## Združene države so popustile, Kanada ne

Civilni aero navtični odbor je sporočil ameriškima letalskima družbam TWA in AWA, naj se ne izpostavljata kaznim s kršenjem mednarodnih dogovorov.

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Na posredovanje državnega tajništva je Civilni aeronavtični odbor odstopil od svojega pravnega stališča in letalskima družbam American World Airways in Trans-World Airlines sporočil, naj se držita mednarodnega dogovora in predpisov v pogledu cen za polete preko Atlantika. Obe družbi sta nato objavili, da bosta vprašanje "proučili". Kanadska vlada L. Pearsona je med tem ostala pri svojem stališču in zahteva ohranitev starih cen za prekocatlanske polete.

Civilni aeronavtični odbor je pravtvo sporočil ameriškima letalskima družbam, da računa s tem, da bosta ostali pri starih cenah. Ko pa je Velika Britanija začela groziti, da bo letala obeh držav zasegla na angleških letališčih ali pa jih prepovedala pristanek, če se ne bodo držale dogovora o povrašanju cen, sklenjenega lani na konferenci Mednarodne zveze za letalski promet, je popustil, čeprav je odčitno, da velika večina letalskih družb pri poletih preko Atlantika zasluži že pri sedanjih cennih in da s tem dobički krije izgube na drugih progah.

V vladnih krogih trdijo, da nimajo po zakonu nobene možnosti, da bi zvišanje preprečili, da pa bo položaj drugačen, če Kongres sprejme zadevni zakonski predlog, ki ga je izdelala Bela hiša.

Vprašanje višjih cen na preko-oceanskih poletih je začela včeraj obravnavati Mednarodna zveza letalskih družb (IATA) na nujno sklicani konferenci na Bermudih.

## Krupp bo gradil v ZSSR

MOSKVA, ZSSR. — Veliko nemško industrijsko podjetje Krupp, ki je oborilo Nemčijo za obe svetovni vojni, je zgradilo v Sovjetski zvezi v zadnjih dveh letih več popolnih tovarn, med njimi tovarne za umetna vlakna. Te dni se mudi tu glavnemu upravniku podjetja Berthold Beitz. Imel je tudi daljši razgovor s samim Hruščevom.

Beitz si bo ogledal tovarne, ki jih je zgradila njegova družba, pa tudi druge industrijske naprave ne samo v evropskem delu Sovjetske zveze, ampak tudi v azijskem.

Beitzova pot v Sovjetijo in njegovi razgovori z vodniki Sovjetske zveze so zanimivi v toliko, ker Sovjetska zveza stalno napada Zah. Nemčijo zaradi njenega oboroževanja in Združene države, da jo v tem podpirajo. Krupp je simbol nemške oboroževalne industrije, vendar je Hruščevu in drugim vodniki Sovjetske zveze dobrodosel gost!

PRAGA, Češka. — Sicer je malo pozno, pa vendar ne prepozno, da so afriški študentje moralni spoznati, da je tudi med češkimi tovariši toliko "socijalistične zavesti" kot na primer v Sofiji in da znajo češki komunisti tudi kar sredi Prage preteplati svoje goste iz Afrike.

Čehi so namreč prisli do prepiranja, da Hruščev vse prveč podpira Afričane, toda ne na svoj, ampak na češki račun. Češka mora tako močno podpirati afriške narode, da pri tem tripi celo življenjski standard njenega prebivalstva.

## Beli bojkot nasledil črnega v Birminghamu

Vodniki belega poslovnega sveta med podpisniki dogovora o končanju segregacije niso preprečili belega bojkota.

BIRMINGHAM, Ala. — V mestu vlada od nedelje sem na splošno mir, toda vprašanje je še vedno odprt, ali bo pri tem tudi stalno. Črnci upajo, da bo dogovor med vodniki belega poslovnega sveta in med predstavniki črncev o desegregaciji mesta in o izboljšanju položaja črnih uslužencev izveden, del belega prebivalstva z guvernerjem države Alabama in načelnikom mestne policije pa je odločno proti temu. Guverner in politički načelik sta izjavila, da se niju dogovor prav nič ne tiče ter da sta prepričana, da ne bo izveden.

Belo prebivalstvo je začelo bojkotirati trgovine in ustanove v središču mesta, ki so pripravljene na desegregacijo. Črno prebivalstvo, ki je preje bojkotiralo večji del trgovin v mestnem središču, se sedaj trumomira vratila.

Obstaja še vedno upanje, da bodo nasprotniki integracije le popustili in izvedbe dogovora vsaj ne ovirali, če jo že ne maja podpirati. Med podpisniki dogovora o integraciji je prvi Milton Andrews, bankir, ki je tudi načelik državnega odbora za alkoholne pičaje. Na to mesto ga je imenoval guv. Wallace. Drugi podpisniki so A. Boudlin, predsednik Alabama Power Co., industrijalec D. Conner Jr., bivši državni guverner F. Dixon, bivši mestni župan W. Cooper Green, izdajatelj lista Birmingham News C. Hanson in drugi. Imena podpisnikov sporazuma s črnci so bila objavljena v sredo v upanju, da bo to ugodno vplivalo na sprejem samega dogovora, ko sta se o njem tako neugodno izrazila državni guverner Wallace in politički načelik Birminghama Connor.

**Potrebeni so novi predpisi za rabo kemikalij proti škodljivcem**

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Predsednikov posvetovalni odbor za znanost je predložil poročilo, v katerem poudarja potrebo po novi ureditvi prodaje in rabe raznih kemikalij sredstev proti škodljivcem v poljedelstvu. Pričnava njihovo koristnost, pa tudi organizacijo katoliških misijonov med Slovanji.

**Sv. oče slavi 1100-letnico sv. Cirila in Metoda**

RIM, It. — Sv. oče je naslovl na vse slovenske škofe posebno okrožnico, ki se v njem spominja življenja in dela slovenskih apostolov Cirila in Metoda. Okrožnica povdara posebno idejo o enotnosti katoliške cerkve, kar smatrajo v Vatikanu kot ponovno zagotovilo, da pri morebitnih pogajanjih med Vatikanom in Moskovsko dogme sv. katoliške cerkve ne bodo prav nič trpele.

Sv. oče je tudi nagovoril večjo skupino slovenskih romarjev, redovnikov, redovnice, duhovnikov in škofov in posebno podčrtal, da je Rim dovolil obema slovenskima misijonarjem uporabo staroslovenskega cerkvenega jezika v liturgiji kakor tudi organizacijo katoliških misijonov med Slovanji.

**Madžarska pustila pet škofov iz konfinacije**

BUDAPESTA, Madžar. — Madžarska hitti iz olajševami za katoliško cerkev. Sedaj je dovolila petim škofov, ki so bili v konfinaciji, svobodnejše gibanje, vendar pa se še ne smejo vrniti v svoje škofije.

Madžarska ima vsega skupaj 11 škofov. L. 1956 je bila večina škofov zaprta ali pa poslana v konfinacijo. Nekaj jih je režim med tem že osvobodil, zadnjih pet je še sedaj prišlo na vrsto.

**Občinske volitve v Vel. Britaniji napovedujejo zmago delavski stranki**

LONDON, Vel. Brit. — Občinske volitve pretekli teden so povečale izgleda delavske stranke pri bodočih parlamentarnih volitvah. Delavska stranka je morala biti silno natančno izvedeno, če naj poteče srečno.

Cooper je 22-krat obkrožil

Zemljo in se po 34 urah in 20 minutah srečno vrnil na njo, čeprav so odpovedale avtomatične naprave za povratek in je svoje vesoljsko vozilo moral upravljati mehanično z rokami.

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Sinoč ob 7.24 je astronaut Gordon Cooper srečno pristal štiri milje od letalonosilke Kearsarge pri otočju Midway sredeti Tihega oceana v svojem vesoljskem vozilu "Faith 7" potem, ko je v 34 urah 20 minutah in 31 sekundah 22-krat obkrožil Zemljo. Polet je potekal odlično, dokler niso med 19. obkroženjem lučke v vesoljskem vozilu pokazale astronomu, da so prekinjene zveze z napravami za avtomatično vrnitev na Zemljo. Treba se je bilo pripraviti na ročno upravljanje vozila, ki mora biti silno natančno izvedeno, če naj poteče srečno. Cooper je ob sodelovanju astronavta Johna Glenna, ki je bil na ladji nedaleč od Japonske z njim v radijski zvezi, opravil vse predpisane ukrepe in pristanek je potekal v krasnem redu. Ob 7.24 je Cooper pristal na morju, ob 8.11 pa je bil s svojim vozilom vred že na letalonosilki Kearsarge.

Mornarji na letalonosilki Kearsarge so astronauta G. Cooperja ob povratku iz vesolja sprejeli z vsemi častmi. Ko je bilo vesoljsko vozilo srečno na ladji, je Gordon Cooper pognal ven vratca. Zdravnik mu je zmeril krvni pritisk, še predno je zvezel iz njega, nato pa še enkrat. Dognal je, da je astronaut v odličnem stanju. Ta je sam in smejoče se šel preko krova. Godba mu je igrala, mornarji pa so zmagoslavno vzklikali. Potovanje v vesolje, ki se je začelo v sredo zjutraj ob 9.04 in je bilo dolgo preko 600,000 milj, je bilo srečno končano. G. Cooper je nevarnih trenutkih in preskušnjah na varnem.

Spoščno prevladuje v krogih političnih opozovalcev prepričanje, da bi delavska stranka zmaga, če bi bile parlamentarne volitve sedaj ali v nekaj tednih. Volitve morajo biti najkasneje do oktobra prihodnje leta, napovedujejo pa, da jih bo konservativna vlada razglasila še za letošnjo jesen.

Konservativci so od lanskega leta sem stalno izgubljali, to se je letos še poslabšalo, ko je De Gaulle zaločil Veliki Britaniji vrata v Skupni trg in je zaznalo izredno hude zbirke številnih brezposelnih močno nastalo. V zadnjih tednih se je začel govor o vrednosti načrta, ki je bil obnovljen v letu 1960 izgubila.

Med prvimi, ki so Cooperju čestitali, je bil predsednik Zarunih držav Kennedy. "To je bil velik polet", je dejal predsednik astronavtu. Nato je preko televizije spregovoril ameriški javnosti: "Mir ima prav tako svoje zmagne kot vojna. To danes je ena izmed največjih zmag človeškega duha." Predsednik je telefoniral tudi Cooperjevi ženi v Houstonu, Tex., in jo povabil na zavetje v skupni dom. Republikanci so skušali predlog spremeni, kar pa jim ni uspel. Sprejet je bil s 45:35.

## Michael A. Feighan

Od kar je bil 2. novembra 1942 Michael A. Feighan prvič izvoljen v Kongres, zastopa v njem nepreklenjeno 20. volivno okrožje države Ohio. V tem volivnem okrožju živi več tisoč volivcev slovenskega rodu, ki so ves čas vneti njegovih podpornikov.

Michael A. Feighan je bil rojen 1. 1905 v Lakewoodu, Ohio, obiskoval tamkajšnjo farno katoliško šolo, graduiral na St. Ignatius High, nato študiral na Princeton University in končal študije na Harvard Law School. Svoje politično javno delo je začel v državnih zakonodajah Ohio, kamor je bil izvoljen leta 1937. Dve leti kasneje je bil že vodja demokratske manjšine v poslanski zbornici. V Kongres je bil izvoljen prvič novembra 1942, nato pa redno vedno znova.

V Kongresu si je pridobil glas poštenega, vztrajnega in preudarnega zakonodajavca. Od leta 1943 je član pravosodnega odbora Predstavnika doma. Prav tako je član pododbora za imigracijo, skupnega odbora Doma in Senata za imigracijo ter posebnega odbora za preiskavanje komunistične napadalnosti.

Michael A. Feighan je ves čas vnet zagovornik pravice delavcev do organiziranja v unijah in kolektivnega pogajanja z delodajalcem. Zavzema se za javno gradnjo domov in stanovanj, ki naj pripomore vsaki družini v deželi do dostenjega doma. Podpira napore za delavske plače, ki naj omogočijo človeku primerno preživljvanje, pa mu dajo tudi možnost, da bo dal kaj na stran za "deževne" dni in stare. Vztrajno se bori za socialno zakonodajo in zagovarja razširitev in izpopolnitve, poudarja potrebo po pravični delitvi davčnih bremen. Skratka moremo reči o njem, da je pošten, preudaren in veden zastopnik koristi svojih volivcev v Kongresu, ki pa zna vedno stavit splošne narodne koristi nad koristi posameznih skupin ali predelov dežele.

To svojo lastnost je ponovno dokazal, zato je dobil tudi vrsto priznanj različnih ustanov in organizacij, prav posebno za svojo odločno borbo proti komunizmu in sovjetskemu imperializmu.

Slovenci imamo do kongresnika Michaela A. Feighana še poseben odnos. Ko je zavladal ob koncu druge svetovne vojne v Jugoslaviji komunizem in je neštetno slovenski ljudi zapustilo svoj dom, so čakali v begunske taboriščih, da se jim odpre vrata v svobodni svet, kjer bodo lahko začeli znova živeti človeka vredno življenje. Kongresnik Michael A. Feighan je podpiral v Kongresu zake, katerih sprejem je nato omogočil stotisočem beguncem vselitev v Združene države, med njimi tudi več tisoč Slovenskih ljudi.

Ko so bili zakoni že v veljavi, so prenekaterikrat nastale težave. Odhod slovenskih ljudi iz begunskega taborišča v Združene države se je zavlekel, dostikrat naravnost občičal. V takih slučajih smo se obračali na kongresnika M. A. Feighana in ga prosili za posredovanje. Vedno je rad pomagal. Na desetine naših ljudi je prišlo v Ameriko po njegovem posredovanju, prenekaterim je pospešil odhod, ko so čakali mesece in mesece brez uspeha na potrebne parje.

Pogomoma so se priseljenci uvajali v nove razmere in si uredili življenje, začeli so misliti na to, kako bi dobili za seboj v Ameriko žene in otroke, ki so jih ob odhodu pustili doma. Zopet se je pojavila vrsta težav in zaprek, zopet je bilo treba dobiti nekoga, ki je pozna razmere in vedel kje potkat. V največjih primerih je bil to kongresnik Michael A. Feighan. Celo vrsto pisem za posredovanje je dobral samo iz našega uredništva za nešteto naših ljudi, ki so obredili vse urade, pa skor izgubili upanje na uspeh. Naš kongresnik se je lotil še tako težavnega vprašanja in ga pomagal rešiti, če je bilo to v mejah zakona in predpisov le mogoče.

Kongresnik Michael A. Feighan je posvetil veliko časa proučevanju komunizma in njegove nevarnosti za svobodni svet. Proučeval je delovanje komunistov v naši lastni deželi, še več pozornosti pa je posvetil delovanju komunizma v mednarodni politiki. V kongresnih razpravah je vedno znova opozarjal na komunistični imperializem, ki je spravil pod svojo oblast ne samo vrsto narodov v Sovjetski zvezni, ampak tudi v vzhodni Evropi vse do črte Stettin-Trst.

Ko so se nekateri v naši deželi še vedno zavzemali za sodelovanje z "zavezniško" Sovjetsko zvezo, je kongresnik M. A. Feighan opozarjal na komunistično nevarnost. Kasneje je v Kongresu ponovno opozoril na številne narode, ki težko prenašajo oblast rdeče Moske in predlagal, naj naša dežela podpira njihove napore za narodno neodvisnost, za osvoboditev izpod sovjetsko-komunistične oblasti. Ni se bal zamere, nastopal je proti podpiranju komunističnih režimov v Jugoslaviji in na Poljskem, pa četudi bi mu to moglo pri delu njegovih volivcev škodovati. Po-

uderja načelno stališče, da brezpogojna pomoč komunističnim državam služi prvenstveno interesom komunističnih režimov in še v veliko manjši meri narodom samim.

Slovenski ljudje v Clevelandu, ki jim je kongresnik Michael A. Feighan na en ali drug način pomagal, so sprožili predlog, naj bi ga za njegovo pošteno delo, za njegovo dobro voljo in vedno pripravljenost pomagati, posebej počastili. Jutrišnja prireditev v Baragovem domu služi temu namenu!

Mets Lead in Gate Derby—Average 23,500 Per Date: The amazing Mets, by drawing a standing-room-only crowd of 53,880 for a May 5 Sunday double-header with the San Francisco Giants, showed a home attendance total of 235,004 for ten dates. That gave them an average of 23,500, highest in the major leagues at that stage of the season.

The Los Angeles Dodgers at the same time were next with an average some 250 cash customers less at Dodger Stadium.

The Mets had a tremendous weekend crowd-wise with the Giants. In the series opener, Willie Mays Night, the Polo Grounds jammed in 49,431. For a single game the next afternoon, there were 25,674. Then came the onrush on Sunday; making for 128,985 paid for the series.

The police reported that at least 5,000 fans were turned away Sunday for lack of room.

The 53,880 was the largest turnout of the season in both leagues.

Hurler Lifted, Never Faced Batter, But Protest Useless: Ever hear of a relief pitcher being legally replaced before he ever officially faced a batter?

Seattle did it in a game here, April 30, and while Manager Jack Tighe of Denver protested the move, it was obvious he didn't have a leg to stand on.

With two out in the last inning, George Spencer pulled a muscle in his shoulder. He left with a 3-and-2 count on Eddie Haas.

R. G. Smith replaced Spencer. His first pitch was ball four for Haas. Manager Mel Parnell then summoned Pete Smith, who wrapped up the 7-6 Seattle victory.

Tighe's protest of the lifting of R. G. Smith was based on the fact that he hadn't actually faced a batter (Scoring Rules). However, under section 3.05 (b) of the Playing Rules, the move was strictly legal.

Commissioner Ford Frick and National League President Warren Giles are also expected to be on hand.



**THE FEDERAL PAYROLL.** When Congress passed the Federal pay raise bill last year, it was with the understanding that the various Government agencies and Departments would absorb much of the increased costs by "attrition" and holding down on jobs. But what has actually happened since President Kennedy "ordered" the agencies to absorb the pay raise? Last year's Federal payroll was \$14 billion. This year it will be \$15 billion. Last June 30, there were 2,494,654 employees. There will be 2,534,041 this year, an increase of 49,387. Now the Administration is asking Congress for funds in the Budget to add another 36,492 employees.

Last year the Secretary of Commerce stated he could cut 10 percent off his payroll without damaging the efficiency of his Department. However, instead of a 10% reduction, the Commerce Department payroll is up 15.5 per cent. Other agencies show a similar increase. Although rural residents are down by a million, the Department of Agriculture employees are up by 10%; the Department of Health, Education and Welfare is up 15.5 per cent; NASA, the Space agency, has leaped up by 39.7 per cent; Department of Labor is up 21.9 per cent; Treasury up 14.2%; General Services up 12.2%; Housing and Home Finance up 11.6%; Interior up 10.6% and USIA up 12.5 per cent. The total net increase in Federal civilian employment since President Kennedy took office is 132,901.

These figures show significantly how our Federal government has expanded. With the highest budget in history and a predicted deficit of \$12 billion, is there any wonder that many of us are insisting that every effort be made to reduce spending wherever possible?

### CLEVELAND INTERNATIONAL PROGRAM

Once again the City of Cleveland will be host to a group of 89 foreign youth leaders and social workers under the auspices of the Cleveland International Program. Representing 40 countries in Europe, Africa, Asia, and South America, the visitors will spend the summer in this country on a work and study program. During their first six weeks they will be guests of families while attending classes at Western Reserve University, introducing them to American life. Then they will be assigned for ten weeks to work at various places such as the Juvenile

Court, YMCA, Society for Crippled Children and neighborhood centers. This marks the eighth consecutive year of the Cleveland International Program which was founded by Henry Ollendorff. It is an operation which has contributed greatly to the promotion of mutual understanding between the people of this country and those abroad. The citizens of Cleveland may be proud of their participation in this excellent program.

### GREAT LAKES SHIPBUILDING CONTRACT

With a bi-partisan group of House Members from the Great Lakes area, I attended a meeting at the Department of Commerce last week with Clarence D. Martin, Under Secretary for Transportation, Under officials of the Maritime Administration. Our purpose was to make a strong and unified appeal for action to rescue and maintain the shipbuilding industry on our Great Lakes. The Maritime Administration recently opened bids for the construction of three ocean-going vessels for Gulf and South American Steamship Company, Inc. The bid of American Shipbuilding Co., which has executive offices in Cleveland and yards in Lorain and Toledo, was just slightly higher than that of the Avondale Company of New Orleans. However, the Avondale Company already has more than \$120 million in government contracts whereas the shipyards of the Great Lakes region are threatened with extinction for lack of work. In the Merchant Marine Act the Congress made it clear that it is in the national interest to provide and maintain adequate mobilization nuclei of shipbuilding facilities and experienced manpower at strategic points in the country for national defense reasons. Furthermore, the Secretary of Commerce was granted authority for allocation of contracts (in cooperation with the Department of Defense) for ships built under the Merchant Marine Act as a direct means to maintain such facilities. Congressman Charles A. Mosher who represents the Lorain area and Thomas L. Ashley of Toledo, both of whom are Members of the Committee on Merchant Marine and Fisheries, spear-headed the meeting at the Commerce Department. We hope very much that action will be taken to award the contract to the Great Lakes Company as the work is vitally needed to maintain shipbuilding facilities in our area.

### Census to Collect Facts on "Second" Jobs of Employed Persons

Questions designed to provide information on the number of persons who have more than one job will be asked in the May Current Population Survey, it was announced today by Director Robert A. Yerkey of the U. S. Census Bureau's regional office at Detroit.

Information will be collected on the type of work done on a second job compared with the regular job, the number of hours worked at the second job, and whether the work was done at night or on weekends.

Previous surveys indicate that about three million workers hold down more than one job. This is about five percent of the total employed.

The questions on secondary jobs will be in addition to the regular inquiries on employment and unemployment asked each month in the Current Population Survey. All of this information is being collected by the Census Bureau for the Bureau of Labor Statistics, U. S. Department of Labor.

The Current Population Survey will be conducted here and in 356 other sample areas of the country during the week of May 20.
