### BITKA ZA PRIMORSKO

Na konferenci zunanjih ministrov petčetih velesil v Londonu se te dni borita Jugoslavija in Italija za bodočo posest Trsta, Primorske in Istre: Na konferenco sta bili povabljeni obe delegaciji, namreč jugoslovenska in italijanska. Jugoslovenski delegaci načeljuje prvi podpredsednik vlade Edward Kardelj. Zunanji ministri petih velesil, Zedinjenih držav, Rusije, Anglija, Francije in Kitajske, bodo, kot vse kaže, te dni odločili usodo Trsta, Istre in Primorske.

### LOV VOJNIH ZLOČINCEV

General MacArthur je odredil aretacijo 40 japonskih militaristov, političnih voditeljev in kvizilgov. General Hideki Tojo, ki je bil japonski premier ob času napada na Pearl Harbor, in kot tak prvi na listi zločincev, se je pred aretacijo skušal ustreliti, pa se ni dobro zaredil. Daj ga bodo skušali ozdraviti v ameriški vojaški bolnišnici, da ga prihranijo za sodbo, če bo mogoče. Nekateri nadaljnji so se sami "uspešno" usmrtili in nekateri so se podali aretaciji brez odpora.

### KOREJCI RAZOČARANI

Domačini v južnem delu Koreje, katerega so okupirali Američani pod poveljstvom generala Hodgea, so zelo razočarani, ker je Hodge začasno obdržal Japonce na uradnih mestih. Protesti Korejcov proti takemu postopanju so bili tako glasni, da so dobili odmev tudi v Ameriki, in vrhovi poveljnik MacArthur je ukazal generalu Hodgeu, da naj odstrani japonske uradnike kar najhitreje mogoče. Severni del Koreje so okupirali Rusi, ki so takoj odstranili osovažene japonske uradnike.

### LJUDOŽRCI

Po uradnem poročilu avstraliske vlade so Japonci grozovito mučili ujetje avstralske in ameriške vojake, pa tudi misijonarje, nune in ženske domačinov. V nekaterih primerih so ujetim vojakom zvezali roke, nakar so prakticirali na njih bajonetne napade. Od nesrečnikov, ko so bili še živi, so japonski vojaki rezali meso in ga žrli. Avstralci so našli tudi v kotli ostanki človeškega mesa, kar kaže, da so Japonci žrli tudi kuhanči človeško meso. S takim divjačkim sovražnikom smo imeli za opraviti na Pacifik.

### NOVI AVTOMOBILI

V Cleveland je pretekli teden dospela prva pošiljka novih avtomobilov iz Detroita. Avtomobili so Fordovega izdelovalnika in modela 1946. Pri raztevovanju novih avtomobilov s traku se je zbrala velika množica gledalcev. Pred vojno kaj takega ni vzbujalo nikake pozornosti občinstva; pa skoraj štirih letih odnosnosti pa so novi avtomobili res nekaka novost.

## Preureditve in obnove

Prehod iz vojnega časa v čas miru zahteva in bo zahteval mnogoštevilne preureditve in obnove v splošnem gospodarstvu dežele. Za to bo treba precej časa, precej razmišljanja, precej potrebljivosti in precej napora. Vsi vemo, da so bile skoraj štiri leta vse materialne in idejne sile dežele v glavnem vsmerjene za doseganje zmage in za poraz sovražnika. To je bilo potrebno in pravilno. Zdaj je situacija močno predugačena. Ni več znatnih vojnih zahtev, pa tudi ni več predvojnih razmer. Gospodarski razmah dežele bo v mnogih primerih treba voditi po odločno novih potih. In brzina današnjega življenja zahteva aktivnega sodelovanja vseh res živih ljudi, če nečemo, da nas pripelje v depresijo.

Od administracije in od zveznega kongresa v Washingtonu pričakujemo v prvi vrsti, da prepreči daljšo brezposelost in da prepreči draginjo oziroma inflacijo. Za to ima kongres moč in sredstva. Kolikor delavcev ne bo moglo uposlit privatno podjetništvo, naj se uposlijajo pri kriptnih federalnih delih, takih, ki se bodo čez čas sama izplačala, kakor se na primer že izplačujejo veliki jezovi in druge naprave na naših vodnih silah, ki so bile v vladni upravi zgrajene tekom zadnje velike depresije. Dalje naj ostanejo v veljavi določbe glede najvišjih dopustnih cen za najbolj važne živiljenjske potrebščine, in sicer toliko časa, da bodo na trgu dovolj takih potrebščin za vse. Potem bodo take določbe lahko odpadle, ker se bodo cene same regulirale.

Ni dvoma, da se na naše postavodajalce izvaja in se bo izvajal močan pritisk proti federalnim projektom in proti regulacijam cen raznih potrebščin. Nekateri industrijski bi radi videli velike trume brezposelnih delavcev, da bi mogli zaposlencem znižati plače. In nekateri trgovci bi lahko napravili sijajne dobičke, če bi bile mahoma odpravljene vse regulacije cen. Toda ogromna večina prebivalstva bi bila pri tem hudo prizadeta. Zato je važno, da zasledujemo, kako bodo postopali naši kongresni. Ali bodo gledali bolj za dobičke velikih podjetij ali za koristi prebivalstva v splošnem. Ob prilikah volitev, ki se bodo vrstile že prihodnje leto, bomo imeli rekorde naših postavodajalcev in jih bomo lahko nagradili po zaslужenju.

Ni dvoma, da je v deželi mnogo industrij in drugih podjetij, ki želijo zdrav gospodarski razvoj, brez ozira na hitre dobičke. Toda marsikje take preureditve ne bodo mogle biti izvedene v nekaj dneh ali tednih, zato bo nekaj začasne brezposelnosti delavcev neizogibne. Marsikaterje naprave, ki so se tokom vojnih let izrabile, bo treba obnoviti, zato med vojno ni bilo časa, niti materiala, niti delovnih moči. Tudi to bo povzročilo nekaj zastoja.

Vsekakor smemo upati na primeroma hitro gospodarsko obnovo in živahno industrijsko aktivnost. Američani niso počasneži; to vemo. Potreba za tisočere civilne potrebščine je velika, torej bo dober trg zanje kar pri našem doma. Mnogo nujnih potrebščin za obnovo bodo potrebovale tudi razne inozemske države in Amerika bo najprej zmožna jih proizvaditi, in vsaj nekatere teh držav bodo mogle plačati za iste s svojimi produkti, posebno s surovinami, ki jih bo želela naša dežela uvažati. Tudi to spada v poglavje preureditev in obnov.

Razne preureditve in obnove bodo potrebne tudi v našem društvenem življenju. V veliki zaposlenosti vojnih časov, v skrbih za naše drage in v splošni vojni napetosti je ponekod naše društveno življenje komaj vegetiralo. Treba bo preureditev za nove razmere, treba bo obnovitev društvenih aktivnosti. Naši člani-vojaki se polagoma vracajo med nas in za te je treba napraviti naše društveno življenje privlačno. Tekmovanje med društvami v kampanji vpisovanja mladinskih članov naj bi se poživel. Skušajmo nadomestiti v zadnji četrtini leta, kar smo dosedaj zamudili. Pomnimo, da je močna Ameriška bratska zveza potrebna nam in našim prijateljem ter našim in njihovim otrokom in vnukom.

Vsekakor se lahko sedaj odločno trdi, da bo Francija zahvalila revizijo franco-italijanske meje v toliko, da bo mestu Tenda pri Mentoni pripadel Franciji.

"Toda največja nevarnost za Italijo in njena največja nasprotinja je zdaj Sovjetska Rusija. Sovjetska Rusija ni pozabilna, da je Mussolini postal pet italijanskih divizij v boj proti Rusiji. Pa so se tudi ostale tri veličastne bojevale z Italijani in to zadevo nekako izravnata. Kar šteje v zadevi Rusije je njena velikopotezna strategija, in Italijani se boje, da bo sedanja mirovna pogodba z Italijo postala v rokah Rusije dobra karta za pogajanja.

In takoj zraven trgovino s sadjem in zelenjavjo, odkar so se mi smejele oranže in breskve in hruške in kumare in melone in paradižniki in polno drugih poljskih in drugih dobrot. 

### A. Zbasnik Sends Cable to Sec'y of State Byrnes in England

The following cablegram was sent to Hon. James J. Byrnes, Secretary of State of the United States by our Supreme Secretary Anton Zbasnik, who, in the name of the American Fraternal Union, asks that the disputed Slav territories under discussion, be included in Yugoslavia.

September 12, 1945

WESTERN UNION

Hon. James J. Byrnes

The people of Jugoslavia have, by their loyalty to the Allies, by their heroic deeds and enormous sacrifices in human lives and in property during World War Two and by their love for liberty and justice earned the recognition of their just claims to all predominantly Slavic territory east of Isonzo River including Trieste, Gorizia and all Istria. The great wrong of Rapallo should now be righted. The American Fraternal Union, a fraternal insurance society twenty-seven thousand strong, has faith in you, Mr. Secretary, and trusts that you will give our gallant Jugoslav Allies a square deal.

### UNBREAKABLE RECORDS

Record buyers will get a break—phonograph records that won't break. They're RCA's new Red Seal De Luxe recordings which are quieter, prettier (they are red in color), unsmashable, because they're made of flexible, lightweight plastic.

RCA developed them several years ago for use in transcriptions and broadcasts, but have just now brought the price down to a level of \$2 for a plastic record, compared to \$1 for the same recording on a shellac record.

### Important Notice to Members of Lodge 2

Ely, Minn.—At this time I would like to inform the members of Lodge No. 2, AFU that I have received the new by-laws and they can obtain them by calling at my home, 533 E. Sheridan St.

All soldier-members who are discharged from the service have 30 days in which to reinstate themselves in the sick benefit fund without a physical examination. Please let me know as soon as you are discharged from the service.

I still have members who hold Plan "A" certificates. All those who wish to have them changed to "A" ordinary life, Plan "B" pay life, and Plan "C" 20-year endowment, may do so before the end of the year as those who change later will have to change to Plans "D," "E" and "F" which are higher in rate.

### Sgt. Edison Terbovec Died in New Guinea



On Sept. 14, 1945, the Editor of the Nova Doba, Anton J. Terbovec, received word that his son, Tech. Sgt. Third Grade, Edison A. Terbovec, had died in New Guinea on Aug. 29th while in the service of his country.

Sgt. Edison was born on April 18, 1923 and had been in the service for three years; half of this time he served overseas. While en route from Oro Bay in New Guinea to his new organization in the Philippines, he grew ill and was taken to the 119th Station Hospital where he died on Aug. 29, 1945.

He was a member of the Golden Gate Lodge No. 141, AFU of San Francisco, Cal. The Commanding Officer wrote that the sergeant was buried with full military honors on Aug. 31, 1945 in the Finschhafen Cemetery in New Guinea.



I'm never in doubt as to my company, Cause when I'm feeling nutty, it's the PEANUTS for me!

As you might have guessed our theme for today it nuts. Perhaps you are wondering what gave your Aunt Mary that idea.

Well you know, up in the plant where your Aunty Mary works there is a jolly, black-haired girl named Doris Mae who has so much trouble with boys. One day Goldie, the red-headed girl who works there too, wrote a song for Doris Mae about pickles and love and that sort of thing and we all had a big laugh over it. Then Goldie wanted to compose a song for your Aunt Mary, so, I asked her to write me a peanut song, for peanuts are Aunt Mary's favorite nut. So she wrote the song which appears at the top of the column and there we got our cue for today's story.

\* \* \* And now for our story about nuts. What is a nut anyway? A nut is one of the most valuable of all fruits that we eat. It is nourishing and healthful and contains much oil. The term "nut" as used commercially or popularly does not always coincide with the botanical meaning; thus an acorn is a true nut; a peanut is not a nut but a pod; walnut is the "stone" of a fruit formed like a cherry and a pig nut is a tuber. Some types of true nuts are hazel, beech, mast and sweet chestnut.

In America various kinds of nuts grow wild but there are several kinds that are cultivated with great success. California is the great land of fruits and most varieties of European nuts have been introduced and flourish there.

Some of the best kinds of nuts are the almonds, walnuts, beechnuts, Spanish chestnuts, filberts and hazelnuts.

The commercial nuts one of the most curious is the almond. The almond tree is the near relative of the peach but instead of the outer covering developing and sweetening, it shrivels as it ripens. When it is ripened it is kind of a horny husk that splits open and frees the pit. There are sweet almonds and bitter ones. From the bitter fruit a flavoring extract is made.

The almond tree blossoms early in the spring. Its flowers are salmon-pink and when in bloom the tree is bare of leaves. Some trees produce nuts with a hard shell but by careful selection of seed and constant breeding a softer shelled nut is produced which is known as the paper-shelled nut. Most of the almonds we eat come from Italy, Spain, France and Northern Africa but California now grows large quantities. The almond nuts are shaken from the trees and the hulls are freed by machinery. The nuts are then dried and bleached by sulphur fumes.

The English walnut was introduced by the Romans. It is a native of Greece and Southern Asia. Its flowers begin to open in April and

sails and many, many things are made.

From its oils are made oleomargarine, soap, candles and lubricating oils. The milk of the coconut is nourishing and the white part is eaten and also used in shredded form for cakes, etc.

It is said that a man could live in a hard shell and are borne on flesh-colored stalks that look something like fruit. They grow on a tree like the walnut and are found in the West Indies.

One of the most extraordinary is the Brazil nut. The nuts as we buy them are shaped like segments of an orange. In reality they are seed and not fruit like the nuts we have been telling you about. They grow in large clusters in a woody-seed-vessel nearly as big as a man's head. When natives walk in Brazilian forests they usually wear heavy wooden covering on their heads for protection. The trees grow to great heights and should one of the clusters drop its weight could kill a man.

The Brazil nut contains about 50 per cent oil. If one end is cut flat and the other end sharpened like a wick and then lit it will burn and produce enough light to light up a room. Sometimes it is called the juiva.

Most useful of all the nuts is the coconut and here is just a suggestion of its many uses. From its timbers such things as oars, yokes, you don't carry AFU insurance!

ljudstva! Ali si hočete res zapraviti lepo, svetlo ime "osvoboditelji" in ga zabarantati? Ako bi vaši ljudje, ti mojih daljnih prijateljev mogli slišati moj glas, klic mojega gneva in ogorčenja in obupa, oni bi se ne smeiali, prisluhnili bi, zamisili bi se in povzdignili bi svojo besedo, ki vem da soglaša z mojo, in napravili bi tožbo in izrekli bi otožbo, nad krštvijo človečanstva, ki so ga krivi njihovi rojaki.

Zdjaj pa, ko sem izilil iz sebe srd in obup, se mi je srce upokojilo in povem vam: nekje globoko v meni je velik mir.
