### Elected by Directors

Other Officers of Bank Remain Same; Board of Directors Re-elected

Once again the same officers will be at the helm of the North American Trust Co. That was decided at the meeting of the board of directors Thursday night. The officers are: Dr. J. M. Seliskar, president; Frank Paulin, vice president; John Gornik, vice president; M. J. Grdina, assistant vice president; F. M. Jakšic, secretary; J. J. Grdina, treasurer; F. V. Verbič, assistant treasurer; F. T. Cullinan, counsel.

At the annual stockholders meeting Wednesday night, the same board of directors and advisory board were elected. The directors are 21 in number, while 13 men make up the advisory board.

At the meeting, much interest was displayed in the current new account campaign. The campaign is put on a competitive basis. The stockholders are divided into two teams; the one composed of the board of directors and the other of the rest of the stockholders.

The losing team will be obliged to give a banquet for the winners, the winner being decided on a point basis. One point is scored for each new account, while one point is given for each \$100.

There are two or three excellent shows in town this week. By far the best of the lot is the free puppet show being staged by the Messrs. Maurice Maschke and Burr Gongwer. You may be surprised to hear that these gentlemen are doing something gratis for the public, and well you may be, for it is pretty generally known that insomnia brought on by concern over the public welfare is very, very rare among political bosses. On, they have their generous moments, of course; now and then they will divide fifty-fifty with the "peepul." But taking it by and large—well, you will see that the "free" part of this show is all a merry jest. You will pay eventually, if not now.

You see, it's this way: Big, kindly, generous Cleveland is paying all the expenses of the production to start with. It is being staged in City Hall. The actors also are furnished by the City. The motions are caused by the manipulation of wires in the hands of Maurice and Burr, hidden from the audience up above. You know they are up there, though they keep out of sight. The wires also are invisible, due to the lighting effects. The chatter of the puppets is mostly clever ventriloquistic work on the part of the operators. There is some very good sleight-of-hand work too, as when one or another of the puppets circulates slyly through the audience and reappears on the stage with his pockets bulging suspiciously. A momentary diversion is caused by the ushers searching under the seats for missing valuables, thus giving the puppet a chance to dispose of his plunder.

The headliner is a specialty number by Maschke, a declamation entitled, "The Boss is Sore."

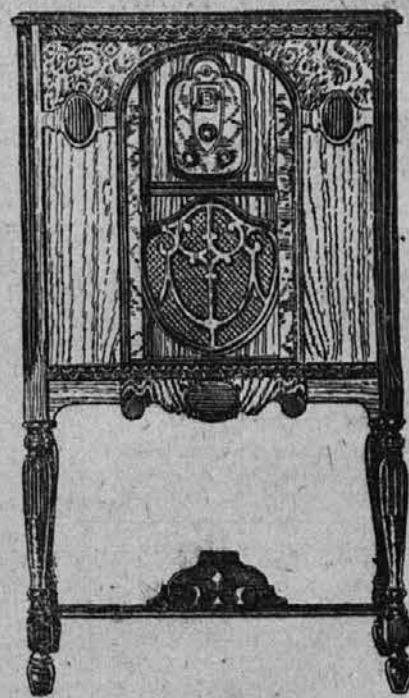
