As I was driving down the North Marginal by E. 55 Street, Cleveland, I glanced toward the many buildings erected over the past 45 years in this area once referred to and known as "Kurja Vas." In English this translation from Slovenian is "Chicken Village," so named because the then mainly Slovenian immigrants and their children raised chickens in their backyards there.

Kurja Vas was a homey and family oriented area in Cleveland in the 1900s. Its existence, however, was extinguished due to the massive and severe fire explosion of the East Ohio Gas Company gas storage facilities close by.

This occurrence in 1944 has been labeled as one of the worst fire incidents to afflict Cleveland during the past 100 years. Many lives were lost, whole homes and businesses were destroyed. Families were devastated by loss of loved ones.

These thoughts were running through my mind as I was rethinking the meeting held tonight, Thursday, March 2 with area citizens and Mayor Voinovich and his staff at the Plumbers Building off E. 30th and Payne Avenue.

The reason for the meeting was to discuss with the mayor and his staff the plan to consolidate several safety and service facilities into the old Warner & Swasey building located on East 55th Street and Carnegie Avenue. Part of this plan includes removing the Third District Police Station currently located on East 21st Street, to the new location which is in the Fifth Police District. This removal from a residential to an industrial artery was the main issue.

Other issues raised were removal of three Fire Stations over the past decade in the same community, deterioration of physical structures, tax abatement, and loss in the future of more neighborhood institutions.

Councilman Gus Frangos (D-13) was the first speaker and outlined the concerns of ward constituents from the Tremont, Downtown, Sterling-Payne, St. Clair, and Broadway area neighborhoods.

Mayor Voinovich was the second speaker and presented the Administration's position.

Approximately 20 minutes were then provided for the Administration to present a slide program explaining the Administration's reasons behind the consolidation plan. Total

estimated cost is in the range of \$43 to \$49 million dollars, excluding interest payment. The financing is proposed via a bond issue.

The final step in this meeting was to allow for questions to be answered by attendees.

Excluding a few immature adults, the townhall meeting with the mayor, his staff, and area residents went rather well. The outcome, however, is still to be decided.

On the question of physical removal of the Third District Police Station, the real issue is whether or not the physical visibility of such a public institution should be within the residential or business area. Both the mayor and residents agree the cost difference of \$2

to \$3 million dollars is what it would additionally cost to have the district station stay in the Sterling-Payne area.

On the issue of a fire station in the St. Clair area the Mayor is adamant in **not** building any fire station, despite agreeing in July, 1983 before a community group gathering to demolish the old fire station, purchase additional land, and build a new mini-fire station in the same area off E. 55th Street and St. Clair Avenue.

Six years have passed since that remark with only an old burned-out fire station still standing on the same location off E. 55th Street. Mayor Voinovich stated at the March 2 meeting that it would be "fiscally irresponsible" to spend \$2 to \$3 million dollars for a new mini-fire station at the E. 55th Street and St. Clair Avenue site. The pump truck that did reside at this location was moved to the E. 74th Street and Superior Avenue site, but since then, has been moved to another location.

The recent Warehouse District fire underscores the need of a mini-fire station in the St. Clair area as no fire protection existed when the Warehouse fire occurred.

That is the shame of St. Clair Avenue. Where basic public institutions do not exist to provide those needed safety services that maintain residents, attract businesses, and attempt to increase the quality of life for all persons.

The real question any administration or person must answer, regarding basic safety services, is what is the cost of a human life. One dollar? One million dollars?

Anyone who has experienced personal tragedy will state, "You cannot place a price tag on the value of a human life where safety is the main issue."

The many wooden frame houses, retail buildings, and other structures in the St. Clair area range in age from 20 to over 100 years old. The majority are, however, quite old.

The need does exist in the St. Clair area for a mini-fire station as much as the need exists for a police station in the Sterling-Payne area.

The hopes and future of the St. Clair and Sterling-Payne area rests on the shoulders of our elected officials.

We can only pray that the devastation that once wiped out Kurja Vas is not repeated in our neighborhood because of the lack of safety equipment in our immediate area due to the city's tightfisted fiscal policy.

Alcohol Not As Fatty as First Thought

Stanford University has come up with a surprising result in a study of 155 middle-aged overweight males. It found that the average man took in over 2,500 calories a day — 40 percent fat, 38 percent carbohydrates, 16 percent protein and 6 percent alcohol.

When they compared drinkers and non-drinkers, both groups were found to be eating the same number of food calories, but, though the drinkers were consuming as many as 4,000 extra calories a week in booze, their weights and percent body fat were no greater than the non-drinkers.

Where did the 4,000 extra calories go?

No one knows for sure. One explanation: they interfered with the absorption of calories from other sources. In any case, the researchers, reporting in the *Journal of the American College of Nutrition*, concluded that "alcohol consumption may not be as fattening as traditionally believed."

More Yugo grief — maker plans termination

Newark, N.J. — The Yugoslavian manufacturer of the Yugo subcompact car has notified Global Motors it intends to terminate its distribution agreement with Global's Yugo America unit.

But until Global's bankruptcy proceedings are concluded, Yugo maker Zavodi Crvena Zastava is assembling an interim management team to run the distributor firm through Impex Car Corp., its agent in the United States, a Zastava spokesman said.

Meanwhile, it was revealed in a U.S. Bankruptcy Court hearing recently that Norauto, an Ohio-based liquidator, essentially paid \$1,500 each for the 5,000 Yugos it purchased from Global. Global's Yugo American subsidiary paid Zastava \$2,100 for cars, which were sold to dealers for \$3,500.

Norauto was seeking the court's permission to sell the vehicles, but Judge Vincent J. Commisa left in place a temporary restraining order putting the sale and other Global financial dealings, including Zastava's termination notice, on hold.

Zastava has agreed to back the car's warranty and Yugo America's obligations to

Lecture on New Thoughts on Galaxies

Galaxies fall into two main types: spiral and elliptical. Our galaxy, the Milky Way, contains large amounts of diffuse gas which forms new stars. Ellipticals have generally been thought to contain no gases and lack the ability to form new stars.

Doctor Jill Knapp of Princeton University has developed some new theories on elliptical galaxies. She will share these in a free lecture entitled, "Elliptical Galaxies: Have They Really Run Out of Gas?" The lecture takes place at the Cleveland Museum of Natural History, Wade Oval in University Circle, at 8 p.m. on March 16.

Dr. Knapp's theories are based on recent radio and infrared wavelength observations. These have shown that elliptical galaxies such as a bright one in the constellation of Centaurus called NGC 5128 do contain gas and dust and that star formation is taking place.

Together with new data from very sensitive optical detectors and the expected wealth of observations from the space telescope to be placed in orbit next year, these observations are beginning to show that the epoch of star formation in galaxies of all types is more recent than current theories hold.

After the lecture, if weather permits, the Museum's 10 1/2 inch telescope will be available for use.

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Be Vigilant

Editor:

Now that Congress has negated a 51% pay raise for itself and other federal employees, we should remember two lessons from this episode. First we must be ever vigilant and informed about what our Congressmen do — not what they say they do — to ensure sound, limited government.

Second, the laws for implementing such hikes must change.

Currently the procedure for increasing pay begins with the naming of a commission to review and recommend salary adjustments of federal employees. The commission's report goes to the president, who approves, disapproves, or alters the figures. His plan is then submitted to Congress, where it becomes law unless both houses reject it.

Representative Tom Tauke of Iowa has introduced HR 401 into the House of Representatives to repair this system. His bill would require that appropriations for Congressional pay increases be considered separately from other appropriations; it would mandate a roll call vote in each chamber on any future Congressional pay raise; and it would postpone any adjustment until after the next scheduled election.

These much-needed amendments will hold our elected officials accountable in effecting salary hikes. Congress, however will only adopt HR 401 under pressure from the people, the same pressure which killed their latest raise.

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RECIPES

WALNUT VEGETABLE MEDLEY

Microwavable

1 lb. carrots, cut into 1 1/2" sticks

1 can Campbell's cream of celery soup

1/2 cup milk

1 tsp. dried basil

3 cups broccoli flowerets

Toasted chopped walnuts

1. In covered skillet, in 1/2" boiling salted water, cook carrots 5 min. or until tender crisp. Drain.

2. Stir in soup, milk and basil until smooth. Add broccoli. Heat to boiling. Reduce heat to low. Cover, simmer 10 min. or until vegetables are tender, stirring often. Top with walnuts. Makes 6 cups. May be doubles.

Microwave:

1. In 3-qt. microwave-safe casserole, place carrots in 1/2" salted water. Cover, microwave on High 10 min. or until tender crisp, stirring once during cooking. Drain.

2. Stir in soup, milk and basil until smooth. Add broccoli. Cover, microwave on High 5 min. or until vegetables are tender, stirring once during cooking. Let stand 5 min. Top with walnuts.

MUSHROOM PIE

1 cup shortening

2 cups flour

1/4 cup rich milk

1 1/2 lbs. fresh mushrooms

2 tablespoons butter

1 tablespoon chopped chives

1 tablespoon chopped parsley

1 tablespoon lemon juice

1/2 cup cream

1 tablespoon paprika

Cut the shortening into the flour and moisten with the milk. Line a deep pie dish (or

individual dishes that are bake proof and good looking enough to be brought to the table) with it. Wash and peel the mushrooms, leaving short stems.

Slice thickly and saute in the butter, chives and parsley. When tender add the lemon juice and simmer for 5 minutes.

Add the cream and paprika. Pour in the pie dish and cover top with twisted strips of pastry laid in a lattice. Crimp the edges and bake in a hot oven (450 degrees F.) about 30 minutes or until golden.

EGG AND VEGETABLE LOAF

2 cups cooked egg noodles

1 cup cooked mixed vegetables (left-overs may be used)

Salt and pepper to taste

3 egg whites, beaten stiff

1/2 cup bread crumbs

3 egg yolks

1 cup milk

1 small onion, cut fine

Combine noodles, vegetables, onion and bread crumbs. In top of double boiler heat milk and add beaten egg yolks; cook until creamy, and then combine with the noodle mixture.

Fold in the stiffly beaten egg whites. Bake in a well-greased loaf pan about 30 minutes at 350 degrees; loaf should be firm.

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
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4 Rev. Tomtz known for story-telling

Rev. Louis Tomtz was born June 18, 1903 in Nova Vas, in the parish of Bloke, Notranjska, Slovenia. His parents were Jernej Tomc and Doroteja Turk. He was one of eight children. His brothers and sisters were Magdalena, Jozef, Ursula Skrbina, Janez, France, Stane, and Jernej.

Fr. Louis attended primary school in Bloke. He joined the Society of Don Bosco (Salesians) in 1920 and was sent to Krakow, Poland for his novitiate and philosophy.

He returned to Slovenia to teach for a short time, then continued his seminary training at the Pontificate College of St. Gregory in Rome, where he received a doctorate in Theology.

Fr. Louis was ordained in Rome on July 27, 1930. Again returning to Slovenia, he continued in pastoral and educational work. At the end of the Second World War and the Communist Revolution in Slovenia, Fr. Louis found it necessary to leave his native country and flee to Italy. From there he did pastoral work in San Juan, Puerto Rico, Los Gatos, California, and on August 7, 1960, he arrived in Hamilton, Ontario where he worked diligently with the Slovenian community and founded the Slovenian

parish of St. Gregory the Great.

In 1971, he retired from the pastorate and came to Cleveland to be closer to his family. He was in residence at St. Lawrence Parish in Cleveland for a short time before moving into the Collinwood area. While in Collinwood, Fr. Tomtz offered his talent and priestly ministry to St. Mary's Parish on Holmes Ave. where he remained active until being diagnosed with cancer seven months ago.

Fr. Louis Tomtz died in the home of his nephew, Joseph, on Saturday evening, March 4. Besides his nephew Fr. Louis leaves his sister-in-law Anna Tomc, and nephews Ivan and Adolf, along with their families in Cleveland. In Slovenia he leaves his nephews Rev. Ciril Tomc and Lojze and niece Dorotheja, and other relatives.

Fr. Louis Tomtz had a profound knowledge of languages and was known for his wit, story-telling, and great love of nature. He was keenly aware of the needs of immigrants in establishing new lives for themselves in both the United States and Canada and dedicated his priestly ministry to their spiritual and cultural welfare.



— PREGLED NAJVAŽNEJŠIH DOGODKOV —

Več sto albanskih rudarjev zopet štrajk na Kosovem, tokrat zoper aretacijo nekega albanskega kosovskega politika

BEOGRAD, SFRJ — Današnji Wall Street Journal na kratko poroča o novem štrajku rudarjev na Kosovem. Rudarji štrajkajo kljub grožnjem oblasti, da so taki štrajki v izrednem stanju, ki so ga v pokrajini proglašale, nedopustni. Rudarji protestirajo zoper aretacijo Azema Vllasija, bivšega voditelja kosovske komunistične partije. Aretirana sta tudi Aziz Abrasi in Burhan Kavaja, ki sta imela visoko funkcijo v rudniku na Kosovem, v katerem so bili več kot teden dni štrajkali albanski rudarji. Dalje so oblasti priprle še Ekrema Arifija, člana centralnega komiteja kosovske partije, in Ibra Osmanija, vodjo kosovskega urada za informacijo.

Najbolj razburajo Albance na Kosovem ta čas predlagane spremembe srbske ustave. Te spremembe bi znatno omejile kosovsko avtonomijo, več neposredne kontrole nad pokrajino pa dale srbski republik. Kosovska skupščina bo o teh spremembah razpravljala začenši s 15. marcem. Spremembe ne morejo postati veljavne brez privolitve kosovske pokrajinske skupščine. Jugoslovanska sredstva obveščanja zadnje dni poudarjajo, da se razmere na Kosovu po uvedbi izrednega stanja oziroma ukrepov »normalizirajo«.

Zvezni senat zavrnil Towerja — Izid glasovanja: 53 proti potrditvi, 47 za — Bush razmišlja o novem kandidatu za mesto obrambnega sekretarja v njegovi vladi

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Včeraj je zvezni senat po dolgi in zelo mučni razpravi končno glasovalo o potrditvi bivšega senatorja, 63-letnega Johna Towerja, za obrambnega sekretarja Združenih držav. Devetič v 200-letni zgodovini zveznega kongresa se je zgodilo, da je senat zavrnil kandidata, ki ga je bil za člana svoje vlade imenoval predsednik ZDA. Glasovalo proti Towerju je 53 senatorjev, od teh ena republikanka, sen. Nancy Kassebaum. Za Towerja je glasovalo 47 senatorjev, med njimi so bili samo trije demokrati in še ti so čakali, dokler jim ni bilo jasno, da njih glasove ne bodo prinesli zmage Towerju.

Towerjeva kandidatura je propadla predvsem zaradi trditev o njegovi vdaniosti pijači in njegovih mnogo pretesnih stikov s podjetji, ki prodajajo orožje ameriški vojski. Očitki, da je Tower ženskar, mu pri senatorjih baje niso toliko škodovali. Po glasovanju je Tower dejal, da se bo vrnil v privatno življenje v Teksasu, kjer je bil pred senatne kariere profesor političnih ved.

Predsednik Bush, ki je podpiral Towerja do konca, mora sedaj izbrati drugega kandidata za obrambno tajništvo. Dobro obveščeni viri v Beli hiši vedo povedati, da Bush ne bo dolgo odlašal, kajti Pentagon potrebuje voditelja. Nekateri viri omenjajo bivšega obrambnega sekretarja Donalda Rumsfelda in bivšega kongresnika iz Alabame Jacka Edwardsa. Bush, ki je telefoniral Towerja takoj po glasovanju, je bil uradno obveščen o izidu od voditelja demokratske senatne večine sen. Georgea Mitchell. Bush je rekel, da je zadeva končana in je treba nadaljevati z delom.

Mnogi politični analitiki so mnenja, da bodo senatni demokrati sedaj iskali načine, kako lahko dokazujo Bushu in ameriški javnosti, da niso negativci, ki želijo samo škodovati Bushovi vladi. Tako je skoro govorovo, da bodo demokrati hitro potrdili nove-

ga kandidata za obrambno tajništvo, to tudi v slučaju, da bo ta kandidat celo konservativnejši od Towerja.

Cape Canaveral, Fla. — Danes zjutraj so strokovnjaki NASA začeli izstrelitveni postopek za zrakoplov Discovery. Ako ne bo prišlo do zastoja zaradi vremena ali okvare, bo zrakoplov izstreljen v ponedeljek zjutraj ob 8.07.

New York, N.Y. — Včeraj je letalska družba Eastern vložila prošnjo za protekcijo pod zakonom, ki regulira bankrotiranje in sicer pod tkim. »poglavljam 11«. Mehanični in piloti štrajkajo zoper Eastern. Vodstvo te letalske družbe bo skušalo Eastern reorganizirati, vendar so mnogi poznavalci civilne letalske industrije mnenja, da ta poskus ne bo uspel.

Vatikansko mesto — Na posebni konferenci o stanju rimskokatoliške Cerkve v ZDA, je prisotnih 35 ameriških škofov. Konference se udeležuje tudi papež Janez Pavel II., ki je zaskrbljen zaradi domnevne popustljivosti mnogih ameriških katoličanov do ločitve, splava, uporabe raznih sredstev zoper spočetje itd. Ameriški škofovi poudarjajo, da ne bodo popustili, ko gre za temeljna stališča Cerkve, obenem pa prosijo za razumevanje za posebne razmere v svobodni državi, kot so ZDA.

Varšava, Polj. — Na pogajanjih med predstavniki poljskega režima in delavskega gibanja Solidarnosti so le našli nekaj skupnega. Režim je pristal na res svobodne parlamentarne volitve za novo ustanovljen senat. Obe strani sta tudi soglašali o dvofaznih volitvah za poljski parlament oz. Sejm. Tu bi mogli opozicijski (do komunistov) kandidati dobiti največ 35 odstotkov vseh poslanskih mest. Glede novega senata, bo smel kandidirati vsakdo, ki bo predlagan od uradno obstoječe politične ali družbene »skupine«, ali ki bo zbral najmanj 5.000 podpisov. Na ta način bodo lahko kandidirali tudi člani Solidarnosti. Režimski pogajalec Jacek Kuron je dejal na televiziji, da gre za iniciativo, ki bo prvič uporabljen v kateri »socialistični« državi.

Beijing, Ki. — V zadnjih dneh potekajo v glavnem tibetskem mestu Lhasi poulični izgredi, ki so naperjeni proti kitajskim oblastem. V demonstracijah je bilo ubitih najmanj 40 do 50 ljudi, veliko več pa so jih kitajski vojaki in policisti aretrirali in odpeljali. Zaradi obsežnosti izgredov, so oblasti izgnale iz Lhase vse tujece. Tuji novinarji ne smejo v Lhaso.

Washington, D.C. — ZDA so izgnale sovjetskega vojaškega atašeja, ker je bil vpletjen v vohunjenju. Prejemal naj bi zaupne dokumente od nekega Američana. Sovjeti so izgon protestirali, pričakovati pa je, da bodo kot maščevanje izgnali nekega ameriškega vojaškega atašeja.

Washington, D.C. — State Department je odobril vizume za prihod v ZDA trem članom PLO. Ti se bodo udeležili privatne konference o Srednjem vzhodu. Proti trem nima State Department nobenega dokaza, da bi kdaj zakrivili kakšno teroristično dejanje.




