## Izrael vidi vodnika gverilcev v Naserju

Gverilci, ki jih sestavljajo v glavnem palestinski Arabci in njihovi otroci, so po sodbi Izraela pod vodstvom Naserja.

ZDROUŽENI NARODI, N.Y.—Gen. Odd Bull, načelnik osebja Združenih narodov, ki nadzira premirje med Izraelom in Egiptom, je opozoril ZN, da postaja stanje ob Suezu "resno". V zadnjih dneh postaja streljanje preko nekaj običajnega.

Gverilski napadi, sabotaže in postavljanje bomb in min povečuje napetost med Arabci in Izraelci vsak dan bolj. Gverila je postala eno glavnih vprašanj, s katerimi se bodo morale ukvarjati štiri velike sile, ki iščejo pot pomiritve Srednjega vzhoda. Izraelski poslanik pri ZN Yosef Tekoah je v posebnem pismu opozoril predsednika Varnostnega sveta ZN Armando Berardu, da je Egipt "javno začel podpirati" gverilske skupine, ki da so dejansko tudi njegova lastna stvaritev.

Izrael ne očita Naserju v Egiptu, da podpira palestinske gverilce, ampak trdi, da so ti tudi pod njegovim vodstvom, četudi je uradno njihov vodnik in polvelnik Yasir Arafat, ki je bil nedavno izbran za predsednika Palestinske osvobodilne organizacije v Kairu. Ta hoče sedaj spraviti vse svoje sile, tudi "palestinsko osvobodilno vojsko", v Jordaniju, kjer naj bi podpirala gverilske vpade na ozemlje, zasedeno po Izraelu.

## Husein se otepa pomoči

Naser je v svojem nedavnom javnem govoru trdil, da je potrebno okrepiti "vzhodne" meje proti Izraelu, pod čemer razumejo v Kairu izraelsko mejo proti Jordaniji, Siriji in Libanonu. To naj bi bilo doseženo ne le s prestatvitvijo 3000 mož "palestinske osvobodilne vojske" iz Egipta v Jordanijo, ampak tudi s prestatvitvijo kuvaškega oddelka iz Egipta v Jordanijo, s okrevitvijo čet savdske Arabije v južni Jordaniji in, če treba, še s pošiljanjem egiptskih čet. Kralj Husein vse te "pomoči" ne mara, ker se boji, da bi bolj okreplila njegove sovražnike, kot pa pomagala varovati Jordanijo. Da bi se te pomoči otepel, je poslal v Kairo predsednika vlade in zunanjega ministra na razgovore.

## "Julie" in "Tricia"

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Vesti iz Bele hiše trdijo, da bo predsednik R. M. Nixon skoro preimenoval predsedniški jahti, 92 čevljev dolgo "Honey Fitz" v "Tricia", 64 čevljev dolgo "Patrick J." pa v "Julie". Ena od njiju bo odplovila v Florido, kjer bo predsedniku na razpolago pri njegovih kratkih odmorih v Key Biscayne.

Tretja, največja jahta "Sequoia", ki služi za zabavo tujih gostov Bele hiše, bo ohranila svoje staro ime.

## Gana se pripravlja na padec diktature

Vojaki, ki so pred 3 leti pregnali Nkrumaha, hočejo vrnilti državi ustavno vladu.

AKRA, Gana. — Vojaška diktatura v Gani ne bo končana s silo. Prav narobe, vojaki želijo miren prehod k civilni upravi. Ko so pred tremi leti prevzeli oblast kot voditelji Sveta narodne osvoboditve, so postavili 7-člansko vodstvo javne uprave, obenem so se pa obvezali, da bodo najkasneje do 30. septembra 1969 vrnili deželi njeno nekdanjo svobodno upravo. Dan 30. septembra bdi zato pred očmi vsem, ki niso zadovoljni z diktaturom ali pa upajo, da bodo imeli osebno korist od civilne uprave.

Teh ni malo. So se že začeli zbirati v razne krožke in skupine, seveda z željo, a svoje gibanje preustvarijo v politične stranke, ki naj prevzamejo oblast.

Najprvo so se zdramili pristaši bivše diktature predsednika Nkrumaha. Je to lep zbor nazadnjaških, nacionalistično pobaranjih politikov. Računajo tudi na pomoč vojaških krogov. Na organizacijo politične stranke misijo tudi voditelji nekaterih večjih plemen, ki svoje dni niso bila preveč sovražna režimu diktatorja Nkrumaha. To je pa še začetek. Čim bolj se bo blížal 30. september, tem več bo strank — vsaj na papirju.

Večina prebivalstva se za vse to ne meni. Gospodarsko delo se je popravilo, vojaška diktatura pa ni prestroga. Zato misli marsikdo, da bi bilo najbolje, da vsaj zaenkrat ostane vse pri starem. Morda bo ta ideja prevladala v septembri.

## Debata o zvezi med dobrodelenostjo in politiko prišla na dnevni red

CLEVELAND, O. — Precej neprčakovano je dejelo presenetila vest, da se je znani kongresnik Mills, načelnik Domovega odbora za pot in sredstva in obenem proračunskega odbora, vnel za "davčno reformo", dasiravno ne taji, da je velik prijatelj še večjih podjetij in rad poskrbi, da jim federacija ne nalaga bremen, posebno denarnih v obliku dakov. Tak korak kongresnika Millsa ni ostal dolgo neraumljiv. Nekateri politični pojavi so mu dali hitro vsaj priznani zanesljivo razlag.

Najprvo ni nobena tajna, da bi Mills rad postal predsednik predstavnika doma, ko se bo od tam umaknil 77 let stari McCormack. Treba mu je torej skrbeti, da bo njegovo imestalo v javnosti in zmeraj dobro zapisano. Vnema, da davčno reformo je gotovo zelo dobro priporočilo za vsakega politika, ki ima še ambicije in Mills jih ne manjka.

Med tem je izza kulisi pri vreda še druga zanimiva novica: nekateri republikani se pritožujejo, da se denar, ki ga delijo velike ustanove, kot na primer Fordova, po ovinkih predelih, kjer je največ črnskih otrok. Denar je po tej po-

ne samo za dobrodelne. Trdijo namreč tole:

Naša davčna politika sili bogataše, da svojega premoženja ne zapuščajo dedičem, kajti v tem slučaju je javna roka največji dedič, ki pobreve vso smetano iz vsakega testamonta. Zato zapuščajo svoje premoženje dobrodelnim ustanovam, ki jim davorkarje ne morejo bližu.

Tako je na primer tudi Fordova družina prenesla velik del svojega premoženja na Fordovo dobrodelno ustanovo in ji predpisala, v kakšne namene lahko uprava ustanove rabi letne dohodke. Uprava ustanove lahko pride v čudne roke, na primer v take, ki niso republikanskega duha. V tem slučaju gredo lahko Fordove dobre v roke tem akcijam, ki jih Fordova družina gotovo ne odobrava. In to se je tudi zgodilo.

Fordova ustanova je pod vplivom Kennedyjevega prijatelja in zaupnika G. Bundyja, ki je sedaj glavni uradnik ustanove, namenila nekaj denarja tudi nujorški akciji za spremembo sedanega prosvetnega sistema v mestnih predelih, kjer je največ črnskih otrok. Denar je po tej po-

ti prišel v roke interesentom, ki se sicer pulijo za črnsko ravnnopravnost v prosteti, imajo pa pri tem tudi druge namene, ki z njimi delajo sestnosti njujo rskemu republikanskemu županu Lindsayju.

Republikanska stranka trdi, da se denar dobrodelnih ustanov ne sme po ovinkih kanalizirati v svrhe, ki so ocitno politično pobaranje. To pa tem bolj, ker dobrodelne ustanove ne plačujejo nobenih dakov. Fordova ustanova je na podoben način financirala v Clevelandu črnsko akcijo za vpis novih volivcev preko CORE. Namen je vreden pohvale, toda zgodilo se je, da so "novi" volivci vsi volili za župana črnskega kandidata Stokesa in ne republikanca. To bi pa ne smelo biti!? Taka je republikanska kritika. Demokratje seveda odgovarjajo, da je čisto v redu, da Fordova ustanova podpira take in podobne akcije. Saj dosegla svoj namen: registrirani volivci je zmeraj več in to koristi sistemu ameriške svobodne demokracije. Ako novi volivci potem volijo demokrate in ne republikance, je to njihova stvar.

Taki in podobni slučaji se dogajajo tudi pri vseh velikih ustanovah. Na to je pa postal pozoren znani kongresnik Patmann, stari sovražnik vseh dobrodelnih ugodnosti, ki jih imajo naravnost dobrodelne ustanove, po ovinku pa tudi velike banke. Je že napovedal boj taki praksi v svojem Domovem odboru. Patmannova akcija bo gotovo sprožila živahnno debato, kdo naj uživa davčno prostost in kdo ne. O tem bo odločal ne Patmanov, ampak Mills odbor. Zato je Mills tako hitro pripravljen na davčno "reformo". Z ozirom na ta njegov nagib, bi lahko rekli že sedaj: davčna reforma bo v glavnem obravnavala davčno prostost dobrodelnih organizacij, ne bo se pa preveč vneto spuščala v omejevanje raznih privilegijev, ki jih imajo velika podjetja na primer pri številu in obsegu odbitih postavk pri davčnih napovedih.

Seveda bo ta debata hotela spaviti na čisto tudi odnose med Kennedyjevo družino in dobrodelnimi ustanovami, tudi Fordova. Debata bo torej ne samo živahnja, ampak tudi zanimiva, kolikor je ne bodo "višje politične sile" že preje spravile k molku.

## Van Thieu nastopa proti zagovornikom koalicije

SAIGON, J. Viet. — Predsednik republike Van Thieu je začel vneto preganjati zagovornike koalicije z vietnamsko OF. Postavil se je na stališče, da je njegova vlada rekla v Parizu, da ne mara nobene zveze z domačimi komunisti in da se tega načela mora držati tudi prebivalstvo v Južnem Vietnamu. Zdi se, da domačini niso zmeraj tistih misli, ki jih zagovarja predsednik. Jih ni strah, da vkljub uradnim prepovedim zagovarjajo koalicijo z OF.

Takih zagovornikov je največ med inteligenco, budističnimi redovniki, študenti in srednjimi stanovi.

Seveda ne morejo zagovorniki tako skrity svojih misli, da ne bi zanje zvedela policija. Zato je bilo zadnje dni aferiranih na ducale domačinov, ki so osumljeni, da agitirajo za koalicijo s komunisti.

Strah ima velike oči: morda velja, da pregorov tudi za Van Thieua. Ni torej izključeno, da je preveč vnet v iskanju pristaševideje o koaliciji. Na drugi strani je najbrž res, da rdeči terenci, aktivisti in partizani namenoma in sistematično širijo govorce, da si koalicijo želi tudi OF.

Baje je OF že ustanovila svojo podtalno vlado, ki naj bi se pojavi v javnosti, kakor hitro bo v Parizu znagala ideja o koncentracijski vladi, ki naj bi bila vključena tudi južnoveselsko OF. Komunisti imajo svoje zaupnike povsed, ne samo med študenti in inteligenco. Zadnje dni je režim aferiral tudi nekaj oficirjev, ki so osumljeni, da na skrivnem sodelujejo z rdečimi zaupniki.

Pri včerajšnjem srečanju so rdeči trdo vstrajali pri svojih zahtevah in poudarjali, da je sporažno mogoče samo z zamerno vlade v Saigonu in s spremembo programa Južnoveselske Osvobodilne fronte. Z drugimi besedami se to pravi, da naj bi Združene države po petih letih krvavega vojskovanja, ki je zahtevalo preko 30.000 mrtvih, pozabilne na vse te žrtve in napore ter prepustile Južni Vietnam enostavno komunistični oblasti.

Pri včerajšnjem sestanku delegacij v Parizu je bil Cyrus Vance poslednji navzoč. On je stal na svojem mestu po odhodu Harrimana kot vez z novo delegacijo ZDA, da bi razgovori lahko nemoteno in brez prekinjivite tekli. Ti so kljub vsemu občitali. Vance je po sestanku dejal, da "upa, da bodo ti razgovori prinesli rešitev vietnamskega vprašanja". Vodnik ameriške delegacije H. C. Lodge je izjavil v razgovoru s časnikarji po koncu včerajšnjega sestanka, da od "teh javnih sestankov ne pričakuje veliko".

Prvji debati bodo prodajali domače pecivo, krofe, rezance, slaščice, jutri, v soboto, od 2. do 6. pop., v nedeljo pa od 7. z. do 2. pop. v šolskem avditoriju. Dobikek je namenjen cerkvi.

Baseball's first pro team, the Cincinnati Red Stockings, defeated the Cleveland Forest Citys, 25-6. The Red Stockings went on to win 64 games and tie one that year.

The 1969 campaign will also mark 30 years since the first sports event was televised. Princeton defeated Columbia, 2-1, in 10-innings on May 17, 1939 as Bill Stern described the action over some 480 TV sets in the New York area. 5. Try to avoid giving keys to deliverymen and other nonfamily members. Even the most scrupulously honest person may lose his keys or have them stolen.

6. Don't "protect yourself" by leaving your name and address in your key case. It's better to have a spare set of keys, take your loss if you lose your main set, and simply change the locks.

In a good neighborhood, a well furnished home or apartment is an especially inviting target. In a poorer neighborhood, some people may have an especially strong need for funds. And neighborhoods are important to consider, for no matter where you live, saving a few dollars on locks and keys may run your loss into the neighborhood of several thousand dollars.

Use the security measures you should, on the other hand, and more than one prospective burglar may be led to feel of your place: "It's a nice place to live, but I wouldn't want to visit there."
