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Predsednik je začel razgovore s Sovjeti

Poslanik ZSSR v Washingtonu A. Dobrinin, ki se je po dveh mesecih vrnil iz Moskve, je orisal R. M. Nixonu sovjetske poglede na mednarodni položaj in povabil predsednika ZDA na obisk v ZSSR.

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Predsednik R. M. Nixon je tekom svojega sprejema sovjetskega poslanika A. Dobrinina pretekel ponedeljek začel široke razgovore s Sovjetsko zvezo o vprašanjih, ki zadevajo obe vodilni sveta. Sovjetski zastopnik je v glavnih obrisih razložil sovjetske poglede na mednarodni položaj in sovjetska stališča, pa dobil na to tudi delni predsedničkov odgovor.

Razgovori so se tako začeli, nadaljevali se bodo na različnih ravneh in krajih, dokler ne bodo takoj dozoreli, da bi bilo koristno neposredno srečanje predsednika R. M. Nixonu z vodniki Sovjetske zveze. Dobrinin je Nixonu povabil na obisk v Sovjetsko zvezo in ta je načelno povabilo sprejel.

R. M. Nixon je še pred vselitvijo v Belo hišo ponovno izjavil, da je čas sovražnega merjenja moči minil in da je treba mednarodne spore reševati s stvarimi političnimi razgovori. Napovedal je pri tem, da se bo najprej pomenil z zavezniki, potem bo še začel razgovore s Sovjetsko zvezo. Razgovor z Dobrininem bo služil Nixonu pri razgovorih z vodniki zavezniških držav na poti po Evropi. Ti razgovori bodo pa nato služili pri zavzemaju ameriških stališč v nadaljnih razgovorih z vodniki Sovjetske zveze.

Doslej še ni noben ameriški predsednik obiskal Sovjetsko zvezo. Eisenhower je imel namen potovati tja leta 1960, pa je Hruščev vabil umaknil po zaletju vohunskega letala U-2, ko je Eisenhower odklonil sovjetsko zahtevo po opravičilu.

Pretekli teden padlo v Vietnamu 197 Amerikancev

SAIGON, J. Viet. — Pretekli teden je padlo v Južnem Vietnamu v bojih 197 ameriških vojakov, 1103 pa so bili ranjeni. Rdeči se izgubili v istem času v bojih 2549 mož.

Skupno je doslej padlo v J. Vietnamu 31,759 Amerikancev, ranjenih pa je bilo 200,792. V korejski vojni so imele ZDA 33,629 mrtvih in 103,284 ranjenih.

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Z ozirom na štrajk pristaniških delavcev, ki se je začel pred Božičem in trajal do srede februarja, je poštna uprava že 20. decembra omejila sprejemanje navadnih poštnih pošiljk za preko Atlantika in Mehikiškega zaliva.

Štrajk je sedaj končan in poštna uprava je ta teden ukinila vse omejitve, ki so bile v zvezi s Nov napad v Jeruzalemu

JERUZALEM, Izrael. — Danes je eksplodirala na enem največjih živilskih trgov sredi mest, komaj kakih 100 jardov od ameriškega poslaništva bomba. Dva mlada Izraelca sta bila mrtva, vsaj 10 pa težje ranjenih.

Druge bombe so odkrili v arabskem delu mesta v bližini britanskega poslaništva, pa jih odstranili, predno je eksplodirala.

Pravijo, da je pripadal tisti struji v demokratski stranki, ki je računala takole: naj Stokes kar postane župan, v par letih se bo čisto "izrabil", volivci ga bodo zapustili in mestna uprava bo prisla zopet v druge roke, seveda ne črne.

Vsi znaki kažejo, da so Stokesovi tekmeci takrat primemali temu upanju precej optimizma. Stokes se je kot župan vsaj politično kar dobro obnene.

AFL-CIO zahleva \$2 za minimalno mezdo

BAL HARBOUR, Fla. — Glavni odbor AFL-CIO je imel tudi letos to svojo zimsko sejo. Dnevnini red je obsegal le tekoče posle. Glavna točka je bila poročilo predsednika Meanya o obisku, ki ga je napravil novemu predsedniku. Obisk je bil namenjen izmenjavi pogledov, kot je rekel Meany, ne pa obravnavanju programov za bodočnost.

Drugače ni moglo biti, kajti Nixon je priznal Meanyju, da se še ni utegnil poglobiti v podrobnosti delavskih zahtev — sestanek se je namreč vršil še v času pred Božičem, ko je Nixon "uradoval" še v New Yorku. Meany je rekel Nixonu, da razume, da je predsednik preobložen z delom in da unije ne bodo sililevanj s svojimi predlogi in željami. Seveda pa unije tudi ne bodo spremnjevale svojega delovnega programa, ker je sedaj republikanska stranka gospodar v Beli hiši.

Da Meany to misli resno, je pokazal te dni. Ko je namreč novi federalni tajnik za delo Schultz izrazil misel, da naj sedanja minimalna delavska mezo \$1.60 na uro ostane nespremenjena, je Meany takoj odgovoril, da bodo unije zahtevalo novo v višini \$2 na uro.

Med važne zahteve AFL-CIO bo spadal tudi predlog, naj federacija poskrbi za varstvo malih otrok v takih delavskih družinah, ker morajo matere čez dan delati. ISTAMBUL, Tur. — Obisk šestega vojnega brodovja ZDA v Istanbulu nas je znova opozoril, da politika ZDA v Turčiji ne more biti dobra. Istanbulska javnost je namreč porabila gornji obisk, da izrazi na "ljudski način" svoje antipatične do ameriške politike.

Kjerkoli so se ameriški mornarji pokazali v Istanbulu, takoj so se proti njim začele demonstracije, kot da bi bili oni odgovorni za zunanj politiko ZDA. Demonstracije so postale tako obsežne, da je bil mornarjem prepovedan ogled mesta brez primerne spremstva turških varnostnih organov.

Odkod taka sovražnost? Vzrok je več. Najprvo velika razlika med turškim in ameriškim načinom življenja, ki ga pozna naše posadke v Turčiji. Za turške domačine je to naravnost razkošje, ki si ga sami ne bodo mogli nikoli dovoliti. Turke jejo dalje, da smo v sporu zaradi Cipra preveč "neutralni" in da s silo oviramo vsako odločno turško akcijo. Tudi to je res.

Turški politiki nam očitajo, da dajemo pomoč le za vojaške namene, za podpiranje socijalne politike pa ne damo niti centa. Tudi to drži.

Amerika ni ničesar storila, da bi Turčija prešla od pridelovanja opija na drugo kmetijsko panogo, zato pa ovira izvoz opija. Tudi to se ne da tajiti. Dodajmo še komunistično propagando, pa je razlogov več kot dosti za turške antipatične do vsega, kar je ameriško, akoravno je Turčija dobila zadnjih 20 let od nas okoli \$5 bilijonov v podporah in posojilih.



French Market Doughnuts New Orleans Specialty

Any visit to New Orleans is incomplete without a trip to the Morning Call for doughnuts and coffee. The Morning Call, in the French Market, is the oldest and most popular coffeehouse in New Orleans... It opened in 1870 for the market people but soon became the place to wind up an evening... in New Orleans.

Although the recipe for the doughnuts is a family secret, here is an excellent version.



French Market Doughnuts

½ cup warm water	1 package active dry yeast or
2 tablespoons Mazola corn oil	1 cake compressed yeast
½ cup sugar	¼ cup warm (not hot) water
½ teaspoon salt	4 cups sifted flour, about
½ cup evaporated milk, undiluted	2 eggs, beaten
	Mazola corn oil, for frying

In a large mixing bowl mix together warm water, corn oil, sugar, salt and evaporated milk. Sprinkle dry yeast into ¼ cup warm (not hot) water. (Crumble compressed yeast into lukewarm water.) Stir until dissolved. Add corn oil mixture. Stir in flour and eggs alternately; heating hard and briskly. If necessary add more flour to make a soft dough. Turn dough out on a lightly floured board, and knead dough lightly for about 5 minutes or until smooth and elastic. Place dough into an oiled bowl; brush lightly with corn oil; cover with a cloth and let stand for about ½ hour. The dough will not be doubled. Divide dough in half. Keep unused portion of dough covered. On a lightly-floured board roll ½ dough at a time into a rectangle about ½-inch thick. Cut into small rectangles or triangles, about 1½ inches. Stretch with fingers until double in size and thin. Pieces should be slightly thinner in center. Fill a sturdy, flat-bottom saucepan one-third full with corn oil. (Use 1-quart corn oil in a 3-quart pan.) Heat to 375 degrees F. Add doughnuts slowly when correct temperature is reached. Fry only one layer at a time. Turn to cook and brown all sides evenly, about 2 to 4 minutes. Drain on absorbent paper. Dust with confectioners sugar; serve hot if possible. Makes 4 dozen.

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

MEMORIES OF SLOVENIAN 1920s IS RELIVED BY JACOB STREKAL

The old time Molderers are rapidly declining in numbers, the younger generation is attached to them only in their memories. Today much of the cast iron molding is done by automatic machinery that was undreamed of 50 years ago.

I am very grateful to Mr. Frank Kovacic, M.L. Valentine Peck, and Mr. Louis Erste for their co-operation in helping relive the memories of the gay 1920s.

The first world war ended in Nov., 1918. The brave men returned home in the spring of 1919. The guns were silenced. The courageous soldiers took off their boots and overcoats. This was spring of 1919, a group of energetic young men met in the quarters of Mr. Cyril Yanchar at 16107 Waterloo Rd., Cleveland, Ohio. They discussed the possibilities of organizing a manufacturing complex that became known as The Euclid Foundry Co.

At this organizational meeting were present the following: Attorney Leopold Kushlan, John Kubessa, Anton Tekavec, Joe Pograis, Valentine Peck, Anton Zajhar, Jacob, Cyril, Anton, John, and James Yanchar, plus others who are not recorded and not available.

OTHERS who LATER became Shareholders were the following: Anton Anzlovar, Anton Baraga, Louis Erste, John Pilipic, John Hribar, Frank Lausche, Ernest Luzar, Anton Jevic, Frank Kovacic, Joe Nosse, Tony Omahen, Edward Pike, Frank Pike, Valentine Peck, Mike Pograis, Frank Tomaric, Rudy Tekavec, Anton Urunkai, Mike Vidmar, and John Yanchar, Jr.

Mr. Joseph Kuncic was unanimously elected as their first President. After many lengthy discussions they decided to purchase approximately 3 acres of industrial property on old St. Clair Ave. and Lake Shore R. R., which later became N.Y.C. RR.

Leo Kushlan was authorized to file the Articles of Incorporation with the Sec. of State in Columbus, Ohio. They received their Charter on Jan. 30, 1920, then took title to the property on Feb. 24, 1920.

The sale of shares progressed nicely. Throughout many years they built and prospered on monies from the sale of stock. Construction of the factory building was started in 1921, completed in 1923. The first castings were poured in 1923.

Share holders had pre-emptive rights, and priority in employment.

The largest number of employees at one time was approximately 95, when in full production. The Molders wage was 95 cents per hour. Helpers and laborers received 50 to 60 cents per hour.

In that era the Slovenians were in process of building their own National Homes, Churches, Fraternals, Cultural singing and Dramatic lodges, along with the Industrial complex of the Euclid Foundry. Culture was their largest industry.

Taxpayers Ask IRS

This column of questions and their answers on federal tax matters is provided by the office of the U.S. Internal Revenue Service and is published as a public service to taxpayers. The column answers questions most frequently asked by taxpayers.

Q. Last year's medical expenses don't add up to 3 percent of my income. Does that mean I can't use the new provision that allows you to deduct one-half of your medical insurance premiums?

A. You may deduct one-half of your medical insurance premiums up to the maximum of \$150 even though your other medical expenses do not exceed the 3 percent income limitation. However, to take this deduction you must itemize all your other deductions such as taxes, contributions, and interest expenses. You can't deduct your medical insurance premiums if you take the standard deduction.

Q. My brother and I provide over half our mother's support. Who gets to claim her?

A. If each of you contributed over 10 percent of your mother's support and the combined total adds up to over half of her total support then either of you may claim her as a dependent. A special declaration must be completed by the one not claiming the exemption and sent in with the return of the one who claims the exemption. Form 2120, Multiple Support Declaration, is the one to use.

Q. I just filed my 1968 return. What records should I keep in case I'm audited?

A. Keep whatever you need to substantiate the income and deductions on your return. Cancelled checks, paid bills, forms W-2 and 1099, bank books and similar records will be helpful.

Q. If I send in my return now, how long will it take to get my refund?

A. Accurate and complete returns are normally processed and the refund issued within five or six weeks.

Q. Do you have anything that explains how a small businessman should handle depreciation of tools and facilities?

A. Depreciation is covered in our publication "Tax Guide For Small Business." It is available at IRS offices for 50 cents.

Q. My son is going to school under the G.I. Bill. Will those benefits lose us the exemption we take for him?

A. Benefits received by your son under the G.I. Bill have to be included as part of his support. Determine his total support requirement for the year and if you provided more than half of this then you are still entitled to claim him as long as the other dependency tests are met.

C. Check your 1040 instructions for further details.

Q. Is alimony considered taxable income?

A. Yes, alimony is taxable income to the recipient and should
