With the third annual SSCU tenpin and duckpin tournaments now a matter of record in the annals of our Union, we can dissect the whole idea and see what the cross section tells us.

The underlying motive which prompted our SSCU to sponsor national duckpin and tenpin tournaments was to indicate to the English-speaking members that it is interested in them as a group distinctly apart from the senior members. Through the tournaments, including the annual basketball tourney held in Ely, Minn., in February, our Union unquestionably left the desired impression on the minds of the participants and spectators.

It is safe to say that a large proportion of performers entered the tournaments not so much with the idea of winning prizes, but more with the spirit of good fellowship; to avail themselves of the opportunity to renew old acquaintances, meet new ones and in general see what programs are being sponsored entirely in the interest of the English-speaking members.

At the alleys the four letters, SSCU, were repeated quite often, not only by member-bowlers-spectators, but by outsiders who wanted to know the nature of our Organization, what the four letters represented, and what were the limitations for membership.

The juvenile convention membership campaign was brought in the limelight at the two tournaments by members of various SSCU lodges, some of whom compared notes on the progress made by individual candidates. invariably, when our Union was discussed by individuals, the topic for discussion reverted to the second juvenile convention campaign.

The two tournaments, although each only of one day's duration, were stretched into days and weeks before the big day arrived. Such programs require weeks and months of preparation. The home town must prepare for the visitors, while the latter must make arrangements for the trip. All point their goal to the one day on which is held the tournament.

Therefore, to the initiated, the national SSCU tournaments embody many items that will prove advantageous to the Organization. To the uninitiated, the bowling tournaments may mean only the actual throwing of balls on the alleys, and eventually to see who knocks over the most pins for the highest scores, and with it the prizes.

Now let us turn our undivided attention to the second juvenile convention campaign for new members. The juvenile candidates for delegate are fire-enthused to reach the goal of securing thirty new juveniles or their equivalent into the lodge.

Director of the juvenile campaign, Stan Pechaver (Little Stan) has shown a great deal of resourcefulness with suggestions and ideas incorporated in his weekly articles. Under his capable direction the campaign appears to be moving in swift lines. Further, his letters forwarded to individual juveniles tend to keep all candidates on their toes, and if they fail to reach their goal it will not be because of any encouragement lacking on the part of Little Stan.

The English-speaking members of our Union should take pardonable pride in the fact that one of its own number is directing the juvenile convention campaign. Certainly this factor alone should spur the English-speaking members to take particular interest in the campaign and contribute their efforts towards making it the most successful membership campaign ever tackled by any fraternal organization.

FIFTY LODGES ACTIVE IN JUVENILE CAMPAIGN!

Cleveland Leads With Three Delegates!

Ely, Minn. — Coming into the second month of the Second Biennial Juvenile Convention drive, finds over 50 lodges actively engaged in what is the biggest campaign in the history of the Union. Thru Saturday, April 24, the list of candidates at the Home Office swelled to 46, three of which have already been elected delegates.

It is an exceptionally fine beginning! In the meantime, other lodges are gathering their forces together, and the total juvenile campaign-active lodges will be increased to an even greater number, with indications that every single lodge in the SSCU will be in the race by the time the campaign closes, June 30.

A comparison of figures of 1935 shows: That during the entire campaign in 1935—the first juvenile convention drive—a total of 84 candidates were in the field. With only a month gone in this second juvenile convention drive there are already 46 candidates in the field. Using that as a comparative figure, we find that the results of the drive are far ahead of the same period in 1935. It all indicates that records will be broken!

Heading the list of the quick-action lodges is lodge Ilirska Vila, No. 173 of Cleveland which already has qualified two delegates in Anton Primc Jr. and Albert Poklar. Are they stopping now? You bet not, because at the moment, they are helping Mary Vehar, who, there is no question about it, will become a delegate also! Back in Cleveland, we find the third juvenile delegate in Joseph Rudolf, Jr., of lodge 37 . . . and members and campaigners working hard to send Edward Zalar and Lillian Rudolf to this second convention! Hats off to Cleveland!

Pausing momentarily we scan the nation-wide situation. A birds-eye view shows us that the English-conducted lodges are not responding very satisfactorily. Out of approximately 25 of these lodges, only six have reported to the Home Office. What is wrong with the remaining 19?

Two more months of active campaigning remains! Come on English-conducted lodges, let's get going!

We turn to Pennsylvania. Out of the large SSCU enrollment of lodges and members we find only a few active — only ten candidates from Pennsylvania so far! Nothing in from lodge 36, Conemaugh!

Into Ohio, we drop into Barberton! Nothing in the nature of reports have come in either! Something must be wrong! Why not use Cleveland as an example, and really make Ohio the largest contributing state to the campaign! Times a'wastin'—and that means—back your candidates now!

Westward into Pueblo, Colorado, where there are two lodges. No reports! And in the 1935 convention, Pueblo was represented by Pauline Erjavec! Notice Little Stan says that NO REPORTS have come in—perhaps you are holding back a surprise. We hope so!

Our nerves throb so we cannot remain in one spot but must stir and drag about like caged beasts. Therefor when the podpolkovnik sends word to Košor and myself to report to him we are glad for once, for it offers something besides waiting.

It develops that we have been called to search out a break in the telephone line connecting this sector with the left wing. In reply to the officer's demand I answer that it would be suicide to attempt the task!

Pri sajenju vrtnic, mladih dreves in grmičja je treba paziti, da se korenine na soncu ne osušijo. Ako morajo tako rastline čakati na sajenje, naj se jim korenine zavijajo v mokre cujne ali pa se jih postavi v posodo vode. Primerna saditev je tista, pri kateri pridejo rastline takoj globoko v zemljo, kot so rastline prej. Korenini se ne sme zavijati ali tlaci skupaj, ampak naj se jih v izkupani jami lepo razporedi. Razume se, da pri sajenju ne rabimo samo lopate, ampak tudi roke in prste. Dolge debele raste korenine se smejajo precej prirezati. Polomljene ali ranjene korenine se morajo odstraniti. Gnojil se ne sme natrositi na korenine, ampak se iste dobro pokrije s samo zemljjo, na to se šele doda gnojil, toda nikdar ne svežega gnoja. Po saditvi naj se zemlja okoli korenin dobro prisne, nakar naj se rastline dobro zalije. Vse presajene grmičice in drevesa je priporočljivo dobro prirezati.
