Ameriške zračne trdnjave so izvedle enega največjih napadov na Francijo

Nad 100 ameriških bombnikov je bombardiralo industrije v Lille, Francija. V tem masnem napadu je bilo tudi nad 500 angleških bombnikov in bojni letal. Štirje ameriški bombniki se z napada niso vrnili.

Londra, 9. okt. — Več kot 100 ameriških bombnikov je potelalo v enem največjih napadov iz Anglije ter bombardiralo nemško industrijo v Lille, okupirani Franciji. Amerikancem se je pridružilo tudi nad 500 angleških bombnikov in bojni letal. Ameriške zračne trdnjave, tipa Liberators, so prvič poleteli pri belem dnevu na sovražno ozemlje. Imele so čast, da so strelje svoje cilje, prodirajo, do cilja skozi roje nemških bojni letal.

Samo štirje ameriški bombniki se z napada niso vrnili. Znana pa je, da je posadka enega teh varno pristala na tleh. Najmanj pet nemških letal je bilo uničenih.

Armada zračne sile je z vso silo udarila na jeklarnice in tvornice lokomotiv v Lille. Številni požari so izbruhnili, ko so zadevali bombe.

Ameriški bombniki so spremljala tudi lastna ameriška bojna letala. Prej so jih vedno spremljala z mlekarško industrijo. Vladni števni urad je poročal, da se je znižalo število farmarskih delavcev od avgusta do septembra za 1,000,000 delavcev.

Tukajšnji Jugoslavani podarjujo, da se Sovjetska Zveza zelo zanima za jugoslovansko uporno gibanje in želi, da bi se nadaljevalo. Vsaka količina orožja, ki ga Rusija z letali posilja v Jugoslavijo, zmanjšuje pritisk na rusko armado.

Predsednik Roosevelt je izrazil željo, naj bi se ta asesment s 1. januarjem prihodnje leto podvojil.

Senat je tudi odobril 5 odstotni "zmagoslavni davek" na zaslužek vsakega posameznika nad \$264 na leto.

Rusi so strile dva nemška poskusa priti do Volge

Moskva, 10. okt. — Uradno se poroča iz Stalingrada, da so ruske čete strile dva nemška poskusa priti do reke Volge. Obenem se poroča, da so pričeli Nemci z novo ofenzivo južno od mesta, s katero nameravajo prodrijeti do Astrahana ob Kaspiškem morju.

Astrahan leži ob ustju reke Volge. Ako pridejo Nemci sem, bi zaprli plovbo na reki, po kateri zdaj Rusi dovozajo potrebštine v Stalingrad in na druge fronte.

Severno od Stalingrada so se Rusi utrdili v svojih pozicijah. Posebnih bojev tukaj ni bilo včeraj.

Nemci že 47 dni naskakujejo Stalingrad brez uspeha. Ako bodo od tukaj umaknili svojo pehoto in samo s topniškim ognjem in bombniki napadali mesto, se še ne ve. Rusi še takega napada ne boje, ker imajo tudi sami zelo dobro topništvo in bodo dobro odgovarjali.

General Draža Mihajlović z vedno večjim uspehom nadaljuje organizacijo svoje vojske. Prihodno pomlad bo njegova vojska sila najbrže sposobna za se hujše ogrožanje sovražnih oporišč, prometnih zvez in vojaških skladis.

Dobava orožja v Jugoslavijo

Washington. (Joseph J. Harrison v Cristian Science Monitor-u) — Hrabre in vztrajne četniške vojske v Jugoslaviji bodo v novem letu razpolagale z večjimi množinami vojaške opreme in z boljšim orožjem, ako bo uspelo izvesti sedanje načrte Zedinjenih narodov.

Oskrbovanje čet generala Mihajlovića z ročnim orožjem in municijo, ki se že zdaj vrši v manjšem obsegu, bo morda preurejeno in poboljšano.

Ni dovoljeno govoriti o podrobnostih načrtov Zedinjenih narodov. Vendar pa smoemo povedati, da je uspeh bolj odvisen od osiščnih straž, nego od novih potov in sredstev za prevoz. Nemci in Italijani poznaajo sedanjo taktilko dovažanja, a kljub temu je bilo dozdaj mogoče prevarati sovražne straže in privesti orčje v Jugoslavijo.

General Mihajlović je prejel sicer male, a vendar pa skrajno potrebo zadostne količine angleškega in ruskega orožja. Zdaj upa dobiti tudi ameriško orožje, kajti prevoz vojne opreme vseh vrst iz Amerike na Srednji Vzhod je dobro urejen. Štiri motorna ameriška bombna letala že krožijo nad balkanskim ozemljem. Tukajšnji opazovalci misljijo, da se bodo mogla ameriška tovorna letala iz Srednjega Vzhoda pridružiti ruskim in angleškim letalom, ki prinašajo jugoslovanski četnikom orožje in vojne opreme iz vzhoda in zahoda.

Poročila, ki so prišla v Washington zatrjujejo, da je bila osmestaj-mesečna četniška borba proti osišču v Jugoslaviji v zadnjih treh ali štirih mesecih najbolj uspešna. Kljub temu pa prevladuje mnenje, da bo v prihodnjih mesecih intenzivnost teh bojev nekoliko popustila, ker je zima v jugoslovanskih gorah zelo huda.

Pred demonstracijo bo parada, ki bo pričela ob 6:15 zvečer od 55. ceste in St. Clair Ave. po St. Clairju do Gordon parka. V povorki bodo vežbalni krožki Slovenske ženske zveze, Castna straža SDZ, deški skavti, Grdinove in Želetovne ambulance, truki od East Ohio Gas Co., White Motor Co., policija na konjih in motornih kolesih, godba fare sv. Vida in East High, ameriški Rdeči križ itd.

Demonstracija bo popolnoma brezplačno in vsak je dobrodošel. Vedite, da smo danes v krvavi vojni in nikdar ne vemo, kdaj pride ta vojna z daljnih front tudi na naše ozemlje. Ne bodite brezbržni, zavedajte se, da živimo v resnih časih.

How Much Do We Know About Slovenia

The Czechs saw the futility of holding on any longer. Premysl saw that things were at an end, when even his own Czech nobility was betraying and forsaking him. He accepted defeat in October, 1276, and ceded to Rudolph the eastern Alpine countries, namely Styria, Carinthia, Carniola, and Austria.

Rudolph, however, was not satisfied with this. He demanded that Premysl renounce his title of king and become a lord and sweat fealty to Rudolph. This hurt Premysl, and his pride was wounded still deeper when Rudolph extended protection to the Czech nobility which had forsaken him. The deeply grieved Premysl did not stand this humiliation for long.

In vain he sought help against Rudolph. He made special efforts to get the good will of the Church authorities, giving them and the monasteries many liberties. The nobility and the cities also got many special privileges. He visited the Slovene country twice. The large estates of various bishops in Styria, he gave to his sons, Albrecht and Rudolph. In this way they became the largest land owners in Styria. His earnest wish was fulfilled at the meeting of the State Princes in Augsburg (1282), when the two sons were given the duchies of Austria, Sturia, Krain (Carniola). Rudolph would have liked to have kept Carinthia, however this duchy, willy nilly, was given to his chief aid in the battle against Rudolph. He made special efforts to get the help of the Poles, but these turned a cold shoulder. Gathering what army he could, he met Rudolph in battle on the Moravian plain at Suhil Krutah (Durnkrut), September 1278. Premysl died as a valiant warrior in the thick of this fight.

The greater portion of the Slovene lands came under the control of the Habsburgs in 1276. In the battle at Suhil Krutah which is sometimes designated as the birthday of the Habsburg Austria, many Slovanes fought on the side of the Habsburgs.
