Dr. Turk Utilizes Robotic Prostate Surgery

It will be a long time before an R2D2 looking robot zips in an operating room, assuring a patient everything will be all right before going to work. However, robots have been in operating rooms for some time. It is safe to say robots will not be giving sponge baths any time soon, but they do deliver medications and bring lunch trays.

Robots in the medical field are here to stay and their performances are nothing short of a miracle. Broadview Heights resident David S. Turk, MD, is a surgeon assisted by a \$1.5 million robot. According to Turk, the machine is worth every cent. It provides minimal invasion for the prostate cancer surgery in which he specializes. "It makes it possible to make small keyhole incisions, rather than a long incision and it becomes easier to reach in and remove the cancer," Turk said. He is the only community urologist in Cleveland performing this specialized technical surgery. "It is very new but is gaining wide acceptance as a means to successfully treating prostate cancer," he said.

Prostate cancer is the second most common form of cancer in males in the United States. Sixteen percent of American men are diagnosed with the disease during their lifetime. Public awareness and early treatment usually results in a positive outcome.

Turk began his work with the da Vinci® machine, pur-

chased by Southwest Hospital last August. "The surgery is safer because there is less blood loss, less chance of injury to important nerves and it is much less complicated," he said. "The surgeon sits down at a console and is able to see the operating field in 3D on the screen because of the camera in the patient's belly." The robot "hands" are extremely small and able to reach into areas the doctor could not reach without a much larger opening. "The surgeon is still doing the operation but this is much better for the patient."

Prostate surgery done the "old way" has the patient in the hospital for four to five days with a fair amount of pain. Recovery time is four to six weeks. With the aid of a robot the patient remains in the hospital one or two days and recovery is about two weeks. Southwest and the Cleveland Clinic are the only two Cleveland facilities with these machines.

Surgical robotics became an integral part of the medical field around 1999. Intuitive Surgical out of Sunnyvale, Calif., introduced the da Vinci® Surgical System and became the global leader in the rapidly emerging field of robotic-assisted minimally invasive surgery practices. When Turk became familiar with the machine, he spoke to Southwest Hospital officials about bringing one into their facility. "There are only 300 of these machines in the world," Turk said. The fact that Southwest was able to see the benefits of it, says a lot about how they think of

their patients."

Today, doctors guiding the robotic arms are performing surgeries, from prostate cancer to heart. This particular equipment was originally developed for the military. It was sold to private industry to help doctors remove cancerous prostate glands, repair ailing hearts and perform gastric bypass. In these procedures, the surgeon's hands never enter the patient, cutting down nerve damage and risk of infection.

According to a December 12, 2005 Newsweek Magazine article, an estimated 36,000 robotic procedures would be performed that year, up nearly 50% from the previous year. Analysts predicted figures would nearly double in 2006 with more than 70,000 procedures expected. The Food and Drug Administration approved the Da Vinci I July, 2000. It is the only robotic system of its type to get the FDA go-ahead.

Turk has been in private practice since 2000 with the Southwest Urology Inc. Others in his group of seven doctors include Dr. Michael Bakoukis of Brecksville and Dr. Martin Kosdrosky of Hinckley. Turk is the only one using the robotic machine doing prostatectomy surgery. He and his wife, Neja, have lived in Broadview Heights for a little over six years and have four sons.

As with most surgeons, there is music playing in the background when Turk operates. If the patient, in his

deep subconscious, happens to think he hears "Beer Barrel Polka," he may be right. Turk not only enjoys polka music, he plays it on the accordion. Sometimes solo and sometimes with his small band.

Even though there may be background polka music while he is doing regular surgery, he does not play while working with the robot and the computer. "It is very intricate work," Turk said; perhaps the happy music might be just a little too upbeat and bouncy for this type of precision surgery."

Strel Completes Amazon Swim

Martin Strel, 52, of Slovenia, completed the 66 day, 3,272 mile Amazon river swim on Saturday, April 7, four days ahead of schedule, averaging 52 miles a day says his son, Borut.

Strel battled piranhas, crocodiles and exhaustion to become the first person to swim the entire length of the Amazon river.

Mr. Strel, known as "fish man," was suffering dizziness, nausea, diarrhea, and sunstroke as he neared the finish. He had previously completed swimming the Yangtze, Mississippi and Danube.

The Amazon is the world's largest river, and the second longest. Besides the previous mentioned animals and fish,

he also overcame whirlpools, tidal waves, and armed bandits. Strel ignored doctor's orders to abandon his task.

Strel said "I think the river animals have just accepted me. I've been swimming with them for such a long time they must think I'm one of them now."

Strel said he was at times in so much pain, "I could not get out of the water on my own."


Church at 1:30 p.m. A luncheon and reception will follow in the St. Martin de Porres (St. Vitus Auditorium).

During the Christmas Season it is always pleasant to send or receive Currier and Ives Christmas cards depicting country snow scenes. Well, I saw one for real, only it was not for Christmas, it was for Easter.

Last Saturday, about five minutes before one p.m., I looked out the American Home window and it was snowing so hard, I couldn't even see Smrekar's Hardware Store across the street. It was time to venture outdoors to St. Vitus Church to get our food blessed which was to be consumed on Easter Sunday morning. Due to the heavy snow and terrible winds, I decided to drive the short distance to the church instead of walking as I usually do and parked across from St. Vitus school and auditorium. After the blessing, as folks emerged from the church with their consecrated food, they could not help but jokingly wish each other a "Merry Easter." I left the Currier and Ives scene with a tear in my heart from the nostalgic scene and the distinct ambrosia of the Slovenian klobase.

Milač is Heritage Speaker

The Slovenian-American Heritage Foundation invites all to attend the second talk in our 2007 lecture series. The foundation is extremely pleased that Dr. Metod Milač will present a talk entitled *Rab – Auschwitz – Vetrinj, Three Remembrances*.

The program, which is free and open to the public, will take place on Tuesday, April 17 at 7 p.m. in the Lower Hall of the Slovenian Society Home, 20713 Recher Avenue in Euclid, Ohio. A coffee and strudel social will follow the lecture.

In his talk, Dr. Milač will recount his personal struggle for survival as a prisoner and forced laborer during World War II. He will describe his imprisonment by Italian Fascists at Rab and the Nazis at Auschwitz. He will also discuss the forced repatriation of Slovenians following the war and the tragic consequences.

Metod M. Milač is Associate

ate Director, *Emeritus*, of the Syracuse University Library and held various positions during his 30 years at the university. His areas of research are late 16th century music and World War II in Slovenia and Central Europe. His book, *Resistance, Imprisonment, and Forced Labor: A Slovene Student in World War II* was published by Peter Lang Publishers in New York City in 2002. In the series, *Studies in Modern European History*, vol. 47. A Slovene edition with the title *Kdo solze nase posuši: slovenskega dijaka med drugo svetovno vojno*, was published in Slovenia by KD Mohorjan Prevalje and Mohorjeva družba Celje in 2003.

Milač is also the founder and first conductor (1950-1961) of the Singing Society Korotan in Cleveland. The last six years (2001-2007) he served as president of the Society for Slovene Studies.

Holiday Rainbow Salad

1 (3 oz.) box black cherry gelatin, dissolved in 1½ cups hot boiling water.

1 (3 oz.) box cherry gelatin, dissolved in 1 cup hot water, then ½ cup evaporated milk added.

1 (3 oz.) box lime gelatin dissolved in 1½ cups hot water.

1 (3 oz.) box orange gelatin, dissolved in 1½ cups hot water.

1 (3 oz.) box strawberry gelatin, dissolved in 1½ cups hot water.

You may use your own combination of fruited Jello.

Have on hand one large can evaporated milk. Use a 9x13-inch pan (clear glass pans work best). Start with black cherry. Put in pan. Chill until set. While it chills, mix cherry gelatin. Let cool, then pour slowly over black cherry. Chill until set. Make each box in order and cool. Pour over layers, allowing each to set.

In a medium saucepan, stir together half and half, butter, Velveeta, Cheddar cheese. Melt over low heat and blend. Pour over potatoes that have been placed in a 9x13 glass dish sprayed with cooking spray. Let stand for one hour. Bake at 350 degrees for 1 hour.

In Memory of Matt Plečnik

My mom always said there was a reason why she married a man who was three inches shorter than her. As the only other short member of my family, I would like to share with you that reason.

Although my five foot, six-inch Ata was never physically intimidating, he had a presence that was truly larger than life. God had squeezed an amazing personality, an enormous, self-sacrificing heart, and a deeply spiritual, Catholic gentleman into this little man.

My father's personality was a rainbow of different characteristics. He was kind, patient, generous, and smart. But he could also be tough and stubborn. I was always struck by his incredible friendliness. Every Sunday he would walk across five pews just to shake someone's hand during the sign of peace. Also, his outgoing nature was always made obvious through his talent for talking. Even if he had just met you, he could still talk your ear off. In fact, many visitors from the past few weeks shared with my family that he actually inspired and encouraged them through his talking talent. However, my favorite part of his friendly nature was his beautiful, ever-present smile. My clearest memories of my Ata include a bright, joyful expression on his face.

In addition to his persona, many people were impacted by my dad's selfless nature. My Ata's phenomenal work ethic extended far past his livelihood. He volunteered countless hours at St. Vitus dinners whether he was cutting meat in the kitchen or helping someone carry their tray of food. He helped Slovenian school to welcome Sv. Miklavz every year by constructing beautiful scenery on the stage. He created memorable crafts for children at Camp Pristava to build and cherish. He spent many Friday and Saturday nights transporting food and instruments for the St. Ignatius Band. His seemingly boundless energy was channeled to help others. During his sickness, he would pray for every individual who took the time to send him a card. Even to his final moments, he remained unselfish. Although his tumor caused him to suffer, my Ata fought it to be with his family. With his children around him, he waited until my mother told him that it was alright to leave. Then, he took one final breath. He wouldn't go until we told him that he needed to be with God.

He wasn't perfect, but my Ata tried very hard to imitate the Lord. His business was successful because it was based on true honesty. Also, he lived the Beatitudes by serving all of God's people. He helped many people, especially those in need. His greatest spiritual strength came from his strong faith in God. He believed that we are all in God's hands. Throughout his entire life, and especially towards the end, he never hesitated to proclaim that "God is good." He always told us, "Bodi Zgobom" which translates as "Be with God." This devotion to the Lord can inspire us to renew our faith, especially during our time of loss.

I am honored to be able to say that I am my father's daughter. He always held my brothers and me high in his heart. He called us his three diamonds, and he treated us like priceless treasures. I remember how he used to sal-

vage my old papers written in high school and read them at dinner instead of his newspaper. My brothers cherish the many hours spent in the shop with their Ata. In between the hard work, they enjoyed trips to Wendy's and "ten minute" naps. They laugh when they think of how stubborn my dad could be when things weren't done his way. These are just some of the beautiful memories that we will keep in our hearts until we meet Ata again.

In one of my final conversations with my Ata, I asked for his advice on getting through this hard time. He told me that when his mother died, he cried and cried, and cried. And then, he smiled again. Now is the time for tears, but I promised my Ata that I will smile again. I can smile because my Ata is with God. *Bodi Zgobom moj oce* – you are free to be with God forever.



Trusteeship

Trusteeship was established by the Ohio Legislature to prevent garnishment of personal earnings. It is a system where a person pays a percentage of their gross earnings into the court to be prorated among their creditors. Garnishment of wages will not be allowed by creditors as long as the debtor makes regular payments into the trusteeship.

How Does It Work?

You pay 17.5% of your disposable earnings every pay period.

Trusteeship is a voluntary program on the part of both the debtor and the creditor. However, if a creditor refuses to participate, they CANNOT GARNISH YOUR WAGES.

You must make a payment to the court each time you get paid.

Slovenia Has Low Birth Rates

With 1.26 children born per woman, Slovenia is among the countries with the lowest birth rates in the European Union, according to data released by Eurostat ahead of the March 8 International Women's Day.

Poland (1.24) and Slovakia (1.25) are the only countries in the EU with lower birth rates than Slovenia, whereas the EU average, including Bulgaria and Romania, stood at 1.51 in 2005. France tops the list with 1.92 children per woman.

Women in Slovenia live 81.3 years on average, which is 7.2 years longer than men. The EU average stands at 81.5 and 75.4, respectively.

Slovenian women are usually better educated than men. In the second quarter of 2006, 25.5% of women in Slovenia aged between 25 and 59 had a higher-education degree, whereas

the grads among men stood at 18.8%.

On the other hand, Slovenian females lag behind in computer skills, with as many as 47% of those between the ages of 16 and 74 are completely unfamiliar even with computer basics.

The EU average of both men and women with higher education degree ranges between 23 and 24%, with Finland standing out in terms of women with higher education (42%).

As in other EU members, the unemployment rate in Slovenia is higher among women (6.1%) than among men (4.2%), while 11.8% of Slovenian women work part time. The average unemployment rate for women in the EU stands at 8.5%, whereas almost a third of women in employment do not work full time.

**Razpadanje Liberalno demokratske stranke
daje vedno večjo prednost na levici
Borut Pahorjevim Socialdemokratom**

Če velja izid ene novejših anket slovenskega javnega mnenja, če bi bile parlamentarne volitve zdaj (dejansko bodo verjetno jeseni prihodnjega leta), bi Social demokratska stranka 25 odstotkov glasov, tako pa premagala Janez Janšo Slovensko demokratsko stranko, ki bi jih dobila 22%. Pri tem pa omenjajo mnogi opazovalci politike v Sloveniji, da Pahor in Janša nista v nobenem posebnem sprtem položaju, ne osebno in ne politično. Zaradi tega pa se pojavljajo glasove, da bi morda lahko po prihodnjih volitvah – ali celo pred tem – prišlo do nekake velike koalicije, ki bi vključevala poleg SD in SDS še kakšno drugo stranko ali dve.

krat govoril o programu vlade, v kateri bi bili tudi socialni demokrati, stranka sama še ni potrdila njegovega gledanja. Ob nedavnem vstopanju novih, vpliva vajenih bivših Liberalnih demokratov, ne gre izključiti, da bi njih gledanja imela precej več vpliva v SD kakor doslej. Proti koncu marca je predsednik države Janez Drnovšek spet presenetil javnost in razburil vlado. Odpotoval je v New York, ne da bi vlado obvestil o tem, s kom se bo sestal in o čem se bo pogovarjal. Med obiskom v prestolnici ZDA se ni hotel pogovarjati s slovenskimi novinarji. Premier Janez Janša je zadevo obravnaval na srečanju s časnikarji in opozoril, da solistične in z vlado neuskrajljene Drnovškove poteze škodujo ugledu Slovenije v svetu.

Priporočilo slovenskim vernikom za prispevek od dohodnine

Slovenski škofje so svoje vernike povabili, naj pol odstotka svoje dohodnine iz lanskega leta namenijo posamezni škofi, Slovenski karitas ali Redovnim skupnostim Slovenije. Gre namreč za prispevek, ki ga država namenja družbeno koristnim organizacijam od davka na dohodek, ki pripada njej.



Pred nedavnim je slovensko zunanje ministrstvo pripravilo dokument, v katerem našteva deset točk v zvezi z reševanjem odprtih vprašanj s Hrvaško – gre sicer za mejo med državama – in tako s slovenske strani prikazalo vse enostranske hrvaške poteze, ki so vse v škodo Sloveniji. Med spornimi točkami je mejni prehod Sečovlje, hrvaška stran lokacijo pozna kot mejni prehod Plovantija. Tako je zapisalo slovensko zunanje ministrstvo: "Hrvaška je leta 1992 na zemljišču v lasti občine Piran, v kraju Sečovlje – na ploščadi, ki jo je junija 1991, pred osamosvojitvijo, uredila slovenska stran – zgradila 'mejni prehod Plovantija'." Ta tkm. začasni mejni prehod še obstaja. Rastoče nezadovoljstvo zoper hrvaške akcije v Sloveniji zadnje čase pritska na vlado. Med drugimi reakcijami, predsednik SLS in član vlade Janez Podobnik govoril o organizaciji referendumu v Sloveniji glede podpore za hrvaško članstvo v EU – brez slovenskega soglasja bi pač članstvo za Hrvaško bilo nemogoče po pravilih EU. Splošno mnenje je, da se bo moral spor rešiti le preko arbitraže, kajti je dvostranski dogovor med Slovenijo in Hrvaško po vsej verjetnosti nemogoče pričakovati.

Pol stoletja združene Evrope

V tem času se veliko razpravlja in piše o evropskem združevanju. Letos poteka 50 let od znane Rimsko pogodbe, ko je prišlo leta 1957 do ustanovitve sedanje politične Evrope oziroma njenih prvih ustanov.

Ideja o združeni Evropi ima seveda svoje korenine v prejšnjih časih zgodovine. Pustimo pri tem nekatere bolj nasilne poskuse v tem smislu. Rimski imperij je zavzelo večino evropskih in nekaterih izvenevropskih narodov in zavladal nad njimi. Skoraj tisočletje kasneje je Karel Veliki poskusil nekaj podobnega v srednjem, severni in zahodni Evropi. Spet tisoč let kasneje je Napoleon Bonaparte tudi zasedel velik del celine, čeprav je marsikje uvedel dobre reforme. Pri nas so nastale Ilirske province, kjer je tudi slovenščina prvič dobila svoje mesto v šolah in v javni upravi.

Malo prej je v času francoskega iluminizma vrsta mislecev že sanjala o neki nadnarodni oz. naddržavni tvorbi, ki bi povezovala države in narode. Tako sta zlasti pisala Rousseau in Voltaire. V romantiki je tudi prišlo do takih pobud. Dovolj, da spomnimo na Mazzinijevo Mlado Evropo (Giovine Europa). V prvih desetletjih dvajsetega stoletja je grof Coudenhove-Kalergi ustanovil Panevropo. Zapisal je, da se mora vsakdo najprej sam europeizirati.

Pomemben dejavnik v evropskem povezovanju je danes zlasti Evropski parlament. Od začetne parlamentarne skupščine je postopno prišlo do prvega parlamenta, ki povezuje predstavnike včlanjenih držav. Najprej je bil parlament sestavljen iz neizvoljenih poslancev. Parlamenti posameznih držav so namreč izvolili določeno število poslancev, ki je bilo različno za posamezne države. Evropski parlament ima danes v glavnem dva sedeža. To sta Strasbourg in Bruselj, deloma pa ima nekaj uradov tudi v Luksemburgu. Evropski parlament je bil prvič neposredno izvoljen leta 1979. Tedaj smo aktivno sodelovali tudi Slovenci v Italiji, povezani z ostalimi manjšinami, zlasti Valdostanci in Sardinci, pa tudi Furlani in Okcitanci.

Letošnjo okroglo obletnico so seveda obeležila velika praznovanja. Najprej so se evropski državniki zbrali v Rimu. Tu sta italijanski predsednik Giorgio Napolitano in predsednik vlade Romano Prodi v svojih posegih podarila zgodovinski pomen nastanka glavnih evropskih ustanov in njih vlogo včeraj in danes. V Berlinu pa je predvsem govorila kanclerka Angela Merkel in podčrtala bistvene etape evropskega združevanja. Srečanja so se tu udeležili predsedniki držav in zlasti vlad sedemindvajsetih držav članic, med njimi slovenski premier Janez Janša.

Berlinsko srečanje se je zaključilo z deklaracijo, ki še posebej nakazuje bodočnost Evropske unije. Na tem srečanju je tudi prišla do izraza zahteva po urešnici evropske ustavne listine še pred letom 2009, ko bodo prihodne volitve Evropskega parlamenta.

Še starejša ustanova je Svet Evrope, ki so ga ustanovili leta 1949. To je širša parlamentarna ustanova s sedežem v Strasbourg. Z razliko do Evropskega parlamenta je to širši organ in zajema še večje število držav (tudi iz vzhodne Evrope). Svet Evrope pa ima manjše pristojnosti od Evropskega parlamenta, in sprejema sklepe in izjave, ki so bolj moralne in simbolične narave. Še prej se je oblikovala Evropska gospodarska skupnost, omeniti pa moramo še Evropsko premogovno in jeklarsko skupnost ter Euratom. V začetku je sodelovalo šele šest držav, in sicer Francija, Italija, Zahodna Nemčija in države Beneluksa (Belgia, Nizozemska, Luksemburg).

Svoje mesto naj bi v Evropi imelo tudi zgodovinsko krščansko izročilo. Za to se zlasti zavzema papež Benedikt XVI., omenila pa ga je tudi nemška kanclerka Merklová.

Vse to stopa ob letošnjem jubileju združevanja Evrope v ospredje in bo gotovo porok tudi za njeni uspešno bodočnost.

Ljubljana – Tajnik Svetega sedeža za odnose z državami Dominique Mamberti se je 2. aprila srečal z zunanjim ministrom Dimitrijem Ruplom, isti dan ga je sprejel še predsednik republike Janez Drnovšek, naslednji dan pa premier Janez Janša.

V izjavi za javnost je Mamberti poudaril, da sta strani dosegli dogovore na številnih področjih, zlasti pa je izrazili zadovoljstvo nad sprejetim zakonom o verski svobodi.

Zunanji minister Rupel je ob tem ocenil, da so dvostranski odnosi med Slovenijo in Vatikanom dobri. Na pogovoru so prevladovale evropske teme, predvsem nujnost medverskega in medkulturnega dialoga, kar bo po besedah zunanjega ministra tudi ena od prioriteta slovenskega predsedovanja Evropski uniji v prvi polovici prihodnjega leta.

V zvezi s preambulo k evropski ustavi je Rupel dejal, da je Slovenija ratificirala pogodbo, ki je v skladu z željami Vatikana, saj je kot izvor EU v njej omenjeno krščanstvo. Ta čas potekajo pogovori o rešitvi krize, ki je nastala z zavrnitvijo te pogodbe na Nizozemskem in v Franciji.

Tudi po mnenju predsednika republike Drnovška so odnosi med državama odlični. Na srečanju 2. aprila sta z Mambertijem večji del pogovora namenila položaju v Sudanski pokrajini Dar (DALJE na str. 14)

Priporočene vrednosti holesterola

LJUBLJANA – Holesterol je snov, ki se nahaja v vsaki človeški celici. Holesterol je sestavni del celičnih membran. Iz holesterola človeško telo izdeluje žolčne kisline, spolne hormone in predstopnjo vitamina D, ki se pod vplivom sončnih žarkov v koži spremeni v aktivno obliko vitamina D.

Holesterol je zato življenjsko nujna sestavina našega telesa, v telo pride s prehrano, naše telo ga lahko tudi nanovo naredi. Težave nastanejo, kadar je holesterola v krvi preveč. Holesterol se začne kopičiti v žilnih stenah, razvijati se začne ateroskleroza.

Arteroskleroza je najpogostejši vzrok za pojav srčnožilnih bolezni, ki so v razvitem svetu vodilni vzrok smrti. Zato bi moral vsak moški, starejši od 35 let, in vsaka ženska, starejša od 45 let, poznati raven holesterola v krvi.

Velja splošno pravilo, da je tveganje za srčnožilne bolezni manjše, čim manjše so vrednosti LDL (slabega) holesterola in trigliceridov in čim večja je vrednost HDL (dobrega) holesterola v krvi. V raziskavi razširjenosti dejavnikov tveganja za srčnožilne bolezni med Slovenci, so ugotovili, da ima več kot 60% odraslih prebivalcev Slovenije preveč holesterola v krvi.

Kdor ima normalne vrednosti holesterola in maščob v krvi, naj gre spet na pregled čez 5 let. Če so vrednosti zvečne, naj družinski zdravni presodi o ukrepih in prihodnjih kontrolah.

V številnih raziskavah so dokazali, da zmanjšanje koncentracije holesterola v krvi bistveno upočasni razvoj arteroskleroze in s tem tveganje za pojav srčnega infarkta, možganske kapi in bolezni motenj prekrvitve okončin.

Holesterol v krvi lahko zmanjšamo predvsem z bolj zdravim načinom življenja. Jesti je treba bolj zdravo, uravnoteženo prehrano z veliko sadja in zelenjave in malo živalskimi maščobami. Zmanjšati je treba preveliko telesno težo. Prenehati je treba kaditi in piti alkohol. Začeti se je treba več in bolj redno gibati.

Naslednji ukrep so zdravila za zniževanje koncentracije holesterola v krvi. Ta so zelo uspešna, še posebej, če ljudje, ki jih jemljejo, upoštevajo tudi našteta pravila zdravega življenja.
