NOVA UPRAVA V TABORISČU SPITAL. — Ker odhajajo UNRRA, so odredili v taborišču Spital volitve, da si begunci izvolijo za notranjo upravo svoj odbor. Pri volitvah je na Slovence padlo pet mest in so izvoljeni Dr. Meršolj, dr. Šinkovec, dr. Vračko, Kolman in Vrtačnik. Druge narodnosti imajo štiri odbornike: Baltijci 2, Srbi in Hrvatje po enega. Tako bo predsednik uprave Slovenec. S tem seveda ni rečeno, da bodo imeli begunci več hrane ali več dela ter zasluga. Vse to bo odvisno od drugih faktorjev.

NOVOMASNIK B E R NARD SLOVSA. — Imenovan novomasnik je cistercijskega reda in je imel novo mašo v Stamsu na Tirolskem med svojimi redovnimi brati že 4. aprila letos. Prišel pa je med begunce ponovno novomasniško slovesnost 11. aprila, ker spada tudi on med begunce. Alojz Slovša je bil rojen 1919 v Butanjevi nad Vrhniko, v župniji šent Jošt. Po končani gimnaziji v Ljubljani je stopil leta 1942 k cistercijscem v Stično. Leta 1945 je defil usodo beguncev in potem nadaljeval študije z drugimi slovenskimi bogoslovci. Med vojsko je izgu-

bil tri brate; dva so ubili komunisti, eden pa je umrl v nacističnem taborišču Buchenwald. Vsi trije so padli kot žrtev zvestobe Bogu in domovini.

Federacija ženskih klubov je za naselitev beguncev v Ameriki

New York. — V hotelu Commodore se je vršila konvencija 56 let stare ženske organizacije, Generalne Federacije ženskih klubov v Ameriki. Delegacija je zadnjo sredo odglasovala, da se ne podpre predlog poslanca Strattona, ki predlaga naselitev 400.000 beguncev v Ameriki in sicer v štirih letih po \$100.000.

V petek, zadnji dan konvencije, je prišlo pa vprašanje ponovno pred zbornico in tedaj je zbornica soglasno sprejela resolucijo, da se predlog poslanca Strattona na celi črti podpre.

Dalje je konvencija sprejela resolucije, da se odobri splošna vojaška treninga ameriške mladine, da se odobri predlog državnega tajnika Marshalla za obnovo Evrope ter da se pomaga družinam, ki so v stiski zaradi stanovanj.

Ta federacija šteje 3.500.000 članic po vseh ameriških državah.

Na konvenciji je govorila tudi Mrs. Eleanor Roosevelt, ki je toplo priporočala konvenciji, naj podpre predlog za naselitev beguncev v Ameriki.

Republikanci v senatu se bodo zavzeli za begunce

Ohijski senator Bricker je za to, da se jih naseli 400.000

Washington. — Akeija, da se dovoli 400.000 beguncem naseliti v Ameriki, je dobila simpatije tudi v senatu. Skupina republikanskih senatorjev, med temi tudi ohijski senator John W. Bricker, bodo predložili zbornici predlog, da se dopusti tisoče beguncev v Zed. države izven predpisane naselniške kvote.

Predlog bo vložil senator Ferguson iz Michigana. Na predlogu bosta tudi imena senatorjev: John Bricker iz Ohio in Joseph Ball iz Minnesote.

Senator Bricker je izjavil, da bo on z vso močjo podprl predlog za naselitev beguncev v tej deželi, da se s tem da novo življenje tisočim osebam, ki bi bile drugače prisiljene vrniti se pod komunistični teror.

"Mnogi izmed nas v Ameriki izhajamo iz družin, ki so bile preganjane v Evropi," je izjavil Mr. Bricker. "Moja družina je prišla sem iz istega vzroka leta 1710."

Predlog v kongresu za naselitev beguncev ni bil posebno prijazen sprejet, čeprav ga je sam predsednik Truman toplo priporočil. Enako so ga priporočili državni, justični in vojni oddelki. Zdaj, ko so se potegnili za sprejem tega predloga republikanci, je upanje, da bo sprejet še v tem zasedanju.

Poslanska zbornica je zopet pripravljena za sekanje davkov

Washington. — Vodja poslanske zbornice, Joseph Martin, je povedal, da je zbornica zopet take volje, da bi glasovala za znižanje dohodninskih davkov. Toda poslanska zbornica ne bi ničesar naredila, dokler ne pride beseda iz senata, da hoče tak predlog imeti. Zdaj je torej vse odvisno od republikancev v senatu, če hočejo znižati davke ali ne.

Toda iz senata se sliši, da tam ne bodo podvzeli nobene akcije, dokler voditelji ne bodo imeli zagotovljene dvetrjetinske večine tako, da bi lahko preglasovali predsednikov veto, če bi ta zopet ne hotel predloga podpisati. V poslanski zbornici je dvetrjetinska večina zagotovljena, je rekel Martin.

Predlog bi bil prav tak, kot je bil prejšnji, samo s to razliko, da bi prišli manjši davki v poštah od 1. jan. 1948, dočim bi bili po prejšnjem predlogu 1. julija 1947.

Jugoslovanski delegat pravi, da Amerika grozi Balkanu

New York. — Jugoslovanski delegat pri koncilu Zveze narodov, dr. Jože Vilfan, je ostro napadel Zed. države, češ, da odprto grozijo balkanskim državam. To je bil odgovor jugoslovanskega delegata ameriškem delegatu, ki je v ostrem govoru napadel Jugoslavijo, da podpira grške gerilce in s tem ogroža mir na Balkanu.

Vilfanov govor je tudi napadel poročilo ameriškega delegata v preiskovalni komisiji na Balkanu, ki se je na licu mesta prepričala o vzrokih nemirov na severni grški meji in obtožila Jugoslavijo, Bolgarijo in Albanijo, da podpirajo grške upornike.

Kot se sliši, ameriška delegacija dr. Vilfanu ne bo odgovorila, ker je že povedala svoje mnenje o Jugoslaviji.

Avtna zveza pravi, da ni treba imeti skrbni zaradi gazolina

Ameriška avtomobilska zveza tolaži motoriste, naj si ne delajo skrbni zaradi pomanjkanja gazolina. Naj radi tega nihče ne opusti nameravanih počitnic. Ta zveza je preiskala položaj gazolina po vsej deželi in pronašla, da so poročila o pomanjkanju gazolina mnogo pretirana. Pač bo v nekaterih državah, zlasti v osrednjih, pomanjkanje gazolina enkrat v avgustu ali septembru, toda to ne bo trajalo dolgo.

Na noben način pa ne bo prišlo do racioniranja gazolina nikjer. Pomanjkanje bo samo v tem, da ga bodo ponekod dobile gazolinke postaje manj, ki ga bodo potem dajale svojim odjemalcem manj, ali pa samo stalnim odjemalcem.

Eden vzrokov, da primanjkuje gazolina je tudi ta, ker se ga porabi zdaj mnogo več kot tekom vojne. V Ameriki ga bomo letos porabili najmanj 2 milijona sodov.

Washington. — Prošlo leto je bilo v Zed. državah 2.300.000 porok, kar je rekord vseh časov. Lansko leto je pa tudi bilo 620.000 razporok, kar je tudi rekord vseh časov.

PARIZ. — Konferenca zunanjih ministrov Anglije, Francije in Rusije se je včeraj zaključila brez vsakega uspeha. Ruski minister Molotov je rekel, da bi pomoč Evropi iz Amerike razdelila Evropo na dva dela, zato da je on proti načrtu ameriškega državnega tajnika. Bevin in Bidault sta izjavila, da bosta šla z načrtom naprej brez Rusije in povabila vse dežele, ki hočejo sodelovati.

Vancouver, Kanada. — Kanadčan George Okulitch, ki je bil v Rusiji s kanadskim poslanstvom, se je tam oženil z Rusinjo. Toda ko je odhajal iz Rusije, sovjetska vlada ženi ni pustila oditi iz dežele.

Okulitch pripoveduje, da je sovjetski pomožni zunanji minister Višinski izjavil, da ženske vse preveč rade govorijo in jih ni poslali iz dežele. "Dolžnost ruskih žena je pa itak roditi otroke za Sovjetsko unijo in ne za kanadsko vlado," je rekel Višinski.

Od maja 1946 se je zvišala povprečna mezda ameriškega delavca za 15 odstotkov, toda v istem času so se dvignile cene za odjemalce za 18%.

Delavci zdaj več zaslužijo, čeprav delajo na teden manj ur kot v vojnem času. Toda cene, ki so prevladoval v času vojne, so se zvišale do danes že za 22 odstotkov, toda višja mezda delavcu ne pomaga nazaj nič.

S prvo nedeljo v septembru (ako ne nastanejo kakšne nepričakovane ovire pri gradnji nove radio postaje v Milwaukee, ki bo nosila inicijalke WEXT in bo operirala na 1430 kilocikliah) bo naš milwaški slovenski radio progra moddajan zopet celo uro, in sicer od 11. do 12. ure dopoldne vsako nedeljo po centralnem času. Vodstvo nove postaje je povabilo vse tujejezične radio programe, ki se oddajajo sedaj preko racinske WRJN postaje, da se poslužijo te nove postaje, ki bo štirikrat močnejša (1000 watov) kot sedanja, in ker je WRJN že itak zadnji dve leti bila stalno v zadržki za čas, tako da je morala omejiti veliko tujejezičnih programov na samo pol ure (z izjemo slovenskega, ki je imel edini na razpolago ¼ ure), je večina direktorjev teh programov sprejela ponudbo nove postaje, kjer bo z omejenim datumom vsak program imel na razpolago celo uro časa. Načrt nove postaje je posvetiti vsako nedeljo cel dan izključno narodnostnim programom in ga imenovati "Dan narodnostnih programov" — "Nationality Day Programs." Nova postaja, ki bo šesta v Milwaukee, se bo nahajala pri Jackson parku na južni strani mesta na približno 4 akre obsehnem zemljišču ob Cleveland in So. 43rd St. Stavba z uradi in oddajnimi studiji bo stala nad \$75.000 in bo zgrajena v modernem stilu. Takoj poleg bo zgrajen tudi transmitter. Gradnja postaje je že v teku. Lastniki nove postaje so skupina vodilnih milwaških trgovcev in profesionalcev, ki so poverili vodstvo nove postaje Mr. Albert F. Gale-u, prejšnjemu pomožnemu direktorju programov WISN postaje.

Približno 300 nas je bilo v skupini, ki smo se skupaj izkrcali v Odesi. Bili smo lepo sprejeti. Po prisrčnem uradnem pozdravu smo vsi prejeli živilske pakete in precej nove obleke. Vsakogar so odpravili na drža-vne stroške, kamor je želel. Od-potovali smo v domače vasi in mesta. Po enomesečnem odpo-čitku je vsakdo dobil primerno zaposlitev. Največji protikomu-nisti med nami so začeli vero-ovati v boljševiški raj. V pol leta so bili časi emigracije pozablje-ni. Niso pa na to pozabili rdeči oblastniki. Vsa objokana prileti k meni žena prijatelja, s katerim sva skupaj bežala in se skupaj vrnili. Lani 17. oktobra je umrl v
Parizu škof Pij Evgenij Ne-
veu, bivši apostolski admini-
strator Mogileva, ki je imel
svoj sedež v Moskvi. Ko so za
njegovo dušo opravili mašo za-
dušnico v ruski cerkvi sv. An-
tona na Eskvilinu v Rimu, je
sv. opravilo imel bivši pravo-
slavni škof Pavel Meletjev, ki
je pred nedolгим časom pre-
stopil v katoliško Cerkev. Ob-
redu so prisostvovali tudi kar-
dinali Tisserant, tajnik sv. Vz-
hodne kongregacije, škof Va-
lerio Valeri, bivši nuncij v Pa-
rizu, in Boleslav Slokanj, škof
iz Minska, ki je imel govor v
ruščini.

Rajni škof Neveu je bil od
l. 1921. duhovnik francoske
cerkve sv. Ludovika v Moskvi.
Kot tak je imel na pol diplo-
matski značaj in je mogel več
let brez preganjanja delovati
med verniki vseh narodnosti.

L. 1926. je škof D'Herbigny
prepotoval vso Rusijo, ne da
bi kdo v njem spoznal katoli-
škega škofa. Ob tej priliki je
po naročilu Pija XI, ki je ho-
tel v Rusiji ohraniti katoliško
hierarhijo, v največji tajnosti
posvetil štiri škofo, od katerih
živi še danes samo škof Boles-
lav Slokanj. Med temi štiri-
mi je bil tudi škof Neveu. Nje-
govo dostojanstvo pa ni moglo
ostati dolgo časa neznano taj-
ni sovjetski informativni služ-
bi. Stalno je živel v poslopju
francoskega poslanstva in je
moral biti v občevarju z Rusi
zelo previden, ker so bili vsi,
ki so prišli z njim v stik, pod
policijskim nadzorom. A
kljub temu se mu je posrečilo,
da je vzdrževal z nekaterimi
ločnimi duhovniki in celo s
škofom Bartolomejem, članom
sv. Sinoda, katerega je sprejel
v katoliško Cerkev.

Zdravje se mu je l. 1936. ta-
ko poslabšalo, da je moral od-
iti v Francijo, kjer so ga ope-
rirali. Toda posled sovjetske
oblasti edinemu katoliškemu
škofu v Rusiji, ki je bil še na
svobodi (ostale je namreč P.
P. U. kmalu zaprla), niso več
dovolile povratka v Rusijo.
Zadnjih deset let je preživel
v Parizu, kjer je veliko storil
s peresom za zedinjenje pravo-
slavcev s katoliško Cerkvjo,
in kjer je končno tudi umrl.

Admiral d'Argenlieu, who became a Carmelite in 1932, left the Order to resume his naval career at the outbreak of the war. Captured by the Germans in 1940 in Cherbourg, he escaped to London where he joined General Charles de Gaulle.

He was head of the French naval forces in Britain and later went to the French delegation to the United Nations.

"Dead-Arm" Hurler Gets Perfect Game

Kansas City, Mo., June 27 — Carl DeRose of the Kansas City Blues, a "dead-armed" pitcher, who may never hurl another ball, turned in the first perfect game in American Association history last night, when he defeated the Minneapolis Millers, 5 to 0, permitting no batter to reach first base.

The pain in his arm was so intense that from the third inning on tears streamed down his face as he threw the ball. He will go to a surgeon soon for an operation.

Boise, Ida. — John Bringman paid with a smile a \$10 fine for speeding. He was arrested for driving his 1914 Peerless—the oldest car on Boise's streets—at 40 miles an hour in a 30-mile zone. "Didn't think the old girl had it in her," he said.

Cleveland, Ohio Thursday, July 3, 1947

New York. — There will be a shortage of fresh eggs this winter. Poultry producers report that the farmers are buying 10% less of chicks than last season, so that sums up to less eggs this winter.

Moscow. — The fields near Moscow are being worked 24 hours a day because at the present time, the nights are short and rather light.

New York. — Mrs. Jones celebrated her 100th birthday by going for her first plane ride. She was born on a farm, not far from the New York airport, where she boarded the plane.

Berlin. — A report from Mecklenburg, located in the Russian zone, unveiled a mass grave containing up to 6,000 victims, which were killed in the last few weeks of war by the Nazis. They were mostly women brought in from Poland, France, Norway and Holland.

Canby, Ore. — Mrs. W. J. Olson's auto stopped on the railroad tracks. Feeling a train coming, she grabbed up her groceries, jumped from the car and — fainted. The woman and the groceries were saved but the auto is for the scrap heap.

Tokyo. — Gen. MacArthur has designated July 4th as the day on which he will review the troops under his command. This is the first such review since he came to Japan.

In greater Cleveland, most firms will give vacations to all their employees at once during this week and next week, because they have found it to be the best system.

Frankfurt. — The Army has now decided that besides immediate relatives, our soldiers in Germany will be allowed to have cousins and in-laws and such to visit them and will be allowed to stay with them 15 days.

Frankfurt. — The American Army has forbidden the sending of cigarettes to the soldiers in Austria and France, beginning with July 1.

The Army authorities hope to kill the black market with this order.

Chicago. — Corn sells today for over \$2 a bushel. In 1939 it was 40¢ a bushel. The general opinion was that it could not stay very long at such a high price.

Washington. — Government figures show that John L. Lewis has accumulated for his United Mine Workers one of the biggest union health and welfare funds in the country in the shortest time on record. At a levy of 5 cents a ton on soft coal, it grew from nothing to \$21,781,807 from June 1, 1945 to May 1, 1947.

Washington. — The Distilled Spirits Institute reports that Americans drank 30% less whisky, gin, rum and brandy during the first 4 months of this year than last year. This was attributed principally to "consumer resistance to prices which have not been substantially reduced since the war."

Berlin. — German prisoners of war held in the Soviet Union will be released, with 100,000 scheduled in 44 months. In March, 900,000 German prisoners of war were held in Russia.

New York. — Passengers from Chicago and Cleveland landing at La Guardia Field last week on Tuesday, were unaware that their plane had been struck by lightning a few minutes earlier. The pilot, Capt. R. E. Lee brought the ship in to a perfect landing after informing the control tower of the accident. Fire and crash crews stood by as the plane landed.

Washington. — Representative John Leininski, Democrat of Michigan, who was a bitter and scrappy opponent of the Taft-Hartley law.

Italy. — Pedro IV, king of the Portuguese Congo, arrived on June 29 with 700 pilgrims en route to Vatican City, with a gift of two elephant tusks for Pope Pius XII. The 75-year-old Negro monarch was the first of his family, which dates from the Pharaohs, to see the Pope.

Americanism vs. Communism

Americanism generates initiative — Communism destroys initiative. The wages of Americanism is an abundant life — the wages of Communism are a barely supportable life. The Russian worker earns 25c an hour, while his American counterpart, in 1946, made \$1. Yet Soviet prices are skyhigh. A wrist watch costs more than \$400, a cotton shirt more than \$80.

It takes ten minutes for the average American worker to earn the bottle of beer he quaffs at the end of a hard day; the Russian worker must toil 8 hours for his brew. Few American workers like to get up in the morning, but they are willing to work three or four hours to purchase an alarm clock. A Russian, who might easily be imprisoned if he oversteals, sweats 20 eight-hour days to buy his clock. He earns an equal length of time for galoshes which the American earns in three hours.

Brushing one's teeth is a luxury in the USSR; it requires four hours' work to earn the price of a toothbrush. And no wonder the Russians have cold feet about agreeing with anyone: 24 hours of labor go for a pair of cotton stockings. The Soviet peasant is even worse off for gloves; woolen ones represent 100 hours of toil.

This, of course, is only the wage side of the picture. Initiative is crushed under the Russian Communist system. You have no right to change your job to better your living or other conditions. You take it, and like it — or else.

New York, June 27 — Brown-skinned Billy Fox of Philadelphia, spoiled Artie Levine's light-heavyweight debut by scoring a technical knockout over the fair-skinned New Yorker at 1:32 of the third of a scheduled 10-rounder in Madison Square Garden before 7,822 who contributed to a \$26,902 gate.

Levine, previously a middle-weight, was floored for a count of nine by a left hook in the third round. When Artie rose, the Philadelphia Negro knockout specialist smashed him with seven terrific hooks to the head — hooks that rocked him from side to side and almost sent him down again. Levine, bleeding from his right brow and from his mouth, was so helpless that Referee Ruby Goldstein stepped in, hit his arm around Fox and stopped the bout.

Recall Doyle Tragedy

Referee Goldstein used good judgment in stopping the bout when he did and the fans were pleased at his action, for most of them remembered the Cleveland tragedy this week in which welterweight challenger Jimmy Doyle died from injuries suffered in his title fight with Champion Ray (Sugar) Robinson. It was Levine who gave Doyle his first concussion when he knocked out Doyle at Cleveland in March, 1946.

Sugar Offers to Box Benefit Bout

Ray (Sugar) Robinson, whose welterweight championship bout at the Arena Tuesday resulted in a fatal accident to Challenger Jimmy Doyle, wants to appear in a benefit bout for the Los Angeles boxer's parents, it was revealed here yesterday.

The welterweight champion discussed the possibilities of such a bout with Paul Doyle, Jimmy's manager, and Louis Munalo, longtime friend of the dead fighter who was here for the Arena show. The fight would be held in Los Angeles, it was said, with Robinson donating his purse.

Noč je bila oblačna in kaj temna: komaj je lovil stezo, ki



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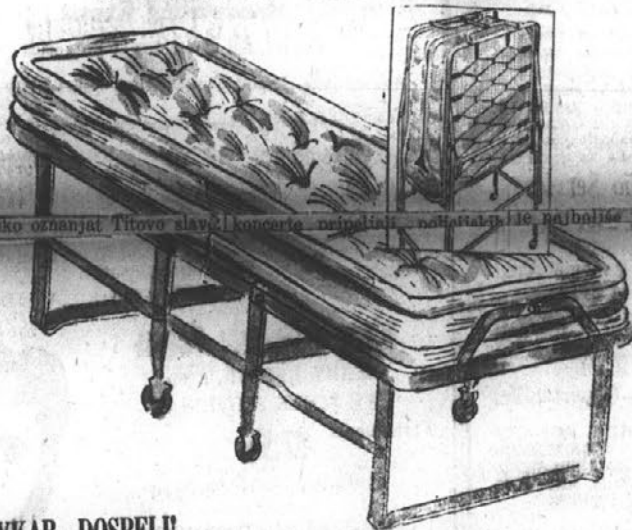
