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Želje po nasilju ne mirujejo v Ameriki

Groženj in atentatov na življeno predsednikov in drugih vodilnih mož deželi ni nikdar manjkalo.

CLEVELAND, O. — Čeprav je na zunaj vse mirno, želje po nasilju ne mirujejo v naši deželi. Lani je na primer šest zlikovcev hotela preplezati železno ograjo okoli Bele hiše z nimenom, da bi "napadil" Johnsona. Njegova pisarna je lani dobila tudi 12,000 grozilnih pisem, ki vsa obetajo Johnsonu "obračune".

Že to število je vredno premisljevanja, sicer je pa zadnja leta Bela hiša dobro zavarovana. Po vsakem atentatu je dostop vajno poostren. Seveda je dobro poskrbljeno tudi za osebno varnost predsednika in podpredsednika. Ni pa bilo zmeraj tako. Ko je bil Truman podpredsednik, je hodil, kjer je hotel, brez vsega policijskega varstva.

Političnih atentatov na predsednike pozna dežela veliko, da-siravno je nekaj med njimi splošno znanih. Vsem nam je še v spominu ponesrečen atentat na predsednika Trumana, ki je bil izvršen l. 1950. Pozabljen je pa že atentat na pokojnega predsednika Roosevelta v Miami Beach l. 1933. Strelci so padli še pred njegovo inauguracijo. Zadet je bil takrat čakaški župan Čermak in tudi ubit. Leta 1912 je bil izvršen atentat na predsednika T. Roosevelt, ko je bil na agitaciji v Milwaukeeju. Kroglo je zadržala debela listnica, predsednik sam je bil le lahko ranjen. Ni ga pa na agitacijskih potovanjih do takrat spremjal nobena telesna straža. Smrtno je bil zadet l. 1901 predsednik McKinley v Buffalu, kjer je obiskal razstavo. Predsednik Garfield je bil ubit na železniški postaji v Washingtonu.

Seveda ima vsaka dežela svojo zgodovino atentatov, nobena ni brez njih, saj je l. 1898 celo v Švici umoril italijanski anarhist Lucheni avstrijsko cesarico Elizabeto, ki se ni nikoli vtikal v politiko. Tudi jugoslovanski kralj Aleksander je bil dvakrat cilj atentata. Prvič so ga hoteli ubiti, ko je odhalil l. 1920 iz parlamenta, drugič so dosegli svoj cilj v Marseillesu l. 1934.

Belgia le dobi vlado

BRUXELLES, Belg. — Vse kaže, da bo krščanskemu demokrati Gastonu Eyskensu, 65 let staremu Flamcu, ki je bil vzgojen in šolan v ZDA, le uspelo dosegiti sporazum med krščansko demokrati in socialisti o novi vladi. Dogovor je bil v glavnem že dosežen in vlada naj bi bila skoraj objavljena.

Belgia je brez prave trdne vlade že 4 mesece, od preteklega februarja, ko je spor zaradi jekika prisilil vlado k odstopu in kralja Baudouina k razpisu novih volitev.

Vlada je v sredo prepovedala vsa protestna zborovanja in javne pohode za čas vojitev in razpustila organizacije študentovskih skrajnežev.

PARIZ, Fr. — V sredo je sklical De Gaulle svoje francoske vlade pod svojim predsedstvom, na njej je bil sklenjen razpust s edinih študentovskih skupin skrajne leve, ki predstavljajo jedro "študentovske revolucije", in prepovedana so vsa javna protestna zborovanja in pohodi za čas do volitve v narodno skupščino 30. junija. Vlada je sklepela objavila in pri tem izjavila, da bo vsak poskus organizacije kakršnegakoli protestnega pohoda ali zborovanja "neusmiljeno strila".

Studentje v glavnem mestu, ki so imeli za sredo popoldne napovedano v veliko množično protestno zborovanje, so tega odpovedali, ker so nemara spoznali, da se De Gaulle ne bo več šalil z njimi in njihovo "revolucijo". Mož je pokazal, da hoče red in mir, da bodo volitve lahko mirno potekle, prav tako tudi priprave na nje.

Javnosti so začeli nemiri študentov, gre v glavnem za skupine skrajnežev, anarhistov, trockistov, maovcev in kastroveev, predsedati. Nemiri, izgredili in spopadi s policijo so pridobili v prvih tednih študentom precej simpatij, toda te naglo izginjajo in vladu se ni treba batiti, da bi zadelna na obsodo javnosti, če stopi revolucionarni študentom na prste. Vse politične stranke, tudi komunistična, so se vneto pognale v volivni boju in hočejo dosegči svoje cilje po zakoniti poti. To je poudaril sam vodja Komunistične partije Waldeck Rochet.

PARIZ, Fr. — Sedanja francoska kriza je pokazala bolj nazono kot karkoli drugega v zadnjih letih, kako zelo je vseh 14 bivših francoskih kolonij v Afriki navezanih na Pariz. V kolonijah ne prevladuje le francoski jezik in francoska kultura, povsod se čuti tudi pomen francoskega gospodarstva. Še zmeraj je na tisoč francoskih državljanov, ki so zaposleni v kolonijah v zasebnih podjetjih in v javni upravi. Še zmeraj so kolonije navezane na podpore, ki jih daje francoska vlada. Vse to podpore znašajo le 2% francoskega narodnega dohodka, se pa matični deželi imenitno obrestijo. To se je pokazalo v sedanjem krizi. Vse kolonije so vrsti so se postavile na stran sedanjega generalovalga režima in izražale strah, da bi spremembra režima utegnila pomeniti zanje tudi konec francoskih podpor.

Režim generala De Gaulle je torej bolj priljubljen v bivših kolonijah, kot v Franciji sami. V tem ne dela izjeme niti Alžir, ki je prva leta po svoji osvoboditvi zmeraj ognjevitvo kritiziral bivšo kolonialno upravo.

Ne mislimo pa tako le politični gospodarji v novih republikah. Istih misli je tudi domače prebivalstvo. Se le prerađo spominja na vse, kar je francoska kolonialna uprava znala lepoš urejati od sedanja domače vlade.

Zahodnoberlinski župan kaže na Ruse kot krvice

BERLIN, Nem. — Župan Zahodnega Berlina Klaus Schuetz je dejal v mestnem svetu po posvetu z mestnimi vodniki, da so Rusi predhodno odobrili nove dolobe vzhodnonemške vlade o osebnem in tovornem prometu med Zahodnim Berlinom in Zahodno Nemčijo. Župan je prepričan, da pomenijo ti ukrepi kršenje dogovorov štirih zasedbenih sil zvezah z Zahodnim Berlinom. Označil jih je tudi za bud udarec naporom za zmanjšanje napetosti v Evropi.

Tudi tri Zahodne sile v svojih protestnih izjavah vztrajajo na stališču, da pripada odgovornost za prometne zveze med Zahodno Nemčijo in Zahodnim Berlinom Sovjetski zvezzi na temelju dogovorov med štirimi zasedbenimi silami, katerih zadnji je bil sklenjen leta 1949 ob končanju znane berlinske blokade.

JOHNSON JE PODPISAL KONZULARNI SPORAZUM MED ZDA IN SOVJETIJO

Predsednik ZDA je podpisal včeraj konzularni sporazum med Združenimi državami in Sovjetsko zvezo ter pozval k nadaljnemu sodelovanju med obema državama, ker je mir sveta prevažen, da bi ga spravljali v nevarnost.

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Včeraj je predsednik ZDA L. B. Johnson podpisal v Beli hiši v navzočnosti državnega tajnika D. Ruska in sovjetskega poslanika A. Dobrinina konzularni dogovor med ZDA in ZSSR, sklenjen še maja 1964, pa odobren od ameriškega Senata lani v marcu, od Vrhovnega sovjeta pa še v preteklem maju. Dogovor bo stopil v veljavo 30 dni po podpisu. Predsednik ZDA je postal to priložnost za ponoven poziv k sodelovanju med Združenimi državami in Sovjetsko zvezo. Priznal je, da obstoje med obema še vedno "globoke in nevarne razlike v nekaterih vprašanjih", pa poudaril, da je "svetovni mir preveč važen, da bi dovolili tem razlikam, da bi ovirale uporabo vseh poti k bolj mirnim odnosom in večjemu sodelovanju sveta".

Konzularni sporazum bo omogočil odprtje ameriških konzulatov v Sovjetski zvezi in ruskih v naši deželi, pa poskrbel tudi za boljše varstvo ameriških državljanov v Sovjetski zvezi in ruskih v Združenih državah. Obe državi se obvezujeta v sporazumu, da bosta v teklu treh dni obvestila druga drugo o arretaciji državljanov druge na svojih tleh in jim dovolile razgovor z domačim konzulom. V podrobnostih so v sporazumu določene tudi vse ostale pravice konzulov in konzulatov.

Združene države so imele do leta 1948 poleg poslanštva v Moskvi tudi konzulata v Lenjingradu in v Vladivostoku, Sovjetska zveza pa je imela svoja konzulata v New Yorku in v San Franciscu. V sporu okoli sovjetske učiteljice Oksane Kosenkine ki je skočila skozi okno sovjetskega konzulata v New Yorku, da se ji ne bi bilo treba vrniti v Sovjetsko zvezo, so bili na predlog Moskve vsi konzulati z izjemo onih v Moskvi in Washingtonu zaprti.

SOVJETSKI POSLANIK A. Dobrinin je podobno kot predsednik L. B. Johnson izrazil upanje, da so bodo odnos med Ameriko in Rusijo razvijali tudi dalje ugodno, četudi je uradno glasilo vlade ZSSR Izvestia v Moskvi komaj dan preje zapisalo, da so ti odnosi zaradi vojne v Vietnamu "zamrznjeni" in bodo taki ostali, dokler te vojne ne bodo konec.

CAPE KENNEDY, Fla. — Z raketo Titan 3 so poslali včeraj v vesolje istočno 8 vojaških komunikacijskih satelitov. Vsi so na določenih mestih in bodo dopolnjevali komunikacijsko mrežo med ZDA in Vietnamom.

List izjavlja, da so ostali odnosi med obema glavnima silama sveta klub nekaterim doseženim sporazumom tekoma preteklega leta dejansko "zamrznjeni" in bodo takci ostali, dokler ne bo vojna končana.

Predsednik L. B. Johnson je bil za gradnico visoke šole v Glassboroju, kjer se je lani dvakrat sešel s predsednikom vlad ZSSR A. Kosyginom. Govoril je o odnosih med obema državama in izrazil upanje, da bo duh, ki je vladal pri lanskih razgovorih, oživel in pomagal do novega izboljšanja odnosov med obema glavnima silama na svetu. Trdil je, da so ti od lani klub vojskovjanju v Vietnamu v zadnjem letu nekaj napredovali. Ruski vladni list odgovarja, da se L. B. Johnson v tem pogledu moti. Odnesi so zamrznjeni in bodo zamrznjeni ostali, dokler vojne v Vietnamu ne bo konec.

LONDON, Vel. Brit. — Nemir med študenti na Angleškem se je pojavi že precej davno, budi in pospešuje ga levičarska skupina "International Marxist", ki je bila ustanovljena pred petimi leti v Nottinghamu in je nato raztegnila svoje veje po vsej deželi. V zadnjem času smo slišali le o nastopu nezadovoljnih študentov na starodavni univerzi v Oxfordu, dejansko je bilo večje število nemirov na večini vseh visokih šol po vsej Veliki Britaniji. Ponekod je prišlo le do pritožb in protestov, drugod pa tudi do pravih izgredov in "zasedbe" visokih šol.

Ti nemiri so se začeli najprej z nastopi proti vojskovjanju v Vietnamu, se spremenili v demonstracije proti Združenim državam in nato tudi proti razmeram doma, na visokih šolah samih, pa tudi izven njih. Britanska radijsko-televizijska družba (BBC) je pripravila te dni na svojem programu razpravo o vzrokih in ozadju nemirov, demonstracij in štrajkov.

Res je šah kupil nekaj opreme za svoje oborožene sile v Moskvi, toda nakupi so obsegali le motorna vozila in protiletalsko artillerijo. Vrednost nakupov je znašala \$110 milijonov.

Naše državno tajništvo bi šahu rado ugodilo, boji se pa, da Kongres ne bo imel preveč razumevanja za iranske želje.



WHAT MAKES A DAD?

God took the strength of a mountain, the majesty of a tree, the warmth of a summer sun, the calm of a quiet sea, the generous soul of nature, the comforting arms of night, the wisdom of the ages, the joy of morning in the spring and the patience of eternity. God compounded these qualities and when there was nothing more to add, he knew his masterpiece was complete and so he called him Dad.

THE BIBLE ON FATHERHOOD

This year Americans will spend over \$1 billion on gifts for Father's Day, the day in June set aside to show appreciation for father. In many cases, it will be father who gets the bill.

The Bible makes every day Father's Day. It gives every father special responsibilities every day, and assigns him a place to be respected by every member of the family — by his wife as well as by sons and daughters.

"Listen to your father who fathered you" is good Biblical advice. "Listen" means "obey." By divine arrangement father has been made head of the household, a position not to be taken lightly by anyone, and certainly not by father himself.

Dr. Oswald Hoffman of radio keeps reminding fathers that they have a duty to perform which cannot be shod off onto mother. "Fathers must be around to exert authority," he says, "if the family is to have a happy life."

The Biblical pattern of a father is God Himself. "Like as a father pities his children, so the Lord pities those who fear Him," said the Psalmist. The Bible pictures God as a father who does not condone the mistakes and missteps of His children, but He does not treat them contemptuously. He corrects and He forgives. He is firm with His children and at the same time He loves them.

A father who never gets angry at his children, says Dr. Hoffmann, probably does not care about them. "The worst thing a father can do" says the radio preacher, "is not to care about his children. When a father gets angry, it shows that he cares." The radio speaker cautions fathers, however, to remember the words of St. Paul: "If you are angry, be sure that it is not out of wounded pride or bad temper. Never go to bed angry — don't give the devil that sort of foothold."

THE LATE HONORABLE ROBERT F. KENNEDY. All of us were deeply shocked and saddened by the assassination of Senator Robert Kennedy in Los Angeles. This latest tragedy again points up the urgent need for firm and decisive action to curb the threat toward violence, lawlessness and disorder in our country today.

Our hearts and deep sympathy go out to Mrs. Kennedy, to the children, his mother and father, brother and sisters, and other loved ones.

SPENDING CUTS AND TAX INCREASE. The House refused by a vote of 137 to 259 nays to adopt a motion to instruct its con-

ferences on H.R. 15414, Tax Adjustment Act, to insist on spending cuts of only \$4 billion (instead of \$6 billion) to be coupled with the adoption of the 10 percent surtax. I voted against the motion in the belief that we must have a substantial reduction in order to deal with our monetary crisis. The President is to make the cuts anywhere in the budget except for operational costs in Vietnam, interest on the debt, veterans benefits, and social security payments. The \$180 billion spending limit for 1969 will still be from \$3 billion to \$4 billion more than is being spent in the current fiscal year. It will not represent a complete austerity pro-

gram. The \$6 billion cut should not hurt any going program seriously if the reductions are made on the basis of more realistic priorities. A cut of only \$4 billion would not be sufficient to meet our current fiscal crisis nor would it have an adequate impact on the factors influencing inflation. The President has stated he would accept the \$6 billion reduction if it is finally adopted by the Congress.

THE ANTI-CRIME BILL. F.B.I. Crime Index figures indicate that the number of crimes committed in 1967 — 3,750,000 — was almost 4½ times the number committed in 1944 — 803,000. These further statistics graphically illustrate the growing crime menace: crime increased by 367% between 1944 and 1967; population increased by 44.6% during the same period. Therefore, the crime rate outstripped population growth by more than 8 to 1. The sharpest one year crime increase — 16% occurred in 1967.

The recent Senate vote and amendments to H.R. 5037, the "Safe Streets and Crime Control Bill" shows that Congress is prepared to act determinedly and effectively in response to the swelling demand that "something be done" to deal with the situation. This legislation started out as a program of Federal grants to improve local law enforcement. The House last year adopted amendments emphasizing the control of organized crime and riots and shifting responsibility for the program from the U.S. Department of Justice to the States. And now the Senate expanded and toughened the measure with these changes: (1) an increase in grants to \$100 million the first year; \$300 million the second year; (2) the reversal of recent Supreme Court decisions which limited the use of confessions and identification procedures; (3) authority for Federal, State and local law enforcement agencies, under court supervision, to employ wiretapping and electronic surveillance devices; and (4) the prohibition of mail order sales of hand guns and also the sale of such weapons to minors and to out of state residents.

This week the House rejected a motion to disagree with the Senate Amendments, thereby speeding the bill to final action rather than sending it to House-Senate Conference. A strong Anti-Crime Bill is needed and the sooner this legislation becomes law the better. The lawlessness and violence so prevalent in America today must be halted. Without effective police protection, backed by citizen cooperation with our law enforcement agencies, without an atmosphere of safety and security on our streets, without order in our cities and throughout our land, all our Civil Rights and Freedoms become meaningless.

TRUTH IN LENDING. The President has now signed the Consumer Credit Protection Act, better known as the "truth in lending bill". I supported this legislation which was approved originally by the House on February 1. This new law is designed to make sure that users of installment credit are told precisely how much they are paying in interest or carrying charges. It also restricts the use of garnishment and includes the Republican authored and sponsored amendment to deal effectively with loan sharking which, next to gambling, is one of the most important sources of revenue for organized crime.
