Rim se boji vladne krize zaradi sporov v socialistični stranki

Položaj predsednika socialistične stranke Pietra Nennija je postal negotov. Nenni utegne izgubiti večino v stranki.

RIM, It. — Dosedaj so navadno ne ravno vzgledne razmere v največji italijanski stranki krščanskih demokratov dajale povod za krize in strah pred njimi, sedaj so to na logu prevzeli Nennijevi socialisti, ki so obenem tudi druga koalična stranka Rumorjevega režima.

V Nennijevi socialistični stranki vlada tih kriza že od takrat, ko je stranka pri zadnjih volitvah tako nemarno pogorela. V strankinem vodstvu sta se počasi izkristalizirali dve stališči: prvo je trdilo, da tiči vzrok volivnemu porazu v sedanji vladni koaliciji, ki v njej socijalisti baje premalo dosežejo; drugo stališče pa trdi, da vzroki za poraz tičijo druge.

Vsako stališče ima svojo strugo, eno vodi predsednik stranke Nenni, drugo pa njegov glavni tekmeč De Martino, ki misli, da je prišel čas, da gredo socialisti iz koalicije in začnejo barantati z ostalimi levicarji, posebno s komunisti. Obe stališči si tako močno nasprotujeta, da prepade med njima res pomeni globoko krizo v stranki. Da bo to vsaj deloma držalo, se vidi po tem, da so Nennijevi ministri že začeli siliti iz vlade in prehajati od Nennija na stran De Martina.

Na krizo gledajo zaskrbljeno tudi krščanski demokrati. V Nenniju imajo zaveznika, ki je sicer siten in zahteven, toda drži besedo in ni bolj zahrben, kot se spodbidi za italijanskega politika. Ako bo Nenni zgubil vodstvo stranke, v čigave roke bo potem prišla? To vprašanje muči krščanske demokrati, ki imajo povrhu še dosti težav v lastni stranki.

Posadko Apollo 10 sestavlja Thomas P. Stafford, John W. Young in Eugene A. Cernan.

Če se bo njihov polet uspešno in srečno končal, bo Apollo 11 v juliju poletel na Luno in se bosta dva astronauta med kroženjem tega okoli Lune spustila v Lunskem vozu na Luno in tam pristala 20. julija.

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Pentagon je že l. 1964 razglasil tank Sheridan kot nekaj posebnega, kar bo močno podprt učinkovitost naše armade. Nekaj propagande zanj je bilo že treba narediti, kajti tank ni ravno cene no blago in vrednost predvidevane naročila je znašala celih \$1.3 milijona. Pa se je zadeva s tankom tako zavlekla, da je postala aktualna še l. 1966.

Ko je bila pa munition na razpolago, je bila pa tako zanikno pakirana, da je bila njena raba zelo tveganja.

Vse to se je dogajalo, ker je Pentagon hotel izrabiti vsa proračunska sredstva proti koncu proračunskega leta, da ne zapadejo. Vse to je odkril kongresni kontrolni urad, znan pod imenom GAO in poslal kongresni posebno poročilo. V poročilu je malo točk, ki bi jim Pentagon mogel stvarno ugovarjati.

LA PAZ, Bol. — V Boliviji bodo predsedniške volitve še v maju prihodnjega leta, svojo senco pa mečejo že se laj na to revno in zupuščeno deželo. Vse pričakuje, da bodo časi do volitev nemirni in da bodo morda celo ustvari takto stanje, da do volitev sploh ne bo prišlo. Ta strah opirajo na bolivijsko politično zgodovino zadnjih 20 let, ki ji je gotovo ne moremo pripisati značaja normalnosti.

V Boliviji je vladala do leta 1952 prava reakcionalna diktatura, ki je poznaла le sebe. L. 1952 jo je pregnala napredna stranka "Narodno revolucionarno gibanje" in prevzela oblast. Fortas je odstopil

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Abe Fortas je v sredo odstopil v včeraj je predsednik Nixon njegov odstop sprejel. Fortas je dejal v pismu predsedniku, da je stopila, da ne bi spravljal v zadregu Vrhovno sodišče.

Abe Fortas je bil na tem, da začne Domov odbor preiskovati njegove zveze z znanim finančnikom Louisom E. Wolfsonom, ki je trenutno v ječi zaradi nepravilnega poslovanja z delnicami. Fortas je prejel prvi \$20,000, pa jih je nato vrnil, ko je videl, da "svojih obveznosti zaradi preobilice posla na sodišču ne more vršiti".

VATIKAN. — V petek, 9. maja, dopoldne je sv. oče Pavel VI. sprejel skupino 500 slovenskih romarjev s škofi na čelu v klementinski dvorani. Pred prihodom papeža je pozdravil romarje msgr. M. Jezernik, rektor Slovenskega, nato pa še kardinal Šepet.

BEograd, SFRJ. — Zastopnik zunanjega tajnika Dragoljub Vujica je dejal, da je 35 nevezanih držav pristalo na posvetovanje za pripravo konference nevezanih držav po vzoru onih v Beogradu leta 1961 in one v Kairu leta 1964. Večje število teh držav je predložilo, naj bi se konferenca vršila v Beogradu in Vujica je dejal, da je Jugoslavija pripravljena sestanek organizirati.

Pripravljalni sestanek bo pripravljen po rednih diplomatskih potih. Vršil se naj bi predvidoma v juniju ali juliju letos.

RASNI NEMIRI GROZIJO MALEZIJSKI FEDERACIJI

Popadli med Malajci in Kitajci v Kuala Lumpur v zadnjih dneh so sprožili rasne napetosti, ki groze še neustaljeni federaciji Malezije. Vlada je ukinila ustavo.

KUALA LUMPUR, Mal. — je bilo okoli 100 oseb mrtvih, Boji med Malajci in Kitajci so večinoma Kitajci. Oblast je za dosegli tak obseg, da predsednik 24 ur proglašila policijsko uro, vlade Abdul Rahman ni videl pa jo nato včeraj za kratek čas nobenega drugega izhoda, kot da ukinila, da bi se mogli ljudje že ukinil ustavo in skuša z odskrbeti s hrano. Takoj je pričelo roko s podporo vojske šlo do novih spopadov in bojev.

Predsednik vlade Malajec Abdul Rahman je izjavil, da so za boji ne bi razširili še na druge izgredi in nemiri komunisti. Udele federacije. Malezija je se ukinila ustava, ki je sama zakona za boj proti komunistom, ki so vodili v Malaji 10 let državljansko vojno v upanju, da se bodo polastili oblasti. Nad 95% vseh rdečih gverilcev so bili Kitajci in to jih malajska večina ni pozabilna, četudi je od konca državljanske vojne minilo že 12 let.

BEograd, SFRJ. — Na pobabilo jugoslovanskega državnega tajnika Mirka Tepavca pride v nedeljo v Jugoslavijo na uradno obisk italijanski zunanjini minister Pietro Nenni. Jugoslovanska vlada italijanski obisk toplo pozdravlja, je izjavil zastopnik vlade, in je pripricana, da bo doprinesel svoj delež k izboljšanju že sedaj dobrih in prijateljskih medsebojnih odnosov.

Pietro Nenni je vodnik italijanske socialistične stranke, ki je dolga leta tesno sodelovala s komunistično partijo. Pred leti se je od nje ločila in sklenila zvezo s krščanskimi demokratimi, za sestavo skupne vlade. SAIGON, J. Viet. — Vlada je sprejela Nixonov načrt o končanju vojne ugodno, zlasti v delu, ki zagotavlja Južnemu Vietnamu neodvisnost, manj pa v predlogu za volitve pod mednarodnim nadzorom.

DA NANG, J. Viet. — Zavezniške čete čistijo znano A Shau dolino, ki vodi iz Laosu v gorjeni del Južnega Vietnamova. V obsežni operaciji so zavezni

ga revolucionarnega gibanja, ta program pa ni več generalom po godu. Kdor bi ga hotel izvajati, ga bodo spravili z oblasti, tako misijo politični opozovalci v bolivijskem glavnem mestu.

Ako se bi tej struti pridružili še generali, ki jim Barrientos že sam po sebi ni posebno simpatičen, potem res lahko nastane nevarnost za državljansko vojno.

Bolivijski politiki so začeli sedeti na trnih, skribi jih, da tega ne bodo mogli spremeniči do maja prihodnjega leta, ako ne pride prej do revolucije.







DECEASED VIETNAM WAR HERO PRAISED

HOMILY SAID AT MAJ. JOHN A. PETRIC MEMORIAL MASS

by Rev. Victor N. Tomc, pastor of St. Mary's (Coll.) Church

EDITOR'S NOTE: The following article is the homily delivered at the Memorial Mass for Major John A. Petric in St. Mary's Church Collinwood, May 2, 1969, His 32nd birthday.

Friends in Christ:

At this time I wish to express my feeling of privilege and honor that is mine to be able to offer the sacrifice of the Mass for the repose of the soul of Major John A. Petric. On this, his 32nd birthday, I thank God I was, in God's grace, favored to direct, at least in formation of his spiritual life some 25 years ago.

Might I express my sympathies to his sorrowing bereaved wife, Linda, to the John Petric family, members of our parish and also to grandparents, the Novak's who had so much to do in the forming of the wonderful character of Major John A. Petric. Also, my condolences to all the relatives at the loss of their prize Soldier, Major John A. Petric.

While reading the letters sent to the Major's widow of the accident that caused his death, one can not help but be proud to have known Johnny!

Quoting from the letter of the Colonel, Prather:

"As Commanding Officer of the 12th Group I was fortunate enough to know John personally and to appreciate his outstanding qualities... His fine record, courage, dedicated devotion to duty, and his accomplishments will long be remembered by his fellowmen and officers who served in his command.

We are all saddened by his death on March 2, 1969, but we shall long remember him for his inspiration he gave to us. He died as he lived, heroically among his comrades, dedicated at sacrificing beyond the call of duty to the cause in which he believed. There are few officers in our service who could fill John's place in the cockpit, in the company orderly room, or standing as a true leader before his troops."

DEATH CIRCUMSTANCES

Quoting from the Colonel's letter of 4-13-69.

"FOLLOWING IS A NARRATIVE of events occurring on the morning of 2 March. Shortly after midnight, the 191st Assault Helicopter Company area came under an intense mortar barrage, during which John had heroically exposed himself to insure the safety of his men. After the attack ceased, he checked the area to determine whether anyone was hurt, then returned to the operations office to organize repairs of several damaged helicopters. Without warning, a second mortar barrage began impacting in the area. John had just directed men to evacuate the building when a mortar round penetrated the roof and exploded inside the room.

Three men had escaped through the door, thanks to John's warning, but your husband and five others were killed instantly. Only one person in the operations office survived the explosion, though suffering grievous wounds."

To all who knew and loved Johnny, I propose to suggest only a few thoughts that passed my mind in the last two months:

"Greater love than this no man has than one lay down his life for his friends." (JN 15:13)

"If our time be come, let us die manfully." (1 Mac. 8, 10)

Stonewall Jackson was one of the most capable and courageous commanders America ever had. He was also an outstanding Christian. Being wounded, one of his friends, also a General visited him and asked him how he could keep so cool, and appear so utterly insensible to danger

in a storm of shell and bullets that rained about him when he was hit. He instantly became grave and reverential in his manner, and replied firmly:

"Captain, my religious belief teaches me to feel as safe on the field of battle as in bed. Almighty God has fixed the time for my death. I do not concern myself about that, but to be always ready, no matter when it may overtake me." "That is the way all men should live, and then all men would be equally brave."

OUR JOHNNY, the Major, was brave and courageous. With a young man's desire to do good for all mankind, with foresight of a true Christian, the words of the 1st Catholic President of the United States, the late John F. Kennedy in his Inaugural Address were ever striven after by Major John A. Petric:

"Ask not what your Country can do for you, but ask, what can I do for my Country."

Our Johnny, fearlessly and proudly joined the Fighting Forces of our Government's U.S. Army, Combat Aviation Group some ten years ago.

We can be reasonably sure that the Major Petric's body possessed courage throughout life and especially on his death bed. Courageously he went to meet his God. A true Catholic and Christian, John knew this earth was not his home and, therefore, he found it easier and willing to leave his possessions.

As a true Catholic, he knew that he and his loved ones will meet again, never to be separated. He was a courageous lad and as an adult lived a life of valor for his friends.

That I might have had some influence on the formation of this magnanimous character, by the grace of God, I thank Him, but I'm assured that the formation of all his wonderful qualities stem back to the early childhood training given by his mother, father and the grand "ole" grandparents (the Novak's) who did such a splendid job in training their children.

Your advice and direction was followed and you directed him back to God who had loaned him to you for a short 32 years. Let this be a consolation to you.

Dear John, for the many pleasant memories, for your manly and courageous work for your Country in the Army you have done, for your tremendous inspiration and admiration for all things good, we say, Thank you!

FROM THE CHERISHED eighth grade graduation keepsakes, I wish to quote my last farewell to the Major:

"May the grace and blessing of the Sacred Heart be with you;

The peace of the Sacred Heart encompass you;

The merits of the Sacred Heart plead for you;

The love of the Sacred Heart inflame you;

The sorrows of the Sacred Heart console you;

The zeal of the Sacred Heart animates you;

The virtues of the Sacred Heart shine forth in every word and work, and may the joys of the Beatific Vision be your eternal recompense. Amen.



It can be baked, broiled, fried, casserole, sauteed, and enjoyed "as is." An added plus to American women who seem to spend a good part of their time dieting, is that this crisp white delicacy has been found to be lowest in calories among the vegetables. According to the U.S. Department of Agriculture (and they know!) the Belgian endive with its mere 47 calories per pound is on a par with lettuce, 26 calories less than sprach, and a third the calorie count of raw carrots.

Enjoying the endive "as is" in its crunchy raw state is easy with a delicious salad recipe like "Country Fresh Delight." This is one of the three prize-winning entries in the annual recipe contest sponsored by the Belgian Endive Association. Here's how to prepare this high-flavored low-calorie dish.

COUNTRY FRESH DELIGHT

16 large leaves of Belgian Endive
1 egg
1 8-oz. package of creamed cottage cheese
1 8-oz. package of softened cream cheese
½ teaspoon of salt
1 cup of walnut halves
8 whole Maraschino cherries
1 10-oz. package frozen blueberries, thawed and well drained.
1 10-oz. package of frozen strawberries, thawed and well drained.
½ pint sour cream.

Wash and drain Belgian endive. Pat dry with paper toweling. Divide each leaf in half. Using 4 leaves per salad plate, form a star with them.

In a medium size mixing bowl, beat the egg and salt until frothy. Add softened cream cheese and beat again until smooth. Beat in creamed cottage cheese.

Fold strawberries, blueberries and nuts into the cheese mixture.

Using an ice cream scooper, scoop on filling over center of Belgian endive leaves. Top with sour cream, and top with a cherry. Makes eight salad servings.

BELGIAN ENDIVE LUNCHEON PIE (Pickadilly Pie)

3 cups Corned Beef (cooked, cut into small squares)
10 Belgian endives
1 (4-oz.) can button mushrooms (juice)
1 tsp. monosodium glutamate
1 tsp. curry powder
¼ tsp. salt
1 tbs. light oil
1 small can chopped ripe olives (with juice)
1 tbs. onion flakes
1 tsp. parsley flakes
1 tbs. lemon juice
¼ tsp. dill seeds
favorite pie crust

Brown corned beef squares in the oil. Add onion flakes, monosodium glutamate, parsley, curry powder, and salt and cook over low heat for



Psychologists, who make their living by advice-giving, offer the following tips on the subject:

1. Don't Call Them; Let Them Call You.

If possible, wait until you're asked. This is not always easy but you will receive a more cordial hearing if you can hold out. Despite an overwhelming urge to advise, the object of your good intentions may learn his lesson better the hard way. Of course, there are occasions when you just can't afford to wait for an opening — and that's where the challenge lies. In this case:

2. Sugar-coat Your Suggestions.
In most cases, if the advice offered can be concealed in a more palatable form — such as a compliment, an offer of help, or a confidence — it will be swallowed with far greater relish.

If, for instance, you're a mother-in-law eager to persuade a young wife that stew makes fine substitute for steak, don't stress her extravagance. It's far better to praise her culinary talents, then offer several new gourmet recipes for stew which you feel sure she can "cook to perfection".

3. The "Third-Party" Line.

Husbands hate nagging wives, but the clever spouse can offer advice so tactfully that her other half never knows he's a victim.

"Don't you think Bill Bailey was a fool to gamble away all that money at the races?", followed by "It's comforting to know YOU'D never do a dumb thing like that" is a wiser way to handle a husband bound for a poker game than the "Don't you be a fool like Bill Bailey" routine.

Or, if your overweight teenage daughter insists on eating sweets all day, advising her to go on a diet may merely goad her on to greater gorging sprees. More persuasive might be such a third-person approach as: "Don't you think Betsy looks marvelous since she's thinned down?" (Even better might be the practical approach of serving low calorie meals and soft drinks, minus the comments).

4. Accentuate the Positive

It's not always what you say that makes a person bridle; it's how you say it. For instance, the child who suffers from acne (which can spell tragedy to a teenager) only suffers more when asked, "Why don't you do something about it?" A much better approach is to bring home a jar of Ice-O-Derm or some similar product with a positive, "Here's something you may find useful."

5. Never say "I told you so."

Above all with teenagers (as with anyone else), this phrase is a sure-fire way to get all future advice turned down cold, so avoid it like dynamite whether your advice is taken or ignored.

6. The Other Side of the Coin

No one likes to have the other guy do his thinking for him — or at least doesn't like to admit it. If you can offer two solutions to a problem, you permit your adviser to make a choice. He feels that he, not you, is solving the dilemma. And what do you care who gets the credit, as long as he gets the message?

7. Watch Your Watch

There are certain times of day when it's fatal to give advice: early in the morning, before a meal or immediately after work. The best times are early in the evening, after dinner, or over a weekend when

Eye Operating Microscope Donated

The Sight Council of Cuyahoga County Lions Club presented a \$6,000 Zeiss Eye Operating Microscope to St. Vincent Charity Hospital recently.

Allen H. Turner, President of the Sight Council, made the presentation on behalf of the Sight Council at luncheon attended by the Hospital representatives and Sight Council delegates from the Lions Clubs throughout Cuyahoga County. Dr. Maxwell S. Udell, 19425 Van Aken Blvd., Shaker Heights, of the Hospital's Ophthalmology Department, thanked the Council on behalf of the Hospital.

Dr. H. S. Siegel, Head of the Hospital's Ophthalmology Department, demonstrated the electrically power driven machine which features complete foot pedal control.

SPECIAL TRAINING is required to operate the microscope which is one of 160 machines in use throughout the country. According to Dr. Siegel, St. Vincent Charity Hospital is the only Cleveland area hospital performing intraocular surgery under the microscope.

Because focusing of the Zeiss Eye Operating Microscope is foot pedal controlled, the operator's hands are completely free for surgery.

This is the third year the Sight Council of Cuyahoga County has contributed equipment to the Ophthalmology Department at St. Vincent Charity Hospital. In addition, the Council provides glasses for indigent patients in the Hospital's Outpatient Department Eye Clinic.

The Sight Council was formed more than 20 years ago to coordinate sight philanthropic efforts of the many Lions Clubs throughout Cuyahoga County. It is the only organization of its kind in the world.

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
