Francija urgira splošno blokado Nemčije v slučaju, da Hitler raztrga zadnje ostanke versaj-ske pogodbe

LIGA IGNORIRALA ABESINSKI PROTEST PROTI ITALIJI

Zeneva, 16. apr. — Zenevska policija in vojske čete so pod-vele potrebne korake za zaščito življenj evropskih državnikov, ki so dospeli sem na izredno zase- danje sveta Lige narodov. Raz- miselnosti zaroti proti življenju vodilnih evropskih državnikov. Palača Lige narodov je posta- la obojena trdnjava, ko je pri- lo poročilo, da je policija v Mar- seilles aretirala dva zarotnika. Policija je zastražila tudi vse hotele, v katerih so se nastanili delegati različnih držav.

Poznejše vesti iz Marseillesa so se glasile, da je bojazen pred teroristično zaroto neutelelje- na, toda govorice o zaroti kljub temu persistirajo. Teroristi so nam sklenili umoriti premierja Mussolinija, francoskega zuna- njega ministra Laval, rumun- skega zunanega ministra Titu- lesca in Eduarda Beneša, zuna- njega ministra Čehoslovaške. Včeraj se je izvedelo, da je bil pred dvema letoma izvršen na- pad na Beneša v palači Lige na- rodov, da je bil napadalec tudi aretiran in da o tem incidentu javnost ni bila informirana. Za- radi vznemirljivih poročil, ki prihajajo iz Zeneve, spremljajo državne na vseh potih detek- tivi.

(Marseilleska policija je na- znanila, da je aretirala Edo Ca- roni in Rudolpha Gunscherja, avstrijske državljane, ker se sta- gnost ženske, ki je bila navedena v njenem potnem listu, ni uje- mala s številkami, ki so jih do- dele švicarske avtoritete. Dvoji- ta je bila aretirana 10. aprila, ko je dospela iz Tunisa, in potem poslana v Švico.)

Zeneva, 16. apr. — Francija je na delu, da pridobi države male in balkanske antante, ki so za- stopane v svetu Lige narodov, da splošno blokado Nemčije v slučaju, da kancelar Hitler raz- trga zadnje ostanke versaj-ske pogodbe. Francija, katero sta podprli Anglija in Italija na- stavkar končani konferenci v Stresu, je uverjena, da bo svoj cilj dosegla.

Svet Lige narodov je včeraj na tajni seji razpravljal o fran- coskem protestu proti oboroži- telni Nemčiji. Istovestno so se vr- lili zaključni razgovori z repre- zentanti malih evropskih drža- v, v katerih so skušali pred- stavniki Anglije, Italije in Fran- cije uveriti prve, da je vse tako kakor trdi Francija.

Francoski zunanji minister Laval je ves dan konferiral z de- legati male antante (Čehoslova- vija, Jugoslavija in Rumunija) kakor tudi z delegati balkanske antante (Grška, Turčija, Jugo- slavija in Rumunija). Dalje je Laval govoril s predstavniki bal- tijskih in skandinavskih držav. Veliko pozornost je izzval dog- razgovor med Lavalom in so- vjetskim komisarjem za zuna- nje zadeve ter z Beckom, polj- skim zunanjim ministrom. Kaj so govorili, ni znano, poroča se- de, da je Francija naletela na o- strogo in neugodno avtomatič- no ekonomsko sankcijo proti dr- žavi, ki bi na svojo pest pogazi- la katerokoli pogodbo. Poljska, ki je priznala napram Nemčiji, je odklonila skemo in nji je sle- dila tudi Danska.

Svobodno mesto Gdansk, 16. apr. — Krvave demonstracije proti nacisti Nemčiji so včeraj izbruhnile med Poljaki v polj- skem koridorju in v Gornji Sle- ziji. V šlezkih premogovnih o- krožjih so Poljaki demonstrirali proti šolam nemške manjšine. V spopadih v okolici Gdanskega je bil eden nemški nacij ubit in mnogo je bilo ranjenih. Nacij- ski senat v Gdanskem je odredil za danes žalne protidemonstra- cije za ubitim nacijem, ki se je pisal Fritz Broen.

V Krolewski v Gornji Sleziji so poljski nacionalisti pozvali starše, ki pošiljajo svoje otroke v nemške šole, naj te šole takoj bojkotirajo.

Poljsko gibanje v koridorju proti nacisti propagandi po- nemčevanja je dobilo zamah po zadnjih volitvah v Gdanskem, pri katerih so socialisti z ostalo opozicijo vred prepredili nacijs- ko absolutno večino in pri ka- terih so Poljaki precej pomnožili svoje glasove.

ROOSEVELT IN- Terveniral v PRID PUŠKARNI

Zasliševanje o kršitvi točke 7A odgodeno

INSCENIRANJE STA- RE IGRE

Washington, D. C. — (FP) — Predsednik Roosevelt je ustavi- la zasliševanja pred senatnim mu- nicijemskim odsekom v zadevi Colt Firearms Mfg. Co., ki je obto- žena kršitve delavske točke za- kona obnove in ji je federalni delavski odbor odvzel znak pla- vega orla. Pred odsekom je nam- reč imel nastopiti Donald R. Richberg, načelnik odbora NRA, kot glavna priča, toda Roosevelt je eno uro prej telefoniral se- natorju Nyeju, načelniku odse- ka, naj odlogi zasliševanje. Predsednik je dejal, da upa, da bo stavka pri omenjeni družbi v kratkem poravnana.

Ker senator Nye ni določil da- tuma za obnovitev zasliševanja, sodijo, da se je uklonil Roose- veltovemu pritisku in da bo ak- cija proti puškarni ustavljena. Stavka proti Colt Co. je izbru- nila pred štirimi tedni, ko je družba odklonila pogajanja z re- prezentanti unij, za katere so se delavci izrekli pri volitvah, ki so se vršile pod nadzorstvom fede- ralnega delavskega odbora. Po volitvah je vladni delavski od- bor odločil, da mora kompanija priznati unije, in ker se je uprla, ji je bil odvzet znak plavega orla. Colt Co. izdeluje strojnice za ameriško armado, zakon obnove pa določa, da ne more nobena firma dobiti vladnih naročil, če nima plavega orla. Spor, ki je nastal med delavci in kompani- jo, je izzval odmev tudi v kon- gresu. Nekateri kongresniki so zahtevali, da vlada zaseže pod- jetje Colt Co. proti odškodnini in ga sama obratuje.

Člani federalnega delavskega odbora so povedali Nyejevemu odseku, da pričakujejo od njega, da bo podprl njihov odlok, ki je, da mora kompanija priznati un- ije, za katere so se delavci izre- klili pri volitvah. Rooseveltova akcija v tem sporu je prišla ne- pričakovano in mnenje prevla- duje, da bo skušala administraci- ja prisiliti stavkarje na spre- jetje kompromisa.

GLASOVANJE O STAROSTNI POKOJ- NINI V ČETRTEK

Washington, D. C. — "New- dealski" voditelji v nižji kon- gresni zbornici bodo poskusili izsiliti glasovanje o starostnem zavarovanju v četrtek z name- nom, da preprečijo liberalne a- mendement. Debatna zadnjih dni je pokazala, da se veliko šte- vilo kongresnikov nagiblje k zviša- nju vsote mesečne pokojnine od \$15 na \$25 ali \$30 a federalne strani, kakor bi bile posamezne bremena.

"Zagovorniki administracijske- ga načrta so izjavili 15. aprila, da bo zakon socialnega zava- rovanja sprejet tak, kakršnega hoče imeti predsednik Roose- velt. Po njih sodbi bo Town- sendov načrt starostne pokojni- ne dobil k večjemu 60 glasov, Lundeonov načrt brezposelost- nega zavarovanja pa morda ne- kaj več glasov.

Delavci v Fordovih to- varnah se organizirajo

Detroit, Mich. — V zadnjih tednih je veliko število delavcev, upošlenih v Fordovih tovarnah, pristopilo v unijo United Auto- mobile Workers of America. Vse detroitske delavske organizaci- je so aktivne v kampanji, kate- re cilj je organiziranje nad 70.000 delavcev v Fordovih avtnih tovarnah.

BREZPOSELNOST. NO ZAVAROVANJE V NEW YORKU

Albany, N. Y. — (FP) — Kill- grew-Byrnsov načrt brezposelost- nega zavarovanja je bil spre- jet v obeh zbornicah državne le- gislature. Governor Lehman ga bo gotovo podpisal, ker je bil na- črt v njegovem programu delav- ske zakonodaje, katero je pripo- ročil v sprejetje.

Za sprejetje tega načrta so se borile državna delavska fe- deracija, centralne delavske uni- je v vseh mestih in druge orga- nizacije. Zakon stopi v veljavo 1. marca prihodnjega leta in krije razen poljedelskih delav- cev vse ročne in pisarniške de- lavce, katerih tedenski zaslužek znaša manj ko \$50 in so upole- ni v podjetju, v katerem dela pet ali več oseb. Uslužbenci v bolnišnicah, v dobrodelnih in zdravniških institucijah so iz- ključeni iz tega zavarovanja.

V brezposelnostni sklad bodo morali prispevati delodajalci, ne pa delavci. S pričetkom l. 1936 bo ta prispevek analen en odst- otek od vsote izplačane meze, l. 1937 dva odstotka in naslednja leta tri odstotke. Brezposelni bo- do prejeli podporo iz brezpo- selnostnega sklada tudi v slu- čaju uveljavitelja federalnega brezposelnostnega zavarovanja. Maksimalna podpora je \$15 na teden in brezposelni jo more prejmati le 16 tednov v letu. Iz- plačevanje podpore iz državnega brezposelnostnega sklada se bo pričelo šele l. 1938.

Osem milijonov otrok na relifni listi

Washington, D. C. — Katha- rine F. Lenroot, načelnica zve- znega otroškega biroja, je na konvenciji Ameriškega rdečega križa poudarila, da je umrljiv- ost otrok največja v družinah, ki žive v velikem pomanjkanju. Ob koncu marca je bilo osem mi- lijonov otrok v starosti 16 let in manj na federalni relifni listi.

Wheeler predlaga nakup železnice

V načrtu je federalna železniška korporacija

Washington, D. C. — Senator Wheeler iz Montane, znani pro- gresivec in predsednik meddr- žavnega trgovskega odseka, je 15. t. m. predložil načrt, po ka- terem naj federalna vlada kupi vse sisteme železnic v Združe- nih državah in jih začne obra- tovati s 1. januarjem 1936. V ta namen naj se organizira fede- ralna železniška korporacija, ki naj konsolidira vse proge v en sam železniški sistem in jih ob- ratuje za ljudske koristi.

V načrtu je, da vlada prevza- me delnice vseh železniških družb in jih zamenja z bondi za dolgo dozorljivo dobo.

Detroit, Mich. — "Obdolžitev, da se moje tiskovine tiskajo v neunijski tiskarni, je prekleta laž", je nedavno gmel "father" Coughlin v radio.

"Father" je govoril resnico, ampak povedal ni, da je firma, katere odjemalec je že več let, sklenila pogodbo s tiskarsko u- nijo samo tri dni prej, predno je bila izrečena tista "prekleta laž". Tiskarna se je morala uklo- niti pritiskajo, ker so pričeli pri- hajati protesti proti Coughlinu- vi uniji za socialno pravičnost, ker je pošiljala svoja naročila neunijski tiskarni.

Ed Thal, predsednik sveta stavbniških unij v Detroitu, je že prej večkrat ovrkal Coughli- na, ker so njegovo cerkev gra- dili neunijski delavci. Thal ga je tudi obdolžil, da sodeluje z orga- nizacijo tovarnarjev v pobljan- ju unijskega gibanja v Detroi- tu.

Washington, D. C. — (FP) — Župani ameriških mest so prišli v kapitol, kjer pritiskajo na Roo- seveltovo administracijo za na- menom, da dobe čimprej denar iz sklada petih milijard, katere- ga je kongres apropriral za fi- nanciranje javnih projektov. Pričakovali so, da bodo z lahko- to dosegli svoj cilj, toda naleteli so na velike ovire.

Milwaukeeški socialistični župan Hoan je dejal, da imajo odgo- vorne avtoritete polno izgo- rov, s katerimi opravčujejo svo- jo neakcijo. Hoan jih je obdol- žil, da namenoma zavlačujejo stvar in nočejo izvajati načrtov za gradnjo projektov, pri kate- rih bi dobili zaslužek brezposel- ni. On je za to, da vlada potroši večino denarja v velikih mestih ali v njih bližini, kjer biva masa brezposelnih, namesto v oddalje- nih in zapuščenih krajih, kamor bi bilo treba delavce transporti- rati, kar bi povečalo izdatke. Newyorški župan La Guardia in nekateri drugi so istega mne- nja.

V letu 1910 se je začelo agitirati na jugozapadni strani Clevelanda za ustanovitev društva SNPJ med Slovenci, kateri so večinoma živeli in delali v okolici opekarne Standard na Jennings rd.

Pokojuj Karli Kuhel, ki je imel gostilno na Jennings rd., je bil prvi agitator. S pomočjo Petra Vesela in pok. Andreja Trčka se je vršil prvi sestanek 11. junija 1910 v prostorih Karla Kuhla, katerega se je udeležilo 11 oseb. Frank Kerče, bivši glavni blaginjak SNPJ, in John Meden sta bila organizatorja. Predlagano je bilo ime "Brooklyn" in tudi sprejeto.

Ustanovitelj so bili sledeči: Martin Oblak, Peter Vesel, Karli Kuhel, John Kaučic, Martin Fink, Andrej Trček, Josip Hočevar, Alojz Jerman in Frank Fevče.

Samo eden ustanovitelj je še ostal v društvu, in ta je Martin Oblak. Peter Vesel je prestopil k društvu št. 406. Josip Hočevar je odstopil, ostali pa so umrli.

Prvi odborniki so bili izvoljeni: Andrej Trček, preds., Martin Oblak, tajnik in Karli Kuhel, blaginjak. Seje so se vršile pri bratu K. Kuhlu do njegove smrti v letu 1918, od tega časa naprej pa se vršijo pri E. Zelezniku na 4002 Jennings rd.

Prva vrtna veselica se je vršila v bližini sešeda društva v jeseni 1910, ki je bila precej uspešna, drugič pa plesna veselica v dvorani Franka Korčeta na St. Clair ave. V letu 1916 je društvo razvilo zastavo na pikniku na prostorih Johna Jesenovec v South Brooklynu. Kumovala sta Albin Kalinger in Agnes Kuhel. Udeležba na tej proslavi je bila velika in uspeh popoln.

Močne aktivnosti društva so začele po letu 1920 pod vodstvom pok. preda. Paula Korencana in tajnika Johna Lužarja, ki je sedanjji blaginjak in zelo aktiven.

Letne veselice so bile uspešne, blaginja je naraščala, tako da je to najstarejše društvo na zapadni strani mesta postalo v letu 1930 tudi najmočnejše v finančnem in članskem oziru. Fundamentalno so vse te naše jednote in zveze poleg kupčka manjših, pokrajinskih in lokalnih, zadržane zavarovalne. Podpora je prva naloga. Zavarovalni sistemi vseh so v glavnem enaki, so pa majhne razlike v vplačilih in izplačilih, načinih zavarovanja, v tem in onem; navidezno se te razlike ne poznajo dosti, bistveno pa le štejejo. Poslovanje v splošnem mora biti navezano na ameriške zakone in ameriški business. Razlike so tudi v businessu, kar zavisi od odborikov v vodstvu. Rekli smo, da so vse naše jednote in zveze a priori zavarovalne. To pa ni vse. Če bi bilo to vse, bi ena sama organizacija zadostovala. Dokaz, da to ni vse, je dejstvo, da imamo danes pet večjih in okrog pet manjših zavarovalnih organizacij. Da je druga najstarejša jednota katoliška le po imenu, je vsekakor vzrok ta, ker za dve večji strogo katoliški jednoti ni bilo prostora; ena je zadostovala in zato je morala druga vzeti nevtralnost stališča, da je lahko dobila mlačne katolike v svoje vrste, namreč one, ki si ne dovoljujejo zapovedovanja, kdaj morajo iti k spovedi.

SNPJ je bila prva svobodomiselnost organizacija. Vsaka dosledna kopija naše jednote se ne bi bila obnesla — kakor se ne bi bila dosledna kopija katoliške jednote. Tako imamo danes pristno katoliško in pristno svobodomiselnost jednoto in druge, ki so to le po imenu.

SNPJ pa ima še eno svojstvo, ki je enako važno kakor svobodomiselnost načelo in točno izplačevanje podpor. To je delavski princip. To je načelo delavske izobrazbe v smislu socialne in industrijske demokracije. To je treba poudariti od časa do časa, ne zaradi našega članstva, ker zavedni člani SNPJ to dobro vedo, temveč zato, da ne bodo tega pozabili zunanji krogi.

Res je, tudi nekatere druge, manjše slovenske podporne organizacije so osvojile to delavsko načelo, toda bolj ali manj je to načelo ostalo le pri sklepu. SNPJ pa izvaja! SNPJ podpira in ščiti svoje članke-delavce v delavskih bojih, SNPJ neprestano poudarja v svojem glasilu delavske politične, ekonomske in socialne pravice; SNPJ dosledno sodeluje s svojim glasilom v boju za socialno zavarovanje in druge reforme, ki so mogoče v okviru kapitalistične družbe in ki bodo pomagale delavcem, da bodo lažje zmagovali v boju za obstanek in se bodo čim prej iznebili strašnega izkoriščanja v današnji družbi.

Ker SNPJ odprto in že od svojih prvih let izpoveduje in zagovarja delavske principe, ki težijo za splošnim napredkom delavstva, ji je to pomagalo, da se je naglo razširila po vseh naših naselbinah in si v razmeroma kratkih letih pridobila največji krog članstva. Nihče, kdor je iskren, ne more zanikati velike vsote dobrega dela, ki ga je SNPJ izvršila samo na polju izobrazbe s svojim dnevnikom in knjigami v zadnjih dveh desetletjih. Ni treba, da bi danes naštevati vsote podpor v milijonih dolarjev, ki so jih prejeli člani SNPJ — prosvetna podpora sama naj zadostuje.

Nobena druga organizacija ni prekosila SNPJ v tem delu. Tudi je ne bo, ker je že prepozno. Vsed tega je SNPJ še vedno na vodilnem, na prvem mestu — in daleč pred vsemi drugimi.

Nove knjige

Heroes and Assassins, by Stoyan Christov
Published by Robert M. McBride & Co., New York, 1935. (\$3.00)

Spet ena knjiga, ki je izšla ta teden v New Yorku in katera se v veliki meri tiče Jugoslavije. Avtor nove knjige "Heroes and Assassins (Junaki in morilci)" je Stojan Christov Macedonec, ki je prišel mlad v Ameriko in kasneje je večkrat obiskal svoj stari kraj.

To je knjiga o macedonskih komitaših — o va knjiga, kolikor nam je znano, katera je izšla v Združenih državah, ki podrobno opisuje komitaško gibanje na Balkanu. To gibanje nam je malo znano, razen kolikor smo čitali o njem v časopisih in ta poročila navadno kažejo v mitaših navadnih bandite in krvoločne teroriste. Iz te knjige pa izvedemo, da je komitaška organizacija Imro stara že 40 let, da se je prvotno borila s Turki za svobodo Macedonije izpod turške jarma in zadnjih 20 let se bori za svobodo izpod Jugoslavije, Grčije in Bolgarije, odkar je bila Macedonija po drugi balkanski vojni (1913) razkosana v tri dele in anektirana po balkanskih zaveznikih.

Avtor skuša biti nevtralen in prepričan, da tatelju, naj sodi, če so komitaši res junaki ali so morilci, vendar pa je vsekoli simpatičen komitaš. Macedonci govorijo bolgarski jezik in so Bolgarom najbližji, kljub temu Imro zahteva neodvisnost za svoje ozemlje ali vsaj avtonomijo.

Vtis, ki ga dobim iz te knjige o komitaših, da so fanatični nacionalisti. Fasistom jih ne moreš primerjati, ker imajo zborovanja in njih vodje so izvoljeni. Idealistični, romantični revolucionarji, katerim ni nikjer para in ki z vseljem trpe in umirajo — na tisoče jih je padlo — za svoj ideal, dasi je jako malo ali sploh nobenega upanja na doseg tega ideala obenem pa teroristi in intriganti brez socialne ga čuta. Med komitaškimi voditelji so več intrige in vsi voditelji do danes so umrli na silne smrti. Pred nekaj leti so jih komunisti skušali pridobiti zase, toda pridobili so le nekaj voditeljev, dočim so se drugi voditelji ločno uprli in pobili večino "izdajalcev". Komitaš Černozemski, ki je v zadnjem oktobru ustrelil kralja Aleksandra na Francoskem, prej ubil tudi bolgarskega komunističnega voditelja Džamova.

Pisatelj opisuje tudi zvezo macedonskih komitašev s hrvaškimi vstaši. Pred tremi leti je dr. Ante Pavelić obiskal bolgarski del Macedonije in se sestal s komitaškimi glavarji. Mihajlov ter sklenil zvezo z njim. Pavelić je prosil Mihajlova, naj mu "posodi" skupino iz vežbanih teroristov, ki bodo vadili Hrvatov atentatih. Mihajlov mu je rad ugodil in "posodil" mu je med drugimi tudi Vladimirja Gezegeva Černozemskega, ki je lansko leto ubil Aleksandra.

Med onimi, ki so to knjigo ocenili, je tudi Louis Adamič, ki piše, da je ta knjiga velika važnost za vse one Američane, ki hočejo pravilno pojmovati politični razvoj na Balkanu svetovni vojni in glavne dogodke, ki so od tega razvoja.

Knjiga "Heroes and Assassins" ima okrog 300 strani in precej fotografskih posnetkov ter risb.

Človek v zraku

Praški raziskovalec dr. Schubert je predaval o funkcijah človeškega organizma v zraku pred vsem torej o zdravstvenih problemih letalca.

Če se človek v petih ali šestih minutah povzpi v višino 5000 m, je to za njegova pljuča in srce velika obremenitev.

Kislika je v tej višini komaj polovico normalne količine. Pri kratkem bivanju v takšnih višinah zdravo srce sicer prenese takšne zahtevnosti, a pomisliti je treba, da mora letalec tega izvršiti še komplicirana dela. Zato poudarja dr. Schubert, naj bi letalci ne skrbeli le o kisliki, ampak tudi o dodatku kisika, kakor zahtevajo dosedanj predpisi za letanje, temveč že v višini 4000 m.

Dr. von Diringshofen je poročal o telesnem zadržanju pri hudih pospeševanjih, kakor n. pr. pri umetnih poletih. Z ogromno pospeševanjem, ki se pojavlja n. pr. pri letu v krivuljah, padalnem letu in loopingih, se krvni pritisk avtomatično poveča. Diringshofen je ugotovil, da vpliva v takšnih primerih ugodno spreminjanje telesne lege v letalu, n. pr. s tem, da portret telo preko nagmone nazaj.

Ta poročila je dopolnil dr. Hartmann, nemške ekspedicije na Himalajo leta 1931. Člani ekspedice, ki se je dvigala najvišje na Kančincing, so pa 6 do 7 tedenskem bivanju v višini preko 6000 m izgubili 30 do 50 funtov telesne teže, toda mislično silo so si ohranili skoraj nespremenjeno. Na teži so izgubili pred vsem zavoljo močne oddaje vlage v suhem zraku. Sele v višini nad 6000 m je začela mislična sila popuščati.

Debeluhi in suhi

Ze od nekdaj velja naziranje, da debeluh težje prenese operacije nego suhi. To naziranje je sedaj statistično potrjeno v raziskavi zdravnika prof. Seyfferta. Na podlagi številnih operacij, ki mu je bil na razpolago, je ugotovil, da je pri operacijah slepiča umrlo 10 odst. sušcev, pri operacijah slepiča umrlo 2 odst. debeluhov in samo 2 odst. sušcev, pri operacijah na žolčnem mehurju umrlo 6 odst. sušcev in 23 odst. debeluhov. To kaže, da bi bilo dobro uporabiti shujševalne kure kot pripravo za operacije.

Campaign Comments

One of the outstanding features of our fraternal lodge system—fraternalism as practiced by the Slovene National Benefit Society—no doubt is the direct mutual help gained by the members. That help is material in character. Important and necessary as this help is under the present chaotic economic system and social injustice, it is not the only gain shared by the membership.

Besides being a fraternal organization, our Society is also doing other important work among its members. It is championing the workers' cause for the past thirty-one years and constantly striving to uplift its membership socially and educationally. It is true that this phase of its work has not yet reached large proportions due chiefly to limited space and means in general.

If the working Slovene people, from whom the great bulk of our members are procured, would but realize in much greater numbers how important fraternal insurance is, our Society would in the near future surpass twice its own numbers. And—

If every member of our Society would give just a little of his time and influence to the matter of increasing the membership—particularly during the E. S. anniversary year—we would make the most wonderful progress that any organization of its kind has ever experienced. And why should we not do it?

We know that the present times are not especially favorable for agitational purposes. Yet, it is hard times that should make people realize the need for their organization. Every member knows that the SNPJ is sound in every respect; that it pays its obligations promptly and that it does everything that a first class fraternal organization could be expected to do, and more.

It would, therefore, seem that a good word spoken now and then to a friend about the Society, and the sending of the names of one or two prospective members to the branch secretary, would not be asking anything that is unreasonable. Because that could so easily be done and would have a far-reaching effect. We are in the Society for the various benefits that we can derive from it and for the purpose of helping to maintain it, thereby doing our share toward making those benefits that we expect, possible.

Praising Corporation Servitude

When the United States News devotes an entire page to an editorial article in praise of the General Motors Corporation, declaring that it "points the way" out of the depression and to security and content for the masses, we become interested in this bourgeois heaven. Here is the old baloney regarding the large number of stockholders which shows "a trend towards popular ownership." Here is "collective bargaining" by the corporation with itself through its dummy company unionism which produces a "loyal group of workers who are more interested in security than in labor politics." Here in the opportunity for the workers to invest in company stock and to participate in their own exploitation; also group insurance, death and accident benefits.

Delightful, to be sure. The collective bargaining reminds us of the practice in the Old South of hiring slaves to contractors, the owners making all arrangements, fixing the "bargain," complimenting the "loyal" slave who returned to the plantation and turned over the money to the boss for which he received the usual ration of bacon, corn pone and molasses. The "security" recalls the permission given slaves to cultivate a patch of the owner's land and to sell the product for a few dollars at the village market. Sick, death and accident benefits were also conceded by the owner who provided a physician and medicine for his human work animals and even incurred the expense of their burial when they died. Of course, the slave did not indulge in "labor politics" either.

In short, General Motors and other big dynasties of capital simply revive the feudal ideal of the old landed aristocracy living on the labor of slaves and whose lives were regulated by a handful of masters at the top of this old regime. The old aristocrat became so confident that they had solved the problem of peace and "security" that in the last twenty years before the Civil War they sent missionaries to the North with the view of winning capitalists and bankers to this program. The idea was to bind northern workers to the industries and parcel out the western lands to big-wigs of the North and South.

Company unionism and corporation "welfare plans" destroy the human being and make of him a vassal of corporate power. The road to emancipation lies in unionism organized and controlled by the workers themselves in alliance with "labor politics," also organized and controlled by the working masses.

The Scottsboro Decision

Considerable water has run under the mill since President Harding said in Birmingham, Alabama, in 1921, in an address on the race question, that it was "a question of recognizing a fundamental and inescapable difference." The Supreme Court of the United States in declaring that the court proceedings in the trial of the Scottsboro boys were invalid because Negroes were excluded from the jury has wiped out the "difference" mentioned by Harding. Henceforth Negroes have the right to serve on southern juries.

This does not mean the end of discrimination or of race prejudice, but it is a long step in the right direction. Workers in the South have seen more and more cooperation between workers of both races in labor struggles and this court decision will help in fostering this solidarity. Workers of the South unite! You have nothing to lose but your prejudice and freedom to gain!—N. L.

The depression was hatched during prosperity. Our present ills are a hang-over from the spree of the New Era. From 1923 to 1929 Big Ownership increased its income by leaps and bounds. The top 400,000 who in 1929 reported incomes of \$100,000 had increased their revenues by 76.6% the top 40,000 by 129.5% the top 4,000 by 207.5%. And the 400 real rulers of America increased their incomes by 234.5% in these six years. The bigger the ownership the better it did.

Just Offhand

Chicago.—Donald J. Lotrich made a fine account of himself in the debate with Leonard Serdiuk on the question of the New Deal, Friday evening, at the SNPJ hall. Approximately 300 people attended the event, sponsored by the Social Study Club. In his rebuttal speeches and in the question period that followed, Lotrich made good use of the opportunity extended him to prove that he knew his subject matter thoroughly. He was, throughout, a forceful and convincing speaker. Despite the fact that he was criticized for attempting to condense a volume of material into a brief period, it must be remembered that it is infinitely better to have had a store of proof at hand than to have had to grope for words and create an impression of uncertainty as to whether there were any facts at hand.

"Chapayev," a Russian film, now playing at the Sonotone, is a pleasant change from the usual fare of emoting dished out by our own film capital. It is a fast-moving drama, enlivened by a good deal of humor, about one of the Russian heroes, Chapayev, a peasant who distinguished himself for his bravery in the guerrilla warfare during the Revolution. The story is taken from the memoirs of Furmanov, one of his Commissars, and many of the scenes are photographed on the exact location where they are supposed to have happened. What distinguished the film is that it needs no conjectured plot and nothing imaginary or idealistic to make it interesting to the very end. That indescribable heroic spirit of Chapayev permeates every scene, and remains with you long after you leave the theater.

It is, and always has been, one of the most curious facts that people cannot sense or appreciate the achievement or greatness of something that is closely allied to them or their everyday lives. For instance, Louis Adamic is one of our own countrymen, with an overwhelming desire to bring the Yugoslav and his racial background before the average American. But how much do the Slovenes know of him or follow his work? Yet people of importance throughout the country are giving unusual recognition to the young author. Here are two, three full-page criticisms of his works, alongside his portraits; here are columns upon columns of other reviews; here is a man in California who is writing a biographical sketch of him; here is another man who is asking permission to incorporate his idea of "shadow-persons" into a novel; here he is interviewed for a prediction of the rubber industry and two weeks later his prediction comes true; etc., etc. We should make it a point to become familiar with his works.

Mamas and Pappas have often been known to take such pride and care of their children that the over-babied recipient of the saccharine goodness too often turned-out to be a spoiled darling. Now that dreadful malady has extended to Uncles, also. The authoritative Mr. Walgreen (authoritative because he has a string of drug stores to his name comparable to Brer Rabbit's mushroom field) deems it highly necessary that he withdraw his niece from the Chicago University because of its radical influences. Deah! Deah! Little girls and boys mustn't have brains of their own; they mustn't hear anything new; they mustn't even learn that everybody else's uncle and auntie doesn't have the good fortune to write a letter to the President of the University that would be reprinted and quoted from in all the city's leading dailies. But Uncles can demand (that is, Uncles with a string of drugstores) that a whole University exist only for one itty-bitty niece—and that the whole world know about it.
