Državni tajnik Marshall vidi še vedno potrebo za pomoč Evropi

Washington. — Državni tajnik Marshall je sporocil kongresu, da je nujno potrebno določiti denar za pomoč Evropi. Izmed vseh evropskih zadet je ta najbolj važna, je naročil Mr. Marshall kongresu, da nadaljujemo s pomočjo Evropi potem, ko preneha UNRRA.

Tajnik Marshall je naslovil pismo na predsednika senata, senatorja Vandenbergra rekoč, da je ta zadeva ena najbolj nujnih, ki jih predлага državno tajništvo kongresu.

Senator Vandenberg je potem rekel, da bo Zed. države prevzele relief od UNRRA v nekaterih krajih Evrope, da preprečijo lakoto. Noben ameriški kongresnik se ne bo hotel temi izogniti, je rekel Mr. Vandenberg.

Povedal je tudi, da je bil prav radi tega poslan v Evropo blivši predsednik Hoover, ki bo preiskal, kje je pomoč najbolj nujna in koliko naj jo dajo Zed. države.

Predsednik Truman je že v svojem poročlu o proračunu obvestil kongres, da bo vprašal za več sto milijonov dolarov za pomoč zunaj, zlasti pa za Italijo, Avstrijo in Grčijo.

Washington. — OPA naznana, da bo izdala za 1. aprila novo sladkorno znakmo, s katero bo lahko kupilo 10 funtov sladkorja. Do kdaj bo ta znakma veljavna še ni znano.

Istočasno pa OPA naznana, da odslej ne bo dajala več znakm za nakup sladkorja za preverziranje. Teh 10 funtov, ki jih booste zdaj lahko kupili z novo znakmo, bo moral biti za vsakdanjo uporabo in za preverziranje.

Kakor računa OPA zdaj bo dobila vsaka oseba letos lahko 35 funtov sladkorja, dočim ga je bilo prošlo leto le 25 funtov na osebo. Lansko leto je dala OPA 15 funtov sladkorja na osebo, 10 funtov pa za preverziranje.

Sedanja znakma 53, ki je veljavna za 5 funtov, bo veljavna torej samo do konca marca. Nova znakma bo govorila za nakup 10 funtov, torej bo moral gospodinja kupiti od 1. aprila naprej 10 funtov sladkorja. Je vznik ta, ker je v knjigi št. 4 samo še 5 znakm in upajajo, da predno bodo ljudje porabili teh pet znakm, bo že konec racionaliranja in ne bo treba tiskati nove knjige.

Poljski parlament je bil odprt; odsočna sta zastop. Anglie in U. S.

Iz priznave so izpustili vsako versko znamenje, ki je bilo v navadi

Varšava. — Ob velikih slovesnostih so v tork odprli novi poljski parlament ali "sejm," kadar so ga Poljaki vedno nazivali. Poslanci Anglie in Zed. držav sta bojkotirala odprtje parlamenta. To je očitno znamenje, da ta dva zaveznika protestirata proti volitvam 19. januarja, ki so bile vse prej kot svobodne.

Kakih 40 zastopnikov raznih držav je prisostvovalo odprtji parlamenta. Edino sedeža ameriškega in angleškega ambasadorja sta ostala prazna. To je boj vzbujalo začudenje in šuštanje med diplomati, kot pa med poljskimi poslanci, ki so menda kakega pričakovani.

Bila je velika debata glede besedila priznave poslancev. Dozdaj je vsak poslanec prizigel pri "Bogu in Sveti Trojici." To so zdaj komunisti odpravili in po dolgi debati dovolili, da vsak poslanec prizne in na koncu dosta: "v to mi pomozi Bog."

S tem je konec "začasne vlade," ki so jo zavezniki ustvarili v Jalti in v Potsdamu in na kraljico je pravomocna komunistična stranka.

ITALIJA BO PODPISALA POGODOBNO, JUGOSLAVIJA NE BO

Rim. — Komisija za mednarodne zadeve, ki je del narodnega končila je zavrnila ultimat Anglije, ki govoril, da se morajo židje odločiti do torka, da sodelujejo pri iztrebljenju terorističnih organizacij v Sveti deželi. Dalje je končil izjavil, da se bo do židje borili do zadnjega zdihljaja proti angleški oblasti.

Živiljenje pod zemljijo

V tistih časih je bilo Bretoniji sedem strašnih gozdov. Vandeja — to je verska vsta. Glavno pomoč so nudili tisti vstaji gozdovi. Dve tajnostni sili sta pomagali druga drugi.

Ti črni gozdovi so bili: gozd Fougeres, ki se vleče kakor jez med Dol in Avranches; gozd Prince, ki obsega osem milij; gozd Paimpont, ki je poln jarkov in hudojnikov ter je s strani Baignona sploh nedostopen, nudi pa lahki umik na rojalistično vas Concorde; gozd pri mestu Rennes, v katerem si lahko čul zvono vseh republikanskih far, ki so bile okoli mest zelo goste; gozd Machecoul, v katerem je gozdaril Charette kot divja zverina; gozd Garnache, ki je pripadal rodbinam La Tremoille, Gauvain in Rohan ter gozd Broceliande, ki je bil izključna last vil. Eden izmed bretonskih plemenitašev je nosil ime "gospodar sedmih gozdov." To je bil vikonte Fontenay, bretonski knez. Tudi Rohani so bili bretonski knezi.

Zgodovina bretonskih gozdov od 1792. do 1800. bi zaslužila posebno knjigo in bi dopolnila veliko junaska tragedijo Vandeje kot legendu. Zgodovina povese resnico po svoje, legenda po svoje. Resnica legende je drugačnega značaja ko resnica zgodovine. Resnica legende je izmišljena, da odkrije še bolj resnico. Obe, zgodovina in legenda pa imate en in isti cilj: da se skozi podobo minljivega človeka prikaže človek večnosti. Vandeja ni mogoče razumeti popolnoma, če se zgodovina ne dopolni po legendi; zgodovina je potrebna na celoto, legenda pa za posameznosti.

In Vandeja to žasluži. Ta vojska nevednežev, bedasta in slavna, odvratna in veličastna, je Francijo onesrečila in povečala. Vandeja je slavna ravnina na telesu Francije.

Kdor hoče razumeti Vandejo, si mora predstaviti, to ogromno nasprotno: francoska revolucija na eni, bretonski kmet na drugi strani. Tam dogodi neizmernega pomena, navaj vseh mogočih dobrot, svobod in naprav, naravnost nor izbruh civilizacije, naprednjaštvo brez meje, strast po reformi celičega življenja brez premisleka in mere — tam resni, divji čudak, kmet svetih oči in dolgi las, ki se hrani od mleka in kostanjev in ne pozna nič drugega ko svojo ilovnato kočo, plot in jarek, ki spozna vsako vas svoje okolice po zvonenju zvonov, ki rabi vodo samo za pitje, nosi usnjat jopič s svilenimi vezeninami in svojo obliko tetovira kakor so njegovi keltski predniki tetovirali svoj obraz; ki celo v svojem rablju vidi svojega gospodarja in govorji mrtev jezik, katerega ostala Francija ne razume; človek narave, ki spoštuje svoj plug in svojo staro mater ter časti "belo domo", Sveti Devico, pred katero oltarjem kleči z istim pobožnim strahom in zaupanjem obenem kakor pred tajinstvenimi velikimi kamni, ki so posuti po Bretoniji; ki po ravni kmetuje, na obrežju ribari in v gozdovih lov; ki ljubi svoje kralje, svoje graščake, svoje duhovne — ki nepremično zamišljen po cele ure stoji ob dolgi pusti peščini in prisluškuje morju.

Kmet ima dve oporni točki v

svojem življenju: polje, ki ga redi, in gozd, ki ga skriva.

Nihče se ne bi mislil, kaj so bretonski gozdovi prav za prav bili: bili so mesta. Ni si mogoče predstavljati kaj bolj nemega, mrkega in divjega kot so bili ti neprodorni, s trnjem popolnoma zaraščeni gozdovi, ki so se v svojem večnem molku zdeli ko en sam grob. Če bi pa bila po čudežu vsa debla naenkrat padla kakor posekana, bi bil človek zapazil, kako bi v tem mraku zamrgoleli ljudje kakor gosto posejani kipi mravljišč. Okrogle, ozke rove, zgoraj pokrite s kamni in vejami, ki so najprej vodili v zemljo navpično, potem pa tekli vodoravno, dokler se niso končali v mračne dupline, to je našel kralj Kamvizes v Egiptu, general francoske revolucije Westermann pa v Bretoniji. Tam so bili podzemski prostori vzdiani v pesek puščave, tu so se razprostirali pod debli gozdovih velikanov. V egiptskih votlinah so stanovali mrlči, v bretonskih živi ljudje. V eni izmed nedostopnih jas v midskem gozdu so bile pod zemljo celo galerije hodnikov in so se tu di takoj imenovale; nek drug tak podzemski kraj se je imenoval "Kraljevi trg."

Tako podzemsko življenje je bilo v Bretoniji odnekaj. Človek se je skrival pred človekom pod zemljijo že od časov drugov, tajnostnih kraljev-svečenikov keltskega naroda. Sence

pa kruteži zgodovine so bili šli preko te mračne zemlje: Tevates, Cesar, Geoffroy angleški, Alain "železno rokavico", grofi, klativitezi in paropari, vikomti Rohansi, ki je dal obešati na stotine kmetov, v petnajstem in sedemnajstem verske vojske, v osemnajstem trope na lov na kmete izučenih psov; v takih razmerah so se seveda ljudje rajši zarili pod zemljijo kakor da bi prenašali batine objestnih vlastodržcev. Pračlovek se je skril pred Kelti. Kelti pred Rimljani, Bretonci pred Normani, Hugenoti pred katoličani, tihotapeci pred finančarji. Dvatisoč let je trinošč v vseh mogočih oblikah: osvajanja, fevdalizma, fanatizma, davčnega izčemanja tlačilo nesrečno Bretonijo; neizprosna gonja zoper ljudi je prenehala samo zato, da v drugi obliki zoper oživi. Zato so ljudje poiskali zavetja v podzemskih votlinah pod neizmernimi gozdovi.

Ko je izbruhnila francoska revolucija, se je Bretonija uprla. Zdela se ji je, da pomeni ogromni osvobodilni pokret novo obliko tlačenja — običajna zmota sužnjev. Stari bretonski gozdovi pa so se zoper postavili na stran kmetov in podprli njihovo vstajo.

Te skrivne goščave, pod katerimi so bili v neizmernih labirintih zakopani tisoč oboroženih vstavev, so bile podobne ogromnim gobam, iz katerih je po orških stopinjam revolucije velike mreže, v katero so se vjevale republičanske armade.

V kolibah so živele ženske, v podzemljih brlogih moški. Ženske so nosile moškim hrano; zgodilo se je, da so katerikrat na tega ali onega pozabili na revez od lakote umrl. Površ nad rovom, ki je vodil v zemljo, je bil iz mahu in vej tako umetno spletene, da ga od zunaj ni bilo mogoče zapaziti,

a od znotraj pa se je dal lahko odpreti in zapreti. Ta skrivena soila izkopana z veliko skrbnostjo; izkopano zemljo so vrgli v kak bližnji ribnjak, stene in tla pa obložili s praprotjem in mahom. Tako ukinjo so imenovali "ložo", in

kjer je lahko pogrešal luč, ogenj in zrak, je bil v njej dobro spravljeno. V teh živalskih brlogih so se ljudje hudo dolgočasili. Katerikrat so ponocno zlezli iz luknji in slično vresišče. Ali pa so molili, da preženejo čas. "Cel dan nas je pustil Jean Chouan moliti rožni venec," poroča Bourdoiseau.

Detroit, Mich. — Because of one man, 14,000 workers walked off their jobs at the Hudson Motor Car Co. The man was told to take the place of a girl, but refused on the grounds that a man cannot work in place of a woman employee.

Atlanta, Ga. — George Hamilton, State Treasurer, warned both governors, Talmadge and Thompson, to file their cases quickly before the court which will decide who is the governor of Georgia before there is a money crisis as he will not pay out a penny until a decision is made.

Washington. — Secretary of War Robert Patterson declared that U.S. must continue with military training for the safety of our country, and that we must have a standing army of 1,000,000 men which Congress should vote a sum of \$7,000,000,000 for expenses.

Washington. — The British government has given orders that no person may buy more than 20 cents worth of fresh meat. Previously, each person could buy 28 cents worth. More canned meats are allowed.

Flight Training
