CURRENT THOUGHT

Baseball

Baseball, that great American sport, is bidding for prominence among the SSCU English-speaking units this year.

From Salida, Colorado, Mt. Shavano Lodge, No. 224, reports a team entered in the local league. Pathfinders, No. 222, of Gowanda, N. Y. have completed plans for a baseball nine. While in Ely, Minn. rumor has it that Arrowheads and perhaps one or two subordinate clubs of SSCU lodges may compete for supremacy. Cleveland is sure to produce one SSCU baseball unit this summer.

Young American Boosters, No. 216, of Walsenburg, Colo., are making plans to organize a baseball team.

Other localities in which branch lodges of our Union are situated will undoubtedly come to the front with an announcement about their lodge teams.

Perhaps some of the lodges are holding preliminary discussions as to the feasibility to sponsor a baseball team. Funds in the treasury may be at a low ebb, and in order to equip a team with the necessary uniforms, bats, balls and other paraphernalia, ready cash must be available.

The problem is: How to raise the necessary money? One of the most effective means is to secure backers for the lodge teams who are compensated by the advertising appearing on the players' uniforms. In some instances the lodge and the backer unite to sponsor a team, in which case the lodge name appears on one side of the jersey and the backer's name on the other side.

Mt. Shavano Lodge, of Salida, Col., appears to follow the practise mentioned in the preceding paragraph. George Washington Lodge, of Cleveland, has used such means in the past in order to enter baseball, basketball and bowling teams in the local Interlodge League.

Year 1934 appears to be an auspicious one for our lodges in the matter of athletics, and baseball in particular. Members are gradually reverting to the practise of supporting lodge baseball teams—a factor that has been conspicuous for the last two years by its absence.

During the seasons of 1930-31 thirteen lodges had baseball teams represent them in local competition.

In Pennsylvania, National Star, No. 213, of Conemaugh, Jefferson Collegians, No. 205, of Canonsburg, and Export Majestics, No. 218, of Export, were actively engaged in baseball. In Ohio three softball teams and one hardball team were sponsored by Betsy Ross, No. 186, Collinwood Boosters, No. 188, George Washington, No. 180, all of Cleveland; and St. Aloysius, No. 6, of Lorain respectively. Illinois had its representation in baseball in Illini Stars, No. 211, and Indians, No. 220, of Chicago; and Comrades, No. 193, of Waukegan. In Minnesota, Arrowheads, No. 184, and Rangers, subordinate club of Chisholm, Minn., were the leading factors of baseball among SSCU circles in the iron range district.

This season we may witness a return of the spirit so nobly started in 1930 to get behind the local SSCU branch and make a leading contender in the field of sports in the local communities.

When we speak or write of athletic activities among our SSCU lodges we consider them mostly in the light of male participation. An athletic SSCU lodge team composed of girls is a rare instance. The only lodges ever to attempt such a venture are No. 120, of Ely, Minn., through its subsidiary club, Basque, and G. Washington, No. 180, of Cleveland.

Unquestionably, many female members of our Organization are athletically inclined, and many would avail themselves of the opportunity to compete with other girl teams.

It is surprising to note how docile our girl members are in voicing stronger arguments at the lodge meeting for a plan to organize and enter a girls' team in local competition.

Must Have Sunshine to Live

Were the sun to go out the earth would be plunged into darkness relieved only by the feeble light of the stars for the moon of course shines only by reflected sunlight. Within a few days the temperature would be so low that all plant and animal life would be frozen to death. Curvature of the Earth

The curvature of the earth is about eight inches to the mile and varies as the square of the distance. For two miles the curvature is four times eight inches; for half a mile it is one-fourth of eight inches, and so on. The curvature of the earth, making allowances for refraction, is about 229.5 feet for 20 miles. A ship 200 feet high is completely out of sight at a distance of 20 miles, assuming the eye to be near the level of the sea.

Membership Drive is Gaining Momentum Each Day

National SSCU campaign for new members is coming along in grand style.

A total of 457 new members have been enrolled during the first four months of the year 1934. Of this number 191 were recruited in the adult department and 266 in the juvenile department.

The most encouraging sign in our drive is the increased interest shown by our members to go out and "produce the goods." During January and February, 1934, adult department showed an increase of 69 new members; while during March and April of this year, membership barometer pointed to 122 new enrollments in the adult division—an increase of almost double of that shown in the first two months of 1934.

New enrollments in the juvenile department continue to show gratifying results. During January and February, 1934, 130 new juvenile members were secured; while during March and April new enrollments in the junior division numbered 136. The following lodges have been the most active in the membership campaign during March and April:

Ely, Minn., home of our Union's headquarters, leads all other settlements with 80 new members enrolled during the first four months of 1934; Joliet, Ill. comes second with 38, and Gowanda, N. Y. third with 20.

In scrutinizing our lodges to find out which ones are really behind the membership campaign we find the startling fact that FOUR lodges are responsible for one-fourth of new members enrolled, and the remaining 181 lodges for the other three-fourths.

Why does the greater majority of our lodges display such a lagging interest in our membership campaign?

Moreover, why do the large cities containing SSCU branches prefer to remain in the background in the matter of securing new members?

If all the SSCU units showed as much propensity to increase in numbers as does Pathfinders Lodge, No. 222, of Gowanda, N. Y., we could report new enrollments totalling 3145.

"It is never too late to start" and the present time is a good time to start enrolling the new members.
