PREGLED NAJAVAŽNEJŠIH DOGODKOV

Politična kriza v Panami — Zaenkrat na vrhu gen. Noriega — ZDA podpirajo predsednika Erica Artura Delvalleja

PANAMA CITY, Pan. — Včeraj je panamski predsednik Eric Arturo Delvalle zahotel od gen. Manuela Antonia Noriege, poveljnika panamske vojske in dejanskega političnega voditelja države, da poda ostavko. Noriega je bil obtožen od nekega ameriškega sodišča, da je sodeloval z mednarodno mrežo trgovcev z mamili in sicer tako, da je tem trgovcem nudil zatočišče v Panami. Poleg tega je avtoritarni režim v Panami, ki ga vodi Noriega, zelo nepopularen. Predsednik Delvalle po panamski ustavi nima dosti moči in je sam bil izvoljen ob Noriegovi podpori, računa pa na podporo domače opozicije in še posebej ZDA.

Gen. Noriega pa ni pripravljen popustiti in so njegovi vojaki sinoči obkolili Delvallejevo rezidenco. Panamski parlament je na sinočnjem zasedanju odstranil Delvalleja, ki pa danes zjutraj trdi, da je bila akcija proti ustavna, neveljavna in da je še vedno predsednik Paname. Reaganova administracija deluje v prid odstranitve Noriege in so imeli ameriški diplomati v Panami stike z Delvallejem.

Delvalle je imenoval polk. Marcosa Justinesa za novega poveljnika vojske, ta pa je imenovanje odklonil. Vojaške in policijske enote so ukrepile zoper demonstrante, ki so podpirali Delvallejevo akcijo. Parlament je tudi odstranil podpredsednika Rodericka Esquivela, imenoval za novega predsednika države pa dosedanjega pravosodnega ministra.

Opazovalci panamskih razmer menijo, da more Noriega še vedno računati na podporo vojske, kar je odločilno. Poudarjajo pa, da dolgoročno gledano nima Noriega rožnate bodočnosti. Med drugim je pričakovati, da bodo ZDA podvzete razne gospodarske ukrepe zoper Panamo in skušale preko gospodarskega pritiska izsiliti generalov odhod. Panama je zelo pomembna za ZDA zaradi strateške važnosti panamskega prekopa, ki bo tekom nekaj let popolnoma v panamskih rokah oz. kontroli.

Reagan dvomi o možnosti novega jedrskega sporazuma z ZSSR do pomlad — Sovjeti bodo najbrž res zapustili Afganistan

WASHINGTON, D.C. — V včerajšnjem intervjuju za *Washington Post*, je predsednik Reagan izrazil dvom o tem, da bo mogoče v naslednjih mesecih doseči nov sporazum s Sovjetsko zvezo o omejitvi oboroževalne tekme na področju strateškega jedrskega orožja. Tako po Reagangu ni pričakovati, da bo mogel podpisati novo pogodbo skupaj s sovjetskim voditeljem Mihailom Gorbačovom, ko bo predsednik na obisku v ZSSR letos pomladi. Ako pa bo ostala dobra volja na obeh straneh, bo mogoče tak sporazum doseči in tudi podpisati pred 20. januarjem, ko bo Reagan zapustil Belo hišo.

V intervjuju je Reagan rekel tudi, da Gorbačova verjame, ko trdi, da želijo Sovjeti umakniti svoje vojaške enote iz Afganistana in da bo do tega umika tudi prišlo.

George P. Shultz na obisku v Izraelu — Predložil bo mirovni načrt — Izgledi za najnovejši poskus posredovanja niso dobri

JERUZALEM, Izr. — Državni sekretar George P. Shultz je priproval v Izrael, da bi izraelski vlad predložil načrt, katerega namen je doseči mir med Izraelom, Palestinci in sosednjimi arabskimi državami. Podrob-

nosti načrta so še vedno tajne, vendar po dobro obveščenih virih predvideva skorajšna pogajanja med predstavniki Izraela, Palestincev, in nekaterih arabskih držav o bodočnosti od Izraela zasedenih krajev Zahodnega brega in Gaze. Shultz je rekel, da je načrt celovit in ga ni pripravljen spremeniti. Poleg Izraelcev, je Shultz pripravljen obiskati Egipt, Jordanijo in Sirijo, da bi voditelje teh držav prepričal o načrtu.

Palestinci in tudi arabske države so skepsični do Shultzovega posredovanja. Menijo, da želi Shultz le pomiriti Palestine, ki že več kot dva meseca demonstrirajo proti izraelskim zasedbenim enotam. Palestinci pravijo, da bodo demonstracije še obsežnejše za časa Shultovega obiska, da bo Reaganova administracija razumela, kako globoko je palestinsko nezadovoljstvo s sedanjim stanjem v zasedenih krajih. V zadnjih dneh so izraelski vojaki zopet streljali na demonstrante in jih nekaj ubili, več pa ranili. V demonstracijah, ki trajajo vse od 8. decembra lani, je bilo ubitih 65 Palestinev, v večini mladincev starih do 21 let, v vseh izgredih pa še ni padel noben izraelski vojak ali civilist.

Množične nacionalistične demonstracije v sovjetski Armeniji — Vojaške enote poslane v nemirne kraje — Nekaj »človeških žrtev«

MOSKVA, ZSSR — Dvoma ne more biti več, da je prišlo v sovjetski družbi do velikih premikov po prihodu na oblast Mihaila Gorbačova. V raznih krajih in koncih ZSSR so bile nacionalistične demonstracije. Tako v baltskih republikah — zadnje dni npr. v Estoniji —, v Centralni Aziji, krimski Tatari so celo demonstrirali v Moskvi sami, ta teden pa v sovjetski Armeniji. Poročila, ki prihajajo iz Moskve in Jerevana, armenskega glavnega mesta, govorijo o množičnih demonstracijah v zadnjih dneh, v katerih naj bi sodelovalo do milijona Armencev. Razmere so dovolj resne, da je vladajoči politbiro poslal svojega člena Vladimirja Dolgiha v Jerevan. Dolgih je baje govoril po televiziji in priznal, da je med demonstracijami in celo izgredi prišlo do »človeških žrtev«.

Armenci zahtevajo priključitev armenski republike kraja Nagorno-Karabakh, ki je sedaj del sosednje azerbaidžanske republike. Ako so vesti o milijonu demonstrantov točne, gre najbrž za največje nedovoljene demonstracije v vsej sovjetski zgodovini.

Kratke vesti —

Miami, Fla. — Dva vodilna člana kampanjske organizacije Roberta Dolea sta bila odpuščena, ker nista soglašala z vodjo kampanje Williamom Brockom. Splošno mnenje političnih analitikov je, da je Doleova kampanja zelo slabo organizirana in neenotna, kampanjska organizacija Georgea Busha pa je v tem oziru odlična. Ankete javnega mnenja kažejo, da ima Bush prednost pred Doleom v državah, v katerih bodo primarne volitve 8. marca. Med demokrati pa ima vsaj trenutno prednost guverner Michael Dukakis, kong. Richard Gephardt pa močno nazaduje. Primarne volitve bodo v glavnem v južnih državah, zato se bo zaradi skoro stodostotne podpore črnskih volivcev zelo izkazal med demokrati Jesse Jackson.

Washington, D.C. — Podatki o ameriškem gospodarstvu v zadnjem četrletju 1987, ki jih je včeraj objavila zvezna vlada, kažejo, da je bila ekonomija dokaj močna. Nekateri gospodarski analitiki namreč že nekaj časa napovedujejo začetek gospodarskega zastoja, zato so podatki presenetljivi.

Človekova pravica do svobode

V Benetkah na otoku Sv. Jurija je bilo od 3. do 6. februarja mednarodno srečanje na skupno temo »Človekove pravice in verske svoboščine v Evropi in v duhu Helsinške listine«. Udeležili so se srečanja zastopniki iz 35 držav. Bili so diplomati, univerzitetni profesorji, časnikarji, med temi odgovorni urednik »Družine« dr. D. Klemenčič, škofje, med njimi ljubljanski nadškof Šuštar, rektor papeške lateinske univerze v Rimu Rossane, pomožni rimski škof Riva. Družba je bila torej zelo pisana, saj so sodelovali udeleženci iz vzhodne in zahodne Evrope. Iz Jugoslavije ni bilo uradne delegacije, pač pa so prišli poleg dr. Šuštarja in dr. Klemenčiča še pesnik in politik Cyril Zlobec, iz Zagreba pa trije univerzitetni profesorji; iz Beograda je prišel Milovan Djilas, znani oporečnik in pisatelj, ki je bil že ponovno zaprt.

V Helsinkih so pred nekaj leti zastopniki vseh evropskih držav, z izjemo Albanije, na posebni konferenci za mir v Evropi potrdili sedanje državne meje v Evropi in se obvezali, da bodo spoštovali osnovne človekove pravice, ki so končno temelj za mir med državami in v državah samih, saj kjer se teptajo človekove pravice, je vedno nevarnost za bolj ali manj krvave revolucije.

Razprave so bile zelo živahne in so potekale v glavnem v soočanju med zastopniki vzhodnih in zahodnih držav. Zahodnjaki so očitali Sovjetom in drugim vzhodnjakom, da niso še uresničili osnovnih človekovih pravic, kot so pravica svobodnega izražanja misli v pisani in govorjeni besedi, svobode do združevanja in zlasti ne svobode na verskem področju. Sovjeti pa so očitali zahodnjakom, da niso uresničili osnovne pravice do dela, saj imajo nad 12 milijonov brezposelnih. Na druge strani so zastopniki Moskve sprejemali kritike, da pri njih niso še uresničene razne temeljne svoboščine, da so bile v preteklosti teptane in v praksi zanikane, toda da so sedaj s »perestrojko« nastopili novi časi, ki obetajo boljšo prihodnost tudi glede človekovih pravic. Razprave in debate so bile res živahne, toda na dostojni akademski ravni. Posebno tretji dan, ko je bila okrogla miza, so se prijavili k besedi tako številni, da vsi niso mogli priti na vrsto. Nadškof Šuštar, ki je vodil razpravo, je imel dokaj dela, da je vse zadovoljil; on sam, ki je tudi imel pripravljen referat, ga je rajši umaknil, da je dal drugim besedo.

Jugoslovanski govorniki

Med jugoslovanskimi delegati so dobili besedo dr. Drago Klemenčič, Ciril Zlobec ter zagrebški profesor dr. Zvonimir Šeparović. Ta se je odločno zavzel za pravice nerojenih otrok, ki so žrtve zlorabe moči s strani družine in države. »Nerojeni otrok je najbolj nezaščiteni človeško bitje na svetu,« je dejal. »Pravice nerojenega otroka niso bile oblikovane, nihče mu jih ne zagotavlja; nerojeni otroci so najbolj nesrečne in najbolj množične žrtve« (Družina). JOŽE MELAHER — 75-letnik

CLEVELAND, O. - Živahan in gotov je njegov korak, ko hiti po St. Clair Avenue v tiskarno Ameriške Domovine ali v Baragov dom, kjer opravlja večji del svojih javnih poslov. Le kdo bi Jožetu prisodil pri njegovi živahnosti in prožnosti 75 let? In vendar jih je danes dopolnil.

Jože Melaher se je rodil 26. februarja 1913 v Pobrežju pri Mariboru očetu Leopoldu in materi Apoloniji. Po osnovni šoli je uspešno končal štiri razrede gimnazije in trgovski tečaj, odslužil vojaško dolžnost, nato pa se posvetil delu v zadrugi v domačem Pobrežju. Vključil se je v narodno-politično delo v okviru Slovenske ljudske stranke in hodil govorit na sestanke in shode po okolici Maribora in po naseljih Slovenskih goric. Delal je tudi v strankinem tajništvu v Mariboru, ki ga je vodil poslanec Marko Kranjc. Postopno je postal Jože njegov namestnik.

Ko je Nemčija marca 1938 zasedla Avstrijo in jo vključila v Tretji Reich, je položaj na severni meji Jugoslavije postal vedno nevarnejši, napetost je rastla iz meseca v mesec. Jože Melaher je z drugimi rojaki pazljivo spremljal razvoj in se pripravljal na nevarni čas, o katerem smo vsi vedeli, da naglo prihaja. Na Cvetno nedeljo 6. aprila 1941 je počelo, nemške čete so vdrle v Jugoslavijo in skoro zasedle večji del Slovenije. Po spiskih, ki jih je sestavila nemška »petra kolona« že davno pred nemškim vdorom v Jugoslavijo, je Gestapo začel zapirati narodno zavedne slovenske ljudi in jih pošiljati v nemška koncentracijska taborišča ali pa jih seliti v Srbijo. Führer je ukazal svojim valptom, da morajo slovensko Štajersko »zopet napraviti nemško«.

Vedno buden je Jože Melaher ušel arretaciji in postal »skrivač«. Gestapo je prijel njegovo ženo in jo zaprl v zloglasno ječo Pisker v Celju. Nemci so Jožeta na vsak način hoteli dobiti v roke, pa se jim

so to bile pogumne trditve na takem mednarodnem srečanju.

Poseg Cirila Zlobca

Zanimiv je bil tudi poseg Cirila Zlobca. Primorski dnevnik ga je objavil v celoti. Zlobec izhaja iz ugotovitve, da sta marksizem in krščanstvo dva miselna sistema, ki se med seboj izključuje na idejni ravni. Eden trdi, »da je religija človeška zabloda, plod zaostalosti in jo je mogoče in treba odpraviti z znanstveno razlagom sveta in življenja«. Religije pa vse, brez izjeme, zlasti še krščanstvo, učijo, da je človek duhovno bitje z večnimi razsežnostmi. Teoretično so si torej religije in marksizem, posebej še krščanstvo, diametralno nasproti.

Drugo dejstvo je, da sta tako marksizem-leninizem kot krščanstvo dve univerzalistični ideologiji, zaobjemata celotnega človeka in celotno človeško družbo. Oba sistema v današnjem svetu soobstajata. Marksizem-leninizem sicer skuša religijo s silo odpraviti tam, kjer je na oblasti. Toda mu ne uspeva, religija živi tudi tam, kjer jo partie na oblasti preganjajo. »Pri dosledni uveljavitvi enega (marksističnega) in drugega stališča (krščanskega) je prepad v družbi neizogiven, negativna polarizacija (razkol med partijci in nepartijci) pa nujno zmanjšuje možnost uveljavljanja vsaj nekaterih človekovih pravic, ki jih je Helsinski listina še posebej poudarila.« Tako C. Zlobec. Kaj storiti?

Zlobec v praksi velik premik pri marksizmu in pri Cerkvi glede medsebojnih odnosov, saj v idejnem pogledu,

dobil zapositev v znani restavraciji Rohr v središču mesta. Začel je s pospravljanjem posode z miz, končal pa po več kot 20 letih kot upravnik te restavracije. Ko je ovdovela lastnica restavracijo prodala, je Jože Melaher skupno z zanim rojakom Jožetom Grdinom kupil Belajevo trgovino na St. Clair Avenue in jo po izplačilu Jožeta Grdine vodil skupno s svojo ženo do pred nekaj leti, ko je stopil v pokoj.

Ko se je Jože Melaher v novih razmerah malo razgledal, se je znova vključil v narodno-politično delo. Od vsega začetka je zbiral okoli sebe svoje nekdanje vojake in druge slovenske Štajerce. Bil je ožji sodelavec pokojnega dr. Mihe Kreka, bil kot tak izvoljen za glavnega tajnika Slovenske krščanske demokracije (SLS) in za člana Narodnega odbora za Slovenijo. To narodno odgovornost je nosil kljub temu, da je bil močno zaposlen tudi z urejanjem Amerikanskega Slovenca, uradnega glasila KSKJ, najprej kot urednik njegovega slovenskega dela, nato pa nekaj časa tudi angleškega. Slovenski del še vedno urejuje, poleg tega pa vodi Slovensko pisarno v Baragovem domu, oporavlja tajniške posle Baragovega doma in je duša vsega dela Slovenske krščanske demokracije v Clevelandu. Kot tak vzdržuje redne stike z izvoljenimi političnimi vodniki v Clevelandu, v Ohiju in Washingtonu, pa tudi z narodnostnimi skupinami v Clevelandu, s katerimi se dogovarja o skupnih nastopih proti komunističnemu nasilju v Srednji in Vzhodni Evropi, zlasti pa v Sloveniji.

Več let je bil Jože Melaher tudi tajnik Zveze slovenskih protikomunističnih borcev, pri tem je tesno sodeloval s pokojnim Karлом Mauserjem, ki je bil predsednik ZSPB. S to organizacijo Jože še vedno vneto sodeluje.

Z ženo Marijo in s hčerkjo gdč. Tino živi Jože Melaher sredi slovenske senkerske naselbine, starejši hčerki Majda in Marta pa sta poročeni. Od svojega prihoda v Cleveland je Jože Melaher s svojo družino dejaven član farne skupnosti Sv. Vida.

Jožetu Melaherju k njegovi 75-letnici prijatelji prisrčno čestitamo in mu želimo, da bi ostal še dolgo zdrav, živahen in podjeten, da bi mogel nadaljevati svoje zasluzno narodno-politično delo, ki ga tako vestno in pozrtvovalno opravlja že toliko let.

»Prisega ob polnoči«**Po sledovih živega srebra**

Decembra lani sta se koprška škofa Pirih in Jenko odzvala povabilu predsednice skupščine občine Idrije, Ivice Kavčič, da si ogledata svetovno znano rudišče živega srebra. V podzemeljske rove sta se spustila v spremstvu generalnega vikarja Renata Podberšiča, idrijskega dekana Stanka Medveščka, predsednika občinske Komisije za odnose z verskimi skupnostmi Jurija Kleindiensta, predsednika OK SZDL Zorka Velikanteja, dipl. inž. geologije Bojana Ržuna ter dolgoletnega rudarskega nadzornika Milana Strausa.

Ob vhodu v rudnik so škofa s spremstvom prijazno sprejeli predstavniki idrijskega družbenopolitičnega življenja na čelu z geologom Ržunom, ki je prevzel strokovno vodstvo obiska. Ob vstopu v rove se je bilo treba »preleviti« v rudarje — s posebno delavsko obleko, usnjennim pasom, čelado, svetilko, škornji ter s podpisom, na lastno odgovornost »romajo po rudniških rovih« idrijskega podzemlja.

To je torej rudnik, ki slovi po kvaliteti živega srebra ter spada med najstarejše rudnike te vrste na svetu! Skoraj pet stoletij je od tod nenehno odtekalo bogastvo predvsem drugam. Ržun je pojasnil: jama z jaškom »Delo«, jama z jaškom »Borba«, rudarska dela na prostornini 1500x500 ali 80 ha, na podzemskih prostorih petnajstih obzorij, ob vstopu v rudnik je nadmorska višina 348 m, najniže odprto obzorje je —6,45 m pod morško gladino, najnišja točka je

—35 m.

Ržun, prijazen in zgovoren geolog Zagorjan (v letu 1981 je v svoji diplomske nalogi opozarjal na plaz v Zagorju!) razkriva skrivnost svet idrijskega rudnika. Govori iz spomina, iz strokovne razgledanosti, iz izkustva. Od škafarja, ki je prvi našel samorodno živo srebro v karbonskem skrilavcu, nekje na območju današnje cerkve Sv. Trojice, do sedanje »živosrebrne krize« v svetu in pri nas.

Z doslej pridobljenim živim srebrom v Idriji bi lahko naplnili dva olimpijska plavalna bazena (25x50 m), globoka 3,11 m. Živosrebrna ruda je bila v glavnem v območju nad Prontom, Smukovim gričem in Kalvinom do Likarce (površina ca 350.000 m²). Za nami je petstoletno izkoriščanje idrijskega rudnika. Že sredi 18. stoletja so napovedovali, da bo rudnik »živelk« le še 150 let, torej do leta 1920. V letu 1936 so videli perspektivo rudnika še za nadaljnjih dvajset let.

Narava je nepredvidljiva! Še vedno je rudnik Idrija edini aktivni rudnik živega srebra v Jugoslaviji, največji na Balkanu ter glede na proizvodnjo četrti v Evropi za Almadenom, Monte Amiato in Nikitovsko. Tako je govoril inž. Mlakar na svetovnem kongresu o živem srebru v Barceloni (1974). Tu je poudaril:

»Podoba je, da preživljamo zadnja desetletja najlepšega obdobja v zgodovini človeštva. Na obzoru so poleg energetske krize, ki je že nastopila, še kriza pomanjkanja mineralnih surovin, da o problemih prenaseljenosti, onesnaženja okolja, prehrane... sploh ne govorimo. Kriza mineralnih surovin bo nedvomno zajela tudi živo srebro...«

Doslej je človeštvo pridobilo okrog 800.000 ton živega srebra in od tega 13,12 odstotkov v Idriji.

Idrijski rudnik je v zadnji fazi dokončnega zapiranja. Cena živega srebra je na svetovnem tržišču silno nizka — daleč pod ceno proizvodnih stroškov. Osnovni razlog je zastrupljanje okolja te kovine v zadnjem desetletju. Vendar inž. Mlakar pravi, da je »gona proti živemu srebru v zadnjih letih naredila več škode kot živo srebro samo; kopijoči se podatki, da živo srebro pri razumni uporabi in ustreznih ukrepov ni nič bolj strupeno od ostalih metalov.«

Še petnajst let — in idrijski rudnik bo zapečaten! Po polstoletnem izkoriščanju. Postopoma ga bodo zapirali, rove bodo zalili z vodo, na razne neoporečne načine zavarovali kraj pred sesedanjem zemlje in plazi. Ostal bo le še spomin,

kako bogato nas je obdarovala ta narava: 250 ton živega srebra (1509 do 1520), 7084 ton (1961 do 1973)...

Skoraj v vsej zgodovini so ga drugi izrabljali. Nekoč je deželník knez oddajal rudnik v najem raznim denarnim mogotcem, ki so imeli izključno pravico do celotne proizvodnje. V osemnajstem stoletju so živo srebro kupovali Španci; takrat je bilo nad 1000 rudarjev (Italijani, Nemci, Čehi, Poljaki, Hrvati in domačini). V Napoleonovem času je bil rudnik njegova osebna last, ko pa je odšel, je s svojimi vojaki pobral iz skladischa 16.000 stotov živega srebra in nad 300 stotov cinobra. Še pred desetimi leti je imel rudnik okrog 1000 zaposlenih, sedaj je od vseh skupaj le 200 delavev, od teh pa morda blizu 30 čistih rudarjev.

Izletniški sprehod po rudniških rovih se je iztekel. Svet nad rovi se nam je zdel toliko bolj očarljiv. Geolog Ržun nas je povedel še v hišo, kjer hrani vzorce rudnin ter geološke karte. Prijazno nas je tu sprejel namestnik direktorja Cigale. Mnogo zanimivosti sta odkrivala ob risbah, ki v potankosti ponazarjajo celoten kompleks rudnika, o nevarnih območjih, nekdajnih rovih, o proizvodnji nekoč in danes.

Vse na tem svetu ugaša. Nekoč bodo bajali o legendarnih idrijskih rudarjih. Ko živosrebrnega rudnika ne bo več! Kar kor se današnji le še spominjam idrijskih rudarjev, ki jim je življenje bilo tesno povezano s Cerkvio.

Že v šestnajstem stoletju so si postavili leseno cerkev Svetega Duha, ki so jo pozneje preimenovali v cerkev Svetе Trojice. Konec 17. stoletja so si zgradili cerkev sv. Barbare. Na hribu nad naseljem so si postavili leseno kapelico sv. Antona Padovanskega; svetnika so si izbrali za zavetnika zoper nezgode. V rovih so si postavili rudniško kapelo z oltarjem Svetе Trojice; tu so pred delom molili za varnost.

Mnoge procesije so imeli v teku cerkvenega leta — k rudarskim zavetnikom (sv. Ahačij, sv. Barbara, Sveti Trojica, sv. Anton). V rudarski čakalnici »pri Kajzer« je bilo nekoč razpelo, dve nabožni sliki in cesarjeva slika. Poseben rov se je imenoval »sv. Terezija«, z njeno sliko. Pri božjem grobu v cerkvi sv. Barbare so v svetem tridnevju rudarji in gasilci v svojih uniformah imeli častno stražo. Vse to je v povojnih letih — moralno izginiti.

Lep dan se je iztekel. Odričemo na globoko v skrivnost svetega v življenju, da bi čim manj o njem bajali.

Fort Dauphin na Madagaskaru 16. nov. 1987 pisala MZA sodelavki v domovino:

»Vzrok, da malo pišem, je v tem, da ne pridev nikamor s časom. Čez dan sploh ne pridev do pisanja, celo za uradna pisma ne. So pa dnevi, ko sem tako zaspala, da ne morem nič. Včasih moramo ponobi vstati kar do 10-krat in če pomislil, da grem k počitku okrog enajste ure, si lahko misliš, da ne spim preveč. S. Jožefa ne spi cele noči in me včasih kliče vsake pol ure. N obenno sredstvo ji ne pomaga za spanje, je res uboga.

Od 7. oktobra, so sem dela la tu duhovne vaje, sem v se meniču. Imamo tu sedaj 13

sestric. Za prvo zaobljubo se pripravlja sedem sester. Pri spevek, ki ga dobimo za sestre in za duhovne vaje sester je že leta isti, potem ko so se stroški povečali povečini za 100% ali še več...«

Lazarist Janez Smolič je bil zadnji v Družbi, ki je takoj po vojni prejel mašniško posvečenje v domovini. Posvetil ga je mariborski škof, ker v Ljubljani škof takrat ni bilo. 42 let je služil Bogu, 36 izven Slovenije v diaspori. Dne 5. januarja 1988 je bil pokopan na Čukarici. R.I.P.

Človekova pravica do svobode

tj. kot miselna sistema, ostajata marksizem-leninizem ter krščanstvo nezdružljiva. Ali je resničen eden ali drugi. Ker sta oba prisotna v sedanji družbi in ker eden ne more izriniti drugega, zato meni Zlobec, je treba sprejeti »element človeške narave in življenja: r a z l i c n o s t«. Cerkev naj torej sprejme sekularizacijo sedanje družbe, marksizem pa religijo kot stvarnost, kot dejstvo, prisotno tudi v sekularizirani socialistični družbi.

Kot praktičen zgled razvoja navaja Zlobec sedanjo jugoslovansko in posebej slovensko družbo. Zveza komunistov Slovenije je na predzadnjem kongresu (1982) zapisala: »...komunisti zavračamo vsako prizadevanje, ki bi skušalo postaviti religijo nasproti socializmu in socialismu na sproti religiji«. O sedanji jugoslovanski družbi pa pravi: »Približno polovica ljudi se svobodno opredeljuje za takšno ali drugačno vernost, druga polovica pa ostaja laična ali pa se prav tako svobodno opredeljuje za ateizem; ta je vse manj militanten (tj. sovražen do religije), vse manj uperen proti Bogu in vse bolj neutralno zasidran v svetu brez Boga.«

Potem še pove: »Glede na politično prakso v Jugoslaviji vsaj do zadnjega desetletja bi mogli reči, da marksizem religije ne izloča več iz družbe, je pa tudi še ne vključuje vanjo, sprejema pa veruje. Prav tako Cerkev: marksizem na oblasti sprejema kot realnost, ne more ali ne želi se pa sprizazniti z njegovo izključno zemeljsko usmerjenostjo.«

Nekaj pripombe

1. Ciril Zlobec pravilno ugotavlja, da sta marksizem in krščanstvo na filozofski ravni nezdružljiva. A so še drugi filozofski sistemi, ki so nezdružljivi s krščanstvom. Torej nič posebnega.

2. Cerkev ni vezana na noben režim, na nobeno politično in socialno ureditev; zahteva pa zase svobodo, da lahko neovirano oznanja evangelij. »Obsoja pa tiste oblike državnih ureditev, ki ovirajo državljanovo ali versko svobodo, množijo žrtve strasti in političnih zločinov in ki oblast, namesto da bi služila javni blaginji, obračajo v korist določene stranke ali celo oblastnikov samih,« je zapisano v konstituciji Gaudium et spes, št. 73. Cerkev torej zavrača dikture.

3. »Ta vatikanski cerkveni zbor izjavlja, da ima človeška oseba pravico do verske svobode. Ta svoboda je v tem, da morajo biti vsi ljudje prosti od siljenja tako s strani posameznikov kakor tudi s strani družbenih skupnosti (npr. partije) in katere koli človeške oblasti (režima)« (Dignitatis humanae, št. 2).

4. Cerkev se bori za enako dostojanstvo in za enake pravice vseh ljudi, ker je vsak človek oseba. V Jugoslaviji pa C. Zlobec priznava, da marksizem tj. partija, veruje »sprejema«, je do njih strpna, niso pa enakopravni državljanji, saj veren državljan ne more postati član Zveze komunistov. To pa je »avantgarda«, se pravi, da ima vso oblast v svojih rokah.

Demokratični razvoj jugoslovanske družbe je torej še vedno na pol poti. Želeti je le, da bi prehodila še ostali del in da bi z novo ustavo ne šli nazaj glede demokratičnih svoboščin namesto naprej.



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
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Economy On The Critical List

The early warning signs of a recession are now arriving with greater magnitude and frequency.

The current condition of the economy was well summarized in the fourth quarter statistics for the Gross National Product (GNP). The economy produced enough goods and services to support the reported 4.2% growth rate, but as revealed by a \$58.3 billion increase in business inventories, much of what was produced remained unsold.

Consumer and business demand was anemic; final sales (GNP less business inventory investment) increased a paltry 0.6%. Excluding the purchase of farm products by the government's Commodity Credit Corporation, final sales fell 1.4%.

The only positive element in the report was the \$7.7 billion reduction in the U.S. trade deficit. Regrettably, the export sector is not large enough to single-handedly offset the weakness that exists in the other sectors of the economy. Given the current imbalance between production and demand, it is only a matter of time before production is cut back, employment is curtailed, and the recession is underway.

The Fed To The Rescue?

The spate of weak economic indicators has not gone unnoticed by the officials at the Federal Reserve, who are mandated to strive for full employment and sustained economic growth in the economy. With production cutbacks looming on the horizon, an easier monetary policy would seem to be in order. However, the Fed is also pledged to maintain stable prices and equilibrium in the foreign exchange value of the dollar.

This is where the problem lies. Should the Fed ease to counter the threat of rising

unemployment and a possible economic downturn, they run the risk of raising price levels and weakening the dollar.

Many Fed Watchers believe the Fed will elect to reduce bank reserve pressures and push interest rates lower. However, should the Fed decide to ease, it would be too late to prevent a recession from occurring in the next several months.

The chart illustrates how past recessions have been preceded by a prolonged decline in the growth rate of the money supply. This phenomenon is occurring again, and is one of the arguments for a recession this year.

In order to avert a recession in 1988, the Fed would have had to ease in 1987.

However, in 1987 the Fed was preoccupied with supporting the exchange value of the dollar and was not overly concerned about the 1988 economic outlook, which at the time was fairly optimistic. To support the dollar, the Fed pursued a restrictive policy that resulted in a meager 2.6% increase in the money supply (M2).

Now that the economic outlook has turned gloomy, the call for Fed easing can be heard from Wall Street to Washington. Unfortunately, no matter what the Fed decides to do, it will be too little too late.

Lokar Selling L&M

Mr. John Lokar, proprietor of L & M Tobacco and Candy Co. on E. 185 St., Cleveland is on the verge of selling the business. It is the only Slovenian owned candy and tobacco company in the United States.

Mr. Lokar was secretary to Senator Frank J. Lausche while he served as Governor of Ohio.

It certainly would be great to see a Slovenian owner step in and continue in the same great tradition that Mr. Lokar has for the past 43 years.

Incidentally, the majority of L and M's accounts include many Slovenian businesses.

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

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How Successful is Cataract Surgery?

Question: My mother's sight is slowly getting worse because of cataracts. Her doctor says she will need cataract surgery soon, and she's worried about it. How successful is this surgery?

Answer: It is only natural for your mother to be concerned about undergoing cataract surgery. But rest assured. If there are no other eye problems, cataract surgery restores perfect or near-perfect vision in more than 95 percent of cases.

A cataract is clouding of the lens inside the eye. Normally this lens is clear and focuses light on the retina, where visual images are formed. When a cataract develops, light cannot pass freely through the lens, and objects may appear blurred or distorted. Cataracts tends to get progressively worse, but not always to the point that surgery is needed. Surgery is performed when a patient can no longer engage in the ac-

tivities he feels are necessary for a normal, satisfying life. In rare cases, cataracts are removed because they are causing inflammation or pressure in the eye.

Cataract surgery is routinely performed on an outpatient basis. During the same operation, the eye surgeon usually places an artificial lens implant in the eye to replace the natural lens. This allows the patient to have normal vision without thick "cataract glasses" or a contact lens.

Cataract surgery is painless, and the minimal discomfort patients feel for a day after surgery can generally be relieved with over-the-counter medications. For several weeks, patients must avoid strenuous activities. However, most patients may resume normal activities, within reasonable limits, starting the day after surgery.



The Cleveland Catholic newspaper, "Universe Bulletin" on December 18 printed a picture of a well known Slovenian intellectual translating for Dr. Zdenko Roter, of Ljubljana, Slovenia who was quoted as saying, "In western Yugoslavia the average Christian is open to Christian-Marxist dialog."

People who were involved in the revolution in Yugoslavia during the Second World War and after, often recall Dr. Roter's role as prosecutor against Slovenian Catholic prelates who ended up serving years in Communist prisons.

Those Catholics who believe mistakenly that they can work for social justice while espousing Marxist ideology come in for some stern lecturing from Toronto's new Archbishop Aloysius Ambrozic who says, "It can't be done because Marxism calls for a denial of God." — might makes right. Oh brother, George Orwell you were right. How quickly we forget the humiliation of being treated as second class citizens in the hope of picking up scraps of crumbs thrown on the floor by the blue bloods. It all has the aroma of a barrel of

dead fish being dried in the noon-day sun. Nice try, folks, but no cigar. The Press would have known who Frank J. Lausche was — the greatest nationality leader of all time. He has class and would never stoop to groveling for the limelight.

Migraines

To most people a migraine is a severe headache that demands rest, and sometimes medication, for recovery. Yet, physicians maintain this definition is a misconception. Medically, migraines refer to a group of headache disorders that range from mild to severe discomfort.

Migraines are a result of the contraction followed by rapid expansion of blood vessels in the brain. The physical change in these vessels does not in itself cause pain; rather biochemicals released into the bloodstream during the onset of a migraine sensitize the vessels, causing pain when the vessels expand.

Pain is the most obvious symptom to the migraine sufferer, but a classic migraine often includes neurological symptoms as well. Vision distortion, numbness and tingling commonly accompany a migraine. Most of these

symptoms do not result in lasting effects; however, permanent injury is known to occur in the back of the eye and to the nervous system. Prevention is therefore considered to be important.

The frequency of migraine headaches varies from patient to patient. More than one-half of patients have one to four attacks per month, and 15 percent may have up to ten attacks per month. Migraines occur during the day or at night. They may be precipitated by an afternoon nap, and are said to increase on weekends or vacations.

While much has been written of the neurotic personality as an important trait of the migraine sufferer, many doctors question this observation. It may be that the data are reflective of patients who choose to see a doctor and not an overall picture of the migraine patient.

Lasar treatment for endometriosis

I have got endometriosis, and my doctor advises me to take hormones. But I've heard about a new laser treatment. Can you tell me more about it?

Endometriosis is a gynecologic disorder that causes cells from the uterine lining to grow in other areas of the body, such as the ovaries or pelvic cavity. It occurs in about 10 percent of the women in this country and can cause painful menstruation, abnormal bleeding and infertility.

In the past, major surgery or drug therapy was usually required to treat endometriosis. Now through the use of an instrument called the argon laser laproscope, women such as yourself have a more conservative option for treatment.

This surgical procedure involves directing the laser beam through the laproscope, which is inserted under the woman's naval. The laser vaporizes the uterine cells that have grown abnormally on the ovaries or in the pelvic cavity. The procedure can be performed on an outpatient basis, and recovery takes only three to five days.

Seventy-five percent of women with endometriosis are candidates for laser surgery. Women who are not can-

dicates include those who have large ovarian cysts with endometriosis or severe adhesions.

Approximately 50 percent of women undergoing laser treatment for endometriosis will be able to become pregnant within six months. Painful menstruation and abnormal bleeding are relieved in a majority of cases.

I suggest that you ask your gynecologist if you are a candidate for laser treatment of your endometriosis.

Violin Virtuoso Miha Pogačnik Returns

Slovenian-born violin virtuoso Miha Pogačnik, who delighted many local Slovenes with his appearance last year, will again perform in concert in Cleveland. He will appear this coming Monday evening, February 29, in the Pavilion Hall of the Cleveland Institute of Music, 11021 East Blvd., in the University Circle area, near Severance Hall and the Cleveland Museum of Art. The concert will begin at 8 p.m. and there is no admission charge.

Pogačnik's appearance is sponsored by Cleveland State University and the Institute of Music. The violinist will again be accompanied by pianist Deidre Irons, who has a major reputation of her own as a soloist.

The program is an attractive one, and will include the following selections, all well-known in the established concert repertoire:

F. Schubert: Duet in A Major;

Beethoven: Sonata No. 10 in G Major, Opus 96;

Enesco: Sonata No. 3, Opus 25;

Bartok: Rhapsody No. 2 (Folk Dances).

Miha Pogačnik, who now resides in the Washington, D.C. area, is still deeply involved with his IDRIART (Institute for the Development of Intercultural Relations through the Arts) organization. Most of the proceeds from his concert tours are devoted to IDRIART, which sponsors festivals in various countries around the world. In addition to concerts, peoples of different cultures are brought together in informal surroundings, the hope being to promote understanding and thus contribute to peaceful solutions to world problems.

This year, IDRIART will hold festivals in Tbilisi, Georgia, in the Soviet Union (May 31 — June 5); Oaxaca, Mexico (June 28 — July 5); Beijing, China (July 10 — 16); Budapest, Hungary (July 20 — 24); and Bled, Slovenia (August 2 — 7). The Bled festival will also have a children's program.

Pogačnik will no doubt follow his custom of speaking during the concert about IDRIART and its goals and will invite those present to become members and even, if their schedules and resources permit, to attend one of the festivals.

Pogačnik has just completed a highly successful two-month concert tour of Europe, New Zealand and Australia. In

March he will begin another concert tour that will take him to many U.S. cities from Texas to California, and from New York to the State of Washington and across the border to Vancouver, Canada.

Slovenian-born, Miha Pogačnik received his first musical training in Yugoslavia, and also in West Germany. He first came to the United States as a Fulbright Scholar and now resides here. He performs over 100 concerts each season in recital and as soloist with orchestras on five continents. He has appeared, among many other cities, in New York, London, Paris, Berlin, Budapest and Sydney. Among international festivals, Pogačnik has appeared at the Prades Festival, Carinthian Summer, Berlin Bach Festival, Mexico City's Festival de Primavera and the Dubrovnik Festival.

Pianist Deidre Irons was born in Winnipeg, Canada, in

1945 and was a child prodigy. She decided to become a concert pianist at the ripe age of two. She studied at the University of Manitoba and the Royal Conservatory of Toronto, then continued her studies in the United States at the Curtis Institute, where world-renowned pianist Rudolf Serkin was among her teachers. Serkin asked her to participate in his festival at Marlboro, Vermont, and also to join the faculty of the Curtis Institute, where she taught for seven years.

In 1977 she moved to New Zealand and is now regarded as that country's finest pianist. In recent years she has joined with Pogačnik in pursuing the aims of IDRIART and they have made concert tours of the United States, Europe and also New Zealand and Australia.

Slovenian Golfer Hits 'Em Far and Straight

While watching the golf professional tournaments this winter keep your eye open for Slovenian golfer Richard Zokol from Vancouver, British Columbia, Canada. Although he can work the ball both ways, he normally hits it straight, and considers his strengths to be driving accuracy and ball-striking.

Even though most pro golfers do not make the final tournament cut, watch for Zokol who plans to enter the Doral Open in Florida from March 3 to 6th, and the Honda Classic March 10 to 13 and the Bay Hill Classic from March 17 to the 20th.

Zokol is a resident of Vancouver, B.C., Canada but can trace his ancestry back to the Martin Grdina family of Prevalje, Slovenia in the 1790s. His great-grandfather was Matija Grdina, older brother of Anton Grdina, famous Cleveland entrepreneur. Among Richard's other relatives in Cleveland are Joe and Tony Grdina who are the sons of the famous KSKJ super salesman Joseph Grdina, long-time residents of the St. Clair area.

Among other Slovenian residents of Greater Cleveland the family included the Vidmars, families of Nosan, Obreza, Merkun, Tominc, Plevnik, and Zalar.

Zokol began playing golf professionally in 1982, earning \$15,110 that year. His scores and earnings have increased since that time commanding a total of \$181,015 up to last year. His best finish was

fourth place in 1985 when he came in fourth in the Southwest Classic.

He says, "I've been getting more consistent, making more cuts, but I'm still looking for more high finishes. I found the first couple of years to be very difficult, but I've become more comfortable with the Tour each year."

When Richard was working on his golf game during his teenage years in his native Canada, he always kept an eye on Jim Nelford. "I didn't know him then," he says, even though they both were from the Vancouver area. "Jim was a couple of years ahead of me and he seemed to win everything. When he went on to Brigham Young University, I could see how much his game improved, so I wanted to follow in his footsteps."

When it was time for Zokol to head for college, he wrote to Karl Tucker, the golf coach, to inquire about the possibilities of going there. He told Zokol that since he didn't have a good amateur record, they couldn't offer him a scholarship.

Soon afterwards, Zokol and Nelford were competing against each other in the British Columbia Amateur and after three rounds, Zokol was leading. "We talked about it, and Jim said he would call the coach and recommended me. The next thing I know Coach Tucker said I should come down to Provo, Utah.

"The day after the tournament, I drove 24 hours straight through, and entered the school without a scholarship,

but I was there. I made the team and for three years, I roomed with Bobby Clampett."

During his senior year, Clampett left for the pro ranks, but Zokol is proud of the fact he captained the team that won the 1981 NCAA title for BYU. "It was their first ever," he said.

That fall, he qualified for the PGA Tour on his first try, turning professional right after the U.S. Amateur Championship.

He gained national attention at the 1982 Greater Milwaukee Open. He showed up the first day with a small portable tape player and headset. Between shots, he would listen to soothing music. "It helps me to relax," he explained. He continued to use it through his second year on Tour, but now

says, "It helped me get over the concentration block, but I don't need it now."

He enjoyed an especially proud moment at the 1984 Canadian Open. He tied for fifth place and that represented the best finish by a Canadian in their national championship in 26 years.

Zokol started playing golf as a 12-year-old caddy. "We lived right across the street from a golf course, and I'd caddy every weekend and also do some work in the golf shop, cleaning clubs, etc."

Richard is the son of the former Elsie Zitko born in Anox, and Joseph Zokol, D.D.S. born in Cirkje. He has a brother, Ronald, and two sisters Janet and Deborah. He married Joann Kindrachuk and they have twins Garrett and Conor, born Oct. 14, 1987.
