Angleška vlada pošlje novo svarilo Nemčiji

Zakulisna politika evropskih velesil

FRANCIJA SE NE RAZBURJA

London, 30. avg. — London je bil včeraj pozorišče mrzličnih aktivnosti. Ministrski predsednik Neville Chamberlain, zunanji minister Halifax in finančni minister Simon so se sestali na poseben seji, katere se je udeležil tudi Neville Henderson, angleški poslanik v Nemčiji, ki je bil poravn domov. Danes se bodo ponovno sestali na konferenci ministrov, ki bo morda odločila o Evropi.

Londonški tisk piše, da bo angleška vlada naslovlila novo svarilo nemški vladi. To bo vsebovalo med drugim poziv, naj Hitler poravn konflikt med češko vlado in suetskimi Nemci na mirnem način. Od Francije se pričakuje, da bo naslovlila Hitlerja z isto poslanico. Oba dokumenta sta spisana v "prijateljskem" in soglasju s pomirjevalno politiko premijera Chamberlaina. Čeprav nacistični tisk silovito napada angleškega finančnega ministra, ki je v svojem govoru izjavil, da bo v prihodnosti nemškega diktatorja, naj odneha v svoji groziji proti Češkoslovaški.

Evropska situacija je silno zažvežena in nihče ne ve, kaj se prav za prav godi za kulisami. Nekateri, ki trdijo, da imajo zadostne informacije, napovedujejo vojno, ki lahko vsak čas izbrusne. Drugi vidijo v splošni nesigurnosti le bluff angleških in nemških diplomatov.

Hugh R. Wilson, ameriški poslanik v Berlinu, in Joseph P. Kennedy, ameriški poslanik v Londonu, sta se včeraj sestala v Parizu. Bosta konferirala s W. C. Bullittom, ameriškim poslanikom v Franciji.

Pariz, 30. avg. — Kljub vojni oblaku, ki se zbirajo nad Evropo, je Francija ostala mirna. Opaziti ni nobenega znamenja, da se razburja zaradi potrditve konflikta med Nemčijo in Češkoslovaško. Na seji kabineta, ki je trajala več ur, so se razpravljali o mednarodni situaciji in narodni obrambi, toda odmevi teh razprav niso dosegli francoske javnosti.

Daladierjeva vlada opozarja, naj ne širi vesti, da je vojna v Evropi neizbežna in da mobilizacija nemške oborožene sile predstavlja nevarnost. Vlada hoče uveriti javnost, da ima Francija na svoji strani Anglijo, ki je odločno nastopila v kritičnem trenutku proti Hitlerju, a ne bo provokirala vojno.

Nacisti odgovorili katoliškemu škofu

Vlada protektira cerkvene ustanove

Berlin, 30. avg. — Minister nacistične propagande je včeraj odgovoril škofu, ki so v svojem pastirskem listu obdolžili vladne organe, da hočejo uničiti katoliške cerkve v Nemčiji.

"Vlada prispeva milijone mark katoliški cerkvi," se glasi odgovor. "Dejstvo, da je bilo pastirsko pismo prečitano v cerkvi, samo pokaže trdnost in perspektivo. Vlada ne preneha skrbeti za katoliške cerkve protektivno pred demonstracijami." Pastirsko pismo je bilo sestavljeno na konferenci katoliških škofov v Fuldi zadnji teden. Avstrijski škofje se niso udeležili te konference, pač pa so namizili, da bodo imeli sestanek v Beogradu v bližnji bodočnosti.

Praga hoče preprečiti nacistični puč

Načelnik nemške delegacije se sestane z Benešem

Praga, 30. avg. — Češkoslovaška vlada, parlamentarni odseki, voditelji političnih strank in večšaki sestavljajo nov načrt z namenom, da potolažijo suetske Nemce in druge narodnostne skupine. S tem nameravajo v prvi vrsti izbiti Hitlerju priliko, da bi pod katerokoli pretežno napadel Češkoslovaško. Ako ne bodo uspeli, bo odgovornost za konflikt padla na Nemčijo.

Edvard Beneš, predsednik češke republike, bo danes sprejel poslanca Ernsta Kundta, načelnika delegacije suetskikh Nemcev. Druga konferenca se bo vršila med Konradom Henleinom, vodjem nacistične stranke, in lordom Runcimanom, načelnikom neuradne angleške komisije, ki je prišla v Prago, da posreduje med vlado in nemško manjšino. Runciman bo zahteval od Henleina, naj pojasni svoje stališče glede predlogov, kateri so mu bili predloženi zadnje nedelje.

Dasi je vsa stvar zavita v tajnost, govorice, da namerava vlada razdeliti deželo v kantone, kakršne ima Švica, nočejo utihniti. V teh kantonih naj bi bila združena ljudstva iste narodnosti. Praška vlada upa, da bo na ta način zadovoljila suetske Nemce, ki zahtevajo teritorialno samovlado.

Vladni krogi dobro vedo, da njihove aktivnosti ne bodo ustavile Hitlerja, ako se je že odločil, da udari po Češkoslovaški. Praga hoče predvsem uveriti Runcimana, da hoče biti pravična na njegov račun. To je v soglasju z njenimi američanmi, da se Anglija postavi na stran Češkoslovaške v slučaju nacističnega napada.

Vprašanje abstraktne pravice ne igra velike vloge pri reševanju prečih problemov. Stranke, ki so zapletene v konfliktu, hočejo predvsem ustvariti vtis, da so v pravem. Svet, kar sta v tem trenutku Velika Britanija in Amerika, naj bi jim aplaydiral.

Vidi hibe v Wagnerjevem zakonu

Green konferiral z avtorjem zakona

Atlantic City, N. J., 30. avg. — Senator Robert F. Wagner, avtor delavskega zakona, je včeraj nastopil pred člani izvršnega sveta Ameriške delavske federacije, ki so se tu sestali na svoji seji. Wagner je moral poslušati Greena in druge voditelje federacije, ki so se pritoževali, da je federalni odbor, ki upravlja zakon, pristranski v svoji praksi. Hibe zakonov, ki to omogočajo, je treba odpraviti.

Senator Wagner je po konferenci z Greenom odpotoval v Washington, kjer bo poročal Rooseveltu o pritožbah ADF. Green je v razgovoru s senatorjem nastel več alužjev, da podpre svojo trditev, da je federalni delavski odbor pristranski v prilogi unijam CIO.

Dva nova satelita odkrita

Washington, D. C., 30. avg. — Carnegiejeva ustanova poroča, da so astronomi na zvezdarni na gori Wilson v Californiji odkrili dva nova satelita planeta Jupitru. Opazovanja planeta s teleskopom so trajala dva meseca pod vodstvom dr. S. Nicholsona. Neki satelit sta dobila številki "10" in "11".

EKSEKUTIVA AVT-NE UNIJE OSVOJI PROGRAM LEWISA

Notranji spor ovira organizatorično kampanjo

BLAGAJNA IZCRPANA

Detroit, Mich. — (FP)—Dolgo odlašana intervencija vodstva Odbora za industrijsko organizacijo v notranji spor avtne unije bo, kakor vse kaže, odobrena na seji eksekutive, ki se bo vršila v prvih dneh septembra. John L. Lewis, načelnik CIO, je že poslal okrožnice avtnim unijam s pozivom, naj naredijo mir v svoji hiši.

Lewisov program vključuje ponovno sprejetje petih članov eksekutivnega odbora, katere je Homer Martin izključil, prepoved frakcijskih razprav do prihodnje redne konvencije in poravnavo spornih vprašanj po CIO, ki jih eksekutiva avtne unije ne more sama rešiti.

Program je v bistvu kompromis, ki sili Martina k priznanju, da obravnava proti članom opozicije ni bila pravična. Na drugi strani bo morda Lewis preprečil načrte opozicije, ki hoče odstaviti Martina. Dasi program ne upaja nobeni v konfliktu zavezovalni grupi, ima vseeno oporo pri večini članov, ki so se že naveličali kavsanja med voditelji unije. Člani v prvi vrsti zahtevajo od eksekutivnega odbora zaščito proti delodajalcem, ki se veselijo razkola v uniji.

Od zadnje konvencije, ki se je vršila v Milwaukeeju, preživlja avtna unija težke čase. V blagajni unije je bilo pol milijona dolarjev ob zadnji konvenciji, zdaj pa je prazna, poleg tega pa je organizatorična kampanja v zastoju. Kampanja v Fordovih tovarnah, ki je bila poverjena Richardu Frankensteinu, Martinovi deani roki, ki je bil nedavno izključen, ni izpolnila pričakovanj.

Lewis želi poravnati notranji spor v avtni uniji iz več razlogov. Eden je preprečevanje nevarne situacije, ki bi nastala, ako bi frakcijske skupine poslale vsaka svoje delegate na prihodnje konvencije CIO. To bi dalo voditeljem ADF municijo v njihovi kampanji proti CIO. Enotnost delavskih sil je potrebna tudi na političnem polju, da bo Frank Murphy ponovno izvoljen za gubernerja.

Frankfurter morda nasledi Cardoza

Washington, D. C. — Ugibanja, kdo bo dobil pozicijo v federalnem vrhovnem sodišču, je prazna od smrti sodnika Cardoza, se nadaljujejo. Mnogi vidijo naslednika v Felixu Frankfurterju, aliovestu načelniku pravne fakultete na univerzi Harvard, ki je bil učitelj mnogih, kateri imajo sedaj važne pozicije v Rooseveltovi administraciji. Vsi ti ga podpirajo in več drugih, med temi senatorji George Norris iz Nebrasko. Imenovanje Frankfurterja za vrhovnega sodnika priporočajo tudi vodilni ameriški odvetniki. Tradicija, katero je postavil pokojni liberalni sodnik Holmes, je, da mora mesto v vrhovnem sodišču dobiti oseba izrednih sposobnosti ne glede na politične in druge obzornosti. Drugi je senator Robert Wagner iz New Yorka, ki ima tudi mnogo podpornikov. Njegov politični vpliv je velik v New Yorku in Roosevelt bi ga pogrejal v senatu, kjer se je vneto boril za uveljavljanje Rooseveltovih reform.

Hitler obiskal trdnjavsko omrežje

Naciji upajo, da bo Anglija pustila Čehe na cedilu

Berlin, 30. avg. — Diktator Hitler in načelniki nemške armade potujejo ob zapadni meji novega nemškega imperija. Včeraj so si ogledali trdnjavsko omrežje ob reki Reni ob meji Francije. Več ur so se zamudili v Kehlju, ki leži na nasprotni strani Strasbourga. Francija, Strasbourg je bil nekdanji nemško mesto.

Nacistični krogi še niso prešli veli razočaranja zaradi govora, ki ga je imel John Simon, angleški finančni minister, zadnji soboto. Simon je posvaril Hitlerja pred izzivanjem vojne, v katero bo morala poseči tudi Anglija.

Angleški zunanji minister Halifax je istočasno pozval prizadevanje kroga, naj ublažijo napetost v Češkoslovaški, poleg tega pa je pohvalil pomirjevalno stališče češke vlade. Iz tega sklepa, da bo Anglija vrgla vso odgovornost na nacistično Nemčijo, če se bo zapletla v vojno s Češkoslovaško.

Visoki nacistični krogi še vedno upajo, da bo Velika Britanija pustila Češkoslovaško na cedilu v kritičnem trenutku. To upanje bazira na "ustnem sporazumu", ki je bil dosežen med Chamberlainom in Hitlerjevimi reprezentanti na nedavni konferenci v Londonu.

List Deutsche Allgemeine Zeitung, glasilo nemške orožne industrije, piše, da bo Nemčija imela zadnje besedo pri reševanju problema nemške manjšine v Češkoslovaški. Nemčija sploh ne potrebuje nasvetov iz Londona, kako naj rešuje ta problem.

Krvave praske med Čehi in Nemci

Veliko število aseb ranjenih

Praga, 30. avg. — Češka policija pravi, da je bilo več oseb ranjenih v bitkah med Čehi in Nemci, ki so se vršile v različnih krajih. Mnogo oseb so morali odpeljati v bolnišnice.

Zupan Hermann v Schoenbornu, nemški občan, je bil napaden, ko je skušal pomiriti politične nasprotnike v neki gostilni. V Elchichtu je prišlo do pretepa med delavci. Ko je policija prišla, so suetskiki Nemci obkolili delavce, toda policija je vseeno razpršila pretepače.

Neki češki policaj je bil napaden v gostilni v Johnsborsu. Drugi spopadi so bili v Altrosloju in več drugih občinah kakor tudi v Pragi. Neki nemški uradnik je bil tepen, ker je strgal češki letak s stene neke trgovine.

Iz New Yorka v Californijo v desetih urah

Los Angeles, Cal., 30. avg. — Alexander P. D. Seversky, letalski tovarnar, je dosegel nov rekord, ko je preletel razdaljo med New Yorkom in Los Angelesom v desetih urah in treh minutah. Na poti se je ustavil v Kansas Cityju, Mo., nekaj minut, da je dobil dodatko zalogo goriva. Prejšnji rekord, ki ga je dosegel Turner, je bil 11 ur in 30 minut. Seversky je letel s povprečno brzino 250 milj na uro.

Pet ubitih v letalski nesreči

Sydney, Avstralija, 30. avg. — Pilot in štiri potniki so se včeraj ubili, ko je letalo, ki je letelo proti Sydneyju, treščilo na tla v bližini Innisfilla.

Španske čete zasedle strategične pozicije

Kmetiska revolta se kuha na Poljskem

Stranka predložila svoje zahteve vladi

Varšava, Poljska, 30. avg. — Na Poljskem preti izbruh kmetске revolte in civilne vojne. To se je pokazalo včeraj, ko so voditelji kmetске stranke predložili vladi svoje zahteve. Načelnik stranke je Matija Rataj, bivši začasni predsednik poljske republike.

Deklaracija kmetске stranke se glasi, da mora biti Vincent Witos, bivši voditelj te stranke, ki se nahaja v izgnanstvu v Češkoslovaški, takoj pomiloščen. Poljska mora postati demokratična država in vlada naj takoj odredi parlamentarne volitve. Ako bo vlada ignorirala zahteve, ne bodo voditelji kmetске stranke odgovorni za posledice. Kmetje se pripravljajo na odprt odpor in situacija je kritična.

Predsednik Ignac Moscicki je sklical izredno sejo kabineta, na kateri bo razprava o novi notranji krizi. Nedavna pogajanja med predsednikom in voditelji kmetске stranke, da jih pridobi za sodelovanje z vlado, so se razbila. Na 15. avgusta so se vršile velike kmetске demonstracije proti režimu, v katerih so govorniki poudarjali, da bodo vztrajali v opoziciji. Ob tej priliki so se spomnili, da je vlada z oboroženo silo razbila silne demonstracije pred enim letom. Čez 50 oseb je bilo takrat ubitih v bitki s policijo in vojaštvom.

Josef Beck, poljski zunanji minister, se je zaradi napete situacije vrnil v Varšavo s počitnic. General Kazimir Sosnowski, oster kritik Beckove politike, je informiral vlado, da se tudi v armadi pojavlja odpor proti zunanji politiki, ki je v prilogi nacistični Nemčiji in v škodo Češkoslovaški.

Kmetaka stranka je zdaj pozvala Becka, naj izstopi iz kabineta kot zunanji minister.

Italija izgnala francoske kmete

Pariška vlada zahteva odškodnino

Nice, Francija, 30. avg. — Več francoskih kmetaskih družin je bilo izgnanih s svojih posestev, ki so nahajajo na drugi strani meje v Italiji. Izgon je bil odrejen v skladu z odredbo, ki so jo nedavno objavile italijanske avtoritete.

Čez sto francoskih družin v Isolu je prizadetih. Fašistične avtoritete pravijo, da potrebujejo zemljo, ki so jo konfiscirale, v militaristične svrhe.

Pariz, 30. avg. — Francoska vlada bo zahtevala odškodnino za zemljo francoskih kmetov, ki so jo konfiscirale italijanske oblasti. To naznanilo je bilo objavljeno, ko je bila vlada informirana o izgonu kmetov.

Eksplozija pozdravila Horthyja ob povratku iz Nemčije

Budimpešta, Ogrska, 30. avg. — Eksplozija bombe je pretešla glavni del mesta, ko se je regent Horthy vrnil v Budimpešto po obisku Nemčije, kjer je bil Hitlerjev gost. Uradni krogi zanikajo, da je bila eksplozija, v kateri ni bil nihče ubit in ranjen, demonstracija proti Horthyjevemu režimu.

Fašistična bojna črta pretrgana v več krajih

UMIK NEMSKIH LETALCEV IZ ŠPANJE

Hendaye, Francija, 30. apr. — Španske čete še vedno prodirajo proti Castueri, fašistični trdnjavi bazi, ki leži 150 milj južno od Madrida. Včeraj so pretrgale 20 milj dolgo fašistično bojno črto v več krajih.

Protiofenziva lojalistov, ki je ustavila fašistično prodiranje proti Almadenu, središču bogatega polja živega srebra, je v razmahu. Včeraj so španske čete napadle upornike v dveh sektorjih, pri Villanueva de la Sereanu in Campanareji.

Uradna vest se glasi, da so lojalisti po vroči bitki zasedli več strategičnih pozicij v hribih v bližini Castuera kakor tudi glavno cesto, ki spaja to mesto s Cabezo del Bueyjem.

Vest iz fašističnih virov priznava, da so uporniške čete v defenzivi, pristavljajo pa, da je bilo prodiranje lojalistov v nekaterih krajih ustavljeno. Nobena dvoma ni, da je bila fašistična ofenziva, katere cilj je bila okupacija Almadena, zlomljena.

Barcelona, Španija, 30. avg. — Nemčija bo pozvala svoje letalce, ki se borijo na strani upornikov, kakor tudi vojaške veščake, domov v nekaj tednih. Tako je izjavil Erich Naumann, nemški letalec, katerega so lojalisti po sestrelitvi njegovega letala na fronti ob reki Ebrri ujeli, v razgovoru z reporterji zunanjih listov. Nemška letala bodo ostala v Španiji, toda pilotirali jih bodo Francovi letalci.

Ameriške bojne ladje v nevarnosti

Kitajski vpadi v šanghajski predmestja

Sanghaj, 30. avg. — Nov konflikt se je izcimil med Američani in Angleži na eni strani in Japonci na drugi. Ta se tiče vprašanja, ali imajo ameriške in angleške bojne ladje pravico plovbe na reki Jangtse.

Ameriška topničarka Monocay je bila poškodovana v eksploziji min, ki so jih Japonci položili v to reko. Mine so eksplodirale ob pomolu v Klukianju, kjer je bila topničarka zasidrana in kjer ima skladišča Standard Vacuum Oil Co.

Poročnik Clarence A. Conlon, poveljnik topničarke, je takoj protestiral pri japonskih avtoritetah, toda dobil je odgovor z nasvetom, naj se ameriške bojne ladje umaknejo iz vojne cone. Silčen odgovor so dobili tudi Angleži na svoj protest, ki so ga vložile, ko je japonska bomba padla v bližini angleške topničarke Cockshafter.

Sanghaj, 30. avg. — Kitajske guerilske čete so včeraj spet udarile v predmestja Sanghaja. Nekaj vojakov je celo prišlo v bližino mednarodne naselbine v Sanghaju, kjer so s dinamitom pogrnili v zrak most nad potokom v Hangjuju. Tam so tudi razobesili kitajsko zastavo in so se umaknili šele potem, ko so dospeli oddelki japonskega vojaštva.

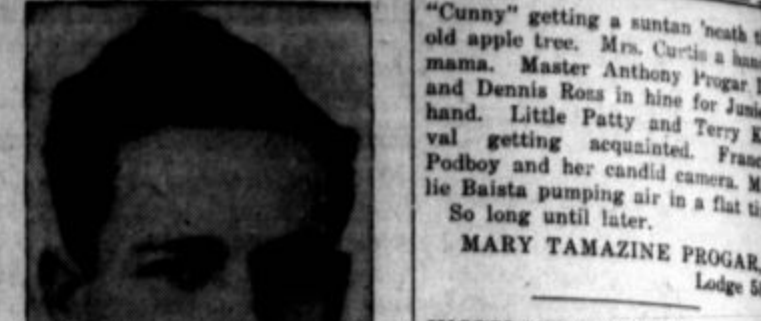
