Nasim cenjenim naročnikom naznanjamo, da bo od 10. novembra naprej Ameriška Domovina \$8.50 na leto, za \$1.50 na leto bo torej dražja.

Nismo radi storili tega koraka, toda k temu nas silijo sedanje razmere: višja meza delavcem in dražji papir.

Od tiskarske unije smo dobili včeraj obvestilo, da je meza za stavce od 1. novembra naprej \$18.00 na dan, ali \$90.00 na teden za 5 dni dela v tednu. Dozdaj so dobivali po \$81.20 na teden. Meza strojnikom je zvišana za 15 centov na uro, kar znaša \$5.50 več na teden.

Zadnjič smo zvišali naročnino v decembru 1945. Takrat so dobivali naši unijski stavci \$58.56 na teden, torej dobivajo zdaj \$31.44 na teden več.

Tiskarski papir je bil takrat po \$63 ena tona, dočim ga plačujemo danes po \$93 tona.

In vendar nismo kljub vsem tem izdatkom nič zvišali naročnine dozdaj. Nekaj smo polovili pri oglaših, nekaj pa na tiskovinah, pa smo rinili naprej. Zdej pa ne gre drugače, da ali povečamo nekoliko zvišamo, ali pa da "zapremo štacuno".

Naši naročniki bodo gotovo uvideli, da drugače ne gre in bodo radi dodali tisti dolar in pol na leto za naročnino. Vsak vidi, da drugače ne gre. Prosimo torej, da to vzamete s pametno preudarnostjo na znanje in se potem ravnote.

Od ponedeljka 10. novembra 1947 bo Ameriška Domovina \$8.50 na leto in sicer za Cleveland po raznašalcih, po pošti, ali pa naročnikom drugod po Ameriki. Za Kanado ali Evropo bo pa list po \$10.00 na leto od ponedeljka naprej.

RAZNO PO SVETU

MOLOTOV TRDI, DA JE ZNANA ATOMSKA BOMBA

London. — Sovjetski zunanji minister Molotov je včeraj govoril v Moskvi ob priliki 30. letnice boljševiške revolucije, da tajnost atomske bombe ne obstoja več. Rekel pa ni, če to tajnost Rusija že pozna.

Obenem je obdoličil Zed. države, da skušajo dobiti vojaške baze po vsem svetu, da bi obkrožile Rusijo. Dalje je izjavil, da kapitalizem umira in da danes vodijo vsa pota v — komunizem. Sledil je buren aplavz poslušalcev, kakopak.

RUSIJO HOČEJO VREČI IZ ZVEZE NARODOV

New York. — Sovjetski delegat Andrej Višinski je včeraj obdoličil zapadne zaveznike, da nameravajo vreči Sovjetsko Rusijo iz Zveze narodov. Ta ukaz da sta dali Amerika in Anglija.

Višinski je napravil to obdoličitev na predlog Zed. držav, da naj Zveza narodov ustvari malo skupščino, ki bo ves čas na delu. To, je rekel Višinski, je samo namen zapadnih zaveznikov, da vzamejo moč varnostnemu koncilu in pravici votiranja.

ČEŠKA VLADA SE

JE UKLONILA KOMUNISTOM

Praga. — Češka vlada, v kateri je 8 strank, je rešila vladno krizo s tem, da se je popolnoma uklonila komunistom. Z 12 proti 10 glasovom je dala polno moč premierju-komunistu Klementu Gottwaldu, da presnuje vladno pot, ko so tri stranke izjavile, da ne bodo več sodelovale z vlado.

S tem so dobili komunisti na Češkem popolno kontrolo nad deželo. Premier Gottwald, nekdanji navadni kovač, ima deželo v pesteh.

V LONDONU PRIDE DO ODLOČITVE Z RUSIJO

Washington. — Na 25. nov. se bodo sestali v Londonu zunanji ministri Zed. držav, Anglije, Francije in Rusije, da napravijo in sklenejo mirovne pogodbe za Nemčijo in Avstrijo. Ameriški diplomati imajo malo upanja, da bi ministri kaj sklenili, ker ne pričakujejo, da bi Rusija sodelovala.

Tukaj je mnenje, da če Rusija ne bo pri volji sodelovati z ostalimi zavezniki v tem oziru, da bodo Zed. države sklicale mirovno konferenco vseh zaveznikov, ki bo potem napravila brez Rusije mirovno pogodbo za Nemčijo in Avstrijo.

FARMARJI BI BIL S TEM MNOGO OLAJŠANO

Washington. — Senator Wherry iz Nebraske bo predložil v prihodnjem zasedanju kongresa predlog, da sme farmar odšteti pri dohodninskem davku izdatke, ki jih ima za izboljšanje svoje zemlje in gospodarstva.

Farmar danes ne sme odšteti pri davkih stroške za nabavo novega drevja, za pognojevanje zemlje, za čiščenje iste, za vrtnenje za vodo, za kopanje namakalnih kanalov, za uravnanje potokov, za napravo jezov ali betonskih korit.

Resna beseda ameriškim Slovencem

V naslednjem so besede, ki jih je govoril dr. Miha Krek na shodu v Jolietu, Ill., zadnjo nedeljo. Pazno prečitajte iskrene besede voditelja Slovencev. Ne tičejo se samo naše stare domovine, ampak tudi nas tukaj v Ameriki.

V nedeljo dne 2. novembra so zborovali slovenski katoličani v Jolietu. Ob pol treh je navzoče pozdravil predsednik Lige, župnik Rev. Matija Butala in naznanil, da je glavna točka prireditve poročilo dr. Miha Kreka, ki je pred kratkim prišel v USA, poprej pa tri leta živel v Italiji in tam organiziral socialno pomoč za slovenske begunce. Pevski zbor je na to zapel skupno šest, moški zbor sam pa dve prelepi slovenski narodni pesmici, ki so jih pevali odpele z navdušenjem in izurjenostjo, da so ubrano lil v dvorano duha in srce oživljajoči akordi naše domače pesmi in priklicali med vse zborovalce žive spomine na slovensko domovino, kakoršna je bila nekdanj. Vrhovni tajnik K. S. K. J., g. Josip Zalar, je nato predstavil poročevalca in popisal njegovo življenje in delo med drugo svetovno vojno in v po-vojnem času.

Dr. Miha Krek je govoril poldrugo uro. Živo je popisoval, kako je prihrumel vihar vojne na stari kraj v aprilu 1941, kako je bila Slovenija raztrgana in razdeljena med tri okupatorje: nemce, Italijane in Madžare.

kako so Slovenci med vojno bili preganjani, preseljevani v Nemčijo, v Srbijo, na Hrvaško, kako so umirali po koncentracijskih taboriščih v Italiji, kako so nacisti in fašisti streljali slovenske ljudi kot talce in kako so uničevali in požigali naše vasi in domove.

"Narod je bil ves proti okupatorju, proti nacistom in fašistom," je dejal dr. Krek, "in okupator je to dobro vedel. Posebno so nacisti sovražili slovensko zavedno narodno duhovščino, zato so jo pregnali, sramotili in po-niževali, zato so cerkve in samostane zapirali in cerkveno premoženje na štajerskem in Gorenjskem konfiscirali. Nemci so takoj v prvih mesecih hoteli imeti narod brez vodstva in zagovornikov, zato so pregnali iz dežele vse izobražence, posebno tiste, ki so v javnem življenju kaj pomenili.

Nič boljši niso bili fašisti v ljubljanski pokrajini, le da so nastopali bolj zvižno in zahrbitno, a končno so napravili še več škode in prelili še več slovenske krvi kot nacisti v severnem delu Slovenije.

Hudo nam je in sram mora biti vsakega Slovenca, da mora ob vsem tem ugotoviti, da oni oboji skupaj, nacisti in fašisti, niso napravili Slovencem toliko gorja kot komunisti, ki so Slovence po imenu in na papirju, ki so se "povampirili" in postali naši krvniki, hujši kot nekdanj turški janičarji.

Sredi vsega okupacijskega gorja, sredi svetovne vojne se je namreč v Sloveniji pojavilo najstrašnejše: Izdajalstvo komunistične stranke. Doma v Sloveniji smo pred vojno imeli komaj nekaj odstotkov komunističnih pristašev. Njihovi voditelji, ki so se pojavili med vojno na Slovenskem, so večnoma mladi ljudje, ki so pred vojno živeli in se šolali v Rusiji, zadnji čas pred vojno in že med vojno pa so jih boljševiki poslali domov z nalogo, da zakurijo

ogenj civilne vojske, strahotno komunistično revolucijo. Narod naš se je komunistom z vsemi močmi upiral, nazadnje se je branil z orožjem, kjerkoli ga je dobil. Naši fantje in moške bi bili komuniste premagali in nikdar bi v Sloveniji ne imeli komunistične vlade, če bi odločale samo slovenske moči. Toda naenkrat je delovalo več različnih vzrokov, da je komunistična stvar v Sloveniji začela le obveljati. Prvi vzrok je bil ta, da so nacisti in fašisti radi videli, kako komunisti koljejo Slovence. To klanje je bila voda na njih mlin. Čim več Slovencev bo poklanih, tem bolje za Lahe in Nemce, ki so oboji smatrali komuniste za najprimernejše orodje, da zapisejo slovensko ime smrti. Zato so eni in drugi komuniste tajno in javno podpirali, zato italijanske oblasti niso našle nobenega komunističnega ubijalca, ko so pod njihovimi strelji in noži na sredi ulic in pri belem dnevu umirali duhovniki, politični voditelji in mladi fantje slovenski. Istočasno, ko sta Hitler in Mussolini z največjimi bobni grmela proti komunisti-

bi se slovenski komunisti mirno sprehajali po Ljubljani, vodje komunističnih band pa sklepali z nemškimi in italijanskimi komandanti pogodbe o medsebojni pomoči v pobijanju in uničevanju demokratičnih Slovencev. Komunisti so se tekom vojne zvezali z vsemi našimi narodnimi sovražniki, da bi prišli do moči in izvršili revolucijo. To je bil prvi vzrok naše narodne nesreče. Drugi vzrok so bili zunanji in veljajo enako za nas Slovence kot za vse druge narode, ki ječe pod boljševiško diktaturo.

Državniki, ki so v imenu zapadnih demokracij vodili vojno v Evropi, so se namreč neprestano bali, da se bosta Stalin in Hitler naenkrat zopet zvezala, kakor sta bila zaveznika v vojni leta 1939 in 1940, in da bosta s skupnimi močmi udarila proti zapadu. Zato, da bi to preprečili, so zastopniki Anglije in Amerike na konferencah v Moskvi, Teheranu in Jalti enostavno izdali svoje prijatelje in zaveznike v srednji in vzhodni Evropi in jih izročili na milost in nemilost komunistično-boljševiški strahovlad. Na ta način je bil pod pritiskom in na zahtevo Stalina imenovan za boljševiškega oblastnika v Jugoslaviji generalni tajnik komunistične stranke Josip Broz, ki mu danes pravijo Tito.

Mnogo jih je, žal le preveč, Slovencev v Ameriki, ki te bridke resnice ne verjamejo. Zlasti tisti, ki stoje izven katoliških vrst, hočejo sami sebe prepričati, da je v starem kraju po tej vojni samo malo drugačna vlada, drugače pa je vse v redu. Celo nekateri, ki trdijo o sebi, da hočejo bitid obri katoličani in do-bri Amerikanci še vedno trmasto vztrajajo "za Tita," češ da so tako zvesti svojemu narodu in svoji narodni državi Jugoslaviji. No, hvala Bogu, da je to številno vsaki dan manjše.

Razumem, če je bilo veliko takih med vojno in v prvih mesecih po vojni. Takrat je svetovna propaganda Tita v zve-

zde kovala in prevpila vso žalostno resnico o starem kraju. Toda danes, ko je že ves zapadni svet spoznal strahovite napake, ki so se delale med vojno, danes, ko ameriški javni delavci brez razlike ver in pokolenj pripovedujejo in opisujejo razmere v Jugoslaviji enako kakor jaz, danes, ko se ves svet trese pred novo vojno s Sovjetsko Unijo, danes, ko je Tito po vsej Ameriki znan kot zastopnik režima, ki je najbolj rogovilasta nevarnost za mir v Evropi, danes, ko so boljševiki prenesli v Belgrad centralo svoje obnovljene kominterne za Balkan in Srednjo Evropo, danes pa res za nikogar ni več izgovora. Kdor ja danes še za Tita in jugoslovanski komunistični režim, je to ali iz prepričanja, ker je sam komunist, ali pa iz trme, ker neče videti resnice. Demokrat in katoličan pa za Titovo diktaturo ne sme in ne more biti. Ne jaz, ampak nek drugi gospod, ki je Titu služil več kot leto dni in tudi v Ameriki naredil veliko propagando zanj, je imenoval samega sebe in vse tiste, ki niso komunisti, pa se za

stični režim navdušujejo iz trme ali pa iz neumnosti, za "koristna budala." (Bil je to znani hrvaški žurnalst Radica. O-pom. ured.)

Želim, da bi titovci našli med ameriški Slovenci čim manj "koristnih tepcev," zato naj opozorim na dve, tri okolnosti.

Vsi veste, da je iz boljševiškega dela Evrope proti zapadu pribežalo ob koncu vojne okrog dva milijona ljudi. Vsi veste, da niti en človek ni bežal iz zapadnega dela Evrope v vzhodno boljševiško Evropo. Ali se tisti, ki še danes Tita in Stalina hvalijo, ne vprašajo, zakaj to strašno moderno prisilno preseljevanje. Zakaj so milijoni zapustili rodno grudo in domovino in šli v neznano tujino, da si rešijo življenje? Ali že visoka številka teh nesrečnejšev ne govori dovolj glasno, da je pod boljševiški strašen pekel na zemlji?

Vsi veste tudi to, da so se tisoči in tisoči ruskih vojakov branili vrniti se domov v Rusijo in da so prosili Angleže in Amerikance, naj jih sprejmejo in pošljejo, kamorkoli na svetu, samo nazaj v Rusijo ne. In to niso bili kakš "beli Rusi," to so bili vojak in oficirji "Rdeče armade." Med temi je bila cela vrsta samomorov, ko so nekatere edinice bile primorane, da se vrnejo nazaj v rdečo boljševiško domovino. Ali ste pa že slišali, da bi angleški, ameriški ali francoski vojaki ali drugi ljudje šli v komunistični raj?

Nemogoče je vedno in vedno ponavljati, kaj napravlja življenje pod komunistično tiranijo tako strašno, da človek, ki hoče živeti kot svobodno bitje,raje zapusti vse in riskira vse, samo tam živeti noče.

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Konec "mrzle vojne"

Walter Lippmann, znani in uvaževani časnika, piše, da je po prepotovanju vzhodne in zapadne Evrope ter Nemčije dobil vtis, da so Rusi izgubili svojo tako zvano "mrzlo" vojno in da se tega tudi dobro zavedajo. Mi, Amerikanci, pa na drugi strani ne vemo tega, zato smo smatrali grobost Višinskijevega govorjenja za rusko moč, zato smo nepravilno, da bi konstruktivno izbrali to priliko za poravnavo evropskih problemov, katera prilika je zdaj mnogo bliže kot si domišljamo.

Analogija vojne bo morda pojasnila to, kar bi rad povedal pravi Lippmann. Mi smo naredili dvoje velikih napač, ki sta nas obe drago stali. Prvič, smo mi podcenjevali moč Japonske in Nemčije kakor tudi njunih namenov, česar posledica je bila, da smo bili nepravilno, ko je napočila vojna. Potem pa, proti koncu vojne, smo precenjevali njeno moč, zato smo bili zopet nepravilni za sklepanje miru. Iz prve napake smo črpali nauke in, kakor se zdi, smo uspešno zavrgli vojaško ekspanzijo sovjetskega imperija. Iz druge napake pa se nismo ničesar naučili.

Potek dogodkov v zapadni Evropi dokazuje, da se visoko razvitih držav ne da zavzeti s komunistično propagando in infiltracijo. Te države ne reagirajo na glad, inflacijo ter na paraliziranje vlad s tem, da bi se obrnile v komunistično stranko. Nasprotno, one se obračajo na desno — ne na levo — h konservativcem, reakcionarjem in v ekstremni agoniji k — fašizmu.

Se je zgodilo v Evropi po prvi svetovni vojni in to se dogaja zdaj. Mi smo bili zelo zavedeni od naših profesionalnih antikomunistov, ki niso mogli zapopasti elementarnega dejstva, da so komunisti manjšina — v glavnem manjšina mest — ki morejo zavzeti moderno državo samo tedaj, če imajo za seboj armado, ki stare vsako opozicijo. Komunistična stranka, ki ne more v zapadni državi privabiti več kot 30 odstotkov ljudstva v svoje vrste, ne more nikoli zavzeti države s štrajki in sabotažo. Ona lahko samo paralizira vladno in razdere socialni red. Toda to pa razplamti v gnevu ostalih 70 odstotkov ljudstva, ki ne tvorijo samo večine, temveč ima na razpolago tudi vse instrumente socialne oblasti — armado, Cerkev, birokracijo, kmete, ki lahko obdržijo svoja živila doma, mesto da bi jih pošiljali v mesta, lastnike industrije in drugega narodnega bogastva.

Komunistična stranka bi potrebovala podporo silne vojaške pomoči, če bi hotela premagati in likvidirati tako opozicijo. V zapadni Evropi se to nikjer ne dogaja in se menda tudi v bodoče ne bo dogodilo, dokler bo Rdeča armada trdno pritisnjena ob Stettin-Trst črto. In ta armada je tam trdno pritisnjena ne sicer po naših četah v Evropi — temveč po naši totalni sili in po našem dokazu, katerega smo ji dali, da vemo, kje in kako izbrati svojo udarno moč, ako bi Rdeča ali Titova armada prekorčila vojaško mejo.

Zdi se, da lahko rečemo, da je bilo prodiranje komunizma v zapadno Evropo ustavljeno, ko smo poslali bojno ladjo Missouri v vzhodno Sredozemsko morje. To je bilo ob času, ko je postala sovjetska propaganda besno antiameriška. Ta sovjetska furija je bila porojena iz spoznanja, da je bila Rdeča armada v Evropi izbočena in da je nam znana pot do vitalnega in ranljivega srca Sovjetske Unije.

Od takrat dalje je bila mrzla vojna za Rusijo izgubljena, čeprav smo mi nadaljevali in še nadaljujemo z njenim bojevanjem, kakor da smo še vedno na ofenzivi.

Zdi se, da je Kremelj že letošnjo pomlad spoznal in realiziral svojo pozicijo. Več zaupnih in verodostojnih virov je izjavilo, da so bili letošnjo pomlad francoski in italijanski komunistični voditelji poklicani pred tajni tribunal, kjer jih je eden najvišjih urdnikov ruske komunistične stranke obtožil polomijade. Povedano jim je bilo, da so kolaborirali s socialisti, liberalci in krščanskimi demokrati, pa jim ob vsem tem ni uspelo, da bi bili privedli Francojo in Italijo v območje sovjetske diplomacije. 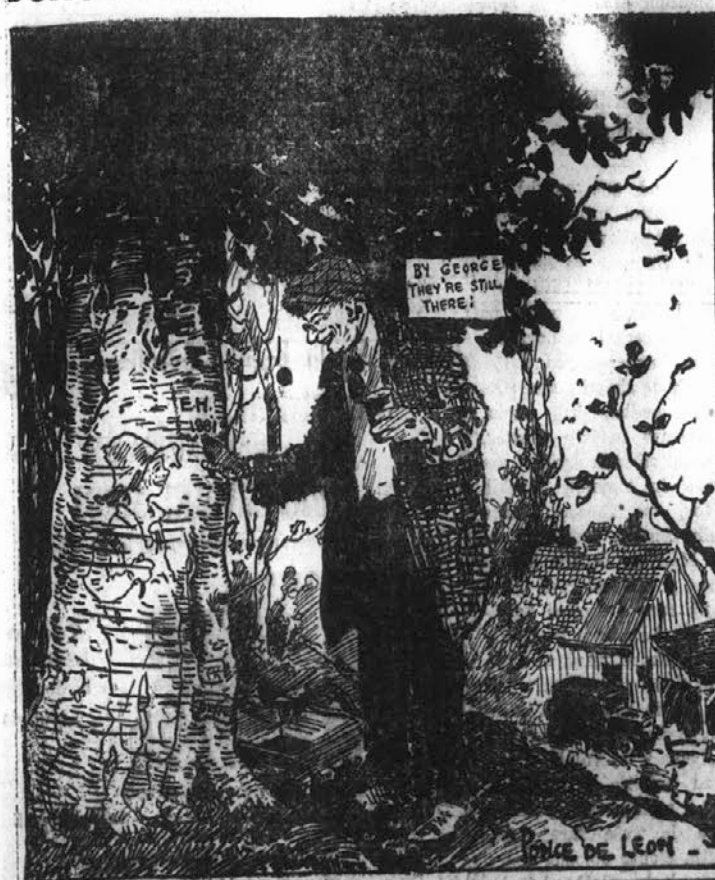

U. S. Armed Forces Seen As Power For Peace

Major Fred G. D. Mauck commanding the Cleveland army and air force recruiting service, announced that, while Armistice Day is a time for reflecting, it is also a time for all Americans to resolve that America shall stay strong.

"Too many of us are prone to forget the lessons of the past," he said. "After World War I, we thought another war just couldn't happen so we virtually wrecked our military establishment and along came World War II."

One of the best means of assuring that it won't happen again, he said, is to keep our Armed Forces up to fully authorized strength.

Major Mauck said America should look to the men of its Army, Navy and Air Force and its Marine Corps and Coast Guard as holding in their hands a share of responsibility for preventing World War III.

"The fine young men in uniform today realize more than most of us the true value of a strong America in a world groping for permanent peace," Major Mauck said. "They are alert, well-trained, well-equipped and they are carrying out their vital peacetime mission with all the zeal and devotion to duty which characterized the U. S. fighting man in battle."

Emphasizing the high caliber of America's men in uniform, Major Mauck said that, at Army and Air Force Recruiting Stations across the country, only about 90 out of every 100 applications for service are being accepted.

"While the recruiting quota is 30,000 men a month for the Army and Air Force," he said, "the high degree of selectivity employed makes it imperative that we get at least 50,000 applicants monthly."

Major Mauck said the Army's quota is 21,000 monthly and the Air Force's 9,000. These, he said, are the basic minimum required to meet our commitments at home and abroad.
