Jugoslavija zahteva od Avstrije Celover, Beljak in Velikovec

Delegat dr. Vilfan dolži Avstrijo kot predstražo Nemčije

London. — Jugoslovanski delegat dr. Jože Vilfan je predložil pred-deputiji ministrov Velike Četvorke zahteve Jugoslavije od Avstrije. "Jugoslovani so vedno smatrali, da je bila Avstrija predstraža Nemčije in nemškega imperializma," je izvajal dr. Vilfan. Rekel je tudi, da Jugoslavija zahteva te dele Koroške, ker so po zgodovinskem pravu slovenski in da se končno ustavi avstrijsko prizadevanje ponemčiti Slovane.

"Avstria," je rekel dr. Vilfan, "je odgovorna za škodo v slovenski štajerski in Koroški tekom vojne, zato naj zdaj plača odškodnino."

Kar Jugoslavija zahteva zdaj od Avstrije je kakih 1.000 štirjaških milij ozemlja na Koroškem in Štajerskem in sicer od reke Zilje z Beljakom do Velikovec in Dravogradra na vzhodu ter obsegata tudi Celovec.

Dr. Vilfan je tudi rekel, da bo Jugoslavija odprla tržaško vprašanje z Italijo takrat, ko bo gorovjeno o avstrijskih in nemških mirovnih pogojih.



Churchill Wins "Substantial" Libel Damages In Out-of-Court Settlement on Adamic Book

London.—An out-of-court settlement under which Winston Churchill is to receive "substantial" damages from Harper & Bros., publishers, for libelous statements in the book "Dinner at the White House," by Louis Adamic, was announced in a London court today.

The defendants, Harper's and Mr. Adamic, agreed that the imputation that the former Prime Minister had been influenced in his policy toward Greece by obligations to a British bank with interests in that country were "entirely without foundation."

Counsel for the defendants repeated in open court the full apology that counsel said had already been made to Mr. Churchill. The defendants also undertook to remove the offending passage from all copies of the book in the publisher's hands and to eliminate it from any future printings. The publisher also undertook to send a correction and apology to every person in England to whom a copy of the book had been sent.

The passage that gave rise to the suit appeared in a footnote and, as read in court, was as follows:

"As Drew Pearson revealed in one of his columns early in 1945, the motives for the British policy in Greece were at least partly linked to the fact that Hambros Bank of London, the chief British creditors of Greece (getting up to 17 per cent on their loans, which the Leftist or Eam Greeks wished to scale down to 5 per cent) had bailed Winston Churchill out of bankruptcy in 1912."

It was made clear in court that Mr. Churchill had never had any objection to the bank.

Counsel for Mr. Churchill said copies of the book had been sent to prominent persons in England, "including a large number of Members of Parliament." It was evident, counsel said, "that this free circulation was organized and paid for by someone or some agency, though by whom we are not in a position to say."

Counsel for Harper's said the offensive footnote had been added by the author, after the publisher had passed the proofs and was printed without the publisher's noticing it.

On according with British legal ethics, no indication of the amount

of damages was given by either party, except that it was "substantial." In addition to the damages, an indemnity against Mr. Churchill's costs in bringing the action is to be borne by defendants.

The estimate by one British newspaper of 5,000 pounds (\$20,000) as the amount of damages was said by Mr. Churchill's solicitors to be erroneous.

Frank S. MacGregor, president of Harper & Bros., declined to disclose the amount of money involved in the settlement of Mr. Churchill's libel suit, which was filed Oct. 24.

Mr. MacGregor said, however, that the terms of the settlement precluded the possibility of any further suits in this country or elsewhere. He added that neither he nor Mr. Adamic, whose home and office are in Milford, N. J., cared to comment further on what Mr. MacGregor described as a "destitute matter."

When one dear old lady came up and asked him to what he attributed his remarkable memory, he thought it was time to call it a day.


