Washington. — Senat je spre-
jel dodatek, da se prepove zbra-
nje v dobrodelne sklade od stra-
ni unij, kjer imajo samo unije
nadzorstvo nad takim skladom.
Lahko se pa zbira za tak sklad,
ako ga delodajalec in unija ena-
ko nadzirata.

Dodatek vsebuje tudi točko,
ki prepoveduje delodajalcu od-
trgati od njegove mezde ases-
ment za unijo, ako delavec ne da
za to pismenega dovoljenja.

To je bila zmaga za ohijskega
senatorja Tafta, ki je dan prej
pogorel s predlogom, da se pre-
pove splošno vseindustrijsko ko-
lektivno pogajanje. Senatorji so
včeraj porazili Taftov predlog z
44 proti 43 glasovom. Včeraj so
pa sprejeli dodatek z 48 proti
40 glasovom.

Sličen predlog je že prej spre-
jela poslanska zbornica.

Telefonska unija je
sprejela ponudbo družbe,
stavka pa še ni končana

New York. — Unija telefon-
skih uslužbencev, ki operirajo
klice na daljavo, je sprejela od
telefonske družbe ponudeno vi-
šjo plačo okrog \$4.40 na teden.
S tem je bila njih stavka danes
zjutraj končana.

Toda telefonska postrežba s
tem še ni vzpostavljena, ker je
ta unija izjavila, da ne bo šla na
delo, dokler bodo na stavki dru-
gi telefonski uslužbenci v posa-
meznih državah.

Od 287,000 telefonskih usluž-
bencev, ki so odšli na stavko 7.
aprila, jih je še vedno na stavki
okrog 200,000. Ti so uslužbeni
pri raznih Bell sistemih po raz-
nih državah.

Cleveland, O. — Pogajanja
med unijo in Ohio Bell Tele-
phone Co. so bila včeraj preki-
njena. Družba je ponudila uniji
\$4 približno na teden, toda unija
ni bila zadovoljna s tem. To-
da led je prebit in bo prišlo
najbrže kmalu do poravnave.

Angleški jetniki hočejo

London. — Angleški jetniki
zahtevajo od vlade višjo pla-
čo. Pravijo, da morajo ob se-
danji plači delati do 5 tednov,
predno zaslužijo za paket ci-
garet. Jetniki dobivajo zdaj
po 14 centov na teden, dočim
stane paket cigaret 64 centov.

V Angliji bo nedelja 6.
julija dan molitve

London. — Vsa Anglija bo v
nedeljo 6. julija upoštevala kot
dan molitve. Kralj George VI.
je pozval ves narod, naj na ti-
sti dan posveti molitvi in Bo-
gu, vzprie naloge in dolžnosti,
ki čakajo Anglijo. Vse cerkve
v Angliji podpirajo ta kraljev
klic k molitvi.

Amerika pošilja hrano
v Romunijo, ta pa daje
moko RusijiSovjeti trdijo, da gre
moka za rusko armado,
ki je v Romuniji

Washington. — Državni od-
delek je včeraj poročal, da za-
hteva Rusija od Romunije 400
železniških voz bele moke. To
zahteva Rusija v istem času, ko
hitijo Zed. države pošiljati ži-
vam ali pa po svojem zastopni-
ku, ki pozna zakone.

Ta slučaj jasno kaže, kakšna
je sedaj pravica pod komuni-
zmem.

VSE DRŽAVA. — V Ljublja-
ni je sedaj ustanovljeno tako
imenovano republiko razsodi-
šče. To ima reševati vse gos-
podarske spore med državnimi
podjetji in vse spore, ki jih ima
kdo s kakim državnim podje-
tjem. Vse to je sedaj odvzeto so-
diščem. Če ima tedaj privatnik
kak spor z državnim podjetjem,
je gotov, da bo izgubil, ker raz-
sodja država, ne pa neodvisno so-
dišče. Za predsednika tega raz-
sodišča je izbran Jernej Stante-
ki je znan iz prvih obravnav
proti nasprotnikom komunizma.

Bil je leta 1945 državni tožilec,
ki je poganjal v smrt ljudi, ki so
imeli ta greh, da so bili proti
partizanom. Izkazal se je za ve-
likega hlapca diktatorskega re-
žima in je sedaj nagrajen z me-

mirje in ne krši obljube, ki jo je
dala Romunija Zed. državam, da
ne bo izvažala živeža iz dežele.

V ponedeljek se bo na
Dunaju sestala komisija
za ministre

Washington. — V ponedeljek
se bo sestala na Dunaju po-
sebna komisija, ki so jo posta-
vili zunanji ministri na konfe-
renci v Moskvi. Namen te ko-
misije bo, da bodo skušali pre-
mostiti razlike na avstrijski
mirovni pogodbi, zaradi kate-
rih se v Moskvi niso mogli ze-
diniti.

Zed. države bo zastopal pri
tej komisiji Joseph M. Dodge,
bankir iz Detroita, ki je bil
prej finančni svetovalec pri ge-
neralu Clayu v Nemčiji.

Komisija ima nalogo pro-
najti glede vojne odškodnine,
glede mej in glede nemških po-
sesti v Avstriji. Te tri zade-
ve so bile namreč največja
ovira na konferenci ministrov
v Moskvi, na katerih se niso
mogli sporazumeti. O svojih
najdbah mora komisija takoj
poročati koncilu ministrov in
dati obenem eventualna pripo-
ročila.

Beneš trdi, da Češka ni
v pesteh Sovjetske zveze

Praga. — Predsednik Češke
republike, Edvard Beneš, je iz-
javil napram ameriški komu-
ničevalcu Sulzbergerju, da Če-
ška ni niti okupirana, niti kon-
trolirana od Sovjetske zveze in
da je obratna trditve nespamet-
na.

Ker leži Češka med Nemčijo
in Sovjetsko zvezo, mora Če-
ška pač gledati v Moskvo za
protekcijo, je rekel Beneš. To-
da v kulturnem in trgovskem
oziru pa gleda Češka proti za-
padu, je dodal.

Izjavil je dalje, da je Češka
prava demokratska dežela, ki
si izboljšuje stanje z evoluci-
jo in ne revolucijo. Kot taka je
v nasprotju z ruskim ali ame-
riškim političnim sistemom, je
govoril Beneš.

Komunizem prepovedan v Braziliji

Policija je zasedla vse komunistične urade po deželi,
da prepreči demonstracije. Komunistična stran-
ka šteje kakih 200,000 članov.

Rio de Janeiro. — Policija je po vsej Braziliji zasedla
urade komunistične stranke, da prepreči eventuelne demon-
stracije, ker je sodni tribunal proglasil komunistično stran-
ko v Braziliji kot nepostavno.

Tribunal je z 3 proti 2 glas-
voma odločil, da je komunisti-
čna stranka neustavna. Ta od-
redba prizadene kakih 200,000
komunistov, ki so vključeni pri
stranki.

Ne ve se še, kako bo zdaj s
komunističnimi poslanci v legi-
slaturah, katerih imajo 70. Pred-
sednik stranke, Luis Carlos Pre-
stes, ima tudi mandat v legisla-
turi. Najbrže bo o njih statusu
odločil kongres in najvišji voli-
vni tribunal.

Istočasno je predsednik repu-
blike, Gaspar Dutra, suspendiral
brezizsko delavsko federacijo in
21 delavskih okrajnih organiza-
cij, ki so bile pod komunističnim
vplivom.

Komunistična stranka je bila
razpuščena po členu 141 ustave
iz leta 1946, ki prepoveduje or-
ganiziranje, registracijo ali de-
lovanje katerekoli politične
stranke ali zveze, katere aktivni
program je usmerjen proti de-
mokratični vladi; ki sloni na
principih večine strank in na
garanciji ustavnih človeških
prav.

Predsednik Dutra je rekel, da
se mora razpustiti delavske or-
ganizacije, ki so pod vplivom
komunistov radi varstva demo-
kracije.

Delavski minister Morvan de
Figueiredo je izjavil, da ima vla-
da neizpodbitne dokaze, da so
bile zadnje stavke in delavski
nemiri vodeni po unijskih ele-
mentih spojenih ali pod vplivom
komunistične stranke.

Dobičkarji napeljujejo v
vojno, zatrjuje Tito

Belgrad. — Ob priliki druge
obletnice, odkar se je Nemčija
podala, je izjavil maršal Tito,
da vojni dobičkarji Zed. držav,
Anglije in drugih kapitalističnih
držav napeljujejo v vojno, ker
jim vojna prinaša ogromne do-
bičke.

"Razni reakcionarji v vseh
deželah hočejo dobiti v roke
oblast, katero so jim "ljudje"
vzeli iz rok," je razglasil Tito v
svojem dnevnem povelju.

"Narodi, ki so se osvobodili,
si žele mir, ker hočejo živeti no-
vo, bolj srečno življenje."
Koncem dnevnega povelja je
Tito apeliral na moštvo jugo-
slavske armade, naj nepresta-
no študira umetnost vojne ter
ohrani slavno tradicijo osvobo-
diteljske borbe.

AMERIŠKA DOMOVINA

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Po njih sadovih jih boste spoznali

V začetku maja minevata dve leti, odkar je zagrnil ubogo Slovenijo val komunistične okupacije. Pomladi 1941 sta Lah in Nemec razdelila slovensko zemljo. Italijanska okupacija se je končala s polomom Italije v jeseni 1943, takrat pa je Nemec zavzel vso staro domovino našega naroda. V začetku maja 1945 je končno premagana Nemčija umaknila svoje zadnje čete z ozemlja našega ljudstva. Vse je pričakovalo, da vkrakajo v Ljubljano zapadni zavezniki. Na naglico sestavljena nova slovenska vlada naj bi pozdravila osvoboditelje Amerikance in Angleže. Usoda je hotela drugače. Preizkušnja Slovencev še ni bila končana. Nerazumljiva politika zapadnih vlad je prepustila Slovenijo novemu, od vseh najhujšemu okupatorju-komunističnemu partizanu, hlapcu Sovjetije. To veliko napako danes obžalujeta Amerika in Anglija. Začuden spoznavata, kako sta proti volji nesrečnega slovenskega naroda in brez vsake potrebe pustili, da se je val prevratnega komunizma zgrnil daleč proti zapadni Evropi.

Prevaran je zlasti slovenski narod sam. Večina Slovencev je že med laško in nemško okupacijo do dna spoznala tudi namene komunizma. Bilo pa jih je le še mnogo, ki so res mislili, da tako imenovana Osvobodilna fronta prinaša osvoboditev, in ki so verjeli, da so voditelji te fronte, komunisti, v prvi vrsti borci za ljudsko svobodo. Tudi ti so sedaj ozdravljeni. Preizkušeni narod po dveh letih živo spoznava, da je tretji okupator najstrašnejši in njegov najhujši sovražnik. Z malimi izjemami onih, ki se sotočijo v milosti diktatorja Tita, vse ljudstvo vidi po sadovih, kdo so prej toliko proslavljeni partizani.

Kaj je prineslo partizanstvo Slovincem? Trpljenje za trpljenjem. Toda partizanstvo in komunizem enkrat izgine. Rane, ki jih je zadalo orientsko divjaštvo, se bodo, upamo, vsaj v doglednem času začele celiti. Nikdar pa se ne bo dalo več popraviti, kar je naredilo partizanstvo z našimi mejami. Ko so vladali Tito in njegovi, ko so bili samovoljni zastopniki Slovencev Kardelj, Kidrič, Bačlerji, Kraigherji, je Slovenija izgubila Trst in slovensko Istro, Gorico z Brdi, Beneške Slovence, Kanadsko dolino s sv. Višarji, porabske Slovence. Na vrsti je izguba naše Koroške, te zibelke slovenske zgodovine in naše prve kulture. Ne premišljenim slovenskim partizanom je bil komunizem vse. Za zmago mednarodnega komunizma so se vrgli z vso silo proti tistim, ki danes odločajo, to je proti Amerikancem in Angležem in še Francozom. Vplili in kričali so tako dolgo proti Ameriki, oznanjali s tako isto sovraštvo do vseh zapadnih narodov, da so naravno morali izzvati odpor. Da z vso silo poudarjajo svojo sovraštvo proti Ameriki, da Tito povabi ameriške letalce nad Bledom, kakor da se nahaja v vojski s tistimi, od katerih besede je zavisela usoda naših meja. Partizani so se zanašali na sovjetske obljube in čisto pozabili, da je dajal obljube človek, ki ni Slovan, ki ni Rus, ampak verolomni Georgijev — Stalin. Ko bo zgodovina pisal o tej brezmejno neumni zunanji politiki Titovine in posebej slovenskih partizanov, se bo čudil s kako selpoto je bila udarjena, ali pa bo moral naravnost povedati: "Slovenskim partizanom ni bilo za slovenstvo, ampak samo za komunizem."

In kaj je prineslo partizanstvo slovenskemu ljudstvu, ki ga je zasušilo? Najprej krvi in spet krvi. Na vsakih deset prebivalcev so ti učenci azijskih tiranov pobili vsaj enega. Marsikje tudi po dva. Že med nemško in italijansko okupacijo so padale partizanske žrtve po vseh slovenskih vaseh, toda pred dvema letoma je slovenski Kaj-partizan dosegel rekord. Kri je tekla v potokih, kri mladih fantov. Partizanska zver je klala na debelo, praznila slovenske kmetije in naše gorske vasi. Desettisoči so izginili po Pohorju, po jamah okrog Trbovelj, po jamah našega Krasa, po Kočevskem Rogu in še da nešteti kraji. Strahotno je bilo žrtvovanje nedolžnih človeških življenj partizanskemu Molohu.

Pa še ni končano! Skoro dan za dnevno beremo, da rdeči Satan še nima dovolj krvi. Njegovi hlapci, slovenski partizani, mu jo še vedno darujejo. "Ljudska" sodišča neprestano čistijo "ljudstvo" od "reakcionarjev" in še vedno gonijo pred puške nesrečne žrtve komunizma, te vere sovraštva.

Kdo ne ve, koliko papirja so pomazali titovski pisci v starem kraju in tu v Ameriki z besedo — svoboda? Ni je večje, pa tudi ne bolj neumne laži, kot govoriti o svobodi, kjer vlada komunistična diktatura. Z železnim zastorom so se zagrnili, da ne bi zunanji svet spoznal njih laži o svobodi. Pa jo je spoznal kljub vsej spretnosti komunistične propagande. Amerikanci radi pišejo o četverni svobodi: svoboda tiska in besede, svoboda vere, svoboda od strahu in svoboda od pomanjkanja. Katero teh svobodčin uživa slovenski narod v starem kraju? Tisk je samo vladen in ta sme pisati samo kar ukaže komunistična stranka. Vera je tako svobodna, da so celo menihi in nune osvobodili klostrov in jih

pognali na cesto. O svobodi od strahu pričajo neprestane obsodbe, napolnjene ječe koncentracijske taborišča natlačena s sužnji, ki jih gonijo na prisilna dela, pričajo tisoči slovenskih fantov in deklet, ki morajo prisiljeni graditi železnico v Bosni in za katerimi jokajo drugi tisoči ustrahovanih staršev. O tej svobodi vpije tajna policija. Kako visoko sega strah, naj navedemo kot zgled parado 1. maja v Beogradu. Vse hiše ob cestah, koder je šla parada s komunističnimi visokimi glavami je OZNA izpraznila. Celo te visoke glave torej ne uživajo svobode od strahu.

Kaj naj rečemo o svobodi od pomanjkanja? Kjer ni bilo pomanjkanja, tja ga je zanesel novi okupator — komunist. Jugoslavija, ki je izvažala v mirni dobi desetstisoče vagonov pšenice in koruze, je prišla pod novimi gospodarji po dveh letih tako daleč, do strada. Tudi železni zastor ne more zaščititi te lakote in prikriti čudovitega gospodarstva — komunistov. Kjer se ti prikažejo — naj bo to v Rusiji ali v Jugoslaviji — prihaja z njimi strašni svetopisemski jezdec — pomanjkanje.

Vse to vidi, vse to občuti narod v starem kraju. Če je bil kdo še doslej za "nove osvoboditelje" jih je sedaj do grla sit. Na vsem tem nič ne spremene velika govorjenja o obnovi. Sami komunistični listi morajo priznavati, da za obnovu ni niti cementa, ker so partizani porušili tovarne te vrste, niti lesa, ker so požgali žage. In številke novega proračuna pripovedujejo namesto o obnovi raje o vojski, ki ruši. Za armado je proračunano čez 13 milijard dinarjev (blizu 300 milijonov dolarjev), fond za obnovo pa znaša komaj polovico tega. Narod mora iz svoje revščine plačevati armado in policijo, da ga ti dve držita v vednem strahu.

To je v kratkih potezah uspeh dvoletnega "dela" partizanskih osvoboditeljev.

Slovinci v stari domovini so temeljito spoznali partizanski komunizem po njegovih sadovih. Kako daleč je prišlo spoznanje ameriških prijateljev partizanstva? Koliko jih je še med temi prijatelji, ki bi hvalili tako "svobodo," koliko jih je še, ki bi mislili, da je totalitarna diktatura — napredek? Vemo, da jih je nekaj, ki so se tako zagledali v Titove medalje, da ne mislijo več s svojo glavjo. Ker se jim tukaj dobro godi, nočejo kljub vsem dokazom verjeti, da lačni narod tamkaj kolne nove gospodarje, ki so ga pahnili v bedo. Takim je vsaka beseda zastoj. Vsi pa, ki jim je za objektivno resnico, naj bi se vsaj ob tej drugi obletnici slovenske nesreče zamislili in se vprašali, kje in kdo so krivci.

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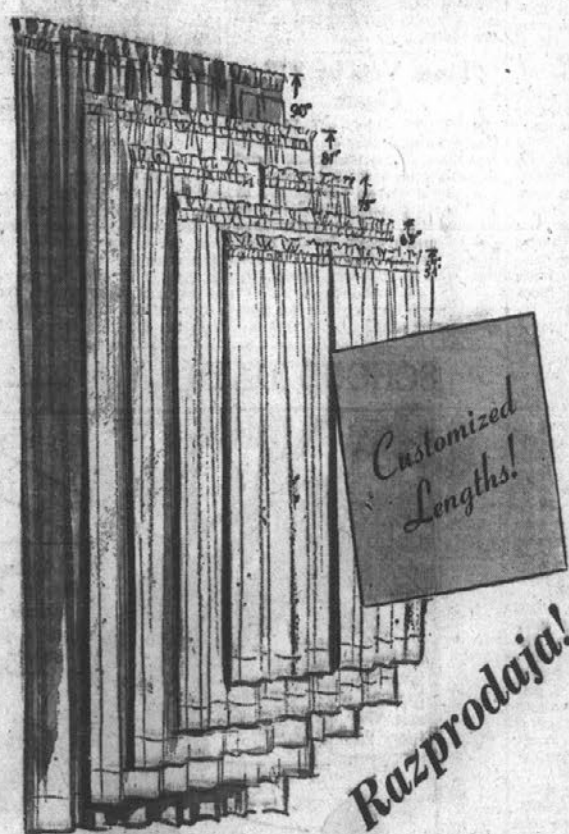

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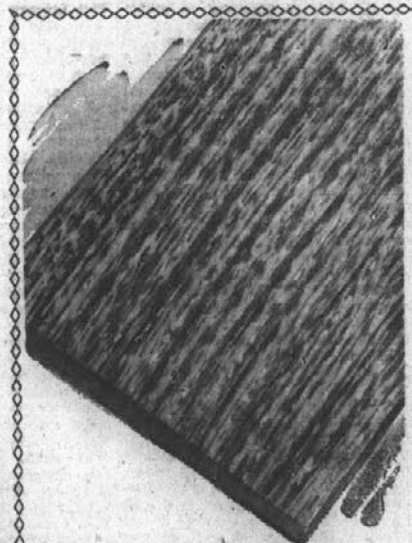

Cleveland, Ohio Friday, May 9, 1947

Sioux Falls, S. D. — Mrs. Mary Sisson, 60, living on a farm in Wyoming, brought the body of her dead husband 400 miles to bury him in Sioux Falls. As they were both from this city, they had made an agreement that the one who outlives the other, will bring his body to Sioux Falls. So Mrs. Sisson wrapped her husband's body in a blanket and drove to the city.

A top food company is basing all future operations on this economic forecast: Business recession begins soon; ends by mid-1948. National income in the last fourth of 1947 will be down 4% from late 1946, but living costs will be down more — 7½%. By year's end, wholesalers will be offering wares 9½% below the same 1946 date.

Detroit — Someone has put around a report Ford Motor will give a new car to anyone who can produce a 1943 copper penny. The company has been deluged with hopeful queries. The catch: All pennies minted in 1943 were made from zinc and steel.

Total value of the loot is placed at about \$35,000.

Tokyo. — A former Japanese paratrooper diver head-first down an 82-foot chimney in an effort to kill himself. He ended head down in a 4-foot pile of soot. A policeman heard him groaning and took him

to a hospital, where physicians treated his slight injuries and nurses undertook to restore his natural color.

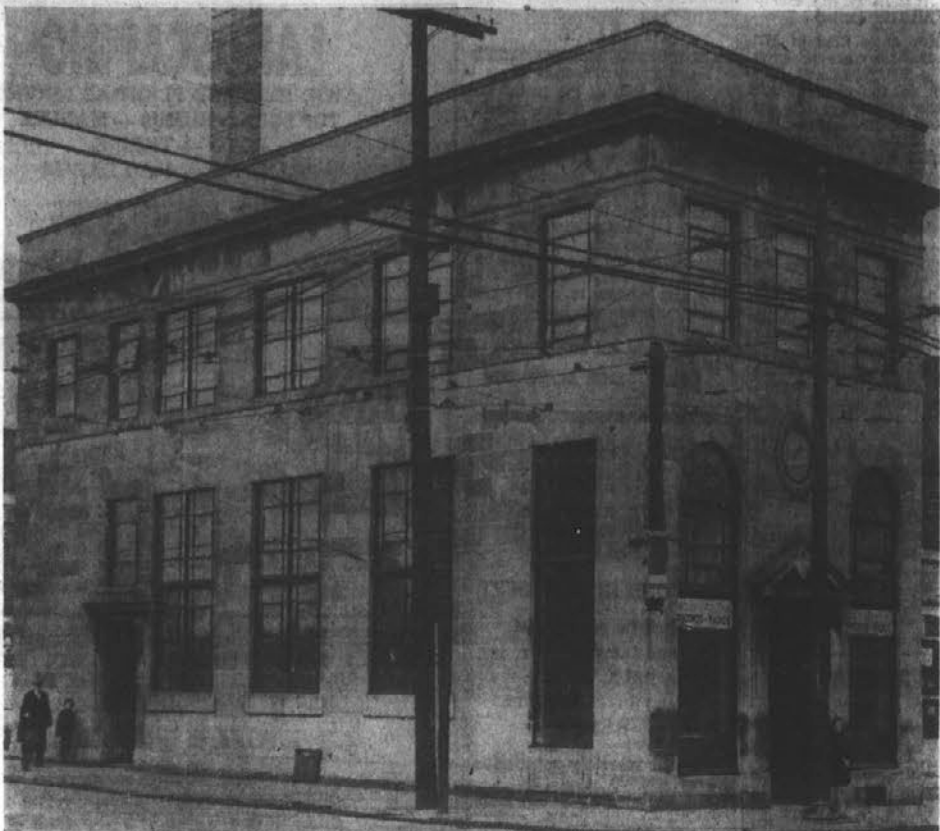

North American Bank Plans Second Branch

The North American Bank Co. of 6131 St. Clair Ave. announced plans to open its second branch banking office, this one to be located at E. 93d St. and Union Ave. and pictured above.

Lackamp, executive vice president, said bank directors and state and government officials have approved the move and the bank will offer an additional 5,000 shares of \$20 par stock to stockholders at \$27.50 a share. This will increase the total number of shares to 100,000 and boost capital to the required \$300,000. Unsubscribed stock will be offered at \$32.50 a share.

Lackamp stated the new bank will offer a complete banking service including safety deposit boxes and personal, business and mortgage loans.

The building, which some years ago was occupied by the Associated Savings & Loan Co. can be suitably adapted for banking purposes at a nominal cost, Lackamp said. The banking room is 23 feet wide and about 50 feet deep and now contains four tellers' windows. It can be arranged to increase the number of windows to six or eight. Gerald A. Herbison, assistant treasurer, will manage the new branch which it is expected will be in operation around August 1. As first assistant to Mr. Herbison will be the popular Johnny Strkal of Newburgh.

The bank, which was founded in 1925 and reorganized in 1934, has been headed by Anton Grdina for the past eight years. The other branch, over 20 years old, is at 15619 Waterloo Rd. In its latest condition statement as of March 31, total resources of \$8,617,565, deposits of \$7,830,702 and loans and deposits of \$2,354,856 all were at all-time highs, Lackamp declared.

CAPITAL HEARS ROBOT THAT READS ALOUD

New Bell Laboratory Device May Aid the Blind

Washington. — Now that the scientists have come up with a device that "reads out loud."

The say it may be possible to have the instrument read to a blind or handicapped person or to people "just too plain lazy to read."

The robot-reader was developed in the Bell Telephone Laboratories. Appropriately for an infant, the choice for its first recitation tonight was: "Mary had a little lamb, its fleece was white as snow."

At present it can't read a book. It can only read large-sized paper patterns mounted on a background of contrasting colors.

But Dr. Oliver E. Buckley, president of the laboratories, in an explanation of the device for members of the National Geographic Society, said that if the talking paper symbols could be reduced to small size they could be printed from type.

He added that many technical difficulties have to be solved first. Engineers said the device might have widespread commercial applications for instance, a printed page might be broadcast without benefit of human voice.

Graves Mission in Iceland

An American graves registration mission arrived here today to arrange for taking home the bodies of 220 American soldiers buried here during the war. The mission, consisting of three officers and twenty enlisted men, is expected to remain here about four months.
