## Kaj je z 11 ameriškimi letalci, lvt. Mikojan?

Septembra se je zrušilo ali je bilo sestreljeno v bližini sovjetsko-turške meje ameriško letalo. Sovjetija še zdaj ni odgovorila, kje so pogrešani letalci.

WASHINGTON, D. C. — V septembru lanskoga leta so Rusi sestrelili nad Sovjetsko Armenijo naše transportno letalo C-130. Pri tem je izgubilo življenje šest mož posadke. Rusi so nam vrili trupla. Že od takrat pa ne dajo nobenega odgovora na vprašanje, kaj se je zgodilo z ostalo posadko 11 mož.

V našem tajništvu za zunanje zadeve niso pozabili in nanjo opozorili ruskega poslanika Menjšikova. Mikojanu še zaenkrat niso nič rekli, saj je pač "zasebni gost" ruskega poslanika. Le zakaj taka obzirnost?

Ko je prišla na primer pred drugo svetovno vojno prva jugoslovanska gospodarska delegacija v Moskvo samo na gospodarska pogajanja, se Mikojan ni prav nič sramoval in začel kar na prvi seji stavljati vprašanja, ki niso imela nobene zvezze z gospodarstvom.

## Predsednik Argentine bo obiskal Washington

WASHINGTON, D. C. — Državni tajnik John F. Dulles se je c argentinskom predsedniku Arturu Frondiziju zelo povoljno izrazil in dejal, da bodo razgovori z njim, ko pride prihodnji ponedeljek sem na obisk, koristni za obe strani in bodo brez dvojma pripomogli k izboljšanju odnosa.

Argentina je v precejšnjih gospodarskih težavah, zato je verjetno da bodo gospodarska vprašanja prevladovala pri razgovorih.

## Predlog za prepoved redovne obleke v šolah

COLUMBUS, O. — Rep. poslanec iz Geauga okraja B. A. Broughton je stavljal v generalni skupščini države Ohio zakonski predlog, ki naj v bodoče prepove nošnjo redovne obleke v šolah, ki se vzdržujejo iz javnih sredstev.

Bivši glavni državni pravnik William Saxbe je v preteklem novembру odločil, da katoliške redovnice lahko uče v javnih šolah v svojih redovnih oblekah. To je povzročilo v nekaterih protestantskih krogih pravo burjo. Protesti so deževali od vseh strani, čeprav je šlo dejansko za šolo, kjer so bili razen dveh sami katoliški šolarji in je tamkajšnja katoliška fara dala javni soli svoje šolske poslopje v način za \$1 na leto.

## Stroški za atomsko letalo večji od stroškov za vodljive izstrelke?

WASHINGTON, D. C. — Vsak vodljivi izstrelki na velike doljave stane nekaj nad \$35,000,000, atomsko letalo bodo pa še dražja. Atomska komisija in vojno letalstvo sta namreč povedala odboru za nakazila pri predstavnškim domu, da so stroški za priprave za atomsko letalo že dosegli višino \$800,000,000 in da bo treba riskirati še kakega pol biliona, preden bo prvo atomsko letalo letelo v zraku.

## Belgia bo podelila Kongu neodvisnosti

Belgijska vlada je objavila načrt, ki predvideva postopno neodvisnost Konga. — Pri izgradnji v Leopoldsvillu je bilo 71 mrtvih.

BRUSSELS, Belg. — Po zadnjih poročilih, ki so prispevali sem iz Konga, je bilo pri izgradnji v Leopoldsvillu skupno 71 mrtvih in 250 ranjenih. Oblasti so prijele vrsto domaćinov in jih občizile požiganja, uničevanja tuje in javne imovine, posilstev in naslja. Število mrtvih in ranjenih ter obtožbe krivek povedo najlepše, kaj se je vse v prestolnici Belgijskega Konga edini dogajalo. Mir je vzpostavilo število vojaštva.

Belgijska vlada je ta teden objavila načrt, ki predvideva postopno uvajanje samouprave kot pripravo za neodvisnost Konga in konec rasnega zapostavljanja. V Kongu živi okoli 10,000,000 domaćinov in kakih 100,000 belcev. Parlament je vladni načrt navdušeno pozdravil.

Značilno zboljšanje atomskih podmornic

WASHINGTON, D. C. — Prva serija petih atomskih podmornic tipa Polaris ima prostora samo za 16 vodljivih izstrelkov na srednje daljave od 1,000 milij na vsaki podmornici. Prihodnja serija bo imela že prostora za 50 vodljivih izstrelkov na vsaki podmornici.

Tako bo na primer vsaka podmornica v črnem morju lahko opustišila celo južno Rusijo, kajti njeni vodljivi izstrelki bodo letelj skoraj do Moskve. Ruske atomske podmornice se zaenkrat niso pokazale na svobodnih morjih.

## Razvrednotenje francoskega franka ne bo priselo našim turistom dosti koristi

NEW YORK, N. Y. — Na prvi pogled je človek dobil vtis, da bodo imeli naši turisti veliko koristi od zadnjega razvrednotenja francoskega franka. Pokazalo se je pa zelo hitro, da koristi ne bo skoraj nobene.

Hoteli so dejansko že zvišali cene sobam za 10%. Prehrana je postalata dražja radi povečanje raznih indirektnih davkov in troškarin, podražile so se cigarete, vino, bencin, elektrika itd. ## NEMCI SO VZNEMIRJENI RADI DULLESOVE IZJAVE

Dullesova izjava na zadnji tiskovni konferenci je Zahodne Nemce tako vznemirila, da je čutil kancler dr. K. Adenauer potrebo pozvati ameriškega poslanika na razgovor in pojasnilo. Zahodne sile so doslej vstrajale na stališču, da so edina pot k združenju Nemčije svobodne volitve v obeh Nemčijah, Dulles je pa izjavil, da vidoj k temu cilju lahko še tudi druga pota. Danes se bo Dulles razgovarjal z Mikojanom.

RONN, Zah. Nem. — Zvezni kancler dr. Konrad Adenauer je pozval k sebi poslanika Združenih držav, da bi mu pojasnil, kaj tiči za izjavu državnega tajnika Dullesa, da svobodne volitve niso edina pot do združitve Nemčije. Poslanik Bruce je v daljšem razgovoru kanclera zagotavljal, da Združene države niso spremenile svojega stališča v nemškem vprašanju.

Kot znano je Dulles označil sovjetski predlog za ureditev nemškega vprašanja za "brutan, neumen in neuporaben," pa izjavil, da so se Združene države pripravljene razgovarjati z zastopniki Sovjetije, Vel. Britanije in Francije o reševanju nemškega vprašanja. V nemških krogih prevladuje mnenje, da Združene države ne bodo odstopile od demokratične poti pri reševanju nemškega vprašanja.

## Svobodne volitve niso edina pot

Državni tajnik Dulles je ostrozavrnil sovjetski predlog za sklicanje mirovne konference z Nemčijo tekom prihodnjih dveh mesecev v Varšavi ali Pragi. Delil je, da so zahodne sile prepirane, naj bo Nemčija združena na temelju svobodnih volitev, pa dodal, da to sicer ni edina pot k temu cilju, ker obstoe "vse vrste potov." Povedal je, da Združene države trenutno nimajo nobenih novih predlogov glede nemškega vprašanja, kar pa ni zključeno za bodočnost.

Dulles je dejal, da obstaja med Sovjetijo in Zahodom glede Nemčije razlika v osnovi. Sovjetija trdi stalno, da mora biti Nemčija osamljena, ločena, razorožena in neutralizirana do vseh svojih sosedov. Po njegovem to ni pametna rešitev, ker je nemški narod prevelik, premoran in preveč vitalen, da bi bilo z njim mogoče postopati na tak način. Dodal je, da ni popolnoma prepričan, že je s Sovjeti mogoče splet doseči kak sporažen glede Nemčije.

Predsednik Eisenhower je v razgovoru s časnikarji v glavnem potrdil Dullesovo stališče. Obstaja potolažila zavezniške, da razgovori z Mikojanom danes in jutri ne predstavljajo nobenih dvostranskih pogajanj, ampak samo "izmeno misli."

Dulles se bo sestal z Mikojanom danes dopoldne in zvečer, pri Eisenhowerju pa ima nopravdan sestanek jutri ob devetih dopoldne.

## Eisenhowerjeva poslanica Kongresu o stanju Unije

Predsednik je po postavi obvezan, da da Kongresu takoj ob začetku vsakoletnega zasedanja poročilo o "stanju Unije." To je poslanica, ki ne pove samo, v kakšnem političnem, gospodarskem, socijalnem in kulturnem stanju se nahaja naša dežela, ampak pove tudi Kongresu, kaka bo predsednikova politika tekmo tekočega leta na vseh področjih javnega udejstvovanja. Poslanica naj bo pravzaprav predsednikov političen program za tekoče leto; vse dogajanje na kateremkoli polju naj bo osvetljeno s političnega vidika.

Razume se, da vsak predsednik razume po svoje svoji nalogu; nekateri so bolj udarjeni na politiko in hočejo v poslanici podčrtati svoj namen, da ostanejo politični voditelji ameriškega naroda. Drugi zoper misijo, da je njihova naloga, da upravlja deželo v duhu ustave, zakonov in politične tradicije in da ne vnašajo v že itak razburkano politično valovanje nov nemir z drznimi političnimi zamislimi.

V drugo skupino spada predsednik Eisenhower. Temu primerno je tudi sestavljenja njegova poslanica. V njej iščeš zastonj nove politične ideje, zato pa nudi lep in stvaren pregled ne samo stanja v naši deželi, ampak tudi jasno sliko o predsednikovih namerah, kako hoče vršiti svojo službo v tekočem letu.

Bistvo njegove poslanice tiči že v prvem odstavku njenega besedila, ki pravi: "En osnovni namen nas veže vse: treba je gojiti moč in varnost, obenem pa tudi svobodo in priložnost za udejstvovanje. Okoli te osnovne misli se vrtijo vse njegova izvajanja v logičnem in preglednem redu."

Najnajvišji interes je narodna varnost, njemu morajo biti podrejeni vsi drugi. Našo varnost ogroža komunizem. "Ne moremo imeti zaupanja v nobeno pogodbo s komunisti, razen v tiste, ki že same po sebi vsebujejo obvezen mehanizem za njihovo izvrševanje." Če je tako, potem mora naša varnost temeljiti samo na moči, kar pomeni, da moramo imeti narodno obrambo, ki bo v tehničnem oziru zmeraj na višini, in da moramo iskati zvezne z vsemi tistimi narodi svobodnega sveta, ki vidijo in iščejo svojo varnost v skupni obrambi.

Predsednik je precej na široko razpredel to misel in podčrtal dejstvo, da največ žrtev za varnost nosi narodno gospodarstvo, ki ne nosi samo stroškov za lastne oborocene sile, ampak mora pomagati tudi našim zaveznikom pri njihovih stroških za narodno obrambo. Da še več: naše narodno gospodarstvo mora pomagati z izdatnimi prispevkami tudi gospodarstvom naših zaveznikov. Pa ne samo to, pomagati mora gospodarsko celo tistim, ki so nevtralni, nočjoče stopiti z nami v skupno obrambo, pa se tudi nočjoče vdinjati komunizmu.

Da zmore naše gospodarstvo vsa ta bremena, mora samo imeti zdravo podlago, ki je njen glavni steber zdrav dollar. Brez zdravega dolarja ni zdravega gospodarstva, brez zdravega gospodarstva ni učinkovite narodne in mednarodne obrambe. Zato je predsednik ponovno izjavil, da bo njegova administracija storila vse, kar je v njeni moči, da zaustavi tih inflacijo, ki nas muči že cela leta.

Kot vsak človek, tako tudi vsak narod ne živi samo do vsakdanjega kruha, potrebna mu je tudi duhovna enostnost, potrebni so mu nesporne ideali in nesobični cilji, potrebna mu je zavestna volja, da pomaga bližnjemu in ne misli pri tem samo na vprašanje, ali to nosi procente narodnim interesom. Predsednik se je tega problema dotaknil bolj na rahlo, bil je konkreten samo v vprašanju civilnih pravic. Na tem polju je naš narod razbit v dva dela, pri čemur se manjšina bori proti civilnim pravicam na način, ki nas sramoti pred vsem svetom. Predsednik je sicer poudaril, da bo v tem pogledu varoval ustavo in zakone, toda ni naznačil nobene smeri, ki bi po njej moglo priti do miru v naši domači politiki.

Predsednik je nasejal v svoji poslanici celo vrsto konkretnih načrtov, kako hoče obravnavati in reševati razne probleme. Res se je potrudil, da jasno pove, kaj je njegova osnovna misel in kaj želi doseči, toda politično je njegova poslanica precej šibek dokument. V poslanici ni nobenih misli, ki bi politično včgale deželo ali vsaj razburile Kongres. V poslanici ponavlja v glavnem ideje iz svojega načrta za moderni republikanizem. Ideje niso svoj čas potegnile za seboj niti republikanske stranke, na demokratsko javnost so pa napravile majhen vtis.

Zato je razumljivo, da poslanica ni naletela v Kongresu na noben poseben interes. Vsem politikom se je zdelo, da so vse to slišali že davno, včasih celo po večkrat. Tudi ploskanje iz vladnosti ni moglo zabrisati vtisa, da Kongres računa s predsednikovo željo, da plava nad strankami, in da se radi tega ne bo dal motiti po predsednikovih načrtih pri svojem vsakdanjem zakonodajnem in kontrolnem delu.

Morda je prav tako. Vse kaže, da se bosta na Kapitolu tepli vedno hujše med seboj dve struji, konservativna in napredna, ki bosta močno zrahljali tudi strankarsko disciplin-

no. Ako bi v tako vzdušje sedaj prišel še predsednik z revolucionarnimi idejami, potem bi v Kongresu zavladala prava zmešnjava in slučajne večine bi pri glasovanjih uzakonile celo vrsto nepotrebnih zakonov brez vsebine in smotra.

Skratka: predsednikova spomenica pove, da hoče biti predsednik samo upravitelj federalne uprave. Politično vodstvo dežele je prepustil Kongresu. Bomo videli, ali bo Kongres dorastel svoji nalogi.



## POLIO IS STILL POWERFUL

The widespread epidemic recently raging in Detroit served notice to a startled nation that polio has lost none of its powerful impact. The disease still strikes unpredictably and with savage force. It finds its victims among the unvaccinated.

In Michigan, during a brief few September weeks, large numbers of children and adults were stricken with polio. More than 500 cases were concentrated in the city of Detroit. There were 16 deaths.

The epidemic first hit the low income areas. Then it spread out, following its own shapeless pattern, striking without warning, hitting people of all ages. Pre-school-age children and young adults were the principal victims. Fully half the cases were paralytic.

Emergency vaccination centers were opened by the Health Department when the National Foundation sent in 100,000 doses of vaccine to make shots available for people of all ages, and also provided needles, supplies and volunteers to staff the clinics, help parents with their children and distribute factual information to families and the entire community. People were frightened. There was a veritable stampede for Salk shots. Families, including babies and teenagers, as well as mothers and fathers, turned out by the thousandfold to get protected against paralytic polio before it was too late.

Surely there is a sober lesson to be learned here.

People have been smug. They are gratefully aware that polio incidence has been relatively low. They know there is a vaccine to prevent paralytic attack. But too many seem to forget that vaccine on the drugists' shelves cannot prevent anything.

To be effective in stopping paralytic polio, vaccine must be used. Three shots properly spaced out as the doctor directs, have the power to prevent polio's paralytic attack. Get them for yourself and your family while there's still time. Don't let your community be surprised by a disrupting, disastrous epidemic. There's no basis to think it can't happen here — or anywhere — unless you know that 80 per cent or more of your local population has been immunized with three shots of Salk vaccine.

Don't take chances with polio. Take Salk shots.



## Reporting from Washington

**THE 88TH CONGRESS CONVENES.** This has been one of the busiest "opening weeks" of a new Congress I have ever experienced. At 9 o'clock on Monday morning, I was privileged to be among the group of congressional leaders who had been called to the White House by President Eisenhower to receive a briefing on his proposals in the military, space and foreign fields for the coming Congress. I was included as a ranking member of the Foreign Affairs Committee, and was particularly gratified to learn that I was the first woman member of Congress ever to attend such a meeting. The President, keen and alert, opened the meeting with a forthright statement which emphasized that in formulating his 1959 program, he and those working with him had as their paramount consideration the peace and security of our country. We then heard from the heads of the various departments of government—State, Treasury, the Joint Chiefs of Staff, other Defense officials, and members of the newly formed Space Agency.

Our Ohio Republican Delegation met in Clarence Brown's conference room on Tuesday morning. It was good to be together again, though we missed the men with whom we had worked for so many years. We were happy to welcome two new members, Robert L. Latta, from the 1st District, and Samuel L. Devine from the 22nd. The House of Cincinnati was chosen the new Chairman of the Delegation. Clarence Brown will be on the Committee on Rules and Committees on Committees. Bill McCollum continues on the National Committee on Committees. Captain Crawford is again the Chairman of the Conference which took

place in the House Chamber Tuesday afternoon. It is always a deeply moving experience when a man who has served for long, hard years must step down and let a younger man take over. I was proud of Joe Martin as he took the microphone and thanked those who had stood by him—glad to have served with him all these years. As Charlie Halleck said, in succeeding Joe Martin, it will be a difficult task to measure up to the high qualities of leadership supplied by him over the past 20 years.

Early Wednesday morning many of us attended special church services. A long-time affiliation with Old Stone Church in Cleveland took me to the Presbyterian Church, which is President Eisenhower's place of worship. Mr. Eisenhower and the Vice President were both there. At 12 noon, the House opened its traditional ceremonies. After the call of the roll by states of all the duly elected members, we rose in a body and took the oath together. In 1940 when I first came to Congress we took the oath by states.

Important next steps will be organizing the Committees, which means placing the new members, and in some instances, changing assignments for others. We have been told there will be no change in the ratio of Republicans to Democrats in membership on the Rules Appropriations, and Ways and Means Committees. Ratios on other Committees are subject to decisions made by the Democratic majority.

By the time this reaches you, many will have heard or read the President's State of the Union Message, delivered to a Joint Session of the Congress with Cabinet Officers, Supreme Court Justices and the Diplomatic Corps present. The all-important budget message will be given to us the week of the 19th.

### Survey of Consumer Buying Plans

The questions asked about TV sets, washing machines and refrigerators will be relatively simple. Respondents will be asked if they own any of the items, when each was purchased, and if they plan to purchase one in the next three or six months.

For cars, information will be obtained not only on ownership and buying plans, but also on methods of financing, outstanding indebtedness on the car, and recent repair costs.

Current Population Survey statistics will be collected locally during the week of January 19 by certified enumerators.
