



USS Blood Drive

This letter is being written for the express purpose of getting blood donors from you or your immediate family and from your organization.

We appeal to you to help us to establish a blood bank for anyone who is associated with the United Slovenian Society.

The blood bank will be held Wednesday, July 16, from 1 to 7 p.m. at the Slovenian Society Home, 20713 Recher Ave., 531-9309.

In practical terms, this means the suburbs will receive at least an additional 75,000 vehicle miles per week over the next five years, with 37,500 of those new vehicle miles per week coming in the first week.

The public meetings will be concerned with implementation of this service improvement in terms of substantial additional frequency on existing lines, new feeder lines and new crosstown lines.

The new vehicle miles are to be allocated based on standards established by the five-county transit study, which call for route spacing in high density areas to be no more than 2/15ths of a mile to the nearest bus route, up to a maximum of 3/4s of a mile in low density suburban areas.

Stoddard indicated public hearings will begin immediately after a favorable vote on the tax issue on July 22.
