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Vabilo škofa dr. G. Rožmana k pobožnosti petih prvih sobot

Dne 13. maja 1946 je bilo v Fatimi na Portugalskem, kjer se je Mati Božja med prvo svetovno vojno prikazovala trem preprostim pastirčkom, največje romanje portugalskega naroda. Udeležilo se ga je 750,000 ljudi. Prišli so se zahvaliti Materi Božji, ker jih je obvarovala grozot zadnje svetovne vojne. Papež — Kristusov vikar — je iz Rima govoril zbranim množicam enega najlepših govorov o Materi Božji in ga zaključil: "Vpisali ste se kot križarji, da osvojite, oziroma zopet osvojite Njeno Kraljestvo, ki je Kraljestvo božje. Pred nebom in zemljjo ste se samega sebe zavezali, da boste njo ljubili, jo častili, ji služili, jo posnemali, tako da boste z njenim blagoslovom bolje služili božemu Kralju. Istočasno ste se tudi zavezali, da boste delali, da jo bodo ljudje bolj ljubili, bolj častili in ji služili povsod, v družinah, v družbah in v vsem svetu."

Nas je, ob Novem letu, prevzvišeni dr. Gregorij Rožman, škof ljubljanski, s posebnim osebnim pismom povabil k skupni pobožnosti petih prvih sobot, ki naj bi jih začeli s prvo soboto v februarju (5. februarja). S to pobožnostjo ob desetletnici najstrašnejših žrtev slovenskega naroda naj biše posebej obudili spomin na te žrtev, dali zadoščenje njemu brezmadežnemu Srcu in jo prosili posebnega varstva za se in ves naš narod.

Ne moremo se združiti na kaki Marijini božji poti, kadar se je združil portugalski narod leta 1946, toda združili se bomo v tej pobožnosti duhovno, da njo, Mater Božja, častimo in se ji posvetimo. Odziv na škofovo vabilo med Slovenci po svetu je tako velik, da lahko govorimo o duhovnem romanju Slovencev z vseh delov sveta k Materi Božji, k češčenju katere nas vsa leta svojega pastirovanja tako goreče vzpodbuja ljubljanski škof.

K temu nas vspodbuja še posebno tudi misel na žalostne razmere v domovini, kjer ni verske svobode. Naši rojaki tam ne bodo mogli slediti škofovemu vabilu, — zato je tem bolj naša dolžnost, da poslušamo njegov glas.

Mati Božja je Luciji, najstarejši fatimskih pastirčkov, naročila posvetitev Rusije brez. Srcu Marijinemu in pogledala tudi, če se to ne zgodi, da se bodo zmote Rusije razširile po vseh deželah sveta. Razlagalci naročila so vsi enih misli, da mora s to posvetitvijo biti združeno tudi zadoščevanje vernih v svobodnem svetu. Ljudje morajo moliti rožni venec, doprinašati žrtev, opravljati pobožnost prvih sobot v mesecu, da tako s skupno duhovno akcijo odvrnejo nevarnosti komunizma.

Žrtev našega naroda, ki so bile doprinešene na oltar vere, da zaježimo prodiranje brezbožnega komunizma, nas še bolj bude, da sledimo željam in naročilom Matere Božje.

Drugi teden v soboto, 5. februarja, je začetek te pobožnosti in naj bi ne bilo Slovencev, ki je že ohranil vero v Boga, ki se ne bi pridružil tej skupni pobožnosti in se pravil na končno ponovno posvetitev vsega slovenskega naroda brez. Marijinemu Srcu, ki bo na nedeljo, 5. junija, t. l., tako da bodo tudi za nas veljale besede svetega očeta: "Pred nebom in zemljjo ste samega sebe zavezali, da boste njo ljubili, jo častili, ji služili, jo posnemali..." V desetih letih se je marsikaj spremenilo

Ko so maja 1. 1945 bežali protikomunistični Slovenci preko meje v Avstrijo in Italijo, so jih zavezniki sprejemali nezaupljivo in včasih naravnost nepriznajo. Titova propaganda je svetu pripovedovala, da so ti ljudje izdajalci in so delavci nasilnega nacizma. Svet tedaj ni poznal komunistične nevarnosti v taki meri, kot jo pozna danes. Zaradi tega nepoznanja in zaradi tedanjega zaveznosti svobodnega sveta s komunističnim nasiljem je izgubilo preko enajst tisoč slovenskih mož in fantov svoja življenja. Bil bi skrajni čas, da Slovenci v svobodnem svetu o tem razmislimo in pokažeemo svetu vso zlaganost, hinavščino in zločinstvo jugoslovenskih komunističnih oblastnikov, ki so že po končani vojni pomorili na desetisočje svojih nasprotnikov.

Doslej je izšlo nekaj knjižic o komunističnih zločinah v Sloveniji v našem jeziku. To je dosti premalo. Treba je sestaviti primerljivo dokumentirano knjigo o teh stvareh v angleškem jeziku. Čas za to je dozorel. V desetih letih se je v svetu marsikaj spremenilo!

Da je temu res tako, nam dokazujojo med drugim tudi poročila iz Indokine. Protikomunisti iz Severnega predela dežele, ki je prišlo pod oblast komunistov, beže na jug. Franci in posebno Amerikanici jim pri begu po najboljših močeh pomagajo. Celo Angleži, ki so maja 1. 1945 vrnili slovenske protikomuniste Titu, sprejemajo sedaj begunce iz komunističnih dežel z odprtimi rokami.

Slovenci smo bili med prvimi narodi svobodnega sveta, ki so komunistično nevarnost spoznali in se proti njej borili

z vsemi silami. V tej borbi smo imeli strahotne žrtve. Prav in potrebno je, da o teh žrtvah spregovorimo vsemu svobodnemu svetu, da bo naša teža tedaj, ko se bo znova odločala usoda narodov, večja in naš glas močnejši!

Zanimivo je čitati, kako je Father Richard Gruenberk poučil in preobrnil h katoliški veri 40 kaznjencev v Michigan City kaznilnici. Vseh 40 je na isti dan prejelo prvo sv. obhajilo. Kar nam zopet kaže, kako velike vrednosti za družbo je vera v Bogove.

Tisti jark, ki mu pravimo "Grand Canyon," je 217 milj dolg, povprečno 10 milj širok, pa eno miljo globok. Računajo da je vzel vodi od sedem do devet milijonov let, da je skopala ta grabenc. SECOND WEEK OF CONGRESS. New Congresses seem to get away slowly in spite of all that Members can do! It takes just so long to make up the Committee, especially when control shifts over to the other Party. But on Wednesday the House Republicans approved the work of their Committee on Committees had an unusually difficult task. The end result is generally good.

My own studies have developed that there is all to little authoritative data on the whole subject. Obviously, without facts we cannot legislate fairly or intelligently. This new bill would authorize the Secretary of Labor to make a complete study of wage differentials now existing between men and women. We need to know the possible effect on wage scales. We need to know the psychological effect of the discrimination that now exists. We need to know how effective State legislation has been in dealing with the problem. We need to know many such things.

You may be interested to know that nobody is really against equal pay. There is just a great deal of difference of opinion as to how it can be worked out.

1955 Heart Fund Drive

A mobilization that will include more than 26,000 civic minded persons in Cuyahoga, Lake, Lorain and Geauga Counties, progresses this week in the 1955 Heart Fund Drive, to be held Feb. 1-20.

The single public movement against disease of the heart in this area, the Heart Fund is this year seeking a goal of \$450,000 to implement the fight against this leading killer of mankind, one which kills more every year than the next five causes combined.

The three-week drive will culminate in a two-hour residential solicitation on Heart Sunday, Feb. 20, when the Heart Fund Volunteer workers will call on their neighbors seeking contributions to be channeled into the Cleveland Area Heart Society's three-pronged attack against Heart Disease — Research ... Education ... and Community Service.

A disheartening factor about Heart Disease is that all too little can be done to cure or alleviate the two major forms, Arteriosclerosis (hardening of the arteries) and Hypertension (high blood pressure), which together cause 90 per cent all heart deaths. With a realization of the vast store of knowledge which must be obtained before it can put its education and rehabilitation programs into effect, the American Heart Ass'n. and its affiliates have made a concerted effort to answer these medical questions thru an all-out program of laboratory research.

In 1954, the Cleveland Area Heart Society channelled over \$300,000 into this research, supporting 29 different projects in laboratories in the Cleveland area. The allocations constitute over half of the \$514,000 realized from the general response Clevelanders gave the 1954 Heart Fund Campaign.

An additional 25 per cent of last year's Fund Drive total in the Cleveland area was forwarded to the American Heart Association for national research and control programs. A good deal of this money has been returned to our locale thru research grants awarded to local research investigators.

Allocations totalling \$22,000 were set aside for the support of the Heart Society's three clinical programs. These include the Work Classification Clinic for the proper evaluation of the job capacity of the heart patient in business and industry; The Children's Diagnostic Clinic, for the early diagnosis of children with suspected Congenital or Rheumatic Heart Disease;

and the Heart of the Home Program, a course of instruction in work simplification methods for the home maker who is handicapped with Heart Disease.

An additional \$30,000 was allocated for program of public and professional education.

Last year's campaign here was accomplished for less than 9 per cent of the realized financial return.

This, briefly, is an accounting of where the funds from your 1954 contributions went to help medical science wage the war against this nation's number one health menace.
