Sodnik, ki jih je obsodil, je dejal: "Obsodba naj ne bo samo kazen za vašo dejanja, temveč tudi svarilo vašim pajdašem, da Ameriki tega ne bo trpela."

Hišnik nemškega konzulata v New Yorku pa je tako rafinirano pripravil "furnez," da papirji, ki jih je hotel sezgati nemški konzulat, niso zgoreli.

tion," he said. "Of the remaining 3,000 miles, approximately 1,300 are to be found in the existing camps and cantonments, and the remaining 1,700 in ordnance plants, depots of various types and other military installations."

Col. Farrell said a typical 30,000 man camp requires approximately 18 miles of primary, seven miles of secondary and three miles of tertiary roads, "exclusive of surfaced parking centers for the cantonment area," and there are from 120 to 270 vehicles for each 1,000 troops, "not counting weapons and miscellaneous equipment." For a camp of this size, he stated, the necessary facilities for storage and surfacing approximate 200,000 square yards, equivalent to 19 miles of 18 foot roadway.

Over 700,000 square yards of Portland Cement or asphaltic concrete pavement are necessary for runways, taxiways and apron pavement on a typical airbase installation. "Such an airfield," he said, "has three runways, each 5,500 feet long by 300 wide, with a typical boulevard section 500 feet in width, and taxiways and apron layout designed to meet the functional requirements of the Air Corps. The plans provide for ultimately increasing the number of runways and extending those being built to a total length of 7,800 feet each. Such a field, when completed, will have approximately a million square yards of pavement."

All Army construction is under the Chief of Engineers, and represents a money value of approximately \$6,000,000. He said, "That much work has been authorized and it is fair to assume that there will be more to

come before this war is over. Over 50 per cent of it is already in place," Col. Farrell reported.

Latin American air fields are no longer a menace to this country's defense for now they are in friendly hands. No axis plane today flies within, or connects with, any portion of the Western Hemisphere.

According to a decision of the Brazilian government, announced on February 6, the Condor airline, once closely associated with Deutsche Lufthansa, is to be reorganized as a purely Brazilian concern. If this program is carried out, it will mean the elimination of the only remaining and perhaps the most vital link of the axis-controlled airway network which once cast its shadow over most of South America.

Columbia, near to the Panama Canal, was the first country to move in the dramatic battle to rid Latin American aviation of Nazi influence. The Columbian government set up a national airline which absorbed the foreign owned companies, and in collaboration with Pan American Airways, now controls aviation in that country.

Peru and Bolivia began to use pressure on foreign controlled airways by terminating contracts and confiscating planes. A fatal blow in Peru came to the German owned company when the Canadian oil company in Peru cut off oil supplies. This line had connected South to Chile and the Argentine.

The Consumers' League of Ohio has set a goal of \$7,500 for the annual membership drive which will open March 14 and close March 28, Municipal Judge Bradley Hull, campaign chairman, announced today.

The campaign will be carried on by three divisions. The first, composed of 20 captains with teams of five each, will be headed by Miss Grace Meyette, director of the League for Human Rights. Miss Marie R. Wing, vice-president of the Consumers' League, will be chairman of the special gifts division. The labor division will be manned by Beryl Peppercorn, manager of the Amalgamated Clothing Workers' Union, and Phil Hannah, business agent of the Gasoline Station Operators Union. Mrs. Alfred Kelley will be secretary of the campaign committee.

The League has geared its program to the war effort and will contribute all of its resources and 40 years of experience to the protection of the welfare of working women and young people in the war emergency. Current activities of the League include a committee on women workers in war industries, a weekly food pricing survey, investigations of child labor law violations, and a study of priorities unemployment insurance in the war economy.

Among its legislative achievements the League lists the Ohio 8-hour law for women, the minimum wage law, Unemployment compensation, and the child labor and school attendance law.

Traffic Toll Mounts

Cleveland, O. — Everybody must beware of becoming complacent about the mounting traffic toll. To get back to where we were in 1933 it will be necessary to reduce traffic deaths by 8,000 and even then we would be killing about 32,000 people each year.

Part of the 16% that traffic deaths increased the past year probably is due to the increased activity upon our highways, but a greater part of this rise is due to the necessity for speed in war industries. The tension that men have acquired while at work is carried over into the operation of their automobiles.

A mere reduction of automobiles in use will not solve the traffic problem. For example in London where there was a sharp curtailment of automobile use the traffic deaths increased greatly, even daytime deaths where blackouts were not a factor.

As the tempo of war production and transportation increases, and automobiles in use deteriorate to a point where they are dangerous, together with other complicating factors make us realize that this is certainly no time to relax our vigilance and carelessness while using our streets.

American Slav Congress Set for April 25-26, 1942 in Detroit, Mich.

The American Slav Congress Committee decided on April 25 and 26, 1942 in the city of Detroit, Michigan as the dates and place of the great Congress of American Slavs.

The committee had before it a very important letter from Cordell Hull, Secretary of State, stating that a Congress of American Slavs is needed that will work to unify the American Slavs in support of our country's war effort.

The Committee decided on Detroit, Michigan as the congress city because Detroit is an outstanding American-Slav center and one of the key centers of our war industries centrally located for all of the American Slav people.

The purpose of the congress, as stated by the committee, is to help organize the American Slavs in support of our government's war efforts, especially to outproduce the Axis; to help sell millions of dollars of bonds and stamps; to appeal to the Slavic people in Europe to cut production of the axis material and to keep up their guerilla war against the axis and their Quislings.

The committee expects about 3,000 delegates, representing all sections of the American Slavs, at the Detroit Congress. Representation at the Congress is on the basis of 10 delegates from each national or international organization; 5 delegates from the state or district organizations; and 2 delegates from each lodge or local body.

The full text of Cordell Hull's letter, addressed to Congressman James A. Wright, follows: January 19, 1942

My dear Mr. Wright: I acknowledge the receipt of your letter of December 27 regarding Mr. Blair Gunther and his inquiry respecting the advisability of holding an American-Slavic Congress.

The courtesy of the sponsors in inquiring as to the attitude of this Department is appreciated, although you of course realize that the final decision as to whether or not such a congress should be held does not lie with the State Department.

The full support for our war efforts of American citizens of Slavic descent, who are such a large factor in our production programs in heavy industry, is particularly important.

All efforts, however should aim at minimizing differences in racial background and at stressing the fundamental unity of the country. Provided therefore that the purpose and program of such a congress aims at stimulating American unity and is concentrated on this subject and not on controversial problems relating to the future of Eastern Europe, it could be of constructive assistance.

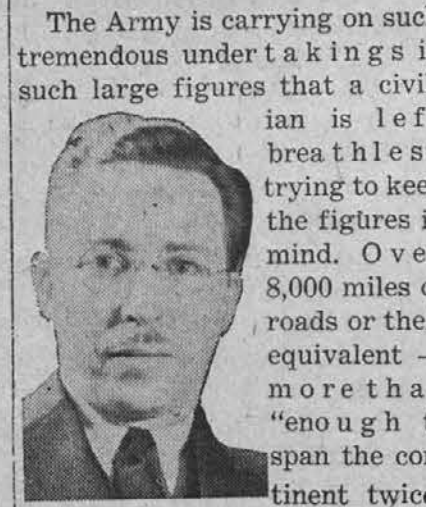
