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## To so strašne razmere

"Na nasvet predsednika Hooverja je zvezna vlada podarila vinorejcem v Californiji ogromno svoto \$19,187,622. Pritoževali so se, da ne morejo svojega grozdja dobro prodati, pa jim je zvezna vlada pomagala. In od tega denarja je dobila kompanija, nazvana po imenu "Fruit Industries, Limited, ogromno svoto \$2,555,330."

"Ta družba oglašuje po deželi, da prodaja koncentrate iz grozdja, iz katerega izdelka je brez vsakega truda lahko narediti dobro vino in celo šampanjec. In to podpira zvezna vlada z milijoni dolarjev prispevkov. Več kot 80,000 železniških voz californijskega grozdja se razpelle vsako leto po Ameriki, in to grozdje gre v privatne domove, kjer se stisne, in ljudje v prohibicijskih časih pijejo vino in drugo močno pijačo, dočim vlada plačuje liberalno, da je to mogoče."

"Seveda, točka 29. narodne prohibicijske postavke trdi, in sodniji so to odbor, da je popolnoma postavno izdelovati doma 12 do 20 procentov alkoholno pijačo, ako se slednja rabi samo za domače potrebe. In pogledajmo, kaj je ta točka povzročila v privatnih domovih, pred prohibicijo in po upeljavi prohibicije."

V letu 1915 in do leta 1919, ko prohibicija še ni bila upeljana, se je povzilo v Zedinjenih državah sledeče količine vina: V letu 1915 vsega skupaj 32,000,000 galon, v letu 1916, ko se je dobro delalo, 47,587,000 galon, v letu 1917 pa 42,723,000 galon, v letu 1918, tekem vojne, že 51,598,000 galon, in v letu 1919, ki je bilo zadnje pred prohibicijo, pa 54,272,000 galon.

In zanimive so sedaj uradne številke, katere je izdal vrhovni prohibicijski direktor, Amos Woodcock, koliko se povzije vina sedaj, ko je prohibicija upeljana. V letu 1925 je vlada našla 137,225,000 galon domačega vina, v letu 1926 pa 126,165,000 galon, v letu 1927 se je produciralo že 143,573,000 galon vina, v letu 1928 pa 153,614,000 galon. Vse to seveda kaže, da se prohibicija čimdalje bolj izpolnjuje v Zedinjenih državah, zlasti pa v privatnih domovih.

"Kdor je pazno zasledoval gori omenjene številke, je rakoz razvidel, da se v prohibicijskih časih pridelava v Ameriki ravno trikrat toliko vina, kot smo ga imeli v časih, predno je bila prohibicija upeljana. Ali je prohibicija torej upeljana, da ljudje bolj pijančujejo, ali je bila upeljana, da se navadijo zmernosti? In to so številke, katere je navedel vrhovni direktor zveznega prohibicijskega urada, kateremu mora biti položaj bolj znan kot vsakomur drugemu."

"To je, kar se tiče vina. Mr. Woodcock, direktor prohibicijskega urada se je izjavil, da je s pivom še veliko slabše. Po zanesljivih podatkih je izračunal, da se je v Ameriki tekom lanskega leta produciralo najmanj 683,000,000 galon alkoholne pive, ne da bi računali na pivo, ki se je upeljalo iz Kanade."

"In prohibicijska postava ima pri tem skrajno neumestno in nerazumljivo postavko!" Dočim postava ne zabranjuje direktno izdelek vina v privatnem domu, pa je direktno prepovedano izdelovanje pive. Vi ne boste aretirani, ako imate doma par sodov vina, toda aretira se vas lahko takoj, ako izdelujete pivo. In dočim ima doma narejeno pivo k večjemu 3.5 odstotka alkohola, pa ima domače vino lahko 12 procentov, pa niste zapadli postavi radi kršenja prohibicije."

V letu 1919, ki je bilo zadnje leto pred prohibicijo, je bilo v Zedinjenih državah 699 pivovaren, ki so izdelovale pivo, ki je imelo le 2.75 procentov alkohola. Teh 699 pivovaren je produciralo 852,977,018 galon pive, in to pivo je imelo veliko manj alkohola v sebi kot pa pivo, ki se sedaj skriva izdeluje v privatnih domovih, do katerih zvezna vlada nima dostopa."

"Kaj je pa z žganjem? Mr. Woodcock, zvezni prohibicijski direktor, ki je tozadevno upeljal natančno preiskavo, je dognal sledeče: iz koruze se je pridelalo v letu 1930 nič manj kot 55,900,000 galon žganja, iz sladkorja 18,000,000 galon, iz žita in molases 14,000,000, iz ukradenega alkohola iz vladnih skladišč, 19,929,000 galon. In kako so ljudje še na druge načine kuhali alkohol, to pa tudi vrhovnemu prohibicijskemu direktorju ni znano."

Pred prohibicijo se je letno nakuhalo v Zedinjenih državah nekako 82,118,000 galon raznega žganja. Sedaj pa, ko imamo prohibicijo, se ga skuha na privatnih domovih najmanj 100,000,000 na leto. In Mr. Hoover pravi, da je prohibicija blagoslov za ameriško družino in dom. Morebiti ima interese v tem?

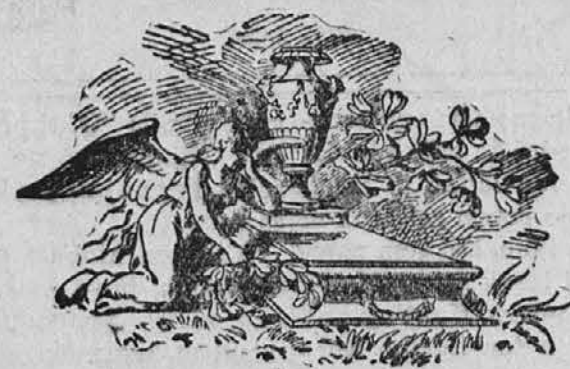

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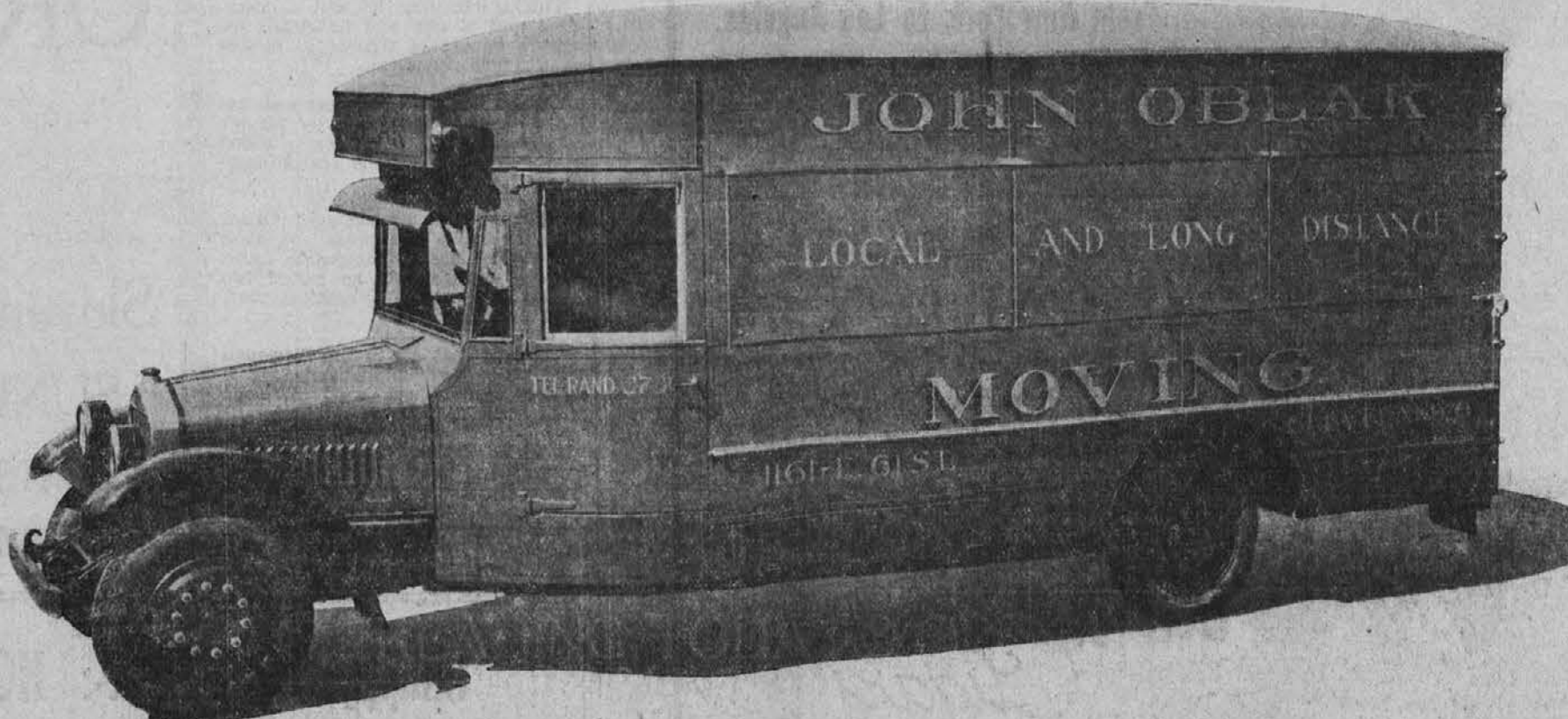
