## Še k sporazumu med Vatikanom in Jugoslavijo

O objavi zapisnika o razgovorih med Vatikanom in Jugoslavijo smo že pisali. Nekateri bi radi iz tega zapisnika napravili "prijeteljski" dogovor, če ne celo kaj več, zato se nam zdi potrebno objaviti celotno besedilo zapisnika in kasneje posebej opozoriti na njegove najvažnejše točke.

## Besedilo

Zato, da bi se odnosi med Jugoslavijo in katoliško Cerkvio uredili, so se predstavniki vlade Socialistične federalne republike Jugoslavije in Sveti stolice pogovarjali v Rimu od 26. junija do 7. julija 1964, v Beogradu od 15. do 23. januarja in od 29. maja do 8. junija 1965 ter ponovno v Rimu od 18. do 25. aprila 1966.

## I.

V splošnem okviru vprašanj, ki so bila predmet pogovorov, so predstavniki jugoslovanske vlade izrazili naslednja stališča:

1. Načela, na katerih je v SFRJ zasnovana ureditev pravnega položaja verskih skupnosti in ki jih zagotavlja ustava in zakon SFRJ, so: svoboda vesti in svoboda vere; ločitev Cerkve od države; enakost in enakopravnost vseh verskih skupnosti; enakost pravic in dolžnosti vseh državljanov, ne glede na vero in izpovedovanje vere; svoboda ustanavljanja verskih skupnosti; priznanje svojstva pravne osebe verskim skupnostim.

Vlada SFRJ zagotavlja katoliški Cerkvi v Jugoslaviji, v okviru teh načel, svobodno opravljanje verskih zadev in verskih obredov. Pristojni organi družbenopolitičnih skupnosti (občina, okraj, pokrajina, republika, federacija) zagotavljajo vsem državljanom, brez kakršnihkoli razlik, sledno uporabo zakonov in drugih predpisov, s katerimi je zavarovano spoštovanje svobode vesti in svobode izpovedovanja vere, ki je zagotovljeno z ustavo SFRJ.

Vlada SFRJ je pripravljena proučiti primere, za katere bi Sveti stolica menila, da je potrebno, da jo v zvezi s temi vprašanji opozori.

2. Vlada SFRJ upošteva pristojnosti Sveti stolice pri opravljanju njene jurisdikcije nad katoliško Cerkvio v Jugoslaviji pri spiritualnih vprašanjih in vprašanjih, ki so cerkvenega in verskega značaja, kolikor ne nasprotujejo notranji ureditvi SFRJ.

Škofom katoliške Cerkve v Jugoslaviji bo tudi v prihodnjem zagotovljena možnost vzdrževanja stikov s Sveti stolico, meneč, da imajo takšni stiki izključno verski, cerkveni značaj.

\* \* \*

Sveti stolica — ostajajoč pri zahtevah, katere je s svoje strani izrazila med pogovori v zvezi s popolno ureditvijo odnosov med katoliško Cerkvio in SFRJ — je sprejela na znanje izjave o stališčih vlade SFRJ, ki so navedene v 1. in 2. točki.

## II.

V splošnem okviru vprašanj, ki so bila predmet pogovorov, so predstavniki Sveti stolice izrazili naslednje stališče Sveti stolice:

1. Sveti stolica potrjuje načelno stališče, da se mora dejavnost katoliških duhovnikov pri opravljanju njihovih duhovniških dolžnosti odvijati v verskih in cerkvenih okvirih in da v skladu s tem ne morejo zlorabiti svoje verske in cerkvene funkcije v namene, ki bi dejansko imeli politični značaj.

Sveti stolica je pripravljena proučiti primere, za katere bi vlada SFRJ menila, da je potrebno, da jo v tem pogledu opozori.

2. Sveti stolica — v skladu z načeli katoliške morale — ne odobrava in obsoja vsako dejanje političnega terorizma ali podobne kriminalne oblike nasilja, ne glede kdo jih storii.

V primeru, da bi jugoslovanska vlada ocenila, da so katoliški duhovniki sodelovali v akciji te vrste na škodo SFRJ in smatrala za potrebno, da Sveti stolico na takšne primere opozori, je v skladu s tem Sveti stolica pripravljena proučiti ta opozorila zaradi podvzemanja postopkov in morebitnih ustreznih ukrepov, ki jih za takšne primere predvideva kanonsko pravo.

\* \* \*

Vlada SFRJ — obstajajoč pri zahtevah, ki jih je s svoje strani izrazila med pogovori v zvezi s popolno ureditvijo odnosov med katoliško Cerkvio in SFRJ — je sprejela na znanje izjave o stališčih Sveti stolice, ki so navedene v 1. in 2. točki.

## III.

Obe strani izražata pripravljenost, da se tudi v prihodnje, kadarkoli bosta smatrali za potrebno, medsebojno po-

svetujeta o vseh vprašanjih, ki so pomembna za odnose med SFRJ in katoliško Cerkvio.

## IV.

Vlada SFRJ je pripravljena, zato da se olajšajo nadaljnji medsebojni stiki, omogočiti bivanje apostolskemu delegatu v Beogradu, ki bi imel hkrati tudi funkcijo odpolanca pri isti vladi, s tem, da si s svoje strani zadrži pravico določiti svojega odpolanca pri Sveti stolici. Sveti stolica je s svoje strani pripravljena sprejeti odpolanca vlade SFRJ in poslati v Beograd apostolskega delegata.

Premnogi slučaji in dogodki glasno povedo: Kaj govorite o demokraciji in svobodi, taterne ne razumete, jo ne pozname — pač pa jo smatraste za nekak patent (dovoljenje), da mete izkorisčevati drug drugega in da smete počenjati, kar am divje strasti sugestirajo.

Ej, slike našega ravnjanja, katero živimo v tej veliki deželi, ki je Bog v vsem obdaril, kakšni smo drug do drugega, kako razumemo moralno in njene dolžnosti — ta slika nas vse obsoja! Kak moralist bi nam upravilno lahko naglasil in zabrusil isti zaključni stavki nekdanje ižanskoga župnika, o katerem anekdota pravi, da je zaklical poslušalcem: "Ce se ne boste poljishali, boste šli vsi k vragu!" Predstave o srečnih samcih prazne?

"Zakonski može so nedvomno najsrcenejši Američani," se glasi presenetljiva ugotovitev raziskovalcev, ki so vprašali skoraj tisoč poročenih in samskih žensk in moških (nad 23 let) po njihovih življenskih navadah, skrbah, težavah, željah in radostih. Poročilo ugotovitve ankete je nedavno objavila revija "Journal of Psychiatry".

Ugotovitev so v nasprotnju z dosedanjem predstavo samev ne le v ZDA, temveč tudi drugod. Samec je bil začelen častni gost mnogih gospodinj pri kousilu ali večerji, in sicer tudi tistih brez hčere, godne za možitev, priatelj zaskrbljenega družinskega očeta, veselih maneken in negovanih stevardes, skratka mož, ki živi po svojih željah in okusu.

Nepodkupljiva statistika pa je prikazala samskega moža v povsem drugačni luči. Ameriško poročilo predvsem odklanja dosedanje mnenje, češ da so samski moži na boljšem kot ženske, ki niso naše življenske družine.

Osamljenih in nesrečnih je po tem poročilu trikrat več samev kot samice, štirikrat več jih je nezadovoljnih v poklicu. Samci so na prvem mestu med ljudmi z znanimi živčnimi bolezni, prav tako so prvi med ameriškimi samomorilci. Za gripo in pljučnico umrejo starostni skupini 20 do 50 let šestkrat več ameriških samev kot pa zakonskih mož.

Medtem ko samski ženam na splošno uspe ohraniti in počlabljati prijateljske vezi in stike z družinami, so starejši samski moži iz leta v letu bolj osamljeni in vase zaprti. Ohranijo sicer neodvisnost, ki so o njej sanjali že od otroških let, pa tudi svojo mladostno trmo v odnosu do družabnih pravil in dolžnosti, vendar se morajo spriznjati z dejstvom, da so navsezadnje le prepričeni samim sebi.

Na odločen protest je naletelo to poročilo pri klubu samev v San Franciscu, katerega članstvo sestavlja okoli 800 v življenu zelo uspešnih samskih možih vseh starosti.

## Deset let televizije v Jugoslaviji

Letos 15. maja so obhajali v Jugoslaviji 10-letnico obstoja televizije. Ob tej priložnosti je RTU priloga "Dela" prinesla o tem tale informativni sestavek.

Ob deseti obletnici prvih televizijskih oddaj v Jugoslaviji morda najprej majhen podatek: leta 1946 so v ZDA izdelali vsega skupaj 6,475 TV sprejemnikov. Zadnja leta se vsake tri mesice vsaj za toliko poveča število televizijskih naročnikov v Sloveniji. Ali drugače: od leta 1924, ko je bilo v Sloveniji registriranih prvih 12 radijskih naročnikov, je radio potreboval 30 let, da je število sprejemnikov v naši republiki preseglo 100,000. Televizijski sprejemniki so to število dosegli v začetku leta njega leta.

Gotovo lahko rečemo, da se je področje množičnih občil pri nas v zadnjih desetih letih bistveno spremeno. Takrat je bil radio še manj razširjen kot na primer dnevi tisk. Odtlej se je število radijskih sprejemnikov početverilo, pojavila in močno se je razvila televizija. Zadnjih deset let torej pomeni krepko modernizacijo obveščanja pri nas in dohitovanje dežel, v katerih je bil razvoj hitrejši kot pri nas.

Televizija, na primer, se je pri nas pojavila razmeroma pozno. Nekatere države — Anglija, Francija, ZSSR, ZDA — so imelo poskusne oddaje že pred drugo svetovno vojno, Anglija dokaj redno od leta 1936 dalje. Pravi razvoj televizije v svetu pa se začne po vojni in je v precejšnjem meri povezan s potrebo rekonverzije elektronske industrije od vojne proizvodnje v delo za široko potrošnjo. Nekateri naši sosedje so bili hitrejši in zato so se prvi televizorji pri nas pojavili ob zahodni in severni meji. Tudi prve televizijske oddaje so si v glavnem sposojale tuji program.

Nekaj poskusov je bilo že pred "uradnim" začetkom. Kot zanimivost naj omenimo, da je v času, ko se je pri nas radio komaj pojavil, delal v Ljubljani baron Codelli poskuse za prenos slike po dokaj primitivnem mehaničnem sistemu. Nekaj se mu je celo posrečilo. Še pred vojno je demonstriral Philips na beograjskem velesejmu svoje takratne televizijske naprave. Leto 1955 so bili v Ljubljani na Taboru poskusi TV programa s prenosom v zaprttem krogu. Pod jesen 1956, ko je oddajnik na Sljemenu že redno prenašal tuji program, so šli v Ljubljani v eter prvi televizijski programi z Gospodarskega razstavlja.

15. maja 1956, ob trideseti obletnici prve radijske postaje v Jugoslaviji, je začel na Sljemenu pri Zagrebu delati prvi TV oddajnik in ta datum velja za uradni rojstni dan naše televize.

Se isto jesen so začeli Zagrebčani z izposojenimi aparaturami in v improviziranem studiu ustvarjati tudi nekaj svojega programa. Za prvo uradno obletnico, 12. maja 1957, pa je v Zagrebu gostovala že ljubljanska televizijska skupina in potem, čez poldrugi mesec, še enkrat. V petek prvih televizijskih delavcev je bilo nekaj imen, ki jih tudi danes srečujete na ekranih — režiserje Mirč Kragelj in Fran Žižek pa Ježek, na primer. Prvi TV obzornik — 23. junija 1957 — je že bral Brane Prestor, od prvih kameramanov še vedno dela pri nas Franjo Meglič.

Redni "eksperimentalni" program se je začel jeseni 1958, pred tem pa lahko iz "prazgodovine" televizije v Sloveniji omenimo še dva dogodka.

V decembru 1957 je lahko Ljubljana devet dni gledala kontinuiran televizijski program z vsemi programske zvrstmi, ki jih še danes poznamo — vsak dan TV dnevnik, drama (resda, samo adaptacija gledališke predstave Molierove

## Državni zakladnik Ohio: Ne bo novih davkov!

CLEVELAND, O. — Na tiškovni konferenci, namenjeni v glavnem tujjezičnim listom, je državni zakladnik John D. Herbert trdil, da v dogledni bodočnosti ne bo nobenih novih državnih davkov, ker je položaj načelne pridelke. Ljudem je začelo primanjkovati hrane, voda pa je prosila za pomoč v tujini. Naša administracija bi Mongoliji rada pomagala, toda ne najde prave poti. Mongolije nismo namreč uradno priznali, da se ne zamerimo Čangkajšku. Sedaj je naša delegacija pri ZN stopila v stike z mongolsko in ji ponudila pomoč. Vrednost prve podpore naj bi bila \$25,000. V akcijo bo verjetno vprežen Ameriški Rdeči križ.

Mongolska komunistična stranka je pred tedni imela svoj kongres. Tito je poslal na kongres delegacijo, ki jo je vodil tovarš Marinko. Marinko je v Ulan Batorju tudi parkrat govoril in navduševal Mongole za komunizem. Radovedni smo, koliko jim bo sedaj pri Titu izprosil pomoč, saj so ga obsipali s častmi.





Milwaukee Loss:  
\$100,000 Year

Milwaukee, Wis. — Milwaukee County is losing \$100,000 a year in its stadium operation because of the departure of the Braves for Atlanta, figures showed last week.

A report prepared by county budget officials for the county board's sports committee revealed that revenue had dropped to about \$194,200. In the Braves' 13 years in Milwaukee, it had averaged \$393,800. The outlay, meanwhile fell from \$426,515 to \$328,745. This left a net tax levy of \$134,545 a year, compared with an average of \$32,715 while the Braves were in town.

Stadium Manager Bill Anderson said that it was "just as much work to maintain the field without a baseball team as with one." He noted also that the field must be kept in shape for professional football in the fall.

As in 1964 and 1965, the session this year is designed to acquaint judges with methods for effective judicial administration being developed in the country. The faculty, composed of leading jurists and law professors, will present courses in court administration, modern trends in evidence, sentencing and probation, criminal procedure, pretrial procedures and other developing fields of trial court administration. The course comprises four weeks of intensive work in these and other fields.

The National College is part of the continuing program of the American Bar Association. Its purpose is to bring about an exchange of ideas and information among the trial judges of the United States. Sponsor is the National Conference of State Trial Judges which is an activity of the ABA's Section of Judicial Administration. The College is operating under grants from the Max C. Fleischmann Foundation and the W. K. Kellogg Foundation.

The National College effort grew out of the work of the Joint Committee for the Effective Administration of Justice which was chaired by the Honorable Tom C. Clark, Associate Justice of the United States Supreme Court.

Through seminars conducted on a state and regional basis, the Joint Committee gathered the information about judicial skills necessary to an educational effort. This information and experience is now being made the subject for instruction at the College, and for seminars now being conducted by the College.

Mr. Justice Clark who serves as chairman of the governing board of the College stated that, after examining the applications, he was impressed with the high quality of the judges who applied and is looking forward to having them in attendance. He expressed his regret that the College, because of limited financial considerations, was able to accommodate only a small percentage of the excellent applicants.

Summer Orchestra

The Pops debut of Al Hirt and his Sextet promises to be the hit of the summer season at Public Auditorium. Mr. Hirt is a veritable giant in the musical part of show business these days. A mountain of a man whose weight reputedly hovers between 275 and 300 lbs., he remains a beholder of "Big Daddy" in "Cat on a Hot Tin Roof," exuding the jovial air of good living of his native New Orleans. As a youngster he absorbed New Orleans jazz by osmosis, but he was soon attracted to the classics and travelled northward to study trumpet or a scholarship at the Cincinnati Conservatory of Music. Following World War II, Mr. Hirt shucked the sergeant stripes from his sleeve and returned to music adopting the nomadic life of touring with name bands. For a time he occupied the trumpet chairs of such bands as those of the Dorsey Brothers, Ray McKinley and Horace Heidt. Being a family man, in a typically big way (eight children) Mr. Hirt returned to New Orleans to settle down and slowly built his reputation in his own home town, initially at Bourbon Street's Pier 600 club. Two years ago, after successive hit appearances on television and best-selling recordings, Mr. Hirt realized a lifetime dream when he bought Pier 600, refurbished it and opened the smartest club on Bourbon Street — Al Hirt's Place. His record albums all bear the stamp of New Orleans' colorful jazz vernacular — "Honey in the Horn," "Cotton Candy" and "Sugar Lips". An outstanding collaboration with Arthur Fiedler and the Boston Pops is called "Pop Goes the Trumpet". And that's exactly what is planned for the weekend concerts in Public Auditorium.

The title page in the program for that evening reads: "Al Hirt and his Sextet will perform selections from the group below but not necessarily each tune but play ad lib and select numbers at random". The type below lists such numbers as "Sugar Lips", "Birth of the Blues", "Down by the Riverside", "Carnival of Venice", "Tin Roof Blues" and "I Can't Get Started". Mr. Hirt and the Sextet (clarinet, piano, organ, saxophone and the drums) will appear on the second portion of the program.

## New Post Office

Pastmaster General Lawrence F. O'Brien announced that a contract has been awarded to build the Richmond Heights Branch of the Cleveland, Ohio Post Office.

Located on the Northwest corner of Richmond and Highland Road, the structure will represent an estimated initial investment of \$185,000, which was the lowest responsive bid received by the department on a competitive basis.

The new two story building will be air-conditioned and will have an interior space of 7,800 square feet, and completed eight months after the plans are approved.

Postmaster General O'Brien explained that the additional space and equipment will mean greater efficiency in line with President Johnson's directive to provide the best possible postal service at the least possible cost.

Because the building will be privately owned, the land will stay on local tax rolls. The Post Office Department's capital investment is limited primarily to postal equipment.

Mr. O'Brien said: "The Nation is experiencing a dramatic expansion in mail volume and services. Post office construction and remodeling is undertaken in areas showing the most urgent needs."

"Our 40,000 postal locations will handle 74 billion pieces of mail this year, over 84 billion pieces in 1970 and approximately 100 billion in 1980. To handle this tremendous amount of mail, the department is expanding its efforts to put mechanized tools into the hands of the Nation's postal workers in areas where it is economically justified."


## THE MEANING OF ADVERTISING

Their business-promoting efforts are reflected in the thousands of pages of advertising that we see every day in our hometown papers and magazines — advertising that tells of new products, expanded service and new opportunities.

It is well worthwhile to think of these things when plans are put forth to extend government in business. Socialized industry does not need to advertise because free choice in the marketplace is gone. The customers are captives of a state monopoly. And in countries where socialism is total, the press consists of a few official organs.

## CONGRESS RETURNS. This week the House and Senate returned from the Independence Day recess to face a long list of complex and controversial measures.

The Legislative Reorganization Act of 1946 stated that the Congress should schedule its workload so it could adjourn by July 31 of each year, except in times of rational emergency. However, the trend over the past few years has been to longer and longer sessions. So far this year only three major bills have been signed into law: the Veterans' Readjustment Act of 1966 (Cold War G.I. bill); the Tax Adjustment Act of 1966 which restored excise taxes on automobiles and telephones and increased withholding rates; and the Supplemental Foreign Assistance Authorization which supplied additional funds for Vietnam. The House has approved legislation extending minimum wage coverage but the Senate has not yet debated the bill. Extension of unemployment compensation has been passed by the House also, but the Senate is just getting ready to begin hearings.

Other major pieces of legislation still to be completed are those dealing with auto and highway safety, aid to education, housing and urban development, extension of the "poverty program," and civil rights. As of now, it appears that the Congress will be in session well into September and some say it will be October before adjournment.


**CAPTIVE NATIONS WEEK.** Seven years ago this month, President Eisenhower approved a resolution adopted unanimously by the Congress to designate a week each year as "Captive Nations Week" and proclaim this observance yearly until "such time as freedom and independence shall have been achieved for all captive nations of the world." The third week of July was set aside for this observance, July 17th-23rd.

Sadly for freedom-loving peoples everywhere, this freedom and independence have not been forthcoming. In clear violation of solemn promises, specific treaties, and international law, none of the fundamental political and human rights for which mankind has struggled through the ages have yet been restored to any of the nations subjected through Communist imperialism. The many years of tragic oppression have not dulled the spirit of these courageous people, yet they must not bear the burden alone. A united and unyielding global pressure is essential. We must continue to reiterate our support for the goals which





## Measles And The Measles Vaccine

The NUMBER ONE childhood disease today is measles... It is not a "harmless" disease... It can kill or leave lifelong aftereffects.

FOUR MILLION children get measles every year.

ONE IN SIX develop serious complications as a result of measles, including respiratory illnesses.

FIVE HUNDRED children die each year from measles encephalitis (inflammation of the brain) and measles pneumonia. Measles pneumonia is responsible for most of the infant deaths from measles.

Of the FOUR THOUSAND children who develop measles encephalitis, about SIXTEEN HUNDRED become mentally retarded.

NINE OUT OF TEN children get measles before their 12th birthday; FOUR OUT OF TEN contact it before the age of five.

MORE THAN HALF of the children who have measles suffer some form of brain involvement, as indicated by abnormal electroencephalograms taken during the course of the disease. Though the EEGs go back to normal when the children have recovered from the measles, researchers do not know what interim changes may have taken place before the return to normal.

MEASLES (known medically as rubella), is a virus infection. Sometimes called "hard" measles, it lasts from seven to fourteen days from the onset to the final peeling.

Symptoms include high fever, running nose, a skin rash of red blotches, cough, and sore throat. One of its most distinguished signs are whitish spots which appear on the insides of the cheeks.

Measles infection is spread from person to person by direct contact, and is usually spread by coughing or sneezing. The infection is contagious for about nine days—from four days before the rash appears to about five days after.

The attack rate in measles is higher than for any other infectious disease. Whenever it breaks out, measles infects seven out of ten susceptible children. The seasonal peak of measles cases is usually in late winter and early spring. In large U.S. cities, epidemics occur about every two to three years; in

rural regions where there is less contact among children, peaks are three to five years apart.

MEASLES VACCINE was first developed by Nobel Prize winner Dr. John Enders of Harvard University and an associate, Dr. Thomas Peebles. In 1954 they isolated a strain of measles virus from an 11-year-old boy, David Edmonston, in Bethesda, Maryland. From the Edmonston strain two types of measles vaccines have been developed: an attenuated live-virus vaccine and an inactive, concentrated vaccine. All of the vaccines on the market now were derived from the Edmonston strain. The first license for a measles vaccine was issued in 1963 by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration.

ATTENUATED LIVE-VIRUS VACCINE contains live viruses that have been greatly weakened. These build immunity by stimulating the production of antibodies to fight the disease germs. Live viruses can be given in a single injection; some are given by themselves and some with gamma globulin.

INACTIVE, OR KILLED VACCINE is given in a series of three injections, spaced four to six weeks apart.

Both vaccines are safe and both are effective; let your doctor make the decision about which one to use. The live-virus vaccine provides lifetime immunity; side effects are rare—sometimes a fever or a light rash. The killed vaccine produces little or no reaction. It is given generally to infants as an extra precaution. Babies have natural immunity to measles, provided by the mother, till the age of six months. The child should receive a vaccination or live-virus vaccine by age two.

been available for more than three years, only 12 million children have been vaccinated; most of them under the age of two.

ANOTHER 12 MILLION CHILDREN MUST BE VACCINATED if measles is to be eradicated. According to the U.S. Public Health Service, measles could be eliminated within two years if the children of susceptible age were vaccinated.

Ample vaccine supplies are available; all parents should make an appointment with their family doctor to have children vaccinated NOW.

The United States Public Health Service has purchased one and a half million doses for distribution through 27 Public Health Service immunization projects in state and local health departments.

## Songwriter Honored

Mayor Ralph S. Locher has proclaimed the weekend beginning Friday, July 22nd as "Ernest R. Ball Days". Teaming up to make the festivities resound are The Kiwanis Club, The Early Settlers Association, The Western Reserve Historical Society, and the Ohio Historical Society.

Who is Ernest R. Ball that such efforts be made to honor him? Born on Cleveland's East Side on July 22, 1878, he is the composer of such famous songs as "When Irish Eyes Are Smiling," "Mother Machree," "Let The Rest Of The World Go By" and many other songs that have become famous all over the world.

Judge Earl R. Hoover, of Cuyahoga Common Pleas Court, discovered Ball's birth site to be at what is now 1541 E. 30th Street. Judge Hoover interested the Ohio Historical Society, and the Kiwanis Club in joining to erect a historical marker.

The dedication ceremony will take place on Friday, July 22, 12:30 p.m., at the birth site.

Since July 22nd is also the birthday of the City of Cleveland, the Early Settlers Association will hold its traditional birthday ceremony at Public Square, 11:30 a.m. The group will then proceed to site of the Ernest Ball dedication ceremonies.
