse te prošnje je treba rešiti z največjo naglico. Sedanje pomanjkanje električne sile mora biti odstranjeno. Dosedanje ugodnosti morajo biti še izpopolnjene. Kmetstvo prebivalstvo, ki živi mnogokje zelo redko naseljeno, je upravičeno do cenene električne sile.

V zadnjem kongresu je bilo več nasprotnikov elektrifikacije podozelske. Nekateri teh nasprotnikov so se vrnili v parlament, mnogi so propadli. Novi kongres bo nedvomno podpiral ta veliki program.

Ohio Society of Washington. Ohio Society v Washingtonu je v rokah republikancev. Čeprav ima veliko sredstev, je bila to ena izmed državnih organizacij, če ne prav edina, ki ni nič storila za slovesnost ustoličenja predsednika. Podobna državna društva imajo staro navado, da počaste imenitne državne goste, ki pridejo k slovesnostim kakršna je ustoličenje. Namesto, da bi to društvo bilo priredilo sprejem gubernorju Lauschetu, je priredilo ples takoj po dnevu ustoličenja in je povabilo senatstvo Tafta kot govornika. Ohij-ski demokratični kongresman so se upirali, češ, da to pomeni nasprotovanje predsedniku Trumanu in gubernorju Lauschetu. Samo en demokratični kongresman se je plesa udeležil in še njega so predstavili šele prav na koncu vse slovesnosti. Njegove žene pa vodja večera sploh ni predstavil, dasi je predstavljala vse žene republikanskih senatorjev in kongresmanov. Pravijo, da skupina, ki vodi to društvo pod predsedstvom Paul L. Predsedniki pododbora za sprejemanje beguncev, za vzgojo in pouk, za časopisje in drugi so dali poročila o svojem delovanju. Odbor je organiziral posebne tečaje angleškega pouka za vse nove katoliške naseljence. Vsak, ki je zadnji čas prišel v Cleveland, se lahko poslužijo ugodnosti in dobi brezplačen pouk. Kasneje se bo pouk razširil tudi na druge panoge, ki so beguncem potrebne, da se bodo mogli uspešno uvrstiti v tukajšnje življenje. Poročila so pokazala, da Cleveland hoče vse storiti, da bodo novim naseljemcem olajšane začetne težave v novi domovini.

Protest USA, poslanske zbornice proti obsodbi kardinala

Washington. — Kongres USA je soglasno sprejel sklep, ki zahteva, da mora federalna vlada USA protestirati proti postopanju madžarskih oblasti s kardinalom Mindsenty. Protest naj se vloži ali potom Zveze Narodov ali pa po drugi primerni poti. Resolucija je tudi v senatu na odločitvi.

Komunisti propadli v C. I. O. v Clevelandu

V Cleveland Industrial Council so bili izvoljeni sami desničarski kandidati. Vsi kandidati komunistične in sopotniške leve so propadli. Za tajnika je bil izvoljen James C. Juinn. Dosedanji tajnik, ki je bil v tem uradu enajst let in ki so ga podpirale levičarske grupe je propadel, dasi je imel sicer zelo dobro reputacijo.

Canton je nova prestolnica Kitajske

Canton, Kitajska. — Predsednik vlade Sun Fo je proglasil Canton za začasno prestolnico Kitajske. Govoril je ob obletnici smrti svojega očeta, ustanovitelja moderne Kitajske Dr. Sun Yatsena. V tem govoru je poudaril pozival komuniste naj ne bodo nepopustljivi v svojih zahtevah za premirje. Napovedal je, da se bo državljanska vojna morala nadaljevati, če bodo komunisti vztrajali in zahtevali popolno in brezpogojno predajo.

Ohio, ki je bil na novo izvoljen, je šel raje na parado državnega društva za Oklahomo.

Za veterane. Sedaj razmotiramo zakon, ki bi dala veteranom izključno predkupno pravico do nakupa vseh dovršenih stanovanjskih hiš. Ta pravica bi trajala trideset dni po dovršitvi zgradbe. Senator Thomas, demokrat iz Utah pospešuje sprejem tega zakona.

Le zaupajmo. General Eisenhower je dejal: "Naša država je precej uspela, da je držala vse tajnosti, ki so bile bistvene za uspešno vodenje vojske, zase. Seveda se lahko jezimo in razburjamo radi delovanja špijonov, toda naša vlada dobro skrbi za vse te stvari in jaz ne verjamem, da smo v kak veliki nevarnosti."

Z NEKAJ PAZNJE SE LAHKO PREPREČI MNOGO NEZGOD

Clevelandski odbor za javno varnost apelira tako na pešce kot na voznike, naj bodo bolj previdni. V prvih 27 dneh letošnjega leta je bilo ubitih na clevelandskih cestah že 13 oseb. Ako bo šlo v tem razmerju naprej bo našlo smrt do konca leta na clevelandskih cestah 175 oseb. Od leta 1937 je to za mesto najslabši rekord. Takrat je bilo ubitih v prometnih nezgodah 247 oseb, dočim jih je bilo prošlo leto le 96.

Ta varnostni odbor je preštudiral vse slučaje nezgod in izjavlja, da bi se bila vsaka smrtna nesreča preprečila, ako bi bilo nekoliko več pazljivosti tako od strani pešcev kot od voznikov. Posebno premalo pazijo pri prehodu čez cesto starejši ljudje. Glavno pravilo za varnost na cestah bi moralo biti: stoj, pogledaj in poslušaj!

Komunistični vohuni pridejo pred vojno sodišče

Frankfurt, Nemčija. — USA komanda objavlja, da bo šest češkoslovaških špijonov prišlo pred vojno sodišče. Špijonirali so za češkoslovaško vlado v ameriški coni Avstrije in Nemčije.

Razne najnovejše svetovne vesti

WASHINGTON. — Predsednik Truman je zaprl vrata žaloge ameriških atomskih bomb in izjavil, da o tem sploh ne bo več govorili, kar je to državna tajna stvar Združenih Držav. Nikomur ne bo Amerika te tajne stvari odkrivala. Truman sam je za strogo čuvanje te tajne.

WASHINGTON. — Predsednik je označil sojenje kardinala Mindsenty v Budimpešti kot infamno. USA sedaj šključira pravni položaj in bo protestirala pri Zvezi Narodov, če se ugotovi, da je Madžarska kršila mirovno pogodbo. Ne bodo pa Združene države sedaj prekinjale diplomatskih odnosov z Madžarsko. Gotovo je le, da si je s tem sodnim postopanjem Madžarska za dolgo zaprla odhod in vstop v Zvezo Narodov. To sodno postopanje bo šlo v zgodovino kot črna pika na madžarski državi. Združene Države bodo že našle več načinov, da pokažejo svojo nevoljo proti madžarski vladi.

BUDIMPEŠTA. — Madžarska vlada je objavila, da je izgnala dva uradnika poslanstva USA v Budimpešti, ker sta pomagala ljudem, da so bežali iz Madžarske in ker sta vohunila za USA. Objava trdi, da sta ta dva uradnika pomagala zbežati tudi voditelju krščanske ljudske stranke. To sta Stephen Andrew Koczak in Robin Sreussy. Oba sta odšla na Dunaj v Avstrijo.

NEW DELHI, INDIJA. — Morilec indijskega duhovnega in političnega voditelja v zadnjih desetletjih Mahatma Ghandija in eden njegovih pomočnikov sta bila obsojena na smrt na vešalih. Pet drugih obtožencev je dobilo dosmrtno ječo dva pa sta bila oproščena.

WASHINGTON. — Glavni stan generala MacArthurja je izdal obširno studijo sovjetske vojnške mreže proti Japonci pred drugo svetovno vojno. Podatke je imel glavni štab japonske vojske, ki je mrežo odkril slučajno neposredno pred napadom na Pearl Harbor. Poročilo pravi, da je v zvezi s tem prišla na dan tudi sovjetska špijunska služba v Kitajski. — Špijonsko društvo je vodil nemški komunist Richard Sorge, ki se je delal za velikega nacističnega predstavljal kot nemški časnikar ter tako imel zveze z najvišjimi japonskimi vojaškimi in političnimi ljudmi. V poročilu se navajata tudi dva ameriška pisca kot člana te vojnške družbe. To sta Agnes Smedley, ki je napisala pet knjig in veliko število člankov in živi v New Yorku. Njo označuje poročilo kot vohunja, ki je imela veliko uspehov za sovjetsko stvar na Kitajskem v zadnjih 20 letih. Vsekako je Agnes Smedley takoj zanjikala, da bi se bila kdaj pečala za vohunstvom za katerokoli državo ali narod. Druga omenja poročilo Mr. Guenther Stein, ki je britanski časnikar, pa živi v New Yorku. Za njega pravi poročilo, da je vohunil za Rusijo na Japonskem. Tudi on je rekel, da je ta trditve smešna laž in nič drugega. Večina vohunov te družbe je bila že med vojno sojena in obsojena. O drugih pa trdi poročilo, da verjetno še delujejo uspešno za sovjetske gospodarje po raznih prestolnicah sveta. Smedley je vsekako priznala, da je oseba poznala voditelja te vojnške družbe Richarda Sorge in njegovega pomočnika Japonca Hozumi. Poročilo je objavljeno zato, da bi USA bila pozorna na delovanje takih ljudi, ki na zunaj izgledajo kot popolnoma neutralni in nepolitični, pa pod to masko delajo komunistično vohunsko službo. Tudi o ameriškem podkonzulu Tycho Lillienstromu pravi poročilo, da je imel v svoji hiši skrita dva vohuna te družbe, ki sta imela tam celo skrivno radijsko postajo. Ta podkonzul je bil v Harbinu na Kitajskem v letih 1922 do 1928 in je umrl v letu 1943.

Dva procesa, dva svetova

V Ameriki traja že nekaj mesecev sodni proces proti 12 tim komunistom, voditeljem komunističnega gibanja v naši deželi. Proti njim je zbranega ogromno obtožnega materiala, da so z nasilnimi sredstvi skušali izvršiti državni prevrat, revolucijo, da so med tem ko je bila Amerika v vojski z nacisti, širili propagando, da naj ameriški državljani ne poslušajo lastne vlade in oblasti ampak naj poslušajo navodila iz Moskve, da so torej rusili Ameriko na vse moč načine v najnevarnejšem času in silno težkih okoliščinah. O vseh obtožbah je notorno, da so vodilne osebnosti v gibanju, ki propagira nasilna sredstva za državni prevrat in revolucijo.

Na Madžarskem je bil proces proti kardinalu in šestim duhovnikom in laikom, ki so notorni pristaši katoliške vere, ki ukazuje in brani in zagovarja ljubezen med ljudmi, prepoveduje upor vsaki oblasti dokler le vlada po osnovnih pojmih pravičnosti, naravnega in pravnega reda, ljudje, ki niso imeli nikake vodilne vloge v kaki politični organizaciji, ki so bili anti-revolucionarji in so z mirnim in zakonitim sredstvi branili pravice svojih članov, vernikov in vseh državljanov, branili osnovne svoboščine, ki so pisane v sami sedanjosti komunistični ustavi, pa jih komunistična vlada ne respektira kadar ji tako kaže.

EVEN THOMAS EDISON MIGHT BE AMAZED BY OUR MODERN LIGHTING EQUIPMENT



This week is especially important to Cleveland as the world's center of lighting and lighting research.

For February 11 marks the 102nd anniversary of the birth of Thomas A. Edison, "Father of the Electrical Industry," at nearby Milan, Ohio.

Edison's greatest invention, the incandescent lamp, opened the way for the use of electricity in countless ways in home and industry.

Of the more than 1000 patents issued to Edison, 360 concerned electric lighting and power distribution.

But today there are more than 10,000 types of electric lamps, over 200 of them intended for home use. Some might have amazed even the "Electrical Wizard" himself.

In the picture above, Miss Virginia Kennedy holds a replica of Edison's first electric lamp (right). She also displays the latest 100-watt "inside-frosted" incandescent lamp. The latter produces, for the same amount of current, about 11 times as much light as did Edison's original lamp.

Other modern wonders in residential lighting, displayed on the table, are, left to right:

- 150-Watt Projector Spotlight, for backyard lighting and special indoor and outdoor decorative effects;
- "Three-lamp" Frosted Bulb, for floor lamps and large table lamps;
- Sunlamp, for sunning and health purposes in bedroom or bathroom;
- 12-inch Circine Fluorescent Lamp, for floor and table lamps, ceiling fixtures, and special decorative effects;
- Infrared Heat Lamp, for relieving muscular aches, for drying paint, odd pieces of laundry, etc.;
- Silver Bowl Lamp, for indirect light in ceiling fixtures;
- Reflector Spotlight.

The tube in the front is a germicidal lamp, for destroying airborne bacteria.

In the back is a 40-Watt, 4-Foot Fluorescent Lamp. This is now extensively in industry, and is popular in homes for valance lighting and other decorative effects, and for general lighting in kitchen and laundry.

NYC Lays Off 600 At Collinwood Yards

Six hundred roundhouse employees of the New York Central System were laid off at the Collinwood yards Thursday.

Another 160 workers got lay-off slips at the repair shop last Friday. They are among 3400 railroad maintenance workers in Ohio and New York who have been temporarily released.

Lack of revenue was cited for the cut-back. Freight traffic on the railroad is reported to be 30% below last year.

At the West Albany, N. Y. shops of New York Central 1400 were laid off last week 370 were released.

The East Buffalo (N. Y.) repair shops will close indefinitely. That will mean a lay-off of 768 additional employees including supervisory and clerical employees, an official of the railroad announced. Almost 100 were laid off there last week.

Buffalo Ben Files for Unemployment Compensation

COLUMBUS, Ohio, Feb. 4.—Buffalo Ben, who rode by the side of the immortal Buffalo Bill Cody and scouted for the U. S. Army in the 1870s, last week filed a claim for unemployment compensation at the age of 93 Ben—undoubtedly the oldest man ever to file a claim under the Ohio Law—has been spending the past several years as a circus performer.

Ben, who signs his name "Ben Buffalo," spends the circus "off season" in Iroquois, Illinois. He was legally eligible to file his claim under the Ohio Law because his most recent employer's main base of operations was in Ohio.

To Ben, "Custer's Last Stand" is something more than a term in a history book. He was scouting Indians in the vicinity when Custer was wiped out at the famed battle of the Little Big Horn. His circus publicity bills him as "the last of the old Indian scouts with Buffalo Bill in 1875."

In addition to his service against the Indians, Ben scouted for the British during the Boer War in South Africa, later accompanied the Tommies to India. He has also served in the Cuban Army and has toured Europe with Buffalo Bill's Wild West Show.

Born in southwestern Oregon, Ben early traveled to the Dakotas where he met Cody and "went into the Indian troubles." At 20, when most people are something less than energetic, Buffalo Ben is in no retiring mood. He fully expects to be working the entertainment circuit before the year is out.

Cleveland's Home and Flower Show

Wheelchair-prisoners have received but little attention up to now from the designers and builders of homes. These handicapped persons find extreme difficulty in moving about the house due to narrow doorways and stairs in the ordinary house.

The Greater Cleveland Home and Flower Show, in Cleveland Public Auditorium, March 5 through 12, is to introduce to the public for the first time a home designed for the convenience and comfort of the physically handicapped. This Paraplegic House, designed and constructed in the show by the Home Builders Association of Greater Cleveland, is as nearly automatic as possible.

The walks and drive are ramped up to the house for the easier use by the wheelchair user. The attached garage has an electrically controlled door. Radiant heating will provide comfort. The medicine cabinet in the bathroom is placed low enough to be reached from a wheelchair and throughout the house all fixtures and fittings are arranged according to this same plan.

All the doorways are extra wide in this Paraplegic House. All light switches are placed immediately inside the doorways so that the wheelchair occupant will not have to enter a dark room.

Two other complete houses are being built in the Homeland section of the Greater Cleveland Home and Flower Show. The main arena will again have a spectacular display of floral gardens with a thirty-foot waterfall, cascades and pools set in a woodland scene, will dominate the vast stage end of the arena.

Throughout the other big halls of Public Auditorium will be garden and home equipment exhibits of infinite variety.

Return of Army Reserve Officer Questionnaires Is Urged

What Your Work Will Buy

Are you one of the many people who are troubled by the high cost of food? If so, an analysis prepared by The National Industrial Conference Board will come as a surprise.

In 1948, twelve hours of work, by the average worker, would purchase a week's food for his family—whereas, in 1914, 30 hours of work was required. Putting it another way, the worker in 1914 had to spend about three-fifths of his total wages on food, while in 1948 one-third would take care of the grocery bill. In the last third of a century, food costs have increased a little more than 150 percent while hourly earnings have risen sixfold.

There are many reasons for this—notably the great increase in pay gained by labor. There is, however, one important factor which may be overlooked and that is the enormous increase in efficiency registered by retailing. What is true of food is true to a greater or lesser extent of practically all the commodities we buy. There has been something resembling a retail revolution in the last decade or so. It was led by the chain systems, which pioneered the idea of cutting the profit earned on each sale to the bone, and still earning a satisfactory overall profit by increasing the volume of business. Other kinds of stores quickly adopted the same plan. The result is the store of today, with its extensive stocks, its attractive displays, its excellent standards of service, and prices which are as low as conditions permit.

Thus, retailing has made a very real contribution to American living standards. This and That from Washington

THE wheels of Congress are slowly beginning to turn after more than a month. Committee membership has been established at last and work has started in most committees. My own Committee on Foreign Affairs has been called together on organization matters. No indication has been given, as yet, as to continuation of the geographical subcommittees, set up in 1945 to stimulate committee members to learn more about the countries in their own particular areas partly by becoming acquainted with the Washington representatives of those countries and partly by travel during House adjournments, or of the topical committees such as the Committee on National and International Movements of which I have been chairman during its two years of life.

THE House Committee on Appropriations has decided upon its subcommittees. It is these committees who hold hearings on all special subjects and report to the full committee which seldom changes their decisions. Subcommittee chairmen are as follows: Michael J. Kirwan, Ohio, Interior; Jamie L. Whitten, Mississippi, Agriculture; George H. Mahon, Texas, Armed Services; Albert Thomas, Texas, Independent Offices; John H. Kerr, North Carolina, Deficiencies and Army Civil Functions; Joe B. Bates, Kentucky, District of Columbia; John E. Fogarty, Rhode Island, Labor and Federal Security; J. Vaughan Gary, Virginia, Treasury and Post Office; John J. Rooney, New York, State, Justice, Commerce and Judiciary.

THE Senate Committee on Foreign Relations will begin consideration of an extension of E.C.A. on February 8. First in line is a three months interim period to cover and then the fiscal year of 1950 must be decided upon. Senator Elbert D. Thomas (Utah) Chairman of the Senate Labor and Public Welfare Committee has announced that his committee would consider the legislation referred to it in the following order: Federal Aid to Education, National Science Foundation, Minimum Wages, and Tariff. The committee is now holding hearings on the Tariff-Hartley Repeal. The Education bill may be reported out of committee soon since the committee is more or less agreed on this issue. Both the Senate and House Banking and Currency Committees have agreed to take up such measures as would extend rent controls beyond March 31, 1949, the House acting first.

Senator Elmer Thomas (Oklahoma), Chairman of the Senate Committee on Agriculture introduced a bill (S. 668) on January 27th providing for stockpiling of certain commodities in fixed amounts to help stabilize farm prices.

THOSE of you who had the pleasure of meeting Lady Ramu Rau, wife of the Indian Ambassador to the United States and heard her speak both in the library of the Council on World Affairs and later at the opening meeting of the Cleveland branch of the Hindustani Student Organization will be sorry to learn that she is returning to India. Her husband, Sir Benejara Rama Rau has been appointed Governor of the Reserve Bank of India.

New Military Code and Trial Procedure

In preparation for donning "new look" military justice robes on Feb. 1, 1949, Headquarters Ohio Military District announced today that schools will be held at Fort Hayes during the month of January. Additional schools will be conducted throughout the year until all Non-commissioned officers of the first three grades, warrant officers and officers are familiar with the new military code and trial procedure.

A fifteen hour course of lectures and conferences, based on the new courts martial manual, will be given to all officers, warrant officers and selected enlisted men by competent experienced senior officers.

This course is designed to prepare military personnel for duties as members of Special and General Courts Martial. It is also planned to assist commanders in the field in effecting necessary changes in the administration of military justice.

Some of the outstanding changes affecting administration of military justice required by Title II of the Selective Service Act of 1948, are:

The new practice allows enlisted men to sit on General Courts for the trial of other enlisted men of lower rank when the accused requests before trial that this be done. In such cases, the enlisted men must comprise at least one-third of the members of the court as finally constituted. The old system set up courts of commissioned officers in the active military service only.

Warrant officers may be detailed as members of General and Special Courts Martial for the trial of enlisted men or other warrant officers. Reserve personnel on inactive duty may serve on an Army Courts Martial.
