General Franco se je
zmotil v svojih računih

TOPNIŠKI DVOBOJ PRI GANDESI

Madrid, Francija, 9. avg.—
Kljub pridobitvam, ki so jih iz-
vajali v zadnjih dneh
dolini ob reki Ebro, je mož-
nost, da bo general Franco iz-
vajal odločilno zmago pred za-
četkom tega leta, spaval pa po-
zaradi trdovratnega odpo-
rja lojalistov, ki so obdržali svo-
je položaje pri Gandesi. Španska
armada pravi, da se je fašistična
armada na tej fronti izjavila
čprav je bilo veliko število
lojalistov ubitih in ujetih. Vze-
lo bo več mesecev predno bodo
lojalisti spet strnili svoje sile in
se pripravili na novo ofenzivo.

Falisti so izčrpali svoje re-
serve v zadnji ofenzivi in gene-
ral Franco je moral opustiti na-
črt "zmagovitega prodiranja"
proti Valenci, pristaniškemu
mestu ob Sredozemskem morju,
ki je v rokah španske vlade. Ma-
terijal in vojake, katere je mo-
biliziral za prodiranje proti Va-
lenci, je moral poslati na fron-
to ob reki Ebro, ko so lojalisti
pričeli ofenzivo.

Lojalisti so uverjeni, da u-
pravni niso pripravljeni na no-
vo ofenzivo. V oktobru so de-
lovni nalivi v vzhodni Španiji in
na ovirali vojne operacije. V
blisknem času je bojevanje na
lojalisti podlagi nemogoče, pravi-
lojalisti, medtem pa bodo voj-
ni industrije v Kataloniji pove-
šale produkcijo in španske čete
bodo pripravljene na obrambo.

Falisti letalci še vedno
bombardirajo postojanke lojali-
stov ob reki Ebro. Vest se glasi,
da je ostalo več tisoč lojalistov na
nem bregu te reke, čeprav
lojalisti trdijo, da so počistili to
zemljo. Na fronti pri Gandesi
lojalisti dvojni nadaljuje ka-
r tudi lokalni napadi in proti-
napadi.

Zaragoza, Španija, 9. avg.—
Fališki obrambni minister je
dnešnji povelj vseh fantov v staro-
ni osemnajst let pod zastavo. On
bi imeli biti poklicani v arma-
do leta 1941. Vsi se mora-
javiti za vojaško vezbanje v
dneh od 20. do 30. avgusta.

Stavka avtnih de- lavcev v Detroitu

Protest proti premesti-
tvi tovarne

Detroit, Mich.—(FP)—Šest-
sto delavcev, članov avtne unije,
je zastavkalo v tovarnah Mc-
Cord Radiator Co. v Detroitu
in Wyandotti, da preprečijo pre-
mestitev obrata v London, O.
N. J. Moskun, predsednik u-
nije, je dejal, da so piketi usta-
vili transportacijo strojev.

"Pred nekaj meseci je kom-
panija ustanovila novo korp-
oracijo pod imenom Armstrong
Corp. v Londonu z namenom, da
premesti obrat v neuničeno me-
sto," je dejal Moskun. "Nekaj
strojev je že poslala v London,
kjer je dobila delavce, ki so pri-
pravljani delati za 20 centov na
uro. Mi smo se trudili, da do-
sežemo sporazum s pogajanj, a
nismo uspeli. Potem smo se od-
ločili za oklic stavke, ker ni bilo
drugega izhoda."

Unija je bila pripravljena
sprejeti petodstotno znižanje
mezd za dobo šestih mesecev
pod pogojem, da kompanija o-
perira svoje tovarne na podlagi
zaprte delavnice v Detroitu in
Wyandotti, kar pa je odklonila,
nakar je sledila stavka.

Delavska liga napadla gubernerja

Washington, D. C., 9. avg.—
Delavska neustrankarska liga je
ožigala Nelsona G. Kraschela,
gubernerja Iowe, ker je z oboro-
ženo silo izsilil poravnavo stavke
v tovarni Maytag Washing Ma-
chine Co. v Newtonu, Ia. Urad-
niki lige pravijo, da je gover-
ner izgubil podporo pri organizi-
ranemu delavstvu.

9. avg.—Ameriški poslanik
Claude G. Bowers je sinoči na-
znanil, da sta španska vlada in
fašistični režim generala Fran-
ca sprejela njegov načrt glede iz-
menjave 56 vojnih ujetnikov.
Med temi je štirinajst Američa-
nov.

Sudetski Nemec umorjen v gostilni

Berlinski tisk žigosa če-
ške avtoritete

Praga, 9. avg.—Uradno poro-
čilo o umoru sudetskega Nemca
vsebuje priporočilo glede oja-
čanja policijske sile v distriktih,
kjer dela manjšinski problem
največje preglavice oblastem.
Wenzel Baierle je bil zaboden
do smrti večeraj zjutraj v neki
gostilni v bližini Glasenwalda.
Uradna vest pravi, da se je za-
pletel v prepir z nemškimi soci-
alnimi demokrati, nasprotniki
Konrada Henleina, voditelja na-
cijske stranke. Avtoritete so
izjavile, da je Robert Hoiden
priznal, da je on umoril Baierle-
ja. Hoiden je živel 28 let na
Dunaju, toda iz mesta je po-
begnil v Češkoslovaško, ko je
Hitlerjeva armada okupirala
Avstrijo.

Berlin, 9. avg.—Umor sudet-
skega Nemca v češki gostilni je
razkažil nacijski tisk v Berlinu.
Listi so objavili vest z velikimi
naslovi na prvih straneh, ki so
kričali: "Nov češki teroristični
val" in "Nadaljnji češki umor."

List Boersen Zeitung je ko-
mentiral umor v svari, "da
nemško ljudstvo ne bo toleriralo
zatiranja svojih bratov v Češko-
slovaški in teroriziranja Nem-
cev po podivljani in nahujskani
drhali."

Gangeški napadi na unijske urade

Voditelji ADF se zve-
zali z delodajalci

New York, 9. avg.—The Pi-
lot, uradno glasilo Splošne mo-
rarske unije, je v uvodniku po-
zval člane, naj mobilizirajo vse
svoje sile, da rešijo organizaci-
jo pred gangeži. Frank Jones,
član distriktnega odbora unije,
pravi, da so se voditelji unij A-
meriške delavske federacije zve-
zali s parobrodniimi družbami z
namenom, da uničijo unijo.

Joseph Curran, predsednik
mornarske unije, je naslovil od-
prto pismo članstvu, v katerem
ga opozarja, naj ne nasedejo
propagandi kliki, ki hoče uniči-
ti učinkovitost organizacije.

"Članstvo", pravi Curran, mo-
ra podvesti korake proti onim, ki
so odgovorni za terorizem, ki o-
vira aktivnosti unije — boj pro-
ti federalni pomorski komisiji,
pogajanja z delodajalci in druge
unije aktivnosti. Uverjen sem,
da se v ozadju tega gibanja skriva-
jo vplivni voditelji Ameriške
delavske federacije."

Terorizem, ki ga Curran ome-
nja v svojem pismu, se očituje
v gangeških navalih na urade
mornarske unije. Teroristi udi-
rajo v urade in razbijajo pohi-
stvo pod pretrvezo, da se borijo
proti komunistom.

Tekstilna unija ohkicala sta v k o

Maysville, Ky., 9. avg.—M.
W. Morgan, predsednik krajev-
ne tekstilne unije (CIO), je na-
znanil oklice stavke v tovarni Ja-
nuary & Woods Cotton Co. v
znak protesta proti mezdni re-
dukaciji, ki jo je kompanija pre-
dagala v pogajanjih glede skle-
nitve nove pogodbe. Tovarna je
prvič v 104 letih, odkar obstoja,
zaprla vrata.

Konvencija zadružne lige bo v Kansas Cityju

Kansas City, Mo., 9. avg.—Dne 12.
oktobra se bo v mestnem avdi-
toriju pričela konvencija A-
meriške zadružne lige. Trajala bo
tri dni.

RUSKI LETALCI NAPADLI KO- REJSKO MESTO

Veliko število ubitih in
ranjenih v obmejnih
spopadih

JAPONSKI BANDITI POSVARJENI

Tokio, 9. avg.—Sovjetski letal-
ci so večeraj prekorčili mejo in
bombardirali mesto Keiko v Ko-
reji, ki leži v bližini strateški-
nega hriba pri Čangkufengu.
Koliko oseb je bilo ubitih in ra-
njenih v tem napadu, še ni znano.

Japonski vojni urad poroča,
da je bilo 1900 Rusov in Japon-
cev ubitih in ranjenih v obme-
jnih spopadih, ki so se pričeli 11.
julija. Ruske izgube so bile več-
je kakor japonske. Poročilo do-
stavlja, da so Japonci uničili o-
krog sto ruskih tankov in sestre-
lili šest bojnih letal. Vojni ur-
ad zanika vest, da so sovjetske
čete okupirale sporni hrib pri
Čangkufengu. Ta je še vedno v
japonskih rokah.

Zunanji urad je naznanil, da
je japonski poslanik Mamoru
Sigemitsu v Moskvi v razgovo-
ru z Litvinovom, sovjetskim tu-
nanjim komisarjem, ponovno
predlagal imenovanje komisije,
ki naj bi jo tvorili trije Rusi,
trije Japonci ter trije predstavi-
niki Mandžurije, vazalne japo-
nske države, ki naj bi določila me-
jo. Razgovori se bodo nadaljeva-
li v Moskvi v upanju, da bo dose-
žen sporazum glede končanja
konflikta.

Litvinov je informiral japo-
nskega poslanika, da ne more ob-
ljubiti, da bodo sovražnostni us-
tavljene, dokler bodo Japonci
vpadali v Sibirijo in provocirali
bitke s sovjetskimi obmejnimi
stražami.

Moskva, 9. avg.—Pravda, gla-
silo komunistične stranke, piše,
da je rdeča letalska sila priprav-
ljena na vse eventualnosti, tudi
na vojno, "v katero nas skuša-
jo potisniti fašistični banditi.
Naši letalci bodo demonstrirali
svojo izurjenost in bojno teh-
niko."

Letalska firma podvojila profite

New York, 9. avg.—Izvoz bojnih le-
tal in opreme je povečal profite
Curtiss-Wright Corp. in njenih
podružnic, ki so imele v prvi po-
lovič tega leta \$2,181,000 čiste-
ga dobička. V isti dobi preteklega
leta je dobiček znašal \$900,-
000. Poročilo federalnega trgo-
vinskega departamenta kaže, da
fašistične države, ki kupujejo
bojni material, niso potrošile to-
liko denarja v Ameriki letos kot
preteklo leto. Japonska je v ju-
niju kupila vojnega materiala v
vrednosti \$15,485,000, v juniju
preteklega leta pa v vrednosti
\$25,194,000. Japonska je omeji-
la uvoz blaga, ki ga ne rabi v
vojne namene. Izvoz ameriških
letalcev v Italijo in Nemčijo je
tudi padel v primeri z izvozom
v isti dobi zadnjega leta.

Nune odslovljene iz šol in bolnišnic

Dunaj, 9. avg.—Nacijske o-
blasti v Avstriji sistematično
odstavljajo katoliške nune, ki so
uposlene kot bolničarke v bolni-
nicah in učiteljice v šolah.

Vsi člani kubanske vlade resignirali

Havana, Kuba, 9. avg.—Ku-
banski predsednik Federico La-
redo Bru je sinoči naznanil, da
so vsi člani njegovega kabineta
resignirali z namenom, da omo-
gočijo reorganiziranje vlade. Ne-
kateri bodo morda stopili v nov
kabinet.

Governer Louisia- ne podprl stavkarje

Kuhinje za stavkar-
je ustanovljene

Hammond, La., 9. avg.—Kuh-
nje, katere je ustanovil gover-
ner Richard W. Leche za delav-
ce, ki so zastavkali v tovarnah
za zaboje v Hammond in Rose-
dal, obratujejo s polno paro,
odkar so se pogajanja glede po-
ravnave konflikta izjavila. Go-
verner je izjavil, da so stavkar-
ji upravičeni do podpore, ker
so šli v boj proti kompaniji, ki
je plačevala sramotno nizke
mezd. On je osebo prevzel
vodstvo kuhinj, v katerih stav-
karji dobivajo hrano.

Alex Wilson, predsednik kom-
panije, je informiral governer-
ja, da bodo tovarne zaprte, "do-
kler ne bo drhal, ki jih oblega,
razgnana."

C. P. Barker, odvetnik fede-
ralnega delavskega odbora, je
priznal, da so se pogajanja gle-
de poravnave konflikta izjavila
po konferenci z uradniki kom-
panije v Hammond.

Obravnava proti teroristom v Ky.

Vlada je bo skušala pre-
mestiti v večje
mesto

London, Ky.—(FP)—Vladni
odvetniki so naznanili, da bo-
do 17. septembra predlagali no-
vo obravnavo proti harlanakim
teroristom—premogovnim dru-
žbam, njih uradnikom in okraj-
ni policiji—ki so se oddahnil,
ker se porota po 11 tednih ob-
ravne ni mogla zediniti na
pravorek.

Kot poročajo, je med porotni-
ki nastala tipična kentukiška
vojna, ko je eden porotnikov iz-
javil, da bo prej strelnel predno
bo pristal, da bi bil kdo spoznan
za krivega valed boja proti ru-
darski uniji UMW. Drugo poro-
čilo je, da je bilo pet porotnikov
za pokrivilje vseh obtožencev
— 39 oseb in 16 premogovnih
družb — štirje so bili za pokrvi-
ljenje nekaterih, trije so pa celo
bili za oprostitev vseh. Govorijo
tudi, da so bili dva tedna pred
zaključkom obravnave vsi porot-
niki razen enega za pravorek
krivde. Eden porotnikov, John
Hibbard, je rekel, da so med se-
boj stalno govorili o procesu, če-
prav je bilo to proti navodilom
sodnika. On je tudi rekel, da so
"štirje porotniki nenadno spre-
menili svoje mnenje in bili za
oprostitev obtožencev."

Vladni odvetniki so bili po-
parjeni nad tem rezultatom, to-
da so rekli, da so takoj zopet
pripravljani pričeti z novim pro-
cesom. Mnenja so, ako bi se ob-
ravnavna vrnila v večjem mestu,
na primer v Covingtonu ali Lex-
ingtonu, da bi bili obtoženci spo-
znani za krive, ker ni toliko
predsedkov proti rudarski uniji
ko med "hrilbovi".

Amerika in Rusija obnovili trgovski pakt

Washington, D. C., 9. avg.—
Uradna vest se glasi, da sta vla-
di Združenih držav in Sovjetske
unije obnovili trgovinsko pogo-
do za eno leto. Amerika je dala
Rusiji v tej pogodbi prvovratne
koncesije in Rusija je obljubila,
da v prihodnjem letu naroči za
40 milijonov dolarjev ameriške-
ga blaga.

Manevri francoskih čet ob italijanski meji

Grenoble, Francija, 9. avg.—
Posebna grupa 600 vojakov je
splezala na vrh gore Blanc, ob
francosko-italijanski meji. V
vznožju te gore so v teku mane-
vri francoske armade.

JAPONCI OBNOVI- LI BOMBARDIRA- NJE KANTONA

Cez dvesto ubitih v dveh
letalskih napadih

TRI JAPONSKE LAD- JE POTOPLJENE

Kanton, Kitajska, 9. avg.—Ja-
ponska bojna letala so danes
spet napadla Kanton, glavno
mesto južne Kitajske, z bomba-
mi. Ta je bil že drugi napad,
ki so ga uprizorili Japonci v za-
dnjih dveh dneh. Letalci so pri-
čeli bombardirati mesto ob de-
vetih zjutraj, ko so bili reševalci
zaposleni s iskanjem žrtev pre-
jšnjega napada. Japonske bom-
be so v dveh napadih ubile čez
dvesto ljudi, med temi veliko
število žensk in otrok.

Največ žrtev so zahtevale tri
bombe, ki so treščile na tla v
bližini obrežja, okrog 300 me-
trov od Samena, mednarodne
naselbine v Kantonu. Bombe so
eksplozirale na prostoru, kjer
so v prejšnjih navalih lakali za-
vetja tisoč. Moški, ženske in
otroci, ki so se skrivali v bližini
katoliške katedrale, a katere je
viharala francoska zastava, so
bili raztrgani na kose. Bombe
so poškodovale tudi katedralo;
vse stranske kapele so uničene.

Japonski letalci so večeraj na-
padli tudi Nanchang, glavno me-
sto province Kiangsi v central-
ni Kitajski. Bombe so ubile 68
ljudi in ranile 83 ter porušile
več dvesto hiš.

Vest iz kitajskega vira se gla-
si, da so kitajske čete uprizori-
le več uspešnih protinaokov na
japonske pozicije na obeh
straneh reke Jangtse v bližini
Kiukianga. Bombe kitajskih le-
talcev so potopile tri japonske
bojne ladje na tej reki in po-
škodovale štiri druge. Vroče
bitke so v teku v gorovju med
mestoma Kuling in Šaohen in
ob progi Kiukiang-Nanchang žele-
znice.

Comments On This and That

OUR POLICY HAS BEEN CHARTED OUT BY THE CONVENTION

Bro. Louis Jartz, of Cleveland, and a few other members like him, are becoming impatient with the Prosveta editorial policy. They call our policy "consistently negative, abetting apathy on the important working-class political actions, and contrary to the working class interests."

The Jartzes are getting impatient because they were caught in the whirl of the Democratic Party squabbles—into which the "non-partisan" political game of the two labor union camps projected itself. This game, apparently, is called by the Jartzes the "important working-class political action."

We regret that we cannot see it that way. The political action involved has nothing to do with the American working class, as it was not sponsored by the workers themselves; it is an old political game of "rewarding friends and punishing enemies" and pursued for years by the American Federation of Labor. It is a pity that the CIO unions, considering that there are so many progressive elements in their ranks, should copy this same method. But the fact that they have copied it tends to prove that the CIO leadership is politically on the same level as the AFL leadership. No class-consciousness there!

The Prosveta has never stood for such nonsense, and it will not stand for it now. The Prosveta's policy is not negative! The last SNPJ convention clearly charted out this policy. We must support politically only working-class parties, independent labor parties, democratic in tactics and goal! Our duty is to support the CIO unions in the union field but not in the political field if the CIO waffles through the morass of the Democratic or Republican parties looking for its political "friends!"

This is the policy of Prosveta in a nutshell. The editor cannot change it—and it is not in our power to direct the mass of the American workers into independent politics for their own interests. If the majority of labor wants to follow what pleases their two union leaders, Lewis or Green, we simply can do nothing but wait and hope that some day, not so far away, the majority will wake up and form their own labor party regardless of the Lewises and Greens.

A word to all impatient Jartzes: You need not look to Prosveta to give you tips on "non-partisan" wisdom! Go to the "non-partisans!" Go with the new-dealers! Seek your own pie in the sky! According to the SNPJ constitution you are, outside of your lodge, perfectly free to go to church, Democratic Party, technocrats, American Legion, or to Russia . . .

But when you return minus shirt and bitterly disappointed and disgusted, you will have to go somewhere else to put your blame . . . The only thing on our part will be: "We told you so!"

JUVENILE CAMPAIGN

AMBRIDGE, PA.—Last week Secretary Michael Kumer began anew the E. S. Federation's drive to participate in the National Juvenile Campaign. Until the close of the drive more active attention will be centered in the campaign. In this latter half of the campaign the E. S. lodges are expected to make a better showing.

An interesting, yet alarming, report of the total juvenile membership of fraternal throughout the country was submitted by an actuary to last fall's session of the Penn Fraternal Congress. The report showed the great gap in total memberships between the adult and juvenile ranks in the fraternal world. There is an urgent need for fraternal to increase greatly their juvenile memberships to assure continued and future strength.

Our Society is fortunate in that our Supreme board officials recognize the need and value for a strong juvenile department. Further, we are fortunate that our officials have outlined a good program for the campaign. Likewise, this organization is fortunate in that it has many members, scattered throughout the country, who are giving active support to the campaign.

The organization's present drive is a fitting observance for celebrating the 25th anniversary of the founding of the juvenile department. The assurances of awards to all members participating and enrolling new juveniles add to the interest in the campaign. With the entire Society centering efforts in the work to make greater the SNPJ's juvenile department, more splendid results should be had before the end of the year.

In line with the Society's national campaign, the E. S. Federation of Western Penna. did more than endorse the current campaign. The Federation outlined further campaign activities and promised additional awards to its active lodges and members that participate. A sum of \$150.00 will be distributed as prizes to lodges and members for enrolling new juveniles.

The \$150 in cash will be distributed in the following manner: Cash prizes shall be given to the 3 lodges gaining the most juveniles. 1st—\$25, 2nd \$15, 3rd—\$10. Individual prizes shall go to the members enrolling the most new applicants; prizes are (1) \$20, (2) \$15, (3) \$12.50, (4) \$10, (5) \$7.50, and next seven prizes of \$5 each.

These prizes can be earned, plus additional awards promised by the SNPJ, by members actively enrolling new juveniles before Dec. 31, 1938. There is sufficient time for hustlers to go out and gain themselves these awards.

Last week's Prosveta contained the list of lodges that are supporting the national juvenile drive. In that list are only two lodges of our E. S. Federation. Sygan with 35 new juveniles, Universal with 15 are showing the result of their activity. Nowhere is there any evidence to show what the other 13 E. S. Federation lodges are doing. In that inactive list of 13 are included Strabane, Ambridge, Library, Moon Run, Meadowlands, Verona, Harnmarville,

West Aliquippa, Burgettstown, Coyle, Clairton, Imperial, and Pittsburgh. These 13 lodges have the opportunity to show their own action before the end of the campaign. START DOING IT! As a strong, alert adult membership assures the society of a strength today, so a growing juvenile membership assures the society a strength for tomorrow.

Finance Committee Proceedings

Meeting of June 18, 1938

Opening of the meeting at 9 a. m. by Brother M. Petrovich, Chairman. Present are: Petrovich, Vider, Calkar, Vogrich and Olip. Absent, Bros. Lotrich who is ill, and Bro. Zupan who departed for a short visit to Jugoslavia.

Since the regular record-keeper, Bro. Lotrich, is not present, it is recommended and unanimously approved that Bro. Calkar keep the minutes of this meeting.

Bro. Chairman reported that he was advised by the St. Clair Building and Savings Association, the authorized agent, to procure insured Federal Housing Administration Mortgages and to service them for the Society of new requirements by the State, and that on account of that, some changes of former agreement in that connection between these two concerns will have to be made. He introduced a representative of the St. Clair Building and Savings Ass'n who explains the situation more extensively and why certain changes became necessary. Mr. Schneller suggests that we change our former agreement to the effect that in the future he will act for us as broker in pursuance of government insured mortgages, and explains all the feasibility in detail.

Mr. Schneller was excused, and a lengthy discussion of the situation took place, whereupon a resolution providing for changes to comply with new requirements was unanimously adopted.

It was also decided that Mr. Schneller be required to furnish bonds in the amount of \$10,000 as guarantee for faithful performance of such service.

The following communication was read by Bro. Secretary:

A letter by Bro. Lotrich, advising the committee of his illness and asking to be excused from this meeting. Letter accepted and placed on file.

A letter from Bro. Zupan, advising of his departure for a short visit to the old country, and giving some suggestions regarding the Society's investments and other duties of the Finance Committee.—Motion, providing that suggestion be given consideration as much as possible, and the letter, placed on file, was accepted.

A letter from Secretary of the Six Point Realty Company answering our communications of May 3rd and 20th, and stating the reasons why they could not comply with some of our requirements.—A motion providing that we agree to refinancing on a 20 year amortization plan at 4 1/2% interest, if they reduce the principle down to \$100,000, and that the interest rate be 5% per annum if the principle amount is not reduced, is carried unanimously.

A letter from Bondholders Committee of Friskhorn Building Bonds, advising that we may withdraw our bonds.—Letter accepted and placed on file.

A letter from Mr. Philip Heller, reporting that the McKinley Land and Lumber Company, whose financial conditions he was investigating for us and its potentiality to pay the obligations on the bonds we hold, requests another extension, and recommending that the extension be granted.—Recommendation approved.

A letter from Moody's Service, giving recommendations regarding future investments of the Society's funds.—Accepted and placed on file.

Treasurer's Report:
Bro. Treasurer reported on government insured mortgages that were procured since last meeting through St. Clair Building and Savings Association of Cleveland, and Yugoslav Building and Loan Association of Chicago, for an aggregate amount of \$37,322.00.

\$10,000 of Aurora, Illinois, Sanitary District Bonds, and \$10,000 Devil's Lake, N. Dakota School Bonds matured last month, and \$25,000 South Dakota Real Estate Bonds were called in.

Transylvania County Bonds, N. C., amounting to \$39,000, were refunded on the basis of smaller interest rate and longer maturity.

He also read a letter from Moody's Service regarding Putnam County refunding bonds who recommended sale of the same.—It was decided, as once before, that we list them for sale.

A letter from Spear and Co., replying to our inquiry regarding Teesville Bonds, and asking for an option on the same was read.—The letter is placed on file. No further action taken.

Also a letter from M. J. Merika, of Cleveland, advising of their price for Glades County Bonds. Bro. Treasurer advised of previous negotiations with Mr. Vick in that connection who hopes to get an acceptable bid for them. Decided that Mr. Vick shall continue trying to get a better price for the bonds.

A communication from Moody's Service advising of the situation regarding Cleveland Terminal Tower Bonds was also read.—It was decided that Moody's report be forwarded to Mr. Heller, who is in charge of our interest in the refinancing procedure, for study and guidance in further actions in that connection.

Bro. Vogrich reports on mortgage No. 17. The property owner came to see him in regard to payments on his loan. He has been out of work for some time, and asks that we wait for another two or three months, thus giving him more chance. He intends to remodel the house, building a small partition for his family and rent out

the rest expecting thereby about \$40.00 per month income. Motion providing that he be requested to assign the income on rent to the Society, was carried.

Bro. Petrovich reports situation of property in Cleveland acquired for mortgage No. 23. The occupant is behind with rent, claiming it is too high and making all kinds of excuses. Decided that it be again left to Bro. Petrovich to act in the matter at his discretion.

In this connection Br. Petrovich recommended that the sale price for this property be reduced as an inducement for quicker sale, stating also, that the adjoining properties in that neighborhood are selling very low. He wants a free hand to act on that also. Motion to that effect was carried. He also reports on former Vessel's property, recommending sale for less than we have been asking. It is a two family frame house, much in need of repairing. We have been collecting rent right along, therefore the loss will not be so heavy if we come down on sale price.—Approved.

Bro. Calkar reports on what steps have been taken to protect our interest in Verbancic' property at Indiana Harbor, Indiana, and Vuksinic' at Gary, Indiana, since last meeting of the Finance Committee.—A motion approving all his actions in that connection is passed.

New Investments:
A motion that \$5,000 of the Juvenile fund be invested in U. S. Savings (Baby) Bonds was carried unanimously.

Recommendation by Bro. Vogrich that we re-invest the \$25,000 received for the called-in South Dakota Real Estate Bonds in new South Dakota Bonds at a lower interest rate was approved by a motion to that effect, adopted by a unanimous vote.

It was also approved that the Treasurer be authorized to order \$25,000 worth of bonds of Metropolitan Water District of Southern California as soon as they are ready for distribution, if they are found to be a legal investment for us, and available at a suitable price.

Motion was made and carried that \$25,000 of the reserve money be invested in further buying of F.H.A. mortgages during the time between this and next Finance Committee meeting.

Bro. Treasurer reported on the prospect of refinancing the Winnett, Montana Bonds. There were several attempts made and finally a suitable plan approved last fall by us and the Western Bohemian Fraternal Association, who are the two largest holders of these bonds. Since then, nothing has been heard of that although we have made several inquiries. They are very reluctant in giving us any kind of information. He suggests that we hire Mr. Heller to investigate. Decided that no immediate action be taken.

The meeting was adjourned at 4:30 P. M.

Your Health

TEETHING

The mouth is an excellent incubator for germs, as it affords darkness, moisture, heat and food. Many varieties of germs are found which cause various tooth abscesses and chronic illnesses, such as rheumatism, neuritis, blood poisonings, etc. The germs do not affect the teeth directly, but by decomposing saliva and all sweets they are able to overcome the resistance of enamel and dentine of the teeth. The softness of the teeth is due to increased acid of the blood.

As we all know, teething occurs twice in each individual's life. The primary dentition is the cutting of twenty temporary baby teeth. The secondary dentition is the cutting of the thirty-two permanent teeth.

The cutting of twenty temporary baby teeth or milk teeth occurs in the first 2 1/2 years of life. The two lower central incisors appear within 6 to 9 months, the 4 upper incisors appear 8 to 12 months. The two lower lateral incisors and four anterior molars appear 12 to 15 months. The four canines appear 18 to 24 months. Four post-terior molars appear 24 to 30 months.

The permanent teeth, totaling thirty-two, start to come in at the ages of 5 to 6 years. The four first molars appear at the age of about 6 years; eight incisors appear 7 to 8 years; eight bicuspids appear 9 to 10 years; four canines, 12 to 14 years; four second molars appear between the ages of 12 to 16 years, four third molars or wisdom teeth, between the ages of 17 to 25 years.

During teething some babies will not finish the bottle, probably leaving about 2 ounces of milk mixture. This may cause a stationary weight for a short time or a slight loss. Loss in weight is a common and harmless result of teething. When an infant begins to leave some of its food, it should not be forced. During hot weather it may be advisable to dilute the formula of milk mixture a little. If the baby is slightly nervous and restless, it should be sponged with lukewarm water, particularly during the hot weather.

When a baby is teething the mucous membrane of the mouth is red, hot and swollen. The tongue may be coated, gums are red and painful. There is excessive secretion of saliva from the mouth. The baby

may have a moderate fever, may be restless and the sleep may be disturbed at night. It may be fretful in the daytime. It may have diarrhea and vomiting, especially when overfed. The child has a tendency to put its fingers into the mouth. Convulsions are rare from teething alone. They occur usually with nervous disorders, aggravated by teething.

Some causes for delayed teething are rickets, due to lack of vitamins A and D which are found in cod-liver oil mixtures; scurvy, due to lack of vitamin C which is found in fruit juices, especially orange juice; lack of calcium which is found in milk; malnutrition; and lack of development of the thyroid gland and mental conditions.

A child should be taken to a dentist twice a year for inspection and treatment of the teeth. Any filling that falls out should be replaced immediately and all unresorbable and diseased teeth removed.

Prevention of tooth decay consists in the daily use of the toothbrush and in taking a diet containing plenty of leafy vegetables and dairy products.

Up to the second year of age, the teeth may be cleansed with a boric acid solution or boracic acid powder. Cotton is wrapped around the finger, dipped into the solution and gently applied to the teeth and gums. After two years of age, a soft toothbrush and some simple tooth powder may be used.

In cases where there is difficulty in teething, rub the gums with the finger covered with sterile gauze, or use a sterilized thin film fitted snugly on your finger and press this on the gums for a few minutes at a time. This treatment is better than lancing the gums, or using teething rings which may be unsanitary at times. Clean the mouth with a mild boric acid solution before and after feeding. Feeding bottles and nipples should always be kept clean and sterile. In severe cases small doses of bromides are given to reduce the pain in teething. If the baby has rickets, improve the diet and give plenty of super D cod-liver oil which is rich in vitamins A and D.

MY VISTAS

When Sinclair Lewis received the Nobel Reward for his "Main Street" some years ago, he sarcastically remarked to the Nobel Reward Committee that in the United States we have many rich people who have hundreds and hundreds of volumes of beautifully-bound books, but, in the majority of cases, they rarely read them, because they are too busy making money. The books are merely exhibit ornaments of their household furnishings.

I thought of this criticism the other day while reading about brothers Van Sweringens, Cleveland railroad magnates, now dead. They owned a home near Cleveland, which is like a miniature kingdom. In this home, among many beautiful rooms, is also Dickens room. Everything in it is concerned with Charles Dickens. There are valuable first editions, the chair the author used as a London editor, framed letters written in Dickens's hand, Dickens's own favorite portrait, and many other things. Any student of literature would immensely appreciate this valuable classic collection and make use of it; however, brothers Van Sweringens were too busy making money to ever read Dickens or personally care much for their Dickens room. To them it was only a part of their household furnishings.

People suffer from all kinds of ailments. Among them we can also class insomnia or sleeplessness. Many books have been written how to overcome insomnia. Lately, Dr. Edmund Jacobson, who had been seeking a cure for insomnia for the last 30 years, announced his "simple" method for curing insomniacs. In his book he writes: "Lie down on your back. Do your best to relax. Raise your right hand and clench your fist. Uncurl your fingers and let your arm drop—limp, like a rag doll. Stretch your legs, bend down feet and toes. . . . Etc., etc., etc."

Yes, Dr. Jacobson wrote a big book with a hundred and one instructions how to fall asleep. Whether his meth-

od works or not, I do not know, but I know of another method (and I am sure you know it, too) which is very simple, and which gives positive results. If you are an insomniac, go to any kind of factory, providing you can get a job, and work in the piece work line. After eight hours of hard slaving, you go home, wash the grease off, change your clothes, then go to bed. Just lie down. You do not need to stretch your legs; nor bend your toes, nor count to 10—just lie down. That is all—you are already sleeping.

Many people have sold their principles for a piece of bread. Sometimes it is hard to blame them. When father sees his children starving, he will do anything in his power to provide bread for them. But there is no excuse for any worker boosting the reelection of such a governor as Governor Davey of Ohio. Davey gave organized labor a terrific licking in this state, and, consequently, in other states of the country. This man should be dethroned at any price.

The saddest part is that some of our members, who were always yelling about their progressive principles, work with all their energy for reelection of this labor-enemy No. 1. Such bread-hunters should be kicked out of our public life!

Interest in the SNPJ Juvenile Circles is increasing. Two weeks ago John Alich wrote an interesting article about the significance of Juvenile Circles. Yes, our organization must strive to bring up capable young members, so when they take the organization in their hands, they will be fit and prepared to lead it.
