ODPOR ISTRIJANOV, — Pismo iz Istre govori: "Položaj tu je obopen. Ljudje so tako razočarani nad Jugoslavijo, ki jih gospodarsko uničuje in ki jim jemlje še zadnje ostanke svobode, ker je že fašizem še pustil, da se obnašajo kot pravi obupanci. Tako v Višnjunu, čisto hrvaški vasi, nasproti komunističnim funkcionarjem taje svojo hrvaško narodnost, češ da noče biti pod titovsko vlado, ampak naj jim pusti, da optirajo za Italije. Do tega so strahovito Šikan režima pripravile preproste hrvaške kmete."

V PIČNU HOČEJO KRIŽ. — V sredi Istre leži mestece Pičen. Kakor drugod je tudi v Pičnu novi režim iz šole odstranil križ. Washington. — Predsednik Truman je poklical v Washington zastopnike treh železniških unij, ki hočejo izvesti stavko v torek 11. maja. Unijski voditelji se bodo sestali z John Steelmannom, ki je Trumanov pomembni tajnik.

Predsednik Truman bi rad poravnal spor pri železnicah in preprečil stavko. Rekel se je, da bo predsednik zasegl železnic v imenu vlade, ako ne bo mogel privesti do sporazuma unije in železniške družbe.

V Washington so povabljeni zastopniki sledečih unij: strojvodil, kurjačev in premikačev. Ni še znano, če bo predsednik poklical na razgovor tudi zastopnike železnic.

Predsednik ima po postavi, sprejeti ob času prve svetovne vojne, oblast, da zaseže železnicce "ob času vojne." Uradno pa 2. svetovna vojna še ni končana, ker predsednik še ni razglasil konec sovražnosti.

Železniške družbe so že opozorile, da ne bodo sprejemale za prevoz stvari, ki se lahko pokvarijo, ker se boje stavke in zastojev obrata. Železniške družbe, ki bodo prizadete v sledi stavke, so že obvestile delavce in uslužence, da bodo vsi morali ostati doma, če bo stavka pri vlagih.

### Ljubitelji kave so se mačevali

Sterling, Ill. — Restavracije v tem mestu so zvišale ceno skodelici kave na 10 centov. Zbrali so se ljubitelji kave in v velikih skupinah obiskovali restavracije. V vsaki so naročili en kozolec vode za vsakega, jo spili in odšli.

### Rusko posojilo podpisano v 36 urah

Moskva. — Sovjetska vlada je vprašala narod za posojilo v znesku 20 milijonov rublov. Narod se je odzval, poročajo in podpisal več kot kvoto v 36 urah.

### Socialisti so zbrani na konvenciji

Reading, Pa. — Tukaj se vrši narodna konvencija socialistične stranke. Navzočih je 400 delegatov. Konvencija bo izbrala kandidata za predsednika in podpredsednika Zed. držav. Konvencija bo zaključena v nedeljo.

### Senat je odobril 3 bilijone dolarjev za zračno silo

Poslanska zbornica je že prej odobrila sličen predlog za letalstvo.

Washington. — Senat je včeraj z 74 proti 2 glasovoma odobril \$3,198,000,000, da se začne graditi zračno armado ter jo opremiti z najmodernejšimi letali. Samo senator Taylor, ki kandidira za podpredsednika 3. stranke, in senator Cain sta glasovala proti.

Senat je glasoval potem, ko je senator Bridges povedal, da je treba zgraditi 70 skupinsko zračno silo, ako hočemo zavarovati delo pred poskusom Rusije, da bi napravila na naši zemlji druge Pearl Harbor.

Kongres je s tem dovolil za zračno armado več, kot je pa vprašal predsednik Truman. Vsota, ki jo je dovolil kongres, je za \$822,000,000 večja, kot je vprašal predsednik Truman za nova letala.

V nedeljo je skupno sv. obhajilo za vse člane društva Njavnetskega Imena. Naši možje in fantje imajo mašo ob 7:15.



(Nadaljevanje s 1. strani) la pokljuka za svojega. Zato je izdal ukaz, da se ga mora pokopati brez duhovnika. Odredili so, da pride k pogrebu godba iz Prvačine, partizci in pionirji polovico Brd ter razna odpolstva in partijski funkcionarji. Reki so: "To ne bo pogreb, ampak manifestacija naše moči kot je še niso Brda videla."

Toda pokljukova mati ni bila tega mnenja. "Jaz sem ga rodila, jaz sem ga dala krstiti, jaz sem ga poslala k svetemu obhajilu in jaz ga bom po naše pokopala. Iztrgali ste mi sicer sina in ga pokvarili. Moj sin je bil grešnik pa se je skosal. Zato bo imel krščanski pogreb s križem in duhovnikom. Krajevni funkcionarji so jo hoteli prepričati, da se mora pokoriti višjim ukazom, toda neustrašena mati je izjavila: "Ne dovolim, da bi truplo mojega otroka služilo brezverskim

stojim nekaj časa pri Marijini kapelici in gledam na Marijino podobo, se mi zazdi, da me Marija opazuje. Kamor sem se premaknil, se mi je zdelo, da se obračajo njeni oči vame. Nobenega čudežnega spreobrnjenja ne mislim, toda danes molim in hvalim Marijo, da mi je izprosila spoznanje, da človek ni brez namena na svetu.

Zdaj spet molim vsak dan Marijino podobo iz Brezij ima res to lastnost, da se zdi človeku, kot bi se njem oči obračale za njim. Le prepričaj se sam. Ko sem bil leta 1935 obiskal Marijino božjo pot na Brezjah in gledal te krasne oči, mi je prišlo na misel, da je 62 let poprej prav tam klečala moja mati kot 18-letno, dekle in prosila Marijnega varstva ob slovesu iz domovine, na poti v daljni, takrat še tako nepoznani svet. Kolikokrat nam je pravila o tisti Marijini podobi . . .

Jožko, mlad pa neiskušen, je dobil nalog, da brisačo posuši pri odprtju ognjišču: "Mama, ali je brisača suha, kadar postane rjava?"

Rožnikova Rozka se je namerila, da zapusti samski stan, ko jo je prišel iskat Matthew Gefert iz sosednje fare. Adlerjeva Francka ji je zapela prav krasno "Ave Maria" ko sta klečala Ženin in nevesta pred Marijinim oltarjem. Da bi bila vedno srečna. Pa je vendar od več, kako čas beži. Ali se mi zdi, kot bi bilo le par let, odkar sta prav tako klečala pred oltarjem njena starša John Rožnik in njegova izvoljenka, Frančiška Penko. Morda sem pa res že tako star, kot se včasih počutim.

Tako za to poroko pa sta prišla Wilbur Miller in Louise Kalister, da se zavežeta kavine barve in jo obrobljena z zelenimi sviljenimi čipkami, prepletnimi z žlätimi listi.

Čudne so barve te uniforme, reče kraljica akademiku z značilnim nasmehom, ki se je zdel na nagovorenemu nekoliko zloben.

Zares, Veličanstvo, v tej obleki smo kot papeževi nunci.

Klub temu, odvrne kraljica, mi vendar mnogo bolj ugaja od vseh velikih uniform, katere vidim vsako uro v naši palači.

In zakaj, Veličanstvo?

Ker teh uniform ne morejo rabiti tepeci.

Zanimiv slučaj je sledič, ki kaže, da so božja pota res čudna in neizvedljiva. V Dallas, North Carolina, sta si pred leti dva protestanta, Mr. in Mrs. J. B. Lay napravila svoj dom. Zakaj neki, to ne ve ni sama danes, žena je hotels, da nad sprednja vrata pritrdira križ. To je tem bolj čudno, ker protestanti niti na cerkvi navadno nimajo križa. Prišel pa je v ta kraj katoliški misijonar in ko je videl križ, je misil, da je prišel h katoliški družini. Seznanil se je z družino Lay in jih končno začel poučevati o verskih resnicah. Danes je vsa družina Lay katoliška in tudi sosedje. Za cerkev pa so samo podališali hišo in pustili križ, ki danes kaže da je tam katoliška cerkev.





## This and That from Washington

A bill of particular importance to the 22nd District came to the House floor on April 30, H. R. 5992, "A Bill To confirm and establish the titles of the States to lands beneath navigable waters within State boundaries and natural resources within such lands and waters and to provide for the use and control of said lands and resources." This is of far greater moment than would at first appear.

As pointed out by one of the committee, it upholds our dual form of government that no matter how strong the central government it must never encroach upon the states.

The principle involved is very grave, the Supreme Court decision being interpreted as a first step towards national socialism. This decision has been described as "confiscation without compensation" and caused untold confusion so that action by the Congress to clarify was imperative.

Our own Attorney General Hugh S. Jenkins submitted a splendid statement to the committee. He called attention to several important facts: Ohio's 184 miles of shore line and the estimated 3,540 square miles of submerged lands upon which improvements, mostly port facilities, are valued at about \$500 million. We can be proud of his share in the final bill.

Feature event of the afternoon will be Roger Daniels, who will present his famous puppet show.



CORNELL University is to have an interesting experience from August 2 to 13, thanks to a program sponsored jointly by the University and the British Embassy here. Thirty representatives of British business and industry will have a course of classroom and field work covering contemporary American life. The idea is to enlighten Britons stationed in the United States as to our ways; an orientation course, as to speak. Sounds like a good idea.

## Warns Veterans on Bonus Checks

All Ohio veterans who will get bonus checks were cautioned by Courtney E. Kirby, assistant director of the World War II Compensation fund to observe the following:

That a check may be endorsed only by the person to whom it is payable; that there is a 60-day limit on cashing the check, and that if the eligible veteran has died, the check must be returned to Columbus and the nearest kin must file on "Form 2."

Bonus checks are now being mailed at a rate of 2,000 daily. More than 610,000 applications have now been received. The check-writing will soon be accelerated to about 6,000 daily, Kirby said.

The woman testified that she was not interested in accepting the job because the pay was too low and she could draw more in unemployment benefits. The Board, however, ruled her ineligible for benefits because she was reasonably fitted for the work and the rate of pay was substantially the same as that prevailing in her locality.

In a similar ruling the Board suspended a Columbus woman's rights to draw benefits. The woman, a stenographer, stated that she quit her job because she was dissatisfied with her salary since men who performed the same work received a higher rate of pay. The testimony, however, revealed that her wage rate was higher than that of other women stenographers.

A Portsmouth shoe worker was denied benefits when the Board decided she was not justified in refusing to investigate a job opportunity offered by the Ohio State Employment Service, a division of the B.U.C. The job paid 40 cents an hour as a guaranteed minimum, with an opportunity to earn more under the piecework system.

The woman testified that she was not interested in accepting the job because the pay was too low and she could draw more in unemployment benefits. The Board, however, ruled her ineligible for benefits because she was reasonably fitted for the work and the rate of pay was substantially the same as that prevailing in her locality.

After the decision was made the Board was informed that the woman accepted a job with the shoe company to which the Employment Service had originally referred her.
