

UPTON SINCLAIR PORAŽEN V CALIFORNIJI

Ampak navzlic opoziciji od
demokratske reakcije je
dobil več glasov kot kate-
ri demokrat pred njim v
državi.

SAN FRANCISCO, 7. nov. —
Na podlagi poročil iz dveh tre-
tin volilnih okrožij v državi je
bil "Epic" kandidat demokratske
stranke v Californiji, bivši
socijalist Upton Sinclair, večeraj
na volišču poražen. Frank Mer-
riam, reakcijski republikanec,
za katerega so agitali tudi
mašinski demokrati, bo bodoči
governor Californije.

Zadnja poročila kažejo: Mer-
riam 594,462, Sinclair 486,610,
Haigh 142,367. Merriamova ve-
čina dosedaj znaša 107,852 gla-
sov.

Ampak ogromno število gla-
sov za bivega socijalista je do-
šlo, da je velik del prebivalstva
nezadovoljen z obstoječimi raz-
merami in da zahteva radikalne
premembe. Se noben demo-
krat ni dobil v Californiji nikoli
toliko glasov kot jih je dobil
včeraj oče "Epic" programa za
oprgavo revščine, in to navzlic
toku, da so mu bili uradni gla-
sari demokratske stranke od-
pravi sovražni.

Vlada premierja Doumergue-a v Franciji padla; Herriot pozvan.

Vest o padcu vlade zadržana, ker se boji, da bo politična
kriza izzvala nove poulične boje.

PARIZ, 6. nov. — Politično
premirje med francoskimi stran-
kami desnice in leve, ki se je
začelo pred devetimi meseci, ko
je bil poklican k vladi "papa"
Doumergue, je bilo nocoj konča-
no, ko je bila Doumergue-ova
vlada prisiljena k resignaciji.

Politično krizo je povzročila
radikalna socijalistična stranka
bivšega premierja Herriota, ki
je s petimi kolegi vred naznanil
izstop iz kabineta, ker ni mogel
pristati na ustavne reforme, gla-
som katerih bi se moč predsed-
nika republike in premierja nad
kabinetom in parlamentom znat-
no povečala. Herriotova stranka
je namreč prepričana, da bi zah-
tebane reforme privedle Franci-
jo v diktaturo.

Predsednik Lebrun bo Herrio-
tu poveril nalogo da sestavi no-
vo vlado. Prijatelji pravijo, da
bo Herriot nalogo sprejel ter pu-
stil sedanji kabinet nedotaknjen
razen da bo sedanjega justične-
ga ministra Lemery nadomestil
z bivšim premierjem Tardieuom
ki je bil sedaj minister brez
portfelja, ter mu ponudil urad
pod-premierja.

Strah, da vladna kriza izzove
nove poulične boje, do kakršnih
je prišlo v februarju, ko je Sta-
visky bančni škandal povzročil
padec Daladierjevega ministri-
stva, pa je tako velik, da se je
odstopil premier odločil z urad-
nim naznanilom o resignaciji po-
čakati dokler ne bo sestavljen
novi kabinet.

ROOSEVELT JE NA DO- MU ČAKAL POROČIL

HYDE PARK, N. Y., 6. nov. —
Predsednik Roosevelt, ki je
prišel sem ter danes tukaj volil,
je nocoj na svojem domu spre-
jemal brzoglasna poročila o ve-
liki zmagi, ki so jo demokratje
izvojevali na volišču. V pre-
cinktu, kjer voli predsednik, je
demokratski governor Lehman
dobil 449 glasov, republikanec
Moses pa 376 glasov. Pred dve-
mi leti je Roosevelt v svojem
precinktu dobil le osem glasov
večine. Kot kažejo zadnja po-
ročila, je bil Lehman ponovno
izvoljen z največjo večino, ki jo
je kdaj dobil kak demokratski
governor v New Yorku. Znaša
namreč nad 1,250,000 glasov.

CHARLESTON, W. Va., 6.
nov. — Glasom še nepopolnih
poročil je val New Deala pokop-
pal republikanskega senatorja
Henry D. Hatfielda. Njegovo

ki je star šele 29 let. Holt bo
najmlajši član zveznega senata.

gova večina znaša samo 1,237
glasov.

Navaden prehlad

Navaden prehlad je tako na-
vaden, da se ne menimo zanj,
dasi obžalujemo, ker se tako
pogosto pojavlja med nami. Vsi
smo nagnjeni k naziranju, da je
navadni prehlad le lahko bole-
nje, in redki so tisti, če jih je
sploh kaj, ki smatrajo prehlad
za eno najbolj nalezljivih bole-
zni, ki napadajo človeka. Če bi
se moglo vsakemu dopovedati,
kako resno obolenje je kihanje
in "smrkanje," bi bilo upravič-
ljivo verjeti, da bi se mnogo
več ljudi posluževalo prepreč-
valnih sredstev, ki bi prehlad v
veliki meri omejila.

Kljub velikemu napredku me-
dicinske znanosti od časa Hipo-
krata naprej, še vedno navaden
prehlad in druge dihalne bole-
zni nadlegujejo človeštvo. Te
bolezni povzročijo več zamude
pri industrijah, pri obisku šol
in pri drugih človeških aktivno-
stih kot vse ostale bolezni sku-
paj; istotako povzročajo tudi
večjo ekonomsko škodo.

Glede navadnega prehlada so
določno znana dejstva, da je isti
nalezljiv, da napada osebe vsa-
ke starosti, da so moški zanj
nekoliko bolj dovzetni kot žen-
ske in da je najbolj razširjen v
zgodnji jeseni, sredi zime in v
zgodnji pomladi. Prispevajoči
faktorji so vreme, zračenje, pre-
hrana in splošno zdravstveno
stanje. Klinike označajo to bo-
lezen kot omejeno ali splošno
katarično vnetje dihalnih orga-
nov in v resnejših slučajih kot
vročnico, glavobol, počutek ne-
določne vznemirjenosti ali one-
moglost.

Dovzetnost za navadne bole-
zni dihal je splošna in napadi te
bolezni povzročajo neko imuni-
teto, ki pa je v najboljsem slu-
čaju kratka in prehodna. Akute-
ten prehlad se navadno odlikuje
z visoko nalezljivostjo, ki je
največja v začetku bolezni. Kaš-
ljanje, kihanje in sluz, ki pri-
haja iz nosa in ust, pomagajo k
širjenju drugih bolezni, kot so
pljučnica, dobri, meningitis in
druge.

Za kontrolo bolezni dihalnih
organov nimamo gotovih sred-
stev, pač pa imamo gotove pred-
pise za obrambo pred temi bo-
lezmi, katere bi morali vsi u-
poštevati. Tako bi morali gor-
koto v naših stanovanjih pravi-
lno regulirati, rok ne bi sme-
li nositi k ustom in bi si jih
morali pogosto umivati, poseb-
no pred jedjo, izogibati bi se
morali ljudskih gnebi, varovati
se prezebljenja, piti dosti vode
in skrbeti za redno telesno
odvajanje, oblačiti se gorko in
skrbeti, da so noge suhe; dalje
bi si morali privoščiti dosti
spanja in sicer 8 do 10 ur na
dan.

Kdor ima navaden prehlad in
nahod, naj misli tudi na druge
ljudi. Vsi tedaj naj se kolikor
mogoče od drugih ljudi proč
drži. Splošnega zdravlila za pre-
hlad nimamo, toda navade po-
sameznika in prava osebnostna
sna so največjega pomena. Kdor
dobi prehlad je z ozirom na nje-
govo lastno varnost priporoč-
ljivo, da si privoščijo počitek v
postelji. To večkrat zamori o-
kuženje v začetku, vselej poma-
ga k hitrejšemu okrevanju in
zmanjša možnost širjenja bole-
zenskih klic.

Brata La Follette zmagujeta v državi Wisconsin

Izgleda, da je "Progresivni
tiket" zmagal. Farmerji
so mu dali največjo oporo.

MILWAUKEE, 6. nov. — No-
vorojena "Progresivna stran-
ka" v Wisconsinu, katero sta u-
stanovila brata La Follette pred
nekaj meseci, potem ko sta u-
radno zapustila republikansko
stranko, je danes pokazala moč
starega političnega veterana.
Kot izgleda, je bil senator Rob-
ert La Follette zopet izvoljen
zveznim senatorjem, njegov
mlajši brat Philip, katerega je
pred dvema leti v demokratski
poplavi porazil governor Schme-
deman, pa se očitno zopet vrne
v governerski urad. Vendar
njegova zmaga še ni povsem go-
tova.

Kot se je pokazalo, ima mlada
"Progresivna stranka" največjo
oporo med farmerji, ki so izgu-
bili zaupanje tako v republikan-
ce kot demokrate.

Progresivci so šli v volilni boj
pod parolo, da je Wisconsin zi-

Vodja lakotnih stav- karjev na Ogrskem umorjen

Policija ga je tekom izpraše-
vanja vrgla skozi okno, da
bi izgledalo kot da je izvr-
šil samomor.

BUDIMPEŠTA, 5. nov. — O-
tto, Hoffman, komunistični vo-
dja 1.500 premogarjev v Pescu
(Pečuhu), ki so bili pred par te-
dni skozi štiri dni in noči v ro-
vih na lakotni stavki, ki je po-
vzročila simpatije svetovne jav-
nosti, je bil tukaj na policijskem
stanu brutalno umorjen, nato
pa je bilo njegovo truplo vrže-
no skozi okno tretjega nadstro-
pja na ulico, da bi izgledalo kot
da se gre za samomor.

Hoffmanov umor je odkril
mnogo novih strani pri vodstvu
groznega lakotnega štrajka in
pa glede brezmejnega sovraštva
premogovnih baronov ter fašis-
tične ogrske vlade za pogumne
voditelje stavke.

Hoffman ni bil edini delavski
vodja, ki je bil aretiran od poli-
cije. Poleg njega sta bila areti-
rana tudi električni inženir Hor-
bath in mehanik Sterger, ki sta
bila, prav tako kot Hoffman,
veterana ogrskega sovjetskega
režima pod Bela Kunom leta
1920. Ta dva se še vedno naha-
jata v zaporu, kjer ju policija
muči, v poizkusu, da iztisne iz
njiju informacije glede lakotne
stavke, ki je svet opozorila na
strašne delavske razmere, ki
vladajo na Ogrskem pod seda-
njim fevdalno - fašističnim re-
žimom.

Poražena sodnika

Nepopolna poročila kažejo, da
sta bila včeraj na volišču pora-
žena okrajna sodnika Hertz in
Harris. Njuni mesti najbrže do-
bita mestna sodnika Day in Ac-
kerman. Hertzja je imenoval go-
vernar White, ko je umrl sod-
nik Kennedy. Sedanji okrajni
sodnik Terrell pa bo najbrže iz-
podrinil prizivnega sodnika Mc-
Gilla, ki je bil tudi imenovan od
governorja White, ko je bilo iz-
praznjeno mesto na apelatni
sodnji.

in sicer naklada (4 1/2 mill) za
relifno akcijo ter naklada (2

nanovo obremenjeni.

Demokratje so včeraj izvoje-
vali največjo politično zmago v
zgodovini kake ameriške stran-
ke izza civilne vojne. Republi-

za neodvisnega McMastra, čigar

sovnico. Za Sulzmann so se
zadnji dan vrgli v volilni boj tu-
di republikanci, ki so raje videli,
da propade njih kandidat Twel-
vetree kot pa da bi zmagal Mc-
Master. Republikanske warde v

dale Sulzmannu na tisoče gla-
sov. V šerifskem boju se bo

no poslansko zbornico sloven-
ski odvetnik Joseph J. Ogrin, ki
je kandidiral na demokratskem
tiketu. Prodril je kot izgleda
cela demokratska lista. Ponov-
no je bil tudi izvoljen v državno
zbornico William M. Boyd
(Boich), ki je rodom Hrvat in
podpredsednik HBZ. Cuyahoga
okraj ima v državni zakonodaj-
ni 18 poslancev in šest senatorjev.
Kot izgleda je bila na celi fronti
zmagovita demokratska lista.

PRVO DEJANJE — DVOBOJ

Med rotenjem in solzami ciganke se Manriko izrga Azu- ceni ter odide z Ruizom na pomoč Leonori. Sledi sprememba scene ki nas popelje pred gorski samostan, kjer se pripravljajo grof di Luna, da ugrabi Leonoro, predno stori zaobljubo. Toda ravno ob pravem mo- mentu se pojavi Manriko, ki prepreči grofov naklep, pustivši slednjega vsega osramočenega ter besnečega od jeze na pozorišču.

V tretjem dejanju najdemo Manrika in Leonoro v trdnjavi Ka- steller, katero drži trubadur za svojega princa; ravnokar se imata po- ročiti. Toda grof di Luna je obkolil trdnjavo ter jo namerava vsak čas naskočiti. Na ta način bo dobil v svojo oblast svojega uspešnega tek- meca ter žensko, ki ga je odšla. Kar privedejo predenj, namreč gro- fa, staro ciganko, katero so ujeli njegovi vojskaki v bližini taborniške. Kjer je najbrže vohunila. Ferrando spozna v njej žensko, ki jo z gro- tom že toliko časa iščeta ter zagotovi grofa, da je to ciganka, ki je izvršila oni strašni čin. Vse rotenje in prošnje Azucene padejo na gluha ušesa. 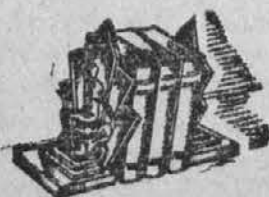
ČETIRTO DEJANJE — MUCENJE

Možna je, da bo umrla z njo tudi skrivnost, katero ju nosila v svoj vse svoje življenje. Vstopi Leonora. Manriko je prese- nečen, toda ko mu pove, da je prost, jo obtoži nezvestobe. Leonora mu namreč ne pove cene - njena lastna smrt. Toda ko pade krasna plenkina mrtva pred njegovo nogo in preloži grof di Luna dano obljubo, ukazavši usmrtitev Manrika, tedaj doseže ciganka svoje ma- ševanje! 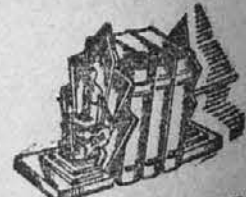

FRATERNALISM GIVEN JOLT

Insinuations of a perverse nature appeared in bold black type on the front page of the "Prosveta" last week. Intentionally planted in the most conspicuous spot, they certainly must not have deviated much from the damaging path they were intended to follow. The author of the article, to which I have just alluded, chose to remain incognito, that is, to a large number of its perusers; but the style of his diatribes was not unfamiliar to those who know its originator. In fact, it so closely resembles past contributions that detection was merely a matter of form... exposure as easy as raising the arm and pointing a guilty finger at the party in question. This is not the first time he has dealt a severe blow to Yugoslav Fraternal Societies... With him, misrepresentation of facts seems to be a habit, if not a characteristic. Such men are a menace to our fraternal institutions and immediate removal from responsible positions would not be too soon... The sooner, the better. The vestige of authority and power should not rest on the shoulders of men whose sincerity of purpose is like that of a coldhearted, unscrupulous politician; whose every motive is selfish and individual; whose only excuse for fraternalistic endeavor is the paycheck, and whose idea of a merger of Yugoslav Fraternal Societies is encompassed by five little words of his own saying, "It is a hopeless case."



INVESTMENTS

Through the medium of this column I have propounded the inadvisability of selecting endowments or annuities as a sound investment. Let me clarify my stand on this important subject still further... Savings policies or certificates are all-right proving the investment committee don't make too many mistakes, but being human the same as the directors of a bank or trust company, they are susceptible to poor judgment which eventually must lead to ill effects since their source of investment is limited to very nearly the same field as that of banks... However, this no longer applies to fraternalism. In their case, the security purchases have been greatly restricted and limited to but four classes of investment. This insures the certificate holder against many uncertainties and elevates fraternal life insurance far above policies issued by insurance companies. This fact, alone, makes fraternal life insurance certificates safer, sounder and more dependable than ever in their history... You will find fraternal life insurance the most satisfactory for protection of your loved ones... If you have some extra dollars, over and above what it takes to pay for certificate assessment, put them where it won't be necessary to pay 6% interest when you need them badly, or into something you will enjoy today... Steer away from endowments and annuities, for 20 or 30 years is too far ahead for any ordinary man or woman to plan what will or might be done with their money... And beside that is the worry... Will you or won't you realize the cash value of your savings policy? Think it over...

This all took place within a few minutes and even while it was going on the biggest part of the crowd had already surrendered itself to the one important impulse, that of destruction and souvenir hunting.

My, oh my, how they were bent on tearing down anything and everything! Many young fellows brought along claw-hammers and crow-bars which were used to bring away souvenirs. In less than half an hour, the most talked about and publicized exhibition of human invention was short of much of its former beauty... Trees, flowers, and hedge fences were up-rooted and borne away to be transplanted in other people's yards... Benches, light bulbs and tubes, iron pipes, fountain fixtures, and hundreds of other articles were carried off. Wherever were seen by the guards, souvenir holders were soon separated from more valuable objects. Sometimes police influence and bodily force was necessary to restore a semblance of order in such cases.

As the morning hours wore on, sheer vandalism took the place of the, hitherto, foolish, impulsively-innocent actions of the crowd... Gradually pleasure was sought in rougher tactics like breaking windows and doors, stealing for-sale articles right off the counters, etc. But, overlooking this late outburst of improprieties, the Fair's last night existence was one, everyone, who was present, shall always remember and cherish in delight.
