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## Piknik podružnic SZZ

V sredo 1. septembra privredijo večinski kroški (Drill Teams) in podružnice Slovenske ženske zveze svoj prvi skupni nastop in piknik v velikem Euclid Beach parku. Popoldne se bodo razdelili prosti vozni listki na zabaviščih za odrasle in otroke. Vršile se bodo tudi razne dirke za otroke in odrasle. Zvečer, točno ob pol osmih, se bo pa razvila slikovita parada vseh večinskih kroškov, ki spadajo k SZZ, sedem po številu, ki štejejo do 150 deklet v krasnih uniformah.

Ob osmih bodo pa dekleta nastopila v skupnih vajah, kar bo nekaj prav krasnega za pogledati. Nato bo sledila plesna veselica. Igrala bo Jankovičeva godba. To bo prvič, da se bo lahko zavrtelo v tem parku po zvokih slovenskih melodij.

Ob desetih zvečer bodo dekleta zopet nastopila in takrat v lepih večernih oblekah in v posebnem nastopu, ki bo podan v počast glavni predsednici Mrs. Marie Prislend, ki bo posetila to slavnost.

## Manj na relifu

Okrajni relifni urad, Cuyahoga okraja, se je zopet znebil nadaljnjih 3.500 oseb od 1. julija. V teh je prizadetih 1.000 družin, mož, žena in otrok, katerim je bil odpovedan relif in podpora od WPA. To pomeni, da je bil odrečen relif, ali pa delo pri WPA, od aprila meseca pa do danes 13.000 družin, kar znači 43.500 posameznih oseb. Tako je ostalo na relifu v Cuyahoga okraju še 42.346 družin, ali okroglo 100.000 oseb. Pred dvema letoma je bilo v okraju na relifu 78.000 družin, ali skoro 200.000 oseb.

Toda teh 1.000 družin, ki jim je bil v zadnjem mesecu odrečen nadaljni relif, pa ne olajšuje dosti bremena relifnemu fondu, ker je vladna agencija WPA v istem času odpustila 2.000 delavcev, ki bodo sedaj padli na rame relifu. Torej iz ene rame na drugo. Tako je bil pri tem olajšan vladni sklad, ne pa mestni relifni sklad. Zadnji teden se je prijavilo za relif samo 428 oseb, kar je najnižje število od meseca maja.

Enako je župan Burton pošiljal policijo, da je nastopala proti štrajkarjem. Dalje je Burton preveč zvezan s trgovsko zbornico.

Ta liga se bo sicer udeleževala v kampanji letos, vendar McGroarty ni hotel reči, katerega kandidata bo liga podpirala. Najbrže se bo izrekla za W. G. O'Donnella, ki je neodvisni demokratski kandidat za župana. Svojo moč bo liga vrgla v smer, kjer bo delavstvu največ koristilo.

Youngstown, O. — Mary Ozimek, stara 22 let in uslužbena v tem mestu, ima silno veselje do zrakovplovov. Naučila se je istega sama voditi. Ko je včeraj letela nad mestom, se je motor nenadkrat ustavil, ko je bila še 500 čevljev v zraku. Obrnila je letalo na bližnji pašnik, in letalo se je zapirilo v zemljo, pri čemer je Mary udarila z glavo ob ogrodje in se močno poškodovala. Zdravi se v North Side bolnici.

Governor Davey je izjavil, da bo počakal z imenovanjem novega predsednika te komisije. Doda je imel ta urad Leland S. Dougan in njegov rok je potekel 16. avgusta. ## CUYAHOGA OKRAJ BO ZDAJ VRNIL LJUDEM PLAČANE KAZNI NA DAVKIH

Prvotno je Zangerle rekel, da se bo z izplačevanjem počakalo, da se vidi izid pritožb na sodnije topogledno, ki so jih nameravali vložiti razni okrajši. Toda ker se v Cuyahoga okraju ni nihče oglasil s kako tožbo, se bo začelo denar izplačevati.

V Cuyahoga okraju se bo vrnilo davkoplačevalcem kakih \$1.500.000 na plačanih kaznih. Največ tega denarja bodo dobile banke, ki so plačale kazni na davkih pri posestvih, pri katerih so iztirjale vknjižbo.

Nanking, 25. avg. Osrednja kitajska vlada je odredila obsedno stanje za vse dele dežele. Smrtna kazen je razglašena za razne prestopke vojaškega pomena, kot: izpraznitev garnizijskih točk brez povelja, umikanje iz bojne črte, izdajstvo, vstaja, nepokorščino, sabotaža in razburjenje naroda z namigavanjem in strahom.

Sangaj, 25. avg. — Ameriški rušilec Parrot je bil zajet v topniškem ognju in je moral zapustiti postojanko na Gough otoku, kjer je varoval oljno rafinerijo Great Texas Cor. v bližini ustja reke Wanpo.

Silovito prodiranje Japoncev bo najbrže postavilo kitajsko armado na defenzivo, če hočejo Kitajci vzdržati v obeh najvažnejših postojankah. Japonci

ci z vso silo obstreljujejo ustje reke Jangtse, da krijejo izkrcavanje svojih nadaljnjih čet. Na severozapadu so Japonci zavzeli mesto Kalgan in tako odrezali Kitajcem pot iz Mongolije. Japonci so tudi zagostili kitajsko armado med Kalganom in Nankovom.

V Sangaju je več kot 2.000.000 ljudi zapustilo svoja domovja, da se umaknejo iz bojne črte. Kakih 1500 ameriških državljank je pobegnulo na ameriške ladje, ki jih bodo odpeljale domov.

Vojni strokovnjaki trdijo, da so boji za Sangaj le stranskega pomena, ampak da se bodo vršile glavne in vroče bitke na severu. Trdi se, da Kitajci ne razvijajo vseh svojih sil, ampak samo ustavljajo Japonce, da se ti izčrpajo.

Councilman McFarland je vložil v mestni zbornici predlog, da najame mesto 300 dodatnih stražnikov. Sedanja mestna ordinanca jih zahteva 1.200, a jih je 75 manj. Po številu mestnega prebivalstva ima Cleveland manj policajev, kot kako drugo mesto enakega obsega. Pomanjkanje mestnih financ je krivo, da Cleveland nima dovolj števila stražnikov, ki bi bilo za tako mesto potrebno.

800 unijskih pekov v Clevelandu je doseglo zvišane plače pri sedmih večjih pekarijah. Dobili so zvišane plače od 3 do 5 centov na uro in enotedenske počitnice s plačo.

## Železničarji zahtevajo 20% zvišano plačo

Alexander F. Whitney, predsednik unije železničarjev, je sinoči izjavil, da se pet železničarskih unij poteguje za 20 odstotno zvišanje plač. Tozadevno se sedaj vrše pogajanja v Chicagu med unijami in železniškimi uradniki.

Iz Chicaga je prišlo prvotno poročilo, da se bodo železničarji zadovoljili s 5 do 8 odstotkov zvišanjem plač, toda železničarji ne sprejmejo manj kot 20 odstotno zvišanje. Železniške družbe tožijo o revščini in izgubi pri obratovanju, toda unije pravijo, da bodo dokazale javnosti, da so železniške družbe izkoriščale svoje delavce zadnjih 40 let.

"Ako železniške družbe ne morejo plačati dostojne plače svojim delavcem, bomo vprašali vlado, da prevzame železnice v svoje področje," je izjavil Whitney. Vladni delavski oddelek je nedavno dokazal, da so delavci v tej deželi do 40 do 70 odstotkov prenižko plačani, to je, da ne zaslužijo niti minimalne plače, ki bi jim šla za preživljanje.

## Maple Heights dobi nižjo obrestno mero

Mestna vlada v bližnjem mestu Maple Heights, O. namerava odpoklicati vse sedanje zadolžnice, v vsoti \$3.000.000, na katere mora plačevati po 5 1/2 in 6% obresti, ter izdati nove, na katere bo mesto plačevalo samo 1 odstotek obresti. Mesto je eno leto in pol zaostalo z obrestmi. Z manjšimi obrestmi upa mesto plačati vse zaostale obveznosti.
