## PREGLED NAJVAŽNEJŠIH DOGODKOV

**Sovjeti pristali na obnovitev pogajanj z ZDA glede oboroževalne tekme – Začetek v Ženevi 7. in 8. januarja 1985**

WASHINGTON, D.C. – Predstavniki ZDA in ZSSR se bodo sestali v Ženevi, Švica 7. in 8. januarja 1985 ter obravnavati možnosti za širša pogajanja o omejevanju oboroževalne tekme, predvsem jedrskega in vesoljskega orožja. Do obnovitev od Sovjetov prekinjenega dialoga med velesilama je prišlo, ko so Sovjeti opustili zahtevo, da morajo ZDA kot predpogojo za pogajanja umakniti svoje Pershing II in »cruise« misile iz NATO držav v Evropi.

V Ženevi bosta delegaciji načelovala sam državni tajnik ZDA George P. Shultz in sovjetski zunanjji minister Andrej A. Gromiko. V zadnjem času so Sovjeti začeli govoriti tudi o možnosti osebnega srečanja med predsednikom Reagonom in Konstantinom Černenkom, sovjetska stran pa poudarja, da bo moral Reagan vsaj nekoliko popustiti glede ameriškega stališča, predno bo mogoče takšno srečanje uresničiti.

V Moskvi je predstavnik zunanjega ministra Vladimir Lomeiko poudaril, da bodo pogovori v Ženevi v januarju povsem »nova«. Sovjeti namreč nočajo priznati, da so popustili v svojih zahtevah, zaradi katerih so prekinili uradna pogajanja v Ženevi pred letom dni. Tako je mogel Lomeiko trditi, da o resnejših pogajanjih o omejevanju jedrskega oboroževanja med ZDA in ZSSR bo mogoče govoriti šele, ko bodo iz Evrope umaknjeni Pershing in »cruise« misili.

V Beli hiši in State Departmentu so prepričani, da bodo Sovjeti pripravljeni na pogajanja, ker vedo, da bo Reagan ostal na krmilu ZDA še štiri leta, želeli pa bodo prek kakega sporazuma o omejevanju oborožitve preprečiti, da bi ZDA nadaljevale z že načrtovanim programom vesoljskega oboroževanja oz. s »Star Wars« obrambnim sistemom.

**V Beogradu poteka politično sojenje šestim disidentom – Neenotnost v vladajoči komunistični parti – Gospodarske težave**

BEOGRAD, SFRJ – V Beogradu se zagovarja pred sodiščem 6 disidentov, ki so jih oblasti obtožile sodelovanja v zaroti, katerega namen je bil strmoglavit socialistično ureditev države. Ako bodo disidenti obsojeni, jih lahko čaka 15 let v zaporu. Današnji Cleveland Plain Dealer je ponatisnila članek o tem procesu, ki je izšel v londonskem »The Economist«.

Sodni proces se je začel 5. novembra in je za komunistično državo dokaj nenavaden. Obtoženci so na svobodi, procesa se udeležuju njih prijatelji in somišljeniki, med njimi znani oporečnik Milovan Djilas. Na prvi seji procesa je dejal eden obtoženih, da med sodelniki ne bi smelo biti nobenega člena komunistične partije, to zato, ker član partije v tem procesu ne bi mogel biti nepristranski. Drugi disident je zahteval diskvalifikacijo glavnega sodnika, ker ni dovolil obtožencem, da se seznanijo z gradivom v rokah policije, itd.

Kaj so pa obtoženci počeli, da so se znašli pred sodiščem? Bili so člani skupine, ki se je srečavala tedensko in debatirala o raznih zadevah, tudi političnih. Nekateri so skupino imenovali »svobodno univerzo«, zadnji korak za oblasti pa je menda bilo sodelovanje Djilasa. Policisti so vdrli v stanovanje, v katerem je potekel sestanek, ter vse navzoče aretrala, tudi Djilasa.

Kot kaže, imajo disidenti podporo od

raznih krajev države, celo Hrvatske. Srbski general Gojko Nikolis, ki je veteran španske državljanke vojske in narodni heroj, je zapustil komunistično partijo v znak protesta zoper sodni proces.

V partijskem vodstvu je precej neenotnosti glede politike – z izjemo močnejših pritiskov na disidente. SFRJ želi nove ugodnosti od zahodnih držav in bank glede odplačevanja dolgov. V zameno želijo zahodne banke neposrednejšega nadzorovanja gospodarske politike v SFRJ. Slišati je več predlogov, naj postane država bolj centralizirana, itd. Inflacijska stopnja v SFRJ je 60-odstotna, brezposelnost je 15-odstotna, država pa kljub 5-letnim prizadevanjem še vedno dolguje kakih 20 milijard dolarjev.

**V Jordaniji zaseduje PLO parlament – Jasir Arafat zopet v ospredju – Sirijski proti – V Izraelu Arabci demonstrirajo**

AMMAN, Jor. – Včeraj se je začelo zasedanje parlamenta PLO, o katerem meni načelnik PLO Jasir Arafat, da je edini zakoniti predstavnik palestinskega ljudstva. Dejstvo pa je, da je PLO še vedno temeljito sprito. V Siriji so štiri palestinske organizacije, ki imajo popolno sirijsko podporo in ki ne priznavajo Arafata, zasedanja parlamenta se tudi ne udeležujejo. V zadnjem letu je Arafat iskal podporo med zmernejšimi arabskimi državami. Tako je obnovil prijateljske stike z jordanskim kraljem Huseinom, ki je pred leti po krvavem obračunu izgnal PLO iz Jordanije. Tudi z Egiptom ima Arafat sedaj dobre odnose, v Moskvi pa še vedno uživa podporo.

Opazovalci palestinskega gibanja menijo, da ima Arafat trenutno malo možnosti za kak viden uspeh, da pa je spreten politik, ki je preživel marsikatero krizo.

Ta teden so Palestinci, ki živijo na od Izraelcev zasedenega Zahodnem bregu, demonstrirali v znak podpore zasedanja PLO parlamenta v Ammanu. V neredih, ki so nastali, sta bila ubita dva Palestinka, enega pa ranili.

### Kratke vesti –

**Danes je prišlo do incidenta na meji med Severno in Južno Korejo. V streljanju je padel južnokorejski vojak, ranjen pa je bil ameriški. Padla sta tudi dva Severnokorejca. Incident se je po prvih poročilih začel, ko je pobegnil čez mejo nek sovjetski državljan. Ta je baje s pobegom uspel in je sedaj v Seulu, Južna Koreja.**

**Angleška vlada je sporočila, da bo zapustila UNESCO organizacije, ker je le-ta postala preveč politična. Angleški ukrep bo prišel v veljavo konec 1985. leta. ZDA nameščajo iz istega razloga UNESCO zapustiti do konca letosnjega leta.**

**Washingtonski kongresni delegat aretriran skupaj z drugimi črnskimi voditelji, ker so vdrli v poslaništvo Južne Afrike. Akcija naj bi bila protest zoper južnoafriško politiko aparteida. Južnoafriški veleposlanik je dal lokalni policiji dovoljenje, da odvede demonstrante.**

**Skupina Angležev, ki nasprotuje laboratorijskim poskusom na živali, je zastrupila nekaj kosov slaščic, izdelkov firme Mars U.K. Ltd., ki baje sodeluje v takih poskusih. Storilci so sicer sporočili javnosti, da je vsak zastrupljen kos posebej označen, da pa v bočne tega ne bodo povedali, seveda, ako se bodo taki poskusi nadaljevali.**

**15. obletnica smrti dr. Mihe Kreka**

V mesecu novembra obhajamo spomin smrti dveh vodilnih slovenskih mož v času zadnje vojske in revolucije in se vsak do svoje smrti v emigraciji.

Škof dr. Gregorij Rožman je umrl 16. novembra 1959, torej pred 25 leti, preteklo nedeljo pa je minilo 15 let, od kar je odšel v večnost dr. Miha Krek, ki je umrl 18. novembra 1969. Oba moža sta se v svojem življenju borila za iste ideale, škof na cerkvenem-verskem področju, dr. Krek v narodno-političnem delovanju. V takšnem sodelovanju ni nikakšnih nasprotij, kot slišimo očitke, da se Cerkev vmešava v politiko. Prav pri letošnjih ameriških volitvah je prišlo javno do izraza, da moralnih načel ne moreš in ne smeš izločiti iz politike.

Vsi vemo, da je komunistični režim v domovini škofu dr. Gregoriju Rožmanu naprtil obtožbo izdajstva nad narodom. 40 let nikdo ni smel javno izreči niti besedice v obrambo škofa, a sedaj začenja mladi izobraženi rod v domovini vrtati in iskati resnico.

Tudi dr. Miha Kreka so v Ljubljani istočasno s škofom Rožmanom obsodili kot narodnega izdajalca. Obdolžili so ga, da je kot predstavnik Slovencev v eksilni vladi v Londonu podpiral »proti-narodne«, to je protikomunistične sile.

Oba vodilna moža sta se skupaj znašla v emigraciji. Po sili razmer je tudi v emigraciji na oba padla dolžnost, da sta vsak na svojem področju morala voditi po vseh kontinentih razkropljeni slovenski narod.

Dr. Miha Krek je bil begunec kot je bil škof in tisoče drugih. V emigraciji je več kot preveč moral poslušati in brati očitke, da med vojno ni razumel položaja v domovini, da ni dovolj storil za rešitev domobranov in končno na njega je bila vržena krvda Vetrinjske tragedije. Njegova veličina je bila, da je vse mirno prenašal. Resnica je, da je dr. Krek mnogo prej spoznal nevarnost položaja kot tisti, ki se še sedaj niso odresli sumničenja o njegovi krividi. Dr. Krek je v več predavanjih govoril o svojih prizadevanjih že v jeseni 1944. Osebno je bil pri papežu in ga opozoril, da se naj Vatikan pripravi, da bo prebežalo okrog 50.000 beguncov, če bodo komunisti zasedli Slovenijo. A vse je šlo več ali manj mimo ušes, kot da se hoče dr. Krek zagovarjati.

Resnica pa vztrajno sili na površje. Kdor je videl film »Klagenfurt Conspiracy«, ki ga je v začetku tega leta predvajala angleška BBC televizija in je slišal pričevanje angleških oficirjev, ki so izvršili vračanje slovenskih domobranov in srbskih četnikov, pričevanja o vlogi Harolda Mac Milana in maršala Aleksandra — ali še kdo more govoriti o krivdi — razen angleški!

V ljubljanskem Delu od 3. novembra 1984, pod naslovom »Kvislingi iščejo rešitev«, je med drugim priobčena tudi ta-le notica: »Raziskovalcem niso dovolili vpogleda v vse dokumente o raznih akcijah emigrantskih politikov, ki so poskušali nagovoriti zavezničke k intervenciji v Jugoslaviji in ponudili storitve izdajalskih čet. Tako sta denimo predstavnik slovenske ljudske stranke dr. Miha Krek in predstavnik četnikov dr. Živko Topalović 20. decembra 1944 prosila britanskega veleposlanika Sira Charlesa Noela, naj posreduje pri feldmaršalu Aleksandru, naj ju sprejme. ... V hribih je okrog 100.000 borcev, ki se nočejo predati Titovi vojski. Še vedno iščejo možnost za sodelova-

Po končani vojni je na dr. Kreka padla težka dolžnost, kako spraviti na varno in v redno življenje desettisoč slovenskih beguncev. Malo je za to dobil dr. Krek priznanja in hvaležnosti, a njemu je bilo dovolj v zadoščenje razumevanje svojega velikega prijatelja škofa dr. Gregorija Rožmana, ki mu je 4. avgusta 1946 osebno in lastoročno napisal: »Dragi gospod minister! Za delo preselitve naj Vam in vsem Vašim sodelavcem da Bog svoj blagoslov. Menim, da je treba kar z vso energijo na tem delati. Mera našega trpljenja se mora pač dopolniti, a kdaj bo to? Želim in prosim Vam od Boga veliko modrosti, potprežljivosti in vztrajnosti, k temu pa še potrebno zdravje, da boste armado naših beguncev srečno spravili na varno.« In voščilo 26. septembra 1948: ...»da Vam Bog nakloni zdravje, telesne moći, vedrost in gibčnost duha za veliko delo, ki ga imate za naš križani narod. Saj je sicer vse, kar moremo storiti, le kapljica balzama na boleče rane, a brez tega bi bile rane v resnici smrtna, tako pa le moremo upati na življenje.« — Gregorij

S Cerkvijo sodelujejo v delu za širjenje evangelija.« (Odlomek 41)

Naše krščanstvo apostolstvo je torej bistveno misijonskega značaja. Nam vsem velja Gospodova zapoved: »Napotite se po celiem svetu, celemu stvarstvu sporočite (pre)srečno novico!« (Mk 16:15) Blagornam, če si in ker se Gospodove zapovedi zavedamo: »Tistemu, ki meni služi, bo Oče podelil čast.« (Jn 12:26)

Naše krščanstvo je torej apostolsko

— misijonsko po svoji naravi — s Kristusom so-delujemo pri gradnji sveta, ki je tem boljši, čim bolj mu je Kristus »pot, resnica, življenje« (Jn 14:5). Pri tem so-delovanju pripada najvažnejša vloga božji in naši materi Mariji — zgoraj omenjene papeževe besede to staro resnico znova potrujejo takoreko za dvajseto stoletje.

Kot misijonsko usmerjeni apostoli — pravzaprav bi se morali imenovati »v cel svet misijonsko usmerjeni kristjani«; apostol namreč pomeni poslanca, kar so Rimljani prevedli z missus, ki se skriva tudi v našem »misijonu« in izpeljankah — potrebujemo »dragocenih darov od zgoraj« (Jk 1:17), da ostanemo v živi zvezzi s Kristusom, ki brez Njega »nezmoremo ničesar« (Jn 15:5).

Ti dragoceni darovi leže v božji zakladnici, do katere ima najlažji dostop — sveta Devica in božja Mati Marija! V tem stavku se zgoraj naničane misli srečajo, kot se srečajo žarki v kristalu, da razodene čudovito umerjenost notranjega ustroja. V podobni kristalni lepoti se svetlika »novo stvarstvo« (prim. Gal 16:15), katerega delovničanski del tvorimo kot kristjani; čudovita pestrost značajev in nagibov preveva to novo stvarstvo, pestra raznolikost sredstev in načinov skrbni za njegovo občevalnost; sredstva takšnega bogastva — kako silno bogato je že tkzv. naravno stvarstvo! — pripada posebno mestu zakladničarki Mariji.

Ko prosi, ljubi; ker ljubi, prosi. Toda svoje ljubezni nam ne more vsiliti; Duh, ki nas oživila v Kristusu Jezusu, nas dela svobodne (prim. Rom 14:14) (Dalje na str. 3)

## Dan's Diary

Normally, I would not expound about something like this, but I have been so emotionally upset, that I must get this off my chest. It will make me feel a lot better. Basically, I am very soft hearted.

You see, our family has lost a true and loveable friend. Her name was Nonny, and we were fortunate to have her share our home since May 1970. She was given to us by the Oberstars, neighbors of ours, who had found this brown and white terrier on their tree lawn as a small puppy. They nurtured her for several weeks, and as they already had a "boarder", offered her to us.

As we did not know her origin, our son came up with the idea of using some letters from the word "anonymous", and we named her Nonny. She was a joy to our youngsters. We gave her all of our love, and in return, she gave us her full undying devotion.

After almost 14 1/2 years of life, she started ailing. We took her to the Vet on Friday morning, Nov. 9. I was delivering packages of "American Home" newspapers to carriers' homes in the Collinwood-Euclid areas, and had our Nonny in a cardboard box in the back seat of the car. I will never forget those soulful big brown eyes peeping over the box every time I opened the car door to make a delivery, and I waved to her each time. At that point in time I never dreamed that she was taking her last ride. My wife remained with her at the Euclid Veterinary Hospital while I delivered the rest of the newspapers.

At 3:25 p.m. the Vet called and stated she had a large tumor, and due to other ailments was a poor surgical risk. He recommended putting her to sleep. We did not want to cause her further suffering, so we followed the suggestion of the Vet, and at 7:05 that evening our beloved friend and boarder was gone... Later, the Vet said we did the right thing. It was unfortunate that our son, who loved her so much, could not see her before she died, as he had been on a three month assignment in Doylestown, Pa., and did not return until this week. To us, losing Nonny was somewhat like losing a fellow human being, a good friend, for instance.

We want to thank John Habat who happened to be

there with his dog at the time, for his words of comfort.

May I end this tribute to Nonny by saying that we will always remember that fateful day, Nov. 9, with deep sadness, and will ever cherish her in our hearts. Although we may get another friend someday, there just will never be a *another* Nonny...
