Anglija namerava razdeliti Indijo. Tujezemsko bla- go Indijci zažigajo

London, 14. januarja. Tu se je pravi kar zaključila konferenca glede indijske province Burma. Priznati je govoril angleški ministriški predsednik MacDonald, ki je obljubil zastopnikom province Burma samovoljno pod gotovimi pogoji. Ako se provinca Burma odloči, da se odcepi od Indije, tedaj dobi samovoljno kot posamezna država. Država Burma bi dobila svoj parlament, načelnik vlade bi pa bil od krone imenovan governor, ki bi vodil samo zunanje zadeve, vojaštvo in finance. MacDonald je opominjal delegate, da Anglija se nikakor ne odpove svoji pravici do vlade v Angliji. Nekateri delegati so ploskali, dočim so drugi molčali. Medtem se pa poročila iz Bombaya, da hodijo indijski prostovoljci od hiše do hiše, nabirajo tujezemsko obleko in jo potem sežigajo na javnem trgu. Policija je napadla zbrane množice, in nad 40 oseb je bilo aretiranih. Neki 9 letni deček, ki je stal pred neko trgovino, ki je prodajala angleško blago, in ki je opominjal mimoidoče, naj kupijo le indijske izdelke, je bil obsojen za štiri leta v poboljševalnico. Anglijo skrbi korak indijskih zastopnikov borze, ki so naredili sledečo prisego: "Prisegam pred Bogom in pred ljudmi, da ne bom kupoval nobenega blaga, narejenega v Angliji ali pa da bi rabil tako blago." Medtem pa indijski voditelji pozivljejo svoje pristaše, da vzamejo svoje prihranke iz državnih bank in poštnih hranilnic in nameravajo upeljati celo privatno pošto, ko računala le pol toliko poštne, kot računa angleška. Anglija izgublja dnevno milijone radi punta v Indiji.

Devet milijonov dolarjev rabi Cleveland za svoje sirotne družine

Cleveland. — A. V. Cannon, načelnik vseh dobrotelnih družb v Clevelandu, se je izjavil, da bo Cleveland v letu 1932 potreboval najmanj \$9,000,000, da zadosti vsem zahtevam, ki se stavijo dobrotelnim družbam od strani sirotnih družin. Teh \$9,000,000 je treba spraviti skupaj poleg vsega drugega denarja, ki je že namenjen v enake svrhe. Raditega bodo dobrotelne družbe v Clevelandu dosledno zahtevale, da skliče governor White izvanredno zasedovanje državne postavodaje, ki naj stori temu primerne ukrepe. Deficit, ki ga bodo imele dobrotelne družbe v Clevelandu, se je izjavil A. V. Cannon, bo znašal najmanj \$9,000,000. Ako se skrajno ekonomično postopa, bo menda deficit samo \$7,500,000. Iz poročila dobrotelnih družb se povzema, da bodo rabile dobrotelne družbe v letu 1932 nekako \$18,306,242. Denarja na razpolago sedaj ali v prihodnjih mesecih bo \$8,876,000, vse drugo je primanjkljaj. Kje se bo dobil denar, je vprašanje.

Trideset milijonov

Washington, 14. januarja. — Tekom prvih devet mesecev lanskega leta so družine brezposelnih v Ameriki dobile podpore v svoti \$30,066,641, in to v 56 večjih ameriških mestih. Za 127 procentov je bila privatna podpora brezposelnim večja v letu 1931, kot pa v letu 1930, in za 383 procentov višja kot v letu 1929. Leta 1929 so privatne dobrotelne družbe v 56 mestih porabile skoro \$7,000,000 za podporo, letu 1930 je ta vsota poskočila na \$13,200,000, in v prvih devetih mesecih 1931 pa že na \$30,000,000. To so izključno podpore, ki jih dajejo dobrotelne družbe brezposelnim družinam, in tu niso vštete podpore, ki so jih prispevala posamezna mesta iz javne blagajne. Nad 8,000,000 brezplačnih kosil se je porabilo v letu 1931, in 2,700,000 ljudem se je dalo prenočišče na javne stroške.

Babe Ruth

Najboljši baseball igralec v Ameriki, Babe Ruth, je vrnil pogodbo za leto 1932, v kateri bi se zavezal, da znaša njegova plača za 1932 igralno sezono \$70,000. Ruth zahteva \$80,000. Izjavil se je, da bi vzel \$70,000, ako podpisše pogodbo za dve leti, toda če je pogodba samo za eno leto, zahteva \$80,000.

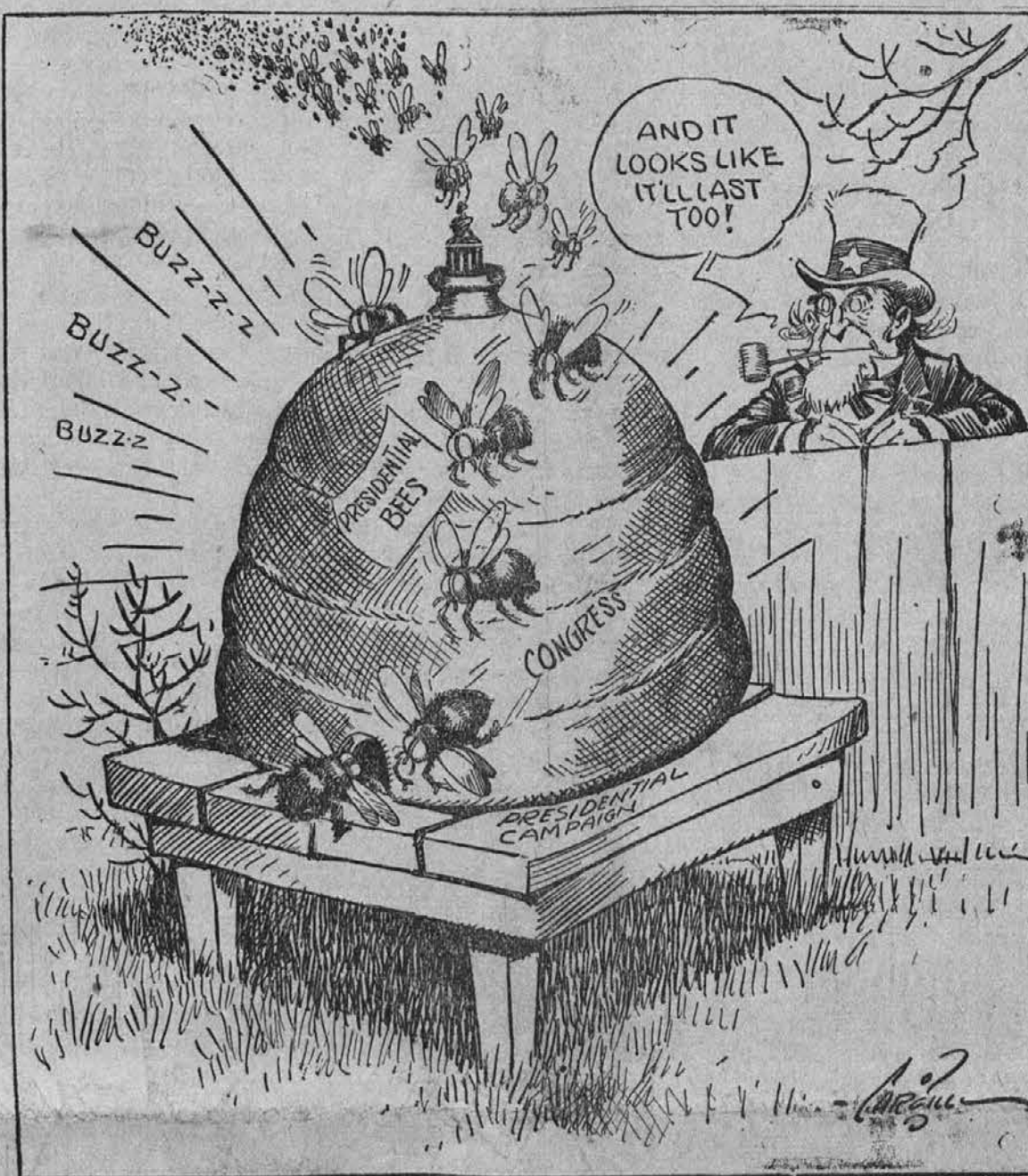
Dva ubita

Pomembne volitve

Pretekli torek so se vršile v Clevelandu izvanredne primarne volitve, kot jih je predpisal novi čarter mesta Cleveland, katerega so državljani odobrili pri volitvah 3. novembra. Zadnjih osem let v Clevelandu nismo imeli župana kot prvega odgovornega uradnika v mestu, pač pa mestnega upravitelja. Očividno je, da ljudem to ni ugajalo, ker 3. novembra so sklenili, da se zopet vrnemo k županskemu sistemu vlade.

Pri volitvah v torek je lahko nastopil vsak kandidat, ki je dobil prej tozadevno 3,000 podpisov državljanov. Glasovalo se je o peterih kandidatih. Ona dva, ki dobila največ glasov, postaneta prava kandidata, in o njima se glasuje 16. februarja. Kdor dobi tedaj največ glasov, je prihodnji župan Clevelanda.

Republikanci so imeli pri torkovih volitvah enega samega kandidata. Oglasili so se sicer štirje, toda jim je najbrž bila juha prevročja, pa so se umaknili eden za drugim. Ostal je sam Daniel Morgan, zvest pristaš Maurice Mascheta, ki je imel najmanj grehov izmed vseh republikancev na sebi, in ta je šel v boj za starinski sistem vlade, katerega predstavlja republikanska stranka v Clevelandu.

Na drugi, na demokratski strani je pa bilo bolj živahno. Stranka demokratov sama je postavila svojega lastnega kandidata v osebi državnega pravdnika Ray T. Millerja. Oglasili so se pa še drugi "demokrati," ki so demokrati, kadar jim to nese in prija, a mnogokrat pa radi pozabijo na demokracijo. Sploh je znano, da se demokrati prav radi medsebojno kregajo in besedičijo, dočim se mora republikanec priznati, da so tako vajeni železne discipline, da na povelje voditelja umolkne vse. Tozadevno pa vlada pri demokratih še prevelika svoboda!

Torej bili so trije demokratski kandidati in en republikanski. Vse, kar je republikanskega v Clevelandu, do zadnjega zamora vred, je glasovalo za Morgana, in so tako republikanci s skrajnim naporom spravili skupaj 59,000 glasov. Demokratski kandidat Ray T. Miller je pa dobil sam 49,000 glasov, Peter Witt 30,000 in Walz pa 8, ali skupaj takozvani "demokratski kandidati" so potegnili 87,000 glasov, ali za 29,000 več kot pa republikanski kandidat Morgan.

Ameriški časopisi sedaj ugibljejo in računajo, kam bodo šli glasovi Witta in Walza pri volitvah 16. februarja. Delajo se stotere bizarne kalkulacije, ki so vse brez podlage in proračuna. Ravno tako, kot je angleško časopisje pred volitvami slabo in krivo tolmačilo sentiment državljanov, ravno tako se tudi sedaj angleško časopisje jako moti. O Witu se dejali, da bo nadkrilil vse, toda je bil komaj tretji.

Sedaj pravijo, da bodo šli Wittovi glasovi deloma k Morganu, deloma bodo njegovi pristaši ostali doma, deloma pa bodo oddani za Millerja. Enako z glasovi Walza. Vse to je napačno in brez podlage. Brez vsakega dvoma je, da bo šlo 70 procentov odstotkov glasov, ali najmanj 21,000, katere je dobil Witt, k Millerju, en tisoč ali dva jih zna pa dobiti Morgan. Toda od 8,000 glasov, oddanih za Walza, jih bo Miller dobil najmanj 90 procentov, ker so Walzovi glasovi čisto demokratski. Ako bo boljše Ford volil za kapitalista Morgana, kot poročajo angleški časopisi, svobodno mu, kajti republikanec Morgan lahko dobi vse Fordove glasove, pa še 25,000 Wittovih, pa še ne bo izvoljen.

Brez vsakega vprašanja je, da inteligentni clevelandski državljani ne bodo pustili vodstvo mestnih poslov več v rokah republikanske stranke. To stranka je imela vladati 15 let, in kje smo danes s to stranko, o tem govorijo zapori v državi Ohio, umori in ganceži! 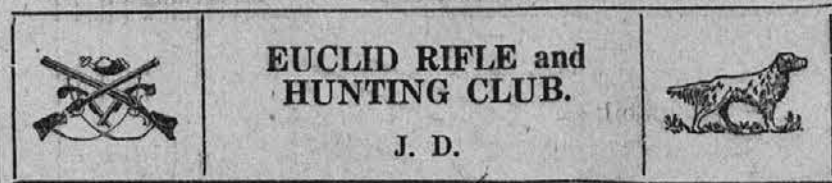

DNEVNE VESTI
Konferenca S. N. Doma

Letna konferenca Slovenskega Narodnega Doma se je otvorila sinoči v avditoriju doma. Točno ob osmi uri je otvoril zborovanje domov predsednik, Mr. Frank Kačar. Sprejel je bil čas zborovanja, in sicer od osme do 11. ure zvečer. Predsednikom konferencie je bil soglasno izvoljen direktor Mr. Frank Somrak; podpredsednikom sta bila imenovana Mr. John Centa in Mr. Anton Korošec. Istotako je bil izvoljen soglasno zapisničarjem Mr. Josip Skuk. Za pregled pooblastil so bili izbrani: Mr. Ludvik Medvešek, Mr. Anton Jankovič in Mr. Joseph F. Terbižan. Poverilni odbor je priporočil vse zastopnike društev za pravilne pooblastitve, zbornica je priporočila poverilnega odbora sprejela. Sledila so poročila direktorjev. Vsa poročila so bila sprejeta brez opazk. Zadovoljivo je bilo finančno poročilo tajnika in blagajnika, v katerem se beleži preostanek par tisočakov, kljub temu, da so današnje razmere občutno prizadale tudi podjetje Doma.

V splošnem se je povdarjalo, da je ves direktorij gospodaril in štedil v vseh ozirih. Posebnih podrobnosti ni bilo, le delničar Mr. Beno B. Leustig je priporočil spremembo v pravih, tikajoč se naslednika odstoplega direktorja. Predlog je bil, da bi bil namestnik le do prihodnje konference. Pred 11. uro se je vprašalo navzočih glede nadaljevanja zborovanja. Nekateri so bili mnenja, naj bi se bila konferenca zaključila še sinoči. Toda večina je bila proti. Torej se zborovanje vrši noč, ki se bo brezdvoma zaključilo v par urah, kajti ostala je le točka volitev direktorjev. Volilo se bo osem direktorjev. Zborovanje se je vršilo zelo mirno in dostojno.

V Nemčiji bodo predsedniške volitve v marcu

Berlin, 14. januarja. Državni kancler nemške republike, Brüning, je opustil načrt, da bi se termin predsedniških republik, Hindenburga, podaljšal potom ukrepa državnega zbora, ker ga v tem načrtu niso hoteli podpirati fašisti. Vršla se bo torej najbrž v marcu mesecu predsedniške volitve, katero zahtevajo tudi narodni fašisti. Po večdnevni posvetovanjih je Adolf Hitler, vodja nemških fašistov, in dr. Hugenberg, vodja nemških nacionalcev, vsak napisal pismo dr. Brüningu, da nasprotujeta podaljšanju predsedniškega termina potom parlamenta, toda da nimata ničesar proti temu, da se razpišejo volitve. Trditve kanclerja Brüninga, da bi ponovna izvolitev Hindenburga utrdila nemško stališče v zunanem svetu, je zavrl dr. Hugenberg s tem, da je izjavil, da bi Nemčija dobila v tujezemstvu najboljši vpliv, ako bi sedanja vlada kratkomalo odstopila. Obenem je pa dr. Hugenberg kot Adolf Hitler izjavil, da nimata ničesar proti Hindenburgu, in da niti fašisti, niti nacionalci ne bodo postavili kandidata proti Hindenburgu.

Jetniki so kupovali svojo svobodo

Columbus, Ohio, 14. januarja. Posebni senatni odesk preiskuje resničnost trditve, ki pravi, da je mnogo jetnikov bilo izpuščenih iz državnih zaporov v tem mestu, če so imeli na razpolago dosti vpliva in denarnih sredstev. Ta odesk je bil imenovan od državne zbornice. Med drugimi, ki so dobili za denar in petem političnega vpliva predčasno izpuščen iz državnih zaporov, se imenuje tudi Liston G. Schooley, iz Clevelanda, katerega je državni pravdnik Miller poslal radi sleparij pri nakupu mestnih zemljišč v dolgotrajni zapor. It was not so long ago that one of the men of the community approached the writer and asked that we devote our editorial space to a crusade to keep the children of the neighborhood off the streets during the late hours of the night. No, he didn't expect the children to stay at home nights just because we told them so. Rather he hoped we could educate the parents to the advisability of seeing that their children were in bed at proper hours.

Observance on his part of the alarming number of boys from 9 to 15 years who were congregating and parading along St. Clair Ave. hours after midnight prompted this action on his part.

However, feeling that our informant was unduly aroused, we shelved the matter for the time being and turned our attention to matters we deemed more pertinent.

But the past week's disclosure of the 15-year-old high school lad who led a Jekyll-Hyde existence, being a model pupil during his classroom hours and a marauder of women after the fall of night had settled over the city, shows the error of our judgment. No less than 17 cases of purse snatching and assaults on women has this lad confessed to.

Who's to Blame?
Now the question arises whether it was as much his fault as that of the parents. Naturally enough, parents are the last to become suspicious of their offspring, but surely some suspicion must have been aroused for the irregular payments for his "work after school hours" and the irregular hours at which the work was being done. Evidently it was the duty of the parents to learn just what sort of work their boy was employed at which offered such lucrative returns for these times and which kept him out at such late hours. Had they done so the boy's purse snatching antics might have been nipped in the bud. As it is, he has a fine start down the criminal path which might lead him to practices of a more dire nature.

No, we are not advocating that children be cooped up nights, but if it is of necessity that the children be out long after the other children of the community have gone to bed, the least the parents can do is find out where they are, what they are doing and whom they are with. That's not only essential, it's obligatory!

A Slow Process
The city streets are bad enough during the hours of day. After dark crime and filth settle down in them, waiting for the opportunity to catch some youth in their murderous grasp. But it is not so sudden, so open, as we have pictured it. It takes time to corrupt the average youngster. He has his education, his family training and conscience. His resistance must be weakened before crime and filth can seep through his body and take possession of his heart. That takes time—time on the streets after dark.

Parents, watch your children. Don't let those play hours after dinner lengthen until 9 o'clock, then 10, then 11, until finally all hours finds your lad parading the streets in company with older young men. Stop it immediately. Set a reasonable hour for the boy to be home, then see to it that he is at the appointed time. If he isn't, find out why. It's your duty!
