V Pittsburghu so se začela med unijo jeklarjev in podjetji pogajanja za nove mezde. Nova pogodba, ki se traja do leta 1954, predvideva možnost novih določb glede mezd kot take. Jeklarji zahtevajo povišanje mezd od 18 do 25 centov na uro. Do 1. julija mora biti dosežen sporazum ali pa pride do stavke.

V Bonnu v Zapadni Nemčiji je nemški parlament odobril pogodbo, s katero Zapadna Nemčija sodeluje pri skupni zapadni evropski obrambi. To je prva država, ki je to pogodbo odobrila. Koncetar Adenauer se nahaja v Londonu radi razgovorov o angleško-nemških odnosih.

John Foster Dulles je v spremstvu Stassena prispel v državico Jordan. Arabci so mu povedali, da so tradicionalno prijatelji Zedinjenih držav, da pa se je to prijateljstvo v zadnjem času ohladilo, ker so Zedinjene države preveč podpirale Jude v Izraelu v Palestini.

DULLES V EGIPTU--BREZ USPEHA; NAPETOST SE JE ŠE POVEČALA

CAIRO, Egipt, 14. maja—Egiptska vlada je ponovila svojo zahtevo, da se morajo angleške čete umakniti od Sueškega kanala in da postane ozemlje ob kanalu suvereno egiptsko. Če naj se ta sklep izsili z vojno, pa naj se! Angleške obdolžitve, da so Egipčani povzročili nove provokacije, s tem pa tudi nove mrtve in ranjene, so izmišljotina. Prišlo je danes do streljanja, vendar po angleški krivdi. To je stališče egiptске vlade.

V britanskem parlamentu so padale obdolžitve na račun egiptске vlade, da se je počenši s 1. aprilom začelo z napadi na Britance, ki so v kateremkoli položaju nastanjeni vzdolž Sueškega kanala. Angleži trdijo, da so načrte zasnovali v egiptskem vojaškem poveljstvu.

Egipčani odgovarjajo, da Angležem gre za propagando, Angleži pa na licu mesta sami provocirajo.

(Zakaj gre? Leta 1936 se je sklenila angleško-egiptska pogodba, po kateri naj čuvarja varnost plovbe po kanalu Suez britanske čete. Britanske čete so bile tudi lahko nastanjene v govtovih krajih Egipta, kjer so imele vse pravice britanskih državljanov in so bile izvzete od egiptskega sodstva in uprave. Teh čet je 80.000. Meseca oktobra 1951 je egiptska vlada to pogodbo odpovedala, nakar so se začele sovražnosti na eni in drugi strani. V zadnjem času je bilo ozračje razmeroma mirno. Egiptska in londonska vlada sta sklenili začasen sporazum glede pokrajine Sudan, ki leži južno od Egipta in katerega skupno upravljata. Pričakovalo se je, da bo prišlo do sporazuma tudi glede druge sporne točke med Egiptom in Londonom—glede britanskih čet ob Sueškem kanalu. Pogajanja so se začela, toda prekinila. Egiptska vlada vztraja kratkoročno na tem, da naj te čete zapustijo egiptsko ozemlje, varstvo plovbe po Sueškem kanalu pa bodo Egipčani prevzeli sami v svoje roke. Ta pogajanja so se prekinila, če ne morda razbila.)

Britanci trdijo: Brez sporazuma in če bodo britanski državljani na kateremkoli položaju že napadeni po Egipčanih, se bo uporabilo od britanske strani orožje. Britanci so pojačili svojo mornarico v Port Saidu, da zaščitijo Britance ob kanalu. Bojno britansko ladjevje je odplulo iz pomorske sredozemske trdnjave Malte. Egipčani trdijo: Na egiptskem ozemlju, ki je suvereno, sme biti samo egiptski vojak. Sueški kanal pripada Egiptu. Za varnost plovbe bodo skrbeli

NI NEVARNOSTI ZA PREMOG

V Clevelandu je razstavljen vse, kar more s tehnične strani pokazati ameriška industrija premoga. Razstave so se udeležile tudi druge države. Med delegati je britanski inženir Humphrey Browne, ki je obenem direktor državnega odbora, ki vodi britansko produkcijo premoga, ki je še vedno nacionalizirana.

Browne je primerjal britansko industrijo premoga z ameriško. Angleška industrija premoga z letno produkcijo 200 milijonov ton se mora dvigniti vsaj na 240 milijonov ton. Za tak dvig produkcije bo morala Velika Britanija potrošiti \$1,750,000,000, a tudi potem bo Velika Britanija proizvedla le polovico tega, kolikor znaša ameriška produkcija premoga.

Splošni pogoji v ameriški produkciji premoga so dobri. Ogromne rezerve dajejo industriji premoga tudi zaslombo v njeni tekmi s produkcijo petroleja in plina.

Ležišča premoga v Ameriki so neizčrpna. V Angliji v nekaterih premogokopih iščejo premog v velikih globinah, tudi do 4.000 čevljev globoko, česar Ameriki ni treba. Browne tudi ne predvideva, da bi bila ameriška industrija premoga kdajkoli nacionalizirana.

Glede ameriške tehnike se je Browne nadvse pohvalno izrazil in naglasil potrebo, da pridejo tuji narodi, tudi Angleži v Ameriko, da se tu naučijo novih tehničnih sredstev, opreme in uporabe teh sredstev v industriji.

Peron zapira

BUENOS AIRES, Argentina, 14. maja—Ko je zajela Argentino velika inflacija, je diktator Peron uvedel dne 1. aprila 1953 kontrolo nad cenami živil. Trgovci v prestolici se Peronu ne pokoravajo, bodisi iz političnih, bodisi iz gospodarskih razlogov. Argentinska prestolica namreč Perona ne mara; tudi njegova žena pokojna Eva je bila izločena iz meščanske visoke španske družbe v prestolici. Očitno so ji, da se je priklopala do oblasti in do državnega položaja iz mesta bivše telefonistke.

Peron se je zatekel h kaznovanju. Zapira ljudi in zapira trgovine. Do sedaj je v zaporih nad 1.300 takih aretirancev, na desetine trgovin pa se dnevno zapira.

Stevenson obišče Beograd

CHICAGO, 14. maja—Iz pisarne Adlaia Stevensona je bilo danes javljeno, da demokratski voditelj, ki je na potovanju okrog sveta, ne bo obiskal Irana, kakor je bilo prvotno določeno, ker tam obstoji neprijateljsko razpoloženje od Amerikancev. Namesto v Iranu se bo Stevenson na svoji poti ustavil v Beogradu, ki prej ni bil v njegovem potnem načrtu.

Ko je žena št. 2 odpotovala v Pittsburgh, je podjetni Daniel odpotoval v državo Iowa, in tam poročil ženo št. 3, katero je spoznal v Clevelandu. Prelom med Ameriko in Anglijo? Francija za konferenco štirih velesil

NADALJNE DEBATE IN OČITKI KONGRESA; IN STEVENSON?

WASHINGTON, 14. maja—Britanski politični voditelji so zagovarjali svojo politiko do komunistične Kitajske s tem, da če gredo na roke Kitajcem in imajo z njimi dobre zveze, jih bodo odcepili od Moskve. Če pa bo imel britanski parlament po svojih voditeljih še več takih govorov, kakor sta bila govora Winstona Churchilla in Clementa Attleea, potem je bolj verjetno, da pridemo do odcepitve Amerike od Velike Britanije, kakor pa odcepitve Kitajske od Moskve!—Tako bi na kratko označili v jedru precejšno napetost, ki trenutno vlada med Londonom in Washingtonom.

Za Londonom se je oglasila tudi Francija, ki enako zahteva konferenco predstavnikov glavnih velesil, s to razliko, da naj se ne sestanejo samo Eisenhower, Churchill in Malenkov, marveč tudi zastopnik Francije. To zahtevo je sprejel zunanje politični odbor francoskega parlamenta, ki je pozval parlament in vlado, da zastavita vse svoje sile, da do te konference tudi pride.

Amerika je nasprotna tako Londonu, kakor Parizu. Kaj pravi Moskva, se še ne ve. Iz moskovskega časopisa se da sklepati, da je tudi v Moskvi Churchillov govor naletel na neugoden odmev. Churchill zagovarja ponovno oborožitev Zapadne Nemčije in njeno soudeležbo pri skupni zapadni evropski obrambi. Sovjetska zveza pa jo zatrdil tega tiska želi združeno Nemčijo, toda nevtalizirano in neoboroženo. Kako premostiti to dvojno stališče? In kaj naj pozitivnega prinese sestanek treh ali štirih?

Uradno stališče Washingtona: Rusija mora priti na dan z dejanji, da bo pokazala, da ji je v resnici za mir. Pristane naj na mir na Koreji in na mirovno pogodbo z Avstrijo. Po teh dejanjih bo Amerika presojala Rusijo in bo imela dokaz, da Rusiji je resnično za mir in tudi za mirovno rešitev ostalih vseh vojn. Nastopi Attleea, ki Ameriki očita, da so v njej krogi, ki sploh ne marajo miru na Koreji, lahko vzbudi v kongresu razpoloženje, da se črta še to, kar bi bil sicer sedanjí kongres pripravljen dati tujni v obliki vojaške in finančne pomoči.

Posamezne izjave politikov

Amerika je dala bodisi pod firmo Marshalllovega plana, bodisi kot pomoč Amerike tujni do sedaj že \$40.000.000.000. Na dnevnem redu zasedanj kongresa je vprašanje, kakšna naj bo nadaljnja pomoč Amerike tujni. Nastopi Attleea, ki Ameriki očita, da so v njej krogi, ki sploh ne marajo miru na Koreji, lahko vzbudi v kongresu razpoloženje, da se črta še to, kar bi bil sicer sedanjí kongres pripravljen dati tujni v obliki vojaške in finančne pomoči.

Tragedija današnjih dni je ta, da anglosaksonski svet t.j. Velika Britanija s svojim imperijem in Amerika ne morejo imeti skupne politike do Azije! Nihče ne more očitati niti enemu Amerikancu, niti enemu zapadnemu zavezniku, da bi si ne želel miru na Koreji!

Neglede na to pa nekateri ameriški krogi trdijo, da Churchill hoče s svojim predlogom novi Monakovo, ko pravi, da ni bistvene razlike med komunističnim in zavezniškim stališčem na Koreji. Churchill da je za barantanje z mirom. Ameriki ne bo preostajalo drugega, če naj bi Churchillovo stališče obveljalo, kakor da ostane na Kongresu.

NOVE POLEMIKE IN IZJAVE

Predsednik Eisenhower je dejal, da ni na strani Rusije še nobenega dokaza o dobri volji. Radi tega odklanja sestanek trah velikih. Eisenhower je nadalje zatrdil, da bodo Zedinjene države proti temu, da bi bila Kitajska pripisana med Združene narode.

Senator McCarthy je silovito napadel Churchilla in Attleja, in celo dejal, naj kar gredo Angleži iz Koreje, Amerikanci pa bodo vodili vojno sami in potopili vsako britansko ladjo, ki trguje in vozi orožje komunistom. V Londonu je McCarthy odgovoril Attleju in dejal: "Britanski laboristi so pobijali komuniste, predno se je McCarthy sploh sanjalo o komunizmu."

Voditelj britanskih delavskih unij, ki štejejo osem milijonov članov, Tom O'Brien je kot član parlamenta dejal o McCarthyju: "McCarthy je za komuniste boljši propagator kot pa je bil Juda Iskarijot pismarjem in farizejem za časa Kristusa."

DULLES V IZRAELU

TEL AVIV, Izrael, 14. maja—John Foster Dulles in Harold Stassen sta se danes razgovarjala z judovsko vlado o teh vprašanjih: ameriška pomoč Izraelu; ameriška pomoč eni ali drugi posamezni arabski državi, ker ni računati, da bi bila uspešna pomoč kakšni skupini teh držav.

Zopet ženska

Ker so demokratje dali ta položaj ženski, so zgledu sledili zdaj republikanci. 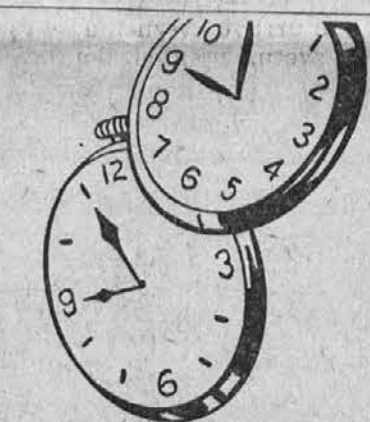

HEALTH NEWS

CHICKENPOX

In line with modern public health thought the Division of Health discontinued routine home nursing visits to reported cases of chickenpox as of December 17, 1952. Adult cases of the disease, however, are still investigated by a physician and later by the public health nurse. Although chickenpox is a highly communicable disease it is seldom serious and complications are rare. It is caused by a virus and occurs most frequently in the winter and spring, usually among children under 15 years of age.

Chickenpox begins about 12 to 21 days after exposure. The first symptoms are fever and loss of appetite. Within 24 hours the skin breaks out in small red spots which become small vesicles (blisters). These quickly become crusted with scabs which eventually fall off. Each crop completes its course from small red spots to crust in from two to four days. Usually they are more abundant on the scalp, the mucous membranes and the trunk of the body than on arms and legs. The child is not very ill and begins to feel better in one to three days.

Though it is mild it should be seen by the family physician at first sign of illness. In older children or adults who have not been recently revaccinated the possibility of smallpox must always be considered. It is for this reason that adult cases will be visited by physician and public health nurse.

Last year in Cleveland there were 2403 cases of chickenpox reported. The age of distribution for all cases ranged from 131 under one year of age to 2 in the over fifty group. The

majority of the cases, however, occurred in the age groups from three to nine. So far this year 301 cases have been reported, as of January 29, 1953.

Because of the new procedure of no home nursing visits by the Division of Health nurses, the schools are no longer notified reported cases of chickenpox and receive no "Release" slips. Therefore they have assumed the responsibility of determining the readiness of the child to return to school following a case of chickenpox. The child is accepted if he is found to be free of primary scabs.

COMMUNICABLE DISEASE

Morbidity reports for February show an increase in the infectious diseases of childhood and in influenza. Chickenpox led the field with 288 cases. Meningococcus meningitis, mumps, scarlet fever, whooping cough and German measles all exceeded their five year medians. 238 cases of influenza were reported for the month as compared with 14 cases for the same period in 1952. A sharp rise in cases, with a spotty distribution, became evident about the third week in January. By the third week in February, cases began to decline, although the distribution was more general. Dr. Harold J. Knapp, Commissioner of Health, states that reporting to date has been incomplete and that the majority of the cases were reported by the Division of Health district physicians who had been alerted to the disease.

In spite of the fact that most of the cases have been of a mild nature, Dr. Knapp warns that precautions should be taken to avoid the disease insofar as possible. Adequate diet, plenty of rest and sleep, clothing suitable to the weather, fresh air and exercise offer some protection. If you show any of the symptoms (headache, chills, fever, muscular pains, nasal symptoms and prostration) stay home and call a doctor promptly.

The total death from all causes for February was 970 as compared with 911 in February, 1952. Combined deaths from influenza and pneumonia were 60 as compared with 24 in the previous year. The majority of the deaths occurred in the older age groups. It should also be pointed out that in 1952 the peak of incidence for influenza occurred at the end of March whereas this year, from all indication, the peak has already been reached.

GOSPODARSKA KRIZA V TRSTU

Roka v Miljah je zašla v krizo, v tržaškem "Arzenalu" pa pošiljajo delavce predčasno na letni oddih zato, ker nimajo dovolj dela. Pri odpušcanju delavcev trdijo delodajalci, da je to posledica majhnih naročil, vendar pa nekateri gospodarstveniki sodijo, da je glavni razlog krize tržaške industrije v tem, ker obratuje z zastarelimi stroji in ker je prisiljena kupovati na italijanskem trgu surovine dražje kot pa na svetovnem trgu. Zato vidijo rešitev v kupovanju surovin v državah, ki so naravno zaledje Trsta, to pa ni mogoče zaradi nadzorstva, ki ga ima Italija nad anglo-ameriško cono Svobodnega tržaškega ozemlja na osnovi dvostranskega sporazuma med Rimom in zavezniško vojaško upravo.

Tržaški gospodarski krogi gledajo zaskrbljeno na sedanji položaj in pričakujejo, da se bo še poslabšal, če ne bodo odstranili činiteljev, ki so pripeljali do sedanje krize.

Pripravljajo se novi predpisi s področja gospodarstva

BEOGRAD, 20. aprila. — V državnem sekretariatu za zadeve narodnega gospodarstva pripravljajo več novih uredb in pravilnikov. Izdelali so načrte uredbe o gozdarstvu, uredbe o varstvu rastlin, uredbe o živinoreji, uredbe o zatiranju živalskih nalezljivih bolezni, o obvezni javni licitaciji za gradbena dela, o projektiranju cest in načrt uredbe o merah. Prav tako so izdelali tudi načrt pravilnika o nadzorstvu nad sredstvi za varstvo rastlin in načrt pravilnika o nadzorstvu nad prometom s sadnim materialom.

Te osnutke in načrte novih predpisov bodo izročili v razpravo podjetjem, fakultetam, inštitutom in različnim strokov-

nim organizacijam. Pričakujejo, da bodo nove predpise v kratkem izročili v razpravo zveznemu izvršnemu svetu Ljudske skupščine FLRJ.

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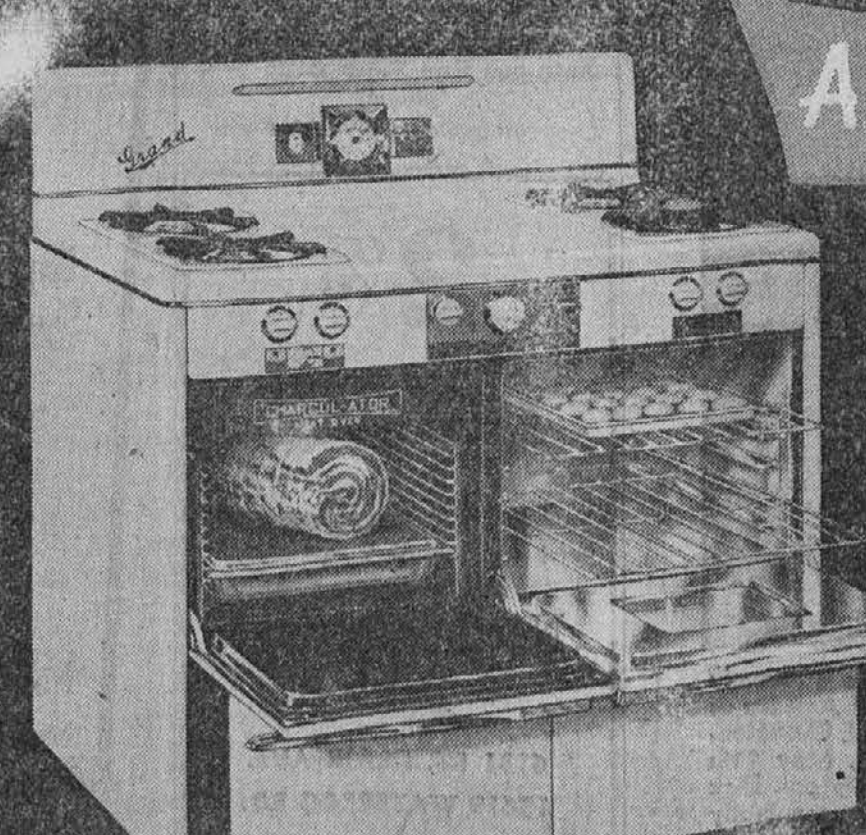
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"The Ohio Story"

Many inhabitants of Ohio, especially those who originally hailed from elsewhere, look upon Columbus as always having been the state capital—an erroneous belief, as Chillicothe was the first seat of our state government and for a brief period it was centered in Zanesville.

The tale of community rivalry and bickering for the honor of being the directing center of Ohio's destinies will be told at 8:30 p. m. Monday, May 18, on "The Ohio Story," the radio program transmitted several times a week over a state-wide network under sponsorship of The Ohio Bell Telephone Company.

Radio listeners in this area can get the program Monday evening by tuning in on Station WGAR, with a re-broadcast scheduled from WERE at 8:00 a. m. Tuesday.

Chillicothe was designated in 1800 by Congress as capital of the eastern part of the Northwest Territory. Inhabitants of the village of 40 log cabins built a two-story statehouse.

But in 1808 the people around Zanesville built a fancier statehouse and lured the legislature there. However, the capital was moved back to Chillicothe in 1812. Then other communities got into the act including Delaware.

Next the legislature passed a resolution to pick a capital site no more than 40 miles from the center of the state, thus disqualifying Chillicothe and Zanesville.

Finally, in 1812, a land firm in Franklin County, where Columbus hadn't yet been founded, offered to donate the site and even put up a capitol building, creating a town around it.

That offer was too good to pass up and so the city of Columbus was born as the capital of Ohio. But even that didn't end the fight by other communities to be selected as the capital and "The Ohio Story" will dramatize their vigorous, but unsuccessful, campaigns to get the seat of state government away from Columbus.

You've seen the headline many a time: "Hometown Girl Makes Good." This is the story of Norma Jones of Boonville, Indiana, who wanted to get out and see the world, and how she attained her goal.

Thomas Renner of Huntington, Long Island, New York, acting as guide, she visited the exhibits of Luxembourg, Holland, Germany, Spain, Italy, France, Ireland, and Austria. She figuratively toured all of Europe in one day.

As they moved from one booth to another, Norma became fascinated with the new and wonderful costumes, products, and perfumes—things she had never seen in Boonville. At her feet were the delicate glass and chinaware of Germany, the linens of Ireland, the fashions of Paris, the wines of Italy, and the cheese of Holland. Here was a cross section of the world's best.

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With a typical woman's approach, Norma examined each product carefully, mentally selecting what she would buy at a later date.

On they moved, through all the exhibits, finding at each something strange and exotic. Finally, when she'd tinkered with toys, sampled the perfumes, viewed the costumes and fashions, and tried to translate (not too successfully) what was told to her, the tour came to an end.

As she rested her tired feet at the Metropole Hotel where she was quartered, WAF Norma Jones said: "Europe is wonderful! I'm going to enjoy every minute of my stay here."
