### Boj za vesolje med SZ in ZDA v polnem teku

Predsednik Johnson je pooblastil obrambno tajništvo za gradnjo posebnih umetnih lun — vojaških laboratorijev.

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Ameriške letalske sile so ponovno skušale dobiti polnomočje za razširitev svojih naporov pri prodiranju v vesolje in za njegovo obvladanje. Z ljubosumjem so gledale na NASA, ki vodi civilne napore naše dežele v vesolju. Poudarjale so, da je večji del ruskega vesoljskega napora posvečen vojaškim ciljem, med tem ko je Amerika v tem pogledu daleč zadaj. Odločile so se za gradnjo in preskušanje posebnega vesoljskega lovca Dyna-Soar, pa morale to opustiti po odločitvi obrambne tajništva.

Sedaj je predsednik Johnson dal obrambnemu tajniku polnomočje, da naroči Letalskim sistemom gradnjo umetnih lun-laboratorijev s človeško posadko. V ta namen je odobrenih biljoni in pol dolarjev, več kot za ves Gemini program. Prve vojaške umetne lune (MOL) bodo poslane na pot okoli Zemlje leta 1968. Posadke za nje letalske sile že vežbajo v svojem lastnem središču na Edwards letalskem oporišču v Kaliforniji. Vojaki trdijo, da je za vojaške namene posebno važen prostor blizu Zemlje, ne oni daleč proč od nje. Poskrbti za obvladanje tega je za nje veliko važnejše kot pa poleteti na Luno, kaj šele na Venere ali Mars.

Letalske sile so doslej poslale v vesolje 150 umetnih lun raznih vrst v pretežno vojaške namene, največ za opazovanja in fotografiranje ozemlja Sovjetije in rdeče Kitajske. Moskva je obdolžila tudi Gemini 5 vojaškega vohunjenja. Astronavta Cooper in Conrad naj bi posvečala posebno pozornost rdeči Kitajski, Severnemu Vietnamu in — Kubi.

Sovjetska zveza je v zadnjem letu poslala v vesolje že tudi celo vrsto vohunskih umetnih lun, gre v glavnem za vrsto Kozmos. Preteklo sredo je poletela v vesolje 79. Te ne opazuje samo Ameriko, ampak nemara še pazljivejše rdečo Kitajsko.

### Gen. Westmoreland hoče lastno obvezčevalno službo

SAIGON, J. Viet. — Vrhovni poveljnik ameriških vojaških sil v Južnem Vietnamu gen. Westmoreland je ukazal organiziranje lastne ameriške vojaške obvezčevalne službe.

Predno bo poslal ameriške čete v kako akcijo, hoče imeti svoje lastne podatke o položaju, namesto da bi bil vezan na južnovietnamske, ki so se ponovno izkazali kot skrajno nezanesljive.

### Večina šolskih okrajev odpravlja segregacijo

WASHINGTON, D.C. —

Zvezne oblasti so opozorile vodnike šolskih okrajev na Jugu, da naj izvajajo integracijo šol ali pa bodo izgubili pravico do podpor iz zveznih sredstev. Zvezni komisijer za šolstvo F. Keppel je v posebni okrožnici obvestil vse prizadete, da zakon o civilnih pravicah od lani ne dovoljuje zvezne podpore šolam, ki vstrajajo pri segregaciji. One šole, ki niso predložile načrtov za integracijo, so doble svarilo, da naj te načrte predložijo do 31. avgusta.

Skupno je predložilo načrte o integraciji 930 šolskih odborov, kjer segregacija še obstaja, odgovora ni bilo iz 184 okrajev. Preko 80% se jih je torej odločilo pokoriti se zveznim zakonom. Največ okrajev ni odgovorilo iz držav Mississippi (49), Louisiane (35) in Teksasa (19).

### Sedaj ima dežela samo 19 "gnezd velike brez- poselnosti"

WASHINGTON, D.C. —

Federalno tajništvo za delo je razdelilo vso deželo po krajih večje ali manjše brezposelnosti. Kraji največje brezposelnosti so tisti, kjer je 6-9% ljudi brez posla, srednja brezposelnost vlada v krajih z 3-6% brezposelnih, odstotki pod 3 pa pomenijo kraje, kjer je brezposelnost najmanjša.

Lani je bilo krajev z največjo brezposelnostjo še 26, letos jih ni več samo še 19. Tako malo jih ni bilo že od 1. 1957. V naši ohajski državi ni nobenega gnezda velike brezposelnosti, tako trdijo največji namestniki; včasih jih je številke tajništva za delo.

Vzemimo na primer sledenje slučaj: Cooper in Conrad sta letela nad Zemljo komaj 125 milij visoko. Z letalskega oporišča Vandenberg v Kaliforniji so prav tisti trenutek poslali v vesolje medcelinsko raketo Minuteman. Astronavta sta jo takoj opazila in jo celo ugnili nekajkrati fotografirati in nabrat nekaj drugih podatkov o njej. Če se jima je to posrečilo za

ženi vaškega poglavarja nedaleč od Pleiku so rezali rdeči kos za kosom mesa s telesa, da bi jo pripravili k "govoru".

SAIGON, J. Viet. — V začetku tedna so rdeči gverilci zasedli postojanko podpornikov vladnih čet v osrednjem višavju Južnega Vietnamu 15 milij vzhodno od oporišča Pleiku. Posadka se je umaknila iz vasi, ki so jo rdeči zasedli. Vaškega poglavarja in njegovega najmlajšega sina so takoj pokončali, poglavarjevi ženi pa so rezali živi kos za kosom mesa s telesa in ji po kosih odsekavali roki, da bi jim razkrila, kam se je posadka skrila. Vse te strahote so prišle na dan, ko so ameriške enote pognale rdeče iz vasi in rešile preživele žrtve. Te so nato prepeljali v varnejše področje.

Po uradnem poročilu so imeli

ameriške enote pretekli teden v bojih v Južnem Vietnamu skupno 59 mrtvih, večji del jih je padlo brez dvoma v bojih na Van Tuong polotoku. Tekom letalskih napadov na Severni Vietnam je bilo sestreljeno od protiletalske obramebe letalo F-105 Letalskih sil, med tem ko je bilo mornariško letalo Phantom sestreljeno kakih 90 milij južno od Hanoia s protiletalsko raketo SAM. To je bilo tretje ameriško letalo sestreljeno z raketo. Te rakete so dali Vietnamu Rusi in jih verjetno tudi Rusi upravljajo. Med tem ko so okoli Hanoia stalna oporišča teh raket, obstoje tudi druga na vzhodih in rakete s tem so sestreljene ameriška letala. Ameriške letalske sile so zato dobile navodilo, naj raketna oporišča iz izjemo onih okoli Hanoia uničijo, kakov hitro jih odkrijejo.

### Vojskovanje je še zmeraj privlačno za mladino

HEIDELBERG, Nem. — Iz glavnega štaba čet ZDA v Nemčiji poročajo, da se je sedaj priglasilo nad 2,000 naših vojakov, ki bi radi menjali mirno življenje v Nemčiji z vojskovanjem v Vietnamu. Nad 500 proučen je že bilo ugodno rešenih.

Vojničke oblasti ne morejo nameniti, naj raketna oporišča iz izjemo onih okoli Hanoia uničijo, kakov hitro jih odkrijejo.

### Prijateljstvo med Indijo in Moskvo se je ohladilo

MOSKVA, ZSSR. — Indijski ministrski predsednik Šastri je že tekom svojega pomladanskega obiska v Moskvi skušal pridobiti Kremlj, da bi se v sporu za Kašmir postavil na indijsko stran. Šastri tega ni mogel dosegiti. Sedaj je indijska diplomacija zopet poskusila svojo srečo, toda ji je zopet spodeljelo. Moskva je jasno povedala, da bo biti v sporu med Indijo in Pakistanom o Kašmirju neutralna, kar je hudo prizadelo indijsko vlado. Boji se namreč, da bodo v Moskvi napravili Pakistansu še druge usluge, seveda na indijski račun.

Vse to je zanimivo radi tega, ker bo od tega imela korist naša zunanjja politika. Indijska vlada je namreč še zmeraj huda na Johnsona, ker je odpovedal obisk ministrskega predsednika Šastrija. Sedaj pa, ko njeni prijateljstvo z Moskvo ni več tako trdno, bo morala zopet misliti na tesnejše stike z našo deželjo, četudi so tudi naši diplomatje nevtralni v sporu glede Kašmira.

### Republikanci isčejo naprednejši "obraz"!

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Glavni odbor republikanske stranke je v skrbeh zaradi močnega vpliva, ki ga imajo konzervativne sile na strankine pristaše. Tako je dobil sodelavec lista "Plain Dealer" iz Cleveland S. Watzman podatke, ki kažejo, da naj bi konzervativci iz kroga Goldwatera dali na razpolago imenike republikanskih finančnih podpornikov prišestvenim konzervativnega krila stranke, ki so prav tedaj ustvarjali "Zvezdo svobodne družbe" in Ameriško konzervativno zvezo.

Watzmanovo poročilo je nekako pojasnilo poročilo o nasilnem odpirjanju predala pisalne mize tedanjega glavnega blagajnika in republikanske stranke F. J. Kovaca. Odpril ga je W. C. Kelly, ožji sodelavec novega načelnika stranke R. Blissa. Ko je vsa reč prišla v javnost, je bil Kelly odpuščen.

Bliss in tovariši se zavedajo, da republikanska stranka s skrajnim desničarskim in konzervativnim "obrazom" ne more razpolagati na uspeh pri volivceh. Skušajo jih dati zato naprednejši obraz. Watzmanovo "razkritje" naj bi služilo temu cilju — tako vsaj tu ugibljejo.

### DOM JE ODOBRLJEN POMOČ VISOKOŠOLSKI IZOBRAZBI

Predstavniški dom je včeraj izglasoval zakonski predlog za pomoč visokim šolam in študiranju na njih. V te namene je bilo izglasovanih \$637 milijonov. Za predlog je glasovalo 387 kongresnikov, proti pa 22. Izglasovani predlog je bil poslan v Senat, kjer ga utegnejo celo razsiriti.

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Kongres priznava potrebo po izboljšanju in razsiritvi visokega šolstva v naši deželi in po povečanju možnosti študiranja revnih in manj premožnih, pa sposobnih mladih ljudi na visokih šolah. Predstavniški dom je izglasoval včeraj načrt pomoči visokim šolam in onim, ki žele na njih študirati. Na eni strani hčijo pomagati visokim šolam pri gradnji novih stavb, pa tudi razsiritvi učnih programov, na drugi nudi novi program štipendije in podpore sposobnim mladim ljudem, ki nimajo lastnih sredstev za študij na visokih šolah. Za gradnje predvideva program 290 milijonov, za pomoč študentom v raznih oblikah pa 197 milijonov. Posebej je določenih 70 milijonov za izboljšanje knjižnic na visokih šolah in za vežbanje knjižničarjev.

Visokošolci in oni, ki žele študirati na visokih šolah, bodo dobili v okviru novega programa štipendije, te so namenjene predvsem revnim, pa sposobnim mladim dijakom, posojila in podpore za plačevanje obresti posojil, potrebnih za študij na visokih šolah. Zadnje je namenjeno predvsem študentom družin srednjimi dohodki, ki pa ne zmorejo vse stroškov študija na visokih šolah sami, oziroma njihovi starši.

HOUSTON, Tex. — Gemini 5 ima zopet težave pri oskrbi z električno silo in gorivom za rakete, ki pomagajo vesoljsko vozilo krmarti in mu spreminjati smer ter brzino. Zaradi teh težav je možno, da bo vesoljsko vozilo pristalo že jučri namesto v nedeljo dopolnilne, kot je bilo prvotno predvideno. Gemini 5 in astronauta Cooper in Conrad sta že sedaj postavila nov rekord poleta skozi vesolje in dosegljata za Ameriko tudi vodstvo v številu na vesoljskih poletov.

COLUMBUS, O. — Tu bo danes odprt veliki letni velesejem. Gov. Rhodes je proglašil za tvelesejem posebni "Manryjev dan" prihodnji četrtek in povabil Roberta Manryja in njegovo družino kot državna gostata dan v Columbus, da si velesejem ogledajo. Manry se bo vrnil v sredo v Cleveland, kjer mu pripravljajo slovenski sprejem za njegovo uspešno prejadrjanje severnega Atlantika v mali jadrnični Tinkerbelle.

LA JOLLA, Calif. — Vojna marinica je spustila včeraj Sealab 2 na 205 čevljev globoko na morsko dno. Posadka v njem bo proučevala možnosti življenja človekove sposobnosti za delo v morski globini.

MOSKVA, ZSSR. — Danes je priletel sem predsednik Egipeta Naser in prinesel s seboj nov načrt za končanje vojne v Vietnamu. Ta načrt so izdelali skupno indijski Šastri, jugoslovanski Tito in Naser. Naser se sedaj skušal dobiti zanj sovjetsko podporo.

MOSKVA, ZSSR. — "Pravda," glasilo Komunistične partije ZSSR, je pozvala Indijo in Pakistan, naj mirnim potom rešita vprašanje Kašmirja.

CLEVELAND, O. — Danes zjutraj je divjalo hudo neurje na področju Chicaga, pa preko Indiane v severni Ohio. Bilo je precej materialne škode.

## Resnica je udarila na dan

Celo mnogim Slovencem v tujini je malo znano, kaj se je dogajalo med vojno in po njej v Sloveniji. Marsičesa človek res ne razume, dokler sam ne doživi. Ni čudno, da o vojnih in povojskih razmerah pri nas še manj vedo in so napako poučeni tuji. Postali so žrtve komunistične propagande, ki ji je laž redno sredstvo v političnih bojih.

Poučen primer za to je v letosnjem letu svobodoljubna Nizozemska. Slovenski komunistični tisk je pred meseči objavil obvestilo, da bo Partizanski invalidski pevski zbor iz Ljubljane šel prepevati na Nizozemsko, kamor so ga povabili. To še samo zase ne bi bilo tako hudo, toda istočasno so objavili tudi, da bo ta zbor **sodeloval pri proslah dvašetletnice nizozemske svobode**. To pa je že goče izzivanje za vsakega Slovence, ki pozna partizansko uničevanje svobode. In bilo je izzivanje tudi za Slovence na Nizozemskem in v ostali zapadni Evropi. Smatrali so, da na izzivanje morajo odgovoriti, ker je stvar bila za veliko večino slovenskega naroda tako žaljiva, da bi molk postal izdajstvo. Od vseh strani so začela romati pisma nizozemskim uradom, časopisom, organizacijam, ki so pojasnjevala, kako strahotne zločine so partizani zagrešili med vojno nad slovenskim narodom. Misli iz omenjenih pism so bile objavljene v nizozemskem dnevnom časopisu. Tako je v javnost prišla vsaj delna resnica o komunističnih partizanih na Slovenskem in izgledalo je, kot da je s tem stvar bila končana, da so svobodni Slovenci opravili svojo nalogu.

Toda neki časopis v Maastrichtu je radi popolnega nezumevanja in nepoznanja predmeta že po tej prvi akciji v svojem članku o partizanih težko žalil resnico in s tem sprožil novo akcijo svobodnih Slovencov.

Zaradi resnosti okoliščin — partizanski prijatelji in nepoučeni časopisi niso trdili nič manj kot to, da so demokratični nasprotniki komunističnih partizan na Slovenskem bili sodelavci in podporniki nacizma in fašistov — so se demokratični Slovenci v zapadni Evropi odločili za izredno in učinkovito sredstvo.

S posebnim odprtim pismom so se obrnili naravnost na nizozemski narod. To pismo je pojasnilo, da se komunistični partizani na Slovenskem niso borili za svobodo, kot je zelo nespametno trdil dnevnik v Maastrichtu, **marveč so se borili le za oblast nad slovenskim narodom**. V boju za to oblast so načrtno morili vse, kar bi jih moglo ovirati pri njihovih nakanah. Tako so komunistični partizani, izjavila pismo, postali najstrahotnejši krvniki poštenega, vernega in narodno zavednega slovenskega ljudstva. Pomorili so več nedolžnih ljudi kot vsi okupatorji skupaj.

Nizozemci zato res ne morejo biti posebno ponosni, da so ti judje bili povabljeni k sodelovanju pri proslavi 20-letnice njihove svobode in zmage nad nacizmom. Prepričanje je, da bodo prihodnji bolj previdni.

To pismo, tiskano na lepem papirju, opremljeno s slikami treh Mravljetovih bratov z Brezovice, nedolžnih žrtev komunističnih pokoljev, je bilo razposlano po vsej Nizozemski. Prejeli so ga od kraljice Julijane in kneza Bernarda vsi do župana malega naselja v Stenakenu, kjer so se zavzemali za partizansko udeležbo. Pismo je učinkovalo. Brali so ga z velikim zanimanjem in mnogi so povedali, da doslej niso imeli pojma o komunističnih strahotah v Sloveniji. Nizozemski člani odpore proti okupatorju, ki so slovenske partizane sprejeli kot tovariše v boju za isto stvar, so z mesešimi občutki brali tisti del pisma, ki dokumentarično dokazuje, kako so komunisti v Jugoslaviji skušali napraviti dogovor z nemškim okupatorjem, da bi s skupnimi močmi vrgli v morje zapadne zavezničke, v slučaju, da bi se le-ti izkrcali na jadranski obali.

Vsebino "odprtega pisma" je med drugimi objavil tudi "Limburgs Dagblad". Glavni naslov članka je bil "Slovensko odprto pismo holandskemu narodu", podnaslov pa: "Rjava sužnost je samo zamenjala barvo" (Hitlerjevemu suženjstvu je sledilo komunistično), "Strahotno zavajanje javnega mnenja", in "Nobene svobode".

Odkar se je pojavilo slovensko odprto pismo, sta mila dva meseca. Komunisti doslej niso odgovorili. Že vedo čemu molče. Mi tudi.

Smemo biti veseli, da si je resnica o komunističnih partizanih v Sloveniji utrla pot med nizozemsko ljudstvo vsaj ob dvašetletnici največjih komunističnih zločinov, ko so pod zverinsko roko padali tisočeri najboljši Slovenci in je v strahu in obupu zajokala vsa Slovenija.

Opisani dogodki na Nizozemskem kažejo, da Slovenci v svobodnem svetu, zlasti politična emigracija, nismo storili svoje dolžnosti, da bi svetu povedali resnico o "narodni osvobodilni borbi" v Sloveniji. Od njenega konca je minilo že nad 20 let, pa del sveta še vedno vidi v komunističnih revolucionarjih borce za narodno svobodo. Mar res

ni mogoče sestaviti in natisniti, mirno, kratko, strokovno poročilo o revoluciji v Sloveniji tekom druge svetovne vojne v angleščini in francoščini ter ga razširiti po vsem svobodnem svetu? Gre za resnico in ne za propagando! Resnica ne zmaguje vedno, zlasti ne hitro, če ji nihče ne pomaga.

## Živila sušilo na mrazu

## Postopek je dober, zahteva pa drage naprave.

"Zmrznilo in posušeno, nato spet kot sveže," je kratek in hkrati nazoren opis najnoviješega konservativnega postopka. Čeprav se zdi metoda preprosta, se še začenja uveljavljati v nekaterih industrijskih deželah. Smoter liofilizacije, kakor pa se imenuje ta metoda: odstraniti kar največ vode iz hrane, ki jo želimo konservirati. Sicer pa ne gre samo za hrano; po tem postopku je mogoče konservirati tudi nekatera zdравila, med drugim antibiotike, pa kri za medicinske potrebe ipd.

Pri običajnem sušenju z zviševanjem temperature vselej prihaja do določenega razkroja, zato so izvedenci ubrali nasprotne pot. Prvi del postopka je zmrzovanje pri 30 do 40 stopinj, nato pa dajo zmrznilo snov v brezračen prostor. Led, ki je nastal iz vode v proizvodu (hrani, zdravil ipd.), preplahi, se pravi, da se brez prehoda v tekoče stanje spreminja v hlapo.

Ker kljub temu ostane v hrani še nekaj vode, jo segrejejo na temperaturo 30 do 60 stopinj, tako da se skoraj popolnoma posuši. Tako konservirana snov vsebuje, kvečjemu dva odstotka vlage. Uspešnost postopka poznarja dejstvo, da vsebuje hrana običajno 80 do 90 odstotkov vode.

Proizvod, pakiran v brezračenem prostoru, lahko spravimo v navadno shrambo za skorajdo poljubno dolgo dobo. Pred uporabo ga krajši čas namačamo v navadni vodi, ki mu vrne prvotno obliko, barvo, vonj in okus, tako da ga je težko ločiti od popolnoma svežega živila.

Zakaj se postopek ne uveljavlja v najširšem obsegu, če je tako imeniten? Metoda ima še nekaj pomanjkljivosti, draga je, potrebuje sokaj zapleteni priporavniki.

Težko je reči, katere pomajnike so posledica nezadostnega tehničnega napredka. Raziskave, ki se nadaljujejo v mnogih delelah, bodo prav gotovo prinesle še marsikatero izpopolnitve.

### Clev. Summer Orchestra "POPS" Concert Attendance Ahead of last Season

The series of seventeen pops concerts presented by The Cleveland Summer Orchestra this season in Public Auditorium closed last weekend, having attracted close to 80,000 people. The total attendance figure of 79,486 compares favorably with last season's final figure which was less than 73,000 for 15 programs. The all-time high was reached during the 1963 season when 81,492 persons attended 15 concerts.

Biggest attraction of the season at Public Auditorium was again the appearance of Cleveland's Henry Mancini as guest conductor in a program devoted to his own music. Mr. Mancini drew a crowd of 7,932 on Friday night, July 30 and 8,233 the following evening to bring the weekend total attendance to a staggering 16,165. A "Rodgers and Hammerstein Night" on August 7 attracted the next largest crowd of the summer, 6,926.

The President of the Musical Arts Association, Frank E. Joseph, remarked that although "pops" attendance was somewhat improved this summer, the financial picture will loom darker than in past seasons. This is due principally to increased salaries and other higher costs including rental fees at Public Auditorium. The fact that the touring company of "Hello Dolly," was booked into the Music Hall and forced the Orchestra to adapt the Auditorium side of the stage in such a manner as to eliminate an entire row of tables also reduced income. This booking conflict also undoubtedly had an adverse effect on "pops" attendance.

★ Athens. — Greek customs officials are checking closely into whisky imports. The investigation was started when British exports showed Greece had imported 40,000 cases of whisky last year but Greek customs records showed only 22,000 cases listed as entering the country.

★ Washington, — "The sun boat" has been found feasible by army engineers after extensive tests. It is a lightweight craft that operates entirely by sunlight falling on power generating cells. The boat is probably especially adapted for use in the tropics. The army conclusion was that "the use of solar cells propulsion of light weight watercraft is feasible. The solar propulsion boat may have potential military application where it is necessary to operate quietly and without using conventional fuel. It seems best adapted, says a report, for terrains with sluggish rivers and plenty of sunshine. It should be able to operate at a speed of about four knots, disregarding the effects of current or wind.

The dog almost got away with the "crime" when Police Cpl. Harold Cox saw it walking calmly on the street with the purse clutched in its mouth. Mrs. Beatrice Archibald said the dog snatched the purse from her grasp and took off. Its owner is unknown. It was taken to the animal shelter.

New York, N.Y. — Casey Stengel, after a 20-day stay in Roosevelt Hospital, was discharged on Friday, Aug. 13, returning to the Essex House, his New York residence.

The 75-year-old manager of the

Mets, who entered the hospital on July 25 with a fractured left hip and underwent an operation two days later, departed via a rear door in an effort to avoid any fanfare.

Casey, whose permanent home is in Glendale, Calif., was expected to remain in New York for the rest of the season in order to be tuned in on Mets' games—either by radio or television.

### Charity Takes Big Loss As Rams Defeat Cowboys

Los Angeles, Calif. — Los Angeles won the game, but charity was a big loser when the Rams knocked off the Dallas Cowboys, 9-0, in a National Football League exhibition on August 17.

The game attracted only 31,579, about half the average in the 20-year history of the Los Angeles Times charity event. Because of the rioting in the area, the contest was postponed for four days.

Bruce Gossett accounted for all of the Ram's points, kicking three field goals, one in the first period and two in the second. They traveled 30, 12 and 22 yards.

### Injuns' Gate Hits 339,793; 186,700 Over 1964 Season

Cleveland, O. — After 37 home dates, the Indians' attendance was up to 839,793—or 186,700 more than they attracted during the entire 1964 season.

If they are to hit the million mark for the first time since 1959 (when 1,497,976 passed through the turnstiles), they'll need to average 10,680 in each of their 15 remaining dates. Their average for each of 40 dates on the road was 12,968.

### Giants Pass One Million Figure in '65 Attendance

San Francisco, Calif.—The Giants passed the million paid mark in home attendance here, August 15, when 26,831 turned out for Murakami Day, bringing the total to 1,000,241.

With 24 games still to play the chances were good the club would top 1,500,000.

Attendance figured to take a jump of 160,000 during the four-game series with the Dodgers Aug. 19-22. And if the Giants can stay up in the race they figure to draw well in the closing series of the season, a four-gamer with the contending Reds.

## NO CONSTRUCTIVE PURPOSE

The wildest kind of charges have been made against the medical profession. This, in large part, resulted from the profession's general opposition to the medicare bill—an opposition based on the conviction that medicare will bring with it political meddling in medical practice, to the detriment of standards and may open the door to socialized or government-dominated medicine on a broad scale.

That, of course, is a matter of opinion, and both the proponents and opponents of medicare had a perfect right to seek support for their positions. But no one has a right to make charges which cannot be substantiated and which are without foundation in fact.

An editorial in a publication of the American Medical Association tells of what a speaker on a national TV program had to say about that organization. Among other things, it was accused of having opposed voluntary health insurance, the social security law, compulsory smallpox vaccination, school health services, Red Cross blood banks, and so on and so on. The publication points out that none of these allegations are true—and that they were refuted, with complete documentation, when first made some years ago.

As for the charge that the medical profession is indifferent to the problems of the aged, it is a matter of record that the AMA offered an alternative to medicare, called Eldercare, which would have provided a broader and better range of services, paid for with public funds, for those in financial need.

The AMA publication adds: "There is no constructive purpose to criticism which lacks discernment, objectivity and documentation." That covers the case perfectly.



### PUBLIC WORKS AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT ACT

Last week the House passed another Administration measure, S. 1648 — the Public Works and Economic Development Act. This legislation is basically a pump-priming measure, which means that it should be used when the status of our economy shows clear evidence that this kind of approach is necessary. It authorizes \$3.3 billion to be spent over the next 5 years in grants and loans for various public works projects and to aid establishment of industries in areas of substantial unemployment. The definition of eligible areas is vague, leaving much discretion to the Secretary of Commerce. S. 1648 is a combination of two previously authorized programs — the Area Redevelopment Act and the Public Works Acceleration Act.

The Administration repeatedly in the last few months, through statements and news releases, has called attention to the fact that it expects this year will set many new records from the standpoint of the height of our economy. In this case, should we be passing a \$3.3 billion pump priming bill at this time?

We have a deficit that we incurred in the fiscal year just completed, ending June 30, 1965, of approximately \$3.5 billion. The Treasury Department has estimated the deficit for the next fiscal year will be \$5.3 billion. Under such circumstances, it does not seem logical to saddle the taxpayers with this additional spending program.

The General Accounting Office has submitted 17 adverse reports on the Administration of the Area Redevelopment Act as it has existed to the present time. In each of these reports, the Comptroller General has stated he feels this program should be tightened up.

Yet the recommendations of the Administration as incorporated in S. 1648 loosens the program even further. In recent years we have had a whole series of programs brought to the floor of the House and in each case the argument has been made that if that particular program was passed, we would be able to solve the problems of unemployment. Among the programs passed in this Congress alone are: the \$1.9 billion "anti-poverty" bill, the \$1 billion Appalachian Development bill, and a \$7.5 billion housing

bill. Now we add a \$3.3 billion public works bill.

With our actual national debt over \$316 billion and the debt limit set at \$328 billion — with the President calling for ever-increasing expenditures on the Vietnam conflict, this did not seem the appropriate time to pass a \$3.3 billion loosely drawn, pump-priming measure. Therefore I voted against S. 1648.

### SOCIAL SECURITY CHANGES


Many people, both young and old, who expect to benefit from changes in Social Security will have to file applications and watch deadlines to qualify for health insurance or cash pensions for which they are now eligible. Those still working after age 65 who have never applied for Social Security pensions should apply now for basic hospital insurance which becomes effective July 1, 1966. Those over 65 who have never worked under Social Security should inquire at a Social Security office on how to apply. The coverage is automatic for all now getting Social Security or Railroad Retirement pensions.

All over 65 who want the voluntary supplemental insurance at \$3 a month, to cover doctor bills and certain other costs, must apply. Forms will be sent to those getting Social Security, Railroad Retirement and Federal Civil Service pensions. Others must apply between September 1 and March 31 to be eligible for the start of coverage July 1, 1966. People who reach 65 after January 1, 1966 should enroll during the period from three months before to three months after the month they reach 65. If they delay beyond that period, they have to wait for a new enrollment period, thus losing several months of protection.

Those who can now get cash benefits but only if they apply, include: widows aged 60 and 61 at reduced benefits in lieu of full benefits at 62. Students aged 18 to 22 whose benefits as children of deceased or disabled workers were stopped at age 18. Students nearing 18 should apply also. Persons 72 or over who didn't have enough Social Security coverage to get pensions under the old rules but who may qualify under the new rules.

Further details on all of these changes and help in filing applications may be obtained at all Social Security district offices.

1 teaspoon salt  
1 teaspoon pepper  
1 teaspoon oregano  
1 bay leaf Meat Balls  
8 hard rolls

Sauté onion in oil in skillet until golden. Remove from heat and add remaining ingredients. Heat until mixture boils, stirring often. Remove bay leaf. Add meat balls; cover and cook 15 minutes. Pour into quart "Thermos" wide mouth vacuum bottle that has been preheated with boiling water. Screw down stopper firmly. Put on cap. At serving time, split rolls and fill with meat balls, allowing 1 per serving.

**Meat Balls:** Combine 1 lb. ground chuck, 1 beaten egg, 1/2 cup packed bread crumbs, 2 tablespoons grated Parmesan cheese, 1/4 cup evaporated milk, dash garlic salt, and 1/2 teaspoon salt. 


